WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 142 of the Health Act, 1911-1944 (as reprinted pursuant to the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938) that no building shall, after the commencement of the said Act, be erected within any municipal district unless and until plans and specification thereof have, before the commencement of such building, been submitted by the owner or occupier to, and have been approved, in relation to ventilation, lighting and sanitary construction, and also as to the area of the open space appurtenant to such building by the local authority; and whereas it is further enacted inter alia by subsection (2) of the said section 142 that the Governor may from time to time declare by proclamation that the said subsection (1) shall apply in any other district or in any portion of any other district and while such declaration remains in force the said subsection (1) shall apply to such district or portion as if it were a municipal district; and whereas it is now desired that the said subsection (1) of the said section 142 shall apply to all townsites, millsites and other communities, other than farms, within the Manjimup Health District constituted under the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said Act, do hereby declare that the said subsection (1) of the said section 142 shall apply to all townsites, millsites and other communities other than farms, within the said Manjimup Health District.

WHEREAS, by section 11A of the Medical Act, 1894-1946, the Governor may, on being satisfied that the residents of any area are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare such area to be a region within the meaning of the said section 11A, and may in like manner, alter any area aforesaid or revoke such proclamation; and whereas the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, having been satisfied that the Ashburton Road District and the West Kimberley Road District were areas not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, did by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of January, 1948, declare the said districts to be regions within the meaning of section 11A of the Act; and whereas a duly registered medical practitioner having been appointed for the Ashburton Road District, it is now desired to revoke that part of the proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th January, 1948, relating to the Ashburton region: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that that portion of the proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th January, 1948, declaring the Ashburton Road District to be a region within the meaning of section 11A of the Medical Act, 1894-1946, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1947, that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Saturday, the 6th day of November, 1948, from eight o'clock in the forenoon to one o'clock in the afternoon, shall be a public holiday within the Plumagenet Shop District for the purpose of section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1947, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule) and warehouses shall be closed.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 17th day of June, 1948, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas the Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited, of 179a St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such subject to the said section, and having made application in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section 10, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by it, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth Government Securities of the value of Five Thousand Pounds (£5,000): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the Company, the said The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944, for a period of two years commencing on and including the 1st day of March, 1948.

LAND AND INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT,
1907-1936.

Land Tax—Notice to Make Returns.

NOTICE is hereby given that every person who was at noon on the 30th day of June, 1948, the owner, within the meaning of the said Act, of any land whatsoever in Western Australia and who is liable to land tax, is hereby required to make and furnish to me at the office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, on or before the 31st day of August, 1948, a land tax return in the prescribed form.

A return form GA in lieu of return form A should be lodged by a land owner (not liable for Federal land tax) who has bought or sold land or who has effected or varied improvements on land since 30th June, 1947. Where there have been no such changes, a further return will not be required.

Penalty for not furnishing a return—not less than £2 nor more than £100. Penalty for making a false return—not less than £2 nor more than £100 and treble tax.

Taxpayers may obtain return forms at the Taxation Department, Perth, or at any Post Office in Western Australia.

THE humble Petition of the undersigned sheweth as follows:—

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 13 of 1948.

(Registered 26/4/1948.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this second day of January, 1948, between The Adelaide Steamship Company Limited and The Swan River Shipping Company Limited (hereinafter called "the employer"), of the one part and The Coastal Dock, Rivers and Harbour Works Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1. That clause 7 of Agreement No. 4 of 1946, be deleted and that the following clause be substituted in lieu thereof:—

Clause 7—Time Off Duty.

(a) In lieu of Saturdays and Sundays, members of the crew to be allowed off duty for four intervals of 24 consecutive hours (midnight to midnight) in each 14 days. Saturdays or Sundays not worked to be counted amongst such intervals. Any of such intervals not given shall be paid for on the basis of eight hours at time and a half.

(b) Any Saturday on which the crew are not required to be on duty after 1 p.m., shall count as one of such intervals, subject to the following conditions:—

(1) For all work performed prior to 1 p.m., payment to be made at the rate of time and a half, with a minimum of four hours, except in the case of fireman and greaser raising steam who shall be allowed one hour additional.

(2) Notification of intention to treat a Saturday, on which the crew are not expected to be required to be on duty after 1 p.m., as such an interval off duty to be given not later than knock-off time on the previous working day.

(3) If after notification of the intention to treat such a Saturday as an interval off duty it is found necessary to cancel this notification and such cancellation is not made prior to knock-off time on the previous working day, all duty performed prior to 1 p.m., shall nevertheless be paid for at time and a half, but for all duty performed thereafter the same rates to be payable as if no such notification had ever been given.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding subclauses, no member of the crew shall be required to be on duty for more than six consecutive days (including any Saturday treated as being an interval off duty, as provided under subclause 'B' hereof), before being allowed to be off duty for at least one day.

(d) In lieu of customary waterside holidays, viz., New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Union Picnic Day (which, so far as they may be allowed off, are to count amongst the four intervals to be allowed off duty in each 14 days, as provided in subclause (a) hereof), members of the crew who have served continuously for one year to be allowed off duty for 16 intervals of 24 consecutive hours on full pay, or if they should have served for any shorter period, not being less than one month for a proportionate number of such intervals, the actual time at which such intervals to be allowed off to be a matter for mutual arrangement.

2. This Agreement shall come into force as on and from the 2nd January, 1948.

3. This Industrial Agreement shall be read in conjunction with Industrial Agreement No. 4 of 1946, dated the 1st July, 1946.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 12 of 1948.

(Registered 26/4/48.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this twenty-third day of December, 1947, between The Association of Employers of Waterside Labour, W.A. (Inc.), The Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust and the State Shipping Service of the one part and the Coastal Dock, Rivers and Harbour Works Union of Workers of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

The following wages and working conditions shall apply to members of the above Union employed as watchmen on or about ships or wharves at the Port of Fremantle in the State of Western Australia.

2.—Rates of Pay.

Basic Wage, £5 10s. 9d. per week.

Gangway watchmen—3s. per hour between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.

Inflammable liquids in containers, watchmen—3s. 3d. per hour between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.

Petrol tanker watchmen—3s. 6d. per hour between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.

Cargo watchmen—Basic general cargo rates payable to waterside workers, exclusive of any other conditions or payments with exception payment for working during meal hours.

3.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Where work is to be continued throughout the period of 24 hours, and sufficient competent labour is available, shifts to be worked:—

7 a.m. to 3 p.m.
3 p.m. to 11 p.m.
11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

(b) For work commencing at 4 p.m., subject to sufficient competent labour being available, shifts to be worked 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. with relief from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

4.—After 11 p.m. on Sundays, Holidays, etc.

For work between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., and also throughout Sundays and holidays, an additional 6d. to be paid to the rate otherwise payable.

5.—Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays:—
New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day (to be held on the same day as that of the Fremantle Branch of the Waterside Workers' Federation), Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

6.—Minimum Period of Engagement.

(a) Upon engagement and for each day of his employment, a watchman shall be entitled to a minimum of four hours pay at the rate appropriate to the work for which he was engaged, provided that:—

(i) If a cargo watchman is unable to continue or commence work owing to rain or boisterous weather, any standing by time to be paid for at ordinary rates, but if the period is between midnight and 6 a.m., the minimum period shall be two hours at the appropriate rate and two hours ordinary rate.

(ii) For both cargo and gangway watchmen waiting for the arrival of a ship to which they have been ordered, shall be paid at all times at ordinary rate.

(b) Upon engagement, the employer shall state a definite starting time for which the employee is required.

7.—Ferry Service to North Wharf.

When employed at the North Wharf, free ferry service to be provided.

8.—Pick-up Arrangements.

(a) All labour shall be engaged at the recognised pick up place between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. each day except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

(b) Labour required to commence work between the hours of 7.45 a.m. on Fridays and 7.45 a.m. Mondays shall be engaged at the Friday pick up.

(c) The Union shall maintain a register of unemployed watchmen who are available for the purpose of meeting emergency requirements outside of pick up hours. The employer shall secure from this register of unemployed members such labour as is required, provided he is satisfied as to the competency of the men for the particular job or jobs to be filled.

9.—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between the parties to this Agreement the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference consisting of a representative of the employers and a representative of the employees and the Registrar of the Court of Arbitration who shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final.

10.—Term.

This Agreement, which shall operate as from and including the 1st January, 1948, and shall continue in force for a period of twelve months thereafter.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 4 of 1948.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Hume Pipe Co. (Aust.) Ltd., Respondent.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court, now therefore the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declare the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

1.—Scope.

This agreement shall apply to work performed by workers employed by the Hume Pipe Co. (Aust.) Ltd., who are carrying out the occupations set out in Clause 22 of this agreement and who are eligible to belong to the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers.

2.—Area.

This agreement shall have application throughout that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division.

3.—Term.

This agreement shall apply for a period of one (1) year from its date.

4.—Casual Hands.

- (a) A casual hand shall mean a worker who is engaged for a period of less than one (1) week.
- (b) Casual hands shall be paid for the particular work upon which they may be employed at an hourly rate enalculated on the rate of pay prescribed in Clause 21 hereof, plus ten per centum (10%).
- (c) Casual workers shall be paid within one (1) hour of their services being terminated.

5.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly and during working hours.

6.—Hours.

(a) Day Workers.—Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) days of eight (8) hours each between Monday and Friday inclusive: Provided that the time of beginning and ceasing work may be arranged by mutual agreement between the Union and the employer with the intent that the workers in the various sections of the industry may be usefully and economically employed within their hours of duty. If no agreement is arrived at the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(b) Shift Workers.—The ordinary hours of shift workers, inclusive of crib time, shall not exceed forty (40) per week, or when two (2) shifts are worked, eighty (80) hours in two (2) weeks, or when three (3) shifts are worked, one hundred and twenty (120) hours in three (3) weeks at the option of the employer, to be worked in rotary shifts, not exceeding eight (8) hours on Monday to Friday inclusive.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed outside the ordinary hours of duty on any day shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work performed on Sunday or on any of the holidays prescribed in Clause 8 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained herein—

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Agreement or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this sub-clause.

(iii) This sub-clause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

8.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to Clause 4, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

9.—Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages record in which shall be entered the following particulars:—

- (a) The name of each worker;
- (b) The occupation of each worker;
- (c) The hours worked by each worker each day and each week;
- (d) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid each week.

The said record shall be open for inspection by the secretary or an accredited representative of the Union at the office of the employer during working hours upon reasonable notice being given of the desire to inspect same.

10.—Higher Duties.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher rate than his ordinary rate up to four (4) hours in any shift shall be paid such higher rate for the actual time so employed. If more than four (4) hours is occupied on such work in any one shift, the worker shall be paid the higher rate as for the whole shift.

11.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;

(ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

12.—Change House.

The employer shall provide all necessary sanitary accommodation, change rooms for workers, bathroom and shelter sheds or other suitable accommodation, and a sufficient supply of boiling water for workers at meal times. In so far as this clause may involve structural alterations or additions it shall remain in abeyance for three (3) months from the date hereof.

13.—Kerosene and Waste.

A sufficient supply of kerosene and waste shall be provided by the employer for the use of workers.

14.—First Aid.

An adequate first aid kit shall be provided in each factory by the employer.

15.—Country Work.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat when saloon fares shall be paid.

(b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(e) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four hour period, from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

16.—Wet Places.

(a) Workers while working in wet places shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the rate prescribed.

(i) "Wet places" shall mean places where the water is over the workers' ankles or top of gum boots when provided, or where in performing the work, the splashing of the water and mud saturates their clothing or where protection is not provided to prevent splashes or drippings sufficient to saturate their clothing.

(ii) The management shall decide whether a place is a "wet place" within the meaning of this clause.

(iii) If any dispute arises as to whether or not a place is a "wet place" the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(b) Workers while working in "wet places" shall be provided by the employer with gum boots or other suitable boots.

(c) Waterproof coats shall be supplied to workers working in the rain or under sprinklers.

(d) Suitable boots shall be supplied to workers engaged in mixing and moulding.

17.—Shift Work.

(a) A worker, other than a day shift worker, shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate prescribed for his class of work.

(b) Liberty is reserved to the Union to apply for an amendment of this Clause in the event of the Court delivering a decision increasing the standard loading payable to shift workers in Western Australia.

18.—Protectors for Hands.

Rubber gloves or other suitable hand protectors shall be supplied when required to workers working as moulders, men handling slabs and pipes, reinforcement wires and pipe jointers. Leather gloves shall be provided for mixers. The worker shall be required to exercise care in the use and custody of these articles and to deliver them at the end of the shift at such place and in such manner as may be required by the employer.

19.—Contract of Service.

(a) Subject to any provisions to the contrary herein contained the contract of service shall be a weekly one.

(b) Notice of termination of the contract of service may be given on any day during the week to terminate on the corresponding day of the succeeding week or any later day thereof.

(c) Unless otherwise herein provided a worker shall not be entitled to payment for any day during which he is absent from work.

(d) This clause shall not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such cases wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

20.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to forty (40) hours in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absentee is for three (3) days or more.

21.—Wages.

(d) A junior worker under 17 years of age shall not be engaged lifting a greater weight than 40 lbs. at one time.

22.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

The proportion of junior workers to fully paid adult workers covered by this Agreement shall not exceed one (1) junior worker to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) adult workers in each factory.

23.—Working in Meal Hours.

Work done in the meal time or any portion thereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time, but this shall not apply to cases involving the completion of work commenced before the lunch period and not occupying more than fifteen (15) minutes from the commencement of the lunch period, in which case the lunch period would be extended by fifteen (15) minutes beyond the ordinary time. In the event of a mishap the said period of fifteen (15) minutes may be increased to forty-five (45) minutes.

24.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

25.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work from any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

26.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish an employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Date of birth.

In the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated in the certificate a breach of this agreement shall not be deemed to have been committed by the employer and the worker shall have no claim upon the employer for additional pay.

I certify pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

Between Coastal Dock, Rivers and Harbour Works Union of Workers, Appellant, and The Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all employees directly engaged or acting as deck hands or firemen on any of the employer's launches, and the area covered shall be all the sea and coastline within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the North Mole Lighthouse, and in addition, the Swan River to and including Perth Water and the Canning River to Lower Canning Bridge.

2.—Definitions.

"Shift or Shifts" means a period of eight (8) consecutive hours worked in reliefs of two or three, as may be required by the Commissioners.

"Employee" means any person employed under the provisions of this Award.

"Wages" includes overtime payment.

"Employer" means the Fremantle Harbour Trust and includes the Commissioners constituted under the Act and in the office for the time being.

"Harbour Master" means the Harbour Master for Fremantle appointed by the Commissioners.

3.—Hours of Duty.

(a) 1. Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. Except as provided in paragraph (e) hereof the ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight (8) hours per day on five days of the week.

2. The employer may require any employee to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such employee shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

3. The Union or employee or employees covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to, or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

4. This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

(b) The hours per week may be worked on any day of the week at the discretion of the employers, and during the continuance of the present system of shifts shall be worked as under:—

Day shift. 7 a.m. - 3 p.m.

Afternoon shift: 3 p.m. - 11 p.m.

Night shift: 11 p.m. - 7 a.m.

(c) For the purpose of this Award the week's work shall be deemed to commence at 3 p.m. on Sundays, and to conclude at 3 p.m. on the following Sunday. The weekly change of shifts shall take place at the completion of the day shift on Sundays, when the watch which finished night shift that morning shall resume on the afternoon shift that day, and shall in turn be relieved by the watch which performed the day shift that day: Provided that the extra shift thus worked on Sundays to enable the rotation of shifts shall not be regarded as overtime, but as part of the ensuing week's ordinary work: Provided further that the present arrangements of shifts to which this paragraph solely relates may be altered by agreement between the parties.

(d) Employees shall be allowed to relieve one another to suit their convenience to catch trains or trams, so long as the full shift is maintained at all times.

4.—Rates of Pay.

(b) The above margins include 6s. per week, which shall be regarded as compensation for shift work.

(c) Wages shall be payable weekly.

(d) Where a deck hand is called upon for any reason to perform the work of a fireman for a period of two hours or more in any shift, he shall be paid at fireman's rates for the whole of that shift. Where the period is less than two hours, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

(e) All wages due shall be payable at 2.30 o'clock p.m. on Friday in each week.

(f) Wages may be payable on the written order of the employee to the person named in such order, and the Commissioners by paying to such order shall be relieved of all responsibility on obtaining the signature of the person named in the said order.

5.—Sunday Time and Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall mean and include all time worked outside of, or in excess of, the ordinary working hours in any shift, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) The time worked on Sundays up to a maximum of eight (8) hours shall be included in the ordinary week's work but employees required to work on Sundays, other than those finishing a shift commenced earlier than 11 p.m. on the preceding Saturday, or employees commencing duty at 11 p.m. on Sunday, shall be paid an extra half day's pay in addition to the week's earnings, provided that this payment shall be deemed to have been complied with by the addition of 6 per cent. to the ordinary weekly wage of forty (40) hours' work, it being agreed that the amount so arrived at represents the average weekly payment during the year for Sunday work.

6.—Engagement and Dismissal.

(a) Except for casual employees, all employment shall be by the week, and a week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate such employment, or the employer shall pay one week's wages in lieu of such notice.

(b) The engagement of employees may be made by the Harbour Master or his deputy at the recognised pick up place at the shelter shed adjacent to the Pilot Office, between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 9 a.m. on any week day. Should it be necessary to fill any vacancy urgently and outside the above hours, the man or men required may be picked up at any place convenient to the Harbour Master or his deputy: Provided that notification shall be sent forthwith to the

secretary of the Union as to the man or men so engaged, the Harbour Master or his deputy shall at all times retain the right of free selection among members of the Union, provided same are available.

(c) The employer shall not discriminate, without just cause, against any member of the Union who bears good conduct record, and who agrees to continue to work under the terms of this Award, and for whom there is a vacancy, and the employer shall consider any representations made to them by the Secretary of the Union.

(d) In cases where an employee misconducts himself, the employer shall have the right to dismiss him instantly.

7.—Crib Time.

The Pilot service shall operate continuously (or as directed by the employers) during each shift without cessation for a recognised meal hour provided that each employee shall be allowed twenty (20) minutes between 4½ hours and 6½ hours after the commencement of a shift in which to have his meal: Provided further that when the Pilot boats are engaged upon any pilotage service, the aforementioned break for crib may be taken at any time between 3½ hours and 6½ hours from the commencement of any shift. In the event of the requirements of the service being such that the break for crib cannot be taken during the appropriate period specified herein, the employees shall receive a special payment of 5s.

8.—Change Room.

A change room shall be provided, as heretofore, by the employers to allow of employees changing their clothes or taking their meals when ashore.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) An employee who serves the employers continuously for a period of 12 months shall be allowed leave of absence on full pay, as soon thereafter as convenient to the service, for a continuous period of one calendar month of 30 days.

(b) If he serves continuously for one month or more and not for one year, he shall be entitled to payment in lieu of leave, at the rate of two and a half days for each completed month of service.

(c) The employers shall give at least 24 hours' notice to each employee of their intention to give the employee his leave of absence, and his wages for the leave period shall be paid, together with all other moneys due, prior to his going on leave.

10.—Sickness and Accident When on Duty.

(a) If in the course of his employment an employee engaged under this Award, whilst on duty or whilst acting under the instructions of the employer, receives an injury or contracts any sickness arising out of or in the course of his employment he shall be entitled to receive the wages prescribed in this Award from the date of his said incapacity up to and including the date of his recovery, as certified by his medical attendant. Provided that the maximum period of payment under this clause shall not exceed three months of 30 days each.

(b) The illness or injury which so entitles the employee to the benefits provided for in this clause shall be suffered while on duty and shall be:—

1. Such as wholly to incapacitate him from performing his duty.

2. So far as can be ascertained, an illness or injury contracted or sustained whilst on duty in the service of the employer: Provided that, if the illness or injury is due to his own wilful act or to his misbehaviour, the employee shall not be entitled to the benefits provided in this clause.

(c) In the case of an accident suffered while on duty the expenses of providing the necessary medicines, surgical and medical advice and attendance shall be paid by the employer without any deduction from the wages on that account until the employee is certified as recovered by his medical attendant: Provided that the aggregate amount so paid shall not exceed the amount that would have been paid had such payment been made under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

(d) All wages payable under this claim to the employee while sick or injured shall be paid on Fridays of each week and as provided in Clause 4.

11.—Sick Leave.

(a) An employee who is incapacitated through sickness or injury, other than that arising out of or in the course of his employment, may, except as provided in subclause (b) of this Award, be granted sick leave with pay for a period of or periods not exceeding in the aggregate, four weeks in any year, upon production, within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence, of a medical certificate showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.

(b) In the event of the full period of sick leave as provided in subclause (a) hereof not being taken in any year, the balance of such sick leave up to a maximum of one week for each calendar year, shall be allowed to accumulate, and such accumulation may be applied against periods of absence on account of sickness in excess of that provided in subclause (a) hereof, occurring during the next or any succeeding year: Provided that in respect of any worker employed under the terms of this Award at the date of its commencement, the accumulation of such leave specified herein shall be regarded as operating retrospectively from the 1st January, 1945, or at the date the employee entered the service if employment commenced after that date.

(c) Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or a medical certificate is not furnished as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay in accordance with the provisions of subclauses (a) and (b) hereof, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.

(d) Upon the period or periods of absence exceeding four weeks in the case of paragraph (a) hereof, or upon the happening or occurrence of any of the events specified in paragraph (c) hereof, immediately such absence commences or such event happens or occurs the contract of service shall be deemed to have been terminated without requiring further notice by the employers, who shall thereby be relieved of any further obligation to the employee: Provided that any such period of incapacity may at the discretion of the employers, be regarded as leave without pay.

12.—Long Service Leave.

Employees shall be granted three months' long service leave after each seven years' service, but periods of absence on long service leave shall not count as service qualifying towards the next grant of such leave.

13.—Rate of Pay When on Leave, etc.

Employees on annual, long service or sick leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 9, 11 and 12 of this Award, or absent from duty during a period of incapacity resulting from sickness or accident arising out of or in the course of employment in circumstances provided for in clause 10 of this Award shall receive the same weekly remuneration as is payable for the usual week's work of 42 hours.

14.—Uniforms.

The employers shall provide for the use of each employee, free of cost, one cap and one serge suit, on the completion of each eight months' continuous service, and one oilskin coat and sou'-wester hat each year. One suit of dungarees shall also be supplied to employees on the completion of the following periods of service, viz., deck hands—each eight months; firemen—each six months. Uniforms shall belong to the employers, to be worn on service, and shall be kept clean and tidy. Should the service of any employee terminate within one month of the date of issue of uniforms or any portion of same, all the issue last made shall be returned to the employers before the employee is paid any moneys which may be due to him.

15.—Casual Employees.

(a) A casual employee is one who is engaged in the temporary capacity, and the contract of service in respect of such employee shall be a daily one. The services of casual employees may be terminated at any time without previous notice.

(b) The daily rates of pay for casual employees shall be:—(1) For the first 14 consecutive working days—one fifth of the rates prescribed in clause 13 hereof, plus 10 per cent.; (2) Thereafter—one fifth of the rates prescribed in clause 13:

(c) A casual employee shall be entitled to annual leave in accordance with clause 9 hereof, but shall not be entitled to any issue of uniform.

16.—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between the employees and the employers, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference, consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the Union and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agreement, the Registrar of the Arbitration Court of Western Australia shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding.

17.—Term.

This Award shall come into force from the date of its delivery, and shall continue for a period of twelve months therefrom.

I certify pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this 21st day of April, 1948, between Electricity and Gas Department of the City of Perth, Municipal Council, and Fremantle Gas & Coke Company, on the one part, and the Metropolitan Gas Works Union of Workers, on the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

Men engaged discharging coal from railway trucks in Perth: Casual rates to apply to all these men.

Labourers: Basic wage.

A rate will be paid for service men and gas fitters on the basis of—where a man is employed for eight (8) hours on service, four (4) hours on maintenance, and twenty-eight (28) hours on gas fitting, he shall be paid £8 4s. 9d. per week. Wartime loading and industry money are included in this amount.

“Industry Money.”—In addition to the wages prescribed in this Agreement “Industry Money” shall be paid at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per week to all workers covered by this Agreement, with the exclusion of the workers enumerated in clauses 12 and 20 hereof and men discharging coal from railway trucks.

“Service money.”—Service money shall be payable to all men (except fitters) employed over ten years at the rate of 3s. per week.

“Relief Retort Operator.”—Is to be paid retort operator's (shift work) rate for the full week.

“Shift workers.”—Shift workers are to receive 5 per cent. increase on the wage rate ruling for afternoon shift; for the night shift they are to receive a ten per cent. (10 per cent.) increase on their wage rate. Relief shift to work shift hours when not employed on their usual occupation.

(a) “Leading hand.”—Leading hand herein means, one who has in any degree, control, supervision, direction of three or more other workers, shall be paid two shillings per day above the ordinary rate of pay for such work (this shall include one man on the regular gang being so designated and paid while in charge on the purifiers while they are being emptied or filled).

(b) “Leading hand” (being a tradesman) in charge of three (3) or more tradesmen or six (6) or more workers shall be paid 2s. 6d. per day above the rate prescribed for his trade.

Gas workers plumber's rate to be paid in the following cases:—

(a) For fixing meters of 700 cubic feet and upwards. On altering position of cooker jobs, when renewing pipe which involves screwing and cutting.

(b) In the case of men on meter lorries, should they be working as fitters, that is, screwing, cutting and fitting, for over four hours in any one day they shall be paid the gas workers plumber's rate for that day.

(c) Fixing meters and fixing stoves which does not involve cutting or screwing is not to be included to make up four (4) hours.

(d) The gas workers plumber's rate starts at the building line, less one-half hour for fixing or fitting meters.

“Working inside boilers, etc.”—Men engaged inside the gas, tar, or water space at any boiler, or inside the boiler flue in cleaning or scraping work, or in tar stills, tar tanks, super heaters, carburettors (water gas plant) after such vessels have been in commission, cleaning off and removing the residue therefrom, shall be paid a margin of sixpence (6d.) per hour on existing rate of pay when so engaged.

“Men cleaning tar tanks of the waterless holder only.”—Shall be paid a margin of two shillings (2s.) per day when so engaged.

“Man in charge operating pan-ash washer.”—Shall be paid a margin of 2s. per day.

“Man in charge of men on coke screening machine at Perth Gas Works,” shall be paid a margin of 2s. per day.

“Working in wet ground.”—Any employee working in wet ground shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay. “Wet ground” means ground in which in the opinion of the engineer it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet, provided that where watertight boots are supplied by the management, there shall be no allowance for wet ground.

“Height Money.”—Any employee working on any temporary scaffolding, swinging stage, bosun's chair, or ladder, at a height of 40 feet or over from the ground shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the rate of pay for the job, providing he so works four hours or over in any one day. If he works less than four hours he shall be paid at the higher rate for the time of working only.

“Mixed functions.”—(a) Any employee required to do more than one class of work in any one day shall be paid at the higher rate for the day, provided he works for four hours or over at this rate, otherwise he shall be paid the higher rate only for the time so worked.

(b) If a higher rate is paid for over four hours in any one day, the rate to be paid when the worker is proceeding from one job to another shall be at the higher rate for that day.

2.—Provision of Oilskins.

Service men, all regular employees of the main-laying gangs complaint men, truck drivers, mates and coal gang shall be supplied with oilskins, leggings, coat and sou'-wester every two years. The worker shall be responsible for any loss or damage to same (ordinary wear and tear excepted) before the expiration of such period. If the worker leaves or is dismissed from his employment before the expiration of two years from the issue he shall return the oilskin, coat, leggings, and sou'-wester issued to him.

3.—Provision of Boots.

Boots will be issued by the department to all men whilst they are engaged on the purifiers and the tar filling plant, these boots are to be handed back each night by the men concerned, and will be kept by the department whilst not in use, under no circumstances are they to be taken away from the gas works.

4.—Travelling Allowance for Main Gangs and Outside Workers.

Where an employee commences work at starting time on the job incurs extra tram or railway fares over and above one fare each way, the extra amount of fare shall be refunded to him each week.

5.—Time Allowance outside the Two-mile Radius.

Employees working temporarily outside the two-mile radius of the Wellington Street Works, Perth; Gas Works, Fremantle; or Cottesloe Depot and not within two miles of their place of residence, shall be allowed one-half hour per day travelling time, without loss of pay, in addition to above travelling allowance, when required to report for work on the job.

6.—Hours.

(a) The hours of duty shall not, without payment of overtime, exceed forty (40) hours per week, and the hours of duty for any day shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed eight (8) hours. Provided also,

that if it is found necessary, arrangements may be made for employees to commence work earlier or later and finish earlier or later than the ordinary hours. Each shift to consist of eight (8) hours.

(b) A five (5) day week shall operate from the first pay period January, 1948, subject to a system of rostering for shift workers.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Payment shall be made for overtime at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours after the usual knock off time and double time thereafter.

(b) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two hours at overtime rates.

(c) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock off time, for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof. This provision shall not apply in case of emergency breakdown repairs.

(d) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(e) No organisation, party to this Agreement or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(f) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Comt.

8.—Shift Work.

(a) The hours of duty without the payment of overtime shall not, for shiftmen (except watchmen) exceed an average of forty (40) hours per week, to be worked in shifts not exceeding eight (8) hours each. Such shifts to be distributed as the employers choose, but so as to make an aggregate shift time on duty not exceeding one hundred and sixty (160) hours in each period of four (4) weeks.

(b) For all duty performed on his day off in the week, a shiftman shall be paid double time.

(c) For all time worked on a Sunday and holidays (not being his day off) the minimum ordinary rate for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half for a Saturday, but in the case of a holiday, it shall be doubled.

(d) In the case of a shiftman working on his day off at the request of another employee, the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate payable for the day or shift.

(e) A shiftman shall be deemed to be working on a continuous process.

(f) In the case of a man, after his usual day's work, being called on for Retort House work between 5 p.m. and 8 a.m. he will be paid at the rate of time and one-half, unless notified before 5 p.m. that he will be required for night shift.

9.—Holidays.

(a) Two week's annual leave will be granted on full pay annually after twelve months' service, leave not to be cumulative and to be taken at the discretion of the management so as to interfere with the routine of the works as little as possible.

(b) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(c) Retort operators and men engaged on shift work shall receive three working weeks (one hundred and twenty (120) hours) leave on full pay after twelve months' service.

(d) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-quarter of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(e) Men on the water gas plant and tar plant shall be classified as shift workers for annual holidays, when two or more shifts are being worked continuously per day.

(f) For the purpose of computing the wage to be paid to an employee for annual leave, the basic wage then in force shall be taken, plus the average of the shift worker's marginal earnings for the period of employment for which the leave is due, then add industry money where applicable.

(g) The following days shall be recognised as holidays and the usual rates of pay shall be paid for same:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Union Picnic Day and People's or Children's Show Day.

(h) Shift workers shall be paid one day's pay in lieu of the Union Picnic Day.

(i) Any days which are prescribed by the laws of the State to be observed in lieu of the holidays above mentioned will be treated as the days to which this holiday clause shall apply.

(j) All employees, other than shiftmen, shall be free from duty on holidays, without loss of pay for the day, but any employee may be required for duty on any Sunday or holiday and, if so required, shall be entitled to the ordinary rate for the time worked on holidays and double time for Sunday, the ordinary day's pay plus the holiday pay for the day.

(k) In the case of workers on mixed functions, for the named holidays, between the periods of annual leave, the employee shall be paid at the rate per day he was paid prior to taking annual leave.

10.—Casual Workers.

A worker employed for less than one working week shall be deemed to be a casual worker and shall be entitled to be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rate.

11.—Junior Workers.

(a) Junior worker is a person under the age of 21 years of age and shall be paid in accordance with the following scale:—

Between 16 and 17 years of age	40
Between 17 and 18 years of age	65
Between 18 and 19 years of age	80
Between 19 and 21 years of age	95

(b) At 16 years, a junior worker shall be paid industry money at the rate of sixpence (6d.) per week, then increased by sixpence per week each year until at 21 years he shall receive three shillings (3s.) per week industry money in addition to the rate prescribed in this Agreement.

(c) Junior workers must not be employed on work which requires the use of tradesmen's tools, or connecting meters or any gas appliances to the main.

12.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) Except as to casual workers, the employment is terminable on either side by one week's notice, given on any day, but for the first four days of employment the hiring shall be from hour to hour, and during this period an hour's notice or an hour's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) If a weekly worker absents himself from duty, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay.

(c) This clause does not affect the right for dismissal for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employers shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or the unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through any break down of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work, or by any such strike or break down which the employers cannot reasonably prevent.

13.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employers, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. Payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to forty (40) hours in each calendar year, provided that if a worker be not absent from his work owing to ill-health during any year such sick pay unused out of the balance of the forty (40) hours in any one year may be carried forward for five (5) succeeding years, there being one-twelfth of a week for every month of service. That is, any balance of forty (40) hours to be carried forward from the first to the second year, any balance of the eighty (80) hours to be carried forward from the second to the third year, any balance of the one hundred and twenty (120) hours carried forward from the third to the fourth year, any balance of the one hundred and sixty (160) hours to be carried forward from the fourth to the fifth year, any balance of the two hundred (200) hours to be carried forward from the fifth to the sixth year, with a maximum carry-forward of two hundred (200) hours. After the sixth year, and at any time the maximum sick pay shall be two hundred and forty (240) hours.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to the employers of sickness, but the employers shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absentee is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provisions shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

14.—Provisions.

Service layer's work to terminate within six feet of inside of building or street line.

15.—Maintenance Work.

Maintenance work shall not constitute gas fitter's work, unless it is found necessary to remove the fittings and replace them to repair a fault.

16.—Tools.

All tools required in connection with any work performed by the employees on behalf of the employers, to be provided by the employers, except small tools.

17.—Overalls or dust coats.

All employees of the E. & G. Department and fitters, complaint men and assistants of the Fremantle Gas & Coke Co., party to this agreement shall be supplied with two (2) pairs of overalls or dust-coats annually, after six months' continuous service.

18.

Plumbers, carpenters, blacksmiths, fitters and turners, and other trades provided for under the various Federal and State Awards are not included in this Agreement.

19.—Membership of Union.

All new employees joining the service of the employers and employed under this Agreement shall, within fourteen (14) days make application to join the union which is party to this Agreement, except that this provision shall not apply to University students or casual workers.

19A.

It is agreed that, in the event of any strike or similar action against any other employer, the union party to this Agreement will not allow its members in the service of the employers to be involved directly or indirectly in the withdrawal of their labour from the normal activities of the employers.

20.—Promotion.

Before any promotion to a vacancy shall be made, consideration as to the qualifications of each man shall be given. Any man for promotion who considers he has been penalised shall have the right of appeal to the engineer or general manager with a representative of the union.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

21.—Washing Facilities.

The employer shall provide for workers at the works in the industry, facility for washing (hot showers and wash basin) and soap suitable as a solvent for removing tar and grease.

22.—Settlement of Disputes.

(a) Should any question or dispute arise regarding this agreement or any matter not provided herein, it shall be referred to a representative of the employers and of the union, who shall meet and endeavour to effect a settlement.

(b) This clause shall not be taken to interfere with any rights of either of the parties to proceed for a penalty for a breach of this Agreement.

23.—Basic Wage.

The basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court being adopted as the standard in this Agreement, any variation of the basic wage declared by the Court will become the standard in this Agreement, and all other rates will be altered so as to preserve the margins shown in this Agreement.

24.—Locality of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to the whole of those areas in which the City of Perth Electricity and Gas Department of the City of Perth Municipal Council, and the Fremantle Gas and Coke Company Limited have the right to supply gas.

25.—Duration of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate for three years, and thereafter until superseded or varied subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration (State) at any time after the expiration of the first twelve (12) months to vary or amend this Agreement.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 62 of 1947.

Between The Western Australian Locomotive Engine-Drivers, Firemen and Cleaners' Union of Workers, Applicant, and The Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Interim Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

INTERIM AWARD.

Except where altered by the provisions of this Award, the provisions of Award No. 6 of 1943, as amended by Order No. 118 of 1945, now in force, shall continue to operate.

5.—Acting Work.

Subclause (1).—Delete present provision and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

(1) (a) A fireman or cleaner who has acted in the capacity of a driver or fireman, respectively, for 313 days shall be appointed to the higher grade, and the

date of such appointment shall, notwithstanding subsequent regression, be taken for the purpose of determining when advancements from class to class become due. To ascertain the number of days acting work performed by a worker, all acting work heretofore or hereafter shall be counted, and the total number of hours worked by him in the higher capacity up to 31st December, 1925, shall be divided by eight. From 1st January, 1926, to 3rd January, 1948, the total number of hours to be divided by seven and one-third, and from 4th January, 1948, the total number of hours to be divided by six and two-thirds.

(b) For the purpose of promotion all time worked on Sundays by locomotive drivers and firemen over and above the ordinary timetable trains shall be calculated as acting work.

12.—Hamper Allowance.

Subclause (e).—Delete existing provision and insert in lieu thereof:—

(e) Any worker notified between 6 p.m. and 10 a.m. of a "book off" job requiring him to come on duty between those hours shall receive an allowance of three shillings (3s.) in addition to ordinary expenses. This provision shall also apply to any worker notified of a "book off" job between 6 p.m. on the day preceding and 10 a.m. on the day following any public holiday on which grocery and butchers' shops are closed if required to come on duty between those hours. The provision shall also apply to any worker required to come on duty on a "book off" job between 12 noon Saturday and 10 a.m. Monday, unless the worker is notified or word left at his place of residence before 11 a.m. on the Saturday.

22.—Free Passes.

Subclause (1) (a).—Delete existing provision and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

(1) (a) After twelve (12) months' continuous service, workers shall be allowed annually free passes as specified hereunder:—All drivers and any ex-driver who has been regressed (either through reduction in the number of drivers or for physical disability); firemen who hold driver's certificate; wash-out men; packers and trimmers:—One first-class station to station pass on the

occasion of the annual and/or long service leave to cover the full term of leave due; two (2) first-class privilege passes from one given station to another and return. All other workers—one second-class station to station pass on the occasion of the annual and/or long service leave, to cover the full term of leave due: Provided that this pass may be changed to first class on payment by the worker of half the additional fare at ordinary rates; two (2) first class privilege passes from one given station to another and return, except during the Christmas, New Year and Easter holidays, when at the option of the Commissioner the passes may be issued as second class: Provided, however, that in the event of the worker, owing to domestic arrangements, desiring to return to his home, leaving his family at the holiday destination, the pass will be considered as available for return of the family, or a separate pass issued therefor. In addition to the worker the passes shall be available for his wife and members of his family under eighteen (18) years of age unmarried, unmarried daughters over eighteen (18) years of age and his parents, provided they are resident with and dependent upon him for support. A widower with his child or children resident with him and who regularly employs a housekeeper may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be granted passes for such housekeeper; in like manner, an unmarried worker supporting younger brothers and/or sisters may be granted passes for such housekeeper.

24.—Hours of Duty and Overtime Payments.

Subclause (k).—Delete existing provision and insert following in lieu thereof:—

(k) Two employees of the Commissioner (such workers to be members of, and to be nominated by, the Union) shall be permitted to attend the departmental half-yearly time table conferences as representatives of the Union, and may take part in any discussion as to whether any particular piece of night work involved in the proposed time table could be avoided. The workers so acting shall be paid by the Commissioner ordinary wages, travelling time and expenses as provided in this Award.

30.—Special Shift Duty.

Subclause (d).—Delete existing provision and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

(d) Cleaners working with shift drivers employed in marshalling engines at principal depots (Fremantle, Perth, Midland Junction, Northam, Merredin, Kalgoorlie, Geraldton, Bunbury, Narrogin), shall be paid firemen's rate of pay. This duty to be called "shift firing."

Insert now subclause (i):—

(i) Cleaners regularly employed operating the steam cleaning plant and required to maintain steam and water in boiler shall be paid minimum rate for fireman whilst so employed. Such time shall not be regarded as acting time as fireman. For the purpose of this subclause, "regularly employed" means employed for not less than three full shifts per week, and "full shift" means a continuous shift on this work from time of signing on to signing off duty. Where a worker is taken off this work to act in a higher capacity, it shall not be regarded as a break in the shift as steam cleaner.

In witness whereof this Interim Award has been signed by the President of the Court and the Seal of the Court has been hereto affixed this 11th day of May, 1948.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 43 of 1947.

Between Coastal Aerated Water and Cordial Manufacturers Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Appellant, and Mackay and Company, Weaver & Look, J. H. Harridge and Co., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have

this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now therefore the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therin enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed in the industry of cordial and aerated water manufacturing.

2.—Definitions.

In this Agreement, the term "Casual hand" shall mean a person employed in the trade who has not been continuously employed by the same employer for a period of one (1) calendar month.

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours (exclusive of the time off for meal time) shall constitute a week's work for all workers.

(b) The time for commencing work for all workers shall be 7.30 a.m. and the finishing time shall be 5 p.m.

(c) Not more than one (1) hour nor less than forty-five (45) minutes shall be allowed for a meal break between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 2 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

(d) The working hours shall be deemed to include all time between the times the worker commences and finishes work each day: Provided that the time allowed off as meal time be deducted.

4.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of six (6) months from its date.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the weekly or daily hours hereinbefore mentioned shall be considered overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Agreement or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

6.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The weekly half holiday shall be observed on Saturday.

(b) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under the Agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(d) During a week in which any of the foregoing holidays occur the weekly working hours shall be suitably reduced. A worker required to work on any of the said holidays, shall be entitled to ordinary time for all time he is employed on those days, in addition to the prescribed wages.

(e) A worker required to work on a Sunday shall be entitled to payment at the rate of double time and a half for all time he is employed on a Sunday.

(f) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(g) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(h) Subject to subclause (l) hereof, if after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(i) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(j) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (h) of this clause to such annual leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers of such employer he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(k) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(l) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

7.—Weekly Engagement.

(a) After being continuously employed for a period of one (1) calendar month, a week's notice on either side shall be required to terminate employment.

(b) In other cases one (1) day's notice shall be sufficient to terminate employment, and the employer shall be entitled to retain in hand one day's pay until such notice has expired.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause an employer shall be entitled to summarily dismiss a worker for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

(e) Drivers who are required to collect money during any week or portion of a week as part of their duties and account for it shall be paid one shilling (1s.) for such week in addition to the rate of wage prescribed above.

9.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

(a) The number of junior workers employed in any factory shall not be such as to exceed the proportion of one junior worker to each four (4) or fraction of four (4) adult workers (excluding drivers) in receipt of the minimum rates hereinbefore prescribed for workers other than junior workers.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding sub-clause, it shall be permissible for each driver, if the employer considers it necessary, to have one junior male worker to assist him.

(b) The number of junior drivers shall not be such as to exceed the proportion of one junior driver to each five (5) adult drivers.

10.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absentee is for three (3) days or more.

11.—No Reduction.

No worker who on the date of this Agreement coming into operation is in receipt of a higher wage than that which is prescribed by this Agreement shall suffer any reduction in wage, but his employment shall be continued at not less than the rate then paid him.

12.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid weekly, excepting in the case of casual workers.

13.—Posting Agreement.

The employer shall cause to be posted up in his factory or at each of his factories if he has more than one, a copy of this Agreement in some position where it shall be visible and open to the inspection of the worker.

14.—General Conditions.

(a) No employer shall be permitted to hire his turnouts to any worker for a lesser rate than ten shillings (10s.) per day, exclusive of petrol or other running expenses.

(b) Any worker employed by an employer to sell on commission shall receive at least the minimum rates of pay provided for under the terms of this Agreement, and shall at all times whilst so employed be bound by the provisions of this Agreement.

(c) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after his usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof. Provided that this subclause shall not apply to a worker living in the same locality as his place of employment, who can reasonably return home for a meal.

(d) The supply of boots and overalls shall be at the discretion of the employer.

15.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep at his factory, or at each of his factories if he has more than one, a time and wages record in which shall be entered the name of each worker.

(b) Each worker shall sign such book on commencing and finishing work each day. The book shall show the number of hours worked, the amount of overtime worked, and the wage paid.

(c) Each worker shall be required to sign the book on receipt of the amount due to him. The employer and the worker shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book, which shall be open and available for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the employers' or workers' union during working hours.

16.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

17.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work from any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

18.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.
- (iii) Name of each previous employer, and length of service with such employer.
- (iv) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age in the above certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

19.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

20.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Agreement a Board of Reference, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of:—

(a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;

(b) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;

(c) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

21.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

I certify pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

(a) The hours of duty for shift workers in the engine room and the boiler house shall be eight (8) hours per day from Monday to Friday inclusive, and shall be paid for at ordinary rates. Any time worked in excess of eight (8) hours on any such day shall be paid for at double ordinary rates. All time worked on Saturdays and Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first eight (8) hours and double ordinary rates thereafter. The provisions of this subclause shall be subject to the provisions of subclause (b) hereof.

(b) Where any shift is extended beyond eight (8) hours by reason of sickness or non arrival, or late arrival of the relieving shift men, or in connection with the change over or rotation of shifts, double time rates shall not apply, and such excess time shall be payable only at the usual rate applicable to that day.

Between Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A., Applicant, and the Home of Peace for the Chronic Sick (Incorporated), Respondent.

Whereas an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: now therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to Nurse-assistants employed by the Home of Peace for the Chronic Sick (Incorporated).

2.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

3.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area occupied by the Home of Peace for the Chronic Sick (Incorporated).

4.—Definitions.

(a) The term "Nurse Assistant" shall mean and include a female person other than a registered nurse or trainee as defined by Award No. 39 of 1945, who is employed in assisting in nursing duties and/or giving attention and care to the sick, aged and infirm persons, or to the care and attention of children in hospitals.

(b) "Adult" shall mean a person of not less than 19 years of age.

5.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours exclusive of meal times shall constitute a week's work: Provided that to suit the convenience of the employer eighty-eight (88) hours may be worked each fortnight.

(b) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply for an amendment of this clause.

6.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the ordinary working time shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, or, if the employer and employee so agree, time off in lieu thereof shall be granted at the convenience of the hospital: Provided however, that such time off shall be in unbroken periods according to each period of overtime worked; and also provided that the overtime is made up within twenty-eight (28) days from the time when it becomes due, except where it applies to the change-over from night duty to day duty or day duty to night duty.

(b) Less than thirty (30) minutes' overtime for a week or a fortnight, as the case may be, shall not be paid for.

(c) For the purpose of calculating the overtime rate, board and lodging assessed in accordance with Clause 16 shall be added to the prescribed cash wage of Junior Workers.

(d) No overtime shall be paid for unless such overtime was worked by direction of the management of the hospital.

7.—Annual Leave.

(a) Every worker covered by this Award where not otherwise provided for, shall be entitled to four weeks' leave on full pay for each twelve (12) months' service.

(b) A worker with more than one month's service, who may resign or be dismissed, shall be entitled to pay for annual leave pro rata up to the time of her leaving the service in such proportion as her period of employment bears to the number of days in the year.

(c) In addition to her salary, the worker on leave shall, where board and lodging allowance as prescribed by clause 16 is not included in the salary, be entitled to receive such allowance for the period of her leave.

(d) Every worker shall receive at least seven (7) days' previous notice of the commencement of her leave.

(e) (i) Leave shall be paid for in advance at the rate of salary the worker is receiving at the time of taking such leave.

(ii) Leave shall be given as soon as practicable after falling due. The leave of a nurse assistant shall not accumulate except with the consent of the nurse assistant, and in no case shall it accumulate for more than two (2) years.

(f) Any worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs her contract of service, shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

8.—Sick Leave.

(a) In the case of illness, provided a satisfactory medical certificate is furnished, full pay shall be allowed as follows:—

Workers with less than six (6) months' service	nil.
Workers with six (6) months and less than one (1) year's service	14 days.
Workers with one (1) year's and less than two (2) years' service	28 days.
Workers with two (2) years' service and over	42 days.

Such sick leave shall be granted in one or more periods but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall be as provided.

(b) The total sick leave in any one triennial period shall not exceed forty-two (42) days; the triennial period to be the three (3) years preceding the date of illness for which leave is claimed.

(c) No payment for sick leave shall be made when the illness is due to the worker's own misconduct, or to an accident met with off duty.

(d) Sick leave, if granted, will only be recognised provided a medical certificate be placed in the hands of the Hospital Secretary within forty-eight (48) hours of the rostered time for commencement of duty.

(e) The foregoing paragraphs of this clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(f) If the absentee exceeds one week, the employment shall be deemed to have terminated after the expiration of the first week's absence, without prejudice to the worker's rights under the other paragraphs of this clause.

9.—Dismissals.

(a) No worker shall be dismissed (except for misconduct) unless she has received fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her dismissal or pay for such period in lieu thereof.

(b) No worker shall, without the consent of her employer, resign without first having given fourteen (14) days previous notice of her intention to do so; and in the absence of such notice the employer may withhold pay up to the amount of fourteen (14) days' wages.

(c) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

10.—Laundry and Uniforms.

(a) Any worker required to wear a uniform shall be supplied free of cost with such uniform by the employer.

(b) Any clothing forming part of a uniform shall be laundered at the employer's expense.

11.—Rosters.

A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in such place as it may conveniently and readily be seen by each worker concerned. The roster shall be posted not less than forty-eight (48) hours preceding the day on which the roster commences. The roster shall be available to the Union Secretary for inspection at all reasonable times. Rosters may be altered at any time if the hospital exigencies render any alteration necessary.

12.—Time and Wages Book.

(a) A time book shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times by the Union Secretary or his nominee, appointed in writing under the seal of the Union. Each worker must record in such book the exact time on which she starts and finishes duty on each day and also time booked off for meals.

(b) The salary sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection at the office of the employer concerned by the Union Secretary or his nominee appointed as aforesaid.

(c) Any system of automatic recording by means of a machine shall be deemed a compliance with the provisions of sub-clause (a) so far as the particulars actually recorded are concerned.

(d) Unless all overtime entered on the record is endorsed by the management's nominee as being authorised overtime, no overtime shall be payable.

13.—Interviews.

The Union Secretary with the employer's permission, may be entitled to interview members of the Union on the employer's premises at reasonable times.

14.—Notices.

If the Union so requests, a copy of this Award shall be posted on a board of reasonable size in a place where it may be conveniently and readily seen by every worker concerned. The Union Secretary may also post thereon such other notices relating to Union matters as are reasonable.

15.—Present Salaries and Privileges.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the salary of any worker who at the date of this Award is being paid a higher rate of salary than the minimum prescribed for her class of work.

A worker shall not be deprived of any privileges relating to her employment enjoyed by her at the date hereof, except such as are dealt with in the Award, in which case the Award provisions shall apply.

16.—Living Allowances.

(a) (i) Where workers are provided with full board and lodging, a deduction equal to thirty-seven (37%) per cent of the female basic wage shall be made from their wages.

(ii) In all cases the ratio of the value of board to that of lodging in the charge of board and lodging shall be two to one.

(b) Where workers are provided with meals by the employer a deduction shall be made at the rate of one twenty-first (1/21st) of the value for board for each meal provided.

17.—Casual Workers.

A nurse-assistant engaged for a period of less than two (2) weeks shall be deemed to be a casual worker and be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the rates specified in this Award.

If a casual worker is still required at the end of two (2) weeks, she may be re-engaged as a casual with payment as aforesaid for another two (2) weeks.

18.—Other Provisions.

Where workers leave the hospital for accumulated days off, in excess of four (4) days, they shall be allowed pro rata board allowance as prescribed by clause 16 hereof. Provided that such allowance will only be paid when application for payment has been made by the worker prior to leaving the hospital.

19.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them.

(ii) Classifying and fixing salaries, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(iii) Deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

20.—Wages.

(a) Wages shall be paid at least fortnightly.

Amendment of Regulations.

C.S.O. 233/46.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, acting pursuant to section 65 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902 (as reprinted with amendments in the 1934 Sessional Volume of Statutes), hereby amend the regulations made by them and in force under the said Act, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of September, 1934, and amended from time to time thereafter (reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments to the 25th day of March, 1948) in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation No. 143 is amended—

(a) by inserting before the word "respectively" in the fourth line of the regulation the word and figures "and 153.";

(b) by deleting the existing paragraph 2 and inserting a new paragraph 2 in lieu thereof as follows:—

All rates of handling charges shall, for each complete penny variation in the ordinary hourly rate of pay to waterside workers based on the said rate of pay (viz. 4s. 9d.) as in operation from the twentieth day of May, 1948, be increased or decreased as the case may require by 1½ per centum;

(c) by deleting from the second line of paragraph 4 of the regulation the figures and symbols "1s. 6d." and inserting in lieu thereof the figures and symbols "1s. 9d."

2. By deleting regulation No. 144 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

No. 144.
