The destruction must be done to the satisfaction of the Board or its Inspector, who will inspect during and after the drive. Failure to comply with this order will lead to action being taken against the offenders.

Means to be Adopted.—Laying of poison baits in furrows, baits to contain any phosphorous or strychnine poisons, the breaking up of burrows by ploughing or deep tyning, and/or by fumigation. Trapping will not be recognised as an effective means of destroying or suppressing rabbits.

Award No. 1 of 1950.

Clause 2.—Area and Scope of Award.

Delete present clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

This Award shall apply to all officers employed in the Western Australian Government Railways, except the Commissioner of Railways, Assistant Commissioners of Railways, Heads and Sub-Heads of Branches, such officers who are members of the Western Australian Division of the Association of Railway Professional Officers of Australia, and managers, assistant managers, relief managers, manageresses and supervising officer, dining and buffet cars, etc., employed in the refreshment service section.

[‡]Limit fixed at intermediate margin Class 4.

Clause 3.—Interpretations.

Delete present clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

For the purpose of this Award—Head of Branch shall mean Secretary for Railways, Chief Traffic Manager, Chief Civil Engineer, Chief Mechanical Engineer, Comptroller of Accounts and Audit, and Comptroller of Stores, or such other Head of Branch as may hereinafter be appointed. "Sub-Head" shall mean the following officers or other sub-head as may be hereinafter

Secretary for Railways Branch: Industrial and Staff Agent, Commercial Agent, Officer-in-Charge Finance, Officer-in-Charge Assets, Superintendent Railway Refreshment Service.

Traffic Branch: Assistant Chief Traffic Manager and District Traffic superintendents, Chief Clerk to Chief Traffic Manager, Superintendent of Road Services, Superintendent of Operating, Research and Investigation.

Motive Power Section: Superintendent of Loco. Running, District Loco. Superintendents.

Mechanical Branch: Chief Clerk to Chief Mechanical Engineer.

Civil Engineering Branch: Chief Clerk to Chief Civil Engineer.

Accounts and Audit Branch: Expenditure Accountant, Chief Book-keeper, Chief Staff Officer, Paymaster and Receiver, Revenue Accountant, Chief Statistical Officer.

Stores Branch: Chief Clerk, Mill Manager. "Department" shall mean Western Australian Government Railways De-

partment.
"Commission" or "Commissioner"—The words "Commission" or "Commissioner" whenever used, shall be deemed to refer to the Western Australian

Government Railways Commission. "Union" shall mean the West Australian Raliway Officers' Union or

such other title as may be hereinafter registered.
"Home station"—Whenever the words "home station" are used they shall mean the station to which an officer is attached.

"Married officer" does not include a married officer whose wife and family are neither resident with nor dependent upon him but includes a single officer who has a parent or child solely dependent upon him and resident in the State of Western Australia.

"Suburban area" means Fremantle to Bellevue, East Perth to Maddington.

Clause 4.—Probation.

Delete present clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

- (a) a junior male clerk who within the first two years of his service passes the prescribed examination in-
 - (i) typewriting-40 words per minute; or
 - (ii) Pitman's shorthand—80 words per minute; or
 - (iii) telegraphy—15 words per minute sound and 15 words per minute transmission; or
 - (iv) timekeeping; or
 - (v) railway accounts; or
- (vi) any subject suitable to the Branch he has been appointed to shall be granted scale increase of salary three months prior to his birthday. Provided that in respect to (i) the increase shall apply only to the ensuing scale increase, but in respect to (ii), (iii), (iv), (v) and (vi), shall apply to future service. Provided also however, that in respect of Railway Accounts and Safe Working the period in which to qualify shall be two and a half
- (b) In addition, a junior male clerk who holds certificates for Railway Accounts and Telegraphy or Timekeeping or Pitman's shorthand, as per (a) Accounts and Telegraphy of Timekeeping of Pichan's shortmand, as per (a) and qualifies in Safe Working, or the qualifying examinations suitable to his Branch (which may include Pitman's shorthand at a speed of 120 words per minute) on or before attaining the age of 21 years, shall be granted a further advance of three (3) months on his scale increase and such increase shall apply to his future service.

Clause 5.—Hours of Duty.

Delete subclauses (a), (b), (e) and (m) and insert the following in lieu

(a) (i) The hours of duty of officers (other than Transport Officers) employed in the Head and District Offices shall be:—

Where a five-day week is worked—Monday to Friday—8.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. with interval of one (1) hour for lunch.

Where a six-day week is worked—Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. with interval of one (1) hour for lunch; Saturday, 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m.

Provided that no officer shall be required to work on Saturday unless considered absolutely necessary by the Commission.

- (ii) Transport officers shall not be rostered for more than thirty-seven and a half $(37\frac{1}{2})$ hours per week.
- (iii) The hours of duty Monday to Saturday, as specified in paragraph (i) may be varied in such a manner as is mutually agreed upon between the Department and the Union.
- (b) The hours of the telegraphists shall not exceed eight per shift exclusive of meal hours.
- (e) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for inspectors or other officers who are required to travel in the performance of their duties. Provided that the total number of hours worked per fortnight by any such officer shall not exceed 96 hours inclusive of travelling time. Provided also that this subclause shall not apply to pay officers.

(m) All time worked on Saturdays shall be paid at time and a half.

Add new subclauses (n) and (o) as follows:-

- (n) Except in cases of emergency or unless in special cases by agreement between the Union and the Commission, officers shall not be called on duty until they have had at least eight (3) hours off after the completion of a rostered shift. In cases where such officers are required to take up duty with less than the prescribed period of rest, they shall be allowed time at ordinary rates equivalent to that by which the period of rest has been shortened. This subclause shall not apply to officers covered by subclause (e).
- (o) All ordinary time worked between the hours of 12.1 a.m. and 6 a.m., and 8 p.m. and 12 midnight, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, shall be subject to the following penalty rates:—

Adult male officers, 4d. per hour. Female and Junior Male Officers, 2d. per hour.

Provided that the aggregate amount payable to any officer under this subclause in any financial year shall not exceed the following:—

Adult Male Officers, £15 per annum. Female and Junior Male Officers, £7 10s. per annum.

Clause 6.—Travelling Time.

Add new subclause (g) as follows:-

(g) Subclauses (a), (b), (d) and (e) shall also apply to officers travelling on Sunday.

Clause 7.—Overtime.

Delete subclause (i) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(i) Any officer in receipt of salary in excess of the maximum of the secondclass shall not be entitled to overtime pay. Provided that where non-payment of overtime to any officer in receipt of a salary in excess of the maximum of second-class would create an anomaly, overtime shall be paid under the provisions of this clause. Provided also that the amount payable to the higher class officers as overtime shall not exceed an amount calculated on the rate applicable to the maximum of the second-class.

Clause 8.—Sunday Time.

Delete subclause (b) (iii) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(b) (iii) If an officer works a broken shift on Sunday a minimum of a quarter $(\frac{1}{4})$ day's pay at the rate applicable to the day shall be paid for each section. No broken shift shall consist of more than two parts.

Add new subclause (b) (iv) as follows:-

(b) (iv) Where the break of shift is less than four (4) hours continuous time shall be paid for provided that one hour for any meal may be booked off without pay at an appropriate time.

Clause 9.—Leave of Absence—Annual.

Delete subclauses (a) (ii), (d), (h) and (i) and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

(a) (ii) After twelve (12) months' continuous service the following officers shall be entitled to annual paid leave of three (3) weeks and public holidays or days in lieu thereof:—

Officers stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway.

Those officers referred to in Clause 5 (e) of this Award. Transit officers and Assistant Transit Officers, Perth, Transport and Assistant Transport Clerks at district offices, also foremen and sub-foremen and their reliefs supervising work of guards, shunters or enginemen and who regularly rotate two or more shifts or who regularly work other than day shift.

- (d) The leave shall be taken out at a time convenient to the Department before the 30th June following the year for which it fell due. At the expiration of that time the leave shall lapse unless such leave shall have been deferred by the Department or the permission of the Commissioner is obtained for its accumulation.
- (h) Officers working a five (5) day week shall, when clearing days in lieu of public holidays worked, be debited with days on a five (5) day basis irrespective of the day of the week the officer does not normally work.
- (i) The Commission shall prepare and exhibit a roster not later than 30th September in each year showing the date it is intended to clear the leave due to each officer.

Clause 11.—Long Service Leave.

Delete subclause (j) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(j) An officer shall be given at least one month's notice before he is booked off on long service leave.

Clause 12.—Sick Leave.

Delete subclauses (c), (i) and (k) and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

- (c) Should the absence be prolonged beyond two days the officer shall except as provided in paragraph (d) forward to his superior officer on the third (3rd) day thereof a certificate from any legally qualified medical practitioner showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.
- (i) Officers who have conformed to the foregoing may be granted sick leave (exclusive of annual and long service leave) as follows:—

Officers with six (6) or less than six (6) months' service—nil, with the exception of appointees from wages to salaried staff whose accrued rights shall be preserved for six (6) months.

Officers with more than six (6) months' but less than three (3) years' service—two (2) weeks on full pay for each completed six months' service.

Officers with three (3) years' service and over—three (3) months' on full pay and six (6) months on half pay.

(k) In no case shall an officer be granted more than three (3) months on full pay and six (6) months on half pay in any one triennial period, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner. The triennial period to be the three (3) years preceding the date of illness for which payment is claimed.

Clause 13.—Away from Home Allowance.

Delete present clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

Allowances to meet the travelling expenses of officers will be paid as under:—

(1) (a) Daily allowance for the first ten (10) days—

Daily expenses after ten (10) days' residence at the same place to be reduced by twenty-five (25%) per cent.

- (b) Where an officer is engaged at one station for one (1) continuous period of four (4) weeks or more, an amount at the rate of £3 15s. per week shall apply in lieu of the foregoing and shall operate as from the first (1st) day of taking up duty at such station.
 - (2) General-
- (a) The daily rate shall represent in equal portions the expenses for three (3) meals and a bed. For the purpose of computing expenses in the case of arrival at home station breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later than 8 a.m., lunch if later than 1 p.m., tea if later than 6 p.m., and bed if later than 11 p.m. When an officer is proceeding away from home, breakfast shall be paid for if departing at or before 8 a.m., lunch if at or before 1 p.m., tea if at or before 6 p.m., and bed if at or before 11 p.m. When an officer does not incur expense in obtaining sleeping accommodation, the bed allowance shall not be payable unless approved by the Head of the Branch.
- (b) An officer absent from his home station (not temporarily lodging away from his home station) shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in suburban areas and three shillings (3s.) outside suburban areas for his second (2nd) and each succeeding meal; provided that any officer who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first (1st) meal shall be entitled to be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in suburban areas, and three shillings (3s.) outside suburban areas, in respect thereof.
- (c) When a sleeping berth is provided, the bed allowance will not apply, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night.
- (d) An officer on a weekly rate of expenses sleeping at a barracks where no other accommodation is available shall be charged the sum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per week.
- (e) Incidental expenses such as cab fares and cartage of personal luggage will be allowed; provided the time away from home station is sufficient to warrant such expenditure.
- (f) Where an officer required to work after his usual finishing time cannot reasonably be expected to go to his home or lodging for a meal, he shall, subject to the approval of the Head of the Branch, be allowed any expense incurred in obtaining a meal, up to a maximum of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in suburban areas and three shillings (3s.) outside such areas. This clause shall not operate where the excess time does not exceed one (1) hour.
- (g) In cases where an officer is engaged at other than his home station in receipt of weekly rate of allowance, and is temporarily away from such station, the daily allowance will be paid in lieu of the weekly rate for the period of such temporary absence, for twenty-four (24) hours or over; if the absence is less than twenty-four (24) hours, reasonable actual expenses will be paid.
- (h) Where an officer is relieving on expenses for a period of less than twenty-eight (28) days, he shall not receive greater payment for relieving expenses than he would have received if he had been relieving for twenty-eight (28) days.
- (i) An additional allowance of fifteen (15%) per cent. shall be granted an officer stationed outside the areas defined in clause 16, subclause (a) when travelling within such areas excepting those areas within the South-West Land Division.
- (j) Where officers travel by steamer on which the fare paid includes sustenance, an allowance of fifteen $(15\,\%)$ per cent. of the passage money shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowance.
- (k) Officers travelling on duty to the Eastern States via the Trans-Australian Railway will be paid such allowance from time of leaving Kalgoorlie until return thereto, as the Commissioner may determine.
- (1) Any unmarried officer who is required to undertake duties away from his headquarters, and who remains at one foreign station for a period exceeding twenty-eight (28) days shall be paid an allowance at the rate of thirty-two shillings and sixpence (32s. 6d.) per week; provided that this provision shall not apply where an officer is able to return to his home station daily.
- (m) Subclauses 1 (b), 2 (h) and 2 (l) will not apply until an officer has received information that his stay at one place will be of such duration as to bring him under the provisions of these subclauses.

- (n) In the case of officers whose salaries have been placed in a range outside the fixed classes, the away from home allowance shall be paid at the rate provided for the class in which the minimum rate of salary of the officer concerned is embraced.
 - (o) In special cases the above scale may be increased by the Commissioner.

Clause 17.—Free Passes, Privilege Tickets, etc.

Delete subclause (1) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(1) For the purpose of this clause, a member of the family shall be deemed to be dependent provided such member's income does not exceed twenty-five (25s.) shillings per week, exclusive of old age or invalid pension; but a member of the family temporarily out of employment shall not be deemed to be dependent.

Clause 20.—Promotions.

Delete subclause (h) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(h) A list of promotions shall be published in the "Weekly Notice" within fourteen (14) days of the Commissioner's approval. Any officer who considers that he has been unjustly passed over and has no right of appeal under the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945, may appeal, in the first place to the head of his branch, and if not satisfied with the latter's reply, may then appeal to the Commissioner, whose decison shall be final. The head of the branch or the Commissioner shall reply to the appeal within twenty-one (21) days, but no appeal will be considered unless forwarded so as to reach the head of the branch within fourteen (14) days after the receipt of the "Weekly Notice," and the Commissioner within fourteen (14) days after date of receipt of the reply from the head of the branch.

Clause 21.—Acting in Higher Capacity.

Delete present clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

- (a) When an officer, other than a relief officer in Class 5 or higher class, performs the duties of a position higher than that in which he is classified for a term exceeding seven (7) days continuous or fourteen (14) days broken within any one (1) financial year, he shall be paid from the end of the period while performing any such duties the minimum salary attached to such higher position. In the case of a relief officer in Class 5 or higher class this subclause shall apply when he has served in the higher position for a qualifying period of seventeen (17) weeks, continuous or broken, not necessarily in any one financial year. Payment of the higher rate shall commence as from the expiration of the qualifying period aforesaid.
- (b) An officer called upon to occupy a higher position temporarily, shall be entitled to increments as though he had been permanently promoted to such position; provided that in the case of the first increment the officer shall have performed the higher duties for twelve (12) months continuous or broken period; provided further, that the officer shall be entitled to receive a second increment if he shall have performed the higher duties for two (2) years continuous or broken period. Absence on anual leave, long service leave, or sick leave on pay shall be counted as service, provided the officer resumes in the same or another higher position.

Clause 22.—Temporary Clerks.

Delete subclause (d) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(d) The rate of pay shall be:—First six (6) months—Basic wage plus margin £2 per week; after six (6) months—basic wage plus margin £2 8s. 9d.

Clause 28.—Payment of Salaries.

Delete subclause (b) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(b) A day's salary shall be calculated as one-tenth (1/10th) of a fortnight's salary in the case of officers working a five-day week and one-twelfth (1/12th) of a fortnight's salary in the case of an officer working a six-day week.

Clause 30.—Rates of Pay.

Delete subclauses (a), (b), (e), (f) and (o) and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

For the purpose of computing expenses in the case of arrival at home station breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later than 8 a.m., lunch if later than 1 p.m., tea if later than 6 p.m., and bed if later than 11 p.m. When an officer is proceeding away from home, breakfast shall be paid for if departing at or before 8 a.m., lunch if at or before 1 p.m.,

tea if at or before 6 p.m., and bed if at or before 11 p.m. When an officer does not incur expense in obtaining sleeping accommodation, the bed allowance shall not be payable unless approved by the head of the branch.

- (d) An officer absent from his home station (not temporarily lodging away from his home station) shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in suburban areas and three shillings (3s.) outside suburban areas for his second (2nd) and each succeeding meal; provided that any officer who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first (1st) meal shall be entitled to be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in suburban areas, and three shillings (3s.) outside suburban areas, in respect thereof.
- (e) When a sleeping berth is provided, the bed allowance will not apply, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night.
- (f) An officer on a weekly rate of expenses sleeping at a barracks where no other accommodation is available shall be charged the sum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per week.
- (g) Incidental expenses such as cab fares and cartage of personal luggage, will be allowed; provided the time away from home station is sufficient to warrant such expenditure.
- (h) Where an officer required to work after his usual finishing time cannot reasonably be expected to go to his home or lodging for a meal, he shall, subject to the approval of the head of the branch, be allowed any expense incurred in obtaining a meal, up to a maximum of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in suburban areas and three shillings (3s.) outside such areas. This clause shall not operate where the excess time does not exceed one (1) hour.
- (i) In cases where an officer is engaged at other than his home station in receipt of weekly rate of allowance, and is temporarily away from such station, the daily allowance will be paid in lieu of the weekly rate for the period of such temporary absence, for twenty-four (24) hours or over; if the absence is less than twenty-four (24) hours, reasonable actual expenses will be paid.
- (j) Where an officer is relieving on expenses for a period of less than twenty-eight (28) days, he shall not receive greater payment for relieving expenses than he would have received if he had been relieving for twenty-eight (28) days.
- (k) An additional allowance of fifteen (15) per cent. shall be granted an officer stationed outside the areas defined in Clause 14 subclause (a) when travelling within such areas excepting those areas within the South-West Land Division.
- (1) Where officers travel by steamer on which the fare paid includes sustenance, an allowance of fifteen (15) per cent. of the passage money shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowance.
- (m) Officers travelling on duty to the Eastern States via the Trans-Australian Railway will be paid such allowance from time of leaving Kalgoorlie until return thereto, as the Commissioner may determine.
- (n) Any unmarried officer who is required to undertake duties away from his headquarters, and who remains at one foreign station for a period exceeding twenty-eight (28) days shall be paid an allowance at the rate of thirty-two shillings and sixpence (32s. 6d.) per week; provided that this provision shall not apply where an officer is able to return to his home station daily.
- (0) Subclauses (b), (j) and (n) will not apply until an officer has received information that his stay at one place will be of such duration as to bring him under the provision of these subclauses.
- (p) In the case of officers whose salaries have been placed in a range outside the fixed classes, the away from home allowance shall be paid at the rate provided for the class in which the minimum rate of salary of the officer concerned is embraced.
- (q) When the officer is relieving at a station and is assisted by his wife or other approved person, the allowances provided in subclauses (a), (b), (d) and (h) shall be doubled, provided expense is incurred by both persons.
 - (r) In special cases the above scale may be increased by the Commissioner.
- (s) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall not apply to officers for whom the Department provides board and/or lodging during such time as board and/or lodging is provided. Further, provided that in any special circumstances approved by the head of the branch the officer shall be entitled to a recoup of expense actually incurred at a rate decided by the Commissioner.

Clause 15.—Free Passes—Privilege Tickets, etc.

Delete subclause (i) and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

(i) For the purpose of this clause, a member of the family shall be deemed to be dependent; provided such member's income does not exceed twenty-five shillings (25s.) per week, exclusive of old age or invalid pension; but a a member of the family temporarily out of employment shall not be deemed to be dependent.

Clause 16.—Privilege Season Tickets.

Delete present clause, and insert in lieu thereof the following:— See Clause 18 of Award No. 2 of 1948.

Clause 17.—Resignations and Retirements.

of 1950.

Clause 19.—Acting in Higher Capacity.

Delete the present clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

When an officer other than a relief manager or manageress performs the duties of a position higher than that in which he is classified for a term exceeding seven (7) days continuous or fourteen (14) days broken within any one (1) financial year, he shall be paid from the end of the period while performing any such duties the minimum salary attached to such higher position. In the case of a relief manager this subclause shall apply when he has served in the higher position for a qualifying period of seventeen (17) weeks, continuous or broken, not necessarily in any one financial year. Payment of the higher rate shall commence as from the expiration of the qualifying period aforesaid.

UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT, 1911-1947.

31/1/1951.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of section 33 of the University of Western Australia Act, 1911-1947, has been pleased to approve of Amending Statute No. 2 of 1950, amending Statute No. 18, and made by the Senate and approved by the Convocation of the University of Western Australia pursuant to the provisions of section 31 of the said Act, by deleting sections 3 and 4 of Statute No. 18 and substituting in lieu thereof the provisions of amending Statute No. 2 of 1950, a copy of which is attached hereto duly sealed.

Conditions of Awarding Hackett Studentships and Scholarships.

(Excerpt from Statute No. 18.—Conditions of Awarding Hackett Bursaries, Hacket Studentships and Scholarships.) Sections 3 and 4.

- 3. Hackett Studentships shall be awarded under the following conditions:—
- (1) Post-graduate studentships hereinafter described as studentships of the value of two hundred pounds per annum are open to graduates of The University of Western Australia.
- (2) During such part of the period for which a studentship is awarded as is spent at a University outside Australia the student shall receive an additional allowance at the rate of one hundred pounds per annum.
- (3) A student may in each year of his studentship be granted a special allowance not exceeding three hundred pounds in the case of students who study outside Australia, provided that if the studentship is renewed for a second year this sum shall be reduced in the second year to one hundred

pounds, and one hundred pounds in the case of students who study within Australia which may be used under the direction of his tutor or supervisor to defray the cost of books, apparatus and other material which shall become and remain the property of the University and other expenses incidental to the student's work. The Vice-Chancellor may authorise any part of this special allowance to be used to pay the student's travelling expenses and the cost of remitting the student's allowances as defined in subsections (1) and (2) to the country where he is doing his work or course of study.

- (4) A studentship shall in the first instance be awarded for one year only, but may thereafter be renewed by the Professorial Board for one year if it is satisfied that the student is making good progress in the work or course of study for which the studentship was awarded. Applications for renewal must be accompanied by a recommendation from the student's tutor or supervisor and should reach the Vice-Chancellor not later than the first day of May in the year in which the studentship would otherwise come to an end.
- (5) (a) A student shall not without written permission engage in any work or course of study in addition to that for which the studentship was granted.
- (b) Written permission to undertake additional work or an additional course of study must first be obtained from the tutor or supervisor if the work or course of study will continue for less than four weeks and from the Vice-Chancellor if the work or course of study will continue for more than four week.
- (c) A student who undertakes additional work or an additional course of study without permission is liable to forfeit his studentship.
- (6) Applications for studentships must reach the Vice-Chancellor on or before a date to be fixed by him and advertised.

- (7) Every applicant must send to the Chancellor satisfactory evidence that his means are such as to make it difficult for him to work as a full-time student without the assistance of a studentship.
- (8) Every applicant must submit a scheme of work or course of study on which the Faculty concerned shall submit a report to the Professorial Board and which shall require the approval of the Board and must attach to his application a written estimate of the amount required by him for books, apparatus and other materials, travelling expenses and other authorised expenditure.
- (9) Awards of studentships will be made by the Professorial Board after reports on each application have been received from the Faculty or Faculties concerned, but the Board has a discretionary power to make no awards or to make less awards than the available number of studentships if it is of opinion that some or all of the applicants are not of sufficient merit to justify awards being made.
- (10) (a) A tutor or supervisor of such part of each student's work or course of study as is intended to be done at The University of Western Australia shall be appointed by the Dean of the Faculty and the Head of the Department concerned as soon as possible after each award is made.
- (b) A student who intends to do all or part of his work or course of study at an institution other than The University of Western Australia shall within three months of his enrolment at such institution submit to the Vice-Chancellor of The University of Western Australia the name of the tutor or other person under whose supervision he proposes to do his work or course of study.
- (11) Payment of the allowances defined in subsections (1) and (2) shall be made by instalments of such amounts as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine, the first of such instalments being payable at the commencement of the studentship and the remaining instalments at such times as may be decided by the Vice-Chancellor, but only after he has received sufficient evidence that the student is satisfactorily doing the work or course of study for which his studentship was awarded.
- (12) At the end of the studentship the student shall be required to supply to the University a full report on the work or course of study undertaken by him and such number of copies as the Vice-Chancellor shall require of any thesis or publications connected with his work or course of study.
- (13) Whenever any written work is carried out under a studentship acknowledgement thereof shall be made in the publication of such work.
- (14) If the Professorial Board considers a thesis submitted by a student to be of sufficient merit it may recommend the Senate to grant out of the funds available for Hackett Studentships not more than seventy-five pounds towards the cost of publishing the thesis on condition that the student shall supply to the University free of all charges as many copies of the published thesis as the Vice-Chancellor shall require and that the University shall have the right to use and dispose of such copies in whatever manner the Vice-Chancellor shall decide.
- (15) A student who is allowed to hold his studentship wholly or partly outside Australia shall before leaving the State enter into an agreement with the University whereby he shall promise that if within three years of the termination of his studentship he fails either to return to Australia and become and remain resident therein, or to satisfy the Senate that he has made a genuine but unsuccessful attempt to obtain suitable employment in Australia, he shall owe to the University a sum not exceeding one-half of the total amount (exclusive of the cost of books, apparatus and other material which have been surrendered to the University) paid by the University in connection with such part of his studentship as has been spent outside Australia, the amount of the debt hereunder to be decided in each instance by the Senate after consideration of all relevant facts.

- (16) The amount, which in accordance with the preceding subsection is declared by the Senate to be owed to the University shall be repaid to the University in the following manner:—
 - (a) On the termination of the period of three years, mentioned in the preceding subsection the student shall commence to repay to the University the amount of his debt by half-yearly instalments or by such other instalments as may be arranged by agreement between the student and the Vice-Chancellor, but so that payment of the whole debt shall be made within a period not exceeding ten years after the termination of the period of three years abovementioned and that no interest shall be payable on any part of the said debt.
 - (b) For the purposes of this and the preceding subsections a studentship shall be deemed to have been terminated on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which the student received the last payment under his studentship.
- 4. Hackett Scholarships shall be awarded under the following conditions:——
- (1) Post Graduate Scholarships hereinafter described as the Scholarships shall be open to graduates of The University of Western Australia and shall normally be tenable at the University but in exceptional circumstances and with the approval of the Professorial Board may be held at any other University or recognised institution within Australia. The scholarships shall be of a value not exceeding £125 per annum if held at the University of Western Australia and of a value not exceeding £175 per annum if held at any other University or recognised institution within Australia.
- (2) Scholarships shall normally be awarded for one year only but may be renewed by the Professorial Board for a second year.
- (3) A scholar may in each year of his scholarship be granted a special allowance not exceeding sixty-five pounds which may be used under the direction of his tutor or supervisor to defray the cost of necessary books, apparatus and other material, which shall become and remain the property of the University, and other expenses incidental to his work or course of study under the scholarship.
- (4) Subsections (5), (6), (7), (8), (9), (10), (12), (13) and (14) of section 3 shall apply to the award and tenure of scholarships with the words scholarship and scholar substituted for studentship and student respectively.
- (5) Payment of the allowance granted under subsection (1) of this section shall be made by instalments of such amounts as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine, the first of such instalments being payable at the commencement of the scholarship and the remaining instalments at such times as may be decided by the Vice-Chancellor, but only after he has received sufficient evidence that the scholar is satisfactorily doing the work or course of study for which his scholarship was awarded.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 26 of 1950.

THIS agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, this 18th day of December, 1950, between the Hon. Minister for Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") of the one part, and the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia, West

Australian Branch Association of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") of the other part, witnesseth as follows: Whereas the parties hereto being the parties to the Industrial Agreement made on the 20th day of March, 1947, and Nod. 15 of 1947, and as further varied by Amendment No. 60 (296) of 1947, and by Amendment No. 40 of 1948. Now the said Industrial Agreement is hereby further varied in the manner following, that is to say:—

4.-Hours.

Delete the whole of the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

- (a) 40 hours shall constitute a week's work.
- (b) Such ordinary hours shall be worked by day workers in five shifts of eight hours each, Monday to Friday, and by shift workers in eight hour shifts.
- (c) The hours of labour shall include all time occupied in raising steam, banking fires, starting up or closing down engines.
- (d) Where circumstances permit, regular starting and finishing times may be fixed by agreement in writing between the Union and the department concerned or its representatives.

5.—Wages.

Delete the whole of the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

- (b) Where a pumper-in-charge or second pumper is required to attend an electric generator exceeding 10 kilowatt capacity, he shall be paid an extra margin of 9s. per week.
- (c) In addition to the margins prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause:—
 - (i) The pumpers-in-charge at Barbalin, Waddouring, Knungagin, Narembeen, and Kondinin shall be paid an extra margin of 20s.

per week to cover all overtime worked in addition to such special duties as defined in clause 6 hereof.

(ii) The pumpers-in-charge at Meckering, Station Creek, Meekatharra, Nallan, Ora Banda and Menzies shall be paid an amount of 22s. 6d. per week to cover all overtime worked in any case where such a worker is required to work 92 hours or more in any one fortnight.

11.—Overtime.

Delete the whole of the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following, with respect to second pumpers:—

(a) All time worked in excess of the normal hours of eight per shift, or any additional shift, or part thereof shall, except as provided herein, be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter; provided that a worker called back to perform another shift on Sunday, after having completed his five shifts of eight hours shall be paid at the rate of double time for the time so worked.

(b) Saturday Time:

- (i) Rostered shift work performed on Saturday up to a maximum of eight hours in each shift shall be included in the week's work and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (ii) The extra quarter rate shall stand alone and be paid for as an addition to the workers' weekly earnings.
- (c) Sunday Time: Rostered shift work performed on Sundays up to a maximum of eight hours in each shift shall be included in the week's work and be paid for at the rate of time and a half. The extra half rate prescribed shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the workers' weekly earnings, provided that time worked in excess of eight hours on such Sundays shall be paid at the rate of double time, i.e., twice the ordinary rate, which rate shall be the maximum payable under this Award.
- (d) Overtime and shift work rates shall not be cumulative on Saturday and Sunday penalty rates.
- (e) The Department may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at such overtime rates, if any, as may be prescribed herein, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (f) The Union or any worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

These amendments shall come into force as from and including the 18th day of December, 1950.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Between State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, Applicant, and Cyclone Fence and Gate Co., Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day a meaned hefers the Conciliation Commissioner. this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court an Award of the Court.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the 11th day of January, 1951, subject to the right of any party to the Award to apply to the Court for a review of the provisions of this Award subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950.

(a) Forty (40) hours, exclusive of Sunday work, shall constitute a week's work: Provided that, by agreement between the employer and the workers employed in any particular establishment, the week's work may be worked in five (5) days exclusive of Schuden and Sunday clusive of Saturday and Sunday.

- (b) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours.
- (c) The ordinary hours of work shall be between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., except on Saturday, when work shall finish at noon.
 - (d) Lunch interval shall not exceed one hour.

7.—Overtime.

- (a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-
 - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subleurse. the requirements of this subclause.
 - (iii) This sub-clause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.
- (c) Work done on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in Clause 14 (a) shall be paid for at double time rates, except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.
- (d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving work, he shall be paid at least two hours at overtime rates.
- (e) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness.
- (f) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof.
- (g) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

8.—Shift Work.

- (a) Whenever shift work is worked, all shifts except the day shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (b) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as night shift unless five (5) consecutive nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overnights are worked, but shall be deemed to be over-time; on the completion of the fifth consecutive night's work, the worker shall be deemed to have been employed on night shift during that and the preceding four (4) nights, and thereafter dur-ing any subsequent consecutive nights he is so employed. The intervention of a Sunday or a holiday on which work is not performed shall not be deemed to break the sequence.
- (c) When night shift is to be paid at time and a quarter rate, as prescribed in the preceding subclause, overtime shall be based on the time and a quarter rate and calculated under clause 7 (a).

(d) Casual Worker shall mean a worker employed for less than one (1) week and he shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the abovementioned rates.

10.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

11.—Contract of Service.

- (a) The contract of service shall be by the day, and shall be terminable by one day's notice on either side, except in the case of a casual worker, when one hour's notice shall suffice.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 13, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Award.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

12.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

13.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.
- (b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

- (d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only or less, unless he produces to the employer, a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of ill-health.
- (g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
- (h) For the purpose of assessing a worker's entitlement to accumulated sick pay, subclause (g) hereof shall be deemed to have become operative as from the first day of January, 1951.

14.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

- (a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to Clause 7 (c) hereof be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (d) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to sub-clause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

- (h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

15.—Country Work.

- (a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boats, when saloon fares shall be paid.
- (b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

16.—Special Rates and Provisions.

- (a) Leading-hand: A leading hand in charge of:
 - (a) not less than three and not more than ten other workers shall be paid nine shil-
 - ten other workers shall be paid fille shillings (9s.) per week extra.

 (b) more than ten and not more than twenty other workers shall be paid eighteen shillings (18s.) per week extra.

 (c) more than twenty other workers shall be paid twenty-seven shillings (27s.) per week
- (b) Reasonable washing facilities and lunchrooms shall be provided for the workers.
- (c) All tools required shall be supplied by the employer.

17.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in all branches of the industry in the proportion of one junior to each of the first three adult workers employed and thereafter one junior to every three or fraction of three adult workers employed under this Award: Provided always, that the foregoing proportions shall not apply to the employment of junior workers on link-mesh machines, in which case the employment of junior workers shall be unrestricted.

18.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—Name in full; age and date of birth. This certificate shall be signed by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim on the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age or date of birth being wrongly stated on his certi-

19.—Under-rate Worker.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

20.—Record.

- (a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision, to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office, or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

21.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Asso-ciation shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one (1) week.

Nothing in this clause shall derogate from the power of any such representative to enter any pre-mises at any time when authorised under section 170 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950.

22.—Posting of Award.

The employer shall keep a copy of this Award placed in a convenient place in the workshop.

23.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference in each branch of the industry.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) In the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by the Award, in any of the mat-ters hereinafter mentioned, the Board is hereby assigned the following functions:—

(i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any machine, occupation, or calling not specifically mentioned in the

or cannot not specifically mentioned in the Award but so as not to contravene any of the provisions herein:

(ii) adjusting any matter of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them: any of them:

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

24.—No Reduction.

This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rates prescribed for his class of work.

I certify pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

HAVING heard Messrs. R. B. Gibson and H. J. Symons on behalf of the Coastal District Commit-tee Amalgamated Engineering Union Association of Workers, Mr. R. A. West on behalf of the State of Workers, Mr. R. A. west on benait of the State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers and Mr. K. D. Reeves on behalf of the respondents, and in pursuance of a remission to me by the Court of Arbitration and in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, I hereby order and declare that Award

No. 12 and 14 of 1947, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in the manner following:-

Clause 2.—Interpretations.

"Market Towns".

In the list of market towns insert the town of "Newdegate" after "Narrogin".

Add the following new definition:-

"Commission" or "Commissioner"—The words "Commission" or "Commissioner" wherever used, shall be deemed to refer to The Western Australian Government Railways Commission. "Commissioner"—The

Clause 5.—Retirement.

Add to this clause a new sub-clause as follows:-

"(c). In the event of either the Commission or the worker failing to give the prescribed notice, wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be, to the extent by which the actual notice given falls short of the fourteen (14) days' notice. Wages so forfeited by the worker may be deducted from any wages due to such worker up to the time of his leaving the service of the Commission: Provided that where both parties agree to the acceptance of notice of less than fourteen (14) days, no penalty shall be imposed."

Clause 7.—Payment for Sickness.

Delete the words and figure "six (6) days" appearing in sub-clause (a) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the words and figure "one (1) week"

Clause 8.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(1) Annual Leave:

Delete the words "and to those workers stationed on the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe Railway" appearing in paragraph 2 of sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(2) Holidays:

Delete sub-clause (c) and insert in lieu thereof the following-

"(c) In the case of workers working a five (5)day week, no payment or day in lieu shall be granted for any holiday falling on a day on which the normal roster provides for the worker to be off duty."

Clause 9.—Apprentices.

Delete sub-clauses (b) and (d) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

- "(b) Apprentices shall be allowed to the following trades:—Blacksmith, coppersmith, electrical fitter, mechanical fitter, turner and iron machinist, patternmaker, watch and clock repairer, electrical installer and motor mechanic."
- "(d) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in this award to the contrary, an apprentice required to live away from his home shall be paid not less than the rate applying to an apprentice in his second year.'

Clause 13.—Hours of Duty.

Delete sub-clause (c) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

"(c) The ordinary hours of duty in the Midland Junction Workshops, and the Carbarn Workshops, other than for shift work, shall be between 7 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. except—

- (i) On Saturday, when the work shall finish
- at noon; where the Commission and the union on some other starting mutually agree on some other starting and finishing time."

Clause 14.—Guaranteed Week.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

14.—Guaranteed Week.

"(a) The Commission shall normally guarantee to each worker a full week's work of forty (40) hours, exclusive of Sunday work, but if during any period, by reason of any action on the part of any section of its workers or for any cause beyond its control it finds itself unable to carry on either wholly or partially the complete running of

trains, services, workshops or other normal operations, the Commission shall be entitled, notwithstanding any implication arising from the provisions of Section 86 of the Government Railways Act, 1904-1948, as reprinted in 1949, to employ only such workers (if any) as it considers can be usefully employed, and for such hours only as it considers necessary, and during such period no worker shall be paid except for such time as shall be actually worked by him. Each week shall stand by itself. trains, services, workshops or other normal operaby itself.

Provided that employees who are required to attend for work and do so attend on any day shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours' pay at ordinary rates.

- (b) Employees stood down in accordance with the foregoing provision shall not lose any sick leave or other rights or privileges to which such employee would ordinarily be entitled, provided that this provision does not entitle an employee to payment for any Award holiday falling during such period of stand down.
- (c) The guaranteed period may also be reduced as follows:-
 - (i) In respect of any worker under suspen-sion: Provided that any worker suspended on a charge which is not sustained shall be entitled to the benefit of the guarantee during the period of his suspension;
 - (ii) in respect of any day a worker is absent, except through sickness as provided for in Clause 7."

Clause 15.—Overtime and Sunday Time.

Delete sub-clause (g) (i) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

"(g) (i) When a worker in the employ of the General Manager of the Western Australian Government Tramways and Ferries, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

This provision shall also apply to employees of the Western Australian Government Railways Commission except that a period of one and three-quarter $(1\frac{3}{4})$ hours shall apply in lieu of the abovementioned one (1) hour."

Clause 17.—Away-from-home and Meal Allowance. Delete sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:

- "(a) The following allowances shall be granted to workers temporarily lodging away from their home stations-
 - (i) For the first twenty-four (24) hours or part thereof— Where attended barracks are used, 8s. Where unattended barracks are used, 9s. Where barracks are not used, 10s.
 - (ii) After the first twenty-four (24) hours, at the rate of fivepence (5d.) per hour;
 - (iii) After the first twenty-four (24) hours, a charge of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per night, with a maximum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per week, shall be made where attended barracks are provided, and a charge of ninepence (9d.) per night, with a maximum of three shillings and ninepence (3s. 9d.) per week shall be made where unattended barracks are provided.
- (b) It will be optional for the workers to use the barracks and/or the Commission to allow them to do so. If used, after the first twenty-four (24) hours, charges shall be made in accordance with the scale in sub-clause (a) (iii) above."

Sub-clause (f).

Delete the words and figure "two shillings (2s.)" appearing in this subclause and insert in lieu thereof the words and figures "two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)."

Sub-clause (h).

Delete the words and figures "thirty shillings (30s.)" where first appearing in this sub-clause and insert in lieu thereof the words and figures forty shillings (40s.)

Insert a new sub-clause (h) (a) as follows:-

"(h) (a) Married workers temporarily transferred for a period exceeding three (3) months, but which is not expected to exceed six (6) months, and not moving their permanent homes, shall be paid a weekly allowance of forty shillings (40s.) in lieu of transfer or lodging allowance to cover the excess cost of living away from their homes: Provided that should any other lodging allowance become due to a worker whilst transferred, such allowance, together with the allowance provided for in this sub-clause shall in no case exceed the allowance payable under sub-clause (a)."

Sub-clause (i).

Delete the words and figures "two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)" appearing in this sub-clause and insert in lieu thereof the words and figure "five shillings (5s.)."

Sub-clause (j) (ii).

Delete all words after the word "leave".

Clause 21.—District Allowance.

Delete items (i), (ii) and (viii) of sub-clause (a) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:---

Delete sub-clause (c) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

"(c) Workers leaving the service for any cause, other than normal retirement between the ages of 60 and 65, or sickness or injury in respect of which a doctor's certificate indicates that such worker cannot continue work, and due for payment in lieu of annual leave and/or public holidays worked, shall not be paid district allowance for the period of such leave and/or holidays."

Clause 24.—Free Passes, Privilege Tickets and Season Tickets.

Delete the words and figures "twenty shillings (20s.)" appearing in the fifth paragraph of subclause (a) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the words and figures "twenty-five shillings (25s.)"

-Allowances, Special Provisions, etc.

Items (5) and (6): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny (1½d.)" where appearing in these items and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "twopence (2d.)".

Item (7): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny $(1\frac{1}{2}d.)$ " where appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "twopence (2d.)."

Item (8): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny $(1\frac{1}{2}d.)$ " where appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "twopence (2d.)", and add the following:—"The above allowance shall be payable to other tradesmen and their assistants when engaged on work in running sheds which the foreman and workmen agree is of an unusually dirty or offensive nature."

Items (9) and (10): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny (1½d.)" where appearing in these items and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "twopence (2d.)".

Item (11): Delete the word and figure "sixpence (6d.)" appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "ninepence (9d.)".

Item (12): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny ($1\frac{1}{2}$ d.)" where appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "twopence (2d.)".

Item (14): Delete the word and figure "twopence (2d.)" where appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "threepence (3d.)".

Item (16): Delete the words and figures "sixpence (6d.)" and "one penny half-penny (1½d.)" where appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the words and figures "ninepence (9d.)" and "twopence (2d.)" respectively.

Item (18): Delete the words and figures "one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.)" appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the words and figure "three shillings (3s.)".

Item (19): Delete the words and figure "one shilling (1s.)" where appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the words and figures "one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.)".

Item (22): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny (1½d.)" appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "twopence (2d.)".

Item (23): Delete the words and figures "one penny halfpenny (1½d.)" appearing in this item and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "threepence (3d.)".

Clause 34.

Amend this clause by removing item 14 "Guaranteed Week" and inserting it after item 9 "Apprentices" of Clause 35.

Clause 36.—Interpretations.

Add to this clause the following new interpreta-Add to this clause the following new interpretation:—"General Manager": When reading Part II. of this Award and the clauses of Part I. referred to in Clause 34 hereof, the words "General Manager" should be substituted for the words "Commissioner" or "Commission" wherever appearing. The term "General Manager" shall be deemed to refer to the General Manager of Western Australian Government Tramways and Ferries.
