### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. JAMES MITCHELL, Governor. [L.S.]

(A, ) By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James J Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

Corr. 1461/39.

WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1943 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder which have been used for streets or ways within the City of Perth, be declared public highways: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutley dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Name of Street, Width, Position, Titles Office Plans. Alderbury Street; 1 chain plus truncations; from the South-Eastern corner of lot 418 of Perthshire Location A1 to the prolongation Southwards of the Western alignment of Ferndale Street; 6091.

Evandale Street; 1 chain plus truncations; from the South-Eastern corner of lot 413 of Perthshire Location A1 to the Eastern alignment of Rosedale Street; 6091. # The Land Act, 1933-1950. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 4401/50. WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any muni-cipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 23189 for a Children's Playground at Dudinin (Lot 46) should be placed under the control of the Kulin Road Board as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Kulin Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

# Health Act, 1911-1950. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 1332/48, Ex. Co. No. 70.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 248 of the Health Act, 1911-1950, that the term "dangerous infectious disease" means and includes certain specified diseases and also any other disease which the Governor may declare to be a dangerous in-fectious disease for the purpose of the Act; and whereas it is desired to declare certain diseases to be dangerous infectious diseases and to revoke the declaration of certain diseases as dangerous infectious diseases: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the diseases mentioned in Schedule A hereto shall cease to be dangerous infectious diseases within the meaning of section 248 of the said Act and the diseases mentioned in Schedule B hereto shall be dangerous infectious diseases.

#### Schedule A.

Asiatic cholera. Cerebro-spinal meningitis. Typhoid fever (including Paratyphoid A and B). Bubonic plague. Acute anterior poliomyelitis. Enteric fever and salmonella. Scarlatina or scarlet fever.

Schedule B.

Cholera. Leptospirosis. Meningococcal infection. Ornithosis. Paratyphoid. Plague.

Poliomyelitis. Puerperal fever. Salmonella infection. Scarlet fever. Trachoma. Typhoid fever.

# Health Act, 1911-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

# P.H.D. 1332/48.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Health Act, 1911-1950, that the term "infectious disease" means and includes certain specified diseases and also any other disease which the Governor may declare to be an infectious disease for the purpose of the Act; and whereas it is desired to declare certain diseases to be infectious diseases and to revoke the declaration of certain diseases as infectious diseases: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the diseases mentioned in Schedule A hereto shall cease to be infectious diseases within the meaning of section 3 of the said Act and the diseases mentioned in Schedule B hereto shall be infectious diseases.

Schedule A.

Undulant fever. Lepto spiral jaundice (Weil's disease). Enteric fever and salmonella. Virus encephalitis. Brills or endemic typhus.

#### Schedule B.

Acute rheumatism (rheumatic fever). Brucellosis. Chorea (St. Vitus). Homologous serum jaundice. Lead poisoning. Trichinosis. Amoebiasis. Leptospirosis. Meningococcal infection. Ornithosis. Paratyphoid. Poliomyelitis. Salmonella infection. Trachoma.

3. Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (i) of subsection (2) of section nine of the Act, it is hereby declared that the provisions of subsection (1) of that section which preclude the commencement of a building operation without the consent of the Commission shall not apply to the construction of a residential building intended for permanent use as a dwelling house if the floor area of the building does not exceed fifteen hundred square feet.

#### Release of Building Material from Control.

4. The provisions of the last preceding regulation do not prejudice the provisions of the Act which impose certain restrictions on transactions in building materials but where a building operation is the subject of an approval of a local authority, that approval shall accompany the application referred to in section twenty-one of the Act, for a license to acquire controlled building material, which is required for the building operation.

Amendment of By-laws for the Control of the Medical Fund.

P.H.D. 439/45, Ex. Co. No. 74. AT a meeting of the board of management of the Wiluna District Hospital held on the 24th day of June, 1950, the following resolution was passed:— Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1948, a board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such fund; and whereas the board of management of the Wiluna District Hospital has established a Medical Fund and has made by-laws for the control and management thereof as published in the Government Gazette on the 1st day of May, 1942, and further amended by notices published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of March, 1945, and on the 3rd day of October, 1947; and whereas the said board of management now deems it expedient to amend the said by-laws in the manner men-tioned in the Schedule hereunder: Now, there-fore the said board of management of the Willing tioned in the Schedule hereunder: Now, there-fore, the said board of management of the Wiluna District Hospital, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1948, doth hereby amend the by-laws for the control and management of its said Medical Fund hereinbefore mentioned in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

#### Schedule.

By-law 2 is deleted and a new by-law is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:-

2. Any person who subscribes 1s. 6d. per week or the sum of 19s. 6d. per quarter, or any male person under the age of 16 years, or single woman or widow who subscribes the sum of 1s. per week or 13s. per quarter shall be termed a subscriber. Males under the age of 16 years earning more than 30s. per week, but less than £3 per week shall subscribe 1s. per week, and males under the age of 16 years earning £3 per week or more shall subscribe 1s. 6d. per week. (v) not burn (except within incinerators approved by the department) any debris, bark, sawdust or other material whatsoever at any place within one and a half chains from the nearest part of the sawmill;

(vi) arrange periodic inspections of the sawmill during the non-working hours for the purpose of preventing if possible any outbreak of fire on the sawmill;

(vii) immediately after operations in the sawmill cease on each working day damp down by spraying with water the interior of the sawmill and an area having a perimeter of ten feet from the sawmill.

For the purpose of this regulation any equipment or appliances to be used for fire-fighting and approved by the department shall be deemed to be efficient fire-fighting equipment and appliances.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Northampton Road Board.

L.G. 1325/35.

THE Northampton Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:---

(a) "Board" means the Northampton Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the manpower directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

All employees of the Board shall, after each 2 period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing from 30th of June, 1941, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, pro-viding the period of absence shall not exceed three months in a year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid-

- (a) their salary or wage of the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week imediately preceding the taking of long service leave;
- (b) the Board may, at its discretion, either-
  - (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or
  - (ii) pay to an employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

5. (a) Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' ser-After the completion of the first 10 years, vice. employees will then be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

(b) The long service leave granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

All annual leave to which an employee is 6 entitled or will become entitled before the expira-tion of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form a part of such long service leave.

7. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

Long service leave shall be considered as a 8 special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance of long service leave.
