Greeting:

I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you, Charles McLean, Senior Metropolitan Magistrate and Chairman of City and Suburban Magistrates of Victoria, to be a Commissioner for the following purposes, that is to say:—

(a) To inquire into the administration, conduct and control of the sport of trotting in the State of Western Australia as such sport has heretofore been and is at present being administered, conducted and controlled in the said State;

(b) to make such recommendations as you may think warranted by your inquiries regarding such legislation (if any) as you may consider necessary for or in respect of the administration, conduct and control of the sport of trotting in the State of Western Australia.

And I declare that you shall by virtue of this Commission be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under that Act.

And I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth this 4th day of July, 1945, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

M.W.S. 545/21.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Extensions.

Mundaring Road District, Swan Road District and Darling Range Road District.

Proposed water supply to Helena Valley as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6779.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 4th day of July, 1945.
