Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds or insects

the names of which the Governor may by proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the said Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the proclamation; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species *Polytelus anthopeplus*, commonly known as "Smoker" shall be "vermin" for the purposes of the said Act within the boundaries of the Katanning Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, the name of the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species *Polytelus anthopeplus*, commonly known as "Smoker," and declare that this proclamation shall apply and have effect only in that portion of the State which is comprised within the boundaries of the Katanning Vermin District as constituted under the said Act.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.

Proposed Mt. Yokine Reservoir.

Construction of a reinforced concrete reservoir of 30,000,000 gallons capacity complete with valves and all necessary apparatus; excavation of a scour sump; laying of all necessary pipes in the vicinity of the reservoir; construction of all necessary access roads, water supply and power lines, near the intersection of Flinders Street and Osborne Park Road on the areas indicated in red within the green border as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6825.

BUNBURY HARBOUR BOARD ACT, 1909.

Department of North-West,
Perth, 26th June, 1946.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Bunbury Harbour Board Act, 1909, that for the purposes of the said Act the Harbour shall consist of so much of the harbour of Bunbury as is contained within the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Act or as altered from time to time by the Governor; and whereas it is also enacted by the proviso to section 20 of the said Act that the Governor may from time to time by notification in the *Government Gazette* alter the boundaries of the said harbour and withdraw any land or other property of any kind from the Board and re-vest the same in His Majesty; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to alter the boundaries of the said harbour as defined in the Schedule to the said Act in the manner hereinafter mentioned and to withdraw the land excised from the harbour by the alteration of the boundaries thereof as aforesaid from the Bunbury Harbour Board as constituted under the said Act and to re-vest such land in His Majesty: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby give notice that as from and including the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* the boundaries of the Harbour of Bunbury as described in the Schedule to the Bunbury Harbour Board Act, 1909, and as altered by notifications in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of June, 1937, and the 9th day of February, 1940, shall be and are hereby further altered in such manner as to exclude from the said harbour the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, and that such area of land shall be and is hereby excluded from the said harbour and withdrawn from the said Bunbury Harbour Board, and that the said area of land as excluded from the said harbour and withdrawn from the said Bunbury Harbour Board as aforesaid shall be and is hereby re-vested in His Majesty.

All that portion of land, including also portion of Koombana Bay, starting from a point situate west, 400 7/10ths links and north 2,135 5/10ths links from the junction of the north side of Roe Street with the north-western side of Henry Street, and extending 48 deg. 45 min. 360 links; thence 137 deg. 28 min. 992 links; thence 48 deg. 29 min. 289 6/10ths links; thence 138 deg. 29 min. 913 6/10ths links, to the north-western side of the Bunbury Jetty; thence 228 deg. 29 min. 825 4/10ths links; thence 267 deg. 18 min. 56 1/10th links; thence 325 deg. 17 min. 985 6/10ths links; and thence 323 deg. 57 min. 897 links to the starting point.
