WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1944, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to revest in His Majesty as of his former estate all or any lands whereof His Majesty may become the registered proprietor; and whereas His Majesty is now the registered proprietor of Kent Locations 67, 204, 242, 241, 194, 142 and 141 as registered in Certificates of Title, Volumes 467, 775, 799, 799, 951 and 951, Folios 170, 49, 190, 191, 192, 79 and 80, respectively: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revest in His Majesty, his heirs and successors, Kent Locations 67, 204, 242, 241, 194, 142 and 141 aforesaid, as of his former estate. (Proclamation appearing on page 1250 of the *Government Gazette* of the 11th October, 1946, quoting Hay Locations 67, 204, 242, 241, 194, 142 and 141 is hereby superseded.)

GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in our said State and its Dependencies, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people, in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said State and its Dependencies, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves, as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Lieutenant-Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, at Perth, this Sixth day of August, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.

GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you, and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in our State of Western Australia in the Magisterial Districts hereinbefore indicated, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in the said Districts, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people in the said Districts according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said Districts, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within the said Districts who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in the said Districts: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the person charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Lieutenant-Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, at Perth, this Sixth day of August, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.

GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS ACT, 1904-1939.

By-law No. 90—By-laws Relating to Sale of Liquor at Railway Refreshment Rooms.

(Licensing Act, 1911-1946, Section 46.)

1. The Commissioner of Railways may grant to an officer employed by him a license in Form No. 792 of the Appendix to these by-laws, for the sale of liquor in any railway refreshment room, for the period of one year from the date of the license.

2. No person, being the holder of a license under the authority of the Commissioner of Railways to sell liquor in any railway refreshment room, shall, at such refreshment room or upon any railway premises, sell or supply, or permit to be sold or supplied, any liquor—

(a) to any person in a state of intoxication; or
(b) to any person apparently under the age of twenty-one years; or

(c) to any aboriginal native of Australia; or
(d) to any person during such time as the refreshment room at or from which the liquor was supplied, is, under the conditions of the license required to remain closed; or

(e) to any person unless within a reasonable time before or after the arrival or departure of any passenger train at or from such station between the hours of nine in the morning and nine at night in any part of the State except the Goldfields district, and between the hours of nine in the morning and eleven at night in the Goldfields district; or

(f) to any person at any time when other licensed premises are required under the Licensing Act, 1911-1946, to be closed, unless to passengers who have travelled on the railway or are about to travel on the railway a distance of not less than twenty miles to or from the station at which the railway refreshment room is situated.

3. Any such holder of a license who offends against any of the foregoing provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, unless charged and convicted for the same offence under the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911-1946.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 9 of 1945.

Between Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, Porecelain and Roof Tile Fixers Employees' Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and H. L. Brisbane and Wunderlich Limited, Stoneware Pipe and Pottery Co. of W.A. Limited and Standard Tile Co., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court now therefore the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement").

1.—Area and Scope.

(a) This Award shall be limited in its application to the area comprised within a radius of thirty (30) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

(b) This Award shall apply to all workers employed to do work on or in connection with the laying and fixing of roofing tiles or slates, also battens, the bedding and laying of hips, ridge capping and roof accessories and the necessary wiring or nailing of such tiles or slates.

2.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked at the option of the employer in five (5) or five and a half (5½) days.

3.—Overtime.

All time worked in any week beyond the hours referred to in clause 2 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

4.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All workers required to work on the days named in subclause (a) hereof, or on any Sunday, shall be paid double time rate for all time worked on any such day.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(j) The quantum of annual leave to be allowed to a worker shall, for service subsequent to the 1st September, 1946, be calculated in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

(k) "Picnic Day" shall be the second Monday in November, but if the second Monday happens to be the day observed as the King's Birthday, the third Monday in November shall be Picnic Day.

(d) A worker commencing in the industry after his eighteenth (18th) birthday shall, after serving three (3) years in the industry, become entitled to submit himself for a qualifying test by his employer and on passing the test shall become entitled to the tile fixer's margin. A worker commencing in the industry before his eighteenth (18th) birthday shall become entitled to the test after having attained the age of twenty-one (21) years, provided he has then served at least three (3) years in the industry. Any adult worker who has not passed the qualifying test shall be classed as an improver and paid accordingly.

6.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

7.—Contract of Service.

For the purpose of convenience the wages set out in clause 5 hereof are stated on a weekly basis, but it shall be understood between the parties that the contract of service shall be a daily one, terminable on either side by one (1) day's notice and the worker shall in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the hour when such notice expires.

8.—Proportion of Juniors.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one (1) junior to one (1) adult worker.

9.—Fares and Travelling Allowances.

(1) The following rules shall apply in regard to fares actually and reasonably incurred by a worker in travelling from his usual place of residence to a job and from the job to his residence:—

(a) Where the distance from residence to job is not greater than sixteen (16) miles—

(i) the worker shall pay the first fourpence (4d.) of the return fare;

(ii) the employer shall, subject to a limit of fivepence (5d.) pay the worker anything incurred in excess of the first fourpence (4d.) of the return fare.

(b) Where the distance from residence to job is greater than sixteen (16) miles paragraph (i) of the foregoing subparagraph (a) shall apply, and in addition thereto the employer shall pay the worker any extra amount incurred by the worker in excess of the first fourpence (4d.) of the return fare.

(2) Where the worker uses any kind of conveyance (other than a public conveyance or a conveyance provided by the employer) the amount of fares for which the employer would have been liable in accordance with subclause (1) of this clause, if the worker had used a public conveyance, shall be paid by the employer to the worker.

(3) During the hours of work all travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

10.—Country Work.

(a) Except in cases where the employer provides board and lodging any worker who is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be paid by his employer at the rate of thirty shillings (30s.) per week of seven (7) days in addition to his regular wage.

(b) Time occupied in travelling up to a maximum of eight (8) hours in each day shall be paid for at ordinary rates.

(c) The employers shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

(d) Where the worker uses any kind of conveyance of his own in travelling, the amount of the fare that would have been reasonably incurred had the worker used a public conveyance shall be paid by the employer to the worker.

11.—Time and Wages Record.

(a) The employer shall make and keep a record (or records) showing:—

- (i) The name of the worker.
- (ii) The class of work performed.
- (iii) The starting and finishing times each day.
- (iv) The hours worked.
- (v) The wage and overtime (if any) paid.
- (vi) The ages of each junior worker.

(b) Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the secretary or other duly accredited representative of the Union not more than once weekly during working hours and such person may take extracts therefrom.

12.—Refund of Disbursements.

The employer shall refund to a worker any out-of-pocket expenses incurred on behalf of the employer in respect of telephone calls and purchase of materials.

13.—Term.

This Award shall operate from its date and shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years subject to the right of either party to amend same in pursuance of the provisions of the Act.

14.—Board of Reference.

(a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;

(ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;

(iii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

15.—Junior Workers' Certificate.

Junior workers upon being engaged shall be required to furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

(a) Name in full.

(b) Age and date of birth.

(c) Length of service with each previous employer.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker or his length of service with another employer being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any worker shall wilfully mis-state his age or length of service with another employer on the above certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

16.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause, other than wet weather, which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

17.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of 1/12th of a week's pay for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(d) Trainees at registered part-time training schools under the Nurses Registration Act shall work in shifts of not more than eight (8) hours; provided such shifts shall not exceed a spread of twelve (12) hours.

Paragraph (e).—Insert the words "of not more than" before the words "eight (8) hours" appearing at the end of the paragraph.

8—Overtime.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (1) of clause 7, all time worked in excess of the ordinary weekly, fortnightly or four-weekly working hours as prescribed in clause 7 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half—

(i) in the case of workers working forty-four (44) hours per week—for the first four (4) hours;

(ii) in the case of workers working eighty-eight (88) hours per fortnight—for the first eight (8) hours;

(iii) in the case of workers working one hundred and seventy-six (176) hours per four (4) weeks—for the first sixteen (16) hours; and double time thereafter, or, if the employer and employee so agree, time off in lieu thereof shall be granted at the convenience of the hospital; provided, however, that such time off shall be in unbroken periods, according to each period of overtime worked; and also provided that the overtime is made up within twenty-eight (28) days from the time when it becomes due, except where it applies to the change-over from night duty to day duty or day duty to night duty.

(b) Less than thirty (30) minutes' overtime for a week, or one hour's overtime for a fortnight, or two (2) hours' overtime for a four-weekly period, as the case may be, shall not be paid for.

(c) For the purpose of calculating the overtime rate, board and lodging assessed in accordance with clause 24 shall be added to the prescribed cash wage.
