PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st January, 1946, until 31st December, 1948, inclusive.

First Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards north of Robbs Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards south of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Second Schedule.

That area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards north of the jetty fronting Douro Road, South Fremantle, to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards south of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Constitution of the Wongan-Ballidu Health District, under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-44.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-44, that the Lieutenant-Governor may constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, to be a health district, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order; and whereas by Order in Council dated 26th October, 1927, published in the *Government Gazette* of 28th October, 1927, and by Order in Council dated 17th August, 1931, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st August, 1931, all that land comprised within the townships of Wongan Hills, Ballidu and Kondut was declared to be the Wongan-Ballidu Health District; and whereas it is desired to extend the boundaries of the Wongan-Ballidu Health District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that all that land comprised within the boundaries of the Wongan-Ballidu Road Board shall be a Health District to be known as the Wongan-Ballidu Health District under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-44.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

Denmark Road Board—Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 320 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, a local health authority may make by-laws and may repeal, amend, vary or suspend operation of any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Denmark Road Board, being a local health authority and having, by resolution, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd August, 1930, adopted the Model By-laws Series "A," prepared under section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, as its by-laws for the Denmark Health District, doth hereby amend its said by-laws as follows:—

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1945.

By-laws of the Westonia Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Westonia.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and

application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) subscribing members, (b) fire fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—(i) owner or occupier of land within the Brigade area, minimum subscription of 10s., (ii) other persons, a minimum subscription of 5s.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings of the Brigade to be held once quarterly and when called by the captain of the Brigade.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, were passed by a resolution of the Westonia Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Westonia on the 9th March, 1946.

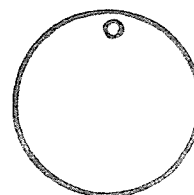

Building By-laws.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Busselton made under section 180 and part fifteen of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-43, and numbered one, for regulating building.

An amendment to be made to existing by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th September, 1945, to be known as clause 32A, which shall read:—

32A. The external walls of all outbuildings the curtilage of premises other than dwellings shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, reinforced concrete or other fire-resisting material approved by the Council, provided that this clause (numbered 32A) and preceding clause numbered 32 shall apply only to that area of the Municipality bounded by the west side of West Street, the east side of Stanley Street, the Vasse River and the ocean foreshore.

ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1943.

Esperance District Road Board.

Building By-laws.

P.W. 781/46.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943 (section 201 and the 2nd Schedule), the Esperance District Road Board makes the following by-laws relating to buildings, areas and open spaces.

PART 1.

1. This law shall apply to that portion of the town of Esperance as hereafter defined, namely:—

That area bounded by a line commencing at the junction of Gladstone Street with the foreshore travelling westwards along Gladstone Street to its junction with Randell Street, thence southwards along Randell Street to its junction with Leake Street, thence westwards along Leake Street to Jane Street, thence southwards along Jane Street to its junction with a line being the extension westwards of the south boundary of lots 1 to 8 on plan 4708, thence eastwards along this said line to its junction with the foreshore, thence northwards along the foreshore to the starting point.

2. Commencement.—This by-law shall come into operation immediately upon its confirmation and approval by the Governor and the publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Repeal.—From the date of coming into operation of this by-law, all previous by-laws made by the Board relating to buildings are repealed.

4. Definitions.—In this by-law, subject to the context—

“Alteration” means any work made or done for any purpose, in, to, or on a building (except that of any necessary repairs not affecting the construction of any external, cross or party wall) or any change in the purpose for which the building or erection, or any part thereof shall be used.

“Apartment” means a room or rooms or part of a building intended or adapted for separate occupation as a dwelling.

“Apartment Building” means a building containing two or more apartments.

“Build” includes erect, build or construct.

“Building” includes erection, structure, detached room and outbuilding whether roofed or not, designed to afford or capable of affording shelter.

“Builder” means the master builder or other person employed to execute any work, or, if there is no master builder or other person so employed, then the owner of the building, or other person for whom or by whose orders such work is to be done.

“Dwelling House” means a building used or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.

“Fire resisting” used with reference to any materials includes—(a) brickwork constructed of good bricks, sound, properly bonded and solidly put together with good lime or cement mortar; (b) any stone suitable for building purposes by reason of its solidity or durability; (c) sheet metals or other similar materials which are in the opinion of the Board, fire resisting; (d) iron and steel (when used for columns, girders, or wall framing) encased in cement concrete or other incombustible or non-conducting external coating; (e) slates, tiles, brick, and terra cotta, when used for covering or corbels; (f) concrete, when composed of broken bricks, stone chip-pings, or ballast and lime, cement, or calcined gypsum.

“External Wall” means an outer wall of a building, not being a party wall, even though it adjoins a wall of another building.

“Frontage” means the distance measured at right angles to one of the sides of the land from the terminal point thereof to the opposite side, or a continuation of such opposite side.

“Garage” means any building used for the housing of a motor vehicle (not being a garage carried on as a business undertaking).

“Height” in relation to any building, means measurement taken from the level of the footway (if any) immediately in front of the centre of the building, or when there is no such footway, from the level of the ground before excavation, to the level of the ceiling or tie of the topmost storey.

“Inspector” means the person appointed by the Esperance Road Board to administer this by-law.

“Height” in relation to walls means the measurement between floor and ceiling, taken inside the room.

“Main Rooms” means and includes all rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining rooms, lounges, ordinary living rooms or kitchens.

“New Buildings” includes:—(a) Any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this by-law coming into operation; (b) any building of which half its cubical contents has been taken down or destroyed by fire, tempest or otherwise, and is re-erected or commenced to be re-erected wholly or partially on the same site after the date of this by-law coming into operation; (c) any buildings removed or transported wholly or in sections into the district, or to another part of the district, after the date of this by-law coming into operation.

“Outbuildings” means any building or the curtilage of any dwelling, shop, or combined shop and dwelling used as a workshop or storeroom not being a building for the storage of inflammable materials, nor for the housing of animals or birds.

“Party Wall” means a wall built to be used as a separation of two or more buildings, or a wall forming part of a building built upon the dividing line between adjoining premises for the common use.

“Person” includes corporation.

“Prescribed” means prescribed by this by-law.

“Public Place” has the same meaning as in the Act.

“Reinforced Concrete” means a form of construction in which cement concrete is reinforced with iron or steel, these materials being so combined that the iron or steel will take up and resist substantially the whole of the tensional stresses and assist in the resistance to shear, while the concrete will take up and resist the compression stresses and assist in resistance to shear.

“Right of way” means any lane or right of way, not a road, over which any person other than the owner thereof has a right of carriage way.

“Road” has the same meaning as in the Act.

“Secretary” means the secretary of the Board and shall include the acting secretary and assistant secretary.

“Shop” means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also saloons of barbers and hairdressers, offices of agents, auctioneers and all other businesses or trades. A bona fide boarding house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied for payment to persons other than boarders.

“Square” applied to the measurement of any area means the space of one hundred square feet.

“Surface or Ground Level” means the level of the ground as determined by the inspector.

“Wooden Buildings” means buildings constructed of wood, or buildings having wooden frames.

PART 2.

Classes of Buildings.

5. For the purposes of this by-law buildings shall be divided into three classes:—

Class A.—“Domestic Class,” which includes all buildings subject to small vibrations and light loading of floors, such as dwelling houses, residential shops, offices, hotels, private schools, clubhouses and studios.

Class B.—“Warehouse Class,” which includes all buildings subject to vibrations and heavy loading of floors, such as warehouses, factories, mills and places for storage and manufacture of goods.

Class C.—“Public Buildings,” which includes all buildings designed to accommodate an assemblage of people, such as theatres, picture halls, churches, chapels, assembly halls, museums, libraries, public schools, hospitals, lecture rooms and other like buildings.

In case of doubt, the inspector shall finally determine to which class any particular building belongs.

PART 3.

Notice of Intention to Build or Demolish and Lodging of Plans.

6. Notice to be given.—No builder shall commence any building or any addition, or alteration to any building without first delivering at the office of the Board a written application in the form of the first schedule hereto before so commencing, and delivering to the inspector—

(a) Plans and Specifications.—Properly prepared plans and specifications of such building, addition or alteration, together with a tracing or copy of the plans of such building, addition or alteration and also details and dimensions, sizes and qualities of all materials and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in the construction of same. Plans shall be drawn in ink and specifications typed or legibly written.

(b) Block Plan.—A block plan showing relation of the building to adjoining buildings and boundaries.

(c) Purpose.—A statement in writing of the purpose for which the building is intended to be used.

(d) Drainage.—Particulars of the proposed method of drainage.

(e) Further Particulars.—Such further particulars in writing regarding same as shall be necessary to enable the Board or its inspector to determine if all the provisions of this by-law applicable thereto are being complied with.

7. Limit to Height.—No building, if constructed of wood, shall be more than one storey in height, or if constructed of brick, concrete or masonry, shall be more than two storeys in height.

8. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which have not, by reason of inflammable material proposed to be used or other reason, proper regard for the safety of persons or other buildings in the event of fire.

9. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which do not in the opinion of the Board bear proper consideration of size or design of construction or architecture to the adjacent buildings.

10. Tracing retained.—The tracing or copy of the plans and details of materials shall be retained by the Board and the original plans and specifications when approved shall be returned to the owner or his agent. Such approval shall be evidenced in writing endorsed on the plans and specifications and signed by the secretary or inspector.

11. Plans to be kept at Building.—Such plans and specifications shall be kept at the building therein referred to and shall be available for inspection by the inspector or accredited officer of the Board at all reasonable times, on demand, during the construction or erection or alteration or addition, as the case may be, and for fourteen days after the completion thereof.

12. Permits and Fees.—No person shall commence a building of any kind or addition or alteration to any building, or demolish any building, without first having obtained from the inspector or secretary written permit for the commencement of the same.

13. Area of New Building.—The decision of the inspector as to the area of a new building or value of an addition shall be final and conclusive.

14. Permits shall lapse after six months.—A permit obtained pursuant to this by-law shall lapse and be of no effect unless the building for which such permit was granted shall be commenced within six months and completed within 12 months from the date of such permit.

15. Inspector may enter and inspect.—The inspector at all reasonable times during the progress, and after the completion of any building, or addition, or alteration to any building affected by this by-law, may enter and inspect such building or addition or alteration.

16. Inspector may stop work if contrary to by-law.—The inspector may at any time stop the progress of any building and withdraw or suspend any permission given by the Board under this by-law in the event of his not being satisfied that all the provisions of this by-law are being complied with, and any person who continues to build, or erect, or work on the site after notice from the inspector to desist shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

17. Demolition or Removal of Building.—When a building is to be demolished or removed, the owner or contractor shall give 24 hours' notice to the inspector of such intended demolition or removal.

18. Sanitary Conveniences for Workmen.—Before commencing any building operations upon any building site, the contractor, or person responsible for carrying out building operations, shall provide 'sanitary' conveniences sufficient for the use of all men working upon the site, such sanitary conveniences shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Health Act.

19. Low-lying Land.—Where land upon which a building is to be erected is below the level of the crown of the road adjoining the land frontage, no building shall be commenced until a level has been given by the inspector. When it is considered by the inspector that having regard to the water level during winter months, filling is required, such filling shall be carried out by the owner or contractor before the commencement of building operations. In the event of there being no made road from which to take a level for any building, the inspector shall determine the level at which any building shall be commenced, and if he considers it to be necessary, shall require the owner or contractor to fill in to a given level.

20. Provision of Bathroom, Bath, Wash Troughs, Copper, etc.—Provision shall be made in all new or re-erected dwellings for a bathroom fitted with bath, also laundry facilities consisting of wash troughs and copper.

21. Distance of Stables from Boundaries.—No stable may be erected nearer than 30 feet to any dwelling, nor than 10 feet to the boundary of land not in the same occupation.

22. Material for Garages.—Every garage shall be constructed of fire-resisting materials, unless otherwise approved by the Board.

PART 4.

Building Materials.

23. All materials used in any building must be of good quality and shall be subject to the approval of the inspector and the inspector shall have the power to condemn any material, which in his opinion is not suitable for use in such building, alteration or addition.

24. Secondhand Material.—No old or secondhand material may be used in any building unless approved in writing by the inspector.

25. Bricks.—Bricks used in any building must be good, hard and well burnt. When old bricks are used in any wall they shall be thoroughly cleaned before being used, and shall be whole and hard and well burnt.

26. Sand.—Sand used for mortar or concrete in any building shall be clean and sharp and free from loam, dirt, salt, and organic matter such as roots, grass, etc.

27. Lime Mortar.—Lime mortar shall be composed of freshly burnt lime and sand in the proportion of at least one part by measure of lime and not more than three parts by measure of sand. All lime intended to be used for mortar shall be thoroughly burnt, of good quality and be properly slaked before being mixed with sand.

28. Cement Mortar.—Cement mortar shall be composed of good Portland cement, or other cement of equal quality, mixed with clean sharp sand, in the proportion of at least one part by measure of cement, and not more than four parts by measure of sand and used before initial setting has commenced.

29. Concrete for Foundations.—Concrete for foundations shall be composed of clean, broken stone or other hard material approved by the inspector, broken to a gauge not exceeding two inches, and sand, well mixed on a wooden floor or in an approved concrete mixer, with cement in the proportions of one part by measure of cement to not more than six parts by measure of the other materials. Concrete for purposes other than foundations shall be as specified above, except that for walls less than six inches in thickness and for reinforced work the stone used shall be broken to a gauge not exceeding three quarters of an inch.

30. Timber.—All timber and wooden beams used in any building shall be of good sound material, free from rot, large loose knots, shakes, gum veins, or other imperfections whereby the strength may be impaired, and shall be of such sizes, dimensions and spaces as set forth in this by-law.

31. Lintels.—Builders casting lintels in position shall submit to the inspector a plan showing position

and details of reinforcement and specifications of materials to be used, such design to be approved at the same time as the plan of the building. Lintels up to six feet span shall be three courses in depth, lintels from six feet to eight feet span shall be four courses in depth. All such lintels shall be reinforced with at least half inch steel rods, not less than three rods per lintel and a proper bearing shall be given at each end of lintel.

PART 5.

Construction.

31. Excavation and Inspection of Trenches.—All excavations for footings shall be not less than 12 inches below the natural surface of the ground, except in cases of special construction of foundations approved by the inspector. No footing shall be placed in position until at least 24 hours' notice has been given to the inspector that the trenches are ready for inspection.

32. Walls to have Footings.—Unless with the consent of the inspector every external wall, and every party wall not carried on a bressumer, and every pier and storey post shall have footings.

33. Dimensions of Footings.—The width of the bottom of the footing of every such wall shall be at least one half greater than the thickness of the wall at the ground floor level but in no case less than 16 inches wide unless approved by the inspector and the height of such footing shall be at least equal to the thickness of the wall at its ground floor level but in no case less than nine inches.

34. External Walls.—All external walls shall consist of brick, stone, concrete, reinforced concrete or other hard fire-resisting material approved by the Board provided that any building used or intended to be used solely as a dwelling house may have walls constructed of wood and/or asbestos cement sheets subject to the conditions set out in this by-law for buildings wholly or partly of wood.

35. Construction of External Walls.—Every wall constructed of brick, stone or other similar material shall be properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar and no part of such wall shall overhang any part underneath it except to the extent of nine inches and as approved by the inspector and provided that the projection is well and solidly corbelled out and that the inside of the wall carrying such corbelling is carried up vertically in continuation of the lower face thereof. All the return walls shall be properly bonded together.

36. Dampcourse.—Every wall or fireplace of brick, stone or similar material shall have a dampproof course or courses of asphalt, distilled tar and hot sand or other approved material at least six inches above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at the one uniform level then the said dampcourse must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same material and shall be not less than half an inch in thickness.

37. Hollow Walls.—External walls may be constructed as hollow walls if constructed in accordance with the following rules:—

(a) The inner and outer parts of the wall shall be separated by a cavity which shall throughout be of a width not exceeding two inches or less than one inch.

(b) The inner and outer parts of the wall shall be securely tied together with suitable bonding ties of adequate strength, formed of galvanised iron or other approved material. Such ties shall be placed at distances apart not exceeding three feet horizontally and at least every fifth course vertically. The thickness of each part of the wall shall throughout be not less than four and one half inches.

(c) The aggregate thickness of the two parts including the width of the cavity shall throughout be not less than the minimum thickness prescribed for solid walls of the same height and length.

(d) No hollow wall of more than eleven inches in thickness shall be greater in superficial extent than three squares in any one storey unless strengthened by a partition wall, fireplace or projecting pier to the satisfaction of the inspector.

38. Concrete Blocks.—Concrete blocks shall contain not less than one part of cement to five parts mixed aggregate and shall be kept damp for a period of not less than four days and shall not be used green. Blocks shall be bedded in cement mortar and no block shall be used within fourteen days of construction.

39. Thickness of Walls.—Domestic Class.—No external wall in brick, stone, concrete or cement block shall have less than the thickness prescribed in the following table "A":—

40. If any storey exceeds in height 18 times the thickness prescribed for walls of such storey, the thickness of each external and party wall throughout such storey shall be increased to one eighteenth part of the height of the storey and the thickness of each external and party wall below that storey shall be increased to that thickness but any such additional thickness may be confined to piers properly distributed, of which the collective widths amount to one fourth part of the length of the wall. No increase in thickness of brick walls shall be less than four and one half inches.

41. The height of any storey may be twenty times the thickness of walls prescribed for such storey if built with cement mortar.

42. Thickness of Walls—Warehouse Class.—No external wall in brick, stone, concrete or cement block shall have less than the thickness prescribed in the following table "B":—

43. Thickness of Walls under certain conditions.—Walls under 75 feet in length may be constructed 9 inches thick provided they are strengthened with four and one half inch piers equally spaced of which the collective widths amount to one fifth of the length of the wall. The height shall not exceed 12 feet when built of lime mortar or 13 feet 6 inches when built of cement mortar.

44. The thickness of walls under 20 feet in length may be two thirds the thickness required for external or party walls as stated in tables "A" and "B" but in no case less than 9 inches.

45. If in any storey of the warehouse class the thickness of the wall as determined by the provisions of this part of this by-law is less than one sixteenth part of the height of such storey, the thickness of the wall shall be increased to one sixteenth part of the height of the storey and the thickness of each external and party wall below that storey shall be increased to that thickness, but any such additional thickness may be confined to piers properly distributed, of which the collective widths amount to one fifth part of the length of the wall. No increase in the thickness of brick

walls shall be less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches. The height of any storey built in cement mortar may be eighteen times the thickness prescribed for such storey.

46. Length, how measured.—Walls are deemed to be divided into distinctive lengths by return walls, and the length of every wall is measured from the face of one return wall to the face of another. Provided that such return walls are external, party or cross walls of the thickness required by this part of this by-law and bonded into the wall so deemed to be divided.

47. Cross Walls.—The thickness of a cross wall shall not be less than two thirds of the thickness hereinbefore required for an external or party wall of the same dimensions and belonging to the same class of building, but never less than nine inches, and no wall subdividing shall be deemed to be a cross wall unless it is carried up to the plate level of the topmost storey, and unless in each storey the aggregate extent of the vertical faces or elevations of all the recesses and that of all the openings therein taken together does not exceed one half of the whole extent of the vertical face or elevation of the wall. If a cross wall is carried on a girder across the ground storey and is supported by piers to the satisfaction of the inspector it shall be deemed to be a cross wall in accordance with this regulation, but in one-storey buildings $4\frac{1}{2}$ inch cross walls will be permitted, provided the unsupported length of any wall does not exceed twenty-five feet.

48. Cross Wall becomes External Wall.—Whenever a cross wall becomes in any part an external wall, the external part of such cross wall shall be of the thickness required for an external wall of the same height and length and belonging to the same class of building, but no portion of such cross wall shall be of less thickness than is required for the external thereof.

50. Internal and Partition Walls.—All internal bearing walls and partition walls shall be constructed in such manner as may be approved by the inspector. All such walls shall be not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches thick, provided that where such walls form a division between flats, then such walls shall be not less than nine inches thick. Unless with the consent of the inspector, every such wall, unless carried on a bressumer, shall have footings and such footing shall be at least twice the thickness of the wall resting upon it.

51. Isolated Piers.—No isolated brick or stone piers shall exceed in height eight times the least diameter of same, if built of lime mortar, and twelve times if built of cement mortar.

52. Parapet to Walls on Boundary.—Where the external wall of any building is erected on the boundary of the land on which the same stands or where the overhanging eaves or gutters of any building would be within two feet of such boundary, then the external wall of such building shall be carried up to form a parapet fifteen inches at least in height above the roof or above the highest part of any flat or gutter, as the case may be.

Parapet, Warehouse Class.—In buildings of the warehouse class, the thickness of such parapet shall be equal to the thickness of such wall in the topmost storey, and in any other buildings of a thickness of nine inches at least.

53. Party Walls.—Every party wall shall be carried up for a height of fifteen inches above the roof, measured at right angles to the slope thereof, or fifteen inches above the highest part of any flat or gutter, as the case may be, and of a thickness (in buildings of the warehouse class) equal to the thickness of such wall in the topmost storey and in any other building of a thickness of $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches at least; provided, however, that in the case of domestic buildings where not more than two buildings are erected under one roof it shall be sufficient if the party wall is carried up at least $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches in thickness to the underside of the roof covering and such roof covering of iron, slate or other material must be bedded in good mortar to the satisfaction of the inspector, and the top of such party wall shall not be hidden from view until it has been approved by the inspector.

54. Buildings wholly or partly of Wood.—The following conditions shall apply as to scantlings and spacing of timber:—

Stumps, if of jarrah, shall not be less than 4 inches x 4 inches, and if of paper bark shall be not less than 5 inches diameter measured at the smallest diameter. All stumps shall be not less than 18 inches in the

ground and not more than 4 feet centres under walls and 5 feet centres elsewhere. Stumps shall be fitted with galvanised iron or other approved ant stops.

Sole plate shall be jarrah not less than 12 inches x 6 inches x $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. All timber in contact with the ground shall be well tarred.

Floor bearers—4in. x 3in. jarrah spaced 5 feet centre to centre. Floor bearers required directly under every wall or partition.

Floor joists—3in. x 2in. jarrah spaced 20in. centre to centre.

Top and bottom plates—not less than 3in. x 2in. jarrah. Flooring—not less than 1in. in thickness.

Studs—not less than 3in. x 2in. jarrah spaced not more than 2 feet centre to centre.

Ceiling joists—not less than 3in. x 2in. jarrah spaced not more than 2 feet centre to centre.

Ceiling hangers—7in. x $1\frac{1}{4}$ in. spaced not more than 7 feet apart.

Purlins—3in. x $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. jarrah (iron roof), 2in. x 1in. (tile roof).

Under Purlins—3in. x 2in. jarrah (iron roof), 4in. x 3in. jarrah (tile roof).

Collar ties—3in. x 2in. jarrah.

Rafters—(iron roof) 3in. x 2in. jarrah spacing 3 feet centre to centre; (tile roof) 4in. x 2in. jarrah spacing 18in. centre to centre. All to be properly braced with purlins and collar ties.

Ridge—8in. x 1in. jarrah.

Facia—8in. x 1in. jarrah.

Hips and valleys—8in. x 1in. jarrah.

Weatherboards—not less than $1\frac{1}{4}$ in. lap.

Stays—2in. x $\frac{3}{4}$ in. (3in. x 2in. studs), 3in. x $\frac{3}{4}$ in. (4in. x 2in. studs) jarrah.

Vermis (bottom) plates must be used in the construction of all wooden buildings except sheds.

No framing timber to be notched or checked out to receive bracing or otherwise so as to reduce its cross sectional area more than one sixth.

55. Roughcast and stucco-roughcast and stucco work shall be applied only to brickwork, provided that in certain cases such as gables of dwellings or other ornamental sections of dwellings roughcast may be applied to expanded metal fixed in an approved manner.

56. Interior Walls of Dwellings.—The interior of all walls and ceilings of every wooden or wooden framed building which is intended to be used, or which may be used as a dwelling shall be constructed of plaster sheets, or other fire-resisting materials.

57. Roofs.—The roof of every building shall be constructed of metal, tiles, slates or other approved materials. No main roof shall have a lesser pitch than 20 degrees.

58. Reinforced Concrete Buildings.—In all cases where reinforced concrete is employed, whether in buildings as a whole or in portions of buildings before the actual carrying out of the work or any portion thereof, complete drawings of such work or portion shall be delivered to the inspector, showing all details of the construction and the size, spacing and all arrangement of all reinforcing members.

59. Public Buildings.—In any case in which the plans of any proposed buildings are required by law to be approved by the Public Works Department, such approval shall be obtained before such plans are submitted for the Board's approval.

60. Alterations.—Except with the consent of the Board or the inspector, no alteration shall be made to any building in such a manner that when so altered it will, by reason of such alteration, not be in conformity with the provisions of this by-law relating to new buildings.

61. Additions and Alterations.—Every addition to or alteration of a building, and any other work made or done for any purpose in or on a building (except necessary repairs which do not affect the construction of a building) shall so far as regards such addition, or alteration, or other work, be subject to the provisions of this by-law relating to new buildings.

PART 6.

Ventilation, Lighting and Drainage.

62. Height of Rooms.—The main rooms in all buildings shall be in every part not less than 9ft. 6in. from the floor to the ceiling, and the minimum height for wash-houses and bathrooms shall be 7ft. 6in.

63. Attic Rooms.—Provided that in the case of buildings of more than one storey, living rooms wholly or partly in the roof may be not less than 9ft. in height from floor to ceiling over two-thirds of the floor area.

64. Minimum Area of Rooms.—No main room in any building shall have a less floor area than 100 square feet.

65. Windows (Natural Lighting).—All rooms in a building intended to be used as a dwelling shall have one or more windows opening into the external air, the area of such window shall be not less than one tenth of the area of the floor of the room in which such window or windows are fitted.

66. Ventilation (Dwellings).—Every part and every room of any dwelling house or building intended to be used for habitation shall be ventilated in the ratio of 24 square inches of inlet and 24 square inches of outlet of uncontrolled ventilating area to each hundred square feet of floor space.

67. Ventilation (other than Dwellings).—The ventilation of all buildings, parts of buildings, type of ventilators to be used, arrangement and situation of ventilation openings shall be subject to approval.

68. Ventilation (subfloor).—The space under the ground floor of every building shall be provided with a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to allow a current of air to flow freely under all parts of the building. Type of ventilators used and spacing of same shall be the subject of approval by the inspector.

69. Lighting and Ventilation (Shops).—The provisions of this part of this by-law relating to height of rooms, lighting and ventilating of main rooms in dwellings shall, as far as applicable, apply to all shops save that the windows need not be constructed to open if other approved provision for ventilation is made, and that the minimum height of walls in shops shall be 11 feet.

70. Enclosing of Verandahs.—No verandah of any dwelling, or shop, or other building shall be enclosed, or built in in such a manner as to exclude natural light, or reduce the proper ventilation of any building or any part thereof. The use of hessian, or jute bags, or similar material for enclosing or screening verandahs is prohibited.

71. Floors.—Floors shall be fixed level, and in all buildings the ground floor, if of wood shall have a space of not less than six inches between the ground and the underside of the floor bearers.

72. Permit may be refused if drainage not satisfactory.—The Board may refuse to approve the plan of any building, or any addition, or alteration to any building, until it is satisfied that the proposed building, or addition, or alteration and the site and curtilage thereof will be properly drained.

73. Drainage of Waste Water.—Every person who shall erect a building shall provide proper drainage for the disposal of all waste water, in conformity with the Health Act and by-laws.

74. Waste Pipes.—Waste pipes from baths, sinks, washtroughs, and similar sanitary fittings shall be of wrought iron of approved sizes. All sanitary fittings shall be provided with traps under fittings, metal cleaning eyes shall be fitted at all changes of direction and angles of waste pipes.

75. Roof Water Disposal.—All buildings shall be provided with gutters and downpipes of approved sizes sufficient to carry all water from every part of the roof in an efficient manner, such water shall be carried at least two feet clear of the foundations of the buildings. In case of large buildings where the inspector shall deem it necessary all stormwater from the roof of such buildings shall be carried by pipes direct to the street drains or gutters in such a manner as directed by the inspector.

76. Water Supply.—Every dwelling house not connected to a public water supply shall be provided with a water storage tank of not less than one thousand gallons capacity. Such tank shall be completely covered at its top and provided with a manhole fitted with a tight fitting lid.

77. Provision of Manhole in Ceiling.—Every building shall be provided with one or more manholes in the ceiling to enable access to be gained to the underside of the roof thereof.

77a. Each house shall have a separate sanitary convenience, bathroom and laundry and cooking facilities, constructed, equipped and drained to the satisfaction of the inspector.

PART 7.

78. Removal of Buildings.—If any building is removed from outside the district to within the district, or from a site within the district to another site within the district, whether on the same or another block of land, such building shall be deemed for the purpose of this by-law to be a new building erected for the first time on the site whither it is removed.

PART 8.

79. Verandahs, Projections, Signs, Hoardings and Fences.—Verandahs (a) No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any portico or verandah over the footway of any road in the district without first obtaining the consent of the Board in writing. The lowest part of the frieze or rails of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 8 feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

80. Openings in Verandah Roof.—(b) No opening shall be made in the roof of such verandah for the purpose of affording light, unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with fine mesh wire-netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the inspector.

81. Porch, Landing, etc.—Every porch, gangway, outside landing, and outside step shall be of fire-resisting material and shall not project beyond the boundary of any road or public place.

82. Shop Windows.—Shop windows intended to be used for the display of goods or business advertisements shall consist of plate or approved glass jointed and fixed in approved metal or timber frames, the level of the sill of such frames to be not higher than 30 inches, nor within 12 inches of the level of the footpath immediately adjoining the same.

83. Woodwork Abutting on Roads.—Woodwork shall not be fixed flush with the face of any wall abutting on a road unless it is encased with metal of not less gauge than 22.

84. Signboard, Hanging Lamp, etc.—No signboard, hanging lamp, or other fixture shall be erected on or attached to any building or verandah projecting over any road unless the permission in writing of the Board be first obtained. Each such signboard, hanging lamp, or other fixture shall be of material, construction and design approved by the inspector and shall be in no part less than 8 feet above the level of the footpath or road. No signboard shall exceed in depth 3 feet, nor unless attached to a verandah project over a footpath or road.

85. Unsightly or Dangerous Fence.—When any fence abutting on or within 10 feet of any road or public place within the district is in a dangerous or unsightly state, the Board may by notice in writing to be served on the owner of such fence require such owner within fourteen days from the receipt of such notice to take down or repair such fence as the case may require, and such owner shall comply with such notice.

PART 9.

Chimneys, Flues, Fireplaces and Heating Apparatus.

86. Foundations, Footings, etc.—(1). Chimneys shall be built on solid foundations and with footings similar to the footings of the wall against which they are built, unless they are carried on steel girders with direct bearings upon party, external, or cross-walls, to the satisfaction of the inspector, or on corbels of brick, stone or other incombustible material, and the work so corbelled out does not project from the wall more than the thickness of the wall measured immediately below the corbel.

(2). Chimneys may be corbelled out 14 inches from walls nine inches in thickness on corbels of stone or incombustible material not less than 10 inches in depth and of the full width of the jambs.

87. Chimneys, etc., with Soot Doors.—(1) Chimneys and flues having proper soot doors of not less than 40 square inches may be constructed at such an angle as is

approved by the inspector, but in no other case shall any flue be inclined at less angle than 45 degrees to the horizon and every angle shall be properly rounded.

(2). Position of Soot Doors.—All soot doors shall be distant at least 15 inches from any woodwork.

88. Arches.—An arch of brick or stone of sufficient strength shall be built over the opening of every chimney to support the breast thereof.

Every chamber arch shall have the abutments tied in by an iron bar or bars of sufficient strength turned up or down at the ends and built into the jamb for at least four and a half inches on each side.

89. Flues.—A flue shall not be adapted to or used for any new oven, furnace, steam boiler or other fire used for any purpose of trade or business, or to, or for the range or cooking apparatus of any hotel, tavern or eating house, unless the flue is surrounded with brickwork at least nine inches thick, or concrete six inches thick, from the floor of the storey on which such oven, steam boiler or other fire is situated, to 12 inches above the roof.

90. Flues in Connection with Engines.—A flue shall not be used in connection with a steam boiler, or hot air engine, unless the flue is at least 20 feet in height measured from the level of the floor on which such engine is placed.

91. Lining of Flues.—The inside of every flue and also the outside where passing through any floor or roof or space enclosed by a roof or behind or against any wood work shall be rendered or pargetted or lined with fire resisting piping or stoneware.

92. Jambs.—The jambs of every fire place opening shall extend at least nine inches on each side of the opening thereof.

93. Incombustible Material in Certain Cases.—The breast of every chimney shall be of incombustible material at least four inches in thickness and the brickwork surrounding every smoke flue shall be at least four and a half inches in thickness.

94. Backs of Fireplaces.—The back of every fire-place opening in party or internal walls from the hearth up to a height of 12 inches above the lintel or arc shall be brickwork at least nine inches thick or shall be reinforced concrete six inches thick. No flue shall be within two inches of the centre line of any party wall.

95. Thickness of Flues.—The thickness of the upper side of every flue when its course makes with the horizon an angle of less than 45 degrees shall be at least nine inches.

96. Height.—Every chimney flue or chimney shaft shall be carried up in brick or stonework at least four inches thick throughout to a height of not less than three feet above the roof, flat or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the highest point in the line of junction with such roof, flat or gutter.

97. Top Courses.—The highest six courses of every chimney stack or shaft shall be built in cement mortar.

97a. Chimney Shafts.—The brickwork or stonework of every chimney shaft except that of the furnace of any steam engine, brewery, distillery or manufactory shall not be built higher above the roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, than a height equal to six times the least width of such chimney shaft at the level of such highest point in the line of junction, unless such chimney shaft is built with and bonded to another chimney shaft not in the same line with the first or otherwise rendered secure to the approval of the inspector.

98. Slabs.—There shall be laid level with the floor of every storey before the opening of every chimney, a slab of stone, slate or other incombustible material at least six inches longer on each side than the width of such opening, and at least 14 inches wide in front of the breast thereof.

99. How to be Laid.—On every floor except the lowest floor, such slab shall be laid wholly on stone or iron bearers, or upon brick trimmers, or other incombustible materials, but on the lowest floor it may be bedded on concrete covering the site, or on solid materials placed on such concrete.

100. Hearths, etc.—The hearth or slab of every chimney shall be bedded wholly on brick, stone or other incombustible materials and shall together with such materials be solid for a thickness of six inches at least beneath the upper surface of such hearth or slab.

101. Flues in Party Walls.—A flue shall not be built in, or against any party structure or existing wall unless it is surrounded with good strong brickwork or other approved material at least four and a half inches thick, properly bonded to the satisfaction of the inspector.

102. Cutting away Chimney Breast.—A chimney breast or shaft built with or in any party wall shall not be cut away unless the inspector certifies that it can be done without injuriously affecting the stability of any building.

103. Cutting into Chimney Shaft.—A chimney shaft, jamb, breast or flue shall not be cut into except for the purpose of repair, or doing one or more of the following things—(a) Letting in or removing or altering flues, pipes or funnels for the conveyance of smoke, hot air or steam; (b) forming openings for soot doors, each opening to be fitted with a close iron door and frames; (c) making openings for the insertion of ventilating valves. Provided that an opening shall not be made nearer than 12 inches to any timber or combustible substance.

104. Position of Timberwork.—Timber or woodwork shall not be placed—(a) under any chimney opening within six inches from the upper surface of the hearth of such chimney opening; (b) within two inches from the face of the brickwork or stonework about any chimney or flue unless the face of such brickwork or stonework is rendered.

105. Position of Wooden Plugs.—Wooden plugs shall not be driven nearer than three inches to the inside of any chimney or flue opening nor any iron holdfast or other iron fastening nearer than two inches thereto.

106.—Ironwork.—No iron or steel joists or other ironwork shall be placed in any flue except insofar as the same may be required for insuring stability.

107. Floors above Furnace or Ovens.—The floor or roof over any room or enclosed space in which a furnace is fixed or any floor within 18 inches from the crown of an oven shall be constructed of fire-resisting material.

PART 10.

Exempted Buildings.

108. Ferneries, Aviaries, etc.—This by-law shall not apply to any greenhouse, fernery, aviary or to an outbuilding if such outbuilding is on an area of not less than five acres used for agricultural or similar purposes only, or to temporary or removable offices or sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period of not exceeding 12 months.

PART 11.

Enforcement of By-laws and Penalties.

109. No building may be erected except in compliance with this By-law.—No person shall erect, build or construct, remove or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built or constructed, removed or make any alteration or addition to any building contrary to the provisions of this by-law.

110. Penalty for Breach.—Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law or shall fail duly to comply with any notice thereunder, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding twenty pounds.

111. Certificate of Inspector.—If the inspector shall certify in writing to the Board that any building has been removed into or erected or re-erected within the district or occupied contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law or that any building is in such a dilapidated, ruinous or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to public safety the Board or any officer thereof or other authorised agent, may give to the owner, occupier or builder or leave upon the site of such building a notice in writing requiring such owner to alter or repair or to remove or to pull down such building within such time as is limited by such notice and such owner, occupier or builder shall comply with such notice within the time limited.

112. Notice to make a building conform to the By-laws.—If any building shall be wholly or partly built, erected or added to or altered, contrary to or not in conformity with the provisions of this by-law the Board or any officer thereof, may give to the owner, occupier or

builder or leave upon the site of such building, notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building within such time as is limited in such notice and such owner, occupier or builder shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

113. Power of Board where such building or erection is contrary to By-laws.—If default shall be made in complying with any notice mentioned in the last two preceding clauses, then, notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Board by its inspector, officer or other authorised agent or agents to enter upon any building and the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose, to break down any fence surrounding the land on which the building is situate, and to demolish and pull down the said building or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place and if the Board in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Board, its inspector, officer or other authorised agent or agents, in demolishing and pulling down the said building or any part thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all the fees and penalties due by the owner, occupier or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Board out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Board shall restore the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner, occupier or builder or other person legally entitled thereto on demand and any deficiency shall be made good and paid by the owner, occupier or builder to the Board on demand.

PART 12.

Areas and Spaces.

Dwelling Houses.

114. Distance from Road.—No building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house and no addition to such building shall be built within a distance of 20 feet measured horizontally from the road the building fronts, unless a building line at a different distance has been fixed by a proper authority.

115. Distance from Side Boundary.—No building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house and no addition to any building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house shall be built within a distance of three feet if of brick or four feet if of wood or wood frame, measured horizontally from the boundary of the allotment on which such building is erected.

116. Minimum Area of Land.—No person shall build or cause to be built any building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area equal to 30 perches and has a depth of not less than 120 feet with a clear frontage to a road of not less than 50 lineal feet; provided that two buildings (and no more) to be used as dwelling houses may be erected on a site having an area of not less than 45 perches. Where two dwellings are to be erected on the same site, then the following conditions shall apply—(a) the second dwelling shall not be built within a distance of 20 feet to the first dwelling except that where the second dwelling is built facing the same boundary alignment and upon approximately the same building alignment as the first dwelling then the distance apart may be reduced but in no circumstances below eight feet. The decision of the Board as to the minimum distance permitted, shall be final.

117. Minimum Area of Open Land.—At least one third of the area of any allotment on which a dwelling house is erected shall be left open and unbuilt on and for the exclusive use of the occupiers of the buildings erected upon such allotment.

118. Minimum Area of Dwelling Houses.—Every dwelling house shall consist of a total area of at least 500 square feet and shall contain not less than three main rooms.

119. Computing Distances.—For the purpose of computing distances from any building, the outer face of the wall or where a verandah is erected, then a point immediately below the outer face of the verandah plate shall be taken as the point from which measurements are to be taken.

Shops.

120. Minimum Area of Land.—(1) Every shop shall have a frontage to a road of at least 16 feet. (2) No shop shall be of less width in any part thereof than 16 feet.

121. Permit for the Erection of Shop where Dwelling not Attached.—Permission may be granted for the erection of a shop where a dwelling is not attached and where no person resides at such shop, on land having a frontage of 16 feet to a road and a depth of not less than 35 feet and a superficial area of not less than 560 square feet; provided that no portion of such shop or building shall be erected within 15 feet of the rear boundary of such land and only if the Board shall approve of the site of the proposed building and the suitability of the site for the type of business to be conducted at such shop.

122. Access to Rear of Shop.—Every shop shall be so erected and built that without passing through the building there is reasonable access to the back premises and offices of such shop for the removal of nightsoil and other refuse to a road or lane 10 feet wide at least.

123. Separate Entrance for Shop and Dwelling in Different Occupations.—If a dwelling attached to a shop is in a different occupation from a shop, a separate entrance from the road shall be provided for the sole use of the occupants of the dwelling.

Apartment Buildings.

124. Area of Land to be Occupied.—The total area covered by an apartment building together with the area covered by any other buildings erected on the same allotment shall not exceed half the area of such allotment.

125. Area of each Apartment.—The total area of each apartment shall be at least 350 square feet and shall have not less than 70 square feet of verandah for the sole use of the occupant of such apartment.

126. Area of Main Rooms.—Every main room in an apartment shall have a floor area of at least 100 square feet.

127. Conveniences.—Every apartment building shall have separate sanitary conveniences for each sex so situated and screened as to ensure privacy. The nature and number of conveniences shall be as under:—bathroom—not less than one bathroom to each three apartments; lavatories—not less than one lavatory to each two apartments; laundries—not less than one laundry to each six apartments.

128. Entrance.—Each apartment shall have a separate entrance from the outside of the building.

PART 13.

Brick Area.

129. Area of Operation.—That area bounded by a line starting at the junction of James Street and the Esplanade and proceeding westwards along James Street to Dempster Street, thence southwards along Dempster Street to the south boundary of the original townsite of Esperance, being also the south boundaries of Esperance town lots 28 and 29, thence eastwards along the said boundary to the Esplanade, thence northwards along the Esplanade to the starting point.

130. Material for Walls.—All walls internal or external of any building shall be constructed of concrete, brick or stone.

PART 14.

Miscellaneous.

131. No Alteration Infringing By-law.—No alteration shall be made in any building in such a manner that when so altered it will by reason of such alteration not be in conformity with the provisions of this by-law relating to new buildings.

132. No User Infringing By-law.—No person shall occupy or permit to be occupied any building for any purpose for which such building could not have been built under the provisions of this by-law; provided that this clause shall not prevent the continued use of any building in existence at the time of coming into operation of this by-law, for any purpose for which it was then being used.

NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924-1939.

Destruction and Prevention of Noxious Weeds.—By-law
 123.

THE Gingin Road Board acting pursuant to section 26 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, doth hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

Gingin Road Board.

Destruction of Noxious Weeds.

(1) Every owner and every occupier of land within the district of the Gingin Road Board upon which any noxious weeds are growing or present shall take one or more of the following alternative acts to destroy such noxious weeds and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all such noxious weeds have been destroyed:—

(a) Pull all such noxious weeds from the ground by hand, or

(b) sever all such noxious weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand, or

(c) cultivate the ground by means of an implement which will sever such noxious weeds below the ground level, or

(d) plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the Board, or

(e) break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, mowing machine or reaping and binding machine, or

(f) in cases where the plants are dry and there is suitable herbage cover, burn such noxious weeds by means of a running fire, or

(g) spray with approved materials, or

(h) carry out any other method ordered by the Board.

(2) The local inspector appointed by the Board under the said Act may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any land within the said district require him to take any particular measures or do any particular acts mentioned in the last preceding paragraph to destroy and dispose of noxious weeds growing or being on the land owned or occupied by him, and he shall forthwith take or do the same without having the alternatives mentioned in such paragraph.

(3) Any person who commits any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
