PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 17 of the Courts of Session Act, 1921, the Governor may by Proclamation *inter alia* fix the times at which periodical sittings of Courts of Session constituted under the said Act shall be held and by a Proclamation dated the 7th day of November, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of November, 1940, certain times as appear in the fifth column of the Schedule to the said Proclamation were fixed for the sittings of the following Courts of Session, to wit, East Kimberley, West Kimberley, Broome, Roebourne, Port Hedland, Pilbara, and Ashburton; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to vary the times of sittings of the said Courts of Session respectively in the manner hereinafter mentioned and to amend the said Proclamation accordingly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Courts of Session Act, 1921, and of all other powers in this behalf me enabling, do hereby—

(a) Vary the times of sittings of the East Kimberley, West Kimberley, Broome, Roebourne, Port Hedland, Pilbara and Ashburton Courts of Session respectively so that in lieu of the times heretofore fixed in the fifth column of the said Proclamation, the times shall be as follows:—

East Kimberley—First Monday in January, April and October; second Monday in July.

West Kimberley—Second Friday in February, August and November; third Friday in May.

Broome—First Tuesday in June; second Tuesday in March, September and December.

Roebourne—Wednesday following the third Tuesday in February, May, August and November.

Port Hedland—Friday following the third Thursday in March, June, September and December.

Pilbara—Wednesday following the fourth Tuesday in February, May, August and November.

Ashburton—Third Monday in January, April, July and October.

(b) Vary and amend the Proclamation aforesaid dated the 7th day of November, 1940, accordingly.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets, in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from January 1, 1946, until December 31, 1946, inclusive.

Schedule.

1. The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries extending in a northerly, easterly, and north-easterly direction from a line drawn from the north-eastern extremity of the Mill Point wharf (situated on the western side of Belches or Mill Point) to the north-western extremity of the Harbour and Lights jetty (situated on

the western side of the river between the Swan Brewery and Eliza Point) upwards to the railway bridge at Guildford (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

2. The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries from the Upper Swan bridge (near Midland) upwards to its source (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

3. The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries from a line drawn from the south-western extremity of Point Resolution to the south-western extremity of the Point Walter jetty (situated at Point Walter) downwards to a line drawn from the western extremity of the South Mole to the western extremity of the North Mole (at Fremantle).

4. The whole of the waters of the Canning River and all its tributaries from the bridge on the Canning highway upwards to its source.

5. All that portion of the ocean waters at Fremantle lying between the Fish Market breakwater and the Fish Market jetty, bounded on the west by a line drawn from the southern extremity of the Fish Market breakwater to the southern extremity of the Fish Market jetty.

6. All that area of Western Australian waters bounded by a line drawn one hundred and fifty (150) chains due west from the southerly extremity of the Fish Market breakwater (at Fremantle); thence fifty (50) chains due north; thence in an easterly direction to Rous Head (near the North Mole, Fremantle).

7. All that area of Western Australian waters from the southerly extremity of Mudurup Rocks (south of Cottesloe jetty) and extending in a northerly direction to the south-western extremity of North street, Cottesloe, with a width of a quarter of a mile from the foreshore.

FIRE BRIGADES ACT, 1942.

Department of the North-West,

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 35 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, has been pleased to amend the Fire Brigades Act Regulations as made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of June, 1943, as amended by amendments published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1944, and the 18th day of August, 1944, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, and to declare that the regulations as amended and as set forth in the Schedule, or such of them as shall not be disallowed, shall come into operation and take effect on the day after that day when they are no longer liable to disallowance by a resolution of either House of Parliament.

The abovementioned Fire Brigades Act Regulations are amended as follows:—

1. After the words "Part VI.—Permanent Fire Brigades" occurring after regulation 93 add the words "and provisions relating to employees of the Board."

2. Regulation 53 is hereby repealed and a new regulation inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

53. The Secretary or other officer appointed by the Board to act in his stead shall—

- (a) be the chief executive officer of the Board;
- (b) be responsible to the Board for the proper control and management of the office;
- (c) prepare and send, or cause to be prepared and sent, to the members of the Board or of any committee, all notices of meetings;
- (d) prepare and submit to the president, at least twenty-four hours before the relative meeting, agenda papers for meetings of the Board or of any committee;
- (e) attend all meetings of the Board and of committees, present all correspondence, reports, notices and other documents relative to the business of the meeting, and enter the minutes of all acts, resolutions, and proceedings in a minute book to be kept for that purpose;
- (f) deal, under the supervision of the President, with all inward and outward correspondence of the Board and of committees;
- (g) carry out, or cause to be carried out, under the supervision of the President, all resolutions and directions carried or given at any meeting of the Board or a committee;
- (h) supervise the receipt and disbursement of moneys on behalf of the Board;
- (i) keep and make, or cause to be kept or made, proper records of the accounts of the Board;
- (j) be responsible to the Board for the purchase, safe custody and disposal of the Board's property;
- (k) have direct contact with any employee of the Board;
- (l) prepare and submit to the Board, in the month of June in each year, an estimate of the probable expenditure which may be necessary to be incurred by the Board, under or in pursuance of section 36 of the Act, during the next succeeding year;

- (m) prepare and submit to the Board, in the month of November in each year, a report of the proceedings of the Board during the year then last past;
- (n) generally carry out, or cause to be carried out, all orders and directions of the Board and of the President, and, subject to the control of the Board and of the President, do all such acts as may be necessary for the proper and effective execution of the Act and these regulations.
3. Regulation 54 is amended by deleting from paragraph (e) all words appearing after the word "each" in line 2, and inserting in lieu thereof the word "month."
4. Regulation 82 is amended as follows:—
- (a) by deleting from paragraph (c) all words appearing after the word "with" in line 2, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "a further period of three months long service leave for an additional consecutive period of ten years' continuous service and to a further three months long service leave for each additional consecutive period of seven years' continuous service."
- (b) by deleting paragraph (d) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—
- (d) Every employee who commences employment after the date of the commencement of these regulations shall be credited with a period of three months' long service leave for and on the completion of each of the consecutive periods of continuous service as follows: For the first and next succeeding period of ten years, and thereafter for each period of seven years.
5. After the word "leave" in the last line of the proviso to regulation 88 a new regulation is inserted as follows:—
- 88A. Subject to the provisions of regulation 88, any employee who is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service or a female employee who resigns on her marriage and who has served continuously for at least three years next before retirement shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to the date of retirement.
6. Regulation 105 is hereby repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof—
105. The Chief Officer shall—
- (a) perform the duties, and where necessary exercise the powers, imposed and conferred on him by the Act and these regulations;
- (b) be responsible to the Board for the proper control of all brigades;
- (c) be responsible for the maintenance and efficient use of the Board's property;
- (d) be responsible for the fire prevention activities of brigades;
- (e) hold a weekly conference with the three senior headquarters officers, and a monthly conference with all metropolitan district officers;
- (f) convey his instructions to the officer in charge of any station who will be responsible for giving effect thereto;
- (g) inspect each metropolitan station every second month, and make such country inspection visits as the Board may approve;
- (h) confer with the Secretary in regard to matters that may concern or affect the Board's policy or administration, and submit to him such reports and comments thereon as may be required;
- (i) generally carry out, or cause to be carried out, all orders and directions of the Board.
7. Regulation 106 is hereby repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof:—
106. The Deputy Chief Officer shall—
- (a) become acquainted with the duties of the position of Chief Officer and act as Chief Officer when that officer is absent;
- (b) assist the Chief Officer generally;
- (c) be the officer in charge of headquarters fire station;
- (d) confer with the Secretary when required;
- (e) inspect each metropolitan station every second month (alternatively to the Chief Officer), and make such country inspection visits as the Board may approve.
8. Regulation 107 is hereby repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof:—
107. The Third Officer shall—
- (a) become acquainted with the duties of the position of Deputy Chief Officer and act as Deputy Chief Officer when that officer is absent;
- (b) supervise the special service work of brigades;
- (c) perform such other duties as the Board and the Chief Officer may from time to time assign to him.
9. Regulation 108 is hereby repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof—
108. (1) A District Officer other than at headquarters shall—
- (a) have charge of such district as may be assigned to him and reside as may be directed;
- (b) attend fires and take control until the arrival of a senior officer;
- (c) make, check and transmit reports and requisitions concerning his district;
- (d) be responsible for the proper working of his district and the maintenance of discipline;
- (e) perform such other duties in his district as the Board and the Chief Officer may from time to time assign to him.
- (2) A District Officer at headquarters shall—
- (a) reside as may be directed;
- (b) attend fires;
- (c) be immediately responsible to the Board and the Chief Officer for fire prevention and protection activities and inspections of buildings, and the submission of reports and recommendations thereon.

10. Regulation 109 is hereby repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof—

109. The Inspecting Officer shall—

- (a) inspect from time to time, as determined by the Board, all registered country brigades;
- (b) inspect the Board's buildings and other property situate in country fire districts;
- (c) perform such fire prevention and other duties in country fire districts as the Board and the Chief Officer may direct, or as he in his discretion may deem necessary;
- (d) submit to the Chief Officer and the Secretary reports on all matters arising from his inspection visits;
- (e) confer with the Chief Officer and the Secretary in regard to any matter that may be required by either officer;
- (f) prepare quarterly itineraries of proposed visits, and submit copies to the Chief Officer and the Secretary;
- (g) peruse all correspondence and requisitions, etc., which concern country fire districts.

11. Regulations 134 to 140, both inclusive, are hereby repealed and new regulations are inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

134. Any person appointed by the Board as an officer, fireman, administrative or other employee, who—

- (a) commits any breach of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, or of any of the regulations made thereunder; or
- (b) is negligent or careless in the discharge of his duties; or
- (c) is inefficient or incompetent through causes which appear to be within his own control; or
- (d) consumes intoxicants or drugs to excess; or
- (e) is guilty of disgraceful or improper conduct either in his official capacity or otherwise; or
- (f) wilfully disobeys or disregards any lawful order or instruction given or issued by any person having authority to make, give or issue such order or instruction; or
- (g) has wilfully supplied to the Board or any person representing the Board, incorrect or misleading information in connection with his appointment to employment by the Board,

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to such punishment as is determined upon under the provisions of these regulations.

135. (1) The President may, if he has reason to believe that an employee has committed an offence, make a charge against the employee, and if he considers that the offence is of such a nature that the employee should not continue in the performance of his duty, suspend the employee with or without pay. Suspension may be effected prior to or at the time of or subsequently to the making of the charge and may be removed at any time by the President pending determination of the charge, or, in any case when the charge is not sustained, immediately upon the promulgation of the finding to that effect.

(2) Without limiting the powers of the President as mentioned in the next preceding subsection, the Chief Officer may exercise similar powers but in respect of officers and firemen only.

(3) Upon a charge being made against an employee, it shall be recorded in writing and a copy shall be handed to him forthwith together with a notice directing him to reply forthwith in writing, stating whether he admits or denies the truth of the charge and giving any explanation he desires in regard thereto. If a reply is not received within seven days of service of the copy of the charge upon him he shall be deemed to deny the truth of the charge.

(4) Every charge shall be the subject of an inquiry by the Board.

Provided that the President may direct that in any case where a charge is made against an officer or fireman an inquiry shall be held by the Chief Officer in lieu of the Board and in such case the Chief Officer shall act accordingly.

(5) The employee charged shall be furnished with copies of all documents intended to be used at the inquiry and written notice of the time and place at which the inquiry will be held at least seven days before the commencement thereof.

(6) The inquiry shall be held within at least 28 days of the service of the charge on the employee.

(7) The Board or the Chief Officer as the case may be, upon being satisfied that the offence charged has been committed by the employee may do any one or more of the following:—

- (i) caution the employee;
- (ii) fine him any sum not exceeding the sum of ten pounds;
- (iii) reduce him in rank, class or status;
- (iv) transfer him to a district other than that in which the offence was committed;
- (v) dismiss him from employment.

(8) An employee who has been charged with an offence which has not been sustained shall be—

- (i) paid the reasonable expenses of conducting his case, such expenses to be fixed by the presiding authority hearing the inquiry; and
- (ii) if suspended pending determination of the charge, reinstated in his employment and if suspended without pay, paid the amount of remuneration he would but for such suspension have received as such employee.

(9) The Chief Officer shall report to the Board in writing on every inquiry held by him forthwith on the completion thereof.

136. Any officer or fireman, a charge against whom has been the subject of an inquiry by the Chief Officer, may, by notice stating the grounds thereof in writing served on the Board within seven days of the promulgation of the finding, appeal therefrom to the Board.

137. (1) Any employee, a charge against whom has been the subject of an inquiry by the Board under regulation 135, subregulation 4, or an appeal under regulation 136, may by notice stating the grounds thereof in writing served on the Board within seven days of the promulgation of the finding on such inquiry or appeal, as the case may be, appeal to the Appeal Board.

(2) The Appeal Board shall consist of a Chairman and two members as follows:—

(a) The Chairman shall be appointed to the office by the Board and shall be a Stipendiary Magistrate, but if a Stipendiary Magistrate is unable or unwilling to act, the Chairman shall be a person who shall have the qualifications requisite for appointment as a Stipendiary Magistrate under the Stipendiary Magistrates Act, 1930.

(b) One member shall be nominated by the association or trade union, of which the appellant employee is a member or in the event of such employee not being a member of any association or trade union by reason of his employment being such that there is not available to him membership in any association or trade union then and in such case one member shall be nominated by the appellant employee; and

(c) One member shall be nominated by the Board.

(3) The Board shall pay to the Chairman and the members of the Appeal Board such fees as shall be agreed.

138. In the case of appeals brought under regulations 136 and 137 the following provisions shall apply—

(a) The Board or the Appeal Board, as the case may be, shall appoint a time for the determination of the appeal.

(b) The time appointed shall be within 28 days of the promulgation of the finding, the subject matter of appeal.

(c) The parties to the appeal shall be given at least seven days' prior notice in writing of the time so appointed.

(d) The Board or the Appeal Board, as the case may be, may affirm, vary or annul the finding, the subject matter of appeal, or may make and promulgate, in lieu thereof, such finding as shall in the circumstances of the case be deemed fit.

(e) The Board or the Appeal Board may fix and award to the appellant reasonable expenses of conducting his case.

(f) Appeal may be brought on the grounds of innocence of the charge or excessive severity of punishment.

139. The following provisions shall apply in respect of any inquiry under regulation 135, subregulation 4, or the proviso thereto, or of any appeal under regulations 136 or 137—

(1) the employee concerned—

(a) may be represented by an advocate from the association or trade union of which he is a member, but if such advocate shall refuse to act, or in the event of such employee not being a member of any association or trade union, by reason of his employment being such that there is not available to him membership in any association or trade union, then and in such case he may be represented by any person of whom the presiding authority shall approve.

(b) shall at the direction of the presiding authority submit himself to examination-in-chief, cross examination and re-examination orally on oath or affirmation.

(2) the Board shall—

(a) cause the proceedings to be recorded;

(b) at the request of the employee concerned, furnish him with a copy of such record forthwith on the conclusion of such proceedings;

(3) the proceedings shall be heard in private or in public as the presiding authority shall direct;

(4) subject to the provisions of these regulations, and the directions from time to time of the Chairman of the Appeal Board, procedure as to matters preliminary to and on the hearing of—

(a) any inquiry—

(i) by the Board under subregulation 4 of regulation 135; or

(ii) by the Chief Officer under the proviso to subregulation 4 of regulation 135; or

(b) any appeal—

(i) to the Board under regulation 136; or

(ii) to the Appeal Board under regulation 137

shall as nearly as practicable, and with the requisite adaptation thereof, follow the appropriate procedure provided for in the Justices Act, 1902-1942, relating to (c) simple offences; and (d) appeals, respectively.

(5) The Secretary to the Board or some person to be nominated by the President shall be authorised to carry out all clerical duties as clerk to the presiding authority in all matters of procedure preliminary to and at the hearing of any such inquiry or appeal.

(6) (a) The President or the presiding authority of any such inquiry or appeal as aforesaid may summon any person who it is believed is able to give or produce evidence relevant or material to the determination of any matter the subject of any such inquiry or appeal.

(b) Any person, who, when reasonable expenses have been paid or tendered to him, fails, without reasonable cause in obedience to such summons to attend and give or produce evidence shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Twenty Pounds.

(7) The finding of the Board or the Appeal Board as the case may be, shall be the finding of the majority of the persons constituting the same.

(8) Any fine inflicted as aforesaid may be recovered as a simple contract debt at the suit of the Board.

140. If anything required by regulations 135, 136, 137, 138 or 139 is omitted to be done or is not done in the prescribed manner or within the prescribed time, the Chairman of the Appeal Board may take all appropriate measures for— (i) rectifying such omission; (ii) validating any irregularity; and (iii) enlarging such time.

12. Regulation 145 is hereby repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof:—

145. Excepting where provided to the contrary in these regulations, any communication from an officer, fireman, administrative or other employee to the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary. The Secretary shall be responsible for the proper distribution of all correspondence received by him.

13. Regulation 209 is amended as follows:—

(i) by adding to paragraph (b) a new sentence after the word "brigade" in line 3 thereof as follows:—Each account of £1 and over owing by the brigade shall be paid by separate cheque, and only in the case of accounts under £1 shall one cheque be drawn to pay several accounts in cash."

(ii) by deleting from paragraph (d) the word "captain" in line 1 and inserting in lieu thereof the word "auditors";

(iii) by adding a new paragraph as follows:—

(e) (i) Each brigade shall appoint two persons (other than the Secretary) to be auditors of the brigade's funds, and shall constantly keep such positions filled.

(ii) The said auditors shall from time to time examine all entries made in the brigade books by the Secretary; and prior to the brigade's monthly meeting check the Secretary's income and expenditure account from the cash book, and the duplicate receipts issued for income, and the invoices and vouchers for payment, and verify the balance shown as cash in bank from the bank pass book; and report in writing to the said monthly meeting the result of their audit of the brigade's accounts.

14. After the word "unincorporate" in the last line of regulation 229, a new regulation is added as follows:—

230. (a) Subject to paragraph (c) hereof, every owner or occupier of any premises (other than private dwellings) shall, when directed so to do by the Chief Officer by a requisition in writing signed by him and served upon such owner or occupier provide, keep and maintain in good order and condition and ready for immediate use in, on or about such premises such apparatus and appliances for saving life and property at fires occurring in, on or about the said premises as may be specified by the Chief Officer in such requisition.

(b) Any person who having been served with a requisition as aforesaid fails or neglects within the time fixed by such requisition to comply with the requirements thereof shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations.

(c) Provided that any person who is aggrieved by any requisition served upon him under this regulation may within seven days after receipt by him thereof appeal against such requisition to a magistrate sitting as a court of petty sessions within the district in which the premises referred to in the requisition are situated, and no proceedings shall be instituted against such person pending the hearing of his said appeal.
