Greeting:

KNOW Ye that I the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby appoint you William John Wallwork to be a Royal Commissioner to inquire into and report upon each and all of the following matters and things, that is to say—

1. Present housing costs, including the items constituting such costs.
2. A comparison between present housing costs, including the items constituting such costs and those ruling in 1938.
3. The reasons for general and specific increases or decreases as the case may be.
4. The relationship of wages, cost of materials and profits for the current year and the year 1938 in relation to the activities of—(a) Builders, (b) Merchants supplying building materials.
5. The causes and effect of shortages of materials and skilled labour on costs.
6. The effect of control systems and the policies of controlling authorities on costs.
7. A comparison between present man-output and that maintained in 1938 and the effect of present man-output on costs.
8. Matters which will bring about a reduction of costs.

And I declare that you shall by virtue of this Commission be a Royal Commissioner within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928 and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under that Act.

And I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets, in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, from January 1, 1947, until December 31, 1947, inclusive.

Schedule.

1. The waters of the Swan River and of its tributaries extending in a Northerly, Easterly, and North-Easterly direction from a line drawn from the North-

Eastern extremity of the Mill Point wharf (situated on the Western side of Belches or Mill Point) to the North-Western extremity of the Harbour and Lights jetty (situated on the Western side of the river between the Swan Brewery and Eliza Point) upwards to the railway bridge at Guildford (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

2. The waters of the Swan River and of its tributaries from the Upper Swan bridge (near Midland) upwards to its source (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

3. The waters of the Swan River and of its tributaries from a line drawn from the South-Western extremity of Point Resolution to the South-Western extremity of the Point Walter jetty (situated at Point Walter) downwards to a line drawn from the Western extremity of the South Mole to the Western extremity of the North Mole at Fremantle.

4. The whole of the waters of the Canning River and of its tributaries from the bridge on the Canning Highway upwards to its source.

5. All that portion of the ocean waters at Fremantle lying between the Fish Market breakwater and the Fish Market jetty, bounded on the West by a line drawn from the Southern extremity of the Fish Market breakwater to the Southern extremity of the Fish Market jetty.

6. All that area of Western Australian waters bounded by a line drawn one hundred and fifty chains due West from the Southerly extremity of the Fish Market breakwater at Fremantle; thence fifty chains due North; thence in an Easterly direction to Rous Head.

7. All that area of Western Australian waters from the Southerly extremity of Mudurup Rocks (South of Cottesloe jetty) and extending in a Northerly direction to the South-Western extremity of North Street, Cottesloe, with a width of a quarter of a mile from the fore-shore.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938, that the Governor may at any time, on the application of the Western Australian Onion Marketing Board, provide and declare by Proclamation that the property in all onions belonging to growers shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on or from some other date specified therein be divested from the growers thereof and become vested in and be the absolute property of the said Board as the owner thereof and that any onions belong-

ing to the growers thereafter coming into existence within a time specified in the Proclamation shall become vested in and be the absolute property of the said Board and may by such Proclamation make such further provision as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of such onions and to deal with the same as may be deemed necessary or convenient in order to give full effect to the objects and purposes for which the Board has been constituted; and whereas the said Board has made application for the issue of a Proclamation accordingly and it is deemed desirable and expedient that such a Proclamation shall be issued: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and pursuant to the application of the Western Australian Onion Marketing Board, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the said Act, do hereby provide and declare, for the purposes of the said Act, that forthwith upon the date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, the property in all onions then belonging to growers within the meaning of the said Act shall, subject to all lawful exceptions and to any exemptions which may be lawfully granted by the said Board, be divested from the said growers thereof, and shall become vested in and be the absolute property of the said the Western Australian Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and also that subject to the exceptions and exemptions aforesaid any onions belonging to the said growers after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and coming into existence within the period commencing on the said date and ending on the 30th day of November, 1947, shall, as from the time when they come into existence as aforesaid become vested in and be the absolute property of the said Board and that as from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and whilst it continues in operation, the Board may, but subject to the regulations at any time or from time to time in force do such lawful acts and things and take such lawful means as the owner thereof to obtain effectively possession of the onions which by virtue of this Proclamation are the absolute property of the said Board and to deal with the same as the Board may deem necessary or convenient in order to give full effect to the objects and purposes for which the said Board has been constituted.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 2A of the Mine Workers' Relief (War Service) Act, 1940-1945, it is enacted that for the purposes of section 4 of that Act the Governor may during a time of war by Proclamation declare that any service or employment or activity of a non-combatant nature in which persons are engaged and which in the opinion of the Governor is connected with or incidental to or arises out of the prosecution of the War then being waged and any internment in an internment camp shall be service incidental to war service; and whereas a time of war still exists within the meaning of the terms set out in the Mine Workers' Relief (War Service) Act, 1940-1945, and it is desirable to give effect to the said section 2A: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation declare that the classes of non-combatant service employment or activity mentioned in the Schedule hereunder shall be service incidental to war service.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1945, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 22588 (Babakin Lot 39 and Avon Location 27101) should vest in and be held by the Bruce Rock Road Board in trust for Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Bruce Rock Road Board in trust for Recreation with power to the said Bruce Rock Road Board, subject to the approval of the Governor in Executive Council to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.
