WHEREAS it is enacted by section 25 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, that the Governor may by proclamation declare any article to be a poison within the meaning of the said Act, and may revoke or vary any proclamation made under the said section by a subsequent proclamation; and whereas the Governor has under and in accordance with the said section from time to time proclaimed certain articles to be poisons as aforesaid; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to add to such poisons declared as aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 25 of the said Act, do hereby declare that the article specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be deemed a poison within the meaning of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, and that the name thereof shall be inserted under the appropriate Schedule to the said Act.

#### Schedule.

(a) Pure and commercial Dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane (commonly known as D.D.T.) without admixture be inserted in Part 1 of the Fifth Schedule.

(b) Preparations containing 10% or more of Dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane (commonly known as D.D.T.) to be inserted in the Ninth Schedule.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 11 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby vary the proclamation dated January 29, 1946 (published in the *Government Gazette* of February 8, 1946), prohibiting all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule thereto, from January 1, 1946, until December 31, 1948, inclusive, by providing that during the currency of the said proclamation it shall be lawful to use a prawn net not exceeding 12 feet in length and having meshes of not more than one inch throughout for the capture

of prawns only in the waters of that part of the Channel Entrance to Peel's Inlet described in the Schedule hereto, provided that no such net is set closer than 12 feet to any other such net set therein or closer than 25 feet to any part of the platform abutting on the Mandurah Bridge, and provided further that no such net is set in the fairway of such Channel Entrance.

# Schedule.

All that portion of Peel Inlet bounded by lines starting from the Eastern corner of location 972 Murray, and extending Westerly to the South-Eastern boundary of location 5; thence generally North-Easterly, and Northerly, along boundaries of the said location 5, and location 58, to the North-Eastern corner of the latter location; thence East-North-Easterly, along the Southern side of the Mandurah Bridge, to the common boundary of the Murray and Cockburn Sound Land Districts; thence generally Southerly, along the said boundary, to the South-Western corner of an island situate South of Channel Island and near Creery Island; thence Westerly to a point of land situate about 14 chains North-Easterly from the Eastern corner of location 972 aforesaid; and thence generally South-Westerly, along the shores of the Peel Inlet, to the starting point.

# THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

#### Albany Road Board-Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws, for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made, by a local authority under any provisions of the Act; and whereas a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series A have been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927, and amended by notice published in the Government Gazette from time to time thereafter; and whereas the said Model By-laws have been reprinted with amendments and published in the Government Gazette of the 4th December, 1944: Now, therefore, the Albany Road Board, being a local health authority within the meaning of the Act, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said Model By-laws as reprinted in the Government Gazette of the 4th December, 1944, shall be adopted without modification.

# ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1943. Bassendean Road Board.

By-law relating to Blasting, Quarrying and Excavations. THE Bassendean Road Board, inpursuance of section 202 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, doth hereby make and publish the following by-law:

1. No person, company or corporation shall within the limits of the Bassendean Road District directly or indirectly-Quarry or permit quarries or excavations for stone, gravel, sand, or other materials, or do any act or thing, for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material whereby an excavation is created or enlarged, without a license from the Board in writing first had and obtained: Provided that any person may excavate for foundations, wells, post-holes, septic tanks, excitate for foundations, wells, post-holes, septic tanks, reservoirs, air-raid shelters, according to the plans and specifications submitted to the Board upon the granting of a building permit. The owner (as shown by the rate bodk), the registered proprietor, the purchaser under contract of sale, the occupier and/or any person removing or assisting in removing any such material without a license having been granted in respect thereof, shall be liable as if such person were actually quarrying.

2. The application for a license shall be in writing, with a deposit of £1, and accompanied by a plan showing the site, with contours and levels and size of the propose quarrying or excavation and its distance from the nearest buildings, roads, and footpaths.

3. The fee for such license shall be £1 per annum and, if cancelled by the Board during its currency, a proportionate part will be refunded.

The Board may refuse to grant or renew a license without assigning any reason to the applicant.

5. The licensee shall, before commencing any blasting or quarrying, erect and keep exhibited such notices of warning as may be directed by the Board.

6. The licensee shall obey the directions of the Board as to the limit in size, weight, or amount of any explosive that may be used in any charge.

7. Every quarry shall be enclosed by a sufficient fence to keep out persons, stock, and eattle and shall have gates, which shall be kept locked during the hours when quarrying operations are not being carried on.

8. No excavation shall be made below the level of the nearest road, except with the written consent of the Board, which may require a deposit from the licensee to cover the cost of levelling such excavation.

9. Before the grant of a license the applicant shall notify every owner of land situated within 300 yards of the proposed excavation and such notification shall inform such owner that he may within seven days object in writing to the granting of a license.

10. No license will be granted for any excavation, and no excavation shall be made or maintained within 20 yards of any road, or of land owned by the Bassendean Road Board, or any person which would be likely (after allowing for a normal angle of slope of the materials excavated) to cause a subsidence of such road or land.

11. The license shall show on its face that it is granted for 12 months and may be renewed annually, and is subject to cancellation without compensation at any time for infringement of any of the by-laws governing the same, or on the breach of any conditions

12. The licensee shall drain and keep drained the excavations, and the responsibility for the discharge and disposal of the water drained shall be upon the licensee

13. The Board may, before or pending the grant of a license, enter into agreements with the licensee as to compliance with the above by-laws, the observance of regulations relating to heavy traffic, the constructions and maintenance of a private road to the quarry or excavation of the licensee bearing a proportionate part of the maintenance of the public road in the said district used by him, and such agreement shall be conditions of the grant and holding of the license. 14. If the Board shall cancel the license for any

reason other than the infringement of any of the con-ditions of the license or agreement (if any), the licensee shall be entitled to a refund of a proportionate part of the fee paid.

15. Between five and ten minutes before blasting a charge, the licensee shall, by bell, whistle, or other means, give sufficient warning of danger.

16. The holding of a license shall not exempt the licensee from damage or liability to the public or entitle or permit him to commit any nuisance.

17. Any contravention of an agreement, if any, or the conditions imposed upon the granting of a license, shall incur cancellation of the license.

18. If there is any breach of any of the above by-laws the penalty shall be up to  $\pounds 20$ .

19. These by-laws shall apply to existing as well as future quarries.

20. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to limit, diminish, or restrict any general by-law made or to be made under the Town Planning and Development Act, and in case of any inconsistency, such general bylaw shall prevail.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in section 201 (8) (a) of the Road Districts Act and all other powers thereto them enabling the Board of the Bassendean Road District doth hereby make and publish the fol-

these by-laws shall mean any vehicle or machine drawn by animal traction, or propelled or drawn by any mechanical power, and includes the vehicle known as a "trotting spider."

"Constructed Roadway" shall mean that area between the boundary lines of a road or street survey, which or similar materials, for the use of general traffic. "Unmade Portion" as applied to a road shall mean

that area within the boundaries of a surveyed road or street, situated between a constructed roadway and the outer edge or kerb of any footpath. If there is no constructed footpath the term applies to the area situated between a constructed roadway and the road boundary.

No person shall ride any horse or drive any vehicle on the unmade portion of any made road within the boundaries of the Bassendean Road District but shall at all times keep to the constructed roadway.

Any person or persons offending against the provi-sions of this by-law shall be guilty of offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

3. Nothing in this by-law shall prevent the driving of any vehicle or the riding of any horse on any made runway leading from a constructed roadway to a gate or entrance to any property adjoining such roadway nor to the driver or rider of any such vehicle or horse using the unmade portion of a road for the purpose of obtaining access to any such property by the most direct route between the made roadway and such pro-

Any person per-mitted by the Board to creet any stall on any footpath, street or way shall conduct it in an orderly manner, and shall not cry his wares.

# ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1943.

#### Bunbury Road Board.

P.W. 1029/37.

By-laws regulating the Flow of Poisonous or Offensive Waters from Factories and other Works and Undertakings.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in section 201 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, the Board of the Bunbury Road District hereby makes the undermentioned by-laws:-

(1) Any person who owns, manages, conducts, controls, or is in charge of any factory or other works or undertakings, or of any work or operation carried on or inductantings, or of any work or operation carried on in any factory, works or undertakings, and who shall suffer or permit any poisonous or offensive water to flow or be conveyed from such factory or other works or undertakings into any creek, watercourse, water channel, or drain within the district, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law and shall on conviction by light to a pound the conversion for which for the former to be liable to a penalty not exceeding 20 pounds for each offence.

(2) Every person who owns, manages, conducts, controls, or is in charge of any factory or other works or undertakings, or of any work or operation carried on in any factory, works, or undertakings as aforesaid, shall take due precautions against the leakage from any vats, tanks, vessels, pits, conduits, or open channels of any poisonous or offensive waters therefrom, and shall sufficiently fence off and protect from the public or from any stray stock all such vats, tanks, vessels, pits, con-duits, or open channels containing any poisonous or offensive water, and every person who shall fail or neglect to so take precautions, or who shall neglect to so fence off and protect any such vat, tank, vessel, pit, conduit, or open channel, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

(3) Every person who owns, manages, conducts, con-trols, or is in charge of any factory or other works or undertakings, or of any work or operation carried on in any factory, works, or undertakings as aforesaid, shall make due provision for the conveyance away from such factory or other works or undertakings of all offensive or waste waters or poisonous water derived from such factory or other works or undertakings, in properly constructed channels or watercourses or conduits and shall make provision by means of culverts or bridges for the

crossing over by the public of all such channels, watercourses, or conduits. Such culverts or bridges or cross-ing places shall be constructed in such a manner as the Board directs, and shall at all times be kept and main-tained in an efficient manner to the satisfaction of the Board. Any person offending against the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(4) The word "person" where it is used in these bylaws, shall mean and include any person, firm or body corporate, and shall also include any manager, servant, or employee of such person, firm or body corporate who does or permits to be done any act made punishable by these by laws, or fails or neglects to do any act re-quired to be done hereunder; whether such act or omission is done or omitted to be done by the authority or permission of any such person, firm or corporation, or not.

By-law No. 28, Clause 20 (a)-Verandahs

(Erection thereof).

P.W. 1184/45.

A By-law of the Municipality of Northam made under section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1945, and numbered By-law 28, Clause 20 (a), prescribing for the Erection of Verandahs over any public footpath within the limits of the district of the Municipality of Northam.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Northam order as follows:-

No person shall erect any verandah over any public footpath within the limits of the district of the Municipality of Northam without having first obtained Municipality of Northam without naving first obtained the consent of the Council of the Municipality of Nor-tham, such consent to be signified by the issue of a license in the form of the Schedule hereto. 2. Any person desiring to obtain the consent of the Council to the erection of such a verandah shall deposit with the Town Clerk of the Council a plan, elevation,

section and specification showing in detail the proposed construction of such verandah and the manner in which it is proposed to secure it to the building to which it is proposed to be attached.

3. No such verandah shall hereafter be erected unless it is of the cantilever type and conforms, save as here-inafter provided, to the standard design which has been settled and approved by the Council and deposited in the office of the Town Clerk. Provided that the strength of the materials used in the construction of any such verandah and the design thereof may, subject to the approval of the Council, be varied according to circumstances.

The minimum height of any verandah hereafter erected shall be 11 feet from the top of the kerb to the underside of the signboard. In the case of sloping ground the height shall be measured at the centre of the frontage. Provided that if the frontage shall exceed 20 feet a break shall be made if so directed by the Council.

5. All verandahs in a street shall be erected of a uniform height and width. Subject to the last preceding section the standard height and width of verandahs in each street shall be fixed by the Council.

6. In the construction of every such verandah the following conditions shall be complied with:---

(a) The roof shall be covered with 24-gauge gal-vanised corrugated iron. The gutters shall be lined with galvanised plain iron not lighter than 24-gauge and shall be of a capacity sufficient to carry off all rain or stormwater. Such capacity shall in no case

be less than 27 square inches. (b) Down pipes shall be of 24-gauge galvanised iron with a minimum area of nine square inches. The inlets from the gutters to the down-pipes shall be at least twice the area of the down-pipes and shall be funnel shaped. Special provisions shall be made for the head of the down-pipes, the lower length of such down since of the down-pipes; the lower length of such down-pipes shall be 18-gauge at least and to a height of six feet above the footpath shall be of cast-iron or concrete and the portion thereof carrying water under the footpath shall be of wrought iron or concrete.

(c) The ceiling shall be of ceilite, plain galvanised iron or other approved non-inflammable materials, securely fixed to the wood joists which shall be of 4in. x 2in. spaced not more than two feet centres running parallel with the footpath and secured to the steel framing. All ceilings to be flat and level.

(d) The hanging bolts are to be 1% in. in diameter, attached to the framing as shown, and securely bolted to the building and provided with a union screw all quite plain.

7. The fascia or signboard of every such verandah is to be framed as shown and covered with 24-gauge galvanised iron neatly fitted over the framing and a flashing of 5 lbs. lead must be fixed over the top as shown.

8. Whenever a proposed verandah will abut on to an existing verandah it shall be so finished as to prevent rain from falling between such verandahs. Provided that when the existing verandah is shorter than the frontage of the building to which it is attached the person erecting the new verandah shall make the necessary extension to the existing one.

Whenever the end of a verandah abuts on to the end of a right-of-way, street or public place, the signboard shall be returned along such end to the satisfaction of the Council.

10. No writing, printing or trade notice of any description shall be exhibited on any portion of the verandah except on the outer face of the signboard and/or upon signboards under the ceiling of the verandah, securely and rigidly fixed to the ceiling at right angles to the building line and having a maximum depth of 12 inches and at a distance of 12 feet between one another.

11. No verandah nor any part thereof shall be painted or repainted unless the colours in which it is proposed to paint or repaint the same shall have been first submitted to the Council and its approval thereof obtained in writing.

12. No paper bill or calico sign shall be placed or exhibited on any verandah unless the consent in writing of the Council shall have been first obtained.

13. The owner or occupier for the time being of any building against or in front of which there is any verandah whether constructed before or after the passing of this by-law shall keep the verandah clean painted and in good repair and it shall be lawful for the Council to give notice to the owner or occupier of the said building to clean, paint or repair such verandah whenever in its opinion such cleaning, painting or

repairing is required. 14. Where anything by this by-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done or where authority is given to the Council to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done and such act so diror to forbid anything to be done and such act so dir-ected to be done remains undone or such act forbidden to be done is done in every such case the person mak-ing such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this by-law. And every person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable for every such offence besides any costs which may be incurred in the taking of pro-ceedings against such person guilty of such offence as well as any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the execution of the work directed to be so executed and not so executed, to a penalty not exceeding 20 pounds for every breach of any such by-law or to a penalty not exceeding two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

1. By-law No. 28, clause 20, heretofore made by the Municipality of Northam is hereby repealed.

2. The owner of any building against or in front of which there is any verandah or balcony supported on posts and projecting over the footway of any street, road, or way in any part of the Municipality of Northam, whether such verandah or balcony was erected before the commencement of paragraph (47) of section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1945, or not, shall at his own expense remove such verandah or balcony within the period of two years from the 20th day of February, 1949.

3. Any person who refuses or neglects to remove any such verandah or balcony within the aforesaid period of two years shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law. Every person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 20 pounds, and shall also be liable for each successive breach of this by-law to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

# 2.--CHILDREN'S FARES.

Children between three and fifteen years of age, when not occupying a seat to the exclusion of an adult, shall be carried over a 3d. section for one penny, over a 4d.,

5d. or 6d. direct section where there is no rebooking for 2d., and over a 7d., 8d. or 9d. direct section where there is no rebooking for 3d. Minimum fare one penny. Children under three years will be carried free when not occupying a seat to the exclusion of an adult.

#### 3.-WORKERS' FARES.

On all trams or buses boarded by passengers between 5 a.m. and 8.30 a.m. (Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day excepted) a uniform fare of 2d. will be charged where the fare is in excess of 1d. This shall apply to all routes with the following exceptions:-

# Welshpool-Victoria Park Route.

(a) Between Welshpool railway crossing and Perth, where the fare of 2d. applies to Barrack Street, Perth, only.

# South Perth-Como Route.

(b) Between Thelma Street, Como, and Perth, where the fare of 2d. applies to Barrack Street, Perth, only.

# Nedlands Route.

(c) Between Hardy Street, Nedlands and Perth, where the fare of 2d. applies to Barrack Street, Perth, only. (d) Between Nedlands Jetty and Barrack Street,

Perth, where single workers' fares are not issued, a return ticket, priced 7d. will be available.

# Swanbourne Route.

(e) Between Loch Street and St. George's Terrace,

Perth, where the fare of 3d. will be charged. (f) Between Bay View Terrace, Claremont, and St. George's Terrace, Perth, where single workers' fares are not issued, a return ticket, priced 7d. will be available.

# Canning Bridge Route.

(g) Between Canning Bridge or the junction of Mt. Henry Road, and Manning Road and the junction of Barrack Street and St. George's Terrace, Perth, where the fare of 3d. will be charged.

# City Beach Route.

(h) Between South end of City Beach and William Street, Perth, where the fare of 3d. will be charged.

# 4.-SCHOOL CHILDREN'S FARES.

Children attending such central primary schools as may be mutually agreed upon by the Commissioner and the Director of Education shall be conveyed to and from their place of residence on a direct route over which the fare prescribed is 6d. or under for a uniform fare of one penny each way upon production of a card in the form provided by the Commissioner bearing the signature of the headmaster of such school.

This concession is applicable on school days only between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. and between 3.30 p.m. and 4.30 p.m.

# 5.—UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' FARES.

Term season tickets available for travel to and from the University of Western Australia between the points specified hereunder shall be issued to students attending the University at the following rates:

(a) Between St. George's Terrace, Perth, and University—25s. per term.

(b) Between Junction of Congdon Street and Stirling Highway, Swanbourne, and University—16s. per ter.
(c) Between Junction of Keightley Road and Thomas

Street, Subiaco, and Junction of Stirling Highway and Hampden Road—9s, per term. (d) The periods of availability of term season tickets

shall be those corresponding to the educational terms decided on from time to time by the University of Western Australia.

(e) The Commissioner may require an applicant for a term season ticket to lodge the sum of 2s. 6d. as a deposit, such deposit to be held by the Commissioner and refunded upon surrender of the ticket within seven days of the date of expiry.

# BY-LAW 32.

Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law 31, a special and uniform fare of not exceeding one shilling may be charged for any distance on any route traversed by certain cars. On every such car a notice shall be exhibited as follows:—''Minimum Fare —d.'' and a passenger by any such car shall be liable for any dis-tance travelled by him to be charged at that fare.

# MARKETING OF ONIONS ACT, 1938-1945.

#### Schedule.

Regulation 23 (published in the Government Gazette, 24th November, 1939) is repealed and the following new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof :-

23. Subject to these regulations-

(a) every member of the Board nominated by the Governor shall hold office for three years from the day fixed by the Governor and specified in the notification of his nomination published in the *Government Gazette* or, if no day is fixed as aforesaid, from the date of publication of such notification in the Govennment Gazette, and

(b) every member of the Board elected by the growers shall hold office for three years from the day following the date of expiry of the term of office of the retiring member to the vacancy in whose office he has been elected or from the day following the date of his election, whichever is the later.

# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 39 of 1945.

Between Western Australian Nurses' Association Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Min-ister for Health, Board of Management of the Children's Hospital, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties :---

#### Award.

#### 1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all nurses (including matrons and assistant matrons and midwifery nurses) and pupil nurses or trainees in the employment of the respondents, and to all included by virtue of the provisions of section 85 of the Act within the area covered by the Award.

#### 2.—Term.

This Award shall be for a period of three (3) years, with the right of any party hereto to apply to the Court for amendment after twelve (12) months.

# 3.—Area.

This Award shall have effect throughout the State of Western Australia.

#### 4.-Definitions

(a) "Nurse": The term "nurse" shall mean and include one who is registered in Western Australia or entitled to be registered in Western Australia under the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1944.

(b) "Matron": A "matron" is a nurse in control of the nursing services and performing other duties at a hospital.

(e) "Assistant Matron": An "assistant matron" is a nurse appointed to assist the matron in control of the nursing services and to perform other duties at a hospital.

(d) "Sister (Class "A"): A "sister (Class "A") is a nurse who is in charge of a ward of a hospital where trainees are employed, or next in charge to the matron of any hospital where no assistant matron has been appointed, or next in charge to an assistant matron where one has been appointed, or a nurse (other than a matron or assistant matron) who is in charge of the theatre of a hospital, or in charge of a ward of a hospital, or in charge of the diabetic clinic, X-ray, radium or other hospital department or in charge of a district, or all registered nurses on duty in the Social Service Department.

This term shall only apply where the daily average number of occupied beds is ten (10) or more, except in the case of a district nurse.

(e) "Sister (Class "B"): "Sister (Class "B") is a nurse who is employed in a hospital or institution and who does not come within the meaning of the definition set forth in subclause (b), (c), (d), (f) and (j).

(f) "Nurse (Class "C"): A "C' class nurse" is one who is employed in the Fremantle, Perth, Children's or Kalgoorlie Hospital during the first twelve (12) months of her nursing experience after having become registered, and who is on duty in a ward or department, including the theatre, under the direction of a sister. This definition shall not apply to the Social Service Department of a hospital.

(g) "Trainee": A "trainee" is a student nurse undergoing training in a registered training school and is an apprentice within the meaning of that term in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941.

(h) "Training School": A registered ''training school" is one which is registered as a training school under the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1944.

(i) "Union": The "Union" shall mean the "Western Australian Nurses' Association Industrial Union of Workers, Perth."

(j) "District Sister": A "district sister" is a nurse performing duties among the sick of a community in their homes, and/or one who is giving advice or attention to persons calling upon her for advice or attention and who is not on the staff of any hospital.

# 5.-Average Occupied Beds.

(i) For the purpose of ascertaining the daily average of occupied beds the average shall be taken for the six (6) months ending 30th June and 31st December in each and every year, and such average shall relate to the salary for the succeeding half-year. In the event of a hospital not having been open for the required period, the salary to be paid shall be such as may be agreed upon by the employer and the union, and if no agreement is aviand at determined by the Beard of agreement is arrived at, determined by the Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

(ii) Babies receiving attention shall be included in calculating the daily average; provided, however, that no new-born baby shall be included in making the calculation for the first seven (7) days in the hospital.

(iii) Out-patients shall be included in calculating the average, three hundred and fifty (350) out-patients in each six (6) months' period counting as one (1) occupied bed.

#### 6.—Classification of Hospitals.

For the purposes of this Award, hospitals are classified as follow:-

Class "A"; Hospitals which are registered training schools.

Class "B": Hospitals which are not registered training schools but at which the beds occupied average more than twenty (20). Class "C": All other hospitals.

#### 7.-Hours.

The ordinary working hours for sisters, nurses and trainees covered by this Award shall be:-

(a) At hospitals within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and at Kalgoorlie, forty-four (44) hours per week, exclusive of meal times; provided that for trainees at Kalgoorlie, Perth, times; provided that for trainees at margorine, form, and Fremantle the hours worked shall be in straight shifts of eight (8) hours each; provided further, that for trainees at the Children's Hospital straight shifts shall be worked as soon as practicable. Liberty is reserved to the Union to apply to the Court at any time to amend this proviso.

(b) At hospitals, except Wooroloo and Kalgoorlie, outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, eight-eight (88) hours per fortnight, exclusive of meal times.

(c) At Wooroloo Hospital, one hundred and seventysix (176) hours per four (4) weeks, exclusive of meal times; provided that the hours for trainees at this institution shall be worked in straight shifts of eight (8) hours each.

(d) Trainees at registered part-time training schools under the Nurses' Registration Act shall work in shifts of eight (8) hours; provided such shifts of eight (8) hours shall not exceed a spread of twelve (12) hours.

(e) At hospitals which come under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this clause, those on day duty shall be allowed one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  days' continuous time off duty per week, and those on night duty shall be allowed one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  days' continuous time off duty per week or three (3) days' continuous time off duty per fortnight.

Similar provisions shall apply in hospitals which come under the provisions of subclause (b) hereof, where reasonably practicable, and where it is not practicable and the days off duty as specified are missed and not taken within four (4) weeks, equivalent time shall be added to the annual leave of the employee, or, in the case of a casual employee, it shall be paid for when the employment terminates. The provisions of this clause shall not apply in the case of trainees working straight shifts of eight (8) hours.

(f) At Wooroloo Hospital, six (6) days' continuous time off duty in every four (4) weeks shall be allowed, which provision shall also apply to trainees.

(g) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall not apply to a matron or assistant matron.

(h) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this section, the ordinary working hours of the sisters in charge of the diabetic clinic at the Perth Hospital, and the sister on duty in the Medical Superintendent's Office at Perth Hospital, sisters on duty in X-ray and radium clinics and social service sisters, shall not exceed thirty-eight (38) hours per week, to be worked between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on week days with a break of an hour for lunch, which time shall not be included in the said thirty-eight (38) hours, and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

(i) In addition to the time off duty hereinbefore provided, nurses and sisters engaged in X-ray work or radium work, shall be allowed such other time off duty as in the opinion of the medical officer in charge of such work may be necessarily consequent upon such work for the purpose of maintaining or restoring them to normal health, and all such time shall be computed as part of the ordinary working time, and there shall be no reduction in salary in respect thereof.

(j) Morning and afternoon tea shall be provided by the employer to be taken as convenient without deduc-tion of time involved.

(k) Where an employee is required to travel as part of her duty, such travelling time shall be considered as part of her working time, and there shall be no reduction in respect thereof.

(1) Where any employee is required to perform duty in connection with not more than two (2) infectious cases, the limitation of hours as specified herein shall not apply, and such employee shall be paid under this and the next following clause for twelve (12) hours' duty in each day, i.e., eight (8) hours at ordinary rates and four (4) hours at overtime rates.

This shall not apply to hospitals within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, or the Wooroloo or Kalgoorlie Hospitals.

(m) Night duty in North-West hospitals and Goldfields hospitals (except training schools) where the staff including the matron is three (3) or more shall not exceed seven (7) consecutive nights when a majority of the employees who are required to do night duty so decide, in which case night duty shall rotate after seven (7) nights.

(n) The provisions of this clause (except subclauses (j), (k) and (1)) shall not apply to hospitals where the daily average of occupied beds does not exceed six (6), in which case there shall be no fixed hours of duty.

#### 8.—Overtime.

(i) All time worked in excess of the ordinary working time shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, or, if the employer and employee so agree, time off in lieu thereof shall be granted at the convenience of the hospital; provided, however, that such time off shall be in unbroken periods according to each period of overtime worked; and also provided that the overtime is made up within twenty-eight (28) days from the time when it becomes due, except where it applies to the change-over from night duty to day duty or day duty to night duty.

(ii) Less than thirty (30) minutes' overtime for a week or a fortnight, as the case may be, shall not be paid for.

(iii) For the purpose of calculating the overtime rate, board and lodging assessed in accordance with clause 24 shall be added to the prescribed cash wage.

#### 9.—Holidays.

(a) Every employee covered by this Award where not otherwise provided for, shall be entitled to four (4) weeks' leave on full pay for each twelve (12) months' service.

(b) An employee with more than one (1) month's service, and, in the case of a trainee three (3) months' service, who may resign or be dismissed, except the dismissal is due to misconduct, shall be entitled to pay for holidays pro rata up to the time of her leaving the service in such proportion as her period of employment bears to the number of days in the year.

(c) In addition to her salary, the employee on leave shall, where board and lodging allowance as prescribed by clause 24 is not included in the salary, be entitled to receive such allowance for the period of her leave.

(d) Every employee shall receive at least seven (7) days' previous notice of the commencement of her leave. For the purpose of ascertaining the approximate time of the annual leave a roster shall be kept in all hospitals of Class "A" and Class "B" giving the necessary information. This roster shall be placed on a notice board in some convenient place for inspection by employees.

(e) (i) Leave shall be paid for in advance at the rate of salary the employee is receiving at the time of taking such leave; provided that any leave accrued for the final year of training shall be paid for at the rate payable for such year of service.

(ii) Leave shall be given as soon as practicable after falling due. The leave of a trainee shall not accumulate, but shall be given each year. The leave of a nurse shall not accumulate except with the consent of the nurse, and in no case shall it accumulate for more than two years.

(f) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary hereinbefore contained, the nurse whose hours are fixed at thirty-eight (38) per week under clause 7 (h) shall be entitled to all Public Service holidays, and if any such holiday is not taken a day off shall be given in lieu thereof, and in addition thereto one (1) fortnight's leave per annum; provided that in the cases of sisters in charge of X-ray and radium clinics their holidays shall be four (4) weeks per annum in addition to the said Public Service holidays.

# 10.—Long Service Leave.

(i) An employee who has completed ten (10) years' continuous service, reckoned from the first day of November, 1935, in one hospital or under one employer shall be entitled to long service leave for three (3) months on full pay, including board and lodging allowance as above, or six (6) months on half pay, plus half the said allowance. Time spent in long service leave or in absence for more than two (2) weeks without pay shall not be considered as part of such qualifying service.

(ii) Any employee who resigns or is retired or dismissed (except for misconduct) and has long service leave due to her, shall receive three (3) months' full pay, plus board and lodging allowance as aforesaid.

(iii) After the completion of the next term of ten (10) years' service, the employee shall be entitled to another long service leave of three (3) months and, similarly, after the next term of seven (7) years, on the same conditions as apply to the first term of long service leave. (iv) This clause shall not apply when there is in existence a special agreement for long service leave.

If an employee has been employed continuously by several employers, whether the Minister for Public Health, or a Hospital Board or Boards established under the Hospitals Act, 1927, or as a District Sister under clause 31 of this Award, her service shall be counted as continuous for the purpose of qualifying for long service leave; provided she has been employed for a minimum period of two (2) years by each employer, unless the employee submits a reason which in the opinion of such employer is a good and sufficient reason for entering into employment with another employer before the expiration of two (2) years' service.

The employee must furnish written proof of such continuous service.

The employer at the time of the application for long service leave shall be the person responsible to the employee for long service leave and payment therefor.

# 11.—Sick Leave.

(a) Sick leave with pay will be granted on the following scale on production of an adequate medical certificate or, in regard to leave not exceeding two (2) days, other evidence of ill-health satisfactory to the employer:—

(i) Under three (3) years' service—one and a quarter (1¼) days for each calendar month of continuous service with hospitals 'under this Award: Provided that payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the employee leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the employee being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(ii) Over three (3) years' service—two (2) months on full pay. The employee must furnish proof of continuous service.

(iii) Provided that all sick leave granted to trainees shall be on the following scale:---

- Under three (3) years' service—two (2) months on full pay;
- (2) over three (3) years' service—the total amount of sick leave not to exceed two (2) months on full pay, and one and a quarter (1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>) days for each completed month of service after the first three (3) years.

(b) Sick leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall not in any one (1) triennial period exceed the time provided for in the foregoing scale.

(c) A "triennial period" shall be three (3) years preceding the date of the commencement of absence through illness in respect of which leave is claimed.

(d) If siekness is due to the wilful neglect or default of the applicant, the proof whereof lies upon the employer, it shall, if granted, be without pay.

#### 12.—Dismissals.

(a) No employee shall be dismissed (except for misconduct) unless she has received fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her dismissal or pay for such period in lieu thereof.

(b) No employee shall, without the consent of her employer, resign without first having given fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her intention so to do; and in the absence of such notice the employer may withhold holiday or other pay up to the amount of fourteen (14) days' wages; provided that this shall not apply in the case of a nurse who has received a summons for duty with any of the armed forces of Australia.

(c) An employee dismissed for misconduct shall have the right of appeal against such dismissal to an Industrial Magistrate or Police or Resident Magistrate, or such other person as may be agreed upon by her with her employer, and such employee shall be entitled to a written statement as to reason for her dismissal from her employer within fourteen (14) days of the said employer's having received a written request for such statement.

(d) This clause shall not apply to casual employees.

#### 13.—Transfer.

(a) An employee who is transferred from one place to another shall be entitled to first-class travelling accommodation between the places of transfer and to full payment of salary during the time of leaving duty and taking up her new duties.

(b) (i) In addition she shall be allowed travelling allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for any meal purchased, or the actual cost of any meal purchased if such cost exceeds two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.). Meal times shall be 8 a.m., 1 p.m., and 6 p.m. Sixpence (6d.) for each morning and afternoon tea shall be allowed when travelling, at 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. Reasonable porterage shall also be allowed. Claims for taxi fares must be supported by receipts for the fares claimed.

(ii) No such meal allowance as mentioned shall be made for journeys completed between the ordinary meal times. Where practicable, at least fourteen (14) days' previous written notice shall be given to an employee required to transfer from one hospital or place to another.

#### 14.-Engagement.

(a) When a nurse or a trainee is engaged for service in a hospital or place outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles of the General Post Office, Perth, she shall be entitled to first-class fare and travelling allowance as above from the place of engagement to the place of employment, and her term of employment shall be deemed to commence as soon as she leaves her place of engagement.

(b) If an employee is dismissed before the period for which she was engaged has expired, or if none is stipulated, then before the period of six (6) months from the date of her appointment, except in case of dismissal for misconduct, she shall be entitled to first-class accommodation and travelling allowance as above to her place of engagement should she desire to return there.

Provided that if she was originally engaged in Perth and has been employed continuously at more than one public hospital without returning to Perth, then she shall be entitled to first-class accommodation and travelling allowance to Perth, should she desire to return there.

And also provided that should an employee elect to return to her place of engagement or to Perth by any other conveyance than by train, she shall be entitled, upon production of receipts to actual transport expenses incurred; but such transport expenses shall not exceed the amount of a first-class rail, boat and/or coach fare from the place of her last employment to the place of her engagement or to Perth, as the case may be.

(c) Any employee whose duties require her to travel shall be entitled to first-class travelling accommodation at the expense of her employer.

(d) If an employee who is engaged for duty in a hospital or place outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles of the General Post Office, Perth, remains for six (6) months or more in the service of the employer who engages her, she shall be entitled to return fare and travelling allowance as mentioned in subclause (a) when she leaves her employment.

(e) Upon the termination of her employment, an employee shall receive payment before she leaves the hospital of all money due to her up to the termination of her employment.

(f) Except in the case of dismissal for misconduct, a casual employee shall receive return fare and travelling allowance irrespective of her period of engagement.

# 15.—Trainees.

(a) Every trainee shall be given the opportunity of securing by experience a knowledge of all hospital duties essential to her calling performed in the hospital or hospitals where she is in training.

(b) A trainee shall not be required to undertake ward duty, except under the immediate supervision of a nurse during the first six (6) weeks' service.

(c) Where trainees are given preliminary training before taking up ward duty, the time spent in such preliminary training shall be counted as part of the period of training.

(d) The period of training shall be such as is prescribed in the regulations issued by the Nurses' Registration Board.

(e) Any employer taking a trainee on probation shall within fourteen (14) days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in writing.

(f) Within one (1) month from the end of the period of probation an agreement in writing as required by the Act shall be executed and signed by the employer, the trainee, and, where the trainee is under twenty-one (21) years of age, the parent or legal guardian of the probationer. There shall be three (3) executed copies of such agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one by the trainee or her parent or guardian, and one shall be lodged with the Registrar.

(g) Trainces shall be employed for a period of six (6) months on probation; such period shall count as part of the term of service.

(h) A trainee may be transferred from one employer to another, but notification thereof must be sent to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days from the date thereof.

(i) The agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent of the parties, but notification of such cancellation must be forwarded to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days from the date thereof.

(j) The employer, with the consent of the Court, may discharge a trainee from service and cancel the agreement for misconduct or wilful disobedience or any other cause which the Court may deem sufficient; provided, however, the employer shall be entitled to impose any other disciplinary measures as are provided in the indentures.

(k) Lecture Times: Any lectures or examinations which occur normally during duty hours shall be computed as part of the working time of the trainees whose duty it is to attend such lectures or examinations, and there shall be no reduction in salary in respect thereto.

(1) Trainees who do not pass their final examinations may be retained until such examinations are passed, and during such period they shall be paid at the rate provided for trainees in their final year. But such extended period shall in no case exceed twelve (12) months.

(m) Trainees at the Kalgoorlie Hospital shall not be required to be on night duty for more than six (6) continuous weeks in any one period.

(n) The employer shall report to the Court in writing the result of all examinations immediately the result is available, showing—

(i) the names of the candidates sitting;

(ii) the training school attended;

(iii) the result of the examinations.

This report shall be available for inspection by the Union Secretary or her authorised nominee.

(o) The proportion of trainees in a training hospital approved by the Nurses' Registration Board shall be not more than eight (8) trainees to each certificated nurse.

# 16.-Laundry and Uniforms.

(a) Each employee shall be entitled to all reasonable laundry work at the expense of the employer, but where the uniform of any employee cannot be laundered at the hospital an allowance of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per week shall be paid to that employee. (b) The employer shall provide all uniforms which shall at all times remain the property of the employer; provided that—

(i) trainees shall pay an amount of three guineas  $(\pounds 3 \ 3s.)$  towards the cost of initial uniforms on commencement of their training, but on completion of the first twelve (12) months of training the amount of three guineas  $(\pounds 3 \ 3s.)$  shall be refunded to the trainee;

 (ii) in lieu of providing uniforms to nurses, the employer may make the following allowance:— Matrons—2s. 4d. per week.

Nurses (excluding Matrons)-2s. per week.

#### 17.—Rosters.

A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in such place as it may conveniently and readily be seen by each employee concerned. The roster shall be posted not less than forty-eight (48) hours preceding the day on which the roster commences. The roster shall be available to the Union Secretary for inspection at all reasonable times. Rosters may be altered at any time if the hospital exigencies render any alteration necessary.

# 18.—Time and Wages Book.

(a) A time book shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times by the Union Secretary, or her nominee, appointed in writing under the seal of the Union. Each employee must record in such book the exact time on which she starts and finishes duty on each day and also time booked off for meals.

(b) The salary sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection at the office of the employer concerned by the Union Secretary or her nomince appointed as aforesaid.

(c) Any system of automatic recording by means of a machine shall be deemed a compliance with the provisions of subclause (a) so far as the particulars actually recorded are concerned.

# 19.—Interviews.

The Union Secretary shall be entitled to interview members of the Union on the employer's premises at reasonable times.

#### 20.—Notices.

If the Union so requests, a copy of this Award shall be posted on a board of reasonable size in a place where it may be conveniently and readily seen by every employee concerned. The Union Secretary may also post thereon such other notices relating to Union matters as are reasonable.

#### 21.—Preference.

All other qualifications being equal, preference in matters of employment and promotion subject to the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945, shall be given to unionists. This provision shall not apply to the engagement of trainees.

# 22.—Present Salaries and Privileges.

Subject to method of regulating salaries on the average of occupied beds, nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the salary of any employee who at the date of this Award is being paid a higher rate of salary than the minimum prescribed for her class of work.

An employee shall not be deprived of any privileges relating to her employment, enjoyed by her at the date hereof, except such as are dealt with in the Award, in which case the Award provisions shall apply.

#### 23.—Relieving.

A nurse who performs the duties of an employee on a higher classification of salary than herself for a period of more than seven (7) days continuously shall receive as from the beginning of such period the minimum salary of the higher classification while performing such duties.

The above provisions shall not apply when higher duties are performed as the result of absence of an employee on annual leave, sick leave, or holidays, unless such absence exceeds twenty-eight (28) days.

# 24 .- Living Allowances.

# (a)-Board and Lodging.

(i) Subject to subclause (b) of this clause, in addition to the salaries (cash) provided hereunder, all employees shall receive suitable board and lodging assessed at the following rates:---

(ii) In all cases the ratio of the value of board to that of lodging in the board and lodging allowance shall be two to one.

#### (b)-Living Out Allowance.

(i) In addition to the salaries (cash) provided herein, all employees required to live out shall receive a weekly allowance equivalent to fifty-two per cent (52%) of the basic wage for females; provided, however, that in the case of matrons the allowance shall be equivalent to sixty-four per cent. (64%) of the basic wage for females.

(ii) Where employees who are paid on a living out basis are provided with meals by the employer, deduction shall be made from their wages at the rate of one-twenty-first (1/21st) of the allowance for board in accordance with subclause (a) (ii) hereof for each meal provided.

(c) The Union Secretary or her nominee duly appointed in writing under the Seal of the Union shall be entitled to inspect such food and accommodation at reasonable times.

#### 25.—Special Allowances.

# 27.—King Edward Memorial Hospital.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, the salary of the matron of the King Edward Memorial Hospital shall be the same as the matron in charge of a hospital with two hundred (200) beds and less than three hundred (300).

#### 28.—Postponement of Hours.

The clause relating to the hours shall not come into effect until three (3) months after the date of the delivery of this Award, so as to permit the employer to complete the necessary arrangements for the accommodation of the additional staff required. In the meantime, the provisions of clause 7 of Award, No. 5 of 1935, as amended, shall apply. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 7 (Hours), the provision shall be deemed to be complied with if eighty-eight (88) hours are worked in weeks of forty (40) and fortyeight (48) hours consecutively; this provision shall cease on 22nd January, 1947, unless the respondents show cause why it should be continued.

# 29.—Emergencies.

In the event of any emergency arising, the Commissioner of Public Health may, with the consent of the Court, or, if the Court is not sitting, with the consent of the President, take such measures as may in his opinion be necessary for the safety and protection or welfare of patients, notwithstanding anything contained in this Award.

#### 30.—Casuals.

A nurse employed for a period of less than two (2) weeks shall be deemed a casual employee and be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the rates specified in this Award.

If a casual employee is still required at the end of two (2) weeks, she may be re-employed as a casual with payment as aforesaid for another two (2) weeks.

# 31.-District Sister.

Outside a radius of twenty (20) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, a district sister shall be classified for the purpose of salary as a third-year matron of a hospital with a daily average of less than five (5) occupied beds, and shall come under the provisions of the Award relating to matrons of such hospitals; provided that a district sister who is not provided with board and lodging by her employer shall be notified by the employer before she takes up her appointment where she may be suitably and reasonably accommodated, and any charge per week for accommodation in excess of the living-out allowance prescribed by this Award shall be paid for by the employer.

# 32-Other Provisions.

(a) Not less than thirty (30) minutes shall be allowed for each meal; provided that where a nurse is called on duty during a meal time the period worked shall be counted in the ordinary working hours of duty.

(b) Trainees sitting for the examinations held by the Nurses' Registration Board or Midwives' Registration Board shall be taken off night duty at least four (4) weeks, as far as practicable, before the examinations are held.

(c) For Nurses' Registration Board examinations, as far as practicable, three (3) consecutive days off—i.e., one and one-half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  days to be days off for week, and one and one-half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  days of examinations.

For Midwives' Registration Board examinations, as far as practicable, two and a half  $(2\frac{1}{2})$  consecutive days off—i.e., one and one-half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  days to be days off for week, and one (1) day for examinations.

week, and one (1) day for examinations. (d) Where employees leave the hospital for accumulated days off, in excess of four (4) days, they shall be allowed pro rata board allowance, as prescribed by clause 24.

#### 33.-Board of Reference.

(1) The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them; (ii) classifying and fixing salaries, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;

(iii) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 34 .--- Salary Schedule.

(a) Salaries shall be paid at least twice per calendar month, or fortnightly, at the option of the employer; provided that by agreement between the employer and the Union, the salary may in any particular case be paid once per calendar month.

(c) For the purpose of this clause a second-year matron is a nurse who has completed a year's service as a matron of any public hospital or hospitals.

(d) A third-year matron is a nurse who has completed two (2) years' service as a matron of any public hospital or hospitals.

(e) Provided that a nurse who has been classified as a Sister (Class "A") shall, upon taking up an appointment as a matron of a hospital with a daily average of less than five (5) occupied beds, carry with her her years of experience as such "A" Class Sister.

(f) The experience of an employee who has been employed elsewhere than in a public hospital shall be taken into consideration, and she shall be paid according to her experience as agreed to between her employer and the Union. In the event of a dispute between the employer and the Union in relation to the foregoing, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(g) For the purpose of this clause, "experience" shall mean experience as a Sister (Class "A"), or as a matron of a hospital, or as a nurse of an Infant Health Centre.
