Maximum Prices for Goods of a Kind Previously Sold.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order issued prior to this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the prevailing price of such goods.

Maximum Prices for Goods of a Kind Not Previously Sold.

4. Maximum Prices for Goods of a Kind Previously Sold.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order issued prior to this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the sum of—

- (a) the prevailing price of such goods; and
- (b) an amount equal to the actual increase in the cost of those goods to that person on or after the 13th day of October, 1950, in consequence of the operation of the Sales Tax (Exemptions and Classifications) Act, 1935-1950.

Maximum Prices for Goods of a Kind Not Previously Sold.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order issued prior to this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person who did not on or before the 12th day of October, 1950, sell any of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto, to be the cost of the goods to that person: Provided that upon application by any person the maximum price at which those goods may be sold by that person shall be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 344.

Onions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 344.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 308, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 310, is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“cost per cwt. into retailer's store” means the sum of the following:—

(a) The price per cwt. paid or payable by the retail seller for the onions computed on the basis of the full weight of the onions and bag and without any allowance for wastage.

(b) Cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to conveying the onions from the point of delivery to the retail seller to that retail seller's store:

Provided that cost of transport shall not be allowed unless it is recorded on an invoice for the onions delivered to the seller;

“cost of outward transport” means in relation to the sale of onions, the cost of transport and handling actually incurred by the seller, and properly attributable to transporting such onions to the purchaser's place of business or to the point of delivery to the purchaser, or in the case of sales free on board a vessel then in placing those onions on board such vessel;

“gross weight” means in relation to the sale of onions by any grower or wholesaler, the aggregate weight of the container and the onions contained therein;

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

“point of delivery” means in relation to the sale of onions by any grower or wholesaler, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying those onions to the purchaser's place of business passed to the purchaser from the person from whom such onions were purchased;

“Grade I onions” means sound onions of similar varietal characteristics, weighing from 2 to 6 ozs. each, free from abnormal doubles, root growths, sprouts, dirt or other foreign matter and blemishes caused by disease, insect injury or sunburns and free of peeled onions;

“Grade II onions” means onions of similar varietal characteristics, weighing from 2 to 6 ozs., each and free from wet or dry rots, dirt or other foreign matter, including onions in which peeled onions and slight blemishes can be removed by the ordinary process of peeling without appreciable increase in waste over that which would occur if the onions were perfect;

“large onions” means onions of similar varietal characteristics which comply with the standard of Grade I except that the onions shall weigh over 6 ozs. each;

“picklers” means sound onions complying with the standard of Grade I and weighing less than 2 ozs. each;

“out of grade onions” means onions which do not conform with Grade I or Grade II or large onions or picklers.

Sales by Growers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any grower may sell onions of the grade or kind specified in the First Schedule to this Order to be the sum of—

- (a) the maximum price specified in that Schedule according to the grade or kind of onions, the gross weight thereof and the point of delivery; and
- (b) in respect of onions delivered outside the Perth Metropolitan Area other than at grower's premises—the cost of outward transport.

Sales by Wholesale.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions of the grade or kind specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by wholesale to be the sum of—

- (a) the price fixed by the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order according to the grade or kind of onions, the gross weight thereof and the point of delivery; or the price paid or payable by that person for such onions, whichever is the lesser;
- (b) the margin specified in the Second Schedule to this Order according to the gross weight and the point of delivery;
- (c) in respect of sales outside the Perth Metropolitan Area—
 - (i) the cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to transporting the onions from the grower's premises to the wholesale seller's premises;
 - (ii) cost of outward transport;
- (d) in respect of onions delivered free on board a vessel—cost of outward transport.

Sales by Retail.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by any person by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales within the Perth Metropolitan Area—4½d. per lb. or the price specified in the second column of the Third Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per cwt. into retailer's store set out in the first column of that Schedule, whichever is the lesser;

(b) in respect of sales in any place other than the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order according to the cost per cwt. into the retailer's store set out in the first column of that Schedule.

General.

7. Where onions are sold by any person in any manner other than in containers, I fix and declare the maximum price at which such onions may be sold to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, less an amount calculated at the rate of 1s. 6d. per cwt.: Provided that the minimum amount by which such maximum price shall be reduced in respect of any quantity sold shall be 1s. 6d.

8. Where any onions, the maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, are sold in containers, such maximum price shall be deemed to be fixed for the sale of those onions together with such containers.

9. Onions contained in any one parcel of onions shall be deemed to comply with the standard of the grade specified if at least ninety-five per centum thereof by weight comply with that standard.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

10. Every person who sells or has for sale onions by retail shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth his selling price in relation to each lot of onions displayed by that person anywhere upon such place or places of business in the following manner, that is to say by exhibiting a prices card specifying the selling price applicable to each lot of such onions displayed so as to properly associate such price with the lot of onions to which that price applies.

Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this order, I declare the maximum price at which any onions specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.

FISH.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantine Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 348.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 342 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Albany” means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Albany;

“Bunbury” means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Bunbury;

“Busselton” means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Busselton;

“Esperance” means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Esperance;

“Geraldton” means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Geraldton;

“Mandurah” means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Mandurah;

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

“cutlet” means the de-scaled flesh of a fish retaining a portion of the back-bone, and includes also the de-scaled flesh of a fish from which all bones have not been removed;

“fillet” means the de-scaled flesh of a fish from which the head and all bones have been removed;

“fisherman” means any person licensed under the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, of the State of Western Australia to catch fish.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Fisherman.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a fisherman for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a fisherman for delivery in Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton or Mandurah, to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish, less one penny per pound weight.

Maximum Wholesale Prices for Sales other than by Fishermen.

5. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a seller other than a fisherman for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price set out in the third column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a seller other than a fisherman for delivery in Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be the price set out in the third column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish, less one penny per pound weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a seller other than a fisherman for delivery outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be the sum of—

- (a) the maximum price fixed by subparagraphs (1) or (2) of this paragraph, as the case may be, for the sale of that fish for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton or Mandurah, whichever is nearest the point the fish was first brought to land;
- (b) one penny per pound weight of that fish.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Auction.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by auction to be the maximum price fixed by the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order.

Maximum Retail Prices.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price set out in the fourth, fifth, sixth or seventh columns respectively, opposite to each such variety of fish, according to whether the fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be—

- (a) in the case of uncleaned or cleaned fish (other than in cutlets or in the form of fillets), the price set out in the fourth or fifth columns, respectively, opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, less one penny per pound weight;
- (b) in the case of cutlets of fish, the price set out in the sixth column opposite each such variety of fish, less one and one-half pence per pound weight;
- (c) in the case of fillets of fish, the price set out in the seventh column opposite each such variety of fish, less one and one-pound weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has been transported through the Perth Metropolitan Area may be sold by retail outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be the sum of—

- (a) the price set out in the fourth, fifth, sixth or seventh columns, respectively, opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second, third, or fourth columns of the Second Schedule, according to the distance by rail from the Perth Central Railway Station to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business.

(4) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has not been transported through the Perth Metropolitan Area may be sold by retail outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah, to be the sum of—

- (a) the price set out in the fourth, fifth, sixth or seventh columns, respectively, of the First Schedule to this Order opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second, third, or fourth columns of the Third Schedule to this Order, according to the distance by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the wholesale seller's place of business, to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business.

Delivery of Invoices.

8. Every person who sells other than by retail any fish for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall deliver with that fish an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and place of business.
- (b) Name and address of the purchaser of that fish.
- (c) The date of the sale of that fish.
- (d) The class of that fish, described according to the classes of fish specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (e) The total weight of each class of fish sold.
- (f) The price per pound at which the class of fish is sold.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which fish of any variety specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Prices.

10. (1) Every person who sells, or has for sale, by retail, fish, shall exhibit in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the following particulars:—

- (a) Retail selling prices of each lot or variety of fish, whether it is cleaned, uncleaned, filleted or in cutlets, which is from time to time displayed or offered for sale at such place or places of business; and
- (b) the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish.

(2) (a) The approved form for the notice or notices in relation to retail selling prices shall be a separate price card or cards, specifying the price per pound weight or the total weight and total price in relation to each such lot or variety of fish, whether cleaned, uncleaned, filleted, or in cutlets, offered for sale as aforesaid, which properly associates such prices with each such lot or variety of fish.

(b) The approved form for the notice or notices in relation to the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of fish shall be in such form as otherwise complies with regulation 49 of the Regulations.
