WHEREAS the Bill for an Act to amend the Supreme Court Act, 1935, cited as the Supreme Court Act Amendment Act, 1945 (Act No. 35 of 1945), was on the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure; and whereas at the Court at Buckingham Palace on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, in the presence of the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, His Majesty did by Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council declare His Assent to the said Bill: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 8 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1938, do by this Proclamation declare that His Majesty has assented to the said Bill and that the said Bill shall come into operation as an Act on the day of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855, that the Governor may by proclamation from time to time frame, alter, amend or repeal rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance to be observed

by all masters and commanders of all ships or vessels in any of the ports or harbours of Western Australia and by all persons duly appointed or licensed to act as harbour masters or pilots in such ports or harbours and may substitute others in their stead but so that all such rules and regulations shall be promulgated by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before the same shall take effect at the expiration of which time the same shall be in full force and effect; and whereas the Governor did by proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of November, 1917, make regulations in accordance with the said Ordinance which came into force on the 20th day of December, 1917, and are still in operation as from time to time subsequently amended, which said regulations are contained and set forth in the Schedule to the said Proclamation; and whereas by a proclamation dated the 24th day of February, 1931, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of February, 1931, the Governor amended the said regulations first hereinbefore mentioned by adding thereto after regulation 61 thereof further regulations numbered 61A to 61R, both inclusive, which came into operation on the 1st day of April, 1931, and are still in operation; and whereas by a proclamation dated the 25th day of October, 1944 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of February, 1945, the Governor amended the said regulations gazetted on the 27th day of February, 1931, which amendments came into operation forthwith after the expiration of one month from the said 2nd day of February, 1945, and are still in operation; and whereas it is deemed desirable to amend further the said regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said Ordinance, do hereby further amend the said regulations as contained in the said proclamation dated the 24th day of February, 1931, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of February, 1931, and amended by the said proclamation dated the 25th day of October, 1944, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of February, 1945, as aforesaid, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder; and I do by this proclamation declare that the further amendments to such regulations hereby made shall come into operation

forthwith after the expiration of one month from the publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

Regulation 61 I is amended by adding thereto a proviso as follows:—

Provided that in the ports of Albany and Onslow in the State and until shore steam is available for the purpose of discharging or unloading inflammable liquid in bulk, the masters and commanders of all oil vessels may, subject to the written approval of the Manager of the Harbour and Lights Department, use ship's steam for the purpose aforesaid.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, by means of fishing nets, in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the First Schedule hereto, for a term of three years from 15th May, 1946, and from any portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Second Schedule hereto from 1st August, 1946, to 31st December, 1946, and from 1st January to 30th April, and 1st August to 31st December in each of the years 1947 and 1948 and from 1st January to 30th April, 1949, all dates inclusive.

Schedule 1.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island within the sea limits of half a mile from the foreshore from Salmon Point east, north-east, north and north-west, to North Point.

Schedule 2.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island within the sea limits of half a mile from the foreshore from Salmon Point west, north, east and north-east to North Point.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, revoke any Proclamation previously issued under the said section 4 relating to the waiving or postponing of the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and the exempting of the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with, or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement: Now, therefore, I Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation revoke the proclamations dated the 5th day of March, 1943; 4th day of June, 1943; 3rd day of September, 1943; 28th day of January, 1944 and 27th day of April, 1945, in so far as the said proclamations waived the payment of rent and/or exempted the holders of the mining tenements mentioned in the Schedule hereunder from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that during a time of war the Governor may by proclamation, for the period mentioned in such proclamation, waive or postpone the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and exempt the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement; and whereas a time of war now exists, to wit, the war in which His Majesty is now engaged with Germany, Italy and Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the present war"), and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 4 in relation to certain mining tenements during the present war: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this proclamation direct in relation to the mining tenements set out in the Schedule hereunder and for the period stated in the said Schedule that the payment of rent shall be waived and the holders of the mining tenements mentioned in the said Schedule shall be exempted from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 2A of the Mine Workers' Relief (War Service) Act, 1940-1945, it is enacted that for the purposes of section 4 of that Act the Governor may, during a time of war, by proclamation, declare that any service or employment or activity of a non-combatant nature in which persons are engaged and which in the opinion of the Governor is connected with or incidental to or arises out of the prosecution of the war then being waged, and any internment in an internment camp, shall be service incidental to war service; and whereas a time of war still exists within the meaning of the term set out in the Mine Workers' Relief (War Service) Act, 1940-1945, and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 2A:

Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this proclamation declare that the classes of non-combatant service, employment or activity mentioned in the Schedule hereunder shall be service incidental to war service.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-44.

Bruce Rock Road Board—Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-44, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act; and whereas a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series "A" published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th day of April, 1927, have been adopted by the Bruce Rock Road Board by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th May, 1928; and whereas under section 320 of the Health Act a local authority may from time to time make by-laws: Now, therefore, the Bruce Rock Road Board, being a local authority within the meaning of the Act, doth hereby make the following by-law to stand as by-law 16A of Part 7 of the said Model By-laws Series "A."

By-law 16A.—"Wrapping of Foodstuffs."

(a) No person shall sell or permit to be sold any food in or from any shop, stall, or barrow for the purpose of being carried away from such shop, stall, or barrow, unless such food is wrapped or packed so as to be protected from contamination.

(b) When paper is used for such wrapping or packing, only clean new white or brown paper shall be used, and such paper shall have no writing or printing thereon, except upon the outside thereof, provided that vegetables, including salad vegetables, may be wrapped in clean newspaper obtained direct from the publisher thereof and not previously sold or used for any purpose.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 14 of 1945.

Between Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia, Western Australian Branch Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Government Printer, Perth, Western Australia, Respondent.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now therefore the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941 and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed to be an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(NOTE.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This award shall apply to members of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia, Western Australian Branch Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, employed by the Government Printer, Perth.

2.—Term.

This award shall operate for a period of twelve (12) months dating from the 12th day of April, 1946. After the expiration of the aforementioned period application may be made by either party for alteration, revision or amendment of any provision contained therein.

3.—Rates of Wages.

Adult Males.

Where any class of work to which this claim relates is performed by an adult male employee, the employee shall be paid the amount of the State basic wage assigned to the Metropolitan Area, and he shall also be paid the sum (being the marginal difference) prescribed in the third column of Table "A."

D7 A female junior entering the industry in her eighteenth year or later shall receive the foregoing rate appropriate to her experience, and not less than 5s. per week extra until she reaches the age of twenty-one years, and then she shall be paid the minimum wage prescribed for females for the class of work which she is doing.

D8 In the above provisions as to work performed by females "experience" means experience in a branch of the industry including experience in the employ of more than one employer, and any female employee mentioned in such provisions on leaving or being discharged from her employment shall be entitled to a certificate from her employer stating the date when such employment began, and the date of its termination, duly signed or authenticated by the employer. Such certificate shall be the property of the employee, and shall be returned to her by any subsequent employer within seven (7) days of her engagement. The proportion of juniors to seniors shall not exceed two juniors to one senior. In assessing this proportion the establishment shall be considered as a whole: Provided that any dispute in regard to this clause shall be referred to the Board of Reference.

4.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary hours of work for all employees (excepting machine compositors, readers and/or revisers and copy-holders) covered by this Award shall not exceed 44 hours per week, provided that the 44 hours may be worked in five or six days at the discretion of the employer.

(b) The ordinary hours of a machine compositor shall be 42 (forty-two) hours per week. The 42 hours may be worked in five or six days at the discretion of the employer.

(c) The hours of work in the reading room shall remain as at present.

(d) Day work shall mean work done between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily; night work shall mean work done between 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. Provided that the time of starting work of the linotype mechanic or other male person who attends to arrange the heat of linotype or like metal pots may be 7 a.m.

(e) Any employee called upon to work night work shall have his weekly hours of work reduced by four: Provided that the minimum number of hours per week shall not be reduced below 38.

(f) Each shift shall stand by itself and all time worked in excess of the usual working hours shall be paid for at overtime rates hereinafter set forth.

(g) Hours of cleaners and lift men shall remain as at present.

(h) In the event of the Court delivering a decision reducing the standard hours to be worked in industry in Western Australia, liberty is reserved to the Union to apply for an amendment to this clause.

5.—Meal Period.

(a) The minimum time allowance for meals shall be three-quarters of an hour, and the maximum allowance one hour.

(b) No employee shall be compelled to break shift except for meals, and no shift shall exceed five hours without a break for meals.

(c) The lunch period of any employee shall be between the hours of noon and 2 p.m.

6.—Roster of Hours.

(a) A roster of daily and weekly hours of shift is to be prominently displayed in the various sections of the factory.

(b) Work performed outside the rostered hours shall be paid for at overtime rates in accordance with clause 7, Overtime.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first three (3) hours, and double time thereafter.

Provided, however, that readers and/or revisers shall not be paid for overtime until they have worked six (6) hours in any one (1) week. Then they shall be paid for all overtime in excess of thirty-eight (38) hours.

(b) An employee starting before his usual rostered shift shall be paid time and half.

(c) Each day shall stand by itself.

(d) Work done on Saturday afternoon or Sunday and all holidays shall be paid for at double time rates.

(e) Any male employee required to work overtime for more than one hour shall be entitled to 2s. tea money if not notified twenty-four (24) hours prior to such overtime being worked. Female employees required to work overtime for more than half an hour shall be entitled to 2s. meal money.

(f) An employer shall not permit any female employee to work overtime after 6 p.m. unless at least one other female is present in the same department in which she is required to work.

(g) The employer shall not require or permit an employee to work overtime in a department using power driven machinery unless he works in company with at least one other person in the same department.

8.—Classes of Labour.

Only two classes of labour, journeymen and apprentices, shall be employed in any branch of the industry to which the Apprenticeship Clauses apply.

9.—Casual Employees.

Casual worker shall mean a worker employed for less than one week and shall receive twelve and half per centum (12½) per day in addition to the rates prescribed in this Award.

10.—Holidays.

Public holidays shall be in accordance with those granted by the State Government to the employees of the Government Printing Office and observed over a period of years.

11.—Annual Leave.

(a) Each worker, other than a casual, shall be entitled to two (2) consecutive working weeks annual leave each year on full pay, or should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

(b) Annual leave will be taken during a period to be arranged between the employer and the chapel, or, failing agreement, between the employer and the Union.

(c) All holidays shall be drawn for and holiday roster posted in each section, but the employer shall be allowed to change the draw of individuals to suit the convenience of his business prior to posting of the annual leave roster, and thereafter the roster shall remain unchanged except with the approval of the Government Printer, provided the Government Printer shall have the right to amend, vary, or cancel the roster to meet a change of circumstances, that could not reasonably be foreseen.

12.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted to all employees in accordance with the conditions applying to Government full time wages employees generally.

13.—Sick Pay.

Sick pay shall be paid in accordance with the conditions granted to the employees of the Government Printing Office by the State Government on 14th April, 1927, and at present existing in the Government Printing Office.

14.—Record Book.

The employer shall keep at his office a record of:—
(a) the names of all workers employed by him and to whom this Award applies, and

(b) The class of work performed, the hours worked (including overtime) and the wages paid to each such worker.

On notifying the officer in charge, the Secretary of the Union may inspect such record at any time during ordinary business hours and he shall have power to enter and inspect during working hours any part of the Printing Factory and to interview all employees in regard to rates and conditions of employment, provided that he shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

15.—Mixed Functions.

Any employee performing a duty for which a higher rate than his ordinary rate is paid, shall be paid such higher rate for the time actually worked.

An employee shall not be reduced to a lower classification without one week's notice.

16.—First Aid Chest.

The employer shall provide a first aid chest which shall be a suitable dust-proof receptacle, made of either metal or wood, for the use of the employees, in some accessible place. Such chest shall be equipped and supplied with the following articles, namely:—

17.—Bronze Work.

(a) All workers employed on bronze work shall be paid double time rates while so employed. Milk shall be provided before commencing, and occasionally during the progress of the work. The work shall be done in a room or place devoted solely to this operation.

(b) No female shall be permitted to do bronzing or dusting-off work.

18.—Time Off for Female Employees.

Existing custom in regard to morning and afternoon tea for female employees shall continue.

19.—Artificial Light.

Where the construction of a building is such that the worker is obliged to work in artificial light he shall be paid 10 per cent. increase on the rates herebefore prescribed during the time he is so engaged, provided that this provision shall not apply during the time overtime rates apply nor to occasions upon which dullness of natural light through weather condition makes artificial light necessary.

20.—Miscellaneous.

The employer shall provide suitable washing facilities for his workers and a suitable place for each worker to keep clothes. Where the floors are composed of materials known as granolithic, on concrete, or combinations of cement, stone or asphalt, employers shall provide some suitable materials upon which the workers may stand whilst at work.

A copy of this Award shall be kept in a convenient place in each workroom.

21.—No Reduction.

It is understood and agreed by both parties to this Award that nothing contained in this Award shall be construed so as to destroy or undermine any existing condition or privilege at present existing in the Government Printing Office; neither shall it be the medium of reducing any employee already enjoying a higher rate to a lower rate contained herein, or be the means of increasing his hours.

Any condition or circumstance arising that is not covered in this Award shall be dealt with by the Government Printer and the Union, and, failing agreement, it shall be referred to a Board of Reference for decision.

22.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of:—

(a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them;

(b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;

(c) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

23.—Pay Day.

Pay day shall be Friday of each week and on that day employees covered by this Award shall be paid for all time worked up to the finishing time of the usual shift on the preceding Wednesday. This clause over-rides any privileges, etc., claimed under clause 21.

24.—Cleaners and Caretakers.

The existing rates of pay and hours of work shall apply to cleaners and caretakers at present employed by the Government Printer, provided that when the present occupants vacate the position the rates of pay in the appropriate award shall apply.

25.—Apprentices.

Apprentices shall be engaged under the terms and regulations herein set forth:—

(1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Award.

(2) The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice, or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and he shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the term of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

(3) The Board of Reference constituted under this Award shall also act as the Apprenticeship Board.

(4) The functions of the Apprenticeship Board shall be as follows:—

(i) To advise the Court as regards apprenticeship matters in the Government Printing Office Award;

(ii) To combine with, and assist the Printing Industry Apprenticeship Board to carry out the standard as set out by the Printing Industry for the education and training of apprentices.

(iii) The decision of the Apprenticeship Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties: provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the chairman and the opposite parties and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review, within fourteen days of such decision; provided further, that all parties abide by the decision unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

(5) Apprentices shall be allowed to any one of the following trades:

(i) Hand Composing:—

An apprentice to hand composing shall be required to prove that he has passed the highest examination provided for in the primary school, or an equivalent examination, or to produce a certificate that he has attained that standard before being registered.

The employer shall have and use in his business at least one cylinder machine and one platen machine before he shall be deemed qualified to take an apprentice to hand composing.

(ii) Letterpress Machining:—

An apprentice to letterpress machining shall be taught and instructed in all phases of letterpress machining, and all things incidental thereto, including make-ready, the mixing and use of inks, black and colour printing, the class of paper and stock used, and the care of cylinder and platen letterpress machines, including the mechanism of such machines. For this purpose the employer shall have and use in his business at least one cylinder machine and one platen machine. An attendance at the Technical School shall be sufficient compliance with this clause as to colour printing.

(iii) Lithographing.

(iv) Bookbinding and Finishing.

(v) Paper ruling.

(vi) Stereotyping.

(vii) Linotype Mechanic and/or Monotype Mechanic.

(viii) Lithographic Art and/or Lithographic Camera Operator.

(6) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months, to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by this Award. In the event of his becoming an apprentice, such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

(7) A probationer shall submit himself to a suitable test prescribed by the Government Psychologist; the cost (if any) of such test shall be borne by the employer. Failure satisfactorily to pass such test shall entitle the employer to terminate the proposed apprenticeship.

Before completing such probationary period, the probationer shall submit himself to an eyesight test and obtain a certificate of his fitness to be apprenticed to the trade, and a copy of such certificate shall be attached to the notice of registration of the apprenticeship.

(8) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed Form 1 (a) in Appendix, and if at the date of coming into operation of this Award an employer is employing an apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(9) The Court may, in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

(10) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within fourteen days of the termination of the probationary period.

(11) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on Form 6 of Appendix, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, and the apprentice. No employer, guardian, or apprentice shall enter

into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(12) The agreement shall be executed in triplicate; and one part shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

(13) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provisions of the Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

(14) Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be for a period of five years.

Provided that the term of apprenticeship to hand composing may be extended for a period of twelve months for the purpose of learning machine composing, and during such extension the apprentice shall be subject to the same conditions as compositors learning machine composing, and shall be paid for each succeeding three months of such period an increase of twenty (20) per cent. of the difference between his last half-year's rate of wage and the minimum for the qualified machine composer. Provided also, that an apprentice learning machine composing under the foregoing provision, and fully employed in that capacity, shall be deemed to have completed his apprenticeship to hand composing, and the employer shall, subject to the foregoing provisions, be entitled to take another apprentice in his stead.

(15) Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain—

(a) the names and addresses of the parties to the agreement;

(b) the date of birth of the apprentice;

(c) a description of the industry, craft, occupation, or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound;

(d) the date on which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship;

(e) a condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and the apprentice to comply with the terms of the Industrial Award so far as they concern the apprentice;

(f) a condition that technical instruction, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time;

(g) a condition that, in the event of any apprentice in the opinion of the examiners not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense during the fifth year of such apprenticeship to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard;

(h) the general conditions of apprenticeship.

(16) The Court may order the transfer of an apprentice from one employer to another, either temporarily or permanently—

(a) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade, or

(b) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

(17) The transfer of every apprentice shall be on Form 2 in Appendix, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the new employer. The transfer Form shall be completed within one month of the date upon which the transfer is ordered to be effected.

(18) The document of transfer shall be held, one part by the late employer, one by the new employer, one by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be supplied by the employer to and be retained by the Registrar.

(19) Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice and guardian, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, qualified and willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by

the Award or otherwise, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

(20) Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

(21) On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court of the cause thereof.

(22) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the Clerk of the Court in Form 3 in the Appendix.

(a) No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court, on the application of the employer.

(b) It shall not be obligatory to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended by the employer for misconduct, but in any such case, the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same, the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension and, in the event of the application being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

(23) When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

(24) Subject to regulation (39) time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever, may, with the consent of the Court, on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement.

(25) In the event of an employer being unable to provide the work for the apprentice, or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

(26) Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice on other work in the factory or establishment.

(27) Every apprentice shall attend a Government Technical School, vocational classes, or classes of instruction, where provided, for instructions in such subjects as are deemed necessary for his branch of the trade. He shall be allowed the necessary time off during his ordinary working hours to attend such classes. Any apprentice failing to attend such classes when given time off for that purpose shall be deemed to have unlawfully absented himself from his employment and may have his wages reduced accordingly.

(28) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(29) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes shall be four hours per week.

(30) Where instruction is provided for any branch of the trade, the method of training shall be as follows:

(a) The name of each apprentice, as soon as he is registered as such, shall be forwarded by the Clerk of the Court to the Apprenticeship Board, which shall keep a waiting list of such enrolments.

(b) The full course of instruction shall be designed to cover the second, third, and fourth years of the apprenticeship term: Provided that, in the event of failure satisfactorily to complete such course by the end of the third year's instruction, the term may be extended (see Regulation (15) (g)).

(c) Each year's instruction shall be divided into two terms ending June and November respectively.

(d) Each session of instruction shall consist of four hours weekly.

(e) The syllabus covering the whole three years' period shall be drawn up by the instructors in collaboration with the Apprenticeship Board.

(f) The instructors shall complete the course set down by the syllabus for each term in time to hold the terminal and annual examinations.

(g) All practical work given out by the instructors shall be entered upon a "Work Docket," and this, with the student's first proof and final proof, shall be examined by the instructor, allotted the deserved number of marks, and carefully preserved in a "Dossier" for reference during and at the completion of his student course. These practical tests shall be recorded on a special form, which may be inspected from time to time by members of the Apprenticeship Board, who shall have the right to make periodical visits of inspection during class hours.

(h) The instructors shall forward to the Apprenticeship Board a monthly report of the attendance and conduct of students, such report to be in the hands of the Secretary of the Board by the seventh day of the following month.

(31) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by the examiners hereinafter provided for.

(32) The Clerk of the Court shall notify examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(33) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry, one shall be nominated by the employers and one by the workers, for each particular branch of the trade. Failing such nomination or nominations the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, at the request of any one of the examiners, and the decision of such Apprenticeship Board shall be final and conclusive.

(34) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and, where any apprentice fails to show progress, to enquire as to the opportunities provided by the employer for such apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within fourteen days from the date of holding the examination.

(35) Such examination shall include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(36) The method of conducting the examination of apprentices in those branches of the trade where technical instruction is provided shall be as follows:—

(a) Except in the case of the first examination, no apprentice shall be examined unless he has gained a pass in the previous examination.

(b) The whole of the practical work of the examination shall be performed at the technical school class room. In those branches of the trade where no technical instruction is provided, the examination shall be held at the factory where the apprentice is employed, and it shall then be the duty of the employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of such examination.

(c) The terminal (June) examination shall be for theory only, and shall be conducted by the instructors during the last week but one preceding the end of the term. The questions shall also be set by the instructors, and the written answers checked, and the deserved marks allotted. These, with each student's practical work for the term under review, shall be handed to the examiners, who shall approve, or otherwise, of the instructor's decisions. Any divergence of opinion that cannot be agreed upon mutually shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, whose decision shall be final.

(d) The examiners, shall, during the month of June, make their annual visit of inspection to each factory where apprentices are employed, and personally interview the employer (or foreman) and

also the apprentice, and shall satisfy themselves as to the assiduity of the apprentice in his daily work, and especially as to the facilities afforded him to enable him to make the required progress in his particular branch of the trade.

(e) The examiners shall present a report to the Court as to the progress made by the students during the term, and at the same time forward a copy to the Apprenticeship Board. The terminal report shall also cover their inspection of factories.

(f) The annual examination shall take place in November. The test papers shall be set by the examiners in collaboration with the instructors. The practical tests set during the term shall be checked by the examiners who shall also set each student a special practical test, which shall be performed under their direct supervision at the technical school class room during the second week of the examination. With these three results before them, viz., the written answers of the theory examination, the term's progressive tests already marked by the instructors, and the special test judged by themselves, the examiners shall draw up their annual report and submit same to the Court at least three days before the date fixed for the final day of the term. A copy of such report shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Board.

(g) Marks shall be awarded for these examinations as follows:—

A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70 to 79 per cent. shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

(h) At the conclusion of the student's course he shall sit for his final examination, which shall be conducted entirely by the examiners. A student securing marks totalling 96 per cent. and over shall be deemed to have attained "Honours," and shall be entitled to receive an additional "Honours" certificate. A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70 to 79 per cent. shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. of marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies for another term.

(i) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating (on Form 4 in the Appendix) the result of his examination, and the final certificate in Form 5 in Appendix.

(j) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this Award. Upon any proceeding against him in respect of such breach, the report may be received in evidence.

(k) Any apprentice claiming to have cause for complaint regarding instruction, either in Technical School or in workshop, shall have the right to appeal to the Apprenticeship Board.

(37) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the Examiners as the Court shall allow.

(38) The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount (if any) by which the wages prescribed by the Industrial Award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

(39) All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training, other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

(40) When an apprentice attends a Technical School during his ordinary working hours, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

(41) If the Apprenticeship Board makes representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School or other such place as it deems necessary.

(42) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

(43) Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court, with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or other such remedial measure as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

(44) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be—in the Hand Composing Branch in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of three, and in the other branches—one to every four or fraction of four (not being less than one) journeymen employed by him.

(45) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the above Act, and subject to the conditions therein prescribed, the Court of Arbitration hereby adjusts and amends the basic wage declaration made on the 12th day of June, 1945, so as to read and have effect as follows:—

Adults.

(1) Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be taken to be that portion of the State comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

(4) The wages being paid to these workers will be altered proportionately, if and when necessary, to the alterations in the basic wages above declared by the application of the percentage where percentages are fixed in the award or industrial agreement and by direct proportion where the amount and not percentage is prescribed.

Contract of Employment.

(5) Payment shall be pro rata where the term of employment is for less than one (1) week.

This order shall take effect from the commencement of the first pay period after the date hereof.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part X. of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, of Western Australia, this 24th day of April, 1946, between The Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter called the Association) of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter called the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all permanent officers employed within the State of Western Australia under the Public Service Act, 1904, in the Professional, Clerical and General Divisions whose maximum margins over the basic rate are less than four hundred and thirty-seven pounds (£437) per annum.

2.—Interpretation.

In this Agreement, the following expression shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby applied to it, namely:—

“Basic rate” means in the case of—

(a) Male or female officers employed in the metropolitan area; the nearest £ to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage respectively for that area as declared from time to time by the Industrial Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

(b) Male or female officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared; the nearest £ to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage, respectively, for that area as declared from time to time by the Industrial Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

3.—Professional Officers.

(a) The following classes and grades therein shall apply to male and female officers in the Professional Division subject to the provisions of clauses 4 and 5 in respect of Draftswomen and ex-cadets, respectively:—

(b) In making a classification under this clause the Commissioner may—

- (i) amalgamate any two (2) or more classes,
- (ii) notwithstanding Public Service Regulation 106, fix a limit at the following places only:—

Within Class 6 at the minimum and intermediate grade;

within Class 5 at the intermediate grade;

within Class 2 at the intermediate grade;

(iii) require from the Permanent Head a certificate of good conduct, efficiency and ability to perform higher duties before engineers, agricultural advisers and draftsmen proceed to a rate of pay exceeding a margin of two hundred and sixty-eight pounds (£268), two hundred and thirty-two pounds (£232) and one hundred and sixty pounds (£160) per annum, respectively, over the basic rate.

(c) A draftsman who obtains a diploma of the Perth Technical College for mechanical or structural engineering, or an equal or higher qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid an allowance of twelve pounds (£12) per annum whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of one hundred and ninety-six pounds (£196) per annum over the basic rate.

4.—Draftswomen.

(a) Draftswomen shall be paid the following margins over the basic rate:—

Second year	100
Third year	112
Fourth year	124

(b) Classes and grades beyond a margin of one hundred and twenty-four pounds (£124) per annum over the basic rate shall be those set out in subclause 3 (a) of this Agreement and the provisions of subclauses 3 (b) (i) and 3 (b) (ii) shall apply.

(c) A draftswoman who has been in receipt of a rate of pay equivalent to a margin of one hundred and twenty-four pounds (£124) per annum over the basic rate for one year or more shall be paid an allowance of twelve pounds (£12) per annum, provided she passes an examination as prescribed by the Commissioner; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position.

(d) A draftswoman retained on a rate of pay equivalent to a margin of one hundred and twenty-four pounds (£124) per annum over the basic rate for five (5) years and who is not in receipt of the allowance referred to in subclause 4 (c) hereof shall be paid an allowance of twelve pounds (£12) per annum: Provided the Permanent Head certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or an officer refusing to accept promotion.

5.—Ex-cadets.

(a) Any person who has graduated through a cadetship requiring a University degree or other academic qualification approved by the Commissioner may be employed on a probationary period of one year with a rate of pay equivalent to a margin of one hundred pounds (£100) per annum over the basic rate.

(b) Any person who has graduated through a cadetship requiring the passing of a Public Service examination only may be employed on a probationary period of two (2) years with a rate of pay for the first year equivalent to a margin of sixty-five pounds (£65) per annum over the basic rate and for the second year eighty pounds (£80).

(c) In the event of their appointment being confirmed at the end of the probationary period, they shall then be appointed at the commencing rate of the respective class to which they have qualified.

6.—Male Junior Clerks.

(a) The rates of pay of male junior clerks under the age of 21 years shall be:—

15 years	35%
16 years	45%
17 years	55%
18 years	65%
19 years	80%
20 years	90%

Notwithstanding the above scale, entrants from the Junior Certificate standard whose ages exceed 16 years may be paid at a rate equivalent to one grade less than the rate of pay according to age: Provided that an officer who, subsequent to his appointment, passes the Leaving Certificate Examination in such subjects as may be approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid the rate of pay according to age from the date of passing such examination.

(b) A junior clerk who is a married man or who is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Commissioner, shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the next higher grade than the rate of pay according to age.

(c) After attaining the age of 19 years and before reaching 23 years, all junior clerks will be required to pass a promotional examination as prescribed in the Public Service Regulations 94 and 96, and subsequent to passing such required examination and reaching the age of 21 years and on appointment to a position within the male adult automatic range, officers will, subject to Regulation 43, be paid the appropriate rate of pay

according to age at date of appointment to such position; subject, however, to the provision that on attaining the age of 21 years an officer shall be paid an amount equivalent to the basic rate.

7.—Male Adult Clerical Officers.

(a) Male adult clerical officers shall be paid the following margins over the basic rate, subject to the provisions of subclause 6 (c) of this Agreement:—

(b) Classes and grades beyond a margin of one hundred pounds (£100) per annum over the basic rate shall be those set out in subclause 3 (a) of this Agreement.

(c) In making a classification under subclause 7 (b) of this Agreement the Commissioner may—

(i) amalgamate any two (2) classes provided that no individual classification shall exceed five (5) grades in the incremental scale and that the total number of individual classifications comprising amalgamated classes under this subclause, together with the total number of individual classifications which have been fixed at a limit below the maximum of a class under subclause (c) (ii) hereof, shall not exceed twelve and a half per cent. (12½%) of the total number of male clerical positions classified into the classes set out in subclause 3 (a) of this Agreement;

(ii) notwithstanding Public Service Regulation 106, fix a limit at the following places:—

Within Class 6 at the minimum and intermediate grade,
within Class 5 at the intermediate grade,
within Class 2 at the intermediate grade.

(d) A male adult clerical officer who is a married man or is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Commissioner, shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the next higher grade than the rate of pay according to age with a maximum margin, inclusive of such allowance, of one hundred pounds (£100) per annum over the basic rate.

(e) An officer retained on the maximum of the automatic range for five (5) years shall be paid an allowance of twelve pounds (£12) per annum: Provided the Permanent Head certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or an officer refusing to accept promotion.

(f) An officer appointed under regulation 90 shall be at a minimum rate of pay, subject to regulation 43, based on years of service and not on age.

14.—Persons Temporarily Employed.

Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 1 hereof, a person temporarily employed under section 36 of the Public Service Act, 1904, shall be paid at a daily or weekly rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable in accordance with this Agreement to a permanent officer of not more than equal efficiency should he or she be engaged on similar duties, provided that in no case shall the provisions of subclauses 3 (c),

4 (c), 4 (d), 6 (b), 7 (d), 7 (e), 9 (d), 9 (e), 11 (d) and 13 (b) of this Agreement apply in respect of a person so temporarily employed.

15.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a report from the Permanent Head regarding the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officers as provided for by the Public Service Regulations, officers classified in the classes referred to in subclauses 3 (a), 4 (b), 7 (b), 9 (b), 11 (b) and 12 (a) of this Agreement shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of respective classes by annual increments according to the grades in such classes, except where the Commissioner has fixed a limit within a class in accordance with this Agreement. In the case of all other officers, progression from year to year shall be subject to the receipt of a similar report from the Permanent Head.

16.—Maintenance of Rights of Appeal.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained or implied, the rights of officers in respect of all appeals under the Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920, shall be preserved and maintained, subject to any legal rights which the Commissioner or any other respondent may have in relation thereto.

17.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years commencing from the 1st January, 1946.

Provided that either party to this Agreement may, after the 1st January, 1947, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, and if both parties agree, such Agreement may be amended by a supplementary Agreement, which shall be concurrent with this Agreement.
