PURSUANT to section 219 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Harvey Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the annual value on that portion of the district described in the Schedule hereto, and may impose rates on the rateable land within such area on the annual value thereof, in accordance with the relative provisions of the said Act, and any Proclamation heretofore or hereafter issued hereunder, and for the time being in force.

The Proclamation published on page 1705 of the *Government Gazette* on September 20th, 1940, is hereby repealed.

road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 18299 (Kanjin Lots 35 and 36 and Kanjin Agricultural Area Lot 163) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage in trust for the purpose of Water with power to the said Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1948, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 23023 (Collie Lot 452) for the purpose of a Drain should be placed under the control of the Municipal Council of Collie as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Municipal Council of Collie as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Part I is amended by inserting after by-law Number 54, a new by-law to stand as by-law 54A as follows:—

54A.—Destruction of Argentine Ants.

(1) The local authority may, at any time and from time to time, give notice, either verbally or in writing to any owner or occupier of premises within the district of the intention of the local authority to enter upon the premises, search for and destroy Argentine Ants thereon.

(2) Every owner or occupier shall, within three days of his receipt of such notice or within such extended time as may be specified in the notice—

(a) remove from ground level all accumulations of refuse, timber and other loose material which may, or which may reasonably be suspected to harbour, or cover Argentine Ants; and

(b) cut clear or otherwise remove all vegetation and other loose material from the boundary fences of the premises.

(3) The local authority may, at all reasonable times and for the purpose of destroying Argentine Ants, enter upon any premises within the district and—

(a) spray the whole or any part of the premises with suitable insecticide;

(b) do such acts and things as may be reasonably necessary to destroy or to facilitate the destruction of Argentine Ants on the premises.

(4) For at least 48 hours immediately following the spraying of the premises by the local authority, the owner or occupier shall not—

(a) heavily water any part of his premises;

(b) turn over the soil or other matter on the premises;

(c) do any act which would or would tend to render ineffective the spraying or other action taken to destroy Argentine Ants;

(d) permit or suffer any person to do any of the acts or things in this by-law mentioned.

(5) Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction be liable to a penalty in accordance with section 335 of the Health Act, 1911-1948, and in addition be liable for all costs, charges and expenses incurred in destroying Argentine Ants upon his premises.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by section 96 of the Vermin Act, 1919, the Dalwallinu Vermin Board hereby orders as follows:—

(a) The respective occupiers and, when no person is in actual possession, owners of all holdings within the district of the Board shall commence the work of destroying rabbits on such holdings, and upon roads bounding or intersecting same not later than 1st February, 1950, and shall continue and systematically carry out the said work for a period of three weeks from said date.

(b) The means by which such destruction shall be carried out shall be, the laying of Phosphorus poison baits through an approved poison cart to the satisfaction of the Inspector wherever evidence of rabbits exists and by the plowing in of all warrens in cleared country to a depth of at least twelve inches.

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Murray Road Board.

(b) "Continuous Service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the third day of September, 1939, and the third day of March 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of ten years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from 30th June, 1936, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average daily rate of pay over the preceding 12 months; (b) the Board may at its discretion either (1) pay to an employee his wage or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of this long-service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of ten years' service. After the completion of the first ten years, employees will then be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave; (b) the Board may at its discretion either (1) pay to an employee his salary or wage periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to an employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his salary or wage for the period of his long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of ten years' service. After the completion of the first ten years, employees will then be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and, during such leave, no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. (a) No person or local authority shall use water supplied under the Act on any day for watering garden or grass plots in streets within the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Area as constituted under the said Act, that is to say the Metropolitan Area lying between Greenmount and Fremantle (both inclusive) and Armadale by means of any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or fixed hose except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m., but during the remainder of the day and night water may be used by hose held in the hand.

(b) No person shall use water supplied under the Act in any place for watering any private lawn or garden by means of any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or fixed hose except between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m., but during the remainder of the day and night water supplied under the Act may be used for watering private lawns and gardens provided that the hose is held in the hand.

2. This Order shall continue in full force and operation until revoked by a subsequent order made by me under the said by-law 283A.

Vermin Drive, 1950.

THE Geraldton, Greenough, Northampton and Upper Chapman Districts Vermin Boards, by virtue of section 98 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1946, hereby order as follows:—
