WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1946, it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture in any specified portion of West Australian waters during a specified portion of every year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf prohibit all persons from taking crabs by means of sunk set nets in those portions of West Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto from 1st April to 14th December in every year.

Schedule.

(a) The waters of the Swan River and of its tributaries upwards to its source from a line drawn from the Southern extremity of the Swan Brewery Wharf (situated on the Western side of the river near Eliza Point) to the Mill Point (or Belches Point) Spit Post.

(b) The waters of the Canning River and of its tributaries upwards to its source from a line drawn from the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, Como, to the North Eastern extremity of Point Heathcote.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7 subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceedings, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that by leave of a judge any action may notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.
