**Gosnells Road Board Resolution.**

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act a local authority may by resolution make by-laws and may alter or amend any by-laws so made: Now therefore the Gosnells Road Board being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act doth hereby make the following by-law to stand as by-law 70 in Part 1 of the said Local Authority's By-laws.

By-law 70, Part 1.

No person other than a contractor to the Gosnells Road Board may undertake or contract for the removal and disposal of night soil within the portion of the Gosnells Road District described in the Schedule hereto so long as the local authority or its contractor executes or continues the execution of such work or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of such work.

## FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902.

## Amendment of Regulations.

C.S.D. 233/46.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, acting pursuant to section 65 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902 (as reprinted with amendments in the 1934 Sessional Volume of Statutes), hereby amend the regulations made by them and in force under the said Act, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of September, 1934, and amended from time to time thereafter (reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments to the 18th day of March, 1949), and since further amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of June, 1949, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder:—

## Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. By deleting the first sentence of Regulation No. 56 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

Any vessel which may require the services of a pilot over the non-compulsory pilotage area in the Outer Harbour as defined in Regulation No. 103 shall proceed to the Sea Pilot Boarding Ground and there wait until boarded by the pilot, for whose services an application shall be made by wireless telegraphy when notification of expected time of arrival at the port, as prescribed in Regulation No. 73 (a), is given.

2. The following new Regulation is made:—

Regulation No. 73 (a)—Notification of Arrival at Port.

(i) Notification of expected arrival time of vessels in the vicinity of the Fairway Buoy marking the approach to Gage Roads shall be given by wireless telegraphy 24 hours ahead, and a second notice of expected time of arrival confirming or amending the previous notice shall be given two hours ahead.

(ii) All vessels with explosives, inflammable liquid and other dangerous cargoes on board shall communicate such information by wireless telegraphy when notice of expected time of arrival is being given 24 hours ahead.

(iii) All such communications shall be addressed to the Harbour Master, Fremantle.

3. The following new Regulation is made:—

Regulation No. 73 (b)—Entry of Vessels.

(i) All vessels entering the port shall except as otherwise provided come to an anchorage in Gage Roads, South of Latitude 32° 01' S., taking care to avoid an area bounded by lines drawn from the light tower on the North Mole on a bearing of 284° for a distance of 1.63 miles, thence on a bearing of 180° for a distance of 7.7 cables, and thence on a bearing of 83° for a distance of two miles to the light tower on the South Mole, this area being reserved for the manoeuvring of vessels into and out of the Inner Harbour.

(ii) Vessels arriving at the port with explosives on board, or desiring to load explosives whilst in port, shall anchor in Gage Roads not less than half a mile from any other vessel, and to the Westward of Longitude 115° 41' 24" E., unless otherwise directed by the Harbour Master.

4. By deleting Regulation No. 103 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—  
No. 103.

Pilotage Compulsory.—(a) Pilotage shall be compulsory upon every vessel not specifically exempted therefrom by these regulations through all waters within the boundaries of the port, excepting between Gage Roads and the Pilot Boarding Ground appointed for the purpose of the non-compulsory pilotage services for which charges are prescribed in Regulation No. 105, paragraph (a).

(b) In those cases where arrangements have been made for vessels to proceed direct to their wharf berth instead of anchoring in Gage Roads as prescribed under Regulation No. 73 (b), they will for the purpose of the compulsory pilotage service into the Inner Harbour, be boarded by pilots after they have passed the Fairway Buoy and before they have reached the locality of the Hall Bank Buoy. Masters of vessels shall, in such circumstances, have the pilot ladder ready at the time of passing the Fairway Buoy.

5. By adding after the word "hundred" in the first line of Regulation No. 104 the words "and fifty."

6. By deleting Regulation No. 105 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—  
No. 105.

Outer Harbour Pilotage.—The charges for pilotage in the Outer Harbour shall be as follows:—

(a) From Sea Pilot Boarding Ground to Gage Roads, or vice versa (non-compulsory)—

(i) All vessels other than whale chasing vessels as provided herein, 2½d. per ton of gross tonnage. Minimum £2 10s. Maximum £15.

(ii) Whale chasing vessels of gross tonnage not exceeding 500 tons if boarded or directly conducted by the Pilot—£5, but if led into the appointed anchorage—£2 10s.

(b) From Gage Roads to Owen Anchorage, or vice versa, all vessels—£7 10s.

(c) From Gage Roads or Owen Anchorage to Cockburn Sound (Rockingham) or vice versa, all vessels—£12 10s.

7. By deleting Regulation No. 106 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

No. 106.

(a) Inner Harbour Pilotage.—The charges for pilotage of vessels from Gage Roads to Inner Harbour, or vice versa, shall be as follows:—

9. By adding the following new paragraph (c) to Regulation No. 109:—

(c) Where a pilot attends a vessel in accordance with an application to conduct the vessel over the non-compulsory pilotage area between the sea pilot boarding ground and Gage Roads and such vessel does not arrive at the boarding ground at the time given, and the pilot is required to wait the arrival of the vessel, detention of the pilot and the pilot vessel shall be payable at the rate of £3 per hour after the first hour for the period of such detention.

10. By deleting Regulation No. 126.

11. The foregoing amendments shall have force and effect as from the first day of November, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-nine.

New Subdivisions and Re-subdivisions.

THE by-laws gazetted on 7th February, 1930, and amendments gazetted 11th October, 1935, are hereby repealed and the following by-law substituted.

Uniform General By-laws—(Section 30, Subsection 1),  
New Subdivisions and Re-subdivisions.

1 (a) Applications for approval of new subdivisions and re-subdivisions of existing lots shall be made to the Board in writing on Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these by-laws, and shall be accompanied by two copies of a plan of the proposed new subdivision or re-subdivision.

1 (b) Where a parcel of land which it is proposed to subdivide or re-subdivide is situated within an irrigation district constituted under the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1941, or within a drainage district constituted under the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, a further copy of the plan of the proposal shall be submitted (3 in all), in accordance with section 22A, subsection (a) of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1945.

1 (c) When, in the opinion of the Town Planning Board, it is necessary to consult with a local authority, public body or other Government Department in accordance with section 24 (1) of the Act, a copy of the plan supplied by the applicant shall be forwarded by the Board to the authority concerned, accompanied by a copy of Form 2 in the appendix hereof.

2. Plans which accompany applications in accordance with the next preceding by-law shall be drawn on a white background and coloured to illustrate the proposal. Plans shall be drawn to a scale not smaller than five chains to an inch and shall show therein:—

(a) The dimensions and areas of the lot or lots which it is proposed to re-subdivide.

(b) The dimensions and areas of the lot or lots which it is proposed to establish.

(c) The position, type, use and condition of all or any buildings on the subject land.

(d) Contours at intervals of not more than five feet for any area or areas to be subdivided greater than three acres; provided that intervals of less than five feet, or levels showing heights in special cases, where they may be required by the Board, or greater contour intervals may be permitted should the topography of the land warrant it and the Board approve;

(e) When under three acres in area, contours are not required, but all other matters in this by-law shall apply where possible;

(f) Flood levels, land liable to inundation, swamps, streams, and any land not naturally drained or having a natural outlet on the surface of the land;

(g) Location, name, widths of adjoining streets and roads, together with size and shape of adjoining lots or portions.

3. In all new subdivisions and re-subdivisions, provision shall be made for the following matters:—

(a) New roads in relation to public convenience, present and prospective, and to intercommunication with neighbouring localities within and without the area;

(b) The draining of the roads and the lands necessary in the circumstances, present and prospective, and the disposal of such drainage;

(c) The treatment of junctions or intersections of roads, the minimum cut-off for a right-angle corner to be 30 links, or 50 links radius; provided that, for intersections or less than a right-angle, the resultant boundary from truncation shall not be less than 42.4 links, or that resulting from a 50-links radius, tangential or truncated boundaries;

(d) The location of existing public works, and whether the district is residential, or other zoned area;

(e) At least 100 feet reservation fronting seashore, lake sides, or banks of streams (exclusive of any road width), and no rear of any lot or lots shall abut such reservation unless expressly approved by the Board;

(f) The size and shape of the lot in relation to the topographical features of the land (e.g., boundaries of lots at right angles or parallel to contours, and generally at right angles or radial to road frontages);

(g) Spaces and sites for dedication to the local or other authorities for parks, recreation grounds, playgrounds, public buildings, schools, churches, memorials, or public services;

(h) When fronting main roads, no block shall be longer than 15 chains, and where more than 10 chains in length provisions shall be made for access by pedestrians, by direct line to the nearest road or street;

(i) The minimum of frontage for residential lots shall be 50 feet and the minimum area 6,000 square feet;

(j) Turning space in laneways at rear of shop sites or industrial sites;

(k) The due compliance with the lawful requirements of the Local Authority in whose district the land is situate, apart from the design of the proposed new subdivision or re-subdivision and other requirements of the Board.

4. Any person who furnishes any false information on the form of application or any false particulars in any plans submitted for the purpose of any application, or who omits to supply to the Board any relevant information or particulars under these By-laws, commits an offence. Penalty £20.

## MINES REGULATION ACT, 1946.

## Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows by inserting a new Regulation as follows:—

## Schedule—Form No. 5.

Regulation 252 (1).—Any person who has been issued with any certificate, except a provisional certificate, which entitled him to be employed as a mine worker and who is not eligible for examination under the provisions of section eight of the Mine Workers' Relief Act, 1932-1943, may be issued with a re-admission certificate in the Form No. 5 in the Schedule to these regulations provided that he is free from the diseases mentioned in the sub-regulation (1) of the last preceding regulation with the exception of silicosis or pneumoconiosis in the early stage.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 22 of 1949.

(Registered 10/8/1949.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1948, this 25th day of July, 1949, between Industrial Extracts Limited (hereinafter called the "employer") of the one part and The West Australian Timber Industry Industrial Union of Workers, South-West Land Division (hereinafter called the "Union") of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree, the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the Wandoo Log Industry as carried on by the employer in the South-West Land Division of Western Australia.

2.—Interpretations.

"Casual worker": Every worker shall be deemed to be a casual worker for the first week of his employment, and during this period his engagement shall be from day to day, at the weekly rate prescribed for his class of work: Provided that, after a factory has closed down or temporarily ceased operations and there still remains upon the factory site a quantity of stocks, plant, or materials to be removed from the site by workers engaged upon the removal, restacking, loading, or in any manner of handling of that stock, plant or material, he shall be deemed to be employed under contract of daily hiring, and shall not come within the scope or provisions of Clause 18 of the Agreement.

"Leading hand" means a worker who, while he is working, has under his charge or control three (3) or more adult persons who are performing the same class of work as himself, and who has been appointed by the employer to take charge or control.

3.—Rates of Pay.

Workers shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of Schedule 1 hereto.

4.—Piecework.

(1) An employer may make a contract with a worker or group of workers for payment by results by piecework.

(2) All disputes between employers and workers or groups of workers, or between the employer and the union concerning any matter relating to payment by results shall, in default of agreement between the employer and his workers or the employer and the union, be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(3) The rates now being paid shall be continued until altered or revised pursuant to the provisions of this clause.

(4) When entering into a contract for piecework the rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a worker of average capacity over a period of three (3) months, if the contract were to be of that duration in the locality specified, for a full week's work of the ordinary hours as prescribed herein for day workers ten per cent. (10%) or more above the minimum time rate of pay as prescribed herein for such week's work plus allowances for holidays, where same are committed to a weekly payment, and such allowances, if any, pursuant to Clauses 13 and 23:—

(5) Any contract for piecework shall contain in express terms a statement as to whether holiday pay is included in the price to be paid for the work.

(6) (i) Contracts for piecework may be revised at the end of each three (3) monthly period from their date.

(ii) If any increase or decrease in the basic wage as proclaimed from time to time is not included in the piecework rates, the worker's earnings shall be increased or decreased, as the case may be, in accordance with such increase or decrease in the basic wage.

(7) Where a worker works part of a week at piecework rates and part at time rates, he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under piecework rates for the amount of work done, and, in addition thereto, such proportionate amount at time rates of pay as prescribed in this Agreement for the portion of the week worked at time rates. In the latter case, the rate of pay shall include such amount, if any, apportioned pro rata if necessary, to which he would be entitled under clauses 13 and 23.

(8) A worker working under any system of payment by results shall receive or be credited with at least the time rate of pay apportioned if necessary. Notwithstanding anything elsewhere in this Agreement contained, when any question arises as to whether any pieceworker has received his time rate of pay, the total payment received by him during the past three months, or during the duration of the contract for piecework, whichever period is the shorter, shall be averaged.

(9) Any time occupied by a pieceworker faller in the performance of such work as sharpening saws and axes, and which is usually performed by a time worker during working hours, shall be taken into consideration when fixing the piecework rates.

(10) Time occupied by a pieceworker walking to and from his working place, when such is situated beyond one and half (1½) miles from the camp, shall be taken into consideration as time worked in fixing piecework rates on the basis of twenty (20) minutes for each mile, both going to and returning from work, between the one and a half (1½) mile point and the working place. If not included when fixing rates for piecework, it shall be paid to the worker as part of his wages.

(11) Where holidays, or equivalent holiday pay, have not been commuted pursuant to subclause (4) hereof, an employer shall grant to any pieceworker in his service paid holidays equivalent to those granted to time workers in accordance with Clause 8. Such holidays, when taken out, shall be paid for at the day work rates prevailing when the holidays are taken. Where the term of service is less than twelve (12) months, holidays for pieceworkers shall be assessed and paid for pro rata.

(12) A contract for piecework may be terminated at any time by either the employer or the worker, in which case payment shall be made for the work done up to date, subject to the provisions of subclause (8) of this clause. In the case of wages, payment shall be made within two (2) hours of application, at the office of the employer, and, in cases where piecework earnings have to be calculated, within two (2) days.

5.—Measuring Logs.

(a) All logs felled or hauled at piecework rates shall be weighed and paid by the ton at the factory landing. Particulars of the logs so weighed shall be given to the pieceworker at least once a fortnight, unless otherwise agreed upon by the employer and worker.

(b) All logs felled shall be paid for in the next fortnightly pay following that in which the logs were felled, subject to the provisions of clause 14.

6.—Shifting or Erecting Camps.

Any worker employed in shifting or erecting camp or assisting therein, or in clearing site for camp, shall be paid at his ordinary rates for the time he is so employed.

7.—Rents for Houses and Huts.

(i) The employer may charge such rents for the use and occupation of the huts or houses owned or controlled by him as may be agreed upon by the employer and worker and the union, and, in default of agreement, such rent (not exceeding the amount ascertained by the application of the Commonwealth Statistician's figures as the average rental for four and five-roomed houses in the four-country-towns statistics for the State) as the Board of Reference may think fit and reasonable.

(ii) In determining what is a reasonable and fair rental the Board of Reference shall—

(a) first ascertain the capital value of the building. Such capital value shall be the actual cost to the employer of the building: Provided that, where the building has been erected prior to the 30th day of June, 1921, there shall be added twenty per cent. (20%) to the cost of the building;

(b) from the capital value so assessed there shall be deducted such amount as shall be estimated to equal the depreciation in actual value of the building, in so far as such depreciation diminishes the letting value: Provided that the depreciation shall not be assessed as an amount exceeding three per centum (3%) per annum.

(iii) The reasonable and fair rental shall be deemed to be not more than the total for the following items—

(a) the percentage on the capital value, at the rate of nine per centum (9%) per annum;

(b) the amount of the rates and taxes;

(c) the amount estimated to be required annually for repairs, including painting, maintenance, and renewal (not exceeding the average amount expended for repairs during the last preceding five (5) years) where the house has been so long erected;

(d) the cost of insurance;

(e) any other cost, charge or outgoing considered by the Board of Reference to be fair and/or reasonable;

(f) the amounts ascertained above shall be reduced to a weekly basis.

#### 8.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to Clause 15 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:— New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day, being an ordinary working day, for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave, as prescribed by this Agreement, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) or subclause (j) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(j) In the area outside a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) Subclause (a) hereof shall not apply except in the case of Anzac Day and Labour Day.

(ii) Subclause (c) hereof shall not apply but except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive week's leave and also Good Friday, Easter Saturday and the week immediately succeeding such days, with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(iii) Subclause (e) hereof shall not apply, but, if after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid twelve hours' pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(iv) Workers engaged on work during the period or periods referred to in paragraph (ii) hereof, shall be allowed equivalent time off at such time as may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

(v) In all other respects the provisions of this clause shall apply.

(k) Pieceworkers whose holiday pay is provided for under Clause 4 shall not be entitled to payment in respect of any holidays or annual leave prescribed herein.

#### 9.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours of workers shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked in five (5) days.

(b) The daily spread of hours shall be such as may be agreed upon by a majority of the workers and employer concerned in any business and approved of by the union. In default of such agreement and approval, such hours shall be worked within nine (9) consecutive hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Fridays—one hour or such other time as may be agreed upon being allowed for luncheon between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(c) Subclause (b) hereof shall not apply to grooms, feeders, log loaders and log haulers, tractor drivers and motor lorry drivers. In the event of a dispute between the employer and the union as to the reasonableness of the daily spread of hours for these workers, such dispute may be referred to a Board of Reference for decision.

#### 10.—Overtime.

(a) Subject to the following, all time worked outside the spread of hours prescribed in Clause 9 hereof, or in excess of the ordinary daily or shift number of hours prescribed therein or elsewhere, shall be paid for as overtime, at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours, and double time thereafter. Work performed during the meal hours shall be paid for at double time rates, but where the total hours worked, including such meal time, do not exceed the prescribed number of hours, then such double time shall be deemed to mean an additional ordinary rate only.

(b) All time worked by grooms and feeders in excess of forty (40) hours in any week shall be paid for as overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first twelve (12) hours and double time thereafter.

(c) All work performed by a pieceworker before or after ordinary hours of work on the instruction of his employer, shall be paid as overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(d) Except where it is otherwise prescribed, all time worked by workers other than grooms or feeders on the holidays to which they are entitled under this Agreement shall be paid for proportionately, in addition to the indirect payment, or to the payment by written agreement for holidays prescribed in Clause 8 at the ordinary rates, and on Sundays shall be paid for at proportionately double rates: Provided that, in the case of work done on either a Sunday or holiday, payment shall be made for two (2) hours at the least at such double rates.

(e) All time worked by workers on Sundays or holidays prescribed herein in maintaining or effecting repairs or renewals to plant or machinery, including the washout of boilers, which it is necessary to effect to enable work to proceed on the next working day, shall be paid for, in the case of Sundays, at the rate of time and a half, and, in the case of such holidays, at ordinary rates in addition to the indirect pay, or to the pay under written agreement for such holidays allowed in Clause 8.

(f) All work performed by a pieceworker on Sundays on the instructions of his employer shall be paid for at double rates.

(g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement:—

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

#### 11.—Lower Grade Work.

Where a worker is transferred, without seven (7) days' written notice, to a grade of work carrying a lower minimum rate of wage than that at which he is usually employed, he shall be paid during such seven (7) days, or any less time so employed, the rate of wage he was receiving for the work usually performed by him.

#### 12.—Higher Grade Work—Mixed Functions.

Subject to the following, where a worker is engaged on higher grade work, he shall be paid the rate prescribed for such higher grade work during the time he is so engaged: Provided that, if engaged at such higher grade work for more than half a day, he shall be paid at the higher rate for the day.

Where a worker is engaged to do work ordinarily consisting of mixed functions coming under varying rates as prescribed herein, he shall be paid at a rate not less than the minimum of the smallest of such rates, plus half the difference at least between the minimum of the smallest and the largest of such rates for such function.

#### 13.—Travelling Time.

(a) Subject to the following, a weekly worker shall, when he is directed or required to work at a place other than his usual place of work, be paid at ordinary rates for all time occupied in travelling to and from the place at which he is so directed, or required to work in excess of the time ordinarily occupied in travelling to and from his usual place of work: Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight (8) hours in any one day.

(b) Every worker in the bush, except a pieceworker, who is provided for under the provisions of clause 4 (10) shall have a starting place for work, which shall be any point not more than one and a half (1½) miles by the nearest practicable route from the camp.

(c) When a worker is required to walk to his work at any place situated beyond the starting point, he shall be paid for all time occupied in walking between the starting point and the workplace at the rate of twenty (20) minutes for each mile or part thereof, both going and returning, that the workplace is beyond the starting point.

(d) New starting places in the bush shall be fixed by agreement between the employer and the union, and, in default of agreement, by the Board of Reference.

#### 14.—Payment of Wages.

(a) All wages due and payable to workers in the bush shall be paid in such manner as may be agreed upon between the employer, the worker, and the Union; or, in default of such agreement:—

(i) Where a bank exists within five (5) miles of the factory or place where the work is performed, weekly in cash at the factory or such place.

(ii) Where no bank exists within five (5) miles of such factory or place, fortnightly or bi-monthly in cash at such factory or place.

Over and above that becoming due on each such period, as the case may be, not more than six (6) days' pay shall be kept in hand by the employer.

(b) If any worker be kept waiting for payment of his wages after working hours for more than fifteen (15) minutes, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for all time he is kept waiting from the termination of his working hours until he is paid.

(c) Should any worker, wherever employed, be dismissed during the course of a week, he shall be paid at the usual place of payment on demand there by him any wages which are legally due to him, within fifteen (15) minutes of dismissal: Provided that, if the usual place of payment be on the work in the bush, then such place of payment shall be deemed to be the nearest office of such employer thereto.

(d) After the 30th day of June in each year, on the request of a worker, the employer shall supply such worker with a statement showing the amount of wages earned by him whilst in the employment of the employer during the preceding twelve (12) months, together with the amount deducted from the wages of such worker by statutory authority.

#### 15.—Time Book.

(a) The employer shall keep a time book or sheets or cards showing the names of his workers, the number of hours worked by each (except as to pieceworkers), the rates of pay, and the wages payable and paid to each worker, and the nature of the work done.

(b) The Secretary or Branch Secretary of the Union, or any official of the Union thereunto authorised in writing by the Union, on production of such authority to the employer or his local manager, shall be allowed at all reasonable times to inspect such time book, sheets or cards, and to make a copy of same. Such time books, sheets or cards for the last preceding twelve (12) months shall be kept available for this purpose.

(c) The Secretary or Branch Secretary of the Union, or any official thereunto authorised in writing by the Union shall, on production of such authority to the employer or his local manager, be allowed at all reasonable times to inspect any part of an employer's works where it is suspected that a breach of this Agreement has occurred, or is occurring, but such inspection shall be carried out in the company of the employer or someone on his behalf. The employer shall provide the necessary facilities for the investigation of the breach, or the supposed breach, of the Agreement, including access to the time books, sheets or cards referred to above. The Union officials shall not interfere with or inconvenience the work and duties of the men more than is absolutely necessary for the proper investigation of the breach, or supposed breach of the Agreement.

#### 16.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

#### 17.—Posting of Agreement.

A copy of this Agreement shall be posted or exhibited by the employer in a conspicuous place, easily accessible to his workers on each of his works.

#### 18.—Contract of Service.

All workers, except those engaged on piecework or on casual work, shall be employed on a weekly engagement, subject to the following terms:—

(a) A worker shall perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require, on the usual days and within the prescribed hours: Provided that, until the

seven (7) days' notice of transfer to a lower grade prescribed by clause 11 hereof expires, such work shall be of or be paid for as of a similar class to that usually performed by such worker.

(b) Employment during the first week of such engagement shall be from day to day, at the weekly rate prescribed, except in the case of re-engagement within one month after the termination of a previous service of the worker under the employer.

(c) A worker, to become entitled to payment of the weekly wage, must be ready and willing to work on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of worker affected. A worker shall not be entitled to payment for any time during which he is absent from his employment, except as provided for in clause 22.

(d) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding paragraphs, a week's notice of the termination of such engagement shall be given on either side. Such notice may be given on any day during the week to terminate such engagement on the corresponding day of the following week, or on any later day thereof: Provided that, in the case of work in the bush and at the factory, such notice may be dispensed with by the consent in writing of the employer and worker.

(e) The employer may dismiss any worker peremptorily without notice for malingering, inefficiency, otherwise than through temporary illness, neglect of duty or misconduct, and pay the worker's wages up to the time of such dismissal only.

#### 19.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer may deduct payment for any day or portion of a day the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike, by or participation in any strike by the Union, by any branch of the Union, or by any members or member of the Union, employed by the employer, or because of any strike by or participation in any strike by any other Union, branch of any other Union, or members or member of any other Union employed by the employer, or because of any breakdown of machinery, or because of any other stoppage of work for any other cause for which the employer cannot be held responsible: Provided that no deduction shall be made unless such stoppage exceeds two (2) hours; so as to obviate as far as possible loss of time to the worker, all plant and machinery shall be kept in a reasonable state of repair by the employer, and every effort shall be made by him to ensure a constant supply of logs at the factory.

#### 20.—Transport Workers.

Where means of transport to the bush are provided by the employer, on the termination of service of a worker, that worker, his family, and his goods and chattels shall be transported free of charge within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt by the employer of notice that such transport is required. But a worker shall not be entitled to free transport on a route along which the public is regularly transported for payment; on the other hand, he shall not be charged a rate on such route in excess of that regularly charged to the public.

#### 21.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purposes of the Agreement—

(a) A Board of Reference to consider and deal with matters mentioned in clause 7 (Rents of Houses).

(b) A Board or Boards of Reference for the purpose of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matters that the Court hereby refers or may from time to time refer for decision to the Board.

(c) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1948, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

(d) Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) representatives, one representative to be nominated by each party.

(e) Separate Boards may be appointed where deemed necessary or advisable for different branches of the industry and/or for different localities.

#### 22.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker (except a worker on piecework or a casual worker) shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

#### 23.—Allowances, etc.

(a) Horsedriver grooming and feeding one or two horses outside ordinary hours shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra, and one shilling (1s.) for Sunday. If more than two horses, the rate shall be two shillings (2s.) per day extra and two shillings (2s.) for Sunday.

(b) A faller engaged on day work and using his own tools and implements shall receive an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day while so engaged.

(c) A leading hand shall receive one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to his ordinary pay.

(d) Casual labourers shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the ordinary rates. For the purpose of this allowance, "casual labourer" shall mean a worker who does not come within the purview of "casual workers" as defined in the Interpretation clause, and who is employed for less than one week.

(e) A worker who is required by his employer to camp in the bush away from a town or away from the factory site shall be paid a camping allowance at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per week.

#### 24.—Part-time Employment.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement to the contrary, the employer and the union are hereby empowered, in the case of emergency or for other cause, which to them may seem sufficient, to provide for a shorter working week at the rate of wages specified in this Agreement, but proportioned to the time to be worked. If such agreement is arrived at, the workers affected shall cease to come within the scope of clause 18 as to weekly hiring, and shall be deemed to be employed under a contract of daily hiring for the period mentioned in the agreement. Any agreement hereunder shall be in writing and signed both by the employer and the secretary or other authorised officer of the Union.

#### 25.—No Reduction.

This Agreement shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving more than the minimum rate prescribed herein for his class of work.

#### 26.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

Cooked Meats and Smallgoods.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 159.

#### Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 3 as amended by Prices Control Order No. 63, is hereby revoked.

#### Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order and the Schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

- (a) "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;
- (b) "Kalgoorlie-Boulder-Coolgardie Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the principal Post Office at Kalgoorlie;
- (c) "Beef sausages" means sausages manufactured by other than a retail butcher, from chopped beef, mutton, lamb, or veal, or any other mixture thereof.

#### Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale, delivered to retail seller's premises or free on rail or free on board, to be the prices specified in the second column of such Schedule.

#### Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) for sales in the Perth metropolitan area—the prices specified in the third column of such Schedule;
- (b) for sales in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder-Coolgardie area—the prices specified in the fourth column of such Schedule;
- (c) for sales outside the Perth metropolitan area or the Kalgoorlie-Boulder-Coolgardie area—the prices specified in the third column of such Schedule, plus in each case the cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to conveying the goods into the retail seller's store.

Provided that no amount shall be added for the cost of transport under the provisions of this sub-paragraph unless such amount has been properly recorded on the invoice delivered in relation to such goods.

#### Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every trader who sells or has for sale by retail, any of the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the Schedule to this Order, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those goods.

#### Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a maximum price for cooked meats or smallgoods is fixed by notice in writing to a person under this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any such goods specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the kinds of service of boot or shoe repairing set out in the Schedule to this Order, including all the materials therefor, may be supplied by any person by retail to be the rate set out in the Schedule opposite each such kind of boot or shoe repairing.

Variation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any kind of service of boot and shoe repairing specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph, may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Price List.

5. Every person who supplies or offers to supply any kind of service of boot or shoe repairing, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall exhibit in a prominent position in his shop, or if he has more than one shop, in each of his shops, a notice setting forth the maximum rate fixed by the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of that kind of service of boot or shoe repairing. I hereby declare that any form of notice shall be deemed to be an approved form if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 49 of the regulations.
