INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 9 of 1950.
(Registered 8/5/1950.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this first day of May, 1950, between The Adelaide Steamship Company Limited and The Swan River Shipping Company Limited, of the one part, and The Coastal, Dock, Rivers and Harbour Works Union of Workers of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1. Area.

The following wages and conditions will apply to members of the crew of the harbour tugs Uco, Wato and Wyola while so employed at the port of Fremantle in the State of Western Australia, and for service outside the limits of the port of Fremantle.

2.—Rates of Pay.

Basic wage—£6 18s. 1d. per week.

(a) Harbour Service—

(b) Sea-going Service—

The rates of pay and conditions of employment for sea-going service shall be determined, by agreement between the parties (and failing agreement, by the Board of Reference), on the occasion of a tug being required to proceed to sea.

3.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All employment shall be by the week. A week's notice on either side shall be given to terminate the employment, or the employer shall pay one week's wages in lieu of such notice, subject to the right of the employer to dispense with the services of the employee for misconduct or negligence without notice at any time.

4.—Payment of Wages.

(a) All wages, other than money for overtime, will be paid weekly.

(b) Money for overtime will be payable on the pay day of the week following that on which it was earned.

5.—Hours of Labour.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, the ordinary hours of labour, other than when working on watches, shall be any eight consecutive hours, exclusive of meal hours, between 7 a.m. and 4.30 p.m.

(b) In any case, when a tug proceeds to sea, the employer may work the crew in watches, which may be set and commenced from the time the vessel leaves the berth or anchorage to proceed to sea.

(c) Outside the hours of labour, and without payment for overtime, any work shall be done that is required for the safety of the tug.

6.—Overtime.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, for all time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary hours of labour, overtime shall be paid at the rate of one and a half times the ordinary rate for work performed up to 11 p.m., and double ordinary rates for work performed between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

(b) Where time of duty commences before or extends beyond the ordinary day's work, overtime payment shall be made only for the actual time worked prior to or subsequent to ordinary hours, as the case may be.

(c) Where employees, having left the vessel at night, are called back, a minimum of three hours' overtime will be paid for each call back (irrespective of number of jobs). For any call back prior to 11 p.m., overtime to be paid for a minimum of three hours at rate of time and a half, double time only to apply for work actually performed after 11 p.m. For any call back, the starting time of which is 11 p.m. or later, a minimum of three hours at double rates to apply.

(d) Where there is a second call back on any night and the break from the time of expiration of the minimum period to the time of re-commencement is less than two hours, overtime shall be allowed continuously as if no break had occurred.

(e) Where the employee, having commenced work at or before 3 a.m., or having completed a tanker duty, is required to continue on day work after 8 a.m., he shall be paid in addition to his ordinary rate of pay a penalty rate equal to the ordinary hourly rate from the latter hour until he has had a two-hour break in which to get a meal and have a lunch prepared for the day.

(f) Broken time to be counted to the next quarter-hour.

(g) These subclauses do not apply to tug crews working on watches or ship-keeping.

7.—Special Conditions Regarding Excessive Overtime.

(a) An employee who has done continuous duty for 24 hours shall not be required to do further duty on the tug until he has had, for the purpose of rest, a

period of eight consecutive hours off duty, exclusive of any meal time, provided that continuity of duty shall, for the purpose of this clause, be deemed to have been maintained despite the occurrence of meal times or of the employee being off duty during any period of not more than four hours, including one of such meal times during the 24 hours in question. Provided further, that for each hour worked during the eight hours' rest period aforesaid, the employee shall be paid overtime at the rate of ordinary time in addition to any other ordinary or overtime payment. For the purposes of this clause, time incurred in banking fires and raising steam shall be excluded from hours of continuous duty.

(b) This clause shall not apply where crews are employed under conditions in clause 15.

8.—Time Off Duty.

(a) In lieu of Saturdays and Sundays, members of the crew to be allowed off duty for four intervals of 24 consecutive hours (midnight to midnight) in each 14 days. Saturdays or Sundays not worked to be counted amongst such intervals. Any of such intervals not given shall be paid for on the basis of eight hours at one and three-quarters ($1\frac{3}{4}$) times the ordinary rate. Notwithstanding the foregoing, and as far as practicable consistent with the work of the port, these intervals are to be given on alternate week-ends on the basis of the tug roster as at present arranged.

(b) Any Saturday on which the crew are not required to be on duty after 1 p.m. shall count as one of such intervals, subject to the following:—

- (1) For all work performed prior to 1 p.m., payment to be made at the rate of time and a half, with a minimum of four hours, except in the case of fireman and greaser raising steam, who shall be allowed one hour additional.
- (2) Notification of intention to treat a Saturday, on which the crew are not expected to be required to be on duty after 1 p.m., as such an interval off duty to be given not later than knock-off time on the previous working day.
- (3) If after notification of the intention to treat such a Saturday as an interval off duty, it is found necessary to cancel this notification, and such cancellation is not made prior to knock-off time on the previous working day, all duty performed prior to 1 p.m. shall, nevertheless, be paid for at time and a half, but for all duty performed thereafter the same rates to be payable as if no such notification had ever been given.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding subclauses, no member of the crew shall be required to be on duty for more than six consecutive days (including any Saturday treated as being an interval off duty, as provided under subclause "b" hereof), before being allowed to be off duty for at least one day.

(d) The employer shall notify the employee, when practicable, not later than tea time of his intention to give the employee time off duty on the following day. Failure to give such notice within the prescribed time shall entitle the employee to four hours' pay in addition to his time off duty.

(e) In lieu of customary waterside holidays, viz.: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Union Picnic Day (which, so far as they may be allowed off, are to count amongst the four intervals to be allowed off duty in each 14 days, as provided in subclause A hereof), members of the crew who have served continuously for one year to be allowed off duty for 16 intervals of 24 consecutive hours on full pay, or if they should have served for any shorter period, not being less than one month, for a proportionate number of such intervals, the actual time at which such intervals to be allowed off to be a matter for mutual arrangement.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) Members of the crews serving continuously for one year to be allowed fourteen consecutive days' leave of absence on full pay.

(b) Members of the crews serving continuously for one month or more, but not for one year, to be allowed leave of absence on full pay for a time proportionate to their length of service.

(c) By mutual consent, this leave of absence may be postponed in whole or in part, and the unused leave accumulated, but it may not be postponed beyond the second year.

(d) One week's notice of intention to give the holidays to the employees shall be given, provided that by mutual agreement a lesser period of notice may be given.

10.—Meals.

Except as hereinafter provided, the meal times allowed shall be:—

Breakfast—

(a) (i) If employees are required to commence duty before 5.30 a.m., they shall be allowed any consecutive sixty (60) minutes for breakfast between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m., such period to be regarded as being part of the crew's hours of duty.

(ii) If employees are required to commence duty at 5.30 a.m. or later, but before 6.30 a.m., they shall be allowed a break of twenty (20) minutes in which to have breakfast, the commencing time of such interval to be at any time from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m., and the period is to be regarded as being part of the crew's hours of duty.

(iii) If employees are required to commence duty at 6.30 a.m. or later, no breakfast time shall be allowed.

(b) Dinner.—Any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(c) For all work performed during the above meal hours, double rates shall be paid and continue to be paid until the employee has been knocked off for a meal.

(d) Where it is necessary, in the opinion of the master or officer in charge of the tug, for the purpose of shifting ship or to enable the tug to start a job during a meal hour, an employee may be called upon to curtail his meal hour, subject to the following provision:—If the time curtailed is half an hour or less, payment shall be made as for half an hour at double rates.

(e) Tea.—Employees to be allowed an interval of two hours for tea between 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. If no such break is allowed and work continues beyond 6 p.m., overtime shall be paid at one and a half times the ordinary rate up to 6 p.m. and double time thereafter until employees are knocked off for the day or given two hours off in which to obtain a meal.

11.—Raising Steam and Banking Fires.

It is assumed that the time required for raising steam and warming up engines is one hour, and that the time required for banking fires and shutting off steam is half an hour, and any portion of such time as falls within overtime hours to be paid for at the appropriate overtime rate—such work to be performed by one fireman and one greaser as heretofore: Provided that—

(i) when having finished the day's work steam is again required, the fireman and greaser shall each be allowed half an hour's overtime in all for raising steam and banking fires, and a similar allowance shall be made to them in respect of each successive call out;

(ii) any payments made under this subclause shall be completely independent of payments under clause 6 (c).

(b) When a fireman is required to attend to banking of fires on days when a tug is off duty, he shall be allowed a total of four (4) hours' overtime at time and a half for his attendance aboard the tug for this work.

12.—Sickness.

In the case of personal ill-health necessitating absence from work, an employee, after one month's continuous service, will be entitled to sick pay on the production of a medical certificate on each occasion, but shall not be entitled to such sick pay for more than six days in the aggregate in each year. Sick leave not availed of may accumulate to the extent of a maximum of 18 days to be drawn upon at such time as absence on account of sickness warrants, but the said 18 days shall be the maximum which can be claimed in any one year, irrespective of the number of years worked without a sick claim: Provided that if the employment is determined, no payment shall be made for sick leave not taken.

This clause shall not apply to employees absent from work because of personal injury by accident arising out of or in the course of the employment.

13.—Discrimination.

(a) The employer will not discriminate without just cause against any members of the Union who bear good conduct records and who agree to and continue to work on the terms now agreed upon, and as there are vacancies for and that the local manager of the company will consider any representations made to him by the Secretary of the Union. The discrimination referred to is unjust discrimination in favour of persons not members of the Union, not discrimination between members of the Union.

(b) Employment of such members shall be made at the pick-up yard of the Union and between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 9 a.m., provided that in cases of urgency outside of the pick-up time and by arrangement with the Union, engagement may be made to meet the need of such urgency.

14.—Disputes.

There shall be no stoppage of work in the towage trade for any reason or cause whatsoever. Should any dispute arise between any employee and the employers, the matter will be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the Union and the chairman to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agreement the Registrar of the Industrial Arbitration Court of W.A. or his deputy shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding to both parties.

15.—Bulk Petrol Ships—Attendance.

(a) Employees called upon to remain on board the tug for duty between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. for the reason that a bulk petrol ship is in port, shall receive an allowance of an amount equivalent to a day's wages.

(b) If, during the period between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m., any towage service or services have to be performed, in addition to the allowance prescribed in subclause (a), overtime shall be paid for such towage work, and the time calculated from the time of leaving the tug's wharf berth until return to such wharf berth, provided that firemen or other members of the crew shall not, in addition to the payment during towage operations, also be entitled to overtime for any other work during such towage periods.

16.—Casual Employees.

(a) A casual employee is one for whom work for a period of six consecutive working days is not provided by the employer, and such employees shall be entitled to payment at the rates set out in clause 2 of this Agreement, plus 20 per cent.

(b) Casual employees required for duty on Saturdays, Sundays or public holidays, as set out in clause 8 (e) shall be paid as under:—

(1) Saturdays—at time and a half.

(2) Sundays and holidays—double time.

With a minimum payment of three hours at the appropriate rate. Provided that if the tug which is the "duty" tug on any of the above days finishes work for the day prior to the completion of the eight ordinary hours of duty, a casual employee shall be paid at the appropriate rates for the time worked or a minimum of three hours, whichever is the greater, plus ordinary rates for the balance of the eight ordinary hours of duty.

(c) The minimum period of engagement for such employees shall be (4) four hours.

17.—Dirty Work.

Any person working inside a boiler or furnace, cleaning inside the casing of internal combustion engines, cleaning inside oil tanks in motor vessels, uptakes, or smoke-boxes where doors have to be opened, or cleaning bilges—1s. 6d. per hour in addition to any other ordinary overtime rate payable.

18.—Cooking and Eating Utensils and Bedding.

The employer will provide on board the tugs, for the use of the employees, all necessary utensils, to be of enamelware or of a similar nature thereto, but not of tin, free of cost to the employee, and also bedding consisting of a kapok mattress, mattress cover, pillow, pillow cover, two sheets and two blankets. The pillow cover, mattress cover and sheets shall be changed as required and the blankets washed as required.

The above items to be provided in sufficient quantity to allow of an independent issue being made to each individual member of the crew, plus any relieving hands.

19.—Provisions.

The employer will continue to provide emergency provisions, consisting of milk, tea, coffee, cocoa, sugar, biscuit, meat, fruit, soups, salt, pepper, sauces and pickles, and shall also maintain on board each tug in the care of an elected member of the crew the sum of 20s. for use in purchasing fresh provisions in cases where emergency meals are necessary.

20.—First Aid.

A properly equipped first aid chest shall be maintained on board and be so placed as to be available to the crew or any one of them at all times.

21.—Sea-going Service.

1. (a) It is agreed that when the tugs covered by this Agreement proceed on sea-going service, the crews shall be victualled by the employers without any deduction from their pay.

(b) Peggy Service.—Overtime payment of up to three (3) hours for one man, or one hour each to each of the three (3) men going off watch, to be allowed for cleaning quarters, etc., which quarters shall be cleaned each day in port or at sea.

2. Nightwatchman in Port.—(a) The hours of any seaman when on articles acting as nightwatchman in port shall be from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.

(b) For acting as nightwatchman when on articles for the night or part of the night, he shall be paid for his duties as such at the rate of 3s. an hour extra to his day's pay.

(c) Where the services of the nightwatchman when on articles are called upon to assist in shifting ship, he shall be paid an extra sum of 1s. 6d. per shift.

(d) The duties of watchmen shall include attending to moorings, gangways and lights, watching crew's quarters and ship's equipment, and generally to prevent unauthorised persons from coming on board and interfering with any of ship's or crew's property, and to make any form of report required. To call out the officers on board when necessity arises, and to do any other work that the master may so desire.

(e) A sufficient supply of food and tea, coffee, or cocoa shall be provided for his requirements during the night.

3. Working Coal.—Seamen engaged in handling coal for bunkering purposes, in port or at sea, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., shall be entitled to such additional payment as will represent the difference between a day's sea pay and the minimum rate of pay to wharf labourers employed in the port in which the work is done, or the nearest Australian port when this work is done at sea.

4.—Engine Room Work.—When at sea, men on watch in the engine room shall not be called upon to do such work as scouring, polishing, brightwork, painting or washing paint when the main engines are working. This clause does not apply to day-men.

5. Sickness and Accident.—If a seaman belonging to a tug for which articles are signed in Australia, is landed and left at any port by reason of illness, or accident in the services of the ship, incapacitating him from following his duty, he shall be entitled—

(a) if landed at his home port—to receive wages at the rate fixed by this Agreement up to the expiration of one week after the date of his recovery, as certified by his medical attendant or by a medical inspector of seamen, if the employer at his own expense requires an examination:

Provided that, in cases where his engagement expires within one month from the date he was left on shore, the time for which he shall be so entitled to be paid shall not exceed a period of one month, and in other cases it shall not exceed a period of three months from the date he was left on shore;

(b) if landed and left at a port other than his home port, to receive wages until his recovery, certified as provided in the preceding subclause (a) and until arrival at his home port, at the rate payable to him when he was landed, and after his recovery (certified as aforesaid), to a free passage to his home port:

Provided that, if after recovery the seaman rejoins his ship or takes other employment, or is offered and refuses employment on some other vessel proceeding to his home port at a similar rate of pay to that received by him immediately prior to his being left ashore, and with right of discharge from that vessel on arrival at his home port, his right to continue to receive wages under this subclause shall then cease;

- (c) if the medical inspector of seamen at an out-port certifies that the seamen shall be landed at that port for treatment, and the master requires the seamen to return to his home port prior to recovery, either before or after being so landed, such seamen shall, after arrival at his home port, be treated in respect of wages, medical expenses, maintenance, etc., as if he had not been returned to his home port;
- (d) the illness, hurt, or injury which shall entitle a seaman to the benefits provided for in this clause shall—
 - (1) be such as to wholly incapacitate him from performance of his duty;
 - (2) be, or appear to be of such a nature that it is considered by the master advisable in the interests of the seaman to leave him ashore;
 - (3) so far as can be ascertained, be an illness contracted on board any ship of the employer, or in the service of any such ship or of the employer, or a hurt or injury sustained in the service of any such ship, or of the employer, in either case under the existing or any preceding articles of agreement not separated from the next succeeding articles by an interval of more than a week (except so far as it includes time off or leave granted under this Award), nor by any time of employment for any other employer;

Provided that, if the illness is due to his own wilful act or default, or to his misbehaviour, or to a venereal disease, the employee shall not be entitled to the benefits provided for in this clause;

- (e) the expense of providing the necessary medicines, surgical and medical advice, and attendance to a seaman belonging to a ship while suffering from the effects of sickness contracted, or injury received, in the service of the ship or of the owner, or from any illness, not being venereal disease, or an illness due to his own misbehaviour, and of the seaman's conveyance to the home port after recovery, shall be paid by the employer without any deduction from wages on that account until he is cured or dies, or is brought or taken back to the port where he is entitled to be discharged, or such other port as is mutually agreed upon with the approval of the proper authority.
- This subclause is subject to the proviso to subclause (b) of this clause.
- (f) While being returned to the port above referred to under the provisions of this clause, the seamen, if he is not being maintained by or at the expense of the employer, shall be entitled to sustenance allowance of 2s. for each meal and 3s. for a bed.
 - (g) If any employee in the service of the owner shall suffer any injury by accident out of or in the course of his employment, but by reason of the happening of the injury out of the jurisdiction of Western Australia, the employee would otherwise be disentitled under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934, to compensation under that Act, he shall nevertheless be considered as having all rights to compensation under that Act as if the accident had happened within the jurisdiction of Western Australia: Provided, however—

- (1) that such right shall not be accumulative on any other rights afforded by the Commonwealth Seamen's Compensation Act, 1911, The Navigation Act (Commonwealth), 1912-1926, The Merchant Shipping Acts (Imperial), or under any statute or at common law, or the provisions of this Agreement, but shall be in the alternative; and
- (2) the making of a claim to compensation or benefits under any of the provisions of the lastmentioned Acts, or at common law, or with this Agreement, shall disentitle the employee to compensation under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934 (State).

6. Ships Stranded.—In the event of a vessel being stranded (not in a tidal river, gulf or harbour), and any member employed assisting to refloat the vessel shall be paid his ordinary wages, and in addition to his wages he shall be paid a special payment of 3s. 6d. per hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. and 7s. per hour between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m. The additional payment shall not be made for the time occupied in performing ordinary duties, or in doing work necessary to save human life.

7.—Shipwrecked Seamen.—(a) Where the services of a seaman terminate before the period contemplated in his agreement by reason of the wreck or loss of the ship, he shall be entitled to conveyance by or at the cost of the owner to the port of his engagement, or, at the master's option, to the port of discharge mentioned in the agreement, or to such other port as is mutually agreed upon, with the approval of the proper authority, between the master and the seamen.

(b) Wages shall be paid up to and including the date of seaman's arrival at his home port.

(c) Where a seaman is not being maintained by or at the expense of the employer during his return to his home port, the employer shall pay the seaman sustenance allowance at the rate of 2s. for each meal and 3s. for a bed.

Provided that the total period for which the seaman shall be entitled to receive wages in pursuance of paragraph (b) of this clause shall not in any case exceed three (3) months from the time of the termination of his service by reason of the wreck or loss of ship.

Provided also that if the seaman refuses or fails to accept the first reasonable means of conveyance, either as a distressed seaman or otherwise, provided or offered by the master or owner, or by a proper authority, he shall not be entitled to receive wages under this clause for any period after such refusal or failure.

(d) In the event of a seaman losing his clothes or effects through the wreck or stranding of the vessel, the employer shall reimburse the seaman for the loss of such clothes and/or effects, but the amount of such reimbursement shall not exceed the sum of twenty pounds (£20) to any one man.

8. Buckets.—The employers will, where necessary, provide a sufficient number of buckets for the use of the seamen, free of cost to the seamen.

9. Tug's Articles.—All conditions of this Agreement applicable to sea-going service shall be accepted by the master and members of the Union as part of the articles of the agreement with the crew.

10. Definitions—

"In port" refers to the time from arrival to departure.

"At sea" refers to the time from departure to arrival.

"Departure" means the time when the vessel is unmoored to proceed to sea.

"Port" includes bay, river, or roadstead.

"A day" means from 12 midnight to 12 midnight.

"Home port" means any port in the Commonwealth at which the seaman originally signs the articles of agreement, or such other port as may be inserted in the articles in accordance with the Commonwealth Navigation Act.

"Wages" include overtime and sustenance allowance, except where it is inconsistent with any provision of this Agreement.

"Seaman" means any member of the Coastal, Dock, River and Harbour Works Union of Workers, Western Australia, employed on the tugs, except where it is clear that the clause or subclause applied to deck hands only.

"Moored" includes anchored, but not where anchored through stress of weather, fog, conditions of tide, waiting for orders, or quarantine, or other legal restrictions.

"Master" means the master of the vessel or his deputy.

11. Manning Conditions.—The Coastal, Dock, River and Harbour Works Union of Workers may apply to the Commonwealth Navigation Department to fix manning conditions, if in any particular case it is not satisfied with the manning conditions fixed for any vessel, provided the members of the Union work under the manning conditions fixed pending the hearing of the application.

12. Existing Conditions.—This Agreement is based on existing customs and practices not inconsistent with any of the terms of this Agreement.

13. Navigation Act.—Nothing in this Agreement shall affect the claim of a member of the Union to any rights he has under the Commonwealth Navigation Act, and an employer shall only be liable once for anything granted by this Agreement and by the Navigation Act also.

22.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for three years from the date hereof, and to continue thereafter subject to three (3) months' notice on either side. Provided that at any time after the expiration of 12 months from its date and subject to one month's notice to the other parties, any party shall have the right by agreement with the parties to amend or vary this Agreement.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 30 of 1949.

Between Fremantle Tramway Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

2.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers prescribed herein employed by the Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board within the area and under powers conferred upon them by the Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board Act, 1903-1937, as amended.

3.—Definitions.

"Motormen and conductors" shall include all workers operating a car or cars in service for passengers and taking it from or returning it to the barn, but does not include shedmen when shunting or running cars for test purposes, or changing cars or any other operation necessary to provide motormen and conductors with a car in good running condition.

"Car repairers and pitmen" shall mean the workers engaged in the work of changing motors, adjusting brakes, putting in or taking out bearings, wheels, pinions and gears, and all similar work in connection with the cars.

"Track cleaner" shall mean a worker engaged in keeping the rails, points and curves free from sand or other obstruction. He shall also have care of the rubbers in the points, and shall keep all shelter sheds in a clean condition.

"Track repairer" shall mean a worker engaged renewing or repairing worn or broken rails, who bonds, installs new fishplates and sleepers, and who lifts and packs and straightens roads and keeps the roadway or street surface in repair.

"Car cleaner" shall mean a worker sweeping, dusting or washing cars.

"Car examiner" shall mean a worker who examines cars for defects, either in the barn or on the track, and oils, greases, adjusts or makes minor repairs necessary to keep the cars in running condition.

"Fettler" shall mean a worker who lifts, packs and ballasts tram roads.

"Platelayer" shall mean a worker who handles material used in the construction or repair of tram tracks, who curves rails, bonds, links in, fastens, installs fishplates, adzes or squares sleepers, spaces sleepers, uses the jigger, gauges, cuts rails, and uses the borer.

"Electrical installer" shall mean a worker engaged in the installation of electric lighting, electric meters, bells, telephones, motors, switches and fuses and apparatus used in connection therewith and includes a worker engaged in the running, repairing and testing of wires used for lighting, heating or power purposes, and all similar work in connection with the supply of electricity.

"Linesman" means a worker engaged (with or without labourers assisting) in erecting poles for electric wires, or erecting wire or cables on poles or over buildings, or tying it or them to insulators, or joining or insulating it or them, or doing any work off the ground, or doing any other work in connection with wiring and fixing which does not require the possession of an installer's license under the regulations made pursuant to the Electricity Act, 1945, but shall not include a labourer assisting a linesman.

"Electrical fitter" shall mean a worker employed in making, repairing, altering, testing, removing, winding or wiring electrical machines, instruments or meters, provided that the work of a house installer or linesman shall not be included in this definition.

"Casual hand" means a worker employed for less than one (1) week continuously, but does not include a worker who, when work is available, leaves his employment before the expiration of one (1) week.

Part II—Traffic Section.

4.—Hours of Work.

(a) On all ordinary days not requiring a special roster owing to exceptional traffic, the roster shall be drawn up to give as near as practicable a week's work of forty (40) hours and a day's work of not less than six (6) hours twenty (20) minutes inclusive of Sunday and signing on time.

(b) The roster for motormen and conductors shall show forty (40) hours per week including reporting time, or failing this, the Board shall pay the amount of the shortage or overtime to the worker.

(c) The Board shall not be required to make good or pay for any time lost by reason of the worker failing to work the full time allotted to him.

5.—Roster Duty.

(a) A rostered shift is a shift posted up showing the daily runs of a motorman or conductor for the week, which shift shall not be less than six (6) hours twenty (20) minutes per day.

(b) If a motorman or conductor fails to take up his rostered or appointed shift, the Board may make such alterations as it finds necessary to fill the vacancy and maintain the service.

(c) Upon public holidays and other days when exceptional traffic demands a special tram service, the roster may be altered to suit requirements, but any such alterations must be posted at least forty-eight (48) hours before being brought into operation. Provided that, should the Board not have knowledge of such special traffic in time to give the said forty-eight (48) hours' notice to the men, a lesser period of notice shall be accepted.

(d) Rostered shifts shall be made to rotate as far as practicable.

6.—Spread of Duty Payment.

The spread of duty for motormen and conductors on the roster shall as near as practicable not exceed nine and a half (9½) hours for seventy-five (75) per cent of them and thirteen (13) hours for twenty-five (25) per cent. Overtime shall operate after ten (10) hours and up to twelve (12) hours at time and a half and all over twelve (12) hours double time.

7.—Signing On and Off Times.

(a) Motormen shall be allowed as signing-on time five (5) minutes for each time they take a car from the barn in service, and five (5) minutes for each time they return a car to the barn, but such taking out or returning, if made during their rostered shift for which they receive pay, will not be considered as signing-on time. If the motormen are required to sign on at the receiving office, an extra five (5) minutes will be allowed, but this allowance will not be made if such time is included in the rostered shift and paid for.

(b) Conductors shall be allowed ten (10) minutes signing-on time: Provided that when more than two (2) conductors are rostered to finish their shifts at the same time, those in excess of two (2) who first pay-in shall be allowed an additional five (5) minutes, unless the Board provided more than one (1) clerk to receive the returns. Conductors will not be required to take up or leave off their shifts at the car barn.

(c) No person shall be compelled to work more than twelve (12) hours in any one (1) day.

8.—Call Back and Call Forward.

A minimum of two (2) hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for all work performed outside of a rostered shift, with the exception of trotting specials, which will be paid for at the rate of double time with a minimum of two (2) hours: Provided, however, that this shall only apply to special cars and not to any late running or incidents over which the Board has no control. Time so paid for shall stand alone and not be included in the weekly hours.

9.—Relief Points.

The point of relief for motormen and conductors on changing of shifts or meal relief shall be the Fremantle Town Hall for the East and Marmion cars, and for the South cars at the corner of High and Market Streets on the outward trip: Provided, however, that if the relief is available and willing at the Town Hall and at the corner of High and Market Streets respectively, the change may take place on the inward journey.

10.—Period off Duty.

(a) Workers shall not be required to appear for duty on the following day unless they have had at least ten (10) hours off duty, except when changing shifts,

or when necessary to avoid loss of trips, or to meet special emergencies: Provided that where a worker is called up for duty on his rostered day off after having been on duty the previous day after 10.45 p.m. he shall not be required to report for duty until 6.55 a.m. on such rostered day off, provided further that should the rostered shift he is performing on such day off commence before 6.55 a.m. he shall not be reduced in rostered time for any time of duty which should have been performed before 6.55 a.m.

(b) A worker failing to take up his rostered or appointed shift, unless owing to illness, shall pay the Board for any overtime incurred through another worker being called upon to work the shift. This shall not relieve the man from punishment if he consistently fails to appear for duty.

11.—Days Off.

(a) Each worker except as herein provided shall be entitled to one (1) day off each week without pay. If a worker's day off be cancelled, he shall receive a full day's pay at time and a half rates. This day shall not count as part of the ordinary week's work.

(b) No motorman or conductor shall be called upon a second time for duty on his day off until all other motormen and conductors available have been called upon to perform similar duty.

(c) Each motorman and conductor is to be allowed every second Sunday off duty: Provided that, should there not be sufficient men available to man the cars as traffic demands, those who have worked on the preceding Sunday may be called upon to work the following Sunday, but such work shall be given to each motorman and conductor, as near as practicable, in rotation when available.

12.—Meal Relief.

Meal relief shall be not less than thirty (30) minutes, and continuous working without meals shall not exceed six (6) hours, and no portion of a regular shift shall be less than two (2) hours: Provided that straight continuous shifts may be worked by mutual consent of the Board and the Union.

13.—Reports.

(a) For making any report in writing as to any accident, the failure of a passenger to pay his or her fare, or any incident requiring investigation by the Board, the worker shall be entitled to fourpence (4d.). The daily running sheets, particulars of lost property, and such other necessary information, including non-payment of fares handed into the receiving office, shall not be paid for, unless a further written report is required. An incomplete report shall be made good, without additional pay.

(b) A motorman or conductor attending by instructions at head office or elsewhere on the Board's business, or to answer complaints, or supply information at times other than when on duty, shall be paid for the time of his attendance at ordinary rates with a minimum of one (1) hour, such time to stand alone; except where his attendance is owing to his own misconduct or carelessness, failure to supply reports, or when incomplete reports have been submitted.

14.—Uniforms.

(a) The following uniforms shall be supplied by the Board to motormen and conductors after three (3) months' service, and to correspond with the general delivery of uniforms, which shall be as near as practicable for winter uniforms, delivered in April, and summer uniforms, delivered in October, of each year:—

One (1) winter suit every year.

One (1) summer suit every year, if of khaki material; or, if mutually agreed when other material is substituted, one (1) in every two (2) years.

One (1) waterproof cap cover every two (2) years.

Two (2) white cap covers every two (2) years.

One (1) overcoat every four (4) years.

One (1) cap every year.

(b) Uniforms, or parts thereof shall not be due until the period allowed after the last delivery.

(c) Car cleaners and other workers acting as motormen or conductors shall, if their work as motormen or conductors exceeds two (2) days per week, averaged over four (4) consecutive weeks, receive a uniform every year, and in addition thereto, any such worker so acting as a motorman shall be provided with an overcoat as required.

15.—Workers Acting as Motormen and Conductors.

The Board shall have the right, subject to the usual staff being insufficient to meet requirements, to call on any car barn or workshop worker to act as an emergency motorman or conductor, in the event of any ordinary motorman or conductor failing to appear for duty owing to sickness or other causes, or in cases of exceptional traffic.

16.—One Man Car Motorman-Conductor.

One man car motorman-conductor shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to his ordinary wage, irrespective of whether he works a full shift or not, but this provision shall not apply to the East Fremantle or Marazion "jigger" cars.

17.—Shorts and Overs.

(a) Shortages are to be charged to the conductor. Should the Board consider the shortages of any conductor excessive, it may take any action it deems necessary to minimise the offence. Conductors, before shorts are charged against them, shall be allowed to inspect their trip slips and reports relating to them and compare them with the statement of the count of tickets handed into the receiving office. Any conductor against whom shorts are sought to be debited shall be allowed to place before the accountant, in person, any objections he may have, and if the accountant persists in making a debit, the conductor may forthwith bring his objection in writing before the Board of Reference. Any shorts proved to be caused by clerical errors shall be refunded by the Board. The conductor shall be allowed to see his cash returns checked when paying into the receiving office at any time when clerks are in attendance in the usual course of their duties, but when clerks are not in attendance a Hopper safe may be provided by the Board as a receptacle for the conductor's fare bag and chits, and at the checking of the conductor's bag in such Hopper safe, the Union representative may, if he desires, attend.

(b) A representative of the Union shall be allowed at any time during which the receiving office is open to check the contents of a conductor's fare bag in the presence of a receiving clerk, in order to ascertain that the amount is properly accounted for.

(c) Overs shall be paid into the credit of the Fremantle Tramway Employees' Provident Fund.

18.—Saturday and Sunday Time and Overtime.

(a) Time and a half shall be paid for all work performed on Saturday or Sunday by workers not otherwise provided for. This shall not apply to workers who finish their Friday's rostered shift after midnight.

(b) All time worked in excess of forty (40) hours in any one (1) week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half: Provided that time on which penalty rates as per clauses 6, 8 and 11, and subclause (a) of this clause are payable will not be subject to the extra rate provided for in this subclause.

(c) Overtime shall operate outside of a rostered shift or regular day's work, or after the completion of same.

(d) Rates for overtime, Saturday time, Sunday time, or by way of penalty, shall be calculated on the weekly rates as appearing in the wages schedule, or as amended from time to time, divided by forty (40) in order to ascertain the ordinary time rate per hour. Double these rates shall be the maximum pay under any circumstances.

Part III.—Car Barn and Workshops Section.

19.—Hours of Work.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) For other than shift workers, the ordinary working hours shall be Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with one (1) hour for a meal.

(c) Where shifts are worked, they shall rotate as far as practicable.

(d) All workers not allowed to leave the car barn for meals, shall be allowed as part of their day's work twenty (20) minutes crib time, for which they shall be paid.

20.—Overtime and Sunday Time.

(a) Overtime outside the usual working hours, except where otherwise provided for, shall be as under:—
First two (2) hours—time and a quarter.

Next two (2) hours—time and a half.

Thereafter—double time.

(b) Overtime for tradesmen, tradesmen's labourers, car repairers, car examiners, pitmen, and track maintenance gangers, shall be paid as under:—

First four (4) hours—time and a half.

Thereafter—double time.

(c) Saturday and Sunday time, except where otherwise provided for, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(d) Sunday time for tradesmen and tradesmen's labourers shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(e) Overtime outside the ordinary Sunday duty for car examiner, car repairer, and pitman shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(f) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours, shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates: Provided such work exclusive of meal time is not continuous with his shift.

(g) Double time shall be maximum rate in any circumstances.

(h) Where a car examiner is called upon to work overtime as the result of illness of another car examiner or where his relief fails to report for duty subclauses (b) and (c) shall not apply.

21.—Uniforms.

Car repairers, car examiners, pitmen, fitters and fitters' apprentices shall be provided with two (2) bib and brace overalls every year. Car repairers, car examiners and pitmen shall be provided with one (1) oilskin every two (2) years.

22.—Rate of Junior Workers.

The percentage of boys under the age of twenty-one (21) years, other than apprentices employed in and about the barn, shall not exceed one (1) to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) employed over the age of twenty-one (21) years.

Part IV.—Electrical Section.

23.—Hours of Work.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) For other than shift workers, the ordinary working hours shall be Monday to Friday—8 a.m. to 5 p.m. with one (1) hour for a meal.

(c) Where shifts are worked, they shall rotate as far as practicable.

24.—Overtime and Sunday Time.

(a) Overtime for all workers in this section outside the usual working hours, except where otherwise provided for, shall be as under:—

First four (four) hours—time and a half.

Thereafter—double time.

(b) Saturday and Sunday time for shift workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(c) Sunday time for tradesmen and tradesmen's labourers shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(d) Any worker brought on duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates: Provided such work, exclusive of meal times, is not continuous with his shift.

(e) When a worker is required for duty during any mealtime whereby his mealtime is postponed for more than one (1) hour he shall be paid at overtime rates until he is given an opportunity of having his meal.

(f) Where a worker other than a shift worker is without previous notification called from his home between the hours of 9 p.m. on one day and 5 a.m. on the next succeeding day, this shall be known as a "call out" shift, and shall be paid for at double rates with

a minimum of two (2) hours. Such double rates shall continue until the completion of the work he has been called upon to perform, or until such time as he is given an opportunity of having a meal.

(g) Double time shall be the maximum rate in any circumstances.

25.—Special Provisions.

(a) Workers, when employed applying first coat of tar to butts of poles, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra, but this extra pay shall not apply to pole trimmers.

(b) Workers shall start and finish their day's work at the Municipal Boundary or Depot when work is done outside the Municipal area, when within the area at the job or the Depot.

(c) No house installer or linesmen engaged on distribution or transmission lines shall work on live wires without an assistant, unless such wires are house service connections or lines on ground and dangerous to the public.

(d) No worker acting as assistant to a linesman shall work on live wires or poles.

(e) All outside workers shall be provided with one (1) waterproof coat every two (2) years.

26.—Apprentices.

(a) The employment of apprentices shall be governed by the provisions of the apprenticeship schedule annexed hereto.

(b) Apprentices may be taken to the following trades:—(i) Carriage building, (ii) painting, (iii) fitting and/or turning.

(c) Carriage builders apprentices shall be supplied with the following tools:—Six chisels, 3 twist bits (auger), 6 nail bits, 1 brace, 2 saws, 1 square, 1 rule, 1 oilstone, 1 nail punch, 1 screwdriver, 1 hammer, 1 mallet, 2 wooden planes, 1 smoothing and 1 jack plane.

(d) These tools shall, during the apprenticeship period, remain the property of the Board. Apprentices shall be responsible for all breakages or losses, and shall make good such losses. At the conclusion of the apprenticeship course, on satisfactorily passing final examinations, the tools shall become the property of the apprentice.

(e) These apprentices shall receive ninepence (9d.) per week tool allowance.

(f) Tool allowance shall not be paid to an apprentice who is absent on extended, annual or sick leave.

Part V.—General.

27.—Contract of Service.

No worker shall leave the employment of the Fremantle Tramway Board until the expiration of seven (7) days' written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the secretary of the Board. Seven (7) days' written notice shall be given by the Board to such worker whose services are no longer required, and the reason for dismissal shall be given. This clause does not apply to casual workers.

A worker failing to take up his rostered or appointed shift or duty unless owing to illness, shall pay the Board for any overtime incurred through another worker being called upon to perform the shift or duty. This shall not relieve the man from punishment if he consistently fails to appear for duty.

28.—Free Transit on Cars.

Existing custom to continue.

29.—Breakdowns, etc.

The Board shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the Board's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause the Board cannot reasonably prevent: Provided also that in the case of the Traffic Section, when a car is delayed beyond its scheduled time for completion of a shift, due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of the Board, ordinary rates shall be paid.

30.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as herein provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Board after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the Board.

(b) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work through sickness in excess of three (3) months, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(d) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct, or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(e) Holidays may, subject to the approval of the Board, be allowed to accumulate for two (2) years.

(f) Annual leave shall be granted at a time to suit the convenience of the Board.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

31.—Holidays.

(a) In addition to their annual leave, all workers other than casuals, shall be granted the following holidays or the days observed in lieu—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Xmas Day, Boxing Day, and any other day proclaimed as a general public holiday.

(b) (i) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday except in the case of a member of the traffic running staff who shall be paid six (6) hours forty (40) minutes for such holiday. If a worker is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were an ordinary working day, and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave.

(ii) A worker in the car barn or electrical section other than a shift worker required to work on a holiday shall be paid double rate for the time worked with a minimum of two (2) hours; provided that in addition he shall receive payment at ordinary rates for the balance of the time not worked for which he would normally be paid on a holiday.

(iii) If a worker, other than a member of the traffic running staff, is rostered for a short shift on a holiday, but is not required to work on that day, he shall be paid for such rostered hours only.

(c) (i) When any holiday falls on a Sunday, workers shall not be granted a paid holiday except where that holiday is observed on the following Monday.

(ii) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or day in lieu shall be granted for any holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) A holiday which falls on a day on which a worker is on paid annual leave shall be treated as if it fell on the worker's ordinary working day.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker, however, is on or is available for duty on the working day immediately preceding a paid holiday or resumes or is available for duty on the working day immediately following a holiday, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on such holidays.

32.—Special Provisions.

(a) Night Shift: Workers employed on night shift and commencing work after 10 p.m. shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the rates paid for the class of work performed.

(b) Meal Allowance—Tradesmen and Assistants: When a worker is required to continue working for more than one (1) hour after knock-off time without

being notified on the previous day, he shall be supplied with any meal required or be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof.

(c) Casual Workers: Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of ten (10) per cent. in addition to the prescribed ordinary rate.

(d) Carpenters shall receive one shilling (1s.) per week tool allowance, but this shall not apply to the leading hand carpenter nor when workers are on annual or sick leave.

33.—Day Off.

Each worker except as herein provided shall be entitled to one (1) day off each week without pay. If a worker's day off be cancelled, he shall receive a full day's pay at time and a half rates. This day shall not count as part of the ordinary week's work.

34.—Workers Changing Shifts and Days Off.

Workers may on obtaining leave from the officer in charge, exchange shifts or days off; provided that there is no loss to the Board; provided further that motormen and conductors making the exchange shall, as soon as practicable enter the necessary information in a book kept at the receiving office for the purpose and sign same.

35.—Promotion.

Promotion shall be made on capability, suitability, seniority, and record. Provided that all other things being equal seniority shall be the determining factor.

36.—Engagement or Dismissal.

In the engagement and dismissal of workers, there shall be no discrimination against members of the Union. When retrenching, preference of employment shall be given in the order of seniority in the particular branch of the system.

37.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each complete month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in respect of each financial year. Payment may be made to workers with over three (3) months service for the full amount for days off sick until the maximum of one (1) week has been paid for irrespective of whether the sickness occurs during the first or any subsequent month or months of the year. Should a worker leave the service of the employer to whom allowance has been made hereunder in excess of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each complete month of service payment may be adjusted and such amount may be deducted from any monies due to the worker. Sick leave pay shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of, or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a Medical Certificate unless absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) No deduction shall be made from annual holidays for any period any worker is off duty through sickness unless such absence exceeds three (3) calendar months in any one (1) year of service.

(e) A worker may accumulate sick leave from year to year without limit.

38.—Higher Duties.

(a) Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay for two (2) hours in any day, shall be paid such higher minimum for the whole of that day; provided that acting time less than two (2) hours in any one (1) shift shall not be counted.

(b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade for any portion of a day, his wage shall not be deducted whilst employed in such capacity for that day.

39.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matter of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;

(ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulation to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

40.—Inquiries.

(a) Before any worker of three (3) months' service or over is suspended for more than two (2) days, or dismissed for any breach of the Board's rules, or for misconduct reported by an officer of the Board, or by any of the public, he shall be formally charged by one of the Board's executive officers.

The worker shall be given twelve (12) hours' notice in writing to answer the charge, and the notice shall state the nature of the charge, the person or persons appointed to make the inquiry, and the time and place where it will be held.

(b) At the inquiry the person charged shall be entitled to be represented by an officer or member of the Union, duly authorised by the Union.

(c) Any worker against whom a charge is made shall be supplied with a copy of same.

(d) Within reasonable time after the conclusion of the inquiry, the person charged shall be informed of the result of the inquiry.

(e) In the event of dismissal or suspension as aforesaid, the worker shall have the right to appeal to the Board of Reference.

(f) If a final decision in any case where a change has been made against a worker is not given within three (3) calendar months of the occurrence of the offence alleged, the charge shall be deemed to have lapsed.
