WHEREAS by section 6 of the Game Act, 1912-1913, it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare a close season for any particular native game either generally throughout the State or in any one or more districts thereof: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the close seasons for Wild Ducks mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be as set out in the second column of the said Schedule; and I do further, with the advice aforesaid, proclaim and declare that the portions of the State defined in the third column of the Schedule hereto shall be districts for the purposes of the said Act and that each close season shall be operative in the district mentioned in the third column of such Schedule opposite the statement of such close season and not elsewhere.

The Proclamations dated 14th April, 1926, 12th November, 1930, and 15th November, 1944, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of 16th April, 1926, 14th November, 1930, and 24th November, 1944, respectively, are hereby revoked.

Schedule.

Kind of Native Game, Statement of Close Season, District within which Close Season operates.

Wild Ducks of all species; from the beginning of June to 5 o'clock in the morning of the 22nd December in every year; District A—The whole of the State with the exception of that portion within the boundaries of the East Murchison Goldfield and the Kimberley Division as defined in The Land Act, 1898, other than that portion described below.

Wild Ducks of all species; from midnight, 31st December, to midnight, 31st May, in every year; District B—Broome, bounded on the North by the 17 deg.

South Latitude; on the East by 124 deg. East Longitude; on the South by the 19 deg. South Latitude; and on the West by the sea coast.

Wild Ducks of all species; from the beginning of December to the end of April in each and every year; within the boundaries of the Magisterial District of East Kimberley.

WHEREAS by section 6 of the Game Act, 1912-1913, it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare a close season for any particular native game either generally throughout the State or in any one or more districts thereof: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the close season throughout the State for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be as set out in the second column thereof opposite the name of such kind of game; and I do further, with the advice aforesaid, proclaim and declare that the portions of the State defined in the third column of the Schedule hereto shall be districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that the close season for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule shall be as set out in the second column of such Schedule opposite the name of such kind of game and that such close season shall be operative in the district mentioned in the third column of such Schedule opposite the statement of such close season and not elsewhere.

The Proclamation dated 14th April, 1926 (published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th April, 1946) is hereby revoked.

Schedule.

Kind of Native Game, Statement of Close Season, District within which Close Season operates.

Wild Geese; from the beginning of December to the end of April in each and every year; within the boundaries of the Magisterial District of East Kimberley.

Seals; from the beginning of November to the end of March in every year; District C—The whole of the State.

Wild Geese of all species, Swamp Hen, Wild Pigeon, Rottneet Snipe; from the beginning of July to the end of November in every year; District D—Comprising that portion of the State bounded on the West and South by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the North by the Murchison River; on the East by a line from Bompas Hill, in the Great Northern bend of the Murchison River, through Wongan Hills and Mt. Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River.

Cranes, Herons, Spoonbills, and Egrets, Plovers of all species (including Stone Plover and Curlew), Oyster Catchers (including Red-bills and Dottrels), Stilts (including White-headed Stilt and Red-necked Avocet), Sea Curlews (including Whimbrels), Sand Pipers, Stints, Knots, and Snipe, Terns and Gulls (exclusive of Gannets), and Kestrels; from the beginning of June to the end of September in every year; District E—Comprising that portion of the State North of the Moore River.

Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-eyes); from the beginning of January to the end of August in every year; District F—The Kimberley Division as defined in the Land Act, 1898.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1945, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 18628 at Ruabon should vest in and be held by the Sussex Road Board in trust for the purpose of a Hall Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Sussex Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act and to the condition that, if the premises are required for school or other Government purposes, they are to be made available free.

Barristers' Board—Amendment of Rules.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Barristers' Board duly convened for and held on Friday, 6th December, 1946, at the Board Office, Supreme Court, Perth, the Rules of the said Board were amended by the insertion, after rule 24, of a new rule pursuant to Act No. 18 of 1946, as follows:—

Rule 24a (a) In relation to articulated clerks who have served in the armed forces at any time since the 3rd day of September, 1939, and whose articles were registered before enlistment therein, a period of such service equal to one-third thereof but not exceeding 12 months shall be deemed to be equivalent to actual and bona fide service under articles of clerkship to a practitioner for the purposes of the Act.

(b) In relation to persons who have so served in such forces, a period of 12 months, being the period immediately preceding graduation and being portion of the period of two years required by section fourteen of the Act to be served by graduates may be served before graduation and while attending the University of Western Australia as students of law, and such period of 12 months so served shall be deemed to be actual and bona fide service under articles of clerkship to a practitioner for the purposes of the Act.

(c) (1) Any person desirous of taking the benefit of this rule shall make application to the Board accompanied by an affidavit by the applicant setting out all the facts and dates relied on by him, and the applicant shall produce for the inspection of the Board his certificate of discharge from the armed forces, statement of service or other similar document.

(2) An application under paragraph (a) of this rule shall be accompanied by a certificate from the applicant's Principal verifying the period or periods of his service under articles.

(3) Any application under paragraph (b) of this rule shall be accompanied by a certificate from the Dean of the Faculty of Law in the University of Western Australia, stating the date on which the applicant was enrolled as a student in such Faculty and verifying that he is still so enrolled on the date of the application.

THE GOVERNMENT TRAMWAYS ACT, 1912-1933.

NOTICE is hereby given that by-laws 1 to 30 inclusive and all amendments thereto, made under section 5 of the Government Tramways Act, 1912-1933, and originally published in the *Government Gazette* on the 23rd day of March, 1923, are hereby repealed and in lieu thereof new by-laws, as set out in the Schedule hereunder, are hereby made under the said section.

Schedule.

1.—By-laws extend to all Premises and Vehicles.

These by-laws shall extend to all premises used for Tramway purposes and to all vehicles used in connection therewith, and the word "tramcar" shall include every such vehicle.

2.—Passenger to pay Fare on Demand.

Every passenger, not being the holder of a pass shall, on demand by the conductor or other duly authorised employee, pay the fare legally demandable for the journey. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

3.—Travelling without Paying Fare.

Any person not being the holder of a pass, who shall travel by and leave any tram car without first having paid his fare to the conductor or an authorised employee shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

4.—Tickets and Passes to be shown on Demand.

Every passenger, not being the holder of a pass, on paying his fare, shall be furnished with a ticket. Each passenger shall show his pass or ticket, when required, to the conductor or other authorised employee, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled by the passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

5.—Sale, Purchase and Use of Tickets.

Cash fare tickets and passes shall remain the property of the Commissioner and shall not be transferable. Any person not duly authorised by the Commissioner who shall sell, or attempt to sell, any pass or ticket, or shall use or attempt to use a transferred pass or ticket, or shall use or attempt to use a pass or ticket, the availability of which has expired, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

6.—Defaced Tickets and Passes not recognised.

A ticket on which the number has been rendered illegible or pass which is defaced or illegible shall be invalid, and the holder thereof shall be deemed not to have paid his fare, and if he refuses to pay the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

7.—Availability of Tickets.

Unless otherwise stated thereon, tickets shall be available only for use on the tramcar and for the journey on which they are issued, and any person who uses or attempts to use any ticket in contravention of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

8.—Smoking in Unauthorised Places.

No person shall smoke in any waiting room or in any part of any tramcar unless such part is set aside for the purpose. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law may be removed by any employee of the Commissioner, and whether removed or not shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

9.—Conveyance of Dogs, Etc.

If any person shall take into, or have in his charge in any tramcar any bird, dog or other animal which, in the opinion of the conductor or any employee may cause inconvenience or be offensive to any passengers, he shall, when requested so to do by such conductor or other employee, immediately remove such bird, dog or other animal from the tramcar. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

10.—Loaded Firearms or Inflammable Liquid or Material not to be carried.

No person shall, without the written authority of the Commissioner, take or place into or upon any tramcar or waiting room any highly inflammable liquid or material or take into or upon or discharge from or upon any tramcar or waiting room any loaded firearm. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

11.—Passengers' Luggage, Parcels, etc.

No person, unless authorised by the Commissioner, shall take into or upon any tramcar any luggage, other than small parcels capable of being carried in the hand, or any luggage which, in the opinion of the conductor or any employee, will cause inconvenience, damage or be offensive to passengers. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

12.—Persons Intoxicated or Committing a Nuisance.

No person who is in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in any tramcar, or be upon the premises of the Commissioner, and no person shall, in or upon any such tramcar or premises, wilfully interfere with the comfort of any person, or commit any nuisance, or gamble, or consume intoxicating liquor, or write or use any insulting, indecent, obscene or blasphemous words. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law may be removed from such tramcar or premises, and whether removed or not shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

13.—Injuring Tramway Property.

No person shall wilfully or negligently injure any lining, shutter, blind, or break or deface any window, or remove or injure any number plate, notice or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any lamp of or in any tramcar or waiting room, or otherwise damage any fittings, tramcar or other property of the Commissioner. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

14.—Advertisements on Tramway Property.

No person, unless authorised in writing by the Commissioner, shall post, stick, paint, write, or distribute or cause to be posted, stuck, painted, written or distributed, any placard, bill or advertisement or other matter within or upon any tramcar, post, fence, gate, platform, wall, building or other property or premises of the Commissioner. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

15.—Persons with Infections or Contagious Diseases.

The Commissioner may refuse to carry any person who has an infectious or contagious disease. No person who has any such disease shall, without the authority of the Commissioner, resort to or enter or remain upon any premises of the Commissioner, or travel or attempt to travel on any tramcar. No person who has charge of any person who has any such disease shall, without the like authority, aid or assist the person having any such disease to travel, or attempt to travel, on the tramway. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law may be removed from such premises or tramcar by any employee.

16.—Persons Offensive to Passengers.

No person whose dress or person might soil the dress of any passenger, or the fittings of any tramcar, or whose presence would, in the opinion of the conductor or any employee, be, for any sufficient reason, offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any tramcar, and any such person found in or upon any tramcar who refuses at the request of any employee to leave the same may be removed therefrom, and whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

17.—Persons Entering or Leaving Tramcars.

No person, except an employee or a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount upon any tramcar; and any person holding or hanging by any part of a tramcar, or riding upon the roof or other portion of a tramcar not intended for the conveyance of passengers, or getting into or upon or quitting any tramcar whilst the tramcar is in motion, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

18.—Male Person not to enter Ladies' Waiting Rooms.

No male person shall enter any waiting room or tramcar set apart for the accommodation of females, and any such person who shall enter such room or tramcar, or remain therein after being warned to leave same, may be removed therefrom by any employee, and whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

19.—Lost Property to be handed over.

Every person who shall find any article or lost property in any waiting room, or in or upon any tramcar, or who shall receive any article or lost property found in any waiting room or tramcar, shall forthwith deliver such article to the officer duly authorised to receive same at any tramway office, or to the conductor in charge of the tramcar. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

The following charges shall be collected in connection with lost property left by passengers in tramcars, or found in waiting sheds and held at the Tramway Lost Property Office:—

For each umbrella, parasol, walking stick, book, gloves, small package or other article for a period not exceeding two days	3d.
After two days and not exceeding four days	4d.
After four days	6d.

20.—Interference with Passengers Entering or Alighting.

Any person who shall wilfully prevent a passenger from boarding or alighting from any tramcar, except when the tram is in motion, or obstruct any passenger from boarding or alighting shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

21.—Entering a Full Tramcar.

Any person entering or attempting to enter a tramcar after being informed by an employee that the same is full or having entered, refuses to leave at the request of such employee, may be removed from such tramcar by any employee, and whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

22.—Position of Passengers when Standing to be Regulated by Conductor.

Any person standing in the aisle or on the platform of any tramcar, and refusing to move to another position in the tramcar indicated by the conductor when requested by the conductor so to do, may be removed from such tramcar by any employee of the Commissioner, and whether removed or not shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

23.—Communication Signals between Drivers and Conductors.

No person being a passenger on a tramcar shall make use of the means of communicating signals used by drivers and conductors for the purpose of starting or stopping tramcars, without reasonable cause. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

24.—Passengers not to Place Feet on Seats.

No passenger shall place his or her foot or feet on any part of a seat in any waiting room or tramcar. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

25.—Expectorating on Premises or Tramcars.

No person shall expectorate in or upon any tramcar, waiting room or premises of the Commissioner. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

26.—Standing when Seat is Available.

No person other than an employee shall stand on any platform or other part of a tramcar when a seat is available, and any such person who continues to so stand after being requested by an employee to be seated shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

27.—Sales on Tramway Premises or Tramcar.

No person shall sell or attempt to sell any article on any tramcar or tramway premises unless authorised in writing by the Commissioner so to do. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

28.—Refusing to Leave Waiting Room when Required.

Any person, not being an intending passenger, who refuses or fails to leave any waiting room when requested to do so by any employee or police officer, may be removed therefrom by any such employee or police officer, and whether removed or not shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

29.—Fare Concession Certificates.

No person shall by means of an untrue statement, certificate or declaration, obtain or attempt to obtain a ticket, or tickets enabling him or her to travel at concession rates. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

30.—Obstructing Progress of Tramcars.

No driver of any vehicle or machine shall without reasonable cause impede the progress of any tramcar and no person shall make use of any tramcar for the purpose of drawing any vehicle or machine. Any person who is guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.
