WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1945, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV. of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time by proclamation declare that Part III. of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to any river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp, or marsh specified in the proclamation to which immediately prior to the issue of the proclamation the said Part III. does not apply, but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of thirty days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp or marsh runs or is situate, to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by proclamation to declare that Part III. of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Gascoyne River (including the subterranean waters beneath the bed thereof) to which immediately prior to the issue of the proclamation the said Part III. does not apply; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister, and with the advice of the Commissioners, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III. of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1945, shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Gascoyne River (including the subterranean waters beneath the bed thereof) as shown marked and defined on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 30531, as kept in the Department of Public Works.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the day on which all shops, except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops, shall close at one o'clock shall be Saturday: Provided that the Governor may by proclamation at any time and from time to time, on the petition (according to the form in the Sixth Schedule) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district or specified locality not within the district, substitute in that district or locality for Saturday any other week day; and whereas a petition in due form has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Shop District of Northampton, praying that Wednesday may be substituted in that district for Saturday, as the day on which such shops shall close at one o'clock, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby substitute Wednesday for Saturday in the Northampton Shop District accordingly, and do

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Pig Industry Compensation Act, 1942, it is provided that in respect of every sale of any pig or carcass there shall be payable stamp duty of such amount as the Governor may by Proclamation prescribe; and whereas by Proclamation dated the 7th day of July, 1943, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of July, 1943, the stamp duty payable in respect of every such sale was prescribed to be twopence for every pound or part of a pound exceeding ten shillings; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to cancel and revoke the said Proclamation and in lieu thereof to issue this Proclamation making other provision as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, cancel and revoke the said Proclamation dated the 7th day of July, 1943, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of July, 1943, and proclaim in lieu thereof that on and after the First day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-six, the stamp duty payable on every sale of any pig or carcass shall be one penny for every pound or part of a pound exceeding ten shillings

(a) of the amount of the purchase money in respect of one pig or one carcass sold singly, or

(b) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of pigs or carcasses as the case may be, sold in one lot.

Provided that the stamp duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one pig or any one carcass, as the case may be, whether sold singly or as part of a lot, shall not exceed two shillings and sixpence.

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.
City of Perth—North Perth.

Proposed water main in Coogee Street and Ashby Street, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6832.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th day of June, 1946.

Water Boards Act, 1904-42.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 356/46, Ex. Co. 802.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1942, and the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the district of a local authority or two or more local authorities or any part or parts of such district or districts a Water Area, under such name as may be directed; and whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor may authorise the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to exercise within a Water Area all the functions of a Water Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute an area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereunder, a Water Area for the purpose of the said Acts, under the name of the Pemberton Water Area, and does hereby appoint the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to exercise all the functions of a Water Board under the Acts in such area.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 5th day of June, 1946.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting under the provisions of section 225 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, and on the advice of the Advisory Committee constituted under section 201 of the said Act, has been pleased to amend in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder, the Food and Drug Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of August, 1928, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter.

Schedule.

The abovementioned Food and Drug Regulations are amended by deleting sub-regulation (1A) of regulation 27 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

(1A) Pasteurised Milk means milk which has been treated by one of the following methods:—

(a) heated to a temperature of not less than 145 degrees and not more than 150 degrees Fahrenheit, and held at such temperature for not less than thirty minutes, and immediately thereafter cooled to a temperature of 45 degrees Fahrenheit.

(b) heated to a temperature of not less than 162 degrees and not more than 175 degrees Fahrenheit for at least fifteen seconds, and immediately thereafter cooled to a temperature of 45 degrees Fahrenheit.

Provided that on any apparatus used for pasteurising milk there shall be provided and operated such indicating thermometers and seven day recording thermometers as the licensing authority and/or the Commissioner of Public Health shall consider requisite, which shall be inserted in suitable places in the apparatus used for pasteurising during the whole of the pasteurising process, and the apparatus shall be thermostatically controlled.

Apparatus used for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (b) of this regulation shall be provided with a device which shall automatically divert the flow of milk, which has not been retained at a temperature of not less than 162 degrees Fahrenheit for a period of at least fifteen seconds. The type of apparatus and thermometers used and the methods employed shall be such as are satisfactory to the licensing authority and/or the Commissioner of Public Health.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws, for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made, by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act; and whereas a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws, with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series A have been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter; and whereas the Model By-laws have been further amended by notices published in the *Government Gazettes* of the 26th January, 1945, and the 30th November, 1945: Now, therefore, the Guildford Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, doth hereby adopt with the modifications hereinafter mentioned, the Model By-laws made under the said Act, and doth hereby further resolve and determine that the amendment of the said Model By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th January, 1945, shall be adopted, with the addition of the words "or wood or asbestos" after the word "iron" in the third line, and doth hereby resolve and determine that the amendment of the said Model By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th November, 1945, shall be adopted without modification, and together also with the amendments and modifications as contained in the Schedule hereto, to be the by-laws for the Health District of Guildford.

Schedule of Amendments and Modifications to Model By-laws.

Part I.—General Sanitary Provisions.

By-law 1 is amended by inserting the word "or" after the word "stone" in sub-paragraph (c) and by deleting the words "or other approved material" after the word "brick" in sub-paragraph (c).

(2) By-law 4 is amended by deleting the word "privy" wherever occurring in this by-law and substituting therefor the words "sanitary convenience."

(3) By adding the words "or trade" after the word "domestic" in by-law 21 of part 1.

(4) By inserting the words "owner or" before the word "occupier" in the first line of by-law 23.

(5) By adding to subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) of by-law 23 the following words:—"The owner or occupier executing any of the works in this by-law specified, and also any person actually carrying out such work on his behalf, shall be responsible for the submission of the aforesaid plan for approval. No such work or works shall be commenced until such approval has been obtained."

(6) By adding a paragraph after paragraph 1 of by-law 23, part 1, to be read as paragraph 1A, as follows:—

"1A. By discharging into a french drain, when so required by the Health Inspector, which shall comply with the following conditions:—

"(a) A sketch plan showing the design, situation, and construction, together with the connections with such french drain, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by an inspector.

"(b) It shall be constructed of agricultural drain pipes of not less than 4 inch diameter laid in a straight line, with open joints and completely surrounded with not less than 9 inches of broken blue metal of not less than 3 inch gauge, or with other approved material.

"(c) The house fittings shall be to the satisfaction of the inspector, and each such fitting shall be discharged over an open gully provided with a water-sealed trap. A grease intercepting trap of approved design and dimensions shall be installed at such premises as is considered necessary by the inspector and shall be situated where directed by the inspector.

"(d) The dimensions of the trench in which the drain is laid shall be determined by an inspector.

"(e) The french drain to be ventilated by means of a 4 inch diameter galvanised iron pipe erected

vertically, carried up to a height of not less than eight feet, or if the french drain is within twelve feet of the wall of the house, the longer pipe shall be carried up at least one foot above the eaves of each house.

"(f) Whenever ordered by an inspector, such french drain shall be emptied, cleansed, and disinfected in such manner and within such time as is specified in the requisition."

(7) By adding after the number (1) (1A) in by-law 23 (3), part 1.

(8) By adding after the words "A grease intercepting trap of approved design and dimensions shall be installed at such premises as is considered necessary by an inspector, and shall be situated where directed by the inspector," after the word "trap" in by-law 23 (1) (c), of part 1.

(9) By adding the words "or owner" after the word "occupier" in the first line of by-law 26 of part 1.

(10) By deleting the word "dwelling" in the second line of by-law 29 (b) and by adding the words "or poultry" after the word "pigeons" occurring in the second line of by-law 29 (b) of part 1.

(11) By adding the words "or owner of any dead animal" after the word "animal" in the first line of by-law 30 of part 1.

(12) By inserting a new subparagraph in part 1, to be known as subparagraph 41 (e) as follows:—

"41. (e) Where any house is not provided with an ample supply of clean wholesome water, the owner of the premises shall cause such house to be properly provided with a supply, either by connecting to any existing water main, constructing a well, or providing suitable rainwater tanks, such work to be carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector."

Part VII.—Food.

(13) By adding the words "or owner" after the word "occupier" in the first line of each of sections 4, 5, and 6, of Part VII.

(14) Add a new by-law after by-law 7 of Part VII. of the by-laws to be read as by-law 7A, as follows:—

"7A. The occupier of premises shall comply with all such directions as shall be given in writing by an inspector for the purpose of protecting all food for sale from contamination by flies or dust."

(15) By the addition of a by-law as follows, in Part VII., to read as by-law 12A of Part VII.:—

"12A. No person shall deposit any vegetable or other food of any kind intended for sale for human consumption upon any street, road, footpath, right-of-way, or upon any other private or public thoroughfare or land."

(16) By the addition of a further paragraph, as follows, to by-law 19 of Part VII.:—"The occupier of every public house, public bar, refreshment room, tea room, eating house, drinking booth, or other public place of refreshment, shall not permit the use of any drinking vessel, unless such vessel is sound and free from cracks or chips."

(17) By specifying the following fees to be paid for the registration of offensive trade premises:—

Part IX.—Schedule "D."

In respect of slaughter houses, artificial manure depots, bone mills, blood drying, fellmongeries, wool-scouring establishments, chemical works, soap and candle works, gut scraping, gut spinning or sausage skins—£5.

In respect of places for storing, drying or preserving bones, bone manure, meat meal, hides, hoofs, or skins, fat melting, fat extracting, or tallow melting establishments, tripe boiling and cleaning, tanneries, manure works or depots, marine stores, rag and bone merchants, or flock factories—£3.

In respect of jute stores, cleaning establishments, piggeries, dry cleaning and dye-works, laundries, fish shops, fish curing establishments—£1.

In respect of fat rendering for dripping at butchers' retail shops—10s.

In respect of any other offensive trade not specified above—£5.

(18) By the addition at the end of such by-laws of a new part, to stand as Part X., as follows:—

Part X.—Morgues.

1. The annual fee for a place for a license for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination, identification, or other lawful purpose before burial or cremation shall be—£1.

2. No such license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless:—

(a) The interior surface of all walls is covered with glazed tiles or is rendered impervious with some material, to be approved by the local authority, so as to be non-absorbent and washable, and

(b) all floors are constructed of some impervious material, to be approved by the local authority, such as granolithic, having a fall to an outlet discharging over a trapped gully, and

(c) the premises are adequately ventilated by direct communication to the outer air.

3. No such license shall be granted in respect of any room the dimensions of which are less than 10ft. x 9ft. x 12ft. high.

4. No such license shall be granted in respect of private premises unless the site thereof is approved by the local authority or if the same are within 20 feet of any dwelling house.

By-law relating to Fencing of Lands Abutting on any Road.

THE Esperance Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make the following by-law:—

Where any land which adjoins or abuts upon any road or portion thereof as defined in the schedule attached hereto, is not fenced in or enclosed to the satisfaction of the Board or the fence thereof has been allowed to fall into disrepair, the Board may from time to time by writing under the hand of the secretary of the Board, order such land so far as the same adjoins or abuts upon any road, to be enclosed with a substantial fence to the description and materials hereinafter set forth.

The owner of such land after due service on him of such order shall in such manner and in such time as shall be expressed therein at his own cost, well and sufficiently fence so much thereof as abuts upon any road to the satisfaction of the Board.

All fences which the Board shall order to be erected under the provisions of these by-laws, shall, unless constructed of stone or brick or a composite of stone or brick or concrete and wrought metal or otherwise constructed in conformity with the plan and specification previously submitted to and approved by the Board, be constructed wholly of sawn jarrah timber and to the following specifications:—Posts not less than 5in. x 3in. in section, not less than four feet, nor more than six feet, out of the ground, not less than two feet in the ground, and placed eight feet centres; the tops to be properly aligned, with two rails to each panel, of not less than 4in. x 2in. in section, and three wires placed not more than 12in. apart.

The erection of any dangerous fence or any fence containing barb wire, abutting on any road specified in the schedule hereunder, or any right of way or public place, leading from the said roads, is hereby prohibited.

UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT,
1911-1944.

Amendment to Statutes.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, under section 33 of the University of Western Australia Act, 1911-1944, to approve of a new University Statute No. 25 (method of election of members of the Senate under sections 10 (c) and 10A (c) of the University of Western Australia Act Amendment Act, 1944), and of University Statute No. 1 of 1946 (amending Statute No. 18) as passed by the Senate and the Convocation of the University, copies of which are shown hereunder.

Statute No. 25.

Method of Election of Members of the Senate under Sections 10 (c) and 10A (c).

1. In this Statute—

“Registrar” shall include Acting Registrar or a deputy nominated in writing by the Registrar or Acting Registrar.

“Vice-Chancellor” shall include Acting Vice-Chancellor or a deputy nominated in writing by the Vice-Chancellor or Acting Vice-Chancellor.

Words importing the singular or plural shall be deemed to include the plural or singular and words importing the male sex shall be deemed to include the female sex unless the context otherwise requires.

2. The election of one member of the Senate in accordance with section 10 (c) of the University of Western Australia Act shall be held on the first Tuesday of March in each alternate year or on such later date in the same month as the Senate shall appoint.

3. At least sixty days' notice of any election shall be given and a copy of such notice shall be sent by post to each elector.

4. (1) Nominations of candidates must reach the Registrar not less than twenty-eight nor more than forty-two days before the date fixed for the election.

(2) Each nomination shall be signed by the candidate.

5. (1) If the number of candidates is equal to the number of vacancies the Vice-Chancellor shall so report to the Chancellor, who shall thereupon and in writing declare the candidates to be elected.

(2) If there are more candidates than vacancies there shall be an election by ballot, for which purpose a voting paper shall be sent to each elector not later than seven days after the last day for receiving nominations.

6. The omission to send any notice or voting paper as required by sections 3 and 5 of this Statute or the misdirection or non-receipt thereof shall not invalidate any nomination or election.

7. Whenever subsection (2) of section 5 of this Statute applies

(1) The voting paper shall contain the names of the candidates arranged in alphabetical order of their surnames.

(2) Each elector shall insert opposite the names of the candidates the numbers 1, 2, 3 etc. in numerical order of his preference. Provided that every voting paper shall be valid on which not more than one name is left unnumbered.

(3) Each elector shall address his completed voting paper to the Registrar in a sealed envelope marked “Senate Voting Paper.”

(4) The scrutiny of the voting papers shall commence at five o'clock on the afternoon of the day of the election and no voting papers received after that hour shall be included in the scrutiny.

(5) The Registrar with one or more scrutineers to be appointed by him who shall be electors but not candidates shall make a scrutiny of the voting

papers in the manner prescribed by section 2 of Statute No. 12, but so that the words "Clerk of Convocation" in the said section shall be replaced by the word "Registrar" and the word "Warden" by the word "Vice-Chancellor."

(6) Each candidate shall be entitled to nominate one scrutineer to be present at the scrutiny held in accordance with the preceding subsection.

(7) Within forty-eight hours of the conclusion of the scrutiny the Registrar shall report to the Vice-Chancellor the result of the election.

(8) The Vice-Chancellor shall report the result of the election to the Chancellor, who shall thereupon and in writing declare the candidates who have been preferred by the electors to have been duly elected as members of the Senate.

8. In the event of the office of a member becoming vacant before the normal expiration of his term of office by death or resignation or by his ceasing to be qualified under section 10 (c) of the Act the Senate shall at its meeting next after the occurrence of the vacancy fix a date for the election of a successor, such election to be held in accordance with this Statute and the successful candidate to hold office for the remainder of the term of office of his predecessor.

9. Subject to the provisions of the Act and of this Statute it shall be competent for the Vice-Chancellor to make all necessary administrative and other arrangements for the conduct of elections.

Amending Statute No. 1 of 1946.

Amendment to Statute No. 18—Conditions of Awarding Hackett Bursaries and Hackett Research Studentships and Scholarships.

From sub 1 of clause 3 strike out the words "one hundred and fifty" and insert in lieu thereof the words "two hundred."

From sub 2 of clause 3 strike out the word "fifty" and insert the words "one hundred."

From sub 3 of clause 3 strike out the words "one hundred pounds" from the third line and insert in lieu thereof the words "three hundred pounds in the case of students who study outside Australia, provided that if the studentship is renewed for a second year this sum shall be reduced in the second year to one hundred pounds, and one hundred pounds in the case of students who study within Australia." Strike out the words "including exchange."

From sub 1 of clause 4 strike out the words "one hundred pounds" and insert "one hundred and twenty-five pounds."

From sub 3 of clause 4 strike out the words "fifty pounds" and insert "sixty-five pounds."

The relevant sections will now read:—

3. The Hackett Research Studentship shall be awarded under the following conditions—

(1) Post-graduate studentships hereinafter described as the Research Studentships of the value of two hundred pounds per annum are open to graduates of the University of Western Australia.

(2) During such part of the period for which a Research Studentship is awarded as is spent at a University outside Australia the student shall receive an additional allowance at the rate of one hundred pounds per annum.

(3) A student may in each year of his research studentship be granted a special allowance not exceeding three hundred pounds in the case of students who study outside Australia, provided that if the studentship is renewed for a second year this sum shall be reduced in the second year to one hundred pounds, and one hundred pounds in the case of students who study within Australia which may be used under the direction of his supervisor to defray the cost of books, apparatus and other material which shall become and remain the property of the University and other expenses incidental to the student's work. The Vice-Chancellor may authorise any part of this special allowance to be used to pay the student's travelling expenses and the cost of remitting the student's allowances as defined in subsections (1) and (2) to the country where he is doing his research work.

(4) to (16) remain unchanged.

4. The Hackett research scholarships shall be awarded under the following conditions:—

(1) Post-graduate research scholarships hereinafter described as the research scholarships of a value not exceeding one hundred and twenty-five pounds per annum shall be open to graduates of the University of Western Australia and shall be tenable only at that University.

(2) Remains unchanged.

(3) A research scholar may in each year of his research scholarship be granted a special allowance not exceeding sixty-five pounds which may be used under the direction of his supervisor to defray the cost of necessary books, apparatus and other material, which shall become and remain the property of the University, and other expenses incidental to his work under the research scholarship.

(4) and (5) remain unchanged.

(e) Irrespective of their parents' income, scholars shall receive an allowance, not exceeding £3 per annum, to defray the cost of books.

MARKETING OF EGGS ACT, 1945.

Schedule.

MARKETING OF EGGS ACT, 1945.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Marketing of Eggs Regulations."

Preliminary.

2. In the regulations, unless the contrary intention appears, "the Board" means the Western Australian Egg Marketing Board constituted under the Act; "the Act" means the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1945.

Elective Members—Qualification.

3. No person shall be qualified for election as an elective member of the Board unless at the time when he is nominated as a candidate for election he is a commercial producer within the meaning of that term as contained in section 5 of the Act, and is not—
 - (a) of unsound mind; or
 - (b) an undischarged bankrupt within the meaning of the laws relating to bankruptcy; or
 - (c) a person who has been convicted of an indictable offence for which a sentence of imprisonment for twelve months or longer may be imposed.

Elections.

4. For the purposes of elections of elective members of the Western Australian Egg Marketing Board—
 - (a) There shall be a Returning Officer who shall be such person as the Board may from time to time appoint.
 - (b) The Board may cancel the appointment of any person as Returning Officer.
 - (c) The Board shall by public notice fix a day for the election by the commercial producers of the first elective members of the Board.
 - (d) The day so fixed shall not be less than two months nor more than three months after the date of the publication of the day fixed for the election.
 - (e) The nomination day for the nomination of candidates for such election shall be not less than fourteen days nor more than one month preceding the day fixed for the said election.
 - (f) Only persons who are commercial producers within the meaning of the Act will be eligible to be registered as electors and unless and until so registered will not be entitled to vote at such election.
 - (g) Within seven days after the said publication, the Returning Officer shall by Public Notice inform commercial producers—
 - (i) of the intention to hold the election;
 - (ii) of the date fixed for the election;
 - (iii) of the nomination day fixed for such election; and
 - (iv) of the address of the Returning Officer.
 - (h) As soon as reasonably may be after the said publication, the Returning Officer shall prepare a roll of electors for use at the elections.

- (i) Any person who is eligible for enrolment upon the said roll of electors and wishes to be enrolled thereon, shall make application for such enrolment in writing in accordance with Form No. 1 in the Appendix to the Regulations, and shall send or deliver the same to the address of the Returning Officer as notified in accordance with paragraph (g) hereof; and so that such application shall be in the hands of the Returning Officer by 12 o'clock noon 21 days before the nomination day so fixed.
 - (j) Such application shall be accompanied by evidence satisfactory to the Returning Officer of the eligibility of the applicant for enrolment as an elector upon the said roll of electors.
 - (k) When the application is sent by post and sufficient postage has not been prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall reject the same; and, when any application is received by the Returning Officer after 12 o'clock noon 21 days before nomination day, the Returning Officer shall reject the same.
 - (l) When the Returning Officer has prepared the roll of electors as aforesaid, he shall sign each page thereof, and thereafter such roll shall be the electoral roll to be used at the said election.
 - (m) Only persons whose names appear on the said electoral roll shall be entitled to vote at the said election.
5. When, after the first elective members of the Board have been elected, any extraordinary vacancy arises or any vacancy is about to arise by effluxion of time in relation to the membership of an elective member of the Board, the following provisions shall apply:—
- (a) In the case of an extraordinary vacancy, the Returning Officer shall notify the Chairman of the Board thereof by writing under his hand as soon as possible after such extraordinary vacancy has arisen.
 - (b) In the case of vacancies occurring by effluxion of time, the Returning Officer shall, at least three months before the term of office of an elective member will expire by effluxion of time, inform the Chairman of the Board by writing under his hand of the names of the elective member whose term of office is about to expire, and of the date upon which such term of office will expire.
 - (c) As soon as reasonably may be after the receipt of a notification from the Returning Officer under paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) hereof, the Board shall fix the date for the holding of the election to fill the vacancy or vacancies of which it has been notified, and shall forthwith notify the Returning Officer of the date so fixed.
 - (d) The date so fixed shall be not less than two months and not more than three months after the date of the publication by the Returning Officer of the notice to be published by him in accordance with paragraph (e) hereof.
 - (e) Upon receipt by him of the notice from the Board fixing the day for the holding of the election, the Returning Officer shall by Public Notice inform the commercial producers—
 - (i) of the intention to hold the election;
 - (ii) of the date fixed for the election;
 - (iii) of the nomination day; and
 - (iv) of the address of the Returning Officer.
 - (f) The nomination day shall be not less than fourteen days nor more than one month prior to the day fixed for the election.

Electoral Roll.

6. (1) For the purposes of elections to be held for the election of elective members of the Board, after the first elective members have been elected, the Returning Officer shall, on the 31st day of December next following the date of the election of the said first elective members, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, and on the 31st day of December in each succeeding year, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, prepare an electoral roll for use at all elections, whether to fill extraordinary vacancies or ordinary vacancies, during the currency thereof.

(2) Such electoral roll, when prepared, shall be signed on each page thereof by the Returning Officer, shall be the electoral roll for all the elections aforesaid, and shall continue current and in force until the next electoral roll has been prepared in accordance with these regulations: Provided that—

- (a) if during the currency of any electoral roll an extraordinary vacancy arises which renders an election necessary to fill such vacancy, such electoral roll may, for the purposes of such election, but in the manner authorised by these regulations, be amended by the Returning Officer by the enrolment thereon of persons who since the preparation thereof have become eligible for enrolment and registered as electors, and by the removal therefrom of the names of persons enrolled thereon who since the preparation thereof have ceased to be eligible for enrolment as electors or to vote at an election;
- (b) any person whose name is not enrolled as an elector on the electoral roll then in existence and who would be entitled to apply for enrolment on such electoral roll under these regulations, if a new electoral roll were then being prepared under these regulations and who desires to vote as an elector in any election about to be held to fill an extraordinary vacancy, may, at any time before 12 o'clock noon 21 days before the last day for the receipt of nominations of candidates for such election, make application in accordance with regulation 4 of these regulations for enrolment as an elector upon the said electoral roll, and, subject to the requirements of these regulations, the Returning Officer shall enrol the name of the applicant upon such electoral roll, and upon the applicant being so enrolled he shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a duly registered elector.

7. (1) Where any commercial producer eligible for enrolment on the electoral roll is a limited liability company or other corporate body, the board of directors or other management authority thereof may authorise any director, trustee, or other member of such board or management authority or its manager, secretary, or other officer (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on the electoral roll) to represent the company or other body aforesaid as an elector, and, upon receipt of an application for enrolment from such representative, together with a certificate in writing of such authority aforesaid under the hand of the managing director of the company or the president or chairman of the management authority of such other corporate body, as the case may be, the Returning Officer may, subject to all other requirements of these regulations being satisfied, enrol such representative person on the electoral roll in accordance with his application.

(2) In the case of a partnership, either one of the partners, but not more than one, at any one time may apply for enrolment and be enrolled on the electoral roll upon which the partnership is entitled to be enrolled.

(3) No person shall be entitled to be enrolled on the electoral roll more than once, whether as an elector in his own right or as the representative of a limited liability company or other corporate body, or as a partner in a partnership, or otherwise.

(4) Every authority given under paragraph (1) hereof shall remain effective for all subsequent elections and electoral rolls until written notice of revocation is sent or delivered to the Returning Officer.

(5) Any company or other corporate body may cancel or revoke any authority given by it under this regulation by notice in writing under the hand of the said Board of Directors or other management authority, as the case may be, sent or delivered to the Returning Officer:

Provided that any such cancellation or revocation shall not invalidate any vote given by the representative person enrolled and voting by virtue of such authority at an election held previously to such cancellation or revocation.

(6) Upon receipt of notice of cancellation or revocation of authority as aforesaid, the Returning Officer shall forthwith remove from the electoral roll the name of the representative person whose authority has been so cancelled or revoked.

Nominations.

8. (1) Every nomination of a candidate for election as a member of the Board shall be made in writing, in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations, and shall be signed by the candidate himself and also by a proposer and seconder, both of whom shall be persons enrolled on the electoral roll to be used at the election.

(2) Every nomination of a candidate shall be sent or delivered to the Returning Officer so as to be in his hands not later than 12 o'clock noon of the nomination day for the election.

(3) Every nomination form received by the Returning Officer after the time aforesaid shall be rejected by him.

(4) Where any nomination is sent by post, but the postage thereon is wholly unpaid or insufficiently prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall refuse to accept such nomination, and such nomination shall be deemed not to have been sent or delivered to the Returning Officer within the meaning of these regulations.

(5) Forthwith, after 12 o'clock noon of the nomination day, the Returning Officer shall examine all the nominations received by him and satisfy himself that the candidates whose names appear on the nomination forms are eligible for election, and that the persons who have signed the said forms as proposer and seconder are entitled under these regulations so to sign the same.

(6) The Returning Officer shall reject any nomination form which, in his opinion, is not in order as required by these regulations, and any such rejection shall be final and conclusive as against the candidate.

(7) An election shall be held for the first elective members, but in subsequent elections where the number of candidates nominated does not exceed the number of candidates to be elected, the Returning Officer shall forthwith certify that fact, together with the names, addresses and occupations of the candidates nominated in accordance with Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations to the Board, and such certificate, when received by the Board, shall be the final and conclusive evidence of the election of the said candidates as members of the Board.

(8) As soon as reasonably may be after the receipt by him from the Returning Officer of the certificate mentioned in paragraph (7) hereof, the Chairman of the Board shall cause a copy thereof to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published in Perth.

(9) When the number of candidates nominated exceeds the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall hold an election in accordance with these regulations, as hereinafter provided.

Polling.

9. (1) When after the receipt of nominations of candidates an election is necessary to elect an elective member or elective members of the Board, the Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the closing time for the receipt of such nominations, but within seven days thereafter, cause ballot papers to be printed in accordance with Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations containing the names of all the candidates in alphabetical order.

(2) The ballot paper shall set forth in a space provided for the purpose notice of the day fixed for the closing of the poll.

10. (1) When the ballot papers have been printed as aforesaid, the Returning Officer shall send by prepaid letter post to each person, whose name appears as an elector on the electoral roll, to his postal address as shown on his application for enrolment, one ballot paper, with the initials of the Returning Officer, or of some other person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer, indorsed on the

back thereof, together with an envelope marked "Ballot Paper Envelope," and another envelope addressed to the Returning Officer and a form of statement in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations, to be completed and signed by the elector.

(2) The Returning Officer may, before sending the statement aforesaid to an elector, fill in the particulars to be furnished therein so that the same will be ready for signature and completion by the elector when marking his ballot paper.

11. (1) For the purpose of casting his vote at the election, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper received by him as aforesaid in the manner hereinafter provided, and shall then place the same in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper Envelope," and seal the envelope. He shall then sign and complete the statement in accordance with the directions stated therein and then place the sealed envelope, with the ballot paper enclosed therein and the statement signed and completed in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and seal such last-mentioned envelope.

(2) The elector may then send by prepaid letter post or may deliver the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, with its said enclosures, to the Returning Officer at his address shown on the envelope, but so that such envelope shall be in the hands of the Returning Officer not later than 12 o'clock noon of the day fixed for the closing of the poll.

(3) Where any envelope containing the ballot paper is sent by post to the Returning Officer, but the postage thereon is wholly unpaid or insufficiently paid thereon, the Returning Officer shall refuse to accept the same, and such envelope, with its enclosures, shall be deemed not to have been sent or delivered to the Returning Officer within the meaning of these regulations.

12. If, prior to the closing of the poll, an elector satisfies the Returning Officer that he has not received a ballot paper and is entitled to vote at the election, or that the ballot paper or envelopes received by him have been lost or destroyed, and that he has not already voted at the poll, the Returning Officer may post or give personally to such elector a ballot paper and envelopes or a further ballot paper and envelopes, as the case may be.

Preferential Voting.

13. (1) Voting shall be by means of a preferential ballot.

(2) When only one candidate is to be elected and there are not more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.

(3) When only one candidate is to be elected and there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3, and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(4) When two candidates are to be elected, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and the numeral 2 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his second preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 3, 4, and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

Ballot Papers.

14. (1) The Returning Officer shall keep a locked and sealed ballot box, with the words "Egg Marketing Board Ballot Box" marked thereon, and, as and when the envelope containing the ballot paper and the statement is received by him from an elector, he shall open the outer envelope and extract therefrom the statement and the sealed envelope containing the ballot paper.

(2) He shall thereupon examine the statement and satisfy himself that the same is in order and that the elector who signed the statement is enrolled on the electoral roll and entitled to vote.

(3) If and when he is so satisfied, he shall place the statement in some place of security for safe keeping and shall immediately place the envelope containing the ballot paper unopened in the said ballot box and so leave the same until the close of the poll.

(4) If, upon examining the statement as aforesaid, the Returning Officer is not satisfied that the statement is in order, or that the person who signed the same is enrolled on the electoral roll and entitled to vote, he shall retain such statement and the envelope containing the ballot paper unopened in a safe place and at once notify the elector in writing that his ballot paper has not been accepted for the reasons to be stated in the notice.

(5) If, before the closing of the poll, a voter who has received notice as provided for in paragraph (4) hereof satisfies the Returning Officer that he is an elector and entitled to vote at the election, the Returning Officer shall forthwith place the sealed envelope containing such voter's ballot paper unopened in the said ballot box and so leave the same until the closing of the poll.

(6) If a voter who has received notice as provided for in paragraph (4) hereof fails to satisfy the Returning Officer in the manner required by paragraph (5) hereof, the Returning Officer shall reject the ballot paper received from such voter. Upon such rejection he shall indorse on the envelope containing the ballot paper the word "rejected," and sign the same, and then place such envelope unopened in some place of security for safe keeping until after the election.

Scrutineers.

15. (1) Each candidate at an election shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the envelopes containing ballot papers relating to such election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny and to remain during the scrutiny.

(2) Every scrutineer shall, before he acts, make and sign, before the Returning Officer, declaration in accordance with Form No. 6 in the Appendix.

The Scrutiny.

16. (1) The counting of the votes cast at an election shall be carried out by the Returning Officer, in the presence of the scrutineers, at the office of the Board, and shall not commence until after 4 o'clock on the election day. The Returning Officer may from time to time adjourn the scrutiny to a day and hour fixed by him and notified to the scrutineers.

(2) The Returning Officer may appoint such officers as he deems necessary to assist in the conduct of an election and count thereof.

(3) Subject as hereunder provided, the method of conducting the count shall be the same as that prescribed under the Electoral Act, 1907-1936, for the counting of the votes taken at an election of members of the Legislative Assembly. Provided that—

(a) When two candidates are to be elected the count of the votes will proceed until one candidate has received an absolute majority, when he shall be declared elected. The first elected candidate shall then be eliminated from the count, and to proceed with the election of the second candidate, all the ballot papers, including those which have been set aside as exhausted, shall be brought into operation and again sorted into first preference votes. The first preference votes of the eliminated successful candidate shall be distributed according to the second preference markings shown thereon to the remainder of the candidates, and when added to their respective first preference votes shall constitute the first count for the second candidate. The procedure from then on shall be the same as in the counting of votes for the election of one candidate.

(b) Votes shall not be deemed to be informal except in the case hereinafter mentioned.

(4) As soon as practicable after the closing of the poll, the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the scrutineers—

(a) open the ballot box and remove therefrom the envelopes containing the ballot papers; and

(b) open the envelopes containing the ballot papers and extract the ballot papers therefrom; and

(c) examine every ballot paper and satisfy himself that the same bears his or the authorised officer's initials indorsed thereon and decide whether such ballot paper is formal or informal; and

(d) count all formal ballot papers and reject all informal ballot papers.

(5) The Returning Officer shall be the sole and final judge as to whether a ballot paper is informal.

(6) Any candidate may attend and be present at the counting of the votes.

17. (1) A ballot paper shall be informal—

(a) if it is not initialed by the Returning Officer or the other officer authorised in that behalf; or

(b) if, subject as hereinafter provided, it is marked in any other manner than prescribed in regulation (11) of these regulations; or

(c) if it has upon it any mark or writing not authorised by these regulations, which in the opinion of the Returning Officer will enable any person to identify the elector; or

(d) if it does not indicate the elector's vote, or, if when there are more than two candidates it is not marked so as effectively to indicate the elector's preference as regards all candidates; or

(e) if no mark is indicated on it.

(2) A ballot paper shall not be informal for any reason other than the reasons stated in paragraph (1) hereof, but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear, and, in particular when only one candidate is to be elected and there are only two candidates, a ballot paper shall not be informal by reason only of the elector having indicated his vote or first preference by a cross instead of the numeral 1.

18. As and when the Returning Officer shall have completed the counting of the votes, he shall declare the result of the election in the presence of the scrutineers and of any candidates who may be present at the time.

19. (1) When the result of an election has been ascertained and declared, the Returning Officer shall forthwith furnish to the Board a certificate of such result in accordance with Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations, and state therein the names, addresses, and occupations of the candidates who have been elected; and such certificate, when received by the Board, shall be final and conclusive evidence of the election of the said candidates as members of the Board.

(2) As soon as reasonably may be after the receipt by him from the Returning Officer of the certificate mentioned in paragraph (1) hereof, the Board shall cause a copy thereof to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and a newspaper published in Perth.

20. Where any person whose name appears on the electoral roll to be used at any election has since such enrolment ceased to be a commercial producer within the meaning of the Act, such person shall not be entitled to vote at any election held subsequently to his ceasing to be a commercial producer as aforesaid merely because his name appears as an elector on the said electoral roll, and in any such case the Returning Officer, upon it coming to his knowledge that the person is no longer a commercial producer shall cause his name to be struck off such roll.

21. The Returning Officer shall retain all ballot papers and statements received by him in connection with any election held under these regulations until the expiration of three months after the declaration of the result of such election, and may then cause the same to be destroyed.

22. Any person who, not being entitled to be enrolled as an elector for the purpose of an election held under the Act and these regulations, makes a claim to be enrolled, and any person who makes any statement which is to his knowledge false in

any application for enrolment, or in any statement accompanying a ballot paper verifying the voter's right to vote, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

23. Subject to subsection (2) of section 8 of the Act, all costs, charges, and expenses as incurred by the Returning Officer in connection with the publication of notices, the receipt of nominations of candidates for election, application for enrolment by commercial producers, preparation of electoral rolls, and the conduct of elections, including any fee that may be allowed, or in connection with any other matters incidental thereto and as certified in writing by the Returning Officer under his hand, and communicated by the Returning Officer to the Board, shall be borne and paid by the Board or reimbursed to the Returning Officer by the Board out of moneys from time to time in its hands: Provided that the Board may at its own expense have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited by the Auditor General, whose decision thereon shall be final as between the parties concerned.
