WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act, 1894-1946, where the Governor is satisfied that the residents of any area are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare such area to be a Region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the residents of the area specified in Schedule hereunder are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, do hereby proclaim the said area to be a Region under the provisions of the said Act— to be designated the Narembeen Region.

All that area of Western Australia included within the boundaries of the Narembeen Road District.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1946, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit

all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto, by means of fishing nets, for a term of three years from January 1, 1948, until December 31, 1950.

Schedule.

The waters of that part of Cockburn Sound at Kwinana Beach extending one-quarter-of-a-mile North and South of the "Kwinana" wreck and extending seawards one-quarter-of-a-mile measured rectangularly from the foreshore.

WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the second Schedule to the Road Districts Act, 1919-1946, it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any buildings, and the open space used in connection with such buildings shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building; and whereas a Proclamation was issued under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th November, 1936, page 1902, fixing certain areas as the area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith in the Perth Road District; and whereas it is

deemed expedient to vary the said areas as fixed by the said Proclamation: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said Proclamation, and doth by this Proclamation declare that the minimum area for any building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house, shall be six thousand square feet.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1946, that during every Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day and Easter Monday and any other day that the Governor may by Proclamation declare to be a public holiday to be observed under the said Act, all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) and warehouses shall be closed: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act do by this Proclamation declare that, in addition to Christmas Day, 1947, and New Year's Day, 1948, Friday, the 26th day of December, 1947, shall be a day to be observed as a public holiday under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1946, throughout the State with the intent that on the said day all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act and registered small shops) and warehouses throughout the State shall be closed.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1942, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the District or any portion of the District of a Local Authority a Water Area under such name as may be directed, and to constitute a Water Board for such Water Area; and whereas the Governor is similarly

empowered to appoint a Local Authority whose District or part of whose District is within the Water Area to be the Water Board for the Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute that portion of the district of the Three Springs Road Board, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto, a Water Area for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of the Three Springs Water Area, and doth hereby constitute a Water Board therefor and appoint the Three Springs Road Board to be such Water Board under the name of the Three Springs Water Board.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 28th day of November, 1947.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceedings, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that by leave of a judge any action may notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following regulations governing the admission of Engineering Cadet Draftsmen, Architectural Cadet Draftsmen and Engineering Survey Cadets in the Public Works and Water Supply Departments, and to cancel the previous regulations relating to the admission of these cadets:—

Regulations Governing the Admission of Engineering Cadets, Architectural Cadets, Engineering Cadet Draftsmen, Architectural Cadet Draftsmen and Engineering Survey Cadets in the Public Works and Water Supply Departments.

1.—Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than 21 nor less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to his character.

When forwarding his application, each candidate shall attach a completed questionnaire on the printed form obtainable at the office of the Public Service Commissioner.

2.—Qualifications.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—Applicants must have qualified for Matriculation in the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Western Australia, or have passed an approved equivalent examination.

(b) Architectural Cadets.—Applicants must have passed the Leaving Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematics A and B, Physics and at least one of the following subjects:—Applied Mathematics, Chemistry, Drawing, Geology, or have passed an approved equivalent examination.

(c) Engineering Cadet Draftsmen and Architectural Cadet Draftsmen.—Applicants must have passed the Junior Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematics A and B, Physics and any two other subjects, or have passed an approved equivalent examination. Applicants shall produce a specimen of their plan drawing.

(d) Engineering Survey Cadets.—Applicants must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Western Australia, including Mathematics A and B.

All applicants will be required to produce evidence of examinations passed by them.

3.—Selection.

Applications for vacancies will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement. Selection of applicants considered suitable for appointment will be made by a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner, the Permanent Head and the Director of Works, or his nominee.

4.—Probation.

Every cadet shall, in the first instance, be appointed on probation for a period of three months. Before the expiration of the period of probation, the Permanent Head shall report to the Public Service Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties, and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report, the Commissioner will confirm, or annul the appointment. Upon confirmation of a cadet's appointment, he will be article to the Director of Works, or to the Principal Architect, as the case may require, for the term hereinafter prescribed.

5.—Term of Cadetship.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—A cadet shall serve for an aggregate period of two years in the Department. For the purpose of determining this period, the sum of all University vacations actually spent by the cadet in training in the Department shall be counted. Leave without pay will be granted to cover the University terms.

A cadet who, after following part of the University course is forced to relinquish it without proceeding to a degree, shall serve an aggregate period of five years in the Department. He shall satisfy the Director of Works that he has entered upon a course of study to enable him to pass one of the examinations referred to in regulation 7 (a) as soon after the abandonment of the University course as may be possible.

At least 20 per cent. of the time spent in the Department shall be in the office for the purpose of receiving instruction in the preparation of engineering drawings, computations, specifications, designing, office methods and general engineering work. The remainder of the term shall be spent in the field on engineering surveys, and the design, construction and maintenance of engineering works, or a short course in the workshops, according to the branch of work to which he is allotted.

(b) Architectural Cadets.—A cadet shall serve for a period of five years. Immediately upon appointment he will be required to enrol as a student in the Diploma Course of Architecture at the Perth Technical College. This course will require two years' full-time and three years' part-time attendance at the College. Leave without pay will be granted to cover the cadet's attendance at the Diploma Course.

The whole of the period of the Cadetship not required in attendance at the Perth Technical College shall be spent in service with the Department. During the time to be spent in the Department, the cadet will receive general practical instruction in designing, drafting, construction, quantities, specifications, and the work of an architect generally. Portion of the time will be spent in the field in the supervision of Construction and Maintenance work, and in carrying out architectural surveys.

(c) Engineering Cadet Draftsmen and Architectural Cadet Draftsmen.—A cadet will be required to serve for a term of four years in the drawing office, during which time he will receive general practical instruction in—

Engineering Cadet Draftsman.—Drafting, plotting from field notes, calculations for design, estimates, specifications, preparations of working drawings, computations and the general work of the Engineering Drawing Office.

Architectural Cadet Draftsman.—Drafting, construction, specifications, quantities and general architectural work.

A cadet shall satisfy the Director of Works or the Principal Architect as the case may require that he has entered upon a course of study to enable him to pass the examination referred to in Regulation 7 (c).

(d) Engineering Survey Cadets.—A cadet will be required to serve for a term of four years, one year of which shall be in the Drawing Office for the purpose of receiving practical instruction in Drawing Office work, including the use of instruments, plotting, grading sewers, drains, roads, etc., quantities and estimates, specifications, computations, areas, traverses, volumes and hydraulic computations. The remaining period of his cadetship shall be spent in the field on practical survey work including the use of instruments for hydrographic surveys.

A cadet shall satisfy the Director of Works that he has entered upon a course of study to enable him to pass the examinations referred to in Regulation 7 (d).

(e) General.—Time served with the Department prior to appointment as a cadet may be counted towards the qualifying period at the discretion of the Public Service Commissioner on the recommendation of the Director of Works.

6.—Study Leave.

When a cadet who is serving in the Department is unable to obtain the necessary instruction at evening classes in respect of his course of study he may be allowed such leave of absence as may be necessary to attend day lectures in approved subjects, but such leave of absence during working hours shall be without pay.

7.—Final Examinations.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—No cadet shall be considered to have completed his cadetship until he has fulfilled one of the following conditions:—

Civil Engineering Cadets—

- (i) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Engineering in the University of Western Australia.
- (ii) Passed sections "A" and "B" of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London.
- (iii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.

Mechanical Engineering Cadets—

- (i) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Engineering in the University of Western Australia.
- (ii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.
- (iii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, London.

Electrical Engineering Cadets—

- (i) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Engineering in the University of Western Australia.
 - (ii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.
 - (iii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, London.
- (b) Architectural Cadets.—No cadet shall be considered to have completed his cadetship until he has fulfilled all of the following conditions:—
- (i) Obtained the Diploma in Architecture at the Perth Technical College.
 - (ii) Obtained Registration under the provisions of the Architects Act, 1921.
 - (iii) Been admitted as an Associate Member of the Royal Institute of British Architects, London; or the Royal Australian Institute of Architects.

(c) Engineering Cadet Draftsmen and Architectural Draftsmen.—At the end of the prescribed term of cadetship a cadet will be required to present himself at a qualifying examination which shall be conducted as directed by the Public Service Commissioner. The Examination will be conducted in the following subjects:—

Engineering Cadet Draftsman—

- (i) Plotting from field notes and sketches.
- (ii) Grading—sewers, drains, railways, roads, etc.
- (iii) Computation of areas, traverses, volumes, etc., hydraulic computations, calculation of stresses.
- (iv) Strength and use of materials, design of structures, including calculations and working drawings.
- (v) Quantities and estimates for engineering works.
- (vi) Preparation of specifications and contract documents.
- (vii) Such knowledge of statutes, regulations and by-laws governing works carried out by the Department as is necessary for the proper preparation of plans in accordance with the following acts and by-laws:—Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, Water Boards Act, Public Works Act, Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, Land Drainage Act, Main Roads Act, Goldfields Water Supply Act.
- (viii) Drawing. This will be taken into account when considering those subjects in which drawings have to be made.

Architectural Cadet Draftsman—

- (i) Drawing—(a) Preparation of sketches, working drawings and details, from outline instructions; (b) Freehand Drawing, perspective drawing and rendering.
- (ii) Building Construction, including computations for structural design.
- (iii) Quantities and Estimates for Architectural works.
- (iv) Specifications—preparation of specifications and contract documents.
- (v) Building Services—Drainage, Water Supply, Sanitation, Hygiene, Lighting, Ventilation, etc.

The Public Service Commissioner may exempt cadets from these examinations wholly or in part, on the production of satisfactory evidence that they have passed an examination at an approved technical school or other examination which, in the opinion of the Director of Works, is of equal standard.

(d) Engineering Survey Cadets.—At the end of the prescribed term of cadetship a cadet will be required to present himself at a qualifying examination, which shall be conducted as directed by the Public Service Commissioner. The examination will be conducted in the following subjects:—

- (i) Plotting from field notes and sketches.
- (ii) Grading—sewers, drains, roads, etc.
- (iii) Computation of areas, traverses, volumes, etc., and hydraulic computations.
- (iv) Quantities, estimates and specifications.

A cadet will also be required to pass an examination in practical surveying and the use of instruments, including instruments for hydrographic surveys.

During the term of his cadetship, a cadet will be required to pass Mathematics I, Geology I, Physics I, Descriptive Geometry and Graphics I, Hydraulics I and Surveying I and II at University standard.

8.—Extension of Term.

If, at the end of the prescribed term of his cadetship, a cadet has not succeeded in fulfilling the conditions of completion set out in Regulation 7, his cadetship may be extended at the discretion of the Public Service Commissioner for a further period not exceeding two years at the same remuneration as he was in receipt of for the last year of his cadetship.

9.—Student Membership.

- (a) Engineering Cadets.—A cadet, as soon as he is qualified by age, shall become a student member of either the Institution of Civil, Mechanical or Electrical Engineers, London, or the Institution of Engineers, Australia.
- (b) Architectural Cadets.—During the first year of his cadetship, a cadet shall become a student member of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects.

10.—Progress and Conduct.

At any time after a cadet has completed one year of the prescribed term of service, if, in the opinion of the Permanent Head of the Department, his progress and/or general conduct have not been satisfactory, his cadetship may be cancelled on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

11.—Regulations.

During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and regulations relating to the Permanent Staff, as far as these may be applicable. The period of his cadetship shall not be considered as any part of a term of service for which long service leave may be granted.

12.—Remuneration.

The remuneration of cadets during periods of service in the Department, shall be at the following rates:—

(a) Engineering and Architectural Cadets:	
1st year	55% of the Basic Rate

(b) Engineering and Architectural Cadet Draftsmen:

2nd "	65%	" " " "

13.—Allowances.

(a) A cadet while in camp where a cook is provided will be paid a daily allowance of three shillings.

(b) When a cadet is employed away from his headquarters an allowance, at such rates as may be approved by the Public Service Commissioner, may be paid as compensation for—

(i) Any extra cost of living involved where no camp with a cook is provided.

(ii) An extra cost for transport necessarily incurred.

14.—Service.

(a) Engineering and Architectural Cadets.—A cadet who has satisfactorily completed his cadetship shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years, at the salary prescribed by Industrial Agreement between the Public Service Commissioner and the Civil Service Association for the first year and thereafter in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged.

(b) Engineering and Architectural Cadet Draftsmen and Engineering Survey Cadets.—A cadet who has satisfactorily completed his cadetship shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years, at the salary prescribed by Industrial Agreement between the Public Service Commissioner and the Civil Service Association for the first two years and thereafter in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged.

15.—Agreement and Bond.

Before any person is accepted as a Cadet under these regulations an agreement in the form, or to the effect, of Form No. 1 in the appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the Head of the Department concerned; and a bond in the form, or to the effect, of Form No. 2 in the said appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties, to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend the Local Court Rules, 1923, by the insertion thereof of a new rule to stand as Order VI., Rule 31, as set out hereunder, which new rule shall come into operation one month after the date of gazettal.

Order VI.

Time Allowed for Service of Summons.

31. (1) The time within which a summons may be served shall, unless extended under the next succeeding paragraph, be limited to a period of 12 months from the issue of the summons.

(2) Where reasonable efforts have been made to serve the summons within the said period and service has not been effected, the Magistrate may, on application, order that the time be extended for a further period not exceeding 12 months or for successive periods not exceeding 12 months each:

Provided that the time shall not be extended for any period unless the application is made within the currency of the last preceding period.

(3) A note of any extension of the time allowed for service shall be indorsed on the summons and on any copy and shall be entered in the books of the court.

The abovementioned by-laws of the Royal Perth Hospital Board are amended as follows:—

1. By-laws 52 to 58 both inclusive are repealed and new by-laws to stand as by-laws 52 to 58 both inclusive are inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

52. The Board shall appoint an Honorary Medical Staff which shall consist of such officers as the Board may from time to time determine.

53. The schedule of available appointments shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in Perth.

54. Appointments shall be made from applications received by the Board whose decisions in any such matter shall be final. Appointments excepting those of clinical assistants shall be for a term of three years. Clinical assistants shall be appointed for a term of twelve months. Any casual vacancy shall be filled by the Board, such appointment to be for the unexpired term of the office vacated.

55. At the end of each term of three years the schedule of appointments shall be re-advertised and new appointments made for the ensuing term. Members of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be eligible for re-appointment provided that applicants must be under the age of sixty years as at the date of the triennial election.

56. The Board may from time to time prescribe matters generally relating to the duties and responsibilities of members of the Honorary Medical Staff.

57. (1) The Board shall appoint an Appointments Advisory Committee to advise the Board in respect of applications for appointment to the Honorary Medical Staff.

(2) The members of the said Committee shall be nominated to the Board by the Honorary Medical Staff and shall consist of two senior physicians, two senior surgeons, and one specialist not being a physician or surgeon. The member of the Honorary Medical Staff on the Board shall, if not a nominated member of the Committee, be a member *ex officio*.

(3) The Board shall require the Honorary Medical Staff to make such nominations within thirty days next following the date of a triennial election and the members then appointed to the said Committee shall hold office until the next succeeding triennial election of the Honorary Medical Staff.

(4) In the event of a casual vacancy on the Committee the Honorary Medical Staff shall nominate another of its members who on appointment by the Board shall hold office for the unexpired term of office.

(5) The Committee shall meet during the months of June in each year and also when requested by the Board and shall advise the Board regarding the appointments of clinical assistants and temporary staff.

(6) The Committee shall elect its own Chairman who shall convene its meetings. Four members including the Chairman shall constitute a quorum.

(7) In respect of triennial appointments of Honorary Medical Staff the Committee at the request of the Board shall carry out full and exhaustive inquiries concerning all applicants and shall make appropriate recommendations for appointments to the Board.

58. (1) The Board shall appoint a House Control Committee which will be responsible to and advise the Board in respect of any matters relating to the professional work of the Honorary Medical Staff and the treatment of patients generally.

(2) The House Control Committee shall consist of one Senior Surgeon, one Senior Physician, and one Senior Specialist not being a physician or surgeon, appointed by the Board within one month of the triennial elections of the Honorary Medical Staff, together with the Medical Superintendent.

(3) The Medical Superintendent shall be Chairman of the House Control Committee and shall convene its meetings which shall be held at least quarterly and at such other times as the Medical Superintendent may require. Three members of the said Committee, including the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

(4) The Committee when appointed shall hold office for a term of three years.

(5) The Committee shall communicate with the Board of Management through the Medical Superintendent.

(6) In the event of a member requiring and being granted leave of absence from the said Committee for a period in excess of four weeks, the Board shall appoint another member of the Honorary Medical Staff to act in his stead during such absence.

2. By-laws 59 to 67 both inclusive are repealed.

Sussex Road Board Caravan By-laws.

P.W. 690/45.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-1946 the Sussex Road Board makes the following by-law relating to caravans under section 201 subsection (61) and section 204.

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, no person shall use or allow to be used any caravan or vehicle designed for use or capable of being used as a dwelling for sleeping purposes on any land whether public or private within the Sussex Road District.

Provided that this by-law shall not apply to:—

(a) Caravans or vehicles travelling over a public road or public place and duly licensed to be on such roads and provided that such caravans or vehicles travel or park in accordance with existing traffic regulations.

(b) Caravans or vehicles stationary on a reserve or area specially set apart and prescribed by the Road Board, or on private land with a written approval of

the controlling authority and owner, and provided sanitary and health regulations or by-laws applying to the area in which the caravan or vehicle is used, are complied with.

2. If any person shall by act or omission contravene by-law 1 of this by-law he shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty.—Not exceeding twenty pounds, and in addition a daily penalty of two pounds for every day or part of a day where the offence is in the nature of a continuing offence.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. By inserting new regulations and a new heading after regulation 52, to stand as regulations 53 and 54, and headed "Division VII," as follows:—

Division VII.

53. Where, under section 12B of the Act, the Minister directs that a poll shall be taken of the owners or occupiers of orchards registered under the provisions of the Act within any district for or against the proposed introduction within such district of a compulsory fruit fly foliage baiting scheme, the manner in which and the conditions under which such poll may be taken shall be as follows:—

(a) The Minister shall appoint a returning officer and such deputy returning officers and other officers as he may deem necessary for the conduct of the poll.

(b) A special roll of such owners or occupiers shall be prepared by the Under Secretary for Agriculture or a person appointed by him for that purpose, and only owners or occupiers registered within such district shall be entitled to be enrolled thereon.

(c) (i) Where any owner or occupier eligible for enrolment on the special roll is a limited liability company or other corporate body, the board of directors or other management authority thereof may authorise any director, trustee or other member of such board or management authority or its manager, secretary or other officer (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be on the special roll) to represent the company or other body aforesaid as a voter, and, upon receipt of an application for enrolment from such representative, together with a certificate in

writing of such authority aforesaid under the hand of the managing director of the company or the president or chairman of the management authority of such other corporate body, as the case may be, such representative person may be enrolled on the special roll in accordance with his application.

(ii) In the case of a partnership, either one of the partners but not more than one at any one time may apply for enrolment and be enrolled on the special roll upon which the partnership is entitled to be enrolled.

(iii) No person shall be entitled to be enrolled on the special roll more than once, whether as a voter in his own right or as the representative of a limited liability company or other corporate body, or as a partner in a partnership or otherwise.

(d) The Minister shall decide the date the roll shall close and the place or places at which the poll shall be held, and such date and place or places shall be published at least fourteen days before the date fixed for the taking of the poll in a newspaper circulating in the district in which the poll is to be taken.

(e) At the poll a resolution shall be submitted to the owners or occupiers aforesaid in the form of a question as follows:—

Do you vote that a Compulsory Fruit Fly Foliage Baiting Scheme should be introduced within this District?

Such question shall be completed by inserting in the space left blank the word "Yes" or "No" as the case may be and the voting shall be according to the form in the Fifth Schedule of these regulations.

(f) An owner or occupier may record his vote by post before a postal vote officer appointed in such capacity under the Electoral Act and at the Chief Electoral Office, Perth: Provided such elector would have been qualified to record his vote by post if the poll under this regulation for which he claims to vote by post had been a Parliamentary election, and provided also that voting by post is permissible only within the district for which the poll is being taken.

(g) The method of conducting the poll and the manner of voting thereat shall be, as far as practicable, in accordance with the provisions of the Electoral Act, 1907, as amended.

(h) The result of the poll shall be notified by the returning officer to the Minister and shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and such notification shall be conclusive evidence of such result and of the regularity of all antecedent proceedings and of due compliance with all necessary conditions.

(i) The fees payable to returning officers, presiding officers, assistant presiding officers and poll clerks for their services in connection with the taking of any poll under this regulation shall be—

Returning Officer—£7. Provided that the Returning Officer shall be paid an additional fee of five shillings per hour whilst engaged in the scrutiny and count of votes.

Presiding Officer and Assistant Presiding Officer—£2. Provided that presiding officers and assistant presiding officers required to assist at the scrutiny and count of votes shall be paid for such services at the rate of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per hour.

Poll Clerk—£1 5s.

(j) The fees and expenses incurred in conducting any poll under this regulation shall be borne by the Fruit Fly Eradication Trust Fund.

54. The fees payable to each of the members, with the exception of the Chairman, of a Committee appointed under section 12C of the Act shall be as follows:—

(a) If the meeting of the Committee occupies a whole day, or the afternoon and evening of the same day, a sitting fee of £1 1s. for every such day; or

(b) if such meeting occupies a morning, afternoon or evening only or any portion thereof, a sitting fee of 10s. 6d.

NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT, 1924-1939.

Destruction and Prevention of Noxious Weeds.—
By-laws.

THE Narembeen Road Board acting pursuant to section 26 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, do hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

Narembeen Road Board.

Destruction of Noxious Weeds.

1. (1) Every owner and every occupier of land within the district of the Narembeen Road Board upon which any noxious weeds are growing or present shall

take one or more of the following alternative acts to destroy such noxious weeds, and shall diligently continue to take and do the same until all such noxious weeds have been destroyed:—

(a) Pull all such noxious weeds from the ground by hand, or—

(b) Sever all such noxious weeds below the surface of the ground by means of a suitable grubbing implement used by hand, or

(c) Cultivate the ground by means of an implement which will sever such noxious weeds below the ground level, or

(d) Plough the ground to a depth to be fixed in each case by the Board, or

(e) Break or cut such noxious weeds at or immediately above the surface of the ground by means of a suitable roller, mowing machine or reaping and binding machine, or

(f) In cases where the plants are dry and there is suitable herbage cover, burn such noxious weeds by means of running fire, or,

(g) Carry out any other method approved by the Board.

(2) The Local Inspector appointed by the Board under the said Act may by notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any land within the said district require him to take any particular measures or do any particular act mentioned in the last preceding paragraph to destroy noxious weeds growing or being on the land owned or occupied by him, and he shall forthwith take or do the same without having the alternatives mentioned in such paragraph.

(3) Every owner and every occupier of land within the said district shall immediately after any noxious weeds on such land have been removed from the ground or detached from their roots, gather the same into rows or heaps and burn them immediately they are sufficiently dry for that purpose, except in such cases when the Board has given written approval for them to be handled in some other manner.

(4) Any person who commits any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Prevention of Noxious Weeds.

2. (1) No owner or occupier of land within the district shall—

(a) Introduce any stock or farm produce from any place infested with noxious weeds or—

(b) Remove stock or farm produce from any place infested with noxious weeds within the district to any other place within or without the district.

Unless such person obtains and produces to the Board an Inspector's Certificate certifying that such stock or produce is free from the seeds of any noxious weeds.

(2) Any owner or occupier of land who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, unless he prove to the satisfaction of the Court—

(a) That a certificate of an inspector was immediately previously obtained in respect of such stock or produce to the effect that such stock or produce was free from the seeds of any noxious weed;

(b) That the said stock or produce was removed or went or was taken beyond the limits of the holding without his knowledge and that he had taken all reasonable means to prevent the same from being removed or going or being taken beyond such limits.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 9 of 1947.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Nutted Tyres (1928), W.A. Ltd., and Sinclair's Tyre Service Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed by the employers in the tyre repair and retreading industry. Provided that it shall not apply to any worker who is at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941.

2.—Area.

This Award shall operate over that portion of the State South of the 26th parallel of latitude and West of the 123rd degree of longitude.

3.—Wages.

- (d) Leading hands shall be paid one shilling and eightpence (1s. 8d.) per day in addition to the ordinary wage.

4.—Contract of Service.

One (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, and wages in such a case shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

5.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one (1) week.

6.—Term.

This Award shall operate from its date and shall remain in force for one (1) year.

7.—Posting Award and Union Notices.

The shop steward shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award or any notice of the Union not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notice shall be posted.

8.—Times and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a record containing the following particulars:—

- The name of each worker.
- The class of work performed.
- The hours worked each day.
- The wages (and overtime, if any) paid.
- The age of each junior worker.

Such record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union.

9.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a Chairman and two representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to the Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of—

- adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;

(ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

10.—Meal Money.

When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof: Provided that such payment need not be made to any worker residing in the same locality as his place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.

11.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked at the option of the employer in five or five and one-half days.

(b) Except in the case of shift work, the hours prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause may be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., on five days in the week, excluding Sunday, and between 7.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on the day upon which the weekly half-holiday is observed: Provided that nothing in this subclause shall apply to the man attending the boiler.

(c) The ordinary day's work shall not, in the case of establishments which work a five and one-half day week, exceed eight hours on five days in the week, excluding Sunday, and four hours on the day upon which the weekly half-holiday is observed. Where a five-day week is worked, the ordinary day's work should not exceed eight hours forty-eight minutes.

(d) In the event of the Court delivering a decision reducing the standard hours to be worked in industry in Western Australia, liberty is reserved to the Union to apply for an amendment of this clause.

12.—Overtime.

All time worked outside the ordinary hours of work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

13.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to subclause (c) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Any worker required to work on Sunday or on any of the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause shall be paid at double-time rates.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave, as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker (other than a casual worker) shall be entitled to payment, for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of the calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

15.—First Aid Kit.

An adequate first-aid kit shall be provided on the job by the employer.

16.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

17.—Shift Work.

Workers employed on afternoon or night shift shall be paid at the rate of 5 per cent. in addition to their ordinary wage.

18.—Casual Workers.

Casual workers, namely workers employed for less than one week, shall be paid 10 per cent. in addition to the ordinary rates.

19.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one (1) junior to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) adult workers employed: Provided that this clause shall not operate or be construed as to require the discharge of any person employed in the industry at the date of this Award.

20.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Award shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.
