PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.]

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared near Bruce Rock: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of 1,013 acres, Avon Location No. 20023, Reserve No. 22462, to be a Reserve for Natives.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 6th day of May, 1946, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-37, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed.

The Land Act, 1933-1939. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 8270/11.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve A17391 for Public Recreation at South Nedlands should be placed under the control of the Nedlands Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Licutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Nedlands Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Amendment of Collie River Irrigation District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 348/45.

WHEREAS by section 29 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-45, it is provided that the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister, acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, may by Order in Council, amongst other things, extend any Irrigation District by the addition thereto of any land that has not heretofore formed part of a District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, on the recommendation of the Minister, acting with the advice of the said Commissioners, doth hereby: Vary and amend the Collie River Irrigation District by extension of the boundaries to include the whole of the land described in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

Part 2, Extension 1946.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the western boundary of the South-Western Railway Reserve situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of Brunswick Estate Lot 17, and extending 125 deg. 30 min. 49 chains; thence 38 deg. 30 min. 180 chains; thence 113 deg. 0 min. 80 chains; thence about 29 deg. 32 min. about 218 chains 63 links, to an angle post on the northern side of road No. 58; thence generally easterly, along said side to its junction with the western side of road No. 1233; thence 148 deg. 38 min. 80 chains; thence about 75 deg. 35 min. about 80 chains to the centre of Mornington Trigonometrical Station; thence 6 deg. 32 min. 180 chains; thence about 74 deg. 52 min. about 45 chains to the north-western corner of location 2758; thence about 58 deg. 27 min. about 15 chains 25 links to a corner post marked A30 situate on the northern side of road No. 1896; thence generally easterly along the said side, to the 12 Mile Post thereon; thence about 86 deg. 53 min. about 201 chains to Gregory's 16 Mile tree marked T7; thence 206 deg. 30 min. 190 chains; thence about 152 deg. 45 min. about 218 chains to a 5 Mile Post situate about three miles westerly from location 2611; thence about 211 deg. 45 min. about 153 chains to a point situate south of the 4 Mile Post; and east of the north-eastern corner of location 3052; thence west about 218 chains, to the said corner: thence southerly to the south-eastern corner of the said location; thence southwesterly to the north-western corner of location 1555;

thence generally southerly to and along the western boundary of location 2753; and continuing to the easternmost angle post on the eastern side of road No. 3959; thence generally south-south-westerly along the said side, to the northern side of road No. 153; thence generally west-north-westerly along the said side to a point situate east of the north-western corner of Quarry Site, being portion of reserve 3915; thence west, to the said corner; thence west-south-westerly to a point on the boundary of the Collie River Irrigation and Drainage District Part "A," and situate at the intersection of the right bank of the North Supply Channel with the centre line of Collie Tramway, portion of reserve 3915; thence generally northerly along the said bank crossing the Collie Railway, the Brunswick River, and onwards across the South-Western Railway Reserve to the western boundary of the said reserve; and thence northerly, along the said boundary to the starting point as shown in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 30395.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations governing the admission of Cadet Draftsmen, Mines Department.

Regulations Governing the Admission of Cadet Draftsmen, Mines Department.

1.—Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty-one nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to his character.

When forwarding his application, each candidate shall attach a completed questionnaire on the printed form obtainable at the office of the Public Service Commissioner.

2.—Qualification.

An applicant shall produce evidence of having passed the Junior Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematics A and B, and any three other subjects, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Public Service Commissioner, be equivalent thereto.

He shall produce a specimen of his plan drawing.

3.—Competitive Examination.

Applications will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement, and in the event of more applications being received than the number of vacancies, a selection will be made by either of the following methods:—(a) A Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner, the Permanent Head, and a professional member to be nominated by the Commissioner, or (b) a competitive examination in trigonometrical computations, plotting and plan drawing.

4.--Probation.

Every cadet shall, in the first instance, be appointed on probation for a period of three months. Before the expiration of the period of probation, the Permanent Head shall report to the Public Service Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties, and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report the Commissioner will confirm or annul the cadetship. Upon confirmation of a cadet's appointment he will be articled to the Under Secretary for Mines, for the term hereinafter prescribed.

5.-Term of Cadetship.

A cadet will be required to serve for a term of four years. At least three years of this period will be served in the drawing office, during which time he will receive general practical instruction in drafting, plotting, compilation of standard plans, computations, standard traverses and the use of draftsmen's instruments, examination of surveyors' plans and accounts, and issue of instructions and at least six months will be served in the field under a departmental surveyor in order to obtain knowledge of field practice.

6.-Qualifying Examination.

At the end of the prescribed term of cadetship a cadet will be required to present himself at a qualifying examination which will embrace the following subjects:—

- (a) Drawing.—Plan drawing, hill shading and etching, contouring, colouring and drawing for reproduction.
- (b) Plotting.—The use of scales and protractors; plotting by means of co-ordinates and by latitudes and longitudes; adjustment and dispersion of errors of close on standard plans; plotting from surveyors' field books.
- (c) Standard traverse.—Computation of geographical positions on standard traverses, closure and adjustment of circuits.
- (d) Projections.—Computation of the latitudes and departures from points of origin of the intersections of meridians and parallels. Latitudes and longitudes of rectangular sheet corners.
- (e) Mining plans.—Horizontal projections; longitudinal projections; transverse projections; isometric drawings. Calculations in connection with mine surveying and assays; calculation of ore reserves.
- (f) Geological plans.—Interpretation of geological field plans and preparation of geological plans for reproduction.
- (g) Instruments.—Use of eidograph, planimeter and calculating machine.
- (h) Computations in connection with land surveying, including azimuth, latitude and time observations.
- (i) Examination of surveyors' diagrams and original plans and adjustment of discrepancies in surveys. Checking contract surveyors' statements of account.
- (j) Acts and Regulations affecting the work of the Professional Branch.

Examinations shall be conducted as directed by the Public Service Commissioner.

7.-Extension of Term.

No cadet shall be considered to have completed his cadetship until he has passed the qualifying examination prescribed in regulation 6. To enable him to do so the term of four years may be extended at the discretion of the Public Service Commissioner for a further period not exceeding two years at the same remuneration as he was in receipt of for the fourth year of his cadetship.

8.—Studies.

When cadets cannot obtain the necessary instruction at the evening classes of the University of Western Australia, the Technical School, or other approved institution, they may be allowed such leave of absence as may be necessary to attend the day lectures in approved subjects, but such leave of absence during working hours shall be without pay.

9.-Progress and Conduct.

At any time after a cadet has completed one year of the prescribed term of service, if, in the opinion of the Permanent Head of the Department, his progress and general conduct have not been satisfactory, his cadetship may be cancelled on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

10.—Regulations.

During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and Regulations relating to the Permanent Staff as far as these may be applicable. The period of his cadetship shall not be considered as any part of a term of service for which long service leave may be granted.

11.—Remuneration.

The remuneration of a cadet will be at the following rates:—

 1st year
 £70 per annum

 2nd year
 £90 per annum

 3rd year
 £110 per annum

 4th year
 £130 per annum

An allowance of 2s. per diem will also be paid when in the field in camp.

When employed away from headquarters an allowance may be paid as re-imbursement for extra cost of transport necessarily incurred.

When stationed away from home and no camp is provided, a special sustenance re-imbursement may be paid as compensation for the extra cost of living involved.

These transport or sustenance re-imbursements will be at such rates as may be approved by the Public Service Commissioner in each case.

12.—Permanent Appointment.

A cadet who has satisfactorily completed his cadetship shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years, at a salary of £245 for the first year, £260 for the second year, and thereafter in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged.

13.—Agreement and Bond.

Before any person is accepted as a cadet under these Regulations an agreement in the form, or to the effect, of Form No. 1 in the appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the head of the Department concerned; and a bond in the form, or to the effect, of Form No. 2 in the said appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties, to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

The cadet will, during the said term, well and truly serve the Under Secretary for Mines as a cadet draftsman and will in all respects and at all times observe, perform, and comply with the obligations on the part of the cadet contained in the said regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

In consideration of the premises the Under Secretary for Mines will during the said term take and accept the cadet attached to the Mines Department and employ him and instruct him or cause him to be employed and instructed as a cadet draftsman under and in accordance with the said regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now therefore the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of eighty (80) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

3.—Hours.

Except as otherwise provided in this Award, the following shall apply:—

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday.

- (c) The hours of work, except where shifts are worked shall be performed as follows:—Monday to Friday inclusive—between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.; Saturday—between 7 a.m. and 12.15 p.m.: Provided that, at the option of the employer, the ordinary week's work of forty-four (44) hours may be worked in five (5) days (from Monday to Friday, inclusive) within hours mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union.
- (d) In the event of the Court delivering a decision reducing the standard hours to be worked by industry in Western Australia, liberty is reserved to the Union to apply for an amendment of this clause and Clause 10 (sub-clause (b)) and to the respondents for an amendment to Clause 8 (sub-clause (ii) (a)) regarding the rate for a burner working forty-eight (48) hours, should the hours for burners be reduced.

4.—Shift Work.

Where two (2) or more shifts in any one day are worked, the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement, the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference.

5.—Overtime.

Subject to the proviso in Clause 3 (c) hereof, work performed beyond eight (8) hours on Monday to Friday, inclusive, or beyond four (4) hours on Saturday, or beyond forty-four (44) hours in any one week, or except in the case of shift work, before the prescribed starting or after the prescribed finishing time, shall be deemed to be overtime.

- (a) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Work performed on Sunday, Christmas Day, Labour Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, and Anzac Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time: Provided that this shall not apply to burners who shall only be paid double time for work performed on Christmas Day and Boxing Day and time and a half for work performed on Labour Day, Good Friday and Anzac Day.

- (c) Workers under the age of eighteen (18) years shall not, as far as practicable, be called upon to work between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m.
- (d) As far as practicable when overtime is worked, any worker who is called upon to work such overtime shall be selected from amongst those workers performing the class of work that is required to be done during the time that such overtime is worked.

6.—Minimum Engagement.

Except as provided in Clause 17, any worker engaged, under the terms of this Award shall be paid a minimum of three (3) hours' pay.

7.-Holidays.

- (a) Subject as hereinafter provided, twelve (12) days' holiday on full pay shall be granted to each worker per annum.
- (b) Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, or the days observed in lieu, and Union Picnic Day (on a date to be agreed upon between the parties, about the middle of February in each year) shall constitute five (5) of such twelve (12) holidays. The remaining seven (7) days' holiday shall be taken between the 23rd day of December and the 2nd day of January, inclusive: Provided that burners on Hoffman or Osborne kilns may be granted the holidays prescribed in sub-clause (a) of this clause at some other time mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union. When this proviso is availed of the holidays due shall be taken within three (3) months of the completion of each year that the worker is in the service of the employer. Provided further, that where a burner on Hoffman or Osborne kilns is granted holidays in the manner laid down in the foregoing proviso, he shall not be entitled to claim payment for any of the other holidays prescribed for other workers, and if work be performed by him on such other holidays, ordinary rates shall be paid for such work, except on Christmas Day and Boxing Day, when double time shall be paid.

Holiday pay for all workers shall be limited to twelve (12) days per annum.

- (c) A worker whose employment has continued for more than one week shall be entitled each year to holiday pay in proportion to his length of service in each
- (d) Where a worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct or dereliction of duty, he will not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (e) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from duty for any cause whatsoever, except as provided in Clause 21 of the Award.
- (f) In the event of the Court delivering a decision increasing the standard holidays to be granted by industry in Western Australia, liberty is reserved to the Union to apply for an amendment of this clause.

(iv) Piecework:

(a) An employer may make a contract with a drawer

for payment by results by piecework.

(b) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a drawer of average capacity for a full week's work of the ordinary hours at least the minimum time rate of pay recognised by custom for such week's work: Provided that, where a drawer works part of a full week at piece-work rates and part at time rates, he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under such piece-work rates, plus the proportionate amount which he is entitled to receive at time rates of pay recognised by custom for drawers.

(e) A drawer working under any system of payment by results shall receive at least the time rate of pay

recognised by custom for drawers.

(d) In the event of any dispute regarding piece-work rates occurring and remaining unsettled between the employer and the drawer, the employer or the Union may refer such dispute to the Board of Reference.

9.—Open Kiln Burners.

(a) Ten (10) hours shall constitute a night's work, starting at 7 p.m. and finishing at 6 a.m., one hour during that period being allowed for meals. Any time so worked shall not count in the week's work.

(b) All burners employed on full night shift shall be kept on until after the last complete feed on that night. Burners working on broken shifts shall be paid one (1) hour in addition to the actual time worked at the conclusion of the last feed.

(c) Not less than two (2) men shall be employed on kilns containing up to fifty-five thousand (55,000) bricks, when in full fire.

(d) On kilns containing over fifty-five thousand (55,000) bricks and up to seventy-five thousand (75,000) bricks when in full fire, not less than three (3) men shall be employed.

(e) On kilns containing over seventy-five thousand (75,000) bricks when in full fire, not less than four (4)

men shall be employed.

(f) An ordinary burner shall not be allowed to work on one kiln for more than two (2) nights in one (1) week, such two (2) nights not to be consecutive.

(g) No burner shall be called upon to attend to more than one (1) full kiln per night, when steaming.

(h) Work performed on a Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. Such work shall be confined to work connected with burning only. Firewood shall only be unloaded when it is required for a kiln then burning.

(i) All firewood, stopping and daub required at night

shall be provided in proximity to the kilns.

(j) When more than three (3) burners are employed at night, one shall be placed in charge and paid as head burner.

(k) It shall be optional for a worker to refuse to wheel up a checker after having been employed as a burner on the previous night.

10.-Hoffman Kilns.

- (a) Coal landings shall not be less than three (3) feet wide and shall be railed.
- (b) The hours of burners shall be forty-eight (48) per week at an hourly rate calculated on the rate prescribed in Clause 8 (ii) (a).

(c) Burners performing work on Sunday shall be paid time and a half for such work and have one clear day off in each week.

(d) Where a head burner is employed he shall, when necessary, supervise the work of the other burners on other shifts. He shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per week extra, and this extra payment shall be regarded as payment for the extra work involved by such supervision.

(e) All workers employed oiling machinery in pressed brickyards shall be paid an additional half hour's pay per day at ordinary rates for performing such work.

(f) All waste and other material required for cleaning shall be supplied by the employer.

(g) Piece-work rates for drawers shall be on trucks or at stack.

11.-Lower Duties.

A worker called upon to do work carrying a lower rate than his usual rate of pay, for less than one half of a day, shall be paid for such work at his usual rate of pay.

12.-Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for

determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

13 .- Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid on the job within twenty (20) minutes of the close of the day's work at least once a fortnight.

14.—Engagement.

One day's notice on either side shall (with the exception of waste sand and bag boys, in whose case one week's notice shall be required) be necessary to terminate the engagement of all workers: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, for misconduct, or if after receiving the prescribed notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

15.-Notices.

Notices relating to meetings in connection with the Union shall be allowed to be exhibited in each yard. A printed copy of the conditions of this Award shall be kept posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in each yard.

16.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing:--

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this Award applies;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the hours worked each day by him;
- (d) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him;
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union not more than once weekly, between the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

17.—Breakdowns, Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or any other Union or association, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

18.—First Aid Outfit.

Every yard shall be equipped with a First-Aid outfit, and such outfit shall be kept in a suitable place not more than three hundred (300) yards from the place of employment.

19 .- General.

- (a) Except where rubber tyred vehicles are used plates or planks shall be provided for all wheelers wheeling into the kiln in all places except where the ground to be wheeled on is hard.
- (b) A powder monkey shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra. Where a powder monkey is not employed a leading hand shall be appointed and he shall be paid one shilling per day extra.
- (c) Where a powder monkey has to break material for six (6) or more workers in a pressed yard, he shall have an assistant, who shall be paid at the labourer's rate of pay.
- (d) It shall be optional on the part of the employer to provide oilskins.

20.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference consisting of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award, or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award.

21.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

22.—Scope.

This Award shall not apply to the manufacture of Cement Bricks, Fire Bricks or Tapestry Bricks.
