I, THE said Governor, acting with the advice and

be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report upon—

- (1) alleged cases of brutality at the Claremont  
Mental Hospital, as published by the *Sunday  
Times* newspaper in its issues of the 12th and  
19th February, 1950, including the facts and  
circumstances of each case and the persons  
(if any) involved;
- (2) in relation to the foregoing, any remedial or  
punitive action recommended.

I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commis-  
sion, be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commis-  
sioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix  
to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year  
1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal  
Commission and of a Chairman thereof under that Act.

I request you to hold your inquiry in the presence  
only of those persons who, in your opinion, have occasion  
to be in attendance thereat, except when and to the  
extent that you consider it to be in the public interest  
to admit other persons.

And I request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to  
report to me in writing the result of this, your Com-  
mission.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the  
Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State  
of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons  
from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing  
nets in any of the portions of Western Australian  
waters specified in the First Schedule hereto for a term  
of three years from 1st May, 1950, and from any  
portions of Western Australian waters specified in the  
Second Schedule hereto from 1st August, 1950, to 31st  
December, 1950, and from 1st January to 30th April,  
and 1st August to 31st December in each of the years  
1951 and 1952, and from 1st January to 30th April,  
1953, all dates inclusive.

#### Schedule 1.

That portion of the Indian Ocean, including Parakeet,  
Geordie, Longreach and Thompson Bays bounded by  
lines starting from North Point on Rottnest Island, and  
extending North 40 chains; thence East 153 chains;  
thence South-East 135 chains; thence South-West about  
40 chains to Phillip Point, and thence generally North-  
Westerly and Westerly along the high water mark of  
the said Island to the starting point.

#### Schedule 2.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island  
within the sea limits of half a mile from the foreshore  
from Phillip Point West, North, East and North-East  
to North Point.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1949, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV. of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that Part III. of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to any river, stream, water course, lagoon, lake, swamp, or marsh specified in the Proclamation, to which immediately prior to the issue of the Proclamation, the said Part III. does not apply, but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of 30 days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, stream, water-course, lagoon, lake, swamp, or marsh runs or is situate, to the intent that, before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by Proclamation to declare that Part III. of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Moore River and certain of its tributaries to which immediately prior to the issue of the Proclamation the said Part III. does not apply; and whereas after due notice given the local authorities concerned have either not made or have withdrawn any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Commissioners, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III. of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1949, shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Moore River and certain of its tributaries as defined in Plan No. P.W.D., W.A., 32092, as kept in the Department of Public Works.

## HEALTH ACT, 1911-1948.

## Regulations.

## Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Argentine Ants (Health Act) Regulations, 1950.

## Interpretation.

2. In these regulations, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means the Health Act, 1911-1948 (Act No. 34 of 1911, as reprinted with amendments to and including Act No. 71 of 1948, incorporated pursuant to the provisions of the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938 and pursuant to approval for reprint, 17th March, 1949) and any Act amending or passed in substitution for the Act;

“ants” means Argentine ants;

“authorised person” means a person who is a Public Health official, inspector, officer of a local health authority, and means also a person who is employed for the purposes of these regulations;

“bait” means a mixture of the following:—

Sugar, 1 lb.; tartaric acid, crystallised, 10.3 grains; benzoate of soda, 14.6 grains; sodium arsenite (chemically pure), 26 grains; water, 5/6ths pint; honey, 2½ oz.

Expressions used have the same respective meanings as in the Act.

"Oil mixture" means three percentum kerosene solution of dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane.

"Water mixture" means one percentum of water mixture of dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane.

#### Destruction of Argentine Ants.

3. Subject to the provisions of these regulations, the owner and occupier of premises are hereby jointly and severally empowered and required to free the premises and keep them free of ants by—

- (a) freeing the premises and keeping them free of refuse, garbage, rank vegetation and litter, whether of the same or a different kind from the foregoing, in which ants are present or are likely to be present, or which is conducive or likely to be conducive to the presence of ants;
- (b) trimming and keeping trimmed trees, shrubs, creepers and other vegetation, whether of the same or a different kind from the foregoing, so that no part of them touches any building on the premises;
- (c) spraying with water mixture —
  - (i) to a height of at least twelve inches from the ground level, fences and the outside foundations of buildings;
  - (ii) the edges of concrete paths, garden borders and the butts of trees and shrubs;
  - (iii) the garbage tin or receptacle and its surroundings to a margin of at least twelve inches; and
  - (iv) any place outside buildings where ants are swarming or nesting; on the premises.
- (d) spraying with oil mixture any place where there are ants inside buildings on the premises;
- (e) in places where spraying is not effective or is not likely to be effective in destroying ants, placing baits and containers so constructed that provision is made for ingress to and egress from baits by ants, but so that bird, animal or human life or health is not likely to be endangered.

#### Powers of Authorised Persons.

4. (i) At any time an authorised person may enter into and inspect any premises.

(2) If an authorised person is of opinion that there is default in complying with the provisions of the last preceding regulation in respect of any premises he may, by written requisition served on the owner or the occupier, or both, or, if there is no occupier, by written requisition served on the owner of the premises, require him or them, as the case may be, within such period of time as shall be specified in the requisition, to make good the default, specifying it.

(3) If the occupier, or the owner, or both, as the case may be, does or do not comply with the requisition within the period, the authorised person may cause the default to be made good otherwise than by the owner or occupier, or both.

(4) The cost of making good the default, pursuant to the provisions of the last preceding subregulation, shall be a debt due to the Minister by the owner or occupier, or both, jointly and severally, according as to whether the requisition is served on either or both, and shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

#### Prohibition of Adversely Affecting Spraying.

5. Where the provisions of Regulation 3 of these regulations are complied with as regards spraying, no person shall, within forty-eight hours of the spraying, adversely affect the result of the spraying by any means, whether by watering, digging in, topdressing or otherwise.

#### Prohibition of Transferring Ants from One Place to Another.

6. The occupier, or if there is no occupier, the owner of premises where there are ants shall not move or cause or permit to be moved from the premises anything unless the thing is free of ants.

#### Responsibility of Owner and Driver of Vehicles Used for Transport.

7. The owner and driver of any vehicle shall not use or cause or permit the use of a vehicle for transport unless the vehicle and anything placed in or upon it are free of ants.

#### Penalty.

8. A person who acts in contravention of or does not comply with any of the provisions of these regulations is guilty of an offence and, without prejudice to any civil liability under Regulation 4, is liable on conviction to a penalty pursuant to section 360 of the Act not exceeding twenty pounds (£20) and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings (40s.) for each day during which the offence continues.

46A.—Imitation Cream.

(1) Imitation cream is an emulsion of edible fat or fats, with or without other wholesome foodstuff and flavouring, prepared in imitation of cream. It shall contain not less than 35 per cent. of total fat.

Labelling.

(2) No person shall sell any package containing imitation cream unless there is attached thereto a label in which shall be written the words "Imitation Cream" in letters of not less than 10 points and the label shall not describe the product in any other terms.

The label shall not bear any pictorial or other device suggesting or indicating that the product is cream derived from the cow.

Prohibition.

(3) No person shall sell any imitation cream contrary to nor fail to do any act required by this Regulation.

## Part 3 of Buildings By-law No. 1.

By inserting a new paragraph after paragraph 20, to stand as paragraph 20a, as follows:—

20a. Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses 19 and 20, permission may be granted for the erection of a stable with external walls of brick, stone, concrete, on the rear boundary of land where a parapet wall shall be provided in conformity with clause 60 of this by-law, provided that the nearest portion of such stable is at least 10 feet from the side boundary, 100 feet from any street and 30 feet from any dwelling-house, church, schoolroom, hall, factory, or place where food is manufactured, prepared, packed, or kept for sale.

The stable shall be so constructed as to the walls, roof and floor thereof as to permit through ventilation, daylight illumination, and drainage to the satisfaction of the Council. The Council shall first approve of the site of the proposed building.

A resolution adopting the foregoing by-law was passed by the Council on the 29th April, 1949.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Geraldton made under section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, and numbered 11A for prohibiting the parking of caravans and certain other vehicles without license, for authorising the granting of licenses and for the control and management of certain public reserves.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Geraldton order that the by-laws of the said Municipality passed on the 11th day of December, 1929, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of February, 1930, be amended by the insertion of the following new by-law immediately after By-law No. 11.

## By-law No. 11A.

## Caravans and Camps.

1. In the construction of this by-law subject to the context:—

The word "caravan" shall mean any caravan or vehicle designed or fitted as a habitation for any person or capable of being used for dwelling or sleeping purposes. The word "camp" shall mean any camp, tent, tent-fly, shed or hut and any awning, blind or other structure designed or fitted as a habitation for any person or used or intended for use as a dwelling or for sleeping purposes.

The word "owner," when used in reference to a caravan shall include the licensee, hirer or other person in charge of the caravan.

2. No owner of a caravan shall park it or allow it to remain stationary on any road within the district of the Council at any time between sunset on one day and sunrise on the next following day.

3. No owner of a caravan shall park it or allow it to remain stationary on any land (not being a road) within the district of the Council unless:—

(a) the caravan is so parked or stationary purely for storage and is not in use and the land is private property the owner of which (if he is not the owner of the caravan) has given permission for the storage of the caravan thereon, or

- (b) (i) the owner holds in respect of the caravan a current caravan license under this by-law, and
- (ii) the land has been designated and defined by the Council as a caravan parking area for the purposes of this by-law and the caravan is on the site allotted to it by the Council under the terms of the license relating to it, and
- (iii) the caravan is on wheels and is capable of being drawn in the usual way without any alteration or adjustment.

4. No person shall erect, occupy or use a camp upon a public reserve within the district of the Council unless—

- (i) he or the person in charge of such camp holds in respect thereof a current camping license under this by-law, and
- (ii) the land upon which such camp is erected has been designated and defined by the Council as a camping area for the purposes of this by-law.

5. The Council may, in its discretion and subject to such conditions as it deems fit, grant caravan licenses and camping licenses under this by-law. Application for any such license shall be made in writing to the Town Clerk and shall be accompanied by the fee hereinafter prescribed. Each application shall be in respect of one caravan only and one camp only.

6. Any caravan license granted by the Council under this by-law shall be deemed to be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) The licensee named therein shall pay to the Council a fee equal to the sum of 25 shillings in respect of every period of seven days or part thereof during which the license is to be current with the addition of the sum of two shillings and sixpence.

(b) No license shall be transferable.

(c) The licensee shall personally be present and be in charge of the caravan throughout the currency of the license.

(d) The caravan shall be removed by the licensee from the parking area immediately on or before the expiration of the license.

(e) The license shall be exercised only on that particular part of the parking area described in the license whether described by reference to a numbered plan kept by the Council or otherwise.

(f) The licensee shall not erect or authorise the erection of any fence, rail, post, or other structure upon that part of the parking area the subject of the license except in accordance with the conditions of the license or disturb or authorise the disturbance of the surface of that part except to the extent necessary for the reasonable exercise of the rights granted by the license.

(g) The licensee shall obey the reasonable directions of the Council or the Town Clerk as to positions, time and mode of parking and general care of that part of the parking area the subject of the license.

(h) The licensee shall not light any fire or authorise the lighting of any fire on the parking area, except in a fireplace provided thereon by the Council.

(i) The licensee shall keep that part of the parking area the subject of his license in a clean and tidy condition and free from any unwholesome matter.

(j) The licensee shall cause all refuse and rubbish from that part of the parking area and subject of his license to be deposited in a receptacle provided by the Council for the purpose, and shall not bury or deposit or authorise the burial or deposit of any refuse or rubbish on any part of the parking area.

(k) The licensee will permit the authorised officers of the Council to enter upon that part of the parking area the subject of his license at all reasonable times and will on demand produce his license to any such officer requiring to inspect the same.

(l) The license may be revoked by the Council if it considers, on report from any of its officers that any breach of the conditions thereof has occurred and, on such revocation, such license shall be deemed to have expired and shall cease to have any further force or effect.

(m) On the expiration or revocation of the license, any authorised officer of the Council may remove from the parking area the caravan the subject of the license and may place the same in such place as he deems fit until such time as the licensee or the owner shall take possession of the same and the licensee will pay to the Council all costs and expenses incurred by it in such removal and in the storage of the caravan.

7. Any camping license granted by the Council under this by-law shall be deemed to be the subject of the following conditions:—

(a) The licensee named therein shall pay to the Council a fee equal to the sum of 25 shillings in respect of every period of seven days or part thereof during which the license is to be current, with the addition of the sum of two shillings and sixpence.

(b) No camp shall be erected under the license unless it shall be of a design and of materials specified on the license or approved by the Town Clerk or an officer of the Council authorised by him for the purpose.

(c) The conditions set out in paragraphs (b) to (m), inclusive, of clause 6 of this by-law, with the substitution of the word "camp" for the word "caravan," the words "camping area" for the words "parking area," and the word "camping" for the word "parking" wherever occurring thereon.

8. Any area set aside by the Council for the purposes of this by-law may be set aside both as a caravan parking area and a camping area, and in that case such area shall be deemed to be a caravan parking area for the purpose of every caravan license granted thereunder, and a camping area for the purpose of every camping license granted hereunder.

9. Any license granted under this by-law may be in such of the forms set out in the Schedule to this by-law as is applicable.

10. No licensee to whom a license has been issued under this by-law shall commit a breach of the conditions of such license, whether expressed therein or implied therein by virtue of this by-law.

11. No person shall, upon any public reserve within the district of the Council which has been designated and defined by the Council as a caravan parking area, a camping area or a caravan parking and camping area—

(a) light any fire, except in a fireplace provided by the Council, or use any fire so lit;

(b) bury, deposit or discard any refuse, rubbish, or waste material of any kind;

(c) erect any structure, whether temporary or otherwise, except pursuant to and in accordance with the conditions of a license granted under this by-law;

(d) damage or injure any tree, garden, building, or structure the property of the Council or growing or erected upon such public reserve;

(e) obstruct or interfere with an officer of the Council in the performance of his duties;

(f) misconduct himself or indulge in any noisy, disorderly, or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress;

(g) deposit any filth or matter which is offensive or dangerous to health, or could become offensive or dangerous to health;

(h) enter upon that part of the reserve which is occupied by a licensee under this by-law without the permission of the licensee, or interfere with any such licensee in the enjoyment of the rights conferred upon him by his license.

12. Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law the Council may by special permit, authorise the use of a caravan as a temporary dwelling upon any land specified in such permit for the period and subject to the conditions so specified but every such permit shall be subject to revocation by 14 days notice to the person to whom the same shall be granted and shall be deemed to have expired and to be of no further force or effect at the expiration of such notice. No such permit shall be granted unless a health inspector appointed by the Council as local health authority shall be certified that in his opinion suitable bathroom, lavatory, and laundry facilities and other conveniences are readily available to the occupants of the caravan and that the use of the caravan as aforesaid would not be in contravention of any regulation made in respect of caravans under the Health Act, 1911-1948. The granting or refusal of any such permit shall be in the absolute discretion of the Council. A person exercising the rights given by any such permit shall not be deemed to contravene clause 3 of this by-law but no such permit shall excuse any person from compliance with any other by-law of the Council.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be granted to Employees of the Marradong Road Board.

P.W. 1043/34.

THE Marradong Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Marradong Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.

2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of ten years' continuous service as permanent full time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of July, 1948, be entitled to three months long service leave. Long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wages for the period thereof at a rate equivalent to the average daily rate of pay over the preceding 12 months; (b) the Board may, at its discretion, either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until completion of ten years' service. After the completion of the first ten years, employees will then be entitled to a *pro rata* payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

7. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be granted to Employees of the Canning Road Board.

THE Canning Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Canning Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a

continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the manpower directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of ten years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from November 1st, 1936, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave; (b) the Board may at its discretion either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

5. (a) Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of ten years' service. After the completion of the first ten years employees will then be entitled to a *pro rata* payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

(b) The long service leave granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

6. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

7. An employee dismissed by the Board except in the matter of retrenchment shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

8. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 34 of 1949.

(Registered 12/12/49.)

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1948 of Western Australia, this 21st day of November one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine between the West Australian Local Governing Bodies' Officers Association Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Association") of the one part and the Municipality of Kalgoorlie (hereinafter called "the Local Authority") of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

## 1.—Area.

This Agreement shall extend over and include the boundaries of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie and any premises or land upon which any undertakings of the Local Authority are being carried on.

## 2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers in the employment of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie but shall not include health inspectors.

## 3.—Preservation of Existing Rates and Conditions.

An officer who at the date of the making of this Agreement is in receipt of a higher rate of salary remuneration or allowance or any of whose conditions of employment is superior to any prescribed in this Agreement shall not have his salary remuneration allowance or condition of employment adversely affected as a consequence of this Agreement.

## 4.—Definitions.

"Officer" shall mean an employee eligible to be a member of the Association.

"Permanent officer" for the purpose of this Agreement is one who is appointed by resolution of the Council and is given notice of such appointment in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

"Temporary officer" shall mean one who is engaged from time to time at the discretion of a departmental head and with the approval of the Town Clerk. A temporary officer after six months continuous service shall be placed on the same conditions as a permanent officer.

"Revenue"—(a) Revenue for the purpose of this Agreement shall be deemed to mean the revenue and all other moneys received by the local authority from any and every source subject to the provision of paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) hereof.

(b) Moneys received by way of loan for which a rate has been struck or trust moneys and moneys received from the realisation of real estate and other fixed assets of a capital nature shall not be deemed to be revenue within the meaning of this Agreement.

(c) Revenue received from electric light undertakings or any other trading concern or public utility shall be deemed to be only the net profit of such undertakings or works after providing for all expenses provided that such net profit shall not in any case be deemed to be less than one half of the total receipts from such undertakings or works.

(d) Moneys received from the Department of Main Roads under contract for the construction of any road culvert bridge or similar undertaking or all moneys received for any works to be carried out by the Local Authority shall only be deemed to be revenue for the purpose of calculating the salary of the Town Clerk or Engineer when they are responsible for the efficient carrying out of such works.

(e) At any particular time during the continuance of this Agreement revenue shall mean the revenue calculated according to the foregoing provisions as shown by the accounts of the Local Authority for the financial year preceeding the time in question.

"Town Clerk" shall mean the person appointed to that position in accordance with the Municipal Corporations Act and who may include in his duties the secretaryship of the Local Board of Health, Water Board Sanitary Board or Drainage Board or of one or more of such boards.

"Local Authority" shall mean the Municipality of Kalgoorlie.

"Engineer" shall mean an officer of a Local Authority (excepting a foreman or overseer) who is required to prepare estimates and/or specifications and/or to set out, supervise control and/or inspect outside work of such Local Authority.

"Senior typist" shall mean an officer employed as a typist who is over the age of 21 years.

"Foreman-overseer." A foreman or overseer shall mean an officer of a Local Authority who is required under direction of an engineer or general foreman or general overseer to supervise control and inspect the outside work of such Local Authority.

"General foreman or general overseer." A general foreman or general overseer shall mean an officer other than an engineer who supervises the work of an overseer/foreman or overseer/foremen.

## 5.—Resignations and Dismissals.

Terms of Employment.—Subject to the provisions of the relevant Act or Acts for the time being in force the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) An officer being a Town Clerk or Engineer shall not without the approval of the Local Authority resign from his position until the expiration of one month's notice in writing of his intention so to do. All other officers to be required to give one week's notice.

(b) One month's notice shall be given by the Local Authority to an officer whose services are no longer required provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct.

(c) Temporary Officers.—One (1) week's notice on either side shall be required to terminate a contract of service except where a temporary officer is engaged for a specified period or job.

## 6.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Except as provided in subclauses (b) and (c) the hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday both inclusive with a break of one hour for lunch between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(b) The hours mentioned in subclause (a) may be varied by agreement between the Local Authority and the Association and where the duties appertaining to any officer cannot be efficiently carried out within the prescribed hours then in default of such agreement the hours of work shall be determined by the Board of Reference. Provided however that the officer or officers concerned shall not be required to work (except subject to the provisions of the next following clause) a greater number of hours than those included in the hours specified in the said subclause (a).

(c) The hours of duty of foremen and overseers who exercise control over non-clerical workers shall be the same as those of the men over whom they exercise control.



## 7.—Holidays.

The following holidays shall be granted and paid for namely:—The days observed as New Year's Day Australia Day Good Friday Easter Monday Labour Day Anzac Day State Foundation Day Kalgoorlie Cup Day Boulder Cup Day King's Birthday Christmas Day Boxing Day and all days gazetted as bank holidays and any other day or days which may be proclaimed as a public holiday in the municipality or may be proclaimed as a holiday for persons employed in the Public Service or under the Public Service Act of the Government of Western Australia.

## 8.—Annual Leave.

(a) After the completion of each year of continuous service all officers shall be entitled to and shall take a minimum of three weeks annual recreation leave (exclusive of intervening holidays) on full pay. The leave shall be taken at a time mutually convenient to the officer and the Local Authority at any time within six (6) months of its becoming due.

(b) An officer not completing one year's service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to his length of service.

(c) At least fourteen (14) days' notice shall be given to an officer by the Local Authority before requiring him to take annual leave.

## 9.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All officers of the Local Authority shall after each period of ten (10) years continuous service as permanent full time officers thereof be entitled to three (3) months long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the Local Authority.

(b) In calculating the length of service of any present officer for the purposes of this clause the following shall be deemed to be continuous service as a permanent full time officer of the Local Authority:—

(i) Continuous service with the Local Authority as a permanent officer immediately prior to the date hereof and after the 1st day of January one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

(ii) In the case of an officer employed by the Local Authority on a permanent full time basis immediately prior to entering thereon continuous full time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia between the 3rd day of September one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine and the 3rd day of March 1947.

(c) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed a break in the continuity of service and periods of absence on account of sickness up to but not exceeding three (3) months duration in any one (1) year shall be included in the period of service.

(d) Officers due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average rate of pay over the preceding (12) twelve months.

(e) Any officer leaving the service of the Local Authority on account of sickness or retrenchment or for any other cause which the Local Authority in its discretion thinks reasonable after three (3) years or more continuous service as a permanent full time officer since the date of the commencement of service or since the date on which such officer last became entitled to long service leave hereunder as the case may be and the personal representatives of any deceased officer who dies after a period of service as aforesaid shall be entitled to be paid at the rate hereinbefore provided for such proportion of three (3) months as such period of service as aforesaid bears to ten (10) years.

(f) Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the officer for a further term and during such leave no officer shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Any contravention of the stipulation in this subclause contained shall entitle the Local Authority to dismiss the officer from its service forthwith.

## 10.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) all work done outside the hours specified in clause (6) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Executive officers and heads of departments shall receive overtime as specified in paragraph (a) only for work of a special nature in excess of their normal duties.

(c) Where an officer other than a departmental head or executive officer is required to be on duty on any of the holidays mentioned in clause (7) or on Saturdays or Sundays he shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(d) A minimum of two (2) hours shall be paid when overtime is worked.

## 11.—Minimum Salary of an Officer Acting in a Higher Grade or in a Dual or Multiple Capacity.

When an officer:—

(a) Performs the duties of a position of a grade higher for not less than one (1) week than that to which he is appointed he shall be paid whilst performing the duties of such position the salary awarded for such position.

(b) Carries out the duties of or occupies a dual office he shall be paid the salary pertaining to the higher office.

(c) Carries out the duties of or occupies more than two (2) positions he shall be paid in addition to the salary prescribed by subclauses (a) and (b) hereof ten per centum of the salary of each of the other positions occupied whether the salary for such other position or positions is prescribed by this or another Agreement.

## 12.—Sick Leave.

In the event of absence from duty on account of personal sickness all officers shall be entitled to payment for such absence on full pay as follows:—Ten (10) days full pay for each year of service with a maximum of sixty (60) days on production of a medical certificate that such leave is necessary.

## 13.—Travelling Expenses.

(a) All reasonable out-of-pocket and travelling expenses incurred by an officer in the discharge of his duties shall be paid by the Local Authority. This shall include fifteen (15) shillings per day away from home allowance. When meals only are required these shall be paid for at the rate of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per meal. The method and mode of travelling or the vehicle to be supplied shall be mutually arranged between the Local Authority and the officer concerned provided however that nothing herein contained shall impose an obligation on any officer to provide a method of conveyance at his own expense nor shall it be a condition precedent to the appointment of an officer that he shall provide a conveyance at his own expense.

(b) When by arrangement the officer supplies his own mode of conveyance there shall be added to his expenses an amount equal to a fair rental value of the vehicle or vehicles and horse or horses as the case may be and the amount expended for horse feed, or petrol and lubricants or in lieu car hire to be paid at the rate of ninepence (9d.) per mile when his own vehicle is used.

(c) If the parties cannot agree upon any question arising under subclauses (a) and (b) hereof the matter may be referred for settlement by either party concerned to the Board of Reference.

## 14.—Preference to Seniority on Promotion.

Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office preference to fill such vacancy may be given to the senior officer of that department regard being had to his efficiency and long service.

## 15.—Salaries.

(a) The annual salary of the Town Clerk shall be as set out in schedule "C" appended hereto and shall be based on the annual revenue of the Local Authority for the preceding financial year and shall take effect as from the first day of the new financial year.

(b) The annual salaries of engineers shall be as set out in schedule "C" appended hereto and shall be based on the annual revenue exclusive of electric light revenue of the Local Authority for the preceding financial year and shall take effect as from the first day of the new financial year.

(c) The salaries of all other officers shall be as set out in schedules "A" and "B" appended hereto.

(d) Any officer who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be employed at and paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Association and the Local Authority. In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

#### 16.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the Regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1948. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement the functions of:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the whole and/or any of the provisions of the Agreement.

(ii) Classifying and fixing wages rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement.

(iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act 1912-1948, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

#### 17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of twelve (12) months from the date hereof.
