WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may by proclamation revoke any proclamation previously issued under the said section 4 relating to the waiving or postponing of the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and the exempting of the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement: Now, therefore, I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this proclamation revoke the proclamations dated the 5th day of March, 1943; 3rd day of September, 1943; 29th day of October, 1943; 27th day of April, 1945; 20th day of July, 1945, and 15th day of February, 1946, insofar as the said proclamations waived the payment of rent and/or exempted the holders of the mining tenements mentioned in the Schedule hereunder from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

form in the Sixth Schedule) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district or specified locality not within the district, substitute in that district or locality for Saturday any other week day, and may at any time on the like petition revoke any such substitution: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, do hereby repeal and revoke the proclamation issued under the said section in respect of shops in the Roe Shop District and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of August, 1923, declaring Wednesday to be the day on which such shops should close at one o'clock in the afternoon.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

Brookton Road Board—Resolution.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 111 and 133 of the Health Act, 1911-1944 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that any local authority which has undertaken or contracted for the collection and removal of nightsoil, urine, and rubbish within its district may by by-law prohibit any person executing or undertaking the execution of the work aforesaid, so long as the local authority or its contractor executes or continues the execution of the said work, or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of such work; and whereas Brookton Road Board, being a local health authority in respect of the Health District of Brookton, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1944, has contracted for the efficient collection, removal and disposal of nightsoil, urine and rubbish within the Health District of Brookton aforesaid, and deems it desirable and expedient to prohibit any and every person other than the contractor of the said Brookton Road Board executing or undertaking the execution of the work aforesaid; and whereas the said Brookton Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, by a resolution published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of November, 1934, adopted Series "A" of the Model By-laws prepared pursuant to section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1926, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and for the purpose of imposing the prohibition hereinbefore mentioned deems it necessary and expedient to amend the said Model By-laws as adopted by the said Brookton Road Board as aforesaid: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the said Brookton Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to sections 111 and 133 of the Health Act, 1911-1944 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that the said by-laws of the said Brookton Road Board, being the said Series "A" of the Model By-laws aforesaid, shall be and are hereby amended by inserting therein in Part I. after by-law 20 a new by-law to stand as by-law 20A, as follows:—

Prohibition against Collection, Removal and Disposal of Nightsoil, Urine and Rubbish.

20A—The Brookton Road Board as the local health authority for the Brookton Health District, having contracted for the efficient collection, removal and disposal of nightsoil, urine and rubbish within the said health district by its contractor, no person other than the contractor of the said local health authority shall execute or undertake the collection, removal or disposal of any nightsoil, urine or rubbish within the Brookton Health District, so long as the said contractor as the contractor of the said local authority executes or continues the said work, or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of the said work.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting in accordance with the advice of the Advisory Committee, pursuant to section 225 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, has been pleased to amend the Food and Drug Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of August, 1928, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The Food and Drug Regulations are amended by deleting paragraphs 4 and 5 from sub-regulation 3 of regulation 68 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

(4) In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—“Licensee and licensed premises” shall bear the same meanings as defined in section

5 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1944; "waste beer" includes any beer, ale or stout which is—

- (a) derived from the spill, drip or overflow from any tap, vessel or other receptacle; or
 - (b) derived from any unconsumed portion supplied to and left by a customer in any glass or other receptacle; or
 - (c) contained in any drip tray; or
 - (d) contained in any receptacle the contents of which are derived from any of the sources mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs (a), (b), (c).
- (5) The licensee of any licensed premises shall—
- (a) cause every container, receptacle or appliances used or intended to be used for the reception of waste beer to contain the colouring matter methyl violet as made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.
 - (b) not place or permit to be placed in any drip tray on any such premises any receptacle capable of holding beer.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Regulation 10 of the regulations made under section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940, is amended by inserting after each of the items—"X-ray screenings"; "X-ray filmings"; "X-ray dental, single negative"; "X-ray dental, full lower or upper jaw"; and "X-ray dental, full lower and upper jaws", appearing in paragraph 16 of the said regulation 10, the words, "except in cases under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944."

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Mukinbudin Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Mukinbudin.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance

with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established, the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members, (b) Fire fighting members, and (c) Associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates:—

(i) owner or occupier of land within the brigade area—minimum subscription of	10 0
(ii) other persons—a minimum subscription of	5 0

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings of the Brigade shall be held when and where called by the captain of the Brigade, or, in his absence, by the then senior officer present, acting on his own account or at the request of the Board.

Provided that the Board at all times on its own account has the right to call a meeting itself if, for any cause whatsoever, that action is considered necessary or advisable.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Mukinbudin Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Mukinbudin on the 14th January, 1946.
