WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Geraldton Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Geraldton, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for despasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 23191 for Soil Conservation (Yilgarn A.A. INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 24 of 1950.

(Registered 15th December, 1950.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, this 13th day of December, 1950, between the Hon. Minister for Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Kimberley Research Station Farm Workers' Agreement. (Original Agreement.)

3.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for two (2) years from the date hereof.

4.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers engaged in the vocations mentioned herein and employed by the respondent at the Kimberley Research Station, Ord River.

5.—Hours.

- (a) The hours of work shall be eighty (80) per fortnight.
- (b) (i) The Minister may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) The Union or worker or workers covered by this agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (iii) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

7.—Deductions.

- (a) Employees provided with board and lodging for themselves only shall be charged an amount equal to a maximum of 28 per cent. of the male basic wage; provided that no charge shall be made when a worker is away during annual leave.
- (b) The deductions as specified above shall be made from the wages set out herein.

8.—District Allowance.

District allowance shall be paid in accordance with the relative provisions of Award No. 24 of 1947 and as may be amended.

9.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid, subject to such day being taken at a time mutually arranged between employer and employee.
- (c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

- (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.
- (d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such annual leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.
- (e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.
- (f) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them.
- (g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.
- (h) Workers regularly working for the Government North of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years, subject to the convenience of the Department. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two (2) years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.
- (i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

10.—Public Holidays.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day: Provided that by agreement between the Union and the employer the local race day for the district may be substituted for one of the above holidays.
- (b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.
- (c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

 (e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.
- (f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

11.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted by the respondent to this Agreement in accordance with the conditions relating to full-time Government wages employees generally.

12.—Overtime.

- (a) All work performed outside the daily spread, or beyond 80 hours per fortnight, shall be deemed to be overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a half, provided that any necessary attention to stock shall not be deemed overtime.
- (b) A worker required to attend to stock outside the spread of shifts, or in addition to the 80 hours per fortnight, shall receive an allowance of 2s. per day, with a maximum of 12s. 6d. per week of seven days.

13.—Day Off Each Week.

All workers shall be allowed one full day off each week subject to the requirements of clause 12.

14.—Contract of Service.

- (a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker fails to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness or is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Agreement.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such cases wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.
- (d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

15.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representative, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

16.—Board of Reference.

- (i) For the purpose of this agreement, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—
 - (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this agreement or any of them;
 - (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time:
 - (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the agreement.

(ii) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, which for this purpose are embodied in this agreement.

17.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of the said Union shall within 14 days of commencing employment under this agreement make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another industrial union, shall, upon expiration of his current membership with such other union, within 14 days of such expiry make and complete an application. days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

18.—Definitions.

"General farm hand" shall mean a worker called upon to carry out all duties associated with the various activities of the respondents to this agreement relating to the operating and servicing of farm machinery and equipment in addition to other work involved in primary agricultural production. work involved in primary agricultural production.

"Leading hand" shall mean a worker who is in charge of, and directs the work of three or more other workers under this agreement.

19.-Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every four, or fraction of four, adult male workers. The rate of pay for junior workers shall be as under:

20.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty to apply is reserved in respect to any of the clauses herein which are now regarded as Government standards but which may be varied by the Court of Arbitration at any subsequent date within the currency of this Agreement.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 25 of 1950

(Registered 19th December, 1950.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, this 19th day of December, 1950, between the Metropolitan Superphosphate and Chemical Works Industrial Union of Workers of the one part and the Hon. Minister for Industrial Development of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Chemical Workers Wundowie Agreement.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers engaged in occupations mentioned herein and employed in connection with the refinery section of the wood distillation, charcoal iron and steel industry, Wundowe, as carried out by the Minister for Industrial Development.

The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year from the date hereof.

5.—Hours.

Day Workers:

Forty (40) hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work. If more than one shift is worked, forty (40) hours shall be inclusive of crib time for such shift workers.

The week's work shall consist of eight (8) hours per day exclusive of crib time, from Monday to Friday, or in such other manner as may be mutually agreed upon between the management and the union.

6.—Overtime for Day Workers.

- (a) All time worked in excess of the daily rostered hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Work performed on Sunday shall be at the rate of double time except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations. in which case the rate of time and a half shall apply.
- (c) When called upon to work without a break of eight (8) hours from the end of the preceding shift, a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and a half unless he is allowed a break of at least eight hours and then until the commencement of such break only.
- (d) When a worker is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, without having been notified the previous day, he shall be provided with a meal or shall be paid 2s. 6d. in respect of any such meal,

- (e) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than an hour he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.
- 7.—Hours for Continuous Process and other Continuous Shift Workers.

The normal hours of work, including work performed on Sunday, shall be forty (40) hours per week to be worked in five days of the week. Such shifts to be of eight (8) hours each including crib time.

- 8.—Overtime and Penalty Rates for Continuous Process and other Continuous Shift Workers.
- (a) All time worked in excess of the normal hours of eight (8) per shift shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter; provided that a worker called back to perform any shift on Sunday after having completed his five shifts of eight hours shall be paid at the rate of double time for the time so worked.
- (b) Subject to paragraph (a) hereof, work performed on Sunday shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first eight (8) hours and double time thereafter.
- (c) Shift workers whose working period includes Saturday as a normal rostered day shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for the ordinary shift of eight (8) hours performed on such Saturdays.
- (d) Overtime and shift work rates shall not be cumulative on Sunday or Saturday penalty rates.
- (e) Overtime rates shall not apply when excess time is worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or where the overtime is caused owing to a relief man not coming on at his appointed time or where an extra shift is necessary to effect the customary periodical rotation of shifts.
- (f) If a worker is called upon to work without a break of eight (8) hours from the end of his preceding shift, he shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until he is allowed a break of at least eight hours and then to the commencement of such break only.
- (g) Shift workers other than day shift workers shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to their ordinary rate for afternoon shift and seven and a half per cent. $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$ for night shift.

9.--Wages.

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10.—Extra Rates and General Conditions. Workers employed on work of an unusually dirty or obnoxious nature and whose marginal rate contains no monetary allowance for working under such conditions shall be paid one shilling (1s. 0d.) per shift in addition to the daily rate of pay. The officer in charge, foreman or ganger shall decide whether work is dirty work within the meaning of this clause.

11.—Mixed Functions.

Where a worker performs duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification for two (2) hours or more of one day or shift, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of such day or shift.

12.—Contract of Hiring.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker whose engagement shall be by the day, terminable by one day's notice on either side given at any time, the contract of service of every worker shall be

on a weekly contract, terminable on either side by giving one week's notice on any day, or by payment on any day of one week's wages in lieu of such notice.

(b) Nothing herein shall derogate from the employer's right at common law to dismiss a worker without notice for misconduct or other sufficient cause, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

13.-Breakdown.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent, provided that wet weather shall not be a cause for deduction of pay

14.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept, a time and wages record, wherein shall be entered the name of each worker, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day, and the amount of overtime, if any. Such book shall be open for inspection by an accredited representative of the union at the plant office during working hours.

15.—Casual Workers.

Workers employed for less than one week shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) above the rate specified for the work.

16.—Sick Leave.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate, and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

 (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of signment.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.
- (e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.
- (ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.

17.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(ii) Seven-day shift workers, i.e., a shift worker who is rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed, in addition to the leave to which he is entitled under clause (a) (i) hereof, seven (7) consecutive days' leave, including non-working days.

Where an employee with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the part of two (2) consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in sub-

clause (a) (i) hereof increased by half a day for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(b) If any holiday under this Agreement falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesid. served as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness, with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3)

calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed for continuously of the purpose of t

portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave which have been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave which have been disconsisted. leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them. Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Department of its right to retain such workers at work during

the close-down period as may be essential.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof, shall mean the rate of wage
the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply

to casual workers.

18.—Public Holidays.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the (a) Except as hereinalter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee's not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date, if the worker so agrees.
- (c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.
- (e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

19.—Board of Reference

A board of reference shall be appointed for the purpose of this Agreement. The Board shall consist of a chairman who shall be a person selected by the representatives of the parties, and two other representatives, one to be appointed by the employer and one by the union. There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

(1) deciding any matters of difference which

may arise between the parties from time

to time;

- (2) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time;
- (3) classifying and fixing wage rates no specifically mentioned in the Agreement.

20.-Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full-time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Agreement.

21.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Metropolitan Superphosphate and Chemical Works Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of any registered industrial union shall within fourteen days of com-mencing employment under this Agreement make and complete an application for membership of the said union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another registered in-dustrial union shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within fourteen days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Metropolitan Superphosphate and Chemical Works Industrial Union of Workers.

22.—Right of Entry. On notifying the officer in charge, any officer of the union authorised in writing by the president the union authorised in writing by the president and secretary of such union, shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such union covered by this Agreement are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises: providing that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder employees in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their ployees are being hampered or hindered in their work.

Delete paragraph (b) of subclause (1) and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(b) Margin per week over the basic wage:-

2.—Clause 7—Meal Times.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

Not more than one (1) hour shall be deducted for meal times in any one day.

3.—Clause 9—Shortages.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:

A worker shall not be held responsible for shortages in money or bread unless notified by the employer or his authorised servant in respect to same by the end of the next working day following such appearing in his delivery book or bread book.

A time and wages record shall be kept by the employer where the worker usually commences work, in which entries shall be made each day by each worker of the time he starts and finishes work and of the time he has worked. The book or other record shall be open during working hours for the inspection of the secretary of the Union, or its accredited representative. Any system of automatic recording by mechanical means shall be deemed a compliance with this clause to the extent of the information recorded.

6.—Clause 14—Termination of Employment.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

(a) One (1) week's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the services of any but a casual hand shall be terminated.

7.—Clause 19—General Conditions.

Delete subclause (a) and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

Between Boilermakers' Society of Australia, Union of Workers, Coastal Districts, W.A., Applicant, and the Western Australian Government Railways Commission, Respondent.

HAVING heard Mr. G. C. Cahill on behalf of the applicant Union and Mr. K. D. Reeves on behalf of the respondent, and in pursuance of a remission to me by the Court of Arbitration, and in pursuance of the powers contained in section 92 of order and declare that Award No. 10 of 1947, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in the manner following:—

Clause 3.—Interpretations.

"Market Towns"—In the list of market towns insert the town of "Newdegate" after "Narrogin."

Add the following new definition:-

"Commission" or "Commissioner"—The words "Commission" or "Commissioner" wherever used, shall be deemed to refer to the Western Australian Government Railways Commission.

Clause 6.—Retirement.

Add to this clause a new subclause (c) as follows:

(c) In the event of either the Commission or the worker failing to give the prescribed notice, wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be, to the extent by which the actual notice given falls short of the fourteen (14) days' notice. Wages so forfeited by the worker may be deducted from any wages due to such worker up to the time of his leaving the service of the Commission: Provided that where both parties agree to the acceptance of notice of less than fourteen (14) days, no penalty shall be imposed.

Clause 8.—Payment for Sickness.

Delete the words and figure "six (6) appearing in subclause (a) of this clause and insert in lieu week." thereof the words and figure "one (1)

Clause 9.—Annual Leave or Holidays.

(1) Annual Leave.

Delete the second and third paragraphs of sub-clause (a) and insert in lieu thereof the follow-

Two (2) days' extra annual leave shall be granted to workers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and North and East thereof, and at Norseman and Southward thereof.

Two (2) weeks' extra leave shall be granted to workers stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway when clearing annual leave, such leave to be counted from the time of booking off duty at home station.

(2) Holidays.

Delete subclause (c) and insert in lieu thereof the following:

(c) In the case of workers working a five (5) day week, no payment or day in lieu shall be granted for any holiday falling on a day on which the normal roster provides for the worker to be off duty.

Clause 10.—Apprentices.

Delete subclause (c) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:

(c) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in this Award to the contrary, an apprentice required to live away from his home shall be paid not less than the rate applying to an apprentice in his second year.

Clause 14.—Hours of Duty.

Delete from subclause (c) of this clause the figures and letters "5.30 p.m." and insert in lieu thereof the figures and letters "4.45 p.m."

Clause 15-Guaranteed Week.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

15.—Guaranteed Week.

(a) The Commission shall normally guarantee to each worker a full week's work of forty (40) hours, exclusive of Sunday work, but if during any period, by reason of any action on the part of any section of its workers or for any cause beyond its control it finds itself unable to carry on either wholly or partially the complete running of trains, services, workshops or other normal operations, the Commission shall be entitled, notwithstanding any implication arising from the provisions of section 86 of the Government Railways Act, 1904-1948, as reprinted in 1949, to employ only such workers (if any) as it considers can be usefully employed, and for such hours only as it considers necessary, and during such period no worker shall be paid except for such time as shall be actually worked by him. Each week shall stand by itself.

Provided that employees who are required to attend for work and do so attend on any day shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours' pay at ordinary rates.

- (b) Employees stood down in accordance with the foregoing provision shall not lose any sick leave or other rights or privileges to which such employee would ordinarily be entitled, provided that this provision does not entitle an employee to payment for any Award holiday falling during such period of stand down.
- (c) The guaranteed period may also be reduced as follows:—
 - (i) In respect of any worker under suspension: Provided that any worker suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension.
 - (ii) In respect of any day a worker is absent, except through sickness as provided for in clause 8
