IN THE LICENSING COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of the Licensing Act, 1911 (section 47), and in the matter of a petition for authority to grant a new Gallon License: To His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

THE humble Petition of the undersigned showeth as follows:—

1. That your Petitioners are a majority in number of the electors of the State of Western Australia living in an area comprised within a rectangle being seven miles North, seven miles South four miles East and four miles West of the Bindoon Hall.

2. That there has been an increase in the population of such area and that such increase is likely to be permanent.

3. That there are no licensed premises to meet public requirements within such area.

4. That a gallon license is required within the area to meet the requirements of the public.

5. That the situation, namely 200 yards South of the Bindoon Hall on the main Perth-Bindoon Road, being the premises erected on Certificate of Title Volume 1067, Folio 471, is a suitable place for such license.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that the Licensing Court may, pursuant to the powers in that behalf contained in the Licensing Act, 1911 (Consolidated), have authority to grant a Gallon License within the Moore Licensing District for premises erected on the said land, and your Petitioner will ever pray, etc.
