WHEREAS the Governor of our State of Western WHEREAS the Governor of our State of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of our said State, has seen fit to direct that you, John Evenden Virtue, K.C. shall in pursuance of section 7 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1950, and subject to the provisions of that Act and of the Judges' Salaries and Pensions Act, 1950, be appointed a Judge of our Supreme Court of Western Australia as from and including the 25th day of February, 1951: Now, know ye that, reposing full trust and confidence in your loyalty, learning, integrity and ability, we do by this our Commission in pursuance and in exercise of all the powers and authorities enabling us in that behalf, appoint you the said John Evenden Virtue, as from and including the 25th day of February, 1951, to be a Judge of our Supreme Court of Western Australia; to have, hold, exercise and enjoy the said office of Judge of our Supreme Court of Western Australia under and subject to the provisions of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1950, and of the Judges' Salaries and Pensions Act, 1950, during good behaviour, with all the rights, powers, privileges, advantages and juris-diction thereunto belonging or appertaining; provided that these presents are and shall be upon this condition-that you shall actually reside within our State of Western Australia, and shall execute the said office in your own person except in case of sickness or other incapacity.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the 5th day of January, 1951, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued :--

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 622/47.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the fol-lowing works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements and Extensions.

Proposed Water Supply to Riverton.

The replacement of existing reticulation mains and the construction of new reticulation mains and the construction of new reticulation mains together with necessary valves and fittings, within Canning Locations 1, 2, 21 and 25, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7532. This Order in Council shall take effect from the 12th day of January, 1951.

Water Boards Act. 1904-1949. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 8th day of April, 1911, the Governor did constitute the District of the Muncipality of Busselton to be a Water Area under the name of the Busselton Water Area and did appoint the Busselton Muni-Water Area and did appoint the Busselton Muni-cipal Council to be a Water Board under the name of the Busselton Water Board; and whereas by section 3 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1913, the Governor may re-voke any Order in Council for the constitution of any Water Board and may dissolve such Board; and whereas the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the distributes of two or and whereas the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the districts of two or more local authorities or any part or parts of such districts, a Water Area under such name as may be directed by the Order in Council; and whereas by Order in Council in order to con-stitute a Water Board the Governor shall deter-mine the date for the election of members and approve of their appointment to the said Board. approve of their appointment to the said Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth-

- (a) revoke the said Order in Council dated the 8th day of April, 1911;
 (b) constitute that portion of the districts of the Busselton Municipal Council and the Sussex Road Board having the boundaries described in the First Schedule hereto a Water Area for the purposes of the said Act under the name of the Busselton Water Area and divide the said Busselton Water Area into sub-areas Busselton Water Area into sub-areas known as Busselton Sub-Area and West Busselton Sub-Area and described in the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (c) constitute a Water Board to be known as constitute a water Board to be known as the Busselton Water Board comprising nine elected members, of which five mem-bers shall be elected by the Busselton Municipality and four members shall be elected by the Sussex Road Board and direct that the annual election of members of the Busselton Water Board shall be held on the second Saturday in January in every year.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 13th day of January, 1951.

All that portion of land bounded by lines com-All that portion of land bounded by lines com-mencing at the intersection of the low water mark of Geographe Bay and the Eastern bound-ary of the Busselton Municipality and extending Southerly, Westerly and Northerly along bound-aries of that Municipality to the left bank of the New River; thence generally Westerly, upwards along that bank to the Eastern boundary of Reserve for Drain number 16061; thence North-erly along that boundary and onwards to the low erly along that boundary and onwards to the low water mark of Geographe Bay and thence gen-erally North-Easterly along that mark to the starting point as shown bordered in red on plan P.W.D., W.A. 32623.

Second Schedule.

Busselton Sub-Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines com-mencing at the intersection of the low water mark of Geographe Bay and the Eastern bound-ary of the Busselton Municipality and extend-ing Southerly, Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of that Municipality to the low water mark of Geographe Bay and thence generally East-erly along that mark to the starting point as shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 32623.

West Busselton Sub-Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the low water mark of Geographe Bay and the Western boundary of the Busselton Municipality and extending Southerly along that boundary to the left bank of the New River; thence generally Westerly, upwards along that bank, to the Eastern boundary of Reserve for Drain number 16061; thence Northerly along that boundary and onwards to the low water mark of Geographe Bay and thence generally North-Easterly along that mark to the starting point as shown coloured blue on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 32623.

Long Service Leave.

L.G. 946/30.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Cuballing Road Board.

THE Cuballing Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder:—

"Board" means Cuballing Road Board.

"Continuous Service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.

2. (a) All present and future employees of the Board shall after each period of ten years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from the first day of January, 1949, be entitled to three months' long service leave, to be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

(b) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

3. The Board may grant long service leave to an employee of the Board who has been granted long service leave for ten years' continuous service if, before a further ten years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the Board's service owing to having reached retiring age, or of permanent inability to carry on his employment, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted pro rata.

4. In the event of the resignation, retirement, or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such an employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee of a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

5. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

6. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid—(a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave; (b) the Board may at its discretion, either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

7. All annual leave to which the employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave but are to form part of such long service leave. 8. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term of service, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

THE Bridgetown Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Bridgetown Road Board.
(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two

days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.

2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing 30th June, 1940, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, which shall as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break of continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average weekly rate of pay over the preceding 12 months; (b) the Board may at its discretion, either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing that amount of his wages or salary for the period of this long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service. After completion of the first 10 years' service, employees shall be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. In the event of the resignation, retirement or death of an employee the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement or death or if the Board after consideration of all circumstances direct that the death of an employee be presumed the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death such date to be determined by the Board.

7. The ground of such proposed cancellation is as follows:-That the aforesaid Company is no longer engaged in the firewood industry.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 22 of 1950.

(Registered 3/11/50.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, this 1st day of November, 1950, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers (W.A. Branch) (herein-after called the Union), of the one part, and the Western Australian Egg Marketing Board (hereinafter called the Board) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:-

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Clerks' (Egg Marketing Board) Agreement."

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all employees of the Western Australian Egg Marketing Board, male or female, engaged on clerical work or as telephonists with the exception of the manager, the secretary, and the accountant.

4.—Definitions.

"Employee" means any clerical worker including telephonist, engaged on the staff of the Western Aus-tralian Egg Marketing Board, covered by this Agreement.

"The Board" shall mean the Western Australian Egg Marketing Board.

5.-Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be 371/2 hours per week and shall be worked in five days of the week, Monday to Friday, inclusive.

6.—Classification.

The classification of positions and employees and the fixing of salaries of employees shall be vested in the Board subject to the right of appeal as provided in clause 23 of this Agreement.

In making a classification under this clause the Board shall adhere to the salary scales provided in this Agreement.

7.-Basic Wage.

The basic wage hereinafter referred to shall be as determined from time to time by the Court of Arbitra-tion of Western Australia but at the date of operations of this Award was £7 per week for males and £3 15s. 7d. per week for females in the metropolitan area.

"Basic rate" means in the case of males and females in Basic rate. means in the case of males and remains employed in the metropolitan area, the nearest \pounds to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage respectively for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6). At the date of operation of this Agreement the basic rate for males was £365 and for females £197 per annum.

8.—Rates of Pay.

(a) Male Juniors:

(ii) Classes and grades beyond a margin of £125 per annum over the basic rate shall be those set out in clause 9, subclause (a), of this Agreement.

(iii) A male adult who is a married man or who is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Board, shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the

next higher grade than the rate of pay according to years of adult service with a maximum margin, inclu-sive of such allowance of £125 per annum over the basic rate: Provided that the employee concerned has served continuously with the Western Australian Egg Marketing Board for a period of at least two years in a clerical capacity.

(iv) An employee retained on the maximum of the automatic range for five (5) years shall be paid an allowance of fourteen pounds (£14) per annum: Provided that such employee is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct. Such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or an employee refusing to accept promotion. accept promotion.

(c) Female Junior Clerks, Typists, Machinists and Telephonists:

(iii) An employee who has been in receipt of a rate of pay equivalent to a margin of £125 per annum over the basic rate for one year or more shall be paid an allowance of fourteen pounds (£14) per annum, provided that-

- (a) in the case of a typist or clerk-typist she passes an examination in shorthand writing at the rate of 120 words and typewriting at the rate of 50 words per minute respectively;
- (b) In the case of a machinist she passes an examination in bookkeeping and the operation of ledgerposting machines, such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position.

(iv) An employee retained on the maximum of the (iv) An employee retained on the maximum of the automatic range for five (5) years and who is not in receipt of the allowance referred to in subclause (e) hereof shall be paid an allowance of fourteen pounds (£14) per annum: Provided that such employee is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or an employee refusing to accept promotion.

(v) The minimum margins payable to telephonists 23 years and over shall not be less than the rate prescribed for age 23 in the automatic range.

Provided that liberty to apply shall be reserved to either party in respect to this subclause.

9.-Classes and Grades above the Automatic Range.

(a) The following classes and grades therein shall apply to male and female employees who are classified above respective automatic ranges :-

(i) Amalgamate any two (2) classes.

(ii) Fix a limit at the following places only :-Within class 4 at a minimum and intermediate

grade. Within class 3 at the intermediate grade.

10 .- Variations of Classes and Grades.

The salary rates set out in this Award shall be varied automatically to conform to any adjustments in standards of salary rates which may be made from time to time in the salary rates of clerical employees engaged in equivalent occupations: Provided the review of the marginal allowances for adjustment of salaries prescribed marginal allowances for adjustment of salaries prescribed herein shall be half-yearly, and such adjustment, if any, shall operate as from the commencement of the first fortnightly pay period beginning in the months of January and July in each year. For the purpose of this Award the operation of this subclause shall be deemed to commence as from the 26th March, 1948, but shall not have effect until 1st July, 1950.

11.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the certification of the Board as to good Subject to the certification of the Board as to good conduct, diligence and efficiency, employees classified in the classes referred to in clause 9 subclause (a) of this Agreement shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of respective classes by annual increments according to the grades of such classes. In the case of all other employees progression from year to year shall be subject to a similar certification.

12.—Qualification Allowance.

Any employee who obtains an accountancy or secre-tarial certificate shall be paid an allowance at the rate of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per week for accountancy qualifications and two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week for secretarial qualifications.

Provided that this shall not apply to officers classified in class 3 or higher.

13.—Overtime.

(a) The following work when carried out by direction of the management shall be classed as overtime:----

- (i) All work performed on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.
- (ii) All work performed before or after customary working hours on week days.

(b) No claim for payment or time off shall be allowed in respect of any day on which the additional time worked amounts to less than one hour or less than a quarter of an hour after the first hour, provided that if the total additional time worked in any week hour on any day shall be counted towards the completion of 21/2 hours in a week.

(c) When overtime is paid for it shall be at the rate per hour ascertained by applying the following formula: Weekdays:

For the first 5 hours in any week-

5 Normal hourly rate x -4

For excess of 5 hours in any week-

3 Normal hourly rate x 2

Saturday mornings:

3 Normal hourly rate x -

2 Saturday afternoons and Sundays:

Normal hourly rate $x = \frac{1}{1}$

Payment for all work performed on a public holiday shall be computed on the basis of ordinary time and shall be paid in addition to the day's pay which the employee would ordinarily receive in respect of such holiday.

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For the purpose of this subclause "uormal hourly rate" shall not include any personal allowance, quali-fications allowance and/or allowance for performing special duties unless the subclause of the performing fications allowance and/or allowance for performing special duties unless otherwise approved by the management.

(d) A break of at least thirty minutes must be made for meals between 12 noon and 2 p.m. when overtime is worked on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday, and between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on any day on which over-time is worked. Such breaks shall not be recognised as overtime.

14.—Meal Allowance.

(a) Where employees are required to work on after (a) Where employees are required to work on after the usual time for ceasing duty they shall, where such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from the usual place of residence, be reinbursed for each meal at the rate of 2s. 6d. and shall be reinbursed the cost of each meal necessarily taken away from the usual place of residence on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each meal, provided that in each case the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. the meal break totals not less than two hours.

15.—Higher Duties.

An employee required to perform the duties of position higher than that in which he himself is classified for a continuous period of not less than three (3) weeks shall be paid the minimum salary of the range of the position being relieved for the whole of the time he is so relieving.

Provided that no allowance shall be paid to an officer classified as a junior when acting in a higher position or to a female when acting in a position classified within the male automatic range.

16.—Public Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as public holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Satur-day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Founda-tion Day, Royal Show Day (from 12 uoon), King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) A period of two weeks' annual leave with pay shall be granted for each year of continuous service. Where the continuous service is over one month but less than twelve months *pro rata* leave shall be granted.

(c) Should any of the holidays referred to in sub-clause (a) occur during the period an employee is on annual leave, a day in lieu of any such holiday shall be added to the period of annual leave.

17.-Contract of Service.

The engagement of any employee shall be terminated by one week's notice on either side, such notice to expire on the usual pay day, excepting that an employee deemed guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

18.-Accrued Rights.

(a) No privilege or concession enjoyed by employees prior to the date of operation of this Agreement shall, unless expressly provided herein, be varied or cancelled solely by reason of the provisions of this Agreement.

(b) No employee shall as a result of this Agreement suffer any reduction in the total remuneration which he may have enjoyed prior to the date of the operation thereof.

19.-Recognition of Union.

All employees bound by this Agreement shall be members of the Union: Provided that any employee appointed, who at the time of engagement is not a member of the Union, shall become a member within fourteen days.

20.-Record Book.

A record shall be kept showing the name of each employee bound by this Agreement, the hours worked each day and the amount of salary received each pay. The said record shall be open to inspection by an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

21.—References.

A reference shall be given to an employee of not less than three months' service containing all necessary in-formation in regard to length of service and duties performed.

22.-Rights of Appeal.

(a) An Appeal Board consisting of a chairman, mutually agreed between the parties to this Agreement, and two other representatives, one to be noninated by each of the parties, shall be set up, as may be required from time to time, to hear and determine any appeal by a member of the Union against a decision of the management in respect of—

- (i) the title, classification, re-classification, or salary of such member of the Union;
 (ii) the interpretation or application of the provi-
- sions of this Agreement.

(b) The time within which written notice of appeal shall be lodged with the management shall be as follows:

- (i) In the case of an appeal in respect of title, classification or reclassification, twenty-eight days after the publication of such title, classification or reclassification.
- (ii) in the case of an appeal against any other matter twenty-eight days after the occurrence of the matter aforesaid.
 (c) The decision of the Board shall be final and

binding on all parties.

23.-Leave Without Pay.

(a) On the application of any officer the Board may grant to him leave of absence without pay for any period not exceeding twelve months.

(b) The period during which any officer is absent on leave granted pursuant to subclause (a) hereof shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

24.—Term.

This Agreement shall be for a period of one year commencing from the 1st day of July, 1950.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 50 of 1950.

Between The Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and The Hon. Minister for Industrial Development, Western Australia, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:---

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note .- Wherever the word "Award" occurs hereunder, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as "The Wundowie Charcoal Iron and Steel Industry Award'' and shall super-sede Award No. 7 of 1948, as amended by No. 41 of 1949.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers engaged in occupations mentioned herein and employed in or in connection with the Wundowie Charcoal Iron and Steel Industry as carried on by the Minister for Industrial Development: Provided it shall not apply to workers in this industry who are covered by the Timber Work-ers' General Award No. 17 of 1947.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be two years as from the 23rd October, 1950.

5.-Hours for Day Workers.

Forty (40) hours exclusive of crib time shall constitute a week's work. If more than one shift is worked forty hours shall be inclusive of crib time for such shift workers.

The week's work shall consist of eight (8) hours per day exclusive of crib time, from Monday to Friday, or in such other manner as may be mutually agreed upon between the Management and the Union.

6.-Overtime for Day Workers.

(a) All time worked in excess of the daily rostered hours or in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work performed on Sunday shall be at the rate of double time except in connection with repairs to employer's machinery which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations, in which case the rate of time and a half shall apply.

(c) When called upon to work without a break of eight (8) hours from the end of the preceding shift, a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and a half unless he is allowed a break of at least eight hours and then until the commencement of such break only.

(d) When a worker is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour without having been notified the previous day, he shall be provided with a meal or shall be paid 2s. 6d. in respect of such meal.

(e) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

7.-Hours for Continuous Process and Other Continuous Shift Workers.

The normal hours of work, including work performed on Sunday, shall be forty (40) per week to be worked in five days of the week, such shifts to be of eight (8) hours each including crib time.

8.-Overtime and Penalty Rates for Continuous Process and Other Continuous Shift Workers.

(a) All time worked in excess of the normal hours of eight (8) per shift or in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter: Provided that a worker called back to perform any shift on Sunday after having completed his five shifts of eight hours shall be paid at the rate of double time for the time so worked.

(b) Subject to paragraph (a) hereof, work performed on Sunday shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first eight (8) hours and double time thereafter.

(c) Shift workers whose working period includes Sat-urday as a normal rostered day shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the ordinary shift of eight (8) hours performed on such Saturdays.

(d) Overtime rates shall not apply when excess time is worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or where the overtime is caused owing to a relief man not coming on at his appointed time or where an extra shift is necessary to effect the customary periodical rotation of shifts.

(e) If a worker is called upon to work without a break of eight (8) hours from the end of his preceding shift, he shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until he is allowed a break of at least eight hours and then to the commencement of such break only.

(f) Shift workers other than day shift workers shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate for afternoon shift and seven and a half per cent. $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$ for night shift: Provided overtime and shift work rates shall not be cumulative on Saturday and Sunday penalty rates.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service wth such employer.

(ii) Seven-day shift workers, i.e., a shift worker who is rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed, in addition to the leave to which he is entitled under clause (a) (i) hereof, seven consecutive days' leave, including non-work. ing days.

Where an employee with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the part of two consecutive weeks' annual leave pre-scribed in subclause (a) (i) hereof increased by half a day for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(b) If any holiday under this Award falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period, one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness, with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(c) (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

or payment therefor. (f) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to pay-ment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them. Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Department of its right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential as may be essential.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause b) hereof, shall mean the rate of wage the worker (a) has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave. (h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to

casual workers.

10 .--- Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzae Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in ad-dition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subse-count date if the worker as carries quent date, if the worker so agrees.

(c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave with-out pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately predue, of a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

11.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of service of every worker shall be on a weekly contract, termin. able on either side by giving one week's notice given on any day, or by payment on any day of one week's wages in lieu of such notice.

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subpay for the actual time of such non-attendance, sub-ject to the provisions of clause 7, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award. This clause does not affect the right of dismissal for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismiscal colu dismissal only.

(c) The employer shall be entitled to deduct pay-ment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union associated with it, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or

any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent with the exception of wet weather in which case the decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the officer in charge, if available, and in his absence, the foreman.

12 .--- Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for on attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein pro-vided shall be allowed to accumulate, and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year. (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end

of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensa-tion Act, 1912-1944.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

(e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.

(ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.

13.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a time and wages record, wherein shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of his work each day, the hours worked each day, and the wages and other allow-ances paid each week. Such book shall be open for inspection by an accredited representative of the Union at the plant office during working hours.

14.-Casual Workers.

Workers employed for less than one week shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) above the rate specified for the work.

15.-Wet Places.

Workers while working in wet places shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to the rate prescribed.

"Wet places" shall mean places where the water is over the workers' ankles or top of gum boots when provided, or where in performing the work the splashing of water and mud saturates their clothing, or where pro-tection is not provided to prevent splashings or drip-pings sufficient to saturate their clothing. The officer in charge, foreman or ganger shall decide whether a place is a ''wet place'' within the meaning of this clause.

16.-Mixed Functions.

If a worker is employed on work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary work for more than two (2) hours in any shift, he shall be paid the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift. If he is employed for less than two hours, he shall be paid at his ordinary rate for the whole shift,

17.-No Reduction.

Any worker who has been, prior to the date of this Award, in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his partienlar class of work than that prescribed by the Award heretofor in force shall not by reason of this Award suffer any reduction in the amount by which such higher rate of pay exceeded the amount formerly prescribed. Such excess amount shall not be affected by this Award.

Margin ner

24.—Wages—continued.

Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men
employed, the Manager, in selecting those to be re-
tained, shall give full weight to the consideration of
length of service, and all things being equal shall
retain those who have been longest in the employ of
the company.

18.—Reduction of Workers

19.-Board of Reference.

A Board of Reference shall be appointed for the purpose of this Award. The Board shall consist of a chairman who shall be a person selected by the re-presentatives of the parties, and two other repre-sentatives, one to be appointed by the employer and one by the Union. There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of-

1. Deciding any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time.

2. Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

3. Classifying and fixing wage rates not specifically mentioned in the Award.

20.-Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Award.

21 .- Dirty Work.

Workers employed on work of an unusually dirty or obnoxious nature and whose marginal rate contains no monetary allowance for working under such conditions shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the daily rate of pay.

The officer in charge, foreman or ganger shall decide whether work is dirty work within the meaning of this clause.

22.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of an-other recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or appli-caut for employment who is not a member of any registered industrial union shall within fourteen days of commencing employment under this Award make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another registered industrial union shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within fourteen days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

23.-Interviewing Workers.

Any accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to inspect the premises of the employer at all reasonable times and interview the workers covered by this Award.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

10.-Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-tenth of a week's pay at the Award rate for each 23.7 shifts actually worked at ordinary rates of pay: Provided that, subject to subclause (d) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(e) For the purpose of assessing a worker's entitlement to accumulated sick pay, subclause (d) hereof shall be deemed to have become operative as from the 1st day of January, 1950.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, of Western Australia, this 20th day of December, 1950, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter called the Association) of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter called the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all permanent officers employed within the State of Western Australia under the Public Service Act, 1904, in the professional, clerical and general divisions whose maximum margins over the basic rate are less than seven hundred and twenty-six pounds (£726) per annum.

2.—Interpretation.

In this Agreement, the following expression shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby applied to it, namely:—

"Basic rate" means in the case of-

(a) Male or female officers employed in the metropolitan area; the nearest \pounds to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage respectively for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

(b) Male or female officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared; the nearest £ to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage, respectively, for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

3.—Professional Officers.

(a) The following classes and grades therein shall apply to male and female officers in the professional division subject to the provisions of clauses 4, and 5 in respect of draftswomen and ex-cadets, respectively:—

(c) (i) A draftsman who obtains a diploma of the Perth Technical College for mechanical or structural engineering or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid, whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of three hundred and ten pounds (£310) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale.

(ii) A draftsman who passes the associate membership examination of the Institution of Engineers, Australia, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid—

(a) whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) per annum, an allow-

ance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the second higher grade in the incremental scale;

(b) whilst in receipt of a rate of pay exceeding a margin of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) per annum and not exceeding a margin of three hundred and seventyfive pounds (£375) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale.

(iii) Provided that a draftsman who obtains more than one of the above qualifications shall only be entitled to payment of the allowance prescribed in either subclause (i) or subclause (ii) hereof, as the case may require, and no payment shall be made for more than one of the qualifications obtained.

(f) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(g) (i) A male adult clerk who obtains a Diploma of Commerce at the University of Western Australia, or passes the final examinations in all subjects of a recognised Institute of Accountants, or Secretaries or Cost Accountants, or passes in five units (including English I.) of a degree course in Arts, Science or Law at the University of Western Australia, or passes the examination in Law prescribed under section 25 of the Public Service Act, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid, whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of three hundred and ten pounds (£310) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale. (ii) A male adult clerk who obtains a degree at the University of Western Australia in Arts, Commerce, Science or Law, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid—

- (a) whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the second higher grade in the incremental scale;
- (b) whilst in receipt of a rate of pay exceeding a margin of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) per annum, but not exceeding a margin of three hundred and seventy-five pounds (£375) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale;
- (iii) Provided that an officer who obtains more than one of the above qualifications shall only be entitled to payment of the allowance prescribed in either subclause

efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(f) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

13.-Persons Temporarily Employed.

Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 1 hereof, a person temporarily employed under section 31 of the Public Service Act, 1904, shall be paid at a daily or weekly rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable in accordance with this Agreement to a permanent officer of not more than equal efficiency should he or she be engaged on similar duties, provided that—

(a) a male adult, temporarily employed in a clerical capacity, shall be paid on appointment an amount at least equivalent to the following rates:—

- (i) Under the age of 23 years—The rate prescribed for age in clause 6, subclause (a) of this Agreement.
- (ii) Twenty-three years of age and over —The rate prescribed in clause 6, subclause (a) of this Agreement for the third year of adult service.
- (b) In no case shall the provisions of the following clauses of this Agreement apply in respect of a person temporarily employed:—
 - 3 (c), 6 (d), (6 (e), 6 (g), 7 (d), 7 (e), 9 (d).

14.—Annual Increments.

(a) Subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a report from the permanent head regarding the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officers as provided for by Public Service Regulations, officers classified in the classes referred to in the following clauses of this Agreement shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of respective classes by annual increments according to the grades of such classes:—

3 (a), 4 (b), 6 (b), 7 (b), 9 (b), 10 (a).

(b) In the case of all other officers, progression from year to year shall be subject to the receipt of a similar report from the permanent head.

15.—Adjustment of Rates of Pay.

(a) The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay contained in this Agreement is the rate payable to a male clerical officer on attaining the age of 27 years or during the seventh year of adult service. This latter rate of a margin of one hundred and eighty-five pounds (£185) per annum over the basic rate, as prescribed by clause 6, subclause (a) of this Agreement, is arrived at from the average of the respective margins, over the Commonwealth basic wage rates for the capital cities of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania, for male adult clerical officers on the maximum of the automatic ranges in the Public Service of those States.

(b) Where necessary, and in the manner prescribed by subclause (c) hereof, the rates of pay contained in this Agreement shall be subject to adjustment half-yearly as from the commencement of the first fortnightly pay period beginning in the months of July and January in each year according to the average of the margins of the other States, over respective Commonwealth basic wage rates as at the 1st July and 1st January respectively, for male adult clerical officers on attaining the age of 27 years or such earlier age as may be prescribed for the maximum of the male adult automatic range.

(c) The manner of adjustment shall be:---

(i) Margins of £185 per annum and above—The difference between the average (to the nearest £1) of the margins for the other States and the margin, over the Commonwealth basic wage rate for Perth, payable in the metropolitan area to male adult clerical officers on the maximum of the automatic range in accordance with clause 6, subclause (a) of this Agreement: Provided that if the amount determined would result in an adjustment of less than five pounds (£5) per annum from the last current adjustment, if any, then no variation shall be made.

(ii) Margins below £185 per annum-

Males.—Pro rata (to the nearest £1) with the gross rate (margin plus basic rate) payable in the metropolitan area to a male adult clerical officer on the maximum of the automatic range;

Maintenance of Rights of Appeal.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained or implied, the rights of officers in re-spect of all appeals under the Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920, shall be preserved and maintained, subject to any legal rights which the Commissioner or any other respondent may have in relation thereto.

17.-Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years commencing from the 1st January, 1951.

Provided that:

(a) Either party to this Agreement may, after the 1st January, 1952, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, or approach the Court of Arbitration for an amend-ment to this Agreement.

(b) In the event of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia varying the basis in operation at the date of commencement of this Agreement for determining the female basic wage for respective areas then the rights of both parties are reserved to negotiate an amendment to this Agreement at any time or to approach the Court of Arbitration for an amendment to this Agreement.
