WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-1913, that the Corresponding to the Common forms of the control of the Corresponding to the Cor

that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality; and whereas by a proclamation dated 30th July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as Macropus giganteus; and whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exer-Now, therefore 1, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from 1st June, 1946, until 31st May, 1947.

All that area of the State lying to the eastward of a straight line drawn from Lake Magenta, in the Roe Land District, to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
over the State of Western Australia

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatso-ever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from 1st May, 1946, to 30th April, 1950, inclusive.

The proclamation dated 28th December, 1944, and published in the Government Gazette of 5th January, 1945, is hereby revoked.

Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters at Geographe Bay within one quarter of a mile of any part of the Busselton Pier, or Jetty.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-34. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-34, which reads as follows:-

THE RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD ACT, 1920-1945.

Between the West Australian Railway Officers' Union (Applicant) and the Commissioner of Railways (Re-

APPLICATION having been made to the Railways Classification Board by the West Australian Railway Officers' Union under the provisions of regulation 18 (3) of the National Security (Economic Organisation) Regulations for variation of clause 26 (Rates of Pay) of Railways Classification Board Award No. 1 of 1939, and the Board having heard the parties and taken cognizance of the evidence submitted, the majority of the members of the Board formed the opinion that the grounds upon which alterations to rates of remuneration were sought provided prima facie evidence that alterations were necessary to remove anomalies and to compensate for changes in circumstances. In pursuance, therefore, of the regulations hereinbefore referred to, the Board reported on the matter to his Honour the Chief Judge, Commonwealth Court of Arbitration and Conciliation.

An order issued by His Honour the Chief Judge, dated the 17th April, 1946 (Reference—Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration No. 105 of 1946) authorising the Board to proceed and determine the matter has been received and the Board having further deliberated accordingly delivers its decision in the following terms.

2.—Determination.

(1) The Board has followed the decision of the Conciliation Commissioner* as closely as possible by continuing the increases of £30 and £20 per annum to foremen and sub-foremen respectively, and by awarding similar increases to all other railway officers on comparable margins. It is necessary to remove particular anomalies by awarding greater increases to certain officers (see under heading "Anomaly," paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 and "Exceptions" hereunder).

(2) Higher salaried foremen receive margins of £217-\$277 per annum; higher salaried sub-foremen receive margins of \$147-\$167 per annum. The Board has chosen the margin of £212 per annum as the dividing point and, subject to certain exceptions, awards an increase of £30 per annum to all officers receiving margins of £212 per annum or greater, and an increase of £20 per annum to all officers receiving margins of less than £212 per

- (g) (i) If a male officer is retained on the maximum of the sixth class (clerical or station-masters) or the fourth class (assistant and night station-masters) for five years, and has not refused promotion to a higher class, and the Head of his Branch certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of good conduct and efficiency, he may be paid, on the approval of the Commissioner, an allowance of £10 per annum.
- (ii) If such officer is subsequently promoted to class five clerical and station-masters or class three assistant and night station-masters, he will be entitled to advancement to the maximum of that class twelve months from the date he received the allowance.
- (h) Officers occupying the positions set forth in the attached Schedule shall be paid a salary not less than the minimum provided for the class in which such position has been classified: provided that, where an officer has been on the minimum, intermediate or maximum of his class he shall be advanced to the equivalent range under this Schedule. Officers who are classified on range of salary outside the Schedule of salaries shall be advanced similarly to those coming under the general schedule.
- (i) Officers (other than juniors) occupying all other positions will be paid the salary set forth in sixth class subclause (b).

- (j) Any officer over 21 years of age who has passed the pay officer's examination and is engaged in paying salaries or wages half or more of his time, shall be classified in the fifth class.
- (k) Advancement from minimum to maximum of any class shall be by yearly increment: provided such advancement shall be approved by the Commissioner, upon satisfactory report from the Head of the Branch in which the officer is employed, of his conduct, diligence, and efficiency, and provided also that the advancement in salary shall not be granted to an officer if the Commissioner determines that such officer has not performed his duties satisfactorily for the preceding twelve mentiles, or that such officer has been guilty of misconduct which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, justifies the postponement or refusal of the advancement.
- (1) An officer who is unable from any cause to perform the duties of his position and is in consequence provided with employment in another position in a lower class shall, unless the Commissioner directs otherwise, be paid the maximum rate for the class in which he has been provided.
- (m) Nothing in this Award shall be deemed to limit the power of the Commissioner to pay any officer at a higher rate than that prescribed in any case, where he may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the officer occupying such position.
- (n) The rates of pay for all officers shall be subject to adjustment in accordance with basic wage declaration of the State Court of Arbitration: provided that the basic wage payable shall be the nearest multiple of £5 to the result obtained by multiplying the State weekly basic wage by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).
