THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944. North Fremantle Municipality.

WHEREAS by section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, any Local Authority within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911-1944, may of its own motion from time to time make by laws with respect to all or any of the matters therein set out: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof the North Fremantle Municipality being a local health authority within the meaning of the said Act doth hereby make a by-law as follows:-

1. No person who is in a verminous condition shall enter or remain in any public vehicle, boardin house, lodging house, public house or public place. boarding

2. Any prosecution hereunder for a breach of this by-law shall be instituted on the complaint of an inspector appointed under the said Act and in respect of the North Fremantle Health District.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947, the WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by laws: following by-laws :--

1. Make the following Building By-laws:-

Interpretation.

"Act" means the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947. "Basement" means a storey or portion of a storey partly below the level of the ground, the ceiling of which is not less than five feet above the adjoining ground (irrespective of any excavation made to comply with these by-laws).

"Cellar" means a storey or portion of a storey below the ground level, the ceiling of which is less than five feet above the adjoining ground.

"Cement mortar" means a mortar composed of one part of cement to three or fewer than three parts of

sand. "Cement blocks" means a rectangular substance of material being a mixture of sand or approved quarry grit, or other approved materials, and cement in the proportion of six parts of sand or approved quarry grit or other approved materials to one part of cement (both by volume), dry mixed, wet mixed, and properly rammed

by volume), dry mixed, wet mixed, and properly rammed to shape in approved moulds. "'Commercial building'' means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or in part for commercial purposes. "'Dwelling-house'' means a building used, constructed, or adapted to be used wholly or in part for human habi-tation, but does not include other than the dwelling-house portion (if any) of a commercial building, and includes a permanent, movable, or temporarily fixed structure structure.

"Habitable room" means any living room, and includes all rooms intended or adapted to be used for

the purpose of sleeping or eating or the cooking of food. "Wall": "Divisional wall" means a wall (other than an external or party wall) which subdivides any floor of a building and carries any load in addition to its own dead weight.

"Wood" or "wooden buildings" means buildings of wood or having wooden frames.

"External wall" means an outer wall of a building not being a party wall, even though adjoining a wall of another building.

By-laws relating to Buildings.

"Partition wall" means a wall subdividing any room and not carrying any other load than its own dead weight. ''Board''

means the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Board.

"Surveyor" means the person appointed by the Board for the time being as building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the Serpentine Jarrahdale Road Board District.

1.-Application.

These by-laws shall apply to all lands and buildings within the townsites of Serpentine, Jarrahdale, Mundi-jong and Keysbrook, situated within the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road District.

1A .- Applications, Plans and Notices.

Before the erection of a building is commenced, two copies of the plans and specifications, together with the cost of such building, and an application in writing for approval thereof, shall be submitted to the Board. Provided that the Board may, if it see fit, dispense

with the necessity for the submission of plans and specifications, and reduce or dispense with the pay-ment of a fee with any application for approval to make minor alterations in an existing building, or to erect a building to be used exclusively for the purpose of a green-house, conservatory, summerhouse, private boat-house, fuel shed, tool house, cycle shed, aviary, veran-dah, or the like; provided also that any building (other than a verandah or au aviary) used or intended to be wholly detached from any dwelling-house: Provided also, that where it is desired to make some minor alterations to a building not materially affecting its stability, light-ing, ventilation, or size of rooms, the application may in the first place be made without submitting any plans and specifications, which shall, however, be submitted if the Board so require.

The application shall describe the building and show the purpose for which the building is to be used.

The plans shall consist of a general plan and eleva-tions, and a block plan. The block plan shall show the relation of the building to the boundaries of the site and to other buildings or structures thereon.

The specifications shall describe the construction and materials of which the building is to be built, and the method of drainage, sewerage and water supply, and state whether the materials will be new or second-hand, and, if second-hand materials are to be used, shall give particulars.

When giving approval, the Board may impose a con-dition that 48 hours' notice shall be given prior to the covering of any or all of the following works in order that they may be inspected, that is to say, trenches, before foundations are laid, foundations before trenches are filled in, and drains before they are covered in.

By-laws Relating to Buildings.

2.—Fees and Permits.

No person shall commence any buildings, erection, or structure, or any addition or alteration to any building, erection, or structure without having first obtained from the surveyor a written permit for the commencement of same, and without having first paid to the Board the fees in respect thereof set forth in these by-laws.

Each building, erection, or structure must be completed within the undermentioned time from the date of issue by the Board of the permit therefor:-

All Buildings-12 Months.

The fees payable in respect to buildings, erections, or structures shall be as follows :-

License for new buildings of wood, iron, or asbestos-2s. 6d.

License for new buildings of brick, stone, or concrete or cement blocks-5s.

License for alterations or additions to existing buildings-2s. 6d.

3.-General Provisions.

Each building in a terrace of buildings or in a pair of semi-detached buildings shall be deemed to be a separate building for the purpose of this by-law.

Every building shall be provided with one or more proper manholes in the ceilings so as to give access for electrical and other fitting.

4 .- Site, Healthiness of.

A person shall not, without the written permission of the Board, erect a building upon any site which shall have been filled with any material impregnated with faecal or with animal or vegetable matter, or upon which any such matter may have been deposited, unless and until such matter shall have been properly removed by excavation or otherwise from such site and depressions filled in with clean soil.

Every person who shall erect a building shall cause the subsoil of the site of such building to be effectu-ally drained wherever in the opinion of the Board the dampness of the site renders such a precantion necessary.

No person shall commence to build any structure without having first provided proper and sufficient sanitary accommodation to the satisfaction of the Board for all persons engaged or employed upon such structure.

Motor garages not exceeding three hundred square feet in floor area may be built in iron, brick, stone or concrete, or other non-inflammable material anywhere in the district, provided that the Board may require-

(a) that any such motor garage be 50 feet dis-tant from the frontage of any road or street (ex-cept in special cases where the physical configuration of the ground precludes such distance being observed);

(b) that any such motor garage be five feet dis-tant from the frontage of any other road or street; (c) that any such motor garage be 10 feet distant

from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment or on any allotment adjoining;

(d) that the motor garage complies otherwise with all the conditions and limitations of this by-law in regard to buildings.

Fowl-houses of not more than 200 square feet in area and not more than six feet in height may be erected at the rear of any dwelling, provided that the nearest portion of such fowl-house is at least 50 feet from any building used as or intended for a dwelling and at least four feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation.

Fowl-houses of larger area may be erected if at a distance of at least 120 feet from any street and 60 Fowl-houses of larger feet from any dwelling-house and at least four feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation: Provided that the roof and walls are covered with galvanised iron or other fire resisting material, approved by the surveyor and that the building shall not be more than seven feet high.

The Board may refuse or postpone approval to build upon the site which is unhealthy by reason of its liability to dampness, unless and until the site has been rendered dry, sound, and well drained to the satisfaction of the Board.

If the Board so direct in any particular case, the whole or part of the ground surface or site of a dwell-ing shall be covered with a layer of good cement conerete, or tarred metal, rammed solid, and at least four inches thick.

5 .- Position of Building Site.

No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of 20 feet measured hori-zontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

Except as hereinafter provided no building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, shall be built, constructed, or erected-

(a) If of wood, within a distance of four feet; if of brick, stone, concrete, or cement blocks, within a distance of three feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building, or of any land not in the same possession or occupation.

(b) Provided always, that any such buildings or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance there-from or from land not in the same possession or occu-pation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood; provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, lane, or right-of-way or land or building or erection, as the case may be, shall be of concrete at least $\$_{\frac{1}{2}}$ inches in thickness, or of brick or stones at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back (b) Provided always, that any such buildings or at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back and at least one foot six inches through the roof covering the gutter adjoining the same.

6.-Access to Rear.

Where there is no public and convenient access to the rear of the site of any building for the removal of night-soil, the building shall be so designed as to leave outside the building a way of access at least four feet wide from a public road to the privy closet, and for the removal of garbage and refuse.

7.-Ontbuildings.

In the case of an application to erect (as appurtenant to any building) any ontbuilding from the use of which unpleasant noises, unpleasant odours, or nunsual risk of fire may reasonably be expected to rise, the Board may determine in what position upon the allotment such ontbuilding may be crected.

8.-Materials.

The Board may reject any application for a permit to erect any buildings, or make alterations or addi-tions to any building if the thickness and height and the description and quality of the substance of which walls and party walls are constructed are not approved by the Board.

9.-Tents-Canvas Buildings.

The Board may grant, subject to conditions, or refuse permission to erect a structure of calico, canvas, or other textile material, and if any such structure is erected without the Board's permission, may order its demolition.

diate

10 .- Materials and Workmanship.

Materials which have been used in the construction of any cesspit, drain, or sewer, or which for any other reason are dangerous to health, shall not be used in the erection of any building.

Faulty or unsuitable materials shall not be used in any building.

Every part of a building shall be erected and finished off in a good and workmanlike manner.

Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard and well burnt, and if old or second-hand, shall be thoroughly cleaned and approved by the Board in writing before being so used.

All brick or stone chimneys shall be constructed of ample flue, to be well plastered or pargeted inside for the full height, and no timber of any description will be allowed to be built into the brickwork. The Board may give authority to erect iron chimneys, but in the erection they shall be laid on either stone or concrete base and free from all woodwork.

Hearths of stone, brick, cement, or iron of approved dimensions shall be placed in front of all fireplaces.

Cement blocks shall be properly cured for three days by spraying with water or effectively covering with bags or other approved material which shall be kept wet for not less three days for not less than three days.

11 .-- Testing Materials.

The Board may test any building materials and prohibit the use of such materials as are proved unfitted for the purpose for which they were intended to be used.

12.—Timber Construction.

All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good sound material, free from rot, free from large and loose knots, and free from shakes, and free from any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

The following conditions shall apply as to the spacings and scantlings of timber :-

(i) Stumps shall not be less than 4in. x 4in., jarrah, or other approved timber, spaced 5 feet centre to centre, and fixed on 6in. x 14in. sole-plates. Stumps shall be tarred and sunk at least half their length in the ground: Provided that no stumps shall be less than 2 feet in the ground. Tarring is to extend for six inches above

the ground surface. (ii) Studs and ceiling joists shall not be less than 4in. x 2in., spaced not more than 2 feet apart, centre to centre, properly secured and braced. Studs and ceil-ing joists or 3in. x 2in. may be used, provided they are spaced 18 inches apart, centre to centre, properly braced and secured. Where studs of 3in. x 2in. are used, the angle or corner studs shall be of 3in. x 3in.; where 4in. x 2in. studs are used, the angle studs shall be of 4in. x 4in.

(iii) Rafters shall not be less than 3in. x 2in., spaced not more than 3 feet, centre to centre, in the case of iron roofs, and 18 inches, centre to centre, in the case of state, tile, or other similar roofs; 4in. x 2in. rafters may be used, but must be spaced at 2 feet centre for slates or tiles, and not more than 3 feet apart for any other type of roof. All rafters must be securely braced with muting cude color time. with purlins and collar ties.

(iv) Floor joists shall not be less than 4in. x 2in. spaced 18 inches apart, centre to centre.

(v) Floor bearers shall not be less than 4in. x 3in., spaced not more than five feet apart.

In addition to the bearers required for this spacing, an additional bearer of 4in. x 3in. must be placed under each wall or partition.

No framing timber in any building shall be notched or checked out to receive bracing or otherwise so as to reduce its cross sectional area more than one-sixth.

13.-Awnings and Verandahs.

All awnings or verandahs proposed to be erected over a public place shall be of the cautilever type. No verandah shall be enclosed for living or sleeping purposes without the Board's written consent.

14.-Footings.

Every person who shall erect a building of brick, stone, or the like shall construct every wall of such building, nuless built upon a hard rock formation

to rest upon proper footings, or upon a sufficient beam. He shall cause the projection of the bottom of the floorings on each side of such wall to be at least equal to one-half the thickness of the wall at its base, unless an adjoining wall interferes, or unless the wall is upon the boundary of the land, in which case the projection may be omitted on the side of the boundary, or where the wall adjoins.

He shall also cause the diminution of the footings to

be in regular offsets, nuless the footings be of concrete. The height from the bottom of such footings to the base of the wall shall be at least equal to two-thirds of the thickness of the wall at its base: Provided that when the footings are of reinforced concrete the Board may permit the height to be less: And, provided further, that it shall not in any case be less than 12 inches.

Footings to walls of brick in cement mortar (three to one) shall be the same width and height as those to walls of the same thickness not built in cement mortar.

Vermin plates shall be provided to all walls other than brick, stone, or concrete.

15.—Dampcourse.

Every person who shall erect a building shall provide and insert damp-proof courses of lead, slate bedded in cement or natural asphalt: Provided that the

bedded in cement or natural asphalt: Provided that the Board may permit the omission of damp-proof courses from closets, ontbuildings, and the like structures. Where material which is not slate, natural asphalt, or lead of a minimum weight of two pounds per square foot under walls not exceeding 40 feet in height, or three pounds per square foot under walls exceeding 40 feet in height is desired to be used, the applicant shall submit to the Board evidence that the material to be used has been approved by the Board of Health to be used has been approved by the Board of Health,

to be used has been approved by the Board of Health, or, failing such evidence that the material is a good and effective damp-proof course. Damp-proof courses shall be inserted in walls to to their full width and in such manner that there shall be no open spaces, cracks, or gaps in the damp-proof courses along the full length of the walls,

Damp-proof courses shall be inserted in walls in such positions and in such manner that-

(a) moisture from the earth shall be prevented from reaching the lowest floor timbers, or the walls above the underside of the lowest floor joists, or, where solid floors are laid, shall be prevented from reaching higher than 3½ inches above such floors;
(b) where floors are below outside ground level,

moisture shall be prevented from reaching inner face of outer walls;

(c) where cavity walls are used, moisture pene-trating outer portion of walls shall be prevented from reaching the floor timbers, or the inner portion or face of all walls above the underside of the lowest floor timbers, or, where solid floors are laid, shall be prevented from reaching higher than $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches above such floors;

inches above such floors; (d) moisture penetrating the chimney, parapet, or other walls above roof shall be prevented from reaching in any part the inner walls or the inner portion of inner face of outside walls below the upper side of the ceiling joists in either case; (e) moisture penetrating the outer portion of cavity walls shall be prevented from reaching the inner portion or inner face of such walls above or about window, door, and other frames or openings. In cavity walls the cavity shall extend not less than (b) in the shelow the damp-proof course

61 inches below the damp-proof course.

This clause shall apply to walls constructed of brick, stone, or concrete, and to walls of any material readily permeable by water.

16.-External Walls-Structure.

Every person who shall erect a building shall cause the external walls thereof to be constructed of brick,

stone, concrete, cement blocks, timber or other mate-rial approved by the Board. If built of brick, stone, concrete, cement blocks, or the like, the external walls shall, except where herein provided to the contrary, be not less than nine inches in thickness. Provided that the walls of heads lengthing in thickness: Provided that the walls of sheds, laundries, In the mess, and the like, not exceeding 10 feet in height may if the Board so permit, be of $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches thickness. Cavity walls may be built, provided the two sections are securely tied together by a sufficient number of wire

ties or other effective method, and when used the combined thickness of the inner and outer parts shall be deemed to be the thickness of the wall.

Bottoms of all cavities shall be carefully raked out before the completion of the buildings, and all ties kept free from mortar droppings.

Where cavity walls are used weep-holes shall be left

where cavity walls are used weep-holes shall be left at foot of cavity not more than six feet apart and over all damp-proof courses inserted to protect walls weepholes shall be left not more than three feet apart. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this clause, the Board may permit the erection of dwellings not more than one story in height of concrete with walls of less than the prescribed thickness, if satisfied that such proposed dwelling will be hygienic and struc-turally sound. turally sound.

All external walls of bricks, stone, concrete, or cement blocks shall be built with a true cavity at least two inches wide: Provided that, where such external walls are protected by a verandah not less than seven feet wide, they may be built solid without cavity.

17.-Party Walls.

Two, but not more, residences may be erected together in one block, provided that they shall be sep-arated from each other by a wall of concrete or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness project. ing, in the case of wooden houses at least one inch through the wood work front and back, and in all cases projecting one foot six inches at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, whether belonging to the same owner or not. Each building or dwelling house in a block shall be subject to the provisions of this by-law applicable to its class, save that the site or curtilage of each of such buildings shall have a superficial area of at least 4,000 square feet and a frontage of at least 33 lineal feet to a street or road.

18.-Rooms (size) Cubic Space.

Every person who shall erect a building shall provide that-

(a) the areas of the floors of all the habitable rooms in such building shall, taken together, average not less than 100 square feet per habitable room;

(b) a habitable room shall not in any case have a floor area of less than 80 square feet; and

(c) a habitable room shall not, in any case, have a cubic space of less than 840 cubic feet: Provided that in each dwelling-house and in each flat of residential flat building there shall be at least one habitable room, the cubic space of which shall not be less than 1,296 cubic feet;

(d) no main room in any building shall be less than 10 feet 6 inches in height from floor to ceiling;

(e) all shops shall have a clear space of 12 feet 6 inches from floor to ceiling.

19.-Height-Rooms in roof.

Every habitable room which is wholly or partly in the Every hauftable room which is wholly or party in the roof of a building shall, in the case of an attic room above the ground floor, he for at least two-thirds of the area of the floor not less than nine feet in height, and shall not in any part be less than fine feet in height, and shall not in any part be less than five feet in height, and, in the case of any other room, shall be for at least three fourths of the area of the floor not less than nine feet in height, and shall not in any part her less than a sum fact four implies in height be less than seven feet four inches in height.

20.—Other Rooms.

Every habitable room which is not a room wholly or partly in the roof of a building shall be not less than nine feet in height: Provided that bays, inglenooks, and recesses for furniture may be added to such rooms with ceilings of a less height than nine feet, but the ceilings of such bays and inglenooks shall not be less than six feet eight inches in height.

21.-Lighting and Ventilation-Under Floors.

For the purpose of ventilation every building shall be so erected that there shall be, between the underside of every joist upon which the lowest floor of such building is laid and the ground surface or upper surface of the asphalt or concrete with which the ground or site of the building may be covered a clear space of 12 inches at least in every part; and such space shall be thoroughly ventilated and cross-ventilated by means of suitable and sufficient air-bricks or other effectual method: Provided that where the lowest floor is so constructed (by filling with concrete, asphalt, or other approved material) as not to permit the harbour-ing of rats, this provision shall not apply.

22.-Rooms-Airbricks, Louvres, etc.

Every room of a building shall be so constructed that for every 1,000 cubic feet or part thereof of air space in the room there shall be 24 square inches at the least of unobstructed ventilation to the outer air by means of airbricks situated at or near the level of the ceiling or any other efficient means.

23.-Rooms-Windows.

Every habitable room, or room, or alcove, in which food is intended or likely to be stored or prepared, and every bathroom, enclosed laundry and privy closet under the main roof of the dwelling shall have at least one vertical window opening directly to the outside air. One-half at least of such window shall be constructed to open to its full extent, and so that the opening may extend to the to be of the window. Provided that in a extend to the top of the window: Provided that in a pantry any other system of ventilation may be sub-stituted for windows if the Board be satisfied that such system is equally efficient.

24.-Bedrooms-Additional Ventilation.

In every bedroom or room intended or adapted to be used for sleeping and having only one window, there shall be provided cross ventilation by means of at least 24 square inches of unobstructed opening in some wall of the room other than that in which the window is fireplace, fanlight, airbrick, or any suitable means.

25.-Height of Windows.

The top of a window of an enclosed laundry or of a kitchen, or alcove, or room in which food is intended or likely to be stored or prepared shall not be less than six feet eight inches from the floor.

26.-Size of Windows.

The window or windows of any room shall have a superficial area (clear of the sash frame) not less than one-tenth of the floor area of the room, or (if the following size be greater than one-tenth of the floor area) not less than 10 square feet for the windows of a kitcher are aloon a room in which food is intraded of a kitchen or alcove or room in which food is intended

or likely to be prepared, not less than six square feet, for the windows of an enclosed laundry, not less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ square feet for the windows of a bathroom, not less than two square feet for the windows of a privy-closet, and not less than 12 square feet for any other room.

27.-Laundries and Kitchens.

A dwelling of any kind shall not be erected with the kitchen and laundry combined in one room.

28.-Windows.

Any window the top of which is more than 12 feet above either the ground or any external flat surface or slightly sloping roof sufficient for safety shall be so constructed that it can be cleaned from the interior of the building.

29.-Drainage Levels.

Every person who shall erect a building shall construct the lower storey of such building at such a level that, in the opinion of the Board, it may be practicable to construct a drain sufficient for the effectual drainage of such building.

No person shall build or erect or cause or permit to be built or erected any building, erection, tent or addition to any building, erection, tent, on any land unless and until such building, erection, tent, or addi-tion and the site and curtilage thereof can be properly drained, and the Board may refuse permission to build and erect any building, erection, or tent, or addition, nuless and until it is satisfied that the proposed build-ing, erection, tent, or addition and the site and curti-lage thereof can be properly drained. No water is to be discharged on to the surface of any footpath.

30.-Miscellaneous.

The Board may permit the enclosure and use of any public place in connection with the building or taking down of a building, or the alteration or repair of a building.

31.-Skylights.

The Board may order the alteration or repair or both of any skylight in any building if such skylight be, in the opinion of the Board in such a condition as to be detrimental to health or dangerous.

32.-Existing Buildings.

If in the opinion of the Board any building has been allowed to fall into an unsafe or unsanitary or neglected condition either by faulty construction or any other cause, the Board may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier to repair said building, and in the event of no action being taken within one month by the said owner or occupier to remedy any defect complained of in the said notice, the said owner or occupier shall be liable to a fine, as hereinafter procomplained of in the said notice, the said owner or occupier shall be liable to a fine, as hereinafter pro-vided, until such time as the building shall be placed in a safe and sanitary condition and the owner or occupier will be liable for all charges incurred in doing the necessary works, and moreover, if in the opinion of the Board any building does not warrant the expense of repairing, the owner after receiving notice, shall remove the building within one month, failing to remove the building after receiving the notice the owner will be liable to a fine as hereinafter provided, furthermore the building after receiving the holder the owner with be lialle to a fine as hereinafter provided, furthermore the Board may remove the building and charge the owner with the cost of so doing and recover the same in any court of competent jurisdiction and or sell the material to cover the cost of taking down.

33.-Removal of Buildings.

No building or erection shall be removed into and erected or re-erected in the road district or removed from one part of the district and erected or re-erected in another part thereof unless the owner or person carrying ont the removal first obtain written permis-sion from the Board to do so. Before such permission shall be granted not less than seven (7) clear days' notice in writing shall be given to the Board or the Surveyor of the desire to remove and erect or re-erect such building or erection.

Such notice shall contain or be accompanied by the following :

(a) Particulars of the situation of building which it is proposed to remove.

(b) Particulars of the situation of and plan of the land upon which it is proposed to erect or re-erect or place such building, showing the proposed position thereon, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Board.

(c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building and any proposed alterations or additions thereto and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Board.
(d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is erected or re-erected.

(e) Evidence satisfactory to the Board that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insani-tary, or unfit for human habitation, and a certificate from the Health Officer of the road district from which the building is proposed to be removed that within a reasonable time prior to date of removal no case of disease of an infections or contagious nature has occurred therein.

(f) Such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Board or its Surveyor to determine if all the provisions of any Act of Parliament, by-laws, or regulation applicable thereto are or will be complied with.

No written permission shall be given unless such removed building when erected or re-crected shall com-ply with the provisions of this by-law as applicable to new buildings.

No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed into or re-erected within the road district.

 N_0 building or erection in which any case of infec-tions or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding six months shall be removed into or re-crected within the road district.

No removed building shall be occupied until the Surveyor shall have certified in writing that all the pro-visions of this by-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands: Provided that in its altered position it shall comply in all respects with this by-law, and that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road, or

public place. No dwelling shall consist of less than three main rooms, of a total of not less than 300 square feet, and no building or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes until at least three main rooms shall have

been completed according to the plans and specifica-tions submitted to and approved by the Board. The Board may in special cases grant permission for the erection of a dwelling-house containing not less than two rooms.

34.-Proportion of Site which may be covered.

A dwelling-house, together with its appurtenances to be erected on an allotment or parcel of land, shall not occupy more than one-half of such allotment. Provided that this shall not prevent the Board granting approval to the erection of a dwelling-house occupying more than one-half of an allotment, or with a minimum of unoccupied area of less than 3,000 square feet, in replacement of an existing dwelling house which occupies more than one-half of that allotment, or has a minimum of unoccupied area of less than 3.000 square feet as the Provided, also, that where situated on a case may be. site considered by the Board to be an established shop-ping locality, the Board may permit a building which is to be a shop and dwelling combined to occupy not more than two-thirds of the allotment. subject to the unbuilt upon area being not less than 2,000 square feet.

35.-Space outside Windows on side Land.

If there be any side wall of a dwelling-house in which it is proposed to provide a window or door opening, that wall shall be set back (throughout its whole length) from the side line of the allotment to a dis-tance of three feet, in the case of a dwelling of one or two storeys, or to a distance of five feet, in the case of a dwelling of more than two storeys.

36.-Kitchen, Laundry and Bathroom Fittings.

Every dwelling-house shall be provided with a completely enclosed bathroom, or combined bathroom and laundry, and with washtubs and copper, or other means of washing clothes, and the water laid thereto. The

floor surface of bathrooms on any floor, and of laundries when above the ground floor, shall be of impervious material properly graded and drained. The washtubs, copper, and bath shall not be placed in the kitchen. One bathroom in each dwelling-honse shall have at least 30 square feet of floor area; and a combined bathroom and laundry, shall have at least 56 square feet of floor area. Provided that the Board may in any area where it considers that a bettroom or how dry any case where it considers that a bathroom or laundry could be dispensed with, exempt any building from the above provisions, but such exemption shall be given by resolution of the Board.

37.-Enforcement-Inspection-Cutting into Building.

The Board may order the opening, or cutting into Building. The Board may order the opening, or cutting into, or pulling down of any work where the Board has reason to believe or suspect that anything has been done in contravention of the Act or of any by-laws, and in the event of the work being found to have been done in contravention of the Act or of the by-laws, the person doing the work shall be required to comply with the Act or the by-laws, and shall bear the full cost of such pulling down onequing or cutting into and of accurit pulling down, opening, or cutting into and of compli-ance with the Act or the by-laws.

In the event of the work being found to have been done in accordance with the requirements of the Act and the by-laws, the cost of such pulling down, opening, or cutting into, as well as the cost of reinstatement shall be borne by the Board.

The surveyor or his representative shall have power to enter at any time upon any building in course of erection for the purpose of inspecting the said build-and may require the production of the approved plans thereof, which are to be available on the building during ordinary working hours whilst the building is in course of construction.

38.-Inspection before Occupation.

Before permitting any person to occupy or use any uncompleted building, and forthwith upon completion of any unoccupied building, the person by or in conse-quence of whose order the building is being erected shall give notice to the Board.

Forthwith upon receipt of notice as aforesaid the Board shall instruct the proper servant to make an inspection, and such servant shall inspect and report to the Board whether or not the building has been erected in accordance with this by-law and without material deviation from the approved plans and speci-fications, but this shall not be read to permit any alteration whatever in the position of the building on the site.

Such report shall not be deemed to be evidence (in the event of any prosecution hereunder) that this bylaw has been complied with.

39.-Penalties.

Any person who erects a building in contravention of this by-law, or any person who neglects to comply with any provision set forth therein, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Between The Food Preservers' Union of Australia, Western Australian Brauch, Union of Workers, Coastal Districts, Applicant, and Mills & Ware Pty. Ltd. and Wilson Bros., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein en-abling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.-Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the employer following the vocations mentioned in clause 4 of this Award: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941: Provided further, that this Award shall be limited in its application to establishments which are engaged in biscuit, cake, and sponge manufacturing for re-sale by another business, and icing sugar crushing for use by the employer and/or for re-sale by another business.

2.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one year commencing as from the beginning of the first pay period after the date hereof.

4.-Wages.

5.-Special Rates.

(a) Any adult worker, other than a shift worker, called upon to commence work between 12 o'clock mid-night and the usual starting time for day workers, on operations which must necessarily commence between those times shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate.

(b) Any junior worker, other than a shift worker, called upon to commence work between 12 o'clock midnight and the usual starting time for day, workers, on operations which must necessarily commence between those times shall be paid at the rate of thirteen per cent. (13%) in addition to the weekly rate prescribed in Clause 4 hereof.

6 .--- Hours of Work.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked in five (5) days Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) Where more than one shift is worked the starting and finishing times shall be as agreed upon between the employers and the union, and failing agreement the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

7.-Shift Work

Any worker who works on shift work other than the recognised day shift shall be paid for such shift at the following rates :---

(a) Five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate for afternoon shift.

(b) Ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rate for night shift.

8.-Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day, or, subject to Clause 5 outside the usual start-ing and finishing times shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) When a worker without being notified the pre-vious day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in Worker or workers covered by this Award shan in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause. (iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only with otherwise determined by the Count

until otherwise determined by the Court.

9.-Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, sub-ject to the provisions of Clause 13 hereof, as to pay-

ment for absence on account of illness. (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

10.-Mixed Functions.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate whilst so employed.

11.-Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Cood Friday, Easter Monday, Anzae Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
(b) All work performed on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
(c) On any unblic holiday upt prescribed as a holi-

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holi-day under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

12.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordin-ary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid. (e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the comploying through up fould of the worker, the

by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to sub-clause (c) of this Clause, to of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

13.-Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be ad-justed at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being cutitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sus-tained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sick-ness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his em-ployer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

14. Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—(1) name in full; (2) age and date of birth; (3) name of each previous employer and length of service with such employer; (4) class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certifi-cate. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

15. Posting of Award.

The employer shall, upon request of the union, post a copy of this Award in a conspicuous place in the factory, where it is easily accessible to the workers.

16. Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record containing the following particulars :-

(a) the name of each worker;
(b) the class of work performed;
(c) the hours worked each day;
(d) the wage and overtime (if any) paid;
(e) the age of each junior worker.
Such record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union.
Any system of automatic recording by machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent

be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
17.-No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

18.-Meal Interval.

No female worker or junior male worker shall be employed for a longer period than five (5) hours with out a break for a meal. The time allowed for each meal required shall not be more than one hour.

19 .--- Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once weekly.

20.—Board of Reference. For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Refer-ence is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chair-man and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the func-tions of ... tions of :-

(a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve inter-pretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them:

them; (b) elassifying and fixing wages, rates and condi-tions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award; (c) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time. An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the resulting to the Inductival Arbitration. Act

in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

21.---Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or in-firmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid upon in writing between the union and the employer. (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference

for determination.

(e) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

22 .- Part-Time Workers.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the em-ployer shall be at liberty to employ part-time workers. Where any worker is employed under the provisions of this Clause, Wages as prescribed in Clause 4, Annual Leave as prescribed in Clause 12 and Siek Pay as pre-scribed in Clause 13, shall be reduced proportionately.

23.-Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

24.—General Provisions.

(a) No female worker shall be permitted to lift or to carry weights in excess of thirty-five (35) lbs.

(b) Where and when practicable suitable seating accommodation shall be provided for female workers unless it is physically impossible to carry out the work re-

quired in a sitting posture.(c) A suitable change and mess room shall be provided. 2.**..** • 11

25.—Inspection By Union.

(a) The Secretary of the Union, or any official there-unto authorised in writing by the Union shall, on production of such authority to the employer or his manager, be allowed once in each week to inspect any part of the employer's works where it is suspected that a breach of this Award has occurred, or is occurring, but such inspection shall be carried out in the company of the employer or someone on his behalf.

(b) The employer shall provide the necessary facili-ties for the investigation of the breach, or the supposed breach, of the Award, including access to the time books, sheets or cards referred to in the preceding clause.

(c) The union official exercising his right under this clause shall not interfere with or inconvenience the work and duties of the workers more than is absolutely necessary for the proper investigation of the breach or supposed breach of the Award.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, there-fore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Indus-trial Agitation Aget 1012 1012 and and the form trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.--Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all employers carrying on laundry businesses within a radius of fourteen (14) niles from the General Post Office in the city of Perth. A laundry business is one which performs laundry work for the public and laundry work shall be deemed to include the laundering of overalls, coats and towels, as carried out by the respondents to this Award, which are laundered by the proprietor and hired out by him for fee or reward for fee or reward.

2.---Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing as from the beginning of the first pay period after the first November, 1948.

3.-Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:----

(f) Leading hands, appointed as such by the employers, shall be entitled to one shilling and six-pence (ls. 6d.) per day in addition to the rates pre-scribed in this clause.

4.-Hours of Work.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, and shall be worked in five (5) or five and a half (5½) days.

5.—Overtime.

(a) Work required to be performed by any worker before the usual starting time or after the usual finish-ing time on Monday to Saturday, inclusive, shall be

hig time on Adonaty to Sanraay, inclusive, shah be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first three (3) hours and double time thereafter. (b) All work performed on Sunday or on any of the public holidays specified in clause 7 of this Award shall be paid for at the rate of double time. (a) Notwithstanding, anything contained in this

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:-

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restric-tion upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

6.-Contract of Service.

The employment of any worker shall terminate by one day's notice on either side.

7.—Holidays. (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall, subject to clause 5 (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: —New Year's Day. Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzae Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Box-ing Day. (b) On any with the state

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and pay-ment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to any of the holidays mentioned in subclause (a) of this clause unless he or she has completed one month's continuous service with the employer.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks leave with payment or ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holi-day observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of

continuous service. (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

9.-Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attend-ance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar vear. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained aris-ing out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default. A worker shall not be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of his sickness, and where a worker is absent for three (3) days or more the employer shall be entitled to demand a medical certificate.

10.-Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once weekly.

11 .- Time and Wages Record.

A readily intelligible record shall be kept by each employer, in which shall be entered and/or marked the name of each worker under this Award the age of the worker, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union at any time during working hours, who shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the record each week.

12 .- Proportion of Juniors.

Junior workers may be employed in the following proportions:

(a) Females:-Two (2) juniors to each adult worker.

(b) Males:-One (1) junior to each adult worker.

Provided that, where special circumstances arise in any Provided that, where special circumstances arise in any given business arrangement for the employment of juniors in greater proportion may be made between the union and the employer concerned: Provided further, that where no adult worker is employed and where the em-ployer or his manager is himself performing the duties of a worker, one junior worker may be employed.

13.-Junior Workers Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars :-

(i) name in full;

(ii) age and date of birth.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis state his age in the above certificate, he shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

(e) Junior Females:

14.-Breakdowns, etc. The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the mion or unions affiliated with it, or by any other asso-ciation or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

15.-No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who at the date of this Award was receiving a rate of pay in excess of the provisions of clause 4 hereof.

16.-Meal Interval.

(a) No female worker or junior male worker shall be required to work for a longer period than five (5) hours without a break for a meal.

(b) No meal interval shall be longer than one (1) hour.

17.—Meal Money. If a worker is required to work overtime for more than one hour after the usual finishing time on any day from Monday to Saturday, inclusive, he or she shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for a meal: Pro-vided that this payment shall not be made if the worker is notified on the previous day that he or she shall be required to work overtime.

18 .- Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19 .- Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference, which Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as pre-scribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at

- between the parties to the Award, the functions of:-(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
 - (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and con-ditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
 - (iii) adjusting any other matter that the Court may

refer to such Board from time to time. An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941 which for this purpose are embodied in the Award

20.-General Conditions.

(a) Where practicable some protective coverings shall be placed on cement or steel floors.

(b) When practicable dining rooms with boiling water

available at meal times shall be provided. (c) Workers engaged on washing machines or in wash-houses shall be provided with rubber boots where required.

(d) No female worker under the age of eighteen (18) years shall be required to lift weights in excess of 25 No other female worker shall be required to lift 1b. weights in excess of 35 lb.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 43.

Plainflour, Whole Wheatmeal and Standard Wheatmeal.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Act, 1948, and the Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 43.

Definitions and Interpretations.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-

- "Metropolitan Area" means the area served by the railway from South Beach and Fremantle to Midland Junction, and Perth to Cannington;
- "for cash" means in relation to any sale, that payments is made-
 - (a) where the purchaser's premises are within 20 miles of the flour mill or the seller's store-within seven days of delivery; or
 - (b) where the purchaser's premises are beyond 20 miles and within 100 miles of the flour mill or the seller's store-within ten days of delivery; or
 - (c) where the purchaser's premises are more than 100 miles from the flour mill or the seller's store-within fourteen days of delivery; or
 - (d) where the buyer's premises are situated North of Carnarvon-by the first postal mail following the receipt of the goods;
- "purchaser's railway station or siding" means the railway station or siding most easy of access to the purchaser's premises;
- "North-Western port" means any port in West-ern Australia North of the 26th parallel of South latitude;
- "Whole wheatmeal" means the product made by grinding sound wheat, and which contains in their natural proportions all the constituents of the cleaned grain;
- "standard wheatmeal" means wheatmeal milled or pounded so as to contain the gristed pro-duce of cleaned and sound wheat mixed with wheaten flour in the proportion of 30 parts of the latter to 70 parts of the former;
- "short ton" means 2,000 lb.
- "long ton" means 2,240 lb.
- "'hong ton means 2,210 ho. "wholesale" means in relation to plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal that such plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal is sold to the purchaser for the purpose of re-sale;
- "retail" means in relation to plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in the preceding clause of this paragraph;
- "Shark Bay area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Shark Bay;
- "Carnaryon area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the prin-cipal post office at Carnarvon;
- "Broome area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Broome;
- "Onslow area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Onslow;
- "Port Hedland area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Port Hedland;

- "Roebourne area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-

- Roepourne area means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of ten miles from the principal post office at Roebourne;
 "Derby area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Derby;
 "Yampi area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Yampi;
 "Wyndham area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Wyndham;
 "Marble Bar area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Wyndham;
 "Marble Bar area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Marble Bar;

- State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Marble Bar;
 "Nullagine area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of twenty miles from the principal post office at Nullagine;
 "Wittenoom Gorge area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Wittenoom Gorge;
 "Nooukanbah area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Wittenoom Gorge;
 "Nooukanbah area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Nooukanbah;
 "Fitzroy Crossing area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Fitzroy Crossing;
 "Hall's Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Hall's Creek;
 "Turkey Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Hall's Creek;
 "Turkey Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Turkey Creek.
 Sales by Millers.

Sales by Millers.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal may be sold by millers to be-

- (a) when sold for delivery in the Metropolitan Area and delivered on buyer's premises or delivered to buyers elsewhere than on buyer's premises in bags or other contain-ers of approximately 150 lb. weight— £16 9s. 9d. per short ton.
- (b) when sold for delivery elsewhere than in the Metropolitan Area and delivered in bags or other containers of approximately 150 lb. weight to buyers at mill door, at mill store or mill siding or railway station, or to buyers on buyer's premises at Albany, Rockingham and Spearwood—the appropri-ate price as specified in the First Schedule to this Order. Provided that except for sales ex mill door these prices shall apply only for sales in truck lots of six long tons.
- (c) when sold for delivery and delivered in less than truck lots of six long tons at any railway station or siding other than the mill siding in bags or other containers of approximately 150 lb. weight—the appropriate mill siding place as specified in the First Schedule to this Order plus rail freight chargeable for the transportation of the flour, whole wheatmeal and standard of the flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal from the mill siding nearest to the purchaser's railway station or siding.
- (d) when sold for loading on ship at Fremantle or Geraldton and for delivery at any North-Western port in bags or other con-tainers of approximately 150 lb. weight— the price at Fremantle or Geraldton as the ease may be in according with the price. case may be in accordance with the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order for deliveries at Fremantle or Geraldton (as the case may be), plus loading charges actually incurred at Fremantle or Geraldton as the case may be, plus freight payable on the consignment.

- (e) when sold for delivery in lots of less than

Bread-South-West Land Division of Western Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Act, 1948, and the Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:---

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 42.

Definitions and Interpretations.

2. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears-

"South-West Land Division" means, the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Anstralia as defined in the Land Act, 1933-1946, of that State but excluding from such South-West Land Division (as so defined) that portion thereof hereinafter defined as the "metropolitan area";

"metropolitan area" means, all that area of the State of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Perth;

"booked sale" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this paragraph;

"cash sale" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, any sale within any period of sixteen days where payment for all bread or Vienna bread sold within the said period is made within that period;

"by retail" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in this paragraph;

"by wholesale" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, that the quantity sold by the baker together with the amount sold by him during the preceding six days to the same purchaser is—

in the case of a sale other than for re-sale-

(a) not less than 1201bs. of Vienua bread consisting of $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. loaves or 11b. loaves or a quantity of both, and

(b) not less than 240lbs. of other bread consisting of 1lb. or 2lb. loaves or a quantity of both; in the case of a sale for re-sale--- (c) not less than 30lbs. of Vienna bread consisting of $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. loaves or 1lb. loaves or a quantity of both, and

(d) not less than 60lbs. of other bread consisting of 11b. loaves or 21b. loaves or a quantity of both; "bread'' means, white bread, wholemeal bread, whole

wheatment bread and brown bread;

"11b. loaf" means, a No. 1 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947;

"2lb. loaf" means, a No. 2 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947; "Vienna bread" or "Vienna rolls" means, Vienna

"Vienna bread" or "Vienna rolls" means, Vienna bread or Vienna rolls within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947;

"Vienna $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. loaf" means, a No. 1 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947;

"Vienna 11b. loaf" means, a No. 2 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread and bread rolls, Vienna bread and Vienna rolls may be sold for delivery in the South-West Land Division to be—

(a) in respect of sales of bread and Vienna bread for delivery within the boundaries of those townsites (other than Ravensthorpe, Mandurah and Bridgetown) in which a bakery is established and operating—the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order;

(b) in respect of sales of bread and Vienna bread for delivery within the boundaries of the townsites of Ravensthorpe, Mandurah and Bridgetown—the prices specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;

(c) in respect of sales of bread and Vienna bread for delivery elsewhere in the South-West Land Division-

(aa) in the case of sales by wholesale the maximum wholesale price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that description of bread and Vienna bread by wholesale for delivery in the townsite whose boundaries are nearest to the place where that bread is delivered, plus the actual amount of railage (if any) paid or payable by the seller; or the actual amount of delivery charges (if any) paid or payable by the seller to any other person in respect of the delivery of that bread and Vienna bread to the purchaser;

(bb) in the case of sales by retail the maximum wholesale price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that description of bread and Vienna bread by wholesale for delivery in the townsite whose boundaries are nearest to the place where that bread and Vienna bread is delivered, plus—

(i) the actual amount of railage (if any) paid or payable by the seller; or the actual amount of delivery charges (if any) paid or payable by the seller to any other person, in respect of the delivery of that bread and Vienna bread to the purchaser;

(ii) a margin of one half-penny per loaf in the case of both 11b. and 21b. loaves.

(d) in respect of sales of bread rolls and Vienna rolls the price specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

Provided that where 1lb. loaves of bread or 1/2lb. loaves of Vienna bread are sold to the same purchaser by cash sale to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1lb. loaves of bread shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be a 2lb. loaf, and two 1/2lb. loaves of Vienna bread shall be deemed to be a 1lb. loaf.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a maximum price is fixed by notice in writing to any person in relation to any bread, Vienna bread, bread rolls and Vienna rolls, the maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which such bread, Vienna bread, bread rolls and Vienna rolls may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.  - (b) in the case of a sale for resale—not less than 60 lb. of bread, consisting of 1 lb. loaves or 2 lb. loaves, or a
- of 1 lb. loaves or 2 lb. loaves, or a quantity of both; ''bread'' means white bread, wholemeal bread, whole wheatmeal bread and brown bread; ''1 lb. loaf'' means a No. 1 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947; ''2 lb. loaf'' means a No. 2 loaf within the mean-ing of the Bread Act, 1903-1947.

 - (i) in the case of sales by wholesale the maximum wholesale price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that descrip-Order for the sale of that descrip-tion of bread by wholesale for de-livery in the townsite whose boun-daries (according to the provisions of subparagraph (2) of paragraph 2) are nearest to the place where that bread is delivered plus the actual amount of railage (if any) paid or payable by the seller; or the actual amount of delivery charges (if any) paid or payable by the sel-ler to any other person in respect of the delivery of that bread to the purchaser; purchaser;
 - (ii) in the case of sales by retail the maximum wholesale price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that descrip-tion of bread by wholesale for delivery in the townsite whose boun-daries (according to the provisions of subparagraph (2) of paragraph 2) are nearest to the place where that bread is delivered, plus— (aa) the actual smouth of wailage

(aa) the actual amount of railage (if any) paid or payable by the

seller; or the actual amount of dclivery charges (if any) paid or payable by the seller to any other per-son in respect of the delivery of that bread to the purchaser; (bb) a margin of one half-penny

per loaf, as in the case of both 1 lb. and 2 lb. loaves:

Provided that where 1 lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser by cash sale to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1 lb. loaves shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be a 2 lb. loaf.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this 4. Notwithstalding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, Rottnest Island, the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Area, and the South-West Land Division by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

The Schedule.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 40.

Bread-Perth Metropolitan Area and Rottnest Island. IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Act, 1948, and the Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 40.

Definitions and Interpretations.

2. In this Order, and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears-

"Perth metropolitan area" means all that area of the State of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Perth;

"booked sale" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this paragraph;

"cash sale" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, any sale within any period of sixteen days where payment for all bread or Vienna bread sold within the said period is made within that period.

"by retail" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, that such sale is not a sale by whole-

sale as defined in this paragraph; "by wholesale" means, in relation to any sale of bread or Vienna bread, that the quantity sold by the baker together with the amount sold by him during

the preceding six days to the same purchaser is-in the case of a sale other than for re-sale-(a) not less than 120 lbs. of Vienna bread con-sisting of ½lb. loaves or 1lb. loaves or a quantity of both, and

(b) not less than 240lbs. of other bread consisting of 11b. or 21b. loaves or a quantity of both;

in the case of a sale for re-sale-

(c) not less than 301bs, of Vienna bread consisting of $\frac{1}{2}$ 1b, loaves or 11b. loaves or a quantity of both, and

(d) not less than 60lbs. of other bread consisting of 11b. loaves or 21b. loaves or a quantity of both; "bread" means, white bread, wholemeal bread, whole

wheatmeal bread and brown bread; "11b. loaf" means, a No. 1 loaf within the meaning

of the Bread Act, 1903-1947; "21b. loaf" means a No. 2 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947; "Vienna bread" or "Vienna rolls" means, Vienna

Act, 1903-1947; 'Vienna ½lb. loaf'' means, a No. 1 Vienna loaf with-in the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947; (Wienna ½lb. loaf'' means, a No. 1 Vienna loaf with-in the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947;

"Vienna 11b. loaf means a No. 2 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1947.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread and bread rolls, Vienna bread and Vienna rolls may be sold for delivery in the Perth metropolitan area and Rottnest Island to be-

(a) in respect of sales of bread and Vienna bread for delivery in the Perth metropolitan arca—tho price specified in the First Schedule to this Order;

(b) in respect of sales of bread and Vieuna bread for delivery in Rottnest Island-the price specified in the Second Schedule to this Order

(c) in respect of sales of bread rolls and Vienna tolls for delivery in the Perth metropolitan area and in Rottnest Island-the price specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

Provided that where 11b. loaves of bread or 1/21b. loaves of Vienna bread are sold to the same purchaser by cash sale to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two llb. loaves of bread shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be a 2lb. loaf, and two 1/2lb. loaves of Vienna bread shall be deemed to be a 11b. loaf.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread, Vienna bread, bread rolls and Vienna rolls specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in the Perth metropolitan area and in Rottnest Island by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
