#### The Fisheries Act, 1905-1949. PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, between the hours of 12 noon and 3 o'clock in the morning on each and every day for a period of 12 morning on each and every day for a period of 12 months as from 1st January, 1951.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the Southern Ocean bounded by lines starting from the Eastern extremity of the Twelve Mile Reef, situate about 10 miles Easterly from Hopetoun, and extending Northerly, to an indication post situate on the high water mark of the said ocean; thence Easterly about 5 chains along the said mark to a second post; thence Southerly, to the Western extremity of the Thirteen Mile Reef; and thence Westerly, to the starting point. (Plan 432/80.)

Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947. Claremont Municipal District and Nedlands Road District.

> Adjustment of Boundaries. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Morawa Road District—Redivision into Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 68/31.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, doth hereby redivide the Morawa Road Districts by—

(1) the abolition of the existing Central Ward;
(2) the creation of two new wards, namely, Pintharuka and Central, as described in the Schedule hereto.

Consequent upon such redivision, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the said advice and consent, doth hereby declare that the number of members to constitute the Morawa Road Board shall be 11 in lieu of nine, and doth determine that the 11 members shall be allocated as follows:—

Canna Ward, two members; North Ward, two members; South Ward, two members; Town Ward, one member; Pintharuka Ward, two members, and Central Ward, two members.

And doth declare and direct that the existing members for the Central Ward of the Morawa Road District shall go out of office on the 21st day of April, 1951, on which day an election shall be held to return two members each for Pintharuka and Central Wards.

#### Central Ward.

THE Dumbleyung Road Board under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned them hereunder.
  - (a) "Board" means the Dumbleyung Road Board.
  - (b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which the employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.
- 2. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.
- 3. Employees of the Board shall upon the completion of 10 years' continuous service as regular full-time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of January, 1940, be entitled to three months'

- (13 weeks) long service leave. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, upon such employee advising the Board at least three months in advance of a date upon which he desires that leave be granted, but the Board may require any employee to take leave as from any definite date by giving not less than three months' notice to employee.
- 4. Each employee granted long service leave shall be paid—
  - (a) his wages or salary for the period of long service leave at the rate equivalent to his average weekly rate of pay over the preceding 12 months.
  - (b) The Board may at its discretion either-
    - (1) pay the employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave or:
    - (2) pay the employee in advance the sum representing the amount of wages or salary for the period of long service leave.
- 5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service as above. After completion of the first 10 years' service as from 1st January, 1940, any employees leaving the services of the Board before the completion of a further 10 years' period of service will then be entitled to a pro rata leave payment at the rate of one and three-tenths (1 3/10) weeks wages or salary for each year of service over and above the 10 years' qualifying period.
- 6. In the event of resignation, retirement, or death of an employee after the completion of the long leave qualifying period of service, the full amount of long service leave payments accrued to the date of termination of service shall be payable to the employee, or in the case of death to dependants of the deceased employee.
- 7. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of these by-laws.
- 8. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled, or will become entitled to before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave.
- 9. Long service leave granted by this Board shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with the view to fitting the employee for a further term of service, and during long service leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for wages, hire or reward, unless by special permission granted in writing by this Board.

Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, cease long service leave payments, and take action for the recovery of amount paid in advance on account of long service leave.

### BEES ACT, 1930-1950.

Department of Agriculture, Perth, 14th February, 1951.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following regulations pursuant to the provisions of the Bees Act, 1930-1950.

### Regulations.

## Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Bees Act Regulations.

### Interpretation.

2. In these regulations unless the context requires otherwise—

Act" means the Bees Act, 1930-1950;

"brand" means a registered brand issued pursuant to the provisions of these regulations and includes as well as the branding instrument the marking resulting from the use of the instrument;

"department" means the offices of the Department of Agriculture at Perth;

"fee" means the appropriate fee set forth in the Appendix to these regulations:

"honey" means honey prior to delivery to the consumer; expressions used have the same respective meanings as in the Act; regulations referred to are these regulations; sections referred to are sections of the Act.

Revocation.

3. The regulations made and published in the Gazette on the days shown hereunder and in force prior to the publication of these regulations are revoked:-

Gazette of 6th March, 1941, page 794; Gazette of 18th March, 1938, page 419.

### Certificates of Freedom from Disease. (Section 14.)

Certificates referred to in section 14 must describe the district referred to in that section either by setting out its boundaries or by referring to it as an area comprised within an imaginary circle having a radius of five miles and having as its centre the place whence come the bees, hives, honey or appliances referred to in that section,

Extracting and Storing Honey and Preventing Spread of Disease.

- A person shall not extract, place in containers, pack, store or otherwise handle or deal with exposed honey-
  - (1) unless in a structure which—
    - (a) is maintained in a clean and sanitary condition;
    - (b) has a constructed floor of wood, cement or other material ordinarily used for the construction of floors in structures;
    - (c) is so constructed and fitted as to exclude insects, including bees and files; and
    - (d) is not used for sleeping or living purposes; or
  - (2) unless the container is thoroughly clean and is closed immediately upon the honey being placed in it and when closed excludes insects. dust and water.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

## Lodging of Documents.

6. Unless otherwise provided, applications made and notices given shall be lodged with the Director of Agriculture at the department accompanied by the appropriate fee, if any.

#### Registration and Renewal of Registration.

#### (Section 5.)

- 7. Application for registration as a bee keeper and for the issue of a registered brand shall be made in writing and signed by the applicant in Form 1.
- A certificate of registration as a beekeeper shall, if granted, be in Form 2 and shall be issued to the applicant.
- 9. Application for renewal of registration as a beekeeper shall be made in writing and signed by the applicant in Form 3.
- 10. A certificate of renewal of registration as a beekeeper shall be made in writing and signed by the applicant in Form 4.
- 11. Applications for approval of the transfer, transmission or cancellation of a registered brand shall be in writing signed by the applicant in Form 5, 6 or 7 as the case requires.
- Approval if granted of an application for the transfer, transmission or cancellation of a registered brand shall be in accordance with Form 8 and shall be handed to or posted to the applicant at the postal address shown on the application.
- The Director of Agriculture may issue a certified copy of the certificate of registration and renewal of registration of a registered beekeeper on payment of the appropriate fee.

### Register.

14. The Director of Agriculture shall cause to be kept at the department a register to be called the Register of Beekeepers and Brands and shall cause to be recorded in the register particulars of registrations, renewals of registrations and transmissions, transfers and cancellations of registrations of persons as registered beekeepers.

### Search.

15. The Register of Beekeepers and Brands shall be open for inspection by any person on payment of the appropriate fee between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and one o'clock in the afternoon and two o'clock and threethirty o'clock in the afternoon on every day that the department is open for the transaction of business.

### Brands.

16. The Director of Agriculture may issue distinctive symbols for use as brands, each brand comprising two numerals and one letter, the height of which numerals and letter shall not exceed one inch and be not less than one half of one inch, to applicants whose applications are granted and shall record the issue of them in the Register of Beekeepers and Brands and shall also record the transmission, transfer or cancellation of the issue of the brand and may rectify the register from time to time by cancelling the registration in his name of a brand which the Director of Agriculture is satisfied has not been used by the beekeeper in whose name it is registered for at least a period of two years.

Notice of Establishment of New Apiary or Removal of an Apiary (Section 5A).

17. Notice required by section 5A to be given by a beekeeper or registered beekeeper of the establishment of a new apiary or the removal of the whole or part of an apiary from an apiary site to another site shall be given in writing signed by the beekeeper or registered beekeeper in Form 9.

### Notice of Sale of Apiary (Section 5C).

18. Notice required to be given by section 5C of sale by a person shall be given in writing signed by the person in Form 10.

## Branding of Hives and Equipment.

- (1) A registered beekeeper must brand his hives and beekeeper's equip-
- ment with his registered brand.

  (2) The brand may be burnt in, acid etched, embossed, stamped or carved but so that the brand is of a depth of one-eighth of an inch below the surface branded where that surface is of wood.

- (3) Hives shall be so branded that successive owners' brands shall appear immediately below the next preceding owner's brand commencing in the top left hand corner of an external face of a side of the hive.
- (4) Every person who at the date of the coming into operation of the Bees Act, 1930-1950, namely the fifth day of January, 1951, is a beekeeper shall within three months of that date brand hives of which he is the owner on that date.
- (5) Every beekeeper who on any day after the coming into operation of the Bees Act, 1930-1950, namely the fifth day of January, 1951, acquires beehives shall brand each of his hives forthwith on acquiring it.
- (6) A person, who brands or marks a hive or beekeeper's equipment with the registered brand of another person without the latter's authority commits an offence.
  - (7) A person who-
    - (a) alters, defaces or otherwise renders undistinguishable a registered brand or the marking made on a hive or beekeeper's equipment by the use of a registered brand or
- (b) knowingly permits any such act to be done by a person over whom he has control, commits an offence.

# Abandoned and Neglected Bees and Beehives. (Section 5F.)

- 20. (1) Prior to taking possession of any bees or beehives pursuant to the power conferred upon him by section 5F an inspector shall obtain the approval of his doing so from the Director of Agriculture.
- (2) Where an inspector takes possession of bees or beehives pursuant to that section and approval was obtained he may with the approval of the Director of Agriculture take such measures as may be necessary to cure disease if there be any, and having cured the disease may sell the bees, bee combs, honey and hives and pay the proceeds of the sale, after meeting the costs thereof, into the Consolidated Revenue Fund, but if there be disease and it is not possible to cure it economically having regard to the relative expenses and probable return from sale, he may destroy the bees or hives as the case may be.

#### General Penalty.

21. Except where any other penalty is provided in these regulations, the penalty for a breach of any of these regulations shall be five pounds.
