WHEREAS it is enacted under the provisions of the Superannuation and Family Benefits Act Amendment Act, 1945, as follows:—(a) by subsection (2) of section 3 of the said Act that subsection (1) of the said section 3 shall come into operation and take effect on a date to be fixed by Proclamation; (b) by subsection (2) of section 9 of the said Act that subsection (1) of the said section 9 shall come into operation and take effect on a date to be fixed by Proclamation; (c) by subsection (2) of section 10 of the said Act that subsection (1) of the said section 10 shall come into operation and take effect on a date to be fixed by Proclamation; (d) by subsection (2) of section 11 of the said Act that subsection (1) of the said section 11 shall come into operation and take effect on a date to be fixed by Proclamation; (e) by subsection (2) of section 14 of the said Act that subsection (1) of the said section 14 shall come into operation and take effect on a date to be fixed by Proclamation; (f) by subsection (2) of section 16 of the said Act that subsection (1) of the said section 16 shall come into operation and take effect on a date to be fixed by Proclamation; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the 1st day of March, 1946, shall be fixed as the date upon which the various subsections aforesaid shall come into operation and take effect respectively: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix and declare that subsection (1) of section 3, subsection (1) of section 9, subsection (1) of section 10, subsection (1) of section 11, subsection (1) of section 14 and subsection (1) of section 16, respectively, of the Superannuation and Family Benefits Act Amendment Act, 1945, shall come into operation and take effect on the 1st day of March, 1946.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, that during a time of war the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister and after due notice given as required by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said

section, may at any time and from time to time by Proclamation direct that any election required by its or their governing Act or Acts to be held by any public authority or any class or classes of public authority shall be postponed for such period, not exceeding twelve calendar months, as shall be specified in the Proclamation; and whereas The Metropolitan Milk Board as constituted by the Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1944, was by an Order in Council made by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of January, 1946, declared to be a public authority for the purposes of Elections) Act, 1942-1943; and whereas in accordance with paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the said last-mentioned Act the Minister duly gave notice of his intention to recommend to me the said Lieutenant-Governor that I, by Proclamation issued under the said section 3 of the said Act, shall postpone until the 31st day of December, 1946, the election of two members as representatives of the dairymen on The Metropolitan Milk Board as required by the said Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1944, which ordinarily would have been held on the 31st day of December, 1945 and which was not held on such last-mentioned date and has not yet been held; and no objection to such postponement has been made or received: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, do hereby direct that the election of two members as representatives of the dairymen on The Metropolitan Milk Board as required by the Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1944, which ordinarily would have been held on the 31st day of December, 1945, but which has not yet been held, shall be postponed until the 31st day of December, 1946.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

Amendment of Regulations.

C.S.D. 99/36.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners hereby amend the regulations made under the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902, and as reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments up to the 30th day of April, 1945, as follows:—

By deleting Regulation No. 321 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

No. 321.

Fishing—

(1) No person shall fish from any part of the wharf structure below wharf deck level nor from pontoons or any public landing steps or place for landing passengers.

(2) Any person fishing from wharf deck level shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) He will use only rod or line.
- (b) He will not interfere with or obstruct the general wharf work or the convenience of other users of the wharf.
- (c) He will forthwith comply with each and every direction of Fremantle Harbour Trust Patrol Officers in regard to his use of the wharf.
- (d) He will not deposit or leave upon the wharf any fish, fish refuse or offensive matter.
