WHEREAS by paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of section 3 of Part VIA of the Police Act, 1892-1945 (as inserted by the Police Offences (Drugs) Act, 1928), it

is provided that if it appears to the Governor that any new derivative of morphine or cocaine, or of any salts of morphine or cocaine or any other alkaloid of opium or any other drug of whatever kind is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine, the Governor may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare that Part VIA of the said Act shall apply to that new derivative or alkaloid or other drug in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in paragraph (a) subsection (2) of section 3 of Part VIA of the said Act; and whereas it appears to the Governor that the drug phenadoxone (also known as heptalgin) identified chemically as 6-morpholino-4 : 4-diphenylheptan-3-one hydrochloride, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of phenadoxone are or are likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by paragraph (e) subsection (2) of section 3 of Part VIA of the said Act, hereby declare that Part VIA of the said Act shall apply to the drug phenadoxone (also known as heptalgin) identified chemically as 6-morpholino-4 : 4-diphenylheptan-3-one hydrochloride, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of phenadoxone, in the same manner as Part VIA of the said Act applies to the drugs mentioned in paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 3 of Part VIA of the said Act.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, subsection (3), it is enacted that the Governor may at any time and from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that in any district or portion of a district it shall be lawful to use wood or other structural material in the construction of the external and internal walls of any building intended for use as a dwelling house, and, notwithstanding that the provisions of the Second Schedule to the said Act have been extended to and are in operation in such district or portion of a district, any provisions of the said Second Schedule and any by-laws made thereunder which are deemed to be inconsistent with or repugnant to the authority granted by such Proclamation shall be suspended or have no force or effect or relation to such building aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation declare that it shall be lawful to use wood or other structural material in the construction of the external and internal walls of any building intended for use as a dwelling house which is erected within the Darling Range Road District except within that portion described in the Schedule hereto.

THE LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893-1948.

Rules of the Barristers' Board.

WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1948, herein called the Act, the Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned; and whereas it is desirable to amend the rules of the Board as published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 45) for the 5th August, 1949: Now, therefore, the Board by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby at a meeting duly held the 28th day of April, 1950, make and publish the following amendments to the said rules.

A new rule is inserted between rules 54 and 55 as follows:—

54A. (i) The Board, before giving its certificate under rule 54, may require any applicant for admission as a practitioner under section 15, paragraphs (a) or (b) of the Act, to pass such examination to test the applicant's fitness for admission as it may in its discretion think fit.

(ii) Such examination shall be in such subjects and shall be conducted by such person or persons and at such time and place and in such manner as the Board may direct.

(iii) The fee payable by an applicant applying to be examined under this rule shall be five guineas.

No person, unless authorised in writing in that behalf by the Northam Municipal Council, shall remove any house or trade refuse or other rubbish from any premises situate within the district of the Northam Municipal Council.

Provided that the occupier of a house may himself use his own house refuse or rubbish, except night soil, urine or liquid wastes, if in so doing he takes sufficient precautions, to the satisfaction of an inspector, to prevent the creation of any nuisance or anything offensive or injurious to health.

Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Sussex Road Board.

P.W. 690/45.

THE Sussex Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) “Board” means the Sussex Road Board.

(b) “Continuous service” means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time services with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the manpower directorate to serve elsewhere, between the third day of September, 1939, and the third day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of ten years’ continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from 1st January, 1943, be entitled to three months long service leave. Long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months’ notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid—(a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average daily rate of pay over the preceding 12 months; (b) the Board may at its discretion either (1) pay to an employee his wage or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of this long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of ten years’ service. After the completion of the first ten years, employees will then be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the above regulations, the Minister shall have the power to: (a) to refuse to accept any enrolment; (b) to cancel any enrolment at any time; (c) to suspend any student for any stated period.

The Minister shall not be required to give any reason or reasons, for any action taken under this Regulation.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 2 of 1950.

Between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Dalgety and Company Limited, Elder Smith and Company Limited, Wm. Haughton & Company Limited, Joyce and Watkins, T. Dewez and Company Proprietary Limited, Respondents.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Wool, Hide and Skin Stores Award."

3.—Area.

This agreement shall be limited in its effect to that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of twelve (12) months from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

(A) Wool Store Section.

5.—Definitions.

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave his employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that—
(i) a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day;

- (ii) where a casual hand is dismissed, the wages due to him shall be paid in cash on the termination of his employment, but where a casual hand is dismissed for cause, the wages due to him shall be paid not later than the next day;
- (iii) any worker who is taken on between the 1st March and the 31st August, inclusive, and who is not kept on for four (4) consecutive weeks, shall be regarded as a casual hand and shall be paid the casual rate prescribed herein.
- (b) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side: Provided that—
- (i) any worker who is taken on between the 1st September and the 28th February in the following year, inclusive, shall be regarded as a casual hand and paid the rate prescribed for a casual hand;
- (ii) if a worker is engaged prior to the 1st September and his engagement is terminated by his employer on or before the 28th February in the following year, he shall be regarded as a casual hand and paid the rate prescribed for a casual hand from the 1st September;
- (iii) any worker who is in the employ of the employer prior to the 1st September and who is kept in his employment up to and including the 28th February in the following year, shall be regarded as a weekly hand and paid the rate prescribed for a weekly hand for any work performed prior to the 1st September and after the 28th February in the year following (such worker shall, however, receive five per cent. (5%) in addition to the prescribed rate for the period between the 1st September and the 28th February in the year following); and for any continuing periods whilst casual hands are employed in the store;
- (iv) casual rates shall not be paid to any worker who, being in the employ of the employer prior to the 1st September is transferred from his employer's wool store to do work in his hide and skin store, or vice versa, during the period between the 1st September and the 28th February in the year following, inclusive, unless such worker's services are terminated by his employer on or before the 28th February, in which case the worker shall be paid the prescribed casual rate only for the time he has been employed in the wool store: Provided that if the total time worked in the wool store and the hide and skin store be less than four (4) consecutive weeks, the worker shall be paid the rate prescribed for a casual hand for the work performed in both stores.
- (c) "Head classer" shall mean a worker in charge of other workers who classes wool for export or packs for appraisement, auction sales or shipment and takes over country consignments.
- (d) "Assistant classer" shall mean a worker who classes for one or more of the following—export, auction sales, appraisements or shipments, which work shall not include the work usually performed by a piece picker as defined in subclause (f) of this clause.
- (e) "Assistant storeman" shall mean a storeman in charge of a branch store separated from the main place of business, or a storeman who is working in a similar capacity in the main store under the man in charge of the wool store.
- (f) "Piece picker" shall mean a worker—(i) separating the clean from the dirty; (ii) separating the large and longer staple pieces and bellies from the short; (iii) taking the rough and stains from cleaner pieces and separating for colour.
- (g) "Leader of gang" shall mean a worker who is placed in supervision over other storemen, notwithstanding that he may himself be under the supervision of the head classer or man in charge. If he be so employed, he shall be paid one shilling (1s.) in addition to his ordinary wage for that day. When working

overtime as leader of gang he shall be paid overtime rates as prescribed, plus threepence (3d.) per hour for being leader of gang.

(h) "Wool sorter" shall mean a worker other than a head classer or assistant classer who sorts wool for quality irrespective of the portion of the sheep's or lamb's body from which it originates.

6.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(b) Overtime rates shall be—

- (i) for work performed up to 10 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive—time and a half;
- (ii) for work performed after 10 p.m. until 8 a.m. the next day, Monday to Friday inclusive—double time;
- (iii) for work performed between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday—time and a half;
- (iv) for work performed on Saturday, after 12 noon, or during a meal hour, or on Sunday or on any of the holidays prescribed by this agreement—double time.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this agreement—

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) no organisation, party to this agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause;
- (iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

8.—Meal Hours and Meal Money.

(a) One (1) hour shall be allowed for each meal: Provided that where the distance or any other unavoidable circumstances does not permit a worker obtaining a meal in that time he shall on notifying the employer prior to the taking of the meal period be allowed up to one and one-half (1½) hours for any meal taken after 5 p.m., otherwise meal hours shall be as under:—12 noon to 1 p.m., 5 p.m. to 6 p.m., 12 midnight to 1 a.m., 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

(b) If any worker is required to return to work after 6 p.m. Monday to Sunday inclusive, he shall be paid two shillings (2s.) meal money. A worker shall also be entitled to two shillings (2s.) meal money, if he is required to work after 12 o'clock midnight, or if he is required to work after midday on Saturday or Sunday for a period of not less than one hour.

(c) Should a worker who has worked during the night up to breakfast time in the morning be required to continue working after 8 a.m., he shall be paid two shillings (2s.) meal money: Provided that such payment shall not be made in the case of a worker who starts work at 7 a.m.

(d) Meal money shall be paid to the worker not later than 5 p.m. on the day that he is required to return to work overtime.

9.—Smoke-ohs.

If any worker is required to work beyond 9 p.m. and/or 3 a.m. he shall be allowed an interval of fifteen (15) minutes for smoke-oh.

- (b) Junior casual hands—Any junior worker employed for less than four (4) consecutive weeks shall be paid at the rate prescribed in subclause (2) (a) of this clause plus twopenny (2d.) per hour.

11.—Duties of Junior Weekly Hands.

If any junior weekly hand is called upon to do any work other than the following, namely: Marking, branding, working lift, cleaning up, sweeping, sewing (other than sewing up), elementary classing, driving

hoist, winch or stacking machine, or any light work ordered by the storeman, he shall be paid the minimum adult rate. Driving of stacking machine shall not include hauling it from place to place unassisted.

12.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

The number of junior workers shall not exceed the proportion of one (1) junior to every four (4) adult workers covered by this section of the agreement.

13.—Engagement.

All labour required in the wool stores for the day shall be engaged between 7.30 a.m. and 8 a.m. but in the event of sufficient men not being available between these times, the employer shall have the right to engage other labour which may report later in the day: Provided that workers shall be entitled to payment only as from the time at which they are told to report for work.

(B) Hide and Skin Store Section.

14.—Definitions.

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker who is engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave his employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that—

- (i) a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day;
- (ii) where a casual hand is dismissed the wages due to him shall be paid in cash on the termination of his employment, but where a casual hand is dismissed for cause, the wages due to him shall be paid not later than the next day.

(b) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker who is engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side: Provided that any worker who is employed for less than four (4) consecutive weeks shall be classed as a casual hand and paid the rates prescribed for a casual hand.

(c) "Head classer and/or head storeman" shall mean a worker in charge of other workers and who classes skins and/or hides for export and packs for appraisement auction sales, shipment, or takes over country consignments.

(d) "Assistant head classer" shall mean a worker who assists the head classer in classing for export, auction sales and for appraisement, and takes over country consignments.

(e) "Assistant storeman" shall mean a worker who assists the head storeman or takes charge of a branch store.

(f) "Skin classer" shall mean a worker who classes for auction sales and takes over country consignments.

15.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive: Provided that the working days and starting and finishing times of workers employed at the abattoirs at Midland Junction or Fremantle, or at other skin drying sheds, shall be mutually arranged in writing between the employer and the Union: Provided that the hours worked in each shift shall be continuous. Forty (40) hours shall also constitute a week's work at the said abattoirs, or at other skin drying sheds: Provided that the said hours shall be worked in five (5) days.

16.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in clause 15, all time worked prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(b) Overtime rates shall be—

- (i) for work performed up to 10 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive—time and a half;
- (ii) for work performed after 10 p.m. until 8 a.m. the next day, Monday to Friday inclusive—double time;
- (iii) for work performed between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday—time and a half.

- (iv) for work performed on Saturday after 12 noon, or during a meal hour, or on Sunday or on any of the holidays prescribed by this agreement—double time.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this agreement—
 - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
 - (ii) no organisation, party to this agreement, or worker or workers covered by this agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause;
 - (iii) this subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

17.—Meal Hours and Meal Money.

- (a) One (1) hour shall be allowed for each meal. Meal hours shall, subject to the proviso in clause 15, be as under:—12 noon to 1 p.m., 5 p.m. to 6 p.m., 12 midnight to 1 a.m., 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.
- (b) If any worker is required to work after 6 p.m. Monday to Sunday inclusive, he shall be paid two shillings (2s.) meal money. A worker shall also be entitled to two shillings (2s.) meal money if he is required to work after 12 o'clock midnight, or if he is required to work after midday on Saturday or Sunday for a period of not less than one hour.
- (c) Should a worker who has worked during the night up to breakfast time in the morning be required to continue work after 8 a.m., he shall be paid two shillings (2s.) meal money: Provided that such payment shall not be made in the case of a worker who starts work at 7 a.m.
- (d) Meal money shall be paid to the worker not later than 5 p.m. on the day that he is required to return to work overtime.

18.—Wages.

(2) Junior Weekly Hands: The rates of wages for junior weekly hands and junior casual hands employed in the hide and skin store section shall be the same as those prescribed in subclauses (2) (a) and (b) of clause 10 for junior workers in the wool store section.

19.—Duties of Junior Weekly Hands.

If any junior weekly hand is called upon to do any work other than the following, namely, marking, branding, working lift or hoist, cleaning up, sweeping, sewing up, handling skins, elementary classing or sorting, or any light work, he shall be paid the minimum adult rate.

The minimum adult rate shall be paid to any junior worker who is required to handle hides or wet painted skins.

20.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

The number of junior workers shall not exceed the proportion of one (1) junior to every four (4) adult workers covered by this section of the agreement.

21.—Changing Time.

The employer shall provide a suitable place and shall allow time for changing of clothes.

22.—Engagement.

All labour shall be employed as required by the employer.

23.—Smoke-ohs.

If any worker is required to work beyond 9 p.m. and/or 3 a.m., he shall be allowed an interval of 15 minutes for smoke-ohs.

24.—Leggings and Aprons.

The employer shall provide leggings and/or aprons, if required.

General Clauses (Applicable to Sections (A) and (B)).

25.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.
- (d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other

workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

26.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work for which a higher rate is prescribed in this agreement than that which he usually performs, shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

27.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing—

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this agreement applies;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the hours worked each day by him;
- (d) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him;
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

Such book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union between the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

28.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

29.—Pay Day.

Wages shall be paid on any one of the first five (5) days of the week: Provided that, when overtime is worked on payday, workers shall be paid in time to enable them to leave their work by 5 p.m.

30.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this agreement, a Board of Reference.

The Board shall consist of a chairman and two representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There shall be assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this agreement, the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this agreement or any of them;
- (b) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specially mentioned in the agreement;
- (c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, which for the purpose are embodied in this agreement.

31.—Gong.

The employer shall provide a gong and all work shall start and finish with the gong.

32.—Travelling Time.

When a worker is required during his ordinary working hours to work outside his usual place of employment, or is transferred from one job to another, the employer shall provide the necessary means of transport or pay the worker any reasonable expenses incurred.

33.—Basic Wage Variations.

The hourly rates as set out in clauses 10 (1) (b) and 18 (1) (b) are subject to adjustment in accordance with any variations of the basic wage which may be ordered by the Court from time to time.

I certify, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 4 of 1950.

(Registered 24/3/50.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, this 10th day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifty, between the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the employer") of the one part and the Builders Labourers' Union of Workers of Perth, (hereinafter referred to as "the union") of the other part, whereby the said parties mutually agree as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This agreement shall apply to members of the Builders Labourers' Union of Workers of Perth, employed by the State Electricity Commission in the State of Western Australia, provided it shall not apply to any workers now already provided for by prior awards of the Court.

2.—Term.

This agreement shall operate for three (3) years from the date hereof: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) calendar months from the date hereof the Court may alter or amend same on the application of either party.

3.—Definitions.

(1) For the purpose of this agreement builders' labourers are divided into three (3) classes as follows:—

(i) Leading labourers:

(a) Scaffolders, riggers, dogmen, gear hands.

(b) Workers engaged in under-pinning and timbering basements.

(ii) Leading labourers:

(a) Hod carriers, mortar mixers, persons wheeling to and from the lift or engaged in filling boxes with materials to be lifted with winch, hoist, elevator or crane required for serving bricklayers, plasterers or masons.

(b) Workers engaged in the erection of steel stanchions, girders, principals and the erection of steel structural work when such work is part of the contractor's contract and under his direct control.

(c) Workers engaged on furnace work and bakers' ovens.

(d) Workers engaged in mixing, preparing and delivering of materials used hot, such as bitumen, trinidad and other similar patented materials.

(e) Workers engaged in the setting and jointing of pipes for sewerage or storm water drainage.

(f) Drainage workers engaged in connection with building operations.

(g) Workers engaged in the timbering of shafts, pits or wells in or around buildings.

(h) Workers engaged in the preparation of granolithic surfaces.

(i) Workers engaged in the mixing of plastic materials and the cleaning up of floors and woodwork after the application of such materials.

(iii) Workers engaged in:

(a) Mixing, preparing or delivering or packing of concrete in connection with the erection of structures or buildings.

(b) Preparing or bending or placing into position steel reinforcements in concrete in connection with building operations.

(c) The demolishing and removing of buildings.

(d) Clearing, excavating or levelling off of sites for buildings when such work is under the building contractor's contract and under his direct control.

(e) Road construction work in connection with approaches to buildings inside the building line (other than road construction work governed by any award of the Court of Arbitration or agreement registered with that Court).

(f) General labourers comprising men engaged as builders' labourers not included under the two previous classifications.

(2) General:

(a) "Casual worker" means a worker employed for less than one (1) week continuously, but does not include a worker who, when work is available, leaves his employment before the expiration of one (1) week.

(b) "Temporary worker" means a worker temporarily employed for a full week or more continuously but not appointed to a position on the regular staff of the Commission. Subject to his successfully passing a prescribed medical examination after three months' service he may be forthwith appointed to a position on the regular staff of the Commission as a permanent worker.

(c) "Permanent worker" means a worker who has been appointed to a position on the regular staff of the Commission. Nothing in the definitions of temporary and permanent worker shall operate to discriminate between the employment.

4.—Mixed Functions.

(a) A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher rate of pay than his classified rate for two hours in any day or shift shall be paid such higher rate for the whole of the day or shift.

(b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade, his wage shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity.

5.—Contract of Service.

(a) No worker, other than a casual or a temporary worker with less than six months' service, shall leave the department until the expiration of fourteen (14) days' written notice of his intention so to do without the approval of the Commission.

(b) Except in the case of summary dismissal for misconduct, peculation or theft, fourteen (14) days' written notice shall be given by the Commission to any worker other than a casual or a temporary worker with less than six months' service, whose services are no longer required and the reason for dismissal shall be stated in such notice, provided that in the case of a temporary worker with less than six months' service, one day's notice shall be given.

(c) The Commission shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union party to this agreement or by a union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union associated with it or through the breakdown of the Commission's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the Commission cannot reasonably prevent.

6.—Absence from Duty.

(a) Any worker losing time through sickness or injury shall as soon as possible notify his foreman, or other officer-in-charge in sufficient time to permit of arrangements being made for the performance of his duties.

(b) Subject to the provisions of clause 7 (Payment for Sickness) any worker losing time through sickness or special leave shall be reduced in wages only to the extent of the time actually lost through sickness or granted as special leave.

7.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the Commission shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof to the satisfaction of the Commission or its representative of sickness, but the Commission shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to a worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Commission after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the Commission.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds an aggregate of thirteen (13) weeks in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by the Commission for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with the Commission.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause other than for peculation or theft shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) When work is closed for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken workers with less than a full year's service shall be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them: Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Commission of its right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greater proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the annual leave.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

9.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) (i) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(ii) If any worker is required to work on a public holiday prescribed as a holiday under this agreement which falls on a non-working day, he shall be paid the rate which he would have been paid if the day had not been a public holiday, and in addition shall have one day for each holiday so worked added to his annual leave.

(c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the whole of the working day immediately preceding a holiday or resumes duty or is available on the whole of the working day immediately following a holiday as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) Day workers employed on Sunday work shall be entitled to half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one day extra on their annual leave for every four (4) Sundays worked during the year; Sunday work shall not be counted for the purpose of this subclause unless at least three (3) hours actual work is done.

(g) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

10.—Rest Period.

(a) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning. This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by employees during this interval but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstances. Upon proof of breach by any employee of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied the Court may grant the employer concerned exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid.

(b) Workers engaged on essential emergency work or on some process in course (e.g., concreting) may be required to take the prescribed tea break at such time and in such manner as considered necessary by the officer-in-charge of the job or in his absence by the foreman.

11.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions relating to full-time Government wages employees generally as in force as at the date of this agreement and as may be amended from time to time, shall apply to all workers employed under the provisions of this agreement.

12.—No New Designation.

No new designation shall be introduced during the currency of this agreement so as to reduce the status of any worker covered thereby.

13.—Shop Stewards.

Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the union shall be recognised by the Commission.

14.—Hours of Duty.

(1) Day workers—

(a) Forty (40) hours, exclusive of Saturday and Sunday work shall constitute a week's work. No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours.

(b) The ordinary hours of duty shall be between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday.

(c) The usual hours of duty within the scope as provided in subclause (b) hereof shall not be altered without consultation with the union concerned, party to this agreement.

(2) (i) The Commission may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) The union or any worker or workers covered by this agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

15.—Guaranteed Week.

(a) The Commission shall guarantee to each worker, other than a casual or a temporary worker with less than six months' service, a full week's work, exclusive of Saturday and Sunday work, except during such period as by reason of any action on the part of any section of its workers or for any other cause beyond its control, the Commission is unable wholly or partially to continue operations at the generating stations and/or at any of its undertakings. Each week shall stand by itself.

(b) The guaranteed period may be reduced or affected as follows:—

(i) Where a worker is suspended, the provisions of clause 16 (Wages during Suspension) shall apply.

(ii) In respect of any day when, as a result of a vote taken by the workers concerned with the consent of the Commission or by agreement between the Commission and the union, a holiday is taken.

(iii) In respect of any day a worker is absent except through sickness as provided for in clause 7.

16.—Wages During Suspension.

(a) Where a worker is suspended and the charge is not proven, full wages for the period of suspension shall be paid.

(b) Where the charge is admitted or proven, the worker may be deprived of wages for the whole or any portion of the period of suspension, but in such case the Commission shall decide the amount of wages of which it is intended to deprive the worker and any such deprivation shall be recorded and regarded as part of the punishment.

(c) Unless proceedings on any charge are commenced within seven (7) days of the first laying of the charge and finalised within one month of such date the charge shall lapse and full payment of wages made to the worker for the complete period unless proceedings are delayed by causes outside the control of the Commission.

17.—Overtime and Sunday Work.

(1) Any worker who is called upon to work overtime for more than two (2) hours shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) for a meal or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment.

(2) Any worker who has left the premises at which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one (1) hour shall receive payment for one (1) hour at overtime rates.

(3) If a worker is required to work during the recognised meal period so that the commencement of the meal period is postponed for more than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) an hour, that worker shall receive payment at double time rates until he gets his meal.

(4) Subject to the preceding subclause, if a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not in consequence obtain during the shift the full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained or any portion lost.

(5) The expression "recognised meal period" means the period customarily observed as the meal period between fixed times on the job, or at the works, as the case may be, except where the time of commencement of the customary period is altered by mutual consent of the employer and the workers on a job to suit the convenience of the workers or the employer, in which case the altered times shall be the basis of any rights under the preceding subclauses (3) and (4).

(6) A worker who commences at or after midnight shall be paid double time until 6 a.m. the following morning, and, subject thereto, all work performed outside the normal limits of the hours of labour shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) of this clause, for the purpose of this subclause, the normal limits of the hours of labour shall be ascertained by reference to the time of commencement and time of finishing generally observed in regard to the worker in question for the particular job on which he is engaged.

(7) All time worked on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

18.—Away from Home Allowance.

(a) When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares, including sleeper and, except when a camp allowance is paid under clause (b) hereof, proper allowance at current rates for all necessary meals and board and lodging. Fares shall be second class except when travelling by coastal boat when saloon fares shall be paid and shall include return fares on completion of job.

(b) (i) When a worker is required to live in a tent or hut away from his usual residence or home station he shall be paid a camping allowance of four shillings (4s.) for each working day he is required to hold himself and does hold himself available in a camp throughout the said day, whether or not work is done on the said day: Provided, however, the total amount payable under this provision shall not exceed twenty shillings (20s.) per week.

(ii) Provided further that if suitable accommodation, not being a tent or hut, is provided for a married worker and his dependants there shall be no obligation to pay any allowance under the previous subclause.

(iii) Rent may be charged for any tent or huts or other accommodation supplied, at rates to be fixed or failing agreement as decided by the Board of Reference.

(iv) Liberty is reserved to the union in regard to subclause (b).

19.—Payment for Travelling Time.

(a) A worker going to work away from or returning to his home station shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual travelling or waiting time for the first eight (8) hours, and thereafter at half the ordinary rates in any one period of twenty-four (24) hours.

(b) Where waiting time exceeds four (4) hours and suitable accommodation is made available at the employer's expense, the worker shall be deemed to be booked off duty, and shall not be entitled to payment for the time he is booked off.

(c) Sunday travelling time shall be paid at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

(d) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.: Provided this shall not operate to reduce the travelling time to be paid for below four (4) hours in any one (1) day: Provided further that where by virtue of the length or nature of the journey the sleeping berth is available for six (6) hours or less, travelling time shall be paid for such period with a minimum of four (4) hours.

(e) A worker residing within the suburban area who is required to start work at some place other than his home station within the suburban area shall—

(i) if notified the previous evening, travel one way from or to work in his own time, provided that there is suitable transport available;

(ii) if not so notified, the worker shall travel both ways in the employer's time.

The Commission shall provide free travelling from the home station. Provided, however, that no worker sent on relief duty within the suburban area shall claim or be allowed extra travelling time if the station at which he is to work is nearer his residence than his home station.

20.—No Reduction.

This agreement shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rates prescribed for his class of work.

21.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of the union. Before being engaged an applicant in the metropolitan area shall produce evidence that he is a financial member. This provision shall also apply outside the metropolitan area, provided, however, that if the applicant is unable to produce satisfactory evidence immediately he shall furnish same within a reasonable period.

22.—Boards of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of the agreement, Boards of Reference. The boards shall each consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There are assigned to such boards, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the agreement the functions of—

(i) Classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any machine, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the agreement.

(ii) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the agreement or any of them.

(iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the board from time to time.

(b) Separate boards may be appointed for different sections corresponding to the occupations, callings or vocations referred to in this agreement and/or for different districts.

(c) The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949 (Appeal from Board), shall be deemed to apply to any board of reference appointed hereunder.

23.—Right of Entry.

On notifying the officer-in-charge, any officer of the union authorised in writing by the president and secretary of such union shall have the right to enter any place or premises, during ordinary working hours where members of such union covered by this agreement are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the workers in such place or premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer-in-charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

24.—Allowances, Special Provisions, etc.

(1) A casual hand shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the minimum rate specified.

(2) Reasonable change room lockers and washing facilities shall be provided for the workers.

(3) Workers employed on the following work shall be paid at the rate of threepence (3d.) per hour in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed.

(a) Boat-type or swinging scaffold:—

In this subclause the term "swinging scaffold" means any scaffold suspended from overhead gear and not supported from the ground and which, by reason of the operations carried out on it, or by reason of the wind force or vibration, is likely to swing or sway.

(b) Excessively dirty work or demolition work which is likely to render the worker or his clothes dirtier than the normal run of work (with a minimum payment as for four (4) hours when employed on such work).

(c) Insulating work in an average temperature of forty-five (45) degrees F. or under.

(d) Working for more than one (1) hour continuously in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to exceed 130 degrees F.

- (e) Working in dust-laden atmosphere caused by the use of materials for insulating, deafening or pugging work (as, for instance, pumice, charcoal, silicate of cotton or any other substitute).
- (f) Working in any confined space in and around a building.
 "Confined space" means one of which the dimensions are such that the workmen must work in an unusually stooped or cramped position or without adequate ventilation or where confinement within a limited space is productive of unusual discomfort to them.
- (g) Builders' labourers carrying tools or materials which exceed thirty pounds (30lb.) in weight or which are by their nature or size awkward to carry on a ladder or stair run exceeding twelve feet (12ft.).
- (4) Workers working for more than one (1) hour continuously in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees F. shall be paid at the rate of one penny half-penny (1½d.) per hour in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed.
- (5) Workers employed on repairs to ovens or furnaces or on under-pinning shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed.
- (6) Workers, while working in any place where water is continually dripping so that the workers' clothing becomes wet with soakage, or where there is water underfoot so that the workers' feet become wet, shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed. This shall not apply to natural surface made wet by rain.
- (7) Bitumen or tar work—Any worker actually coming in contact with hot or viscous tar or bitumen whereby his clothing becomes injuriously affected shall be paid an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the prescribed rate of pay unless protective material is used.
- (8) Workers engaged in concrete work shall be paid an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day extra, provided that this shall not be applied to a worker whose margin already provides for this work.
- (9) Provision of boiling water—The employer shall provide on each job boiling water for the use of his workers, including for the morning tea and lunch period.
- (10) Attendants on ladders—No worker shall work on a ladder at a height of over twenty (20) feet from the ground when such ladder is standing in any street, way or lane where traffic is passing to and fro without an assistant on the ground.
- (11) Sanitary arrangements—Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job of each employer for the convenience of all workers and be kept in a clean and hygienic condition and where sewerage facilities exist proper connections must be made. If a pan system is used thunder boxes are to be installed.

25.—Leading Hands.

A leading hand placed in charge of—

- (a) not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid nine shillings (9s.) per week extra;
- (b) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid eighteen shillings (18s.) per week extra;
- (c) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid twenty-seven shillings (27s.) per week extra.

26.—Rates of Pay.

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, of Western Australia, this 7th day of March, 1950, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated), (hereinafter called the "Association") of the one part, and the Hon. Chief Secretary (as Minister controlling State Hotels) (hereinafter called the "Minister") of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers employed by the State Hotels as Managers, including Acting or Relieving Managers.

2.—Wages.

The weekly wages of Managers as from the 1st day of January, 1950, shall be:—

These wages are related to the State Basic Wage applying in the particular area as at the 1st January, 1950. That is to say £7 2s. 11d. per week at Gwalia, and £6 15s. 4d. per week at the remaining centres.

3.—Adjustments of Wages.

The wages shown above shall be adjusted to conform with adjustments made from time to time by the State Court of Arbitration to the basic wage applying in the area concerned, excluding any adjustments made in respect to the items "Food and Groceries" and "Rent," but including the items "Clothing," "Miscellaneous" and "Loading," and such adjustments shall apply from the date of the Court's declaration.

4.—Board and Lodging.

In addition to the salary margins prescribed in Clause 3 herein, each Manager and his wife and their children under the age of sixteen years, shall be entitled to free board and lodging at the Hotel.

5.—Annual Leave.

All Managers shall be entitled to four (4) weeks' Annual Leave per annum on full pay.

6.—Long Service Leave.

All Managers shall be granted Long Service Leave in accordance with the terms and conditions under which Long Service Leave is granted to officers employed under Section 31 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1948.

7.—Sick Leave.

All Managers shall be entitled to Sick Leave on a similar basis as applying from time to time to officers employed under Section 31 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1948.

8.—Manager and Manager's Wife—Additional Duties.

Where through lack of staff or because of exigencies, the Manager and/or the wife of a Manager is required to carry out duties at the Hotel which it is proper for other members of the staff to perform, they shall be paid the rate prescribed for such duties in the appropriate Industrial Award or Agreement, for the whole time that the extra duties are performed.

9.—Travelling Allowance.

Where Managers are required to travel on official business or on transfer, they shall be allowed Travelling Allowance at the rates prescribed for Public Servants under the Public Service Act, 1904-1948.

Where a Manager uses his own conveyance to transport himself and family when transferred, he shall be allowed the cost of first class rail fares for himself, wife and their children under the age of sixteen years, plus the actual out-of-pocket expenses incurred for meals and lodgings.

10.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years, commencing from the 1st day of January, 1950.

Provided that either party to this Agreement, after the 1st day of January, 1951, may negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, and if both parties agree, such Agreement may be amended by a Supplementary Agreement, which shall be concurrent with this Agreement.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(No. 40 of 1949.)

Between the Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, Applicant, and Bell Bros., Wakelam Bros., and White Rock Quarries, Respondents.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now therefore the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1. Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Excavator Engine Drivers' Award."

2. Arrangement.

This Award is arranged as follows:—

3. Term.

The term of this Award shall be one (1) year from the date of issue hereof.

4. Area.

This Award shall have effect over the whole of the South-West Land Division.

5. Scope.

This Award shall apply to certificated workers employed by the Respondents operating navvies and drag-line or dredge type excavators for which a certificate to drive is required under the provisions of the Inspection of Machinery Act.

6. Hours.

(a) The hours of duty shall be forty (40) per week.
(b) In any week in which there are one or more holidays the hours shall be reduced by the number of ordinary working hours the worker would have been required to work on the holiday or holidays had such day or days not been holidays.

(c) Any hours worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift.

(d) Subject to agreement between the parties to this Award, the ordinary hours of work may be extended on any one day during the week preceding Christmas Day.

7. Five Day Week.

An employer when engaging any worker shall state definitely whether such worker is to work on a basis of a five (5) or six (6) day week. Failing such notice the worker shall be deemed to be employed on the basis of a six (6) day week. An employer desiring to change the basis of any worker from a six (6) day week to a five (5) day week or vice versa, shall give one (1) week's notice of such intended change to the worker concerned.

8. Starting and Finishing Time.

With the exception of shift workers the starting time for the purpose of calculating overtime shall be 7 a.m. or after; and the finishing time, on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, shall be not later than 6 p.m. and on Saturdays not later than 1 p.m.

9. Overtime.

All overtime shall stand alone and shall be paid for, in addition to the ordinary weekly or casual wage, at the rate of time and a half.

Overtime shall be paid for all time of duty:—

(a) Before the prescribed starting time, or after the prescribed finishing time; or

(b) After eight (8) hours on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturdays; or

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (b) hereof, in the case of five (5) day week workers after nine (9) hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and for all time of duty on Saturdays; or

(d) In excess of the hours prescribed in Clause 6. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this sub-clause.

(iii) This sub-clause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

10. Sunday Work.

For all time of duty on Sundays, payment in addition to the weekly wage, shall be made at the rate of double time.

11. Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be granted as holidays to the workers without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All time of duty on such holidays shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly wage at the rate of ordinary time: Provided that all time of duty before the prescribed starting time or after the prescribed finishing time on any such holiday had the day not been a holiday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. Any worker required to work on a holiday shall be paid at least half a day's pay at holiday rates.

12. Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under the Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(f) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to sub-clause (c) of this section, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(g) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this Clause.

(h) The provisions of this Clause shall not apply to casual workers.

13. Casual Workers.

"Casual Worker" means a worker who is employed for less than one week.

Casual workers shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day in addition to the prescribed rates.

14. Contract of Service.

The contract of service of workers other than casuals shall be by the week.

15. Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This Clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this Clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

16. Time and Wages Record.

(a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages record in which shall be entered:—

- (i) The name of each worker;
- (ii) the nature of work performed;
- (iii) the hours worked each day; and,
- (iv) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid each week.

(b) The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during ordinary office hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

17. Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a Chairman and two other representatives one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement the functions of:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of differences which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them.

(ii) Classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupations or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement.

(iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

18. No Reduction.

Nothing herein shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date of this Award.

19. Breakdowns, Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

20. Wages.

The minimum weekly wage to be paid to and received by all workers shall be as follows:—
