AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 31st day of July, 1946, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, that the municipal and road districts mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act are, for the purposes of the Act, constituted fire districts by the names as in the said Schedule stated, but that the Governor may by Order in Council *inter alia* (a) excise from any fire district any specified portion thereof and thereupon such portion shall be no longer included in or be part of such district; and (b) unite the district of or portions of the district of two or more local authorities with any portion or portions of another or others into one fire district by such name as the Governor may think fit, but before any such order is made at least one month's notice of intention to make the same shall be given to the local authorities concerned; and whereas by an Order in Council made by the Governor under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of June, 1943, the Busselton Municipal Fire District and the Sussex Road District Fire District were united into one Fire District to be known by the name of the Busselton Fire District, as mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council, but from which was excised that portion of the land comprised in the Sussex Road District as defined and described in the second column of the First Schedule to the said Order in Council opposite the name of the said fire district in the first column of the said Schedule; and whereas it is now deemed expedient to reconstitute the said fire district as at present subsisting by reinstating therein certain portions of the said lands which were heretofore excised therefrom by the said Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth

hereby for the purposes of the said Act reconstitute the said Busselton Fire District as heretofore subsisting under the said Order in Council by reinstating and including in such fire district as part thereof those portions of the land comprised in the Sussex Road District which are more particularly defined and described in the second column of the Schedule hereunder opposite the name of the said district in the first column of such Schedule.

#### Schedule.

Fire District, Portion of Land Reinstated and Included.

Busselton—All that portion of land, bounded by lines starting from a point on a Western boundary of the existing fire district, as described in the *Government Gazette* of 4th June, 1943, page 545, and situate due West from the South-Western corner of Busselton Suburban Lot 76, and extending Westerly through the South-West corner of lot 125 of Sussex Location 5 (L.T.O. Plan 3822), and onwards to the Eastern side of Lennox Drain; thence Northerly along the said side of the drain to the low water mark of Geographe Bay; thence generally North-Easterly along the said low water mark to join the existing boundary of the aforesaid Busselton Fire District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the South-Eastern corner of Plantagenet Location 507, and extending Easterly, passing through the Eastern corner of location 386 and onwards to and through the North-Western corner of location 875, to the North-Eastern corner of location 871; thence Southerly, along the Eastern boundary of the said location, to a point situate in prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of location 392; thence Easterly, to and along the said boundary, to the South-Eastern corner of the said location; thence Easterly to the North-Western corner of location 371; thence Easterly, Southerly and South-Westerly along boundaries of the said location, to its Southern corner; thence continuing South-Westerly, to and along boundaries of locations 43 and 42, to the Southern corner of the latter location; thence North-Westerly, to the North-Eastern corner of location 226; thence Southerly to and along the Eastern boundary of location 2 to the South-Eastern corner of the said location; thence Westerly along its Southern boundary, to the South-Western side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve; thence South-Easterly, along the said side to the South-Eastern side of a level crossing situate in continuation of Carlisle Street; thence generally South-Westerly along the South-Eastern side of a one-chain road through reserve 500, to the Northern shore of Princess Royal Harbour; thence generally South-Westerly, Southerly, and South-Easterly, along the said shore to a point on the North-Eastern boundary of location 102 and situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 962; thence Westerly, to and along the said boundary, and onwards, to the South-Western corner of location 420; thence Northerly, passing through the North-Western corner of the said location, and onwards, to the Southernmost boundary of reserve No. 996; thence Westerly along the said boundary, and

onwards, to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 2480; thence Northerly, to and along the said boundary, and onwards, to the South-Western corner of Gledhow Lot 26; thence Northerly, along the Western boundary of the said lot, and onwards, to a point on a Southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 5490; thence Easterly, to the South-Western corner of location 488; thence Northerly, along its Western boundary, and onwards to a point on the Southern boundary of location 507 aforesaid; and thence Easterly, to the starting point.

IN THE LICENSING COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of the Licensing Act, 1911 (Consolidated) and Amendments, and in the matter of a petition for authority to grant a new License: To His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia.

THE humble Petition of the undersigned showeth as follows:—

1. That your Petitioners are a majority in number of the electors living in an area within a circle having a radius of one mile from the intersection of McLarty and Warnbro Roads, Safety Bay.
