WHEREAS by the Election of Senators Act, 1903, it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation, to be published in the *Government Gazette* not less than seven days before the issue of the Writ for any election of Senators for the State of Western Australia, fix the places at which such election shall be held, and the dates for the nomination, the polling, and the declaration of the poll and return of the writ; and whereas the 21st day of August, 1946, has been fixed as the date for the issue of a Writ for the election of Senators

aforsaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Tuesday, the Third day of September, 1946, at 12 o'clock noon, as the day and time before which nominations for the said election are to be made, and Saturday, the 28th day of September, 1946, as the date for the polling at the said election, and on or before Saturday the Second day of November, 1946, as the date for the return of the Writ; and do hereby fix the Office of the Commonwealth Electoral Officer, Commonwealth Bank Buildings, Second Floor, Murray Street, Perth, as the place of nomination for the said election, and the polling places within the said State appointed under the law of the Commonwealth for the time being in force for the regulation of Parliamentary elections as the places at which such election shall be held.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that any hospital within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1927, is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, declare

such hospital to be a region within the meaning of section 12 of the Medical Act, Amendment Act, 1940: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the Perth Hospital, the Children's Hospital, and the King Edward Memorial Hospital are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, hereby proclaim that the Perth Hospital, the Children's Hospital, and the King Edward Memorial Hospital shall be regions within the meaning of section 12 of the said Act.

1942-1943.

Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, that during a time of war the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister and after due notice given as required by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said section may at any time and from time to time by proclamation direct that any election required by its or their governing Act or Acts to be held by any public authority or any class or classes of public authority shall be postponed for such period as shall be specified in the proclamation; and whereas Potato Growers' Advisory Committee as constituted under the Potato Growers Licensing Act, 1941, has in accordance with the provisions of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, been declared by the Governor to be a public authority under and within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act; and whereas by proclamations issued under section 3 of that Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of September, 1943, the 16th day of June, 1944, and the 27th day of July, 1945, respectively, the Governor directed that the election of Potato Growers' Advisory Committee aforesaid which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, be firstly postponed until the 15th day of June, 1944, be secondly postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945, and be thirdly post-

poned until the 15th day of June, 1946; and whereas it being deemed expedient that the said election shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1947, the Minister in accordance with paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the said Act has duly given notice of his intention to recommend to me the said Lieutenant-Governor, that I, by proclamation issued under section 3 of the said Act shall postpone further until the 15th day of June, 1947, the election of the said Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and now stands postponed as aforesaid until the 15th day of June, 1946, and no objection to such further postponement has been made or received: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, do hereby direct that the election of the said Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and which now stands postponed until the 15th day of June, 1946, shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1947.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds, or insects the names of which the Governor may by proclamation add to the said Schedule; and that any proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the said Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the proclamation; and whereas by proclamation dated the 11th day of October, 1944, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th day of October, 1944, the name of the animal or bird known as "Emu" was added to the said Schedule and it was declared that the said proclamation should operate and have effect generally throughout the State; and whereas it is deemed desirable to restrict the operation of the said proclamation to a defined portion of the State: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers herein in that behalf enabling and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the said proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to all those portions of the State which are not within the boundaries of the Vermin Districts hereinafter specified, that is to say:—Albany; Armadale-Kelmscott, Armadale; Balingup; Upper Blackwood, Boyup Brook; Bridgetown; Bunbury; Capel; Collie; Cranbrook; Dardanup; Darling Range, Kalamunda; Denmark; Drakesbrook, Waroona; Fremantle; Gosnells; Greenbushes; Harvey; Manjimup; Mundaring; Murray, Pinjarra; Nannup; Plantagenet, Mt. Barker; Preston, Donnybrook; Rockingham; Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Mundijong; Sussex, Busselton; West Arthur, Darkan; Beverley; Brookton; Broomehill; Cuballing; Katanning; Kojoonup; Marradong, Boddington; Narrogin; Pingelly; Tambellup; Wagin; Wandering; Wickepin; Williams; Woodanilling; York.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemption) Act, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation revoke any proclamation previously issued under the said section 4 relating to the waiving or postponing of the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, and the exempting of the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1937, to observe, comply with or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this proclamation revoke the proclamations dated the 5th day of March, 1943; 4th day of June, 1943; 3rd day of September, 1943; 29th day of October, 1943; 28th day of January, 1944; 19th day of May, 1944; 11th day of August, 1944; 17th day of November, 1944; 5th day of January, 1945; 9th day of January, 1945; 27th day of April, 1945; 20th day of July, 1945; 26th day of October, 1945; 15th day of February, 1946, and 17th day of May, 1946, in so far as the said proclamations waived the payment of rent and/or exempted the holders of the mining tenements mentioned in the Schedule hereunder from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 31st day of July, 1946, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued.

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests File No. 275/46, Lands File No. 2713/46.
WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918, it is provided that the Governor may by an Order in Council declare any Crown lands as Timber Reserves within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the Crown lands described in the schedule hereunder as Timber Reserves No. 119/25 within the meaning and for the purpose of the Forests Act, 1918.

Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941.

Wilson Drainage District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 442/46.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, the Governor may constitute any defined portion of the State a drainage district; specify the boundaries of such district, assign a name to such district; and whereas under section 9, subsection (1) the Minister may exercise within any district all the powers and authorities except the power to borrow money, and shall have all the immunities conferred on a Board: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby constitute a Drainage District, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto, and assign the name of the Wilson Drainage District thereto; and doth direct that the Minister shall exercise all the powers and authorities and have the immunities conferred by section 9, subsection (1).

Westerly and North-Westerly, along boundaries of the said location, to its Western corner; thence generally North-Easterly, along the South-Eastern side of a one chain road, to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 2954; thence North, to and along the said boundary, to the South-Eastern corner of location 2952; thence West and North along boundaries of the said location, and onwards, in the latter direction to a South-Eastern boundary of location 3725; thence generally South-Westerly, and North-Westerly, along the Northern side of a one chain road, to a point on a Southern boundary of location 3712, and situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 4824; thence West to and along the said boundary, and onwards, to the Easternmost boundary of location 3180; reserve 16769; thence North, West, North, West, North, East, Northerly, Westerly and Southerly, along boundaries of the said location, to the Southernmost corner of location 3102; thence generally North-Westerly, along boundaries of locations 3102, 1990, 1991, 1992 and 1828, to the South-Western corner of the said location 1828; thence Southerly, generally Westerly, and generally North-Easterly, long boundaries of Nullaki Point Townsite, to its Northern corner; thence continuing generally North-Easterly, and generally South-Easterly, along the Southern shore of Wilson Inlet, to the entrance of Nenamup Inlet; thence generally Northerly, Southerly, Easterly, Northerly and Westerly, along the shores of the latter inlet, to a point situate South of the South-Westernmost corner of location 1088; thence North, to the said corner; thence generally Northerly, along boundaries of the said location, to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 37; thence Westerly and Northerly, to and along boundaries of the said location, to the South-Eastern corner of location 145; thence generally Westerly, North-Westerly, and North-Easterly, along boundaries of locations 145, 1775, and 39, to the said shore of Wilson Inlet at the Western corner of the last-mentioned location; thence generally North-Easterly, and South-Easterly along the said shore, to the North-Eastern corner of location 34; thence Southerly, along the Eastern boundary of the said location to a point situate in prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of location 1093; thence Easterly, to and along the said boundary, to the South-Eastern corner of the said location; and thence Northerly, and East, along boundaries of location 1982 aforesaid, to the starting point.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944 that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10; and whereas Cuming Smith and Mt. Lyell Farmers Fertilisers, Limited, of 133 St. George's Terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 10 and, having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the operation of the said section, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act to pay compensation to all workers employed by it, and that it has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a fixed deposit receipt for five thousand pounds issued by the English, Scottish, and Australian Bank, Limited, at Perth, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers

conferred by the said section 10, doth hereby exempt Cuming Smith and Mount Lyell Farmers Fertilisers Limited, of 133 St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, for a period of two years computed from and including the first day of July, 1946.

The Land Act, 1933-1945.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1945, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 5556 (Wiluna Lot 95) should vest in and be held by the Maternal and Infant Health Association of W.A. 1. By-law 40 of Part VII is deleted and the following by-law is substituted to read as follows:

No person shall transfer any milk, condensed or concentrated milk or cream from one vessel to another vessel on any street or public place except where transferred from the vessel of the producer or vendor for immediate delivery to the customer.

Dwellingup Hospital Board.—Amendment of By-laws Resolution.

THE by-laws for the control of the Medical Fund of the Dwellingup Hospital Board of Management, under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd day of January, 1942, and the 28th day of July, 1944, are amended as follows:—

By-law (5) (*Gazette* 2/1/42)—Delete the words “In-door or” occurring in the second line.

By-law (8) (*Gazette* 2/1/42)—The whole of this by-law to be deleted and the following by-law inserted:—

“The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of out-patient fees to any subsidised hospital for subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for such treatment.

(b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital for out-patient treatment the Board will pay for such treatment but a maximum of £1 1s. only will be paid for X-ray, and £1 1s. only to another doctor for consultation fee. The Board will not be responsible for any fares or cost of transfer.”

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

Bunbury Municipal Council—Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws, for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made, by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act; and whereas a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series A. have been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter; and whereas by resolution dated the 27th day of April, 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of June, 1936, the Bunbury Municipal Council adopted the Model By-laws with amendments and additions: Now, therefore, the Bunbury Municipal Council doth hereby resolve and determine that its by-laws shall be further amended by the addition, to Part VII of the by-laws, of a new by-law to be known as 72A, as follows:—

Part VII—By-law 72A.

(a) Keeper of every eating-house shall:—

1. Keep or cause to be kept scrupulously clean and in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the local authority the floors, walls, ceilings and all por-

tions of the premises and all fittings, stoves, ranges, utensils, implements, shelves, counters, bins, cabinets, fixtures, sinks, drain-boards, drains, grease-traps, tubs, vessels, and things of the like description used on the premises or in connection with the preparation or storage of food thereon.

2. Provide all such furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, grease-traps, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, implements and things for use on the premises as the local authority may from time to time deem necessary for the proper conduct of the business.

3. Construct and arrange or cause to be constructed or arranged all furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, and things in every kitchen, serving room, scullery and fish-cleaning room on the premises so that the floor in every such room or place may at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition.

4. Not keep or use any floor covering that is absorbent or in such a condition as to allow of the lodgment of dirt thereunder.

5. Keep all tables and benches used for the preparation of food at least three inches from the wall and movable to facilitate cleansing.

6. Keep all portions of the premises free from any unwholesome or offensive odour arising from the premises of the operations carried on thereon.

7. Provide and maintain an approved hood over every wood, gas or electric cooking fire, stove or boiler. The hood shall be so placed as to arrest all steam, effluvia, odours and smoke from the process of cooking or boiling. The underside of the hood shall not be more than two feet above the top or fire plate of the stove. The flue from the hood shall be at least seven inches in diameter and shall discharge to the open air at a height of not less than two feet above the eaves of any adjoining building.

8. Provide an efficient chimney or flue to every wood, coal or coke cooking stove so that no smoke nuisance shall arise in or outside the premises.

9. Provide and maintain a hot water installation of capacity to supply sufficient hot water and adequate sink facilities for the thorough cleansing of all drinking vessels, dishes, plates and other vessels, tableware, spoons, forks, knives, and all other utensils used on the premises.

10. Immediately after each occasion of use all such vessels and utensils referred to in clause (9) shall be thoroughly cleansed by means of washing in water at a temperature of not less than 150° F. and immediately thereafter rinsed in clean hot water at a temperature of not less than 120° F. and to the satisfaction in all things of a local authority.

11. Not permit or suffer any table napkin which has been used as such or for any other purpose by any person to be placed on any table in the dining room on the premises used for serving meals for use by or to be used by any other person unless such table napkin shall have been thoroughly washed and cleansed since it was previously used by such first mentioned person.

12. Remove or cause to be removed the whole of the canned or preserved food or any food contained in an hermetically sealed container (such container not being composed wholly of glass or stoneware) intended for use on the premises from such original can or container immediately after the same shall have been opened.

13. Not permit or suffer any food which is unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be used for food, or for the preparation of food or meals.

14. Cause any food which is or has become unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be immediately withdrawn from sale, stock or use and placed in the waste food garbage bin.

15. Provide adequate and efficient means of refrigeration of an approved type for the preservation of food.

16. Remove or cause to be removed any food which may have been served to any person or placed on any table occupied by any customer on the premises and not then consumed or removed by him immediately after such person shall have finished his refreshment to the kitchen or serving room of such premises nor permit, suffer or allow any of such food so removed to any such kitchen or serving room to be again served to any person on the premises, and such food shall be immediately deposited in the waste food garbage bin.

Provided that in this paragraph food shall not mean or include the following substances, to wit, sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices or condiments if such substances are contained in receptacles or containers of a design approved by the inspector and so constructed that the contents of such receptacles or containers cannot be handled by any person. Provided further that in this paragraph food shall not include bread which is placed in a glass receptacle or container of a design approved by a local authority and so constructed that the contents are only handled as required.

17. Not gut, clean or scale any fish on any portion of the premises unless such portion of the said premises shall have been constructed for such purpose and approved in writing by the local authority and shall not store any fish in any kitchen or pantry of the premises unless such fish has already been gutted, cleaned, sealed and washed.

18. Not allow, permit or suffer any live animal or bird to be kept in or upon any portion of the premises set apart for the accommodation of the public or in any kitchen or scullery or serving room or pantry or fish cleaning room on any such premises or in any room in which food intended for use on the premises is stored or prepared for use thereon (provided that a cat or cats may be allowed in such portions of the premises after all food has been covered and premises not open to the public) or allow or permit or suffer any animal or bird to be killed or any poultry, pigeons, or game to be plucked in any such kitchen or scullery.

19. Not permit, suffer or cause to be kept on any portion of the premises any live poultry, pigeons or game or any horse, cow, ass, mule, pig or goat.

20. Not allow, permit or suffer any clothing or wearing apparel to be placed, kept, hung or deposited in any dining room, kitchen, scullery, pantry or food store provided that patrons may be permitted temporarily to hang hats and cloaks in a dining room.

21. Not keep or permit or suffer to be kept any hamper, basket, box, trunk, case, crate or barrel which has contained wet fish or other perishable food and which has not after the last occasion of such use been cleansed and rendered inoffensive upon any portion of the premises for a period longer than 24 hours or in such a manner as to become or be likely to be or become offensive or a nuisance.

22. Not use, keep or store or permit to be used, kept, or stored any petrol, kerosene, benzene, naphtha, alcohol, mineralised or methylated spirit or any volatile liquid (not being an article of food) in any kitchen on the premises.

(b) No keeper of any premises shall:—

1. Permit, suffer or cause to be or done to or on the premises any alteration, addition or other work for any purpose affecting or likely to affect in the opinion of the local authority the suitability of the premises for the use specified under this by-law in respect of such premises without the previous consent in writing of the local authority; or

2. Permit, suffer or cause any spittoon or article or thing for like use to be placed in any dining room or in any place where food is served or in any kitchen, scullery or fish cleaning room on the premises.

3. Alter, suffer or permit any structural or other alterations to be made to any premises or portion thereof without first having obtained permission in writing from the local authority.

(c) No person shall spit and no person shall chew or smoke tobacco in any kitchen, serving room, scullery or fish cleaning room or in any room wherein food is being prepared for use in the premises and every proprietor of such premises shall exhibit conspicuously and constantly maintain in a clean visible and legible condition in every such kitchen, serving room, scullery, fish cleaning room and room in which food is being prepared for use on the premises a notice printed in letters of not less than 48 points face measurement to the following effect:—“Spitting or chewing or smoking tobacco in this room is an offence against the by-law. Penalty not exceeding £50 (fifty pounds).”

(d) Every person engaged on the premises shall when so engaged immediately before beginning work and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience wash his hands and every such person shall when so engaged keep and maintain his clothing and body clean; and every occupier of such premises shall provide and properly maintain at all times on such pre-

mises such means for maintaining personal cleanliness as in the opinion of the local authority shall be adequate and efficient.

(e) No person who is suffering from any infectious, contagious or eruptive disease, suppurating wound or sore, discharging abscess or gathering, chest complaint accompanied with expectoration, or malignant growth of any kind, shall enter the kitchen or take part in the preparation or handling of food on any premises.

(f) 1. Every keeper of premises shall as soon as he becomes aware that any person engaged on the premises is suffering from any of the abovementioned diseases cause him to cease to be engaged on and to leave such premises without unnecessary delay and shall not allow him to be again engaged on such premises until such person shall have obtained a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner that he has recovered from or is not suffering from any such condition as aforesaid and is no longer a source of danger to others.

2. The keeper of the premises shall forthwith report in writing to the Medical Officer the suspension of any person engaged on the premises suffering from any disease mentioned in (e) of this by-law and shall send a copy of any medical certificate obtained for the purpose of this clause to the Medical Officer before such person shall again be engaged on the premises.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

The Municipality of Midland Junction—Health By-laws (Eating Houses).

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1944, a local authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the Municipality of Midland Junction, being a local health authority, doth hereby make the following by-law.

Eating Houses.

1. This by-law shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1947.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Act” means the Health Act, 1911-1944, and any amendment thereof.

“Local Authority” means the Municipality of Midland Junction.

“Medical Officer” means the Medical Officer of the local authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.

“Senior Inspector” means the Senior Health Inspector of the local authority and includes any person acting in that capacity.

“Inspector” means any person appointed by the local authority to be a Health Inspector pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

“License” means a license to conduct an Eating House granted pursuant to the provisions of this by-law.

“Registered premises” means any premises which are registered as an Eating House under this by-law.

The terms “food,” “eating house,” “owner,” “premises” and “proprietor” shall have the same meanings as they have under the Act.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of Midland Junction.

3. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an Eating House unless:—

(a) The premises are registered under this by-law by the local authority, and

(b) the proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a license issued by the local authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an Eating House.

4. Before any premises are registered under this by-law, the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application, together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a Certificate of Registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. Before any license to any proprietor to conduct an Eating House is granted by the local authority under this by-law, the proprietor shall sign an application for the same in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee, to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a license in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

6. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under clauses 4 or 5 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Every Certificate of Registration of premises registered as an Eating House and every license issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the local authority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the Certificate of Registration and the license on the registered premises and shall, when requested so to do by an Inspector, produce to him the Certificate of Registration and also the license issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

8. Every Certificate of Registration and every license shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereof until and inclusive of the 31st day of December then next ensuing, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

9. Applications for the renewal of Certificates of Registration and licenses shall be made annually during the month of December. Such applications shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto, respectively, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

10. The fees to be paid to the local authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a license and on the renewal of any registration or license shall be as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

11. So often as any person holding a license issued pursuant to this by-law changes his place of abode, he shall within seven days next after such a change give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk, specifying in such notice his new place of abode, and he shall at the same time produce such license to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

12. (1) If the owner of any registered premises sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer the said premises to another person, he shall within 14 days from the date of such sale or transfer or agreement notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing, stating the full name, address and occupation of such other person.

12. (2) Such other person shall within 14 days of such sale, transfer or agreement make application in writing to the Town Clerk in the form of the Eighth Schedule for the transfer of such license, and shall attach to such application the then current license, together with fees as prescribed in the Seventh Schedule.

12. (3) If such proposed transfer of the license is approved by the local authority, the Town Clerk shall thereupon endorse a memorandum to that effect and return such license to the transferee, whereupon the same shall remain current in such transferee's name for the unexpired period of such license.

12. (4) Any person who makes any false statement in connection with any application for transfer of a license as provided under subsection 3 shall be guilty of an offence.

13. In all premises occupied or used or intended to be occupied or used as an Eating House:—

(a) The walls of all rooms therein shall be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete suitably rendered and plastered and shall be tiled or oil-painted to a height of at least seven feet from the floor level so as to maintain a smooth, hard, durable and washable surface, devoid of holes, cracks and crevices.

(b) The floors of all kitchens, sculleries, and food and vegetable stores shall be constructed or adapted with concrete rendered with cement, or provided with an approved surfacing which must be applied directly to the concrete without intervening air spaces.

(c) Every room therein shall be properly ceiled with stamped metal, lath and plaster, fibrous plaster or asbestos sheets or other similar material, and shall be constructed and maintained throughout its area and at the wall junctions free from holes, cracks and crevices.

(d) There shall be provided a suitable kitchen, larder, scullery, dry food store, and cupboards, and such kitchen (exclusive of all larder, scullery, dry food store, and cupboards) shall have a floor area not less than 25 per cent. of the floor area of the dining room of such premises, but in no case shall such floor area be less than 144 square feet. Where any larder, scullery, dry food store, or cupboards are permitted to be incorporated in the lay-out of any kitchen, then the floor area occupied by such larder, scullery, dry food store, or cupboards shall not be deemed part of the floor area of the kitchen for the purpose of this clause.

(e) There shall be provided for the use of employees and, when required by the local authority, there shall also be provided for customers, sufficient and suitable lavatories with wash-hand basins and all necessary appurtenances or such other lavatory system as may be approved by the local authority, and there shall also be provided for use therewith an adequate supply of water, soap, nail-brushes and clean towels, but no towel or towels shall be provided for use in common.

(f) There shall be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of employees, and when required by the local authority, there shall also be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of customers, and in either case when considered necessary by the local authority, separate sanitary conveniences shall be provided for each sex.

(g) All water closets or urinals situate on any registered premises shall be separate from the yard or building of such premises by a properly constructed anti-chamber or air-lock not less than 30 square feet in area.

(h) Every room shall be properly lighted with a surface of clear glass exposed to the open air equivalent to not less than one-tenth of the floor area of the room. Where such natural lighting cannot be reasonably secured, artificial lighting to the approval of the local authority shall be installed.

(i) Every room shall be provided with approved outlet ventilators corresponding with an allowance of not less than one square inch of airway for every 40 cubic feet of gross air space of every such compartment, or alternatively, some mechanical system of ventilation shall be installed to the satisfaction of the local authority.

(j) The air space between the ground surface and the floor (except in the case of concrete or other solid floors) shall be efficiently ventilated to the satisfaction of the local authority.

(k) In every registered premises where wood, coal or coke is used as fuel, such wood, coal or coke shall be stored or kept in a properly constructed wood store with brick walls and concrete floor, separating such store from the remainder of the premises.

14. The proprietor of every Eating House registered under this by-law shall:—

(a) Keep or cause to be kept scrupulously clean and in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the senior Health Inspector the floors, walls, ceilings and all portions of the registered premises and all fittings, stoves, ranges, utensils, implements, shelves, counters, bins, cabinets, fixtures, sinks, drain-boards, drains, grease traps, tubs, vessels, and things of the like description used on the premises or in connection with the preparation or storage of food thereon.

(b) Provide all such furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, grease traps, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, implements and things for use on the registered premises as the senior Health Inspector may from time to time deem necessary for the proper conduct of the business.

(c) Construct and arrange or cause to be constructed or arranged all furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, and things in every kitchen, serving room, scullery and fish-cleaning room on the registered premises so that the floor in every such room or place may at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition.

(d) Not keep or use any floor covering that is absorbent or in such a condition as to allow of the lodgment of dirt thereunder.

(e) Keep all tables and benches used for the preparation of food at least three inches from the wall and moveable to facilitate cleansing.

(f) Provide and properly maintain at all times suitable and effective means for keeping and keep every room or compartment on the registered premises free from dust, rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, ants, moths, and all other vermin, and if, in the opinion of an inspector, effective means and methods of cleansing and eradication of vermin from the premises cannot be done effectively while the ordinary business of the establishment is carried on, then the local authority may order the temporary closure of the premises to the public until such time as such cleansing and eradication of vermin has been carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector.

(g) For the purpose of keeping the registered premises free from rats; provide and maintain at least six spring break-back rat traps, in good working order, properly set and baited at all times. The type and number of traps and kind of baits used and the position and locality of the traps set shall be as directed by an inspector.

(h) Keep all portions of the registered premises free from any unwholesome or offensive odour arising from the premises or the operations carried on thereon.

(i) Provide and maintain an approved hood over every wood, gas, or electric cooking fire, stove, or boiler. The hood shall be so placed as to arrest all steam, effluvia, odours and smoke from the process of cooking or boiling. The underside of the hood shall not be more than two feet above the top or fire plate of the stove. The flue from the hood shall be at least seven inches in diameter and shall discharge to the open air at a height of not less than two feet above the eaves of any adjoining building.

(j) Provide an efficient chimney or flue to every wood, coal or coke cooking stove so that no smoke nuisance shall arise in or outside the premises.

(k) Provide and keep a sufficient number of suitable vessels or receptacles, with lids, constructed of galvanised iron or other non-absorbent and non-corrosive material to a design approved by the senior Inspector on the registered premises for the purpose of receiving all garbage, waste matter and other refuse arising from the business, and place and keep such vessels or receptacles in a properly constructed room with concrete floor to be fly and rat-proof, and efficiently ventilated, or in such positions as directed by an inspector.

(l) Forthwith after such garbage, waste matter and other refuse is produced, place the same in such vessels or receptacles provided and kept in accordance with paragraph (k) hereof, and remove or cause the contents of such vessels or receptacles to be removed from the premises at least once in every 24 hours.

(m) Thoroughly cleanse all such vessels or receptacles provided and kept in accordance with paragraph (k) hereof once at least in every 24 hours and to the satisfaction of an inspector, and renew or repair any or all of the aforesaid vessels or receptacles as often as is necessary and when required by an inspector so to do.

(n) Provide and maintain a hot water installation of capacity to supply sufficient hot water and adequate sink facilities for the thorough cleansing of all drinking vessels, dishes, plates, and other vessels, tableware, spoons, forks, knives and all other utensils used on the registered premises.

(o) Immediately after each occasion of use all such vessels and utensils referred to in clause (n) shall be thoroughly cleansed by means of washing in water at a temperature of not less than 150° F., and immediately thereafter rinsed in clear hot water at a temperature of not less than 120° F., and to the satisfaction in all things of an inspector.

(p) Not permit or suffer any table napkin which has been used as such or for any other purpose by any person to be placed on any table in the dining room on the registered premises used for serving meals for use by or to be used by any other person, unless such table napkin shall have been thoroughly washed and cleansed since it was previously used by such first-mentioned person.

(q) Remove or cause to be removed the whole of the canned or preserved food or any food contained in an hermetically sealed container (such container not being composed wholly of glass or stoneware) intended for use on the registered premises from such original can or container immediately after the same shall have been opened.

(r) Not permit or suffer any food which is unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be used for food, or for the preparation of food or meals.

(s) Cause any food which is or has become unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be immediately withdrawn from sale, stock or use and placed in the waste food garbage bin.

(t) Provide adequate and efficient means of refrigeration of an approved type for the preservation of food.

(u) Remove or cause to be removed any food which may have been served to any person or placed on any table occupied by any customer on the registered premises and not then consumed or removed by him immediately after such person shall have finished his refreshment to the kitchen or serving room of such premises, nor permit, suffer, or allow any of such food so removed to any such kitchen or serving room to be again served to any person on the registered premises, and such food shall immediately be deposited in the waste food garbage bin. Provided that in this paragraph food shall not mean or include the following substances, to wit, sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices or condiments if such substances are contained in receptacles or containers of a design approved by the inspector and so constructed that the contents of such receptacles or containers cannot be handled by any person. Provided further, that in this paragraph food shall not include bread, which is placed in a glass receptacle or container of a design approved by an inspector and so constructed that the contents are only handled as required.

(v) Not gut, clean or scale any fish on any portion of the registered premises unless such portion of the said premises shall have been constructed for such purpose, and approved in writing by the senior Health Inspector, and shall not store any fish in any kitchen or pantry of the registered premises unless such fish has already been gutted, cleaned, scaled and washed.

(w) Not allow, permit, or suffer any live animal or bird to be kept in or upon any portion of the registered premises set apart for the accommodation of the public or in any kitchen or scullery, or serving room or pantry, or fish cleaning room on any such premises, or in any room in which food intended for use on the registered premises is stored or prepared for use thereon (provided that a cat or cats may be allowed in such portions of the premises after all food has been covered and the premises are not open to the public), or allow or permit or suffer any animal or bird to be killed or any poultry, pigeons, or game to be plucked in any such kitchen or scullery.

(x) Not permit, suffer or cause to be kept on any portion of the registered premises any live poultry, pigeons or game or any horse, cow, ass, mule, pig or goat.

(y) Provide and maintain a suitable change and cloak room approved by the senior Inspector for the exclusive use of female employees, and an approved cloak room for male employees.

(z) Not allow, permit or suffer any clothing or wearing apparel to be placed, kept, hung, or deposited in any dining room, kitchen, scullery, pantry or food store: Provided that patrons may be permitted temporarily to hang hats and cloaks in a dining room.

(aa) Not keep or permit or suffer to be kept any hamper, basket, box, trunk, case, crate or barrel which has contained wet fish or other perishable food and which has not after the last occasion of such use been cleansed and rendered inoffensive upon any portion of the registered premises for a period longer than 24 hours, or in such a manner as to become or be likely to be or become offensive or a nuisance.

(bb) Cleanse daily and at all times keep and maintain all water-closets, urinals, lavatories, catch-pits, grease traps and all other sanitary appliances on the registered premises in a clean and sanitary condition.

(cc) At all times provide and maintain a notice board on which is legibly inscribed, in letters one inch high, the name of the person licensed to carry on business

on the registered premises, and such notice board shall be fixed and maintained free from obstruction in a prominent position at the entrance of the dining room.

(dd) Not use, keep or store or permit to be used, kept or stored any petrol, kerosene, benzine, naphtha, alcohol, mineralised or methylated spirit or any volatile liquid (not being an article of food) in any kitchen on the registered premises.

15. No proprietor of any registered premises shall:—

(a) Permit, suffer or cause to be made or done to or on the registered premises any alteration, addition or other work for any purpose affecting or likely to affect, in the opinion of the senior Health Inspector, the suitability of the premises for the use specified in the license granted under this by-law in respect of such premises, without the previous consent in writing of the senior Health Inspector, or

(b) permit or suffer any drain-pipe for carrying off faecal or sewage matter to have an opening, or any gully trap, to be within any roofed enclosures (not being a water-closet or urinal) on the registered premises; or

(c) permit, suffer, or cause any spittoon or article or thing for like use to be placed in any dining room or in any place where food is served, or in any kitchen, scullery, or fish cleaning room on the registered premises.

(d) Permit, allow or suffer a greater number of persons to be accommodated at any one time in any dining room on the registered premises than will allow of a ratio of one person to every 12 square feet of the available floor area of such dining room.

(e) Alter, suffer or permit any structural or other alterations to be made to any registered premises or portion thereof without first having obtained permission in writing from the local authority.

16. No person shall spit and no person shall chew or smoke tobacco in any kitchen, serving room, scullery or fish cleaning room, or in any room wherein food is being prepared for use in the registered premises, and every proprietor of such premises shall exhibit conspicuously and constantly maintain in a clean, visible and legible condition in every such kitchen, serving room, scullery, fish cleaning room and room in which food is being prepared for use on the premises a notice printed in letters of not less than 48 points face measurement to the following effect:—"Spitting, or chewing or smoking tobacco in this room is an offence against the by-law. Penalty not exceeding £50 (Fifty Pounds)."

17. Every person engaged on the registered premises shall, when so engaged, immediately before beginning work and immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience, wash his hands, and every such person shall, when so engaged, keep and maintain his clothing and body clean; and every occupier of such premises shall provide and properly maintain at all times on such premises such means for maintaining personal cleanliness as in the opinion of the inspector shall be adequate and efficient.

18. No person who is suffering from any infectious, contagious or eruptive disease, suppurating wound or sore, discharging abscess or gathering, chest complaint accompanied with expectoration, or malignant growth of any kind, shall enter the kitchen or take part in the preparation or handling of food on any registered premises.

19. (1) Every proprietor of registered premises shall so soon as he becomes aware that any person engaged on the premises is suffering from any of the abovementioned diseases cause him to cease to be engaged on and to leave such licensed premises without unnecessary delay, and shall not allow him to be again engaged on such premises until such person shall have obtained a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner that he has recovered from or is not suffering from any such condition as aforesaid, and is no longer a source of danger to others.

(2) The proprietor of registered premises shall forthwith report in writing to the Medical Officer the suspension of any person engaged on the premises suffering from any disease mentioned in clause 19 of this by-law, and shall send a copy of any medical certificate obtained for the purpose of this clause to the Medical Officer before such person shall again be engaged on the premises.

20. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, and, where such breach is of a continuing nature to a daily penalty not exceeding two pounds.

Geraldton Public Cemetery (Reserve No. 19984)—
By-laws.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, 1897, and the Acts amending the same, has been pleased to approve of the following by-laws for the control and management of the Geraldton Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 19984.

Public Cemetery, Geraldton—By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the trustees of the Geraldton Public Cemetery, the said trustees make the following by-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. The "secretary," as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as the secretary of the Cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

3. The "superintendent," as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as the superintendent of the Cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, have charge of the general care of the Cemetery, the supervision of the erection or placing of monumental work and fixtures, also the supervision of interments, the opening, closing and dressing of graves, and such other duties as are mentioned in these by-laws or ordered by the trustees.

4. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B.

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the offices of the trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

6. The trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. Any coffin not complying with this by-law will not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

8. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

10. If application be made for an "interment" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial."

11. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be re-opened, for the purposes of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before the interment takes place.

12. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representative be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such a certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

13. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except by written permission of the trustees or when it is certified in writing by a Medical Officer of Health, or by a Police Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

14. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.

15. The hours for burial shall be as follows: Week-days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the trustees.

16. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

17. If for any reason the funeral shall, on arrival at the entrance gates of the Cemetery, remain there for more than 15 minutes prior to proceeding to the graveside, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings and sixpence.

18. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Vehicles shall not be allowed to proceed faster than five miles per hour within the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the superintendent or other officer of the trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

19. If application be made to the trustees to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or of his family, an order from the Governor or the warrant of a Coroner or of a Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Board to permit of the exhumation must be attached to the application form.

20. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

21. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

22. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

23. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the trustees for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the trustees or their representatives.

24. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

25. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, flower, earth or other material without the written authority of the trustees or their representative.

26. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the trustees, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

27. No person employed by or under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the trustees, except by written permission of the trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work without such permission shall be liable to summary dismissal.

28. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

29. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. Any portion of such tombstone, monument, enclosure, foundations or other work outside the area of the grave shall not be above the level of the ground and shall not encroach more than six inches outside the area of the grave.

30. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the superintendent or other officer appointed by the trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

31. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

32. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the trustees the sum of one pound (£1) which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

33. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery. No sand, earth or other material shall be taken from any part of the Cemetery for use in the erection of any monument or work except with the written approval of the trustees.

34. No catacomb shall be allowed.

35. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the Cemetery during other than the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, Saturday and Sunday excepted, when no work is to be done from noon Saturday to the opening of gates on the Monday morning, without the written permission of the trustees.

36. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

37. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the superintendent.

38. All workmen, whether employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said superintendent, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

39. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the trustees, such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July.

40. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed in any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed. (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the superintendent. (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the superintendent. (d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due dispatch, and only during regulation hours.

41. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every undertaker shall pay to the trustees an annual fee as prescribed in Schedule A and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

42. The trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee so to do. If the grantees do not desire the trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the trustees for that purpose.

43. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the trustees, or those licensed by the trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

44. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the trustees find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, shrubs, etc., from off the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the trustees the charges laid down in Schedule A.

45. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

46. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

47. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

48. Any person committing any breach of any by-law or regulation, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach a further sum not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

49. Any person committing a breach of any by-law in the Cemetery shall in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-law be liable to be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the trustees or the superintendent or other employee of the trustees or by any police constable. If such person resists removal, or if and as often as such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the superintendent, again enter the Cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Geraldton Public Cemetery held at 34 Durlacher Street, Geraldton, on the 21st day of February, 1946, and adopted.

NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924-1939.

Mingenew District Road Board.

MINGENEW Road Board being a Local Authority within the meaning of and for the purpose of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, hereby makes the following by-laws in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred by section 26 of the said Act, such by-laws to be in addition to any by-laws already made in exercise of the said powers.

Destruction of Noxious Weeds.

1. (1) Every owner and every occupier of land within the district of the Mingeneew Road Board upon which any noxious weeds are growing or are present shall take one or more of the following alternative actions to destroy such noxious weeds and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all noxious weeds have been destroyed:—(a) Pull all noxious weeds from the ground by hand, or (b) sever all such noxious weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand, or (c) cultivate the ground by means of an implement which will

sever such noxious weeds below the ground level, or (d) plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the Board, or (e) break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, mowing machine or reaping and binding machine, or (f) in cases where the plants are dry and there is suitable herbage cover, burn such noxious weeds by means of a running fire, or (g) carry out any other method approved by the Board.

(2) The Local Inspector appointed by the Board under the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any land within the said district require him to take any particular measures or do any particular acts mentioned in the last preceding paragraph to destroy noxious weeds growing or being on the land owned or occupied by him, and he shall forthwith take or do the same without having the alternative mentioned in such paragraph.

(3) Every owner and every occupier of land within the said district shall immediately after any noxious weeds on such land have been removed from the ground or detached from their roots, gather the same into rows or heaps and burn them immediately they are sufficiently dry for that purpose, except in such cases where the Board has given written approval for them to be handled in some other manner.

(4) Any person who commits any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Prevention of Noxious Weeds.

2. (1) No owner or occupier of land within the said district shall:—

(a) Introduce any stock or farm produce from any place infested with noxious weeds, or

(b) Remove stock or farm produce from any place infested with noxious weeds within the said district to any other place within or without the district unless such person obtains and produces to the Board an Inspector's Certificate certifying that such stock or produce is free from the seeds of any noxious weeds.

(2) Any owner or occupier of land who commits a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court—

(a) That a certificate of an Inspector was immediately previously obtained in respect of such stock or produce to the effect that such stock or produce was free from the seeds of any noxious weeds;

(b) That the said stock or produce was removed or went or was taken beyond the limits of the holding without his knowledge and that he had taken all reasonable means to prevent the same from being removed or going or being taken beyond such limits.
