IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* for a period of three (3) years.

## Schedule.

All that portion of the Gascoyne River (near Carnarvon) lying south of a line drawn due east from the north-east extremity of Babbage Island and all that portion of Western Australian waters within a radius of one half a mile of the south entrance to the Gascoyne River.

The waters of all creeks within a distance of five miles due north of the Carnarvon jetty and the waters of all creeks south of the Carnarvon jetty to the southerly bank of Oyster Creek and all those portions of Western Australian waters within a radius of one quarter mile of the entrances to the aforesaid creeks.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from (a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of

capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the power aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of three (3) years as from and inclusive of the 1st January, 1946. Provided that no person, either as principal, or as the employee or agent of any person, nor any company or party of persons nor any partnership, shall use or cause to be used at any one time, more than one net having a length of not more than 50 yards and with meshes of not less than three inches throughout.

Moore River (the whole)—Situate about 45 miles north of Fremantle.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the day on which all shops, except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops, shall close at one o'clock, shall be Saturday: Provided that the Governor may by Proclamation at any time and from time to time on the petition (according to the form in the Sixth Schedule) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district or specified locality not within the district, substitute in that district or locality for Saturday any other week day, and may at any time on the like petition revoke any such substitution: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, do hereby repeal and revoke the Proclamation issued under the said section in respect of shops in the Northampton Shop District and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th day of February, 1921, declaring Wednesday to be the day on which such shops should close at one o'clock in the afternoon.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that during a time of war the Governor may by Proclamation, for the period mentioned in such Proclamation, waive or postpone the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and exempt the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with, or perform any conditions relating to such mining tene-

ments; and whereas a time of war now exists, to wit, the War in which His Majesty is now engaged with Germany, Italy, and Japan (hereinafter referred to as 'the present war') and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 4 in relation to certain mining tenements during the present war: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation direct in relation to the mining tenements set out in the Schedule hereunder and for the period stated in the said Schedule that the payment of rent shall be waived and the holders of the mining tenement mentioned in the said Schedule shall be exempted from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation revoke any Proclamation previously issued under the said section 4 relating to the waiving or postponing of the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and the exempting of the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with, or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamations dated the 4th day of June, 1943, and 28th day of January, 1944, in so far as the said Proclamations waived the payment of rent and/or exempted the holders

Infectious Diseases.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Health Act, 1911-44, that the term "Infectious Disease" means and includes certain specified diseases, and also any other disease which the Governor may declare to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is desired to so declare the disease known as Tetanus Neonatorum: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the disease above-mentioned, that is to say, Tetanus Neonatorum, to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-44.

Amendment of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 869/38.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902-1942, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, define the boundaries of a Water Area for purposes of the said Act and may divide such area into districts and define the boundaries of such districts, etc; and whereas, by Order in Council dated 1st February, 1924, the boundaries of the Darlington and Mundaring Districts were defined and approved; and whereas it is desired to alter such boundaries of the

Darlington and Mundaring Districts in the manner described in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council and under the powers conferred in the said Act, doth order that as from the date of this Order the following alterations shall be made in the Schedule of the above-mentioned Order in Council.

Schedule.

Amendment to Portion of Existing Boundary between the Darlington Water District and Mundaring Water District.

The boundary of the Darlington Water District as described in the *Government Gazette* dated February 1, 1924, page 142, shall be amended as follows:—

The amended boundary shall be a line commencing on the existing boundary of the Darlington Water District at the south-west corner of lot 64, Mahogany Creek, and proceeding westerly along the southern boundary of lots 82 and 81 to the south-western corner of the latter lot; thence northerly along the western boundary of lot 81 to its north-western corner; thence westerly across a road and along the southern boundary of lots 59, 58 and 57 to the south-western corner of lot 57; thence north along the western boundary of the said lot to its north-western corner; thence easterly along the northern boundary of lots 57, 58 and 59 to the north-eastern corner of the said lot 59; thence northerly across a road and along the eastern boundary of lot 29 and its prolongation northwards to the southern boundary of Parkerville Lot 37; thence easterly along the southern boundary of lots 37, 38, 39, 41, 43, 49, 44, 45, 46, 48, 51 and Swan Location 1912 to the south-eastern corner of the said location; thence southerly along the western boundary of location 1828 to its south-western corner; thence easterly along the south boundary of the said location and along the south boundary of Mount Helena Lots 203, 202 and 201 to the south-eastern corner of the said lot 201; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said lot and of lot 196 and across Oliver street to the south-western corner of lot 192; thence east along the southern boundary of the said lot and of lot 191 to the centre of Sexton street; thence north along the centre of Sexton street to and across the Eastern Goldfields Railway to the south-western corner of location 2066; thence northerly and easterly along the western and northern boundaries of the said location to its north-eastern corner; thence north-westerly along the western boundary of Alice road to a point opposite the northern alignment of Dibble street; thence easterly across Alice road and along the said alignment of Dibble street to the south-eastern corner of lot 136; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said lot to the south-western corner of lot 115; thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said lot, crossing Princess road and along the southern boundary of lots 109 and 86, across Evans street to its eastern alignment; thence northerly along the said alignment to the northern alignment of Cook street; thence easterly along the said alignment to the south-eastern corner of Swan Location 1751; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said location and westerly along the northern boundary and its prolongation westerly to the existing boundary of the Darlington Water District.

The amended boundary is shown in yellow on plan F.W.D., W.A., 30508.

The area which is to be transferred by this amendment from the Darlington Water District is shown in green on the said plan and the area to be transferred from the Mundaring Water District to the Darlington Water District is shown in blue.

#### FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-43.
