PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-1913, that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality; and whereas by a proclamation dated 30th July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus giganteus*; and whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from 1st October, 1946, to 31st December, 1946, inclusive.

All that area included within a radius of 10 miles of Young's Siding on the Elleker-Denmark railway.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking by any means of capture whatsoever the fish known as or called "Crayfish," in that portion of Western Australian waters lying south of 28 deg. 15 min. of South latitude, and West of 114 deg. 10 min. of East longitude, including the waters surrounding the island situated therein, from 1st October, 1946, to 15th February, 1947.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds or insects the names of which the Governor may by proclamation add to the said Schedule and that any proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the said Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the proclamation; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosicapilla" commonly known as "Galah" shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act, within the boundaries of the Wongan-Ballidu Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the

said Act, do by this proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, the name of the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosicapilla," commonly known as "Galah," and declare that this proclamation shall apply and have effect only in that portion of the State which is comprised within the boundaries of the Wongan-Ballidu Vermin District as constituted under the said Act.

THE STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION ACT, 1945.

Schedule.

1. These by-laws shall be read and construed with the by-laws made under the provisions of the Government Electric Works Act, 1914, as amended and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th December, 1926; 20th May, 1927; 17th June, 1927; 27th November, 1931; 29th September, 1933; 2nd October, 1936; 31st December, 1937, and 8th July, 1938, and the by-laws made under the State Electricity Commission Act, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th August, 1946.

2. By-law No. 13 made under the Government Electric Works Act, 1914, as amended and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th December, 1926, is repealed and the following by-law is made in lieu thereof:—

13.—Temporary Disconnection.

(1) A consumer may have his service disconnected temporarily by the Commission provided he makes application to the Commission at least three clear days before the date such disconnection is required by him as specified in his application.

(2) The service shall not be reconnected until payment has been made to the Commission of the prescribed minimum charge for the period during which the service has been disconnected.

3. By-law No. 26 made under the Government Electric Works Act, 1914, as amended and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th December, 1926, is repealed and the following by-law is made in lieu thereof:—

26.—Interference with Electric Works.

(1) No person shall, either directly or indirectly, interfere with—

(a) Any wire, conductor, insulator, crossarm or other service apparatus or building or structure connected with or forming part of the electric works of the Commission;

(b) any wire which has fallen or is hanging from any portion of the Commission's electric works.

(2) No person shall—

(a) Climb any post, pole, standard, or structure carrying any electric conductor;

(b) fix or attach anything, either permanently or temporarily, to any post, pole, standard or structure connected with or forming part of the electric works of the Commission, without the consent in writing of the Commission.

Removal of Trees and Vegetation.

4. (1) Where any tree or vegetation growing on any land adjacent to any overhead wires or apparatus of the Commission is in proximity to and likely, in the opinion of the Commission, to interfere with any electric wire or service apparatus of the Commission, the owner or occupier of such land shall, within seven days after service of notice in writing by the Commission requiring him to do so, remove such tree or vegetation or portion thereof specified in such notice, as the Commission by such notice may direct.

(2) If such owner or occupier fails to remove any tree or vegetation when required to do so in accordance with the preceding paragraph of this by-law, the Commission may by its employees remove any such tree

or vegetation or portion thereof and for that purpose may enter at all reasonable times upon the land of such owner or occupier.

Entry on Premises already Supplied with Electricity.

5. If any person enters into possession of premises fitted with any electric fitting connected to the electric works of the Commission without having previously made application to the Commission in the form approved by the Commission to be registered as a consumer and without having received the approval of the Commission, to such application, the Commission may recover from such person the full amount chargeable for all electricity consumed since the last reading of the meter or meters, notwithstanding that such last reading took place prior to his entry into possession of the premises.

Temporary Service Without a Meter.

6. (1) When an applicant for a service connection to his premises requires such connection immediately and the Commission is for any reason unable to instal a meter when connecting the premises the Commission may for the purpose of assessing the charges payable for electricity consumed by the applicant, before connecting the premises and from time to time after connecting the premises require the applicant to furnish in the form of a statutory declaration such information in regard to electric fittings installed on the premises and the use made of such electric fittings and any further information as the Commission may require to enable it to assess the charges as aforesaid.

(2) In the event of the applicant failing to supply the information required in accordance with the preceding paragraph of this by-law the Commission may refuse to connect the service or may at any time disconnect the service.

(3) The charge for electricity supplied to the consumer under this by-law shall be based upon the estimated consumption of electricity by the consumer at the rates prescribed which shall be recoverable accordingly.

1. Regulation 14 is amended by deleting the words "by placing a cross opposite the name or names of the candidate or candidates for whom he may vote" in lines 10, 11 and 12 thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words "in accordance with regulation 16A of these regulations."

2. Regulation 16 is amended by deleting the words "Each employer when voting shall place a cross against the name or names of the person or persons for whom he votes" and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "in accordance with regulation 16A of these regulations."

3. By inserting after regulation 16 a new regulation 16A as follows:—

16A. (1) Voting shall be by means of a preferential ballot.

(2) When only one candidate is to be elected and there are not more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.

(3) When only one candidate is to be elected and there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(4) When two candidates are to be elected, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and the numeral 2 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his second preference and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 3, 4 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

4. Regulation 18 is amended—

(a) by inserting after the word "election" in line 2 thereof the word "and"

(b) by inserting after the word "votes" in line 2 thereof the words "in the manner prescribed by these regulations."

5. After regulation 18 new regulations are inserted as follows:—

18A. Except as otherwise provided in these regulations the method of conducting the election and the count of the votes shall be the same as that prescribed under the Electoral Act, 1907-1936, for the conduct of an election and the counting of votes taken at an election of members of the Legislative Assembly. Provided that—

(a) when two candidates are to be elected the count of the votes shall proceed until one candidate has received an absolute majority, when he shall be declared elected. The first elected candidate shall then be eliminated from the count, and to proceed with the election of the second candidate all the ballot papers, including those which have been set aside as exhausted, shall be brought into operation and again sorted into first preference votes. The first preference votes of the eliminated successful candidate shall be distributed according to the second preference markings shown thereon to the remainder of the candidates, and when added to their respective first preference votes

shall constitute the first count for the second candidate. The procedure from then on shall be the same as in the counting of votes for the election of one candidate.

(b) Votes shall not be deemed to be informal except in the case hereinafter mentioned.

1SB. (1) A ballot paper shall be informal—

(a) if it is not initialled by the Returning Officer,

(b) if, subject as hereinafter provided, it is marked in any other manner than that prescribed in regulation 14 or 16, as the case may be, of these regulations; or

(c) if it has upon it any mark or writing which, in the opinion of the Returning Officer, will enable any person to identify the voter; or

(d) if it does not indicate the elector's vote or if, when there are more than two candidates, it is not marked as prescribed by these regulations so as to indicate by numerical sequence the elector's preference as regards all candidates; provided that if numerals in arithmetical sequence are placed opposite the names of all the candidates but one, the next following numeral shall be deemed to be placed opposite the name of the remaining candidate.

(2) A ballot paper shall not be informal for any reason other than the reasons mentioned in paragraph (1) of this regulation, but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear and in particular when only one candidate is to be elected and there are only two candidates a ballot paper shall not be informal by reason only of the elector having indicated his vote or first preference by a cross instead of the numeral 1.

NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924-1939.

Destruction and Prevention of Noxious Weeds—
By-law No. 3.

THE Wandering Road Board, acting pursuant to section 26 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, doth hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

Wandering Road Board.

Destruction of Noxious Weeds.

(1) Every owner and every occupier of land within the district of the Wandering Road Board upon which any noxious weeds are growing or present shall take one or more of the following alternative acts to destroy such noxious weeds, and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all such noxious weeds have been destroyed:—(a) Pull all such noxious weeds from the ground by hand or (b) sever all such noxious weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand; or (c) cultivate the ground by means of an implement which will sever such noxious weeds below the ground level, or (d) plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the board, or (e) break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, mowing machine, or reaping and binding machine, or (f) in cases where the plants are dry and there is suitable herbage cover, burn such noxious weeds by means of a running fire, or (g) spray with chemicals approved by the board, or (h) carry any other method ordered by the board.

(2) The local inspector appointed by the board under the said Act may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any land within the said district require him to take any particular measures or to do any particular acts mentioned in the last preceding paragraph to destroy and dispose of noxious weeds growing or being on the land owned or occupied by him, and he shall forthwith take or do the same without having the alternatives mentioned in such paragraph.

(3) Any person who commits any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
