### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,  
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and  
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia  
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

(1) In pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedules A, B. and C. hereto, for the term of twelve months from April 1, 1946, inclusive.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of the section aforesaid, I prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters described in Schedule D hereto, during the periods commencing at 8 o'clock in the forenoon on Friday in each week and ending at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the Monday next following, for the term of twelve months from April 1, 1946, inclusive.

(3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Act aforesaid prohibit—(a) the taking of all species of fish by means of nets, known as "pilchard nets" and "whiting nets," as defined in paragraphs (c) and (d) respectively of the Proclamation dated 24th October, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated 1st November, 1940, in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedule E hereto, from 1st October, 1946, to 31st March, 1947, both inclusive; (b) the taking of all species of fish by means of nets known as "garfish nets" as defined in paragraph (e) of the Proclamation aforesaid, in that portion of Western Australian waters known as Koombana Bay, from 1st August, 1946, to 31st March, 1947, both inclusive.

### SCHEDULES.

#### Schedule A.

The whole of the waters of the entrance to Leschenault Inlet upwards from its junction with Koom-

bana Bay and of the waters of Leschenault Inlet (including all tributaries) upwards to a line drawn from Turkey Point to the northernmost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the north-western corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### Schedule B.

The whole of the waters of the Collie River and all its tributaries and all that portion of Leschenault Inlet lying within a radius of one-half mile of the northernmost extremity of Bar Island.

#### Schedule C.

The whole of the coastal waters in the vicinity of Bunbury known as "Hungry Hollow," being those waters lying between the westerly extensions of Clifton street and Beach road, in the municipality of Bunbury, and within a distance measured rectangularly from the foreshore of one-half mile.

#### Schedule D.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the north of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the northernmost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the north-eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### Schedule E.

The whole of the waters of Koombana Bay and of Leschenault Inlet lying to the north of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the northernmost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the north-eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-34.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7 subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-34, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the pastoralist or any of the pastoralist's assets whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in their pastoral business or not during the operation of such Stay Order; provided that by leave of a judge any action may notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the pastoralist but not beyond judgment.

## THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

The City of Perth—Health By-laws (Amendment).

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1944, a Local Health Authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Perth, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby order that the by-laws made by it under the said Act and gazetted on the 24th day of December, 1925, be amended as follows:—

As from the 1st day of May, 1947, Clause 42 of Part I. is amended by the deletion of paragraph (a) thereof and the substitution of a new paragraph to be numbered (a) in lieu thereof as follows:—

(a) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any poultry or pigeons within that portion of the district embraced within the following boundaries:—On the north by Newcastle street, on the east by Victoria avenue and Lord street, on the south by the Swan River, and on the west by Spring street, Milligan street, Shenton street and Palmerston street.

## THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

Melville Road Board—Resolution—Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, a Local Health Authority may, of its own motion, make a by-law defining an area within the district of such Local Health Authority within which the keeping of any swine or pigsty is forbidden: Now, therefore, the Melville Road Board, being a Local Health Authority under the provisions of the said Act, doth hereby make the following by-law:—

No person shall keep any swine or pigsty north of a line as set out hereunder:—Commencing at a point at the north-west corner of High road and Carrington street on the boundary of the Melville Health District; thence along the north side of High road to Rome road; thence along the west side of Rome road to the northern boundary of Lot 1114; thence east along the said boundary and a prolongation of this line to Norma road; thence south along the east side of Norma road to the south-west corner of Lot 48; thence east along the south boundary of the said lot to the south-east corner; thence south along the east boundary of lot 10 to Bulls Creek road; thence along the north side of Bulls Creek road and a prolongation of the line of this road to the Melville Health District boundary.
