WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section 269 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, that no pharmaceutical chemist or other person shall sell, except on the prescription of a medical practitioner, any derivative of the sulphanilamide group of drugs or any other drug proclaimed by the Governor as coming within the terms of that section, and that in the case of any such drug, every chemist or other person shall keep a record showing the quantities received from time to time and the complete details of the sales of any such drug, and such records shall be available at any time for inspection by any inspector appointed under the said Act or under the Pharmacy Act: Provided that persons engaged in wholesale dealing may sell such drugs to medical practitioners and to pharmaceutical chemists, but in all such cases the terms of the preceding paragraph shall apply; and whereas penicillin and the products and salts of penicillin are drugs within the meaning of that term as defined in section 3 of the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to proclaim penicillin and the products and salts of penicillin to be drugs coming within the terms of section 269 of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby

declare and proclaim that penicillin and the products and salts of penicillin shall be drugs coming within the terms and section 269 of the said Act.

No person shall remove from the wharf at the port of arrival any portion of such consignment unless and until such consignment has been examined and passed as wholesome and fit for human consumption, provided that the examining inspector may permit all or any portion of such consignment to be removed into cold storage from which place it shall not be removed without his consent until after examination and approval.
- 3. The fee to be paid for the inspection or examination shall be at the rate of one penny for every 14 lb. of frozen, smoked, salted, cured or otherwise preserved fish or portions of fish, and such fee shall be payable by the consignee or other person having the custody of such consignment on demand by the Commissioner or an Inspector.
- 4. Whenever on examination any consignment or portion thereof is found to be unfit for human consumption, such consignment shall be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Commissioner may direct and a certificate of condemnation under the hand of the Inspector shall be given when required.

(a) The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her sub-scription at the rates set out in the succeeding paragraph, and, in the case of a married man, paying a subscription as set out in paragraph 3 (a), the term "subscriber" shall include the husband, wife, and all dependants under the age of 16 years.
- (b) The subscriber shall be financial for four clear weeks before he shall be eligible to receive any benefits either for himself or his dependants.

 (c) A subscriber shall be financial for at least 12
- months before being eligible to receive the concession rate for maternity cases.
- 3. The subscription to be paid by a subscriber shall be-
- (a) Three shillings and sixpence per month, or £2 per year, for a husband, wife, and all dependants under the age of 16 years.
- (b) Three shillings and sixpence per month for all adult single persons.
- (c) Two shillings and sixpence per month or 30s. per year, for all juniors between the ages of 16 and 21.
- While a subscriber, or any dependant of such subscriber, is an inmate of any hospital in Western Australia, such subscriber shall be entitled to the following benefits:-
 - (a) Payment at the rate of-
 - (i) Six shillings per day for a maximum period of sixty-one days in each year in respect of the subscriber and any dependant of such subscriber 13 years of age or over, other than maternity cases.
 - (ii) Four shillings per day for a maximum period of sixty-one days in each year for any dependant under the age of 13 years, excepting babies born in hospital.
- (iii) Three shillings per day for maternity cases. (b) Out-patient treatment including out-patient X-ray treatment at any hospital in Western Australia.
- 5. Subscribers shall not receive any benefits or concession in any of the following cases:-
 - (i) Venereal Disease.
 - (ii) Disease caused by alcoholic excess or misconduct.
 - (iii) Workers' Compensation cases.
 - (iv) Infectious cases requiring removal to an infectious ward.
 - (v) Treatment for any disease from which the subscriber or his dependants are suffering at the time of joining the fund.

(Every subscriber or his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination before being accepted as a subscriber, and the cost of such medical examination shall be borne by the subscriber.)

6. Any member becoming unfinancial shall pay his arrears and shall be financial for one calendar month before receiving benefit, but, provided that he is unfinancial for less than one month, he may receive benefits immediately upon payment of arrears.
7. The Warren District Hospital Board may recoup

from the Fund-

(a) Ten per cent. of all subscriptions received for

administration expenses; and
(b) Two shillings and eightpence per member annually for the treatment of out-patients at the Warren District Hospital.

8. Any surplus accruing in the Fund shall be distributed at the discretion of the Board.

9. A register of members shall be kept and shall be available for inspection by any financial member at the hospital or Secretary's office at any reasonable hour.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1945.

By-laws of the Toodyay Road Board relating to the establishment, maintenance and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Toodyay.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established, the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualifications and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the

Brigade.

Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall amount at each denot a person to look officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1945, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire fighting members, and (c) associate members. (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

s. d. (i) Owner or occupier of land within the Brigade area-minimum subscription of .. 10 0

(ii) Other persons—a minimum subscrip.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

- (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.
- (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.
- (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

9. Saturday-Third in each second month.

Deputy Chairman.

3. The Committee may elect one of its members to be deputy chairman who, in the absence of the Chairman, shall act as chairman of the Committee.

Conduct of the Business of the Committee.

- 4. Meetings of the Committee shall be held at such intervals and at such times and places as the Committee may by resolution from time to time determine.
- 5. The chairman or, in his absence, the deputy chairman, may at any time call a special meeting of the Committee.
- 6. At all meetings of the Committee the chairman shall have a deliberative vote but no casting vote.
- 7. (a) All questions before the Committee shall be decided by the votes of a majority of the members present at the meeting and when so decided shall be deemed to be the decision of the whole Committee.
 - (b) In the event of an equality of votes the motion shall be lost.
 - 8. The Board shall keep a record of its proceedings.
 - 9. The order of business at ordinary meetings shall be as follows:-
 - (i) Confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.
 - (ii) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
 - (iii) Correspondence.
 - (iv) Motions.
 - (v) General business.

- 15. A notice pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 7 of the Act of the intention of the Committee to recommend that an application made under section 6 of the Act be approved shall be in accordance with the Form 4 in the Appendix to these regulations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, section 201, the Katanning Road Board doth make and publish the following by-

1. In these regulations—
''Act'' means the Road District Act, 1919-1943.
''Board'' means the Katanning Road Board.
''Officer'' means any officer appointed by the Board.
''Owner'' includes any owner or consignee, whether joint or sale or person in possession or in charge of any stock or any agent of such owner or consignee and includes the occupier for the time being of any portion of a saleyard.
"'Saleyard" means the structures and property owned

by the Katanning Road Board used for the sale of

stock.
"Stock" means all classes of livestock.

- "Stock Agent" means any person authorised by an owner or consignee to sell stock at the saleyards on his behalf and includes a firm or body corporate.
- 2. Every person who shall bring stock to a saleyard and keep same therein for more than 24 hours shall provide them with food. It shall be competent and lawful for the officer in charge to move or remove such stock from the saleyard to any other part of the Board's property and to recover from the owner any expenses incurred in so doing.

3. All stock brought to a saleyard for sale shall be in the care of the stock agents to whom the same shall

be consigned.

The Board will not be responsible for any injury or damage to or for the death or escape of any stock brought or delivered to a saleyard.

5. Sales shall be held in the saleyards, on such days and at such hours, between sunrise and sunset, as shall

be determined from time to time by the Board.

- 6. No person shall sell any stock in a saleyard unless he has obtained a licence so to do from the Board. Licenses shall be issued annually and the fee payable for a licence shall be 5s. A licence issued to a firm shall entitle any member thereof to sell stock. Any clerk of a licensee may sell for such licensee in the saleyard while the licence issued to his employer under this regulation remains unrevoked.
- 7. The order of priority in which stock agents shall sell stock on authorised sale days shall be determined by the stock agents.
- 8. The following dues and fees shall be paid in respect of all stock sold:-

These charges to be subject to alteration from time to time as the Board may require by resolution.

Yard fees shall be charged only once for any lot or stock resubmitted for sale on the same day by the stock agent responsible for the first offering.

When any lots passed in or sold by stock agents are transferred to another stock agent and again submitted for sale on the same day, yard dues shall be charged on both transactions.

11. Yard dues shall be levied on all runs given from

- stock yarded for sale on the day prior to sale day.

 12. Every stock agent shall furnish to the Board a true statement in writing, setting out the total number of each class of stock yarded by him in a saleyard in respect of each sale day and remit all dues and fees thereon within seven days after sale. The Board shall have power to inspect any books necessary to verify such statement.
- 13. Stock upon which all market dues and fees have been paid may be yarded free for a period of 24 hours from the time of sale, if the consent of the officer in charge be obtained. If such stock be not despatched

from the saleyard at the expiration of such period, the yarding fees to be paid upon such stock for every day or part of a day that such stock remain yarded shall be as follows:-

For every head of	cattle		 1d.
For every horse		 	 1d.
For every sheep		 	 ½d.
For every lamb		 	 ⅓d.
For every pig		 	 ⅓d.
For every goat		 	 ⅓d.

- 14. The owner of stock shall, if so desired by the officer in charge, cause such stock to be removed from the saleyard at a specified time following the day upon which stock have been submitted to auction.
- 15. The owner or person having the control of any dog in a saleyard shall tie or secure the dog, when the same is not working therein, in such a manner as to prevent such dog from running about the saleyard or interfering with any stock therein. Any dog, while not tied up, shall be muzzled. No owner or person having the charge or control of any mangy or diseased dog shall take the same into a saleyard or permit or suffer it to enter therein. Any officer of the Board may destroy any such dog found in a saleyard.
- 16. No person shall ride or drive any animal, whether attached to any vehicle or not, at more than a walking pace, within the precincts of a saleyard, except in such places as shall be allotted for the purpose.
- 17. No person in a saleyard shall:—(a) Behave in a disorderly or indecent manner; or (b) commit any act of theft or dishonesty therein; or (c) be or remain in the saleyard, if he has no legitimate business therein, or if he has at any time committed a breach of paragraphs (a) or (b) of this regulation.
- 18. The Board may exclude from a saleyard any person considered to be an undesirable character.
- 19. No person shall put or place any sign, advertisement or notice on any part of a saleyard, except with the written consent of the Board.
