WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that the residents of any area are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, declare such area to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore, I the Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the area specified in the Schedule hereunder is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, proclaim the said area to be a region under the provisions of the said Act, to be designated the Meekatharra region.

Road Districts Act, 1919-1948.

Collie Road Board and Municipal Council

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, His Excellency the Governor has given notice of intention to exercise certain powers conferred by section 8 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and by this Order exercises such powers; and whereas, in consequence of the exercise of such power His Excellency the Governor has deemed it necessary to determine certain questions and matters regarding the representation of electors of the local authority affected and the constitution of such local authority: Now, therefore, under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—

- constitute the whole of the Collie Municipal district a Road District to be known as the Collie Town Road District with a Board consisting of 10 members, being the members of the former Municipal Council;
- (2) unite the Collie Road District and the Collie Town Road District into one District under the Road Districts Act, to be known as the Collie Coalfields Road District;
- (3) divide the Collie Coalfields Road District into Wards, to be known as (i) Town Ward—consisting of land formerly comprising the Collie Municipal District; (ii) West Ward—consisting of the land formerly comprising the West Ward of the Collie Road District; (iii) South Ward—consisting of the land formerly comprising the South Ward of the Collie Road District; (iv) North Ward—consisting of the land formerly comprising the North Ward of the Collie Road District;
- (4) declare that the Collie Coalfields Road Board shall consist of 13 members, seven of whom shall be elected for the Town Ward and two of whom shall be elected for each of the West, South and North Wards;

- (5) declare that until the 16th day of June, 1951, Messrs. John Marshall, Frederick Edwards, Robert Tabor Everett, Walter Geldert, Daniel Joseph James, Samuel Newall and James Henry Pinington, shall represent the Town Ward; Messrs. Reginald Victor Gulvin and Findlay David Noel MacNish shall represent the South Ward; Messrs. Harold Marley and Arthur Youd shall represent the North Ward; Messrs. Mervyn Phillip Bevan and William Evan Vernon shall represent the West Ward;
- (6) determine that the first meeting of the Collie Coalfields Road Board shall be held on the 2nd day of March, 1951, at 7.30 p.m., at the Municipal Buildings, Collie. The first business of the meeting will be election of a Chairman and Vice Chairman and the appointment of a Secretary and an Engineer, and that until the Chairman of the Board is elected from the Members, the Secretary for Local Government (Mr. George Seddon Lindsay) shall act as Chairman of the meeting:
- (7) determine that on the 16th day of June, 1951, all of the existing members of the Collie Coalfields Road Board shall go out of office, but shall be eligible for re-election, and that an election for the return of members for each of the Wards of the District shall be held on the 16th day of June. 1951:
- (8) determine that the office of any person formerly employed by the Collie Municipal Council or the Collie Road Board, but whose employment is determined within three months after the 2nd day of March, 1951, shall, for the purpose of section 130 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, be deemed to have ceased or to have been abolished.

Handling Charges—All rates of handling charges shall, for each complete penny variation in the ordinary hourly rate of pay to waterside workers, based on the said rate of pay (viz., 6s. 1d.) as in operation from the 1st day of November, 1950, be increased or decreased as the case may require by  $1\frac{3}{4}$ per centum.

Livestock Handling—Department does not handle livestock, but shall, if requested to do so, and charge according to services rendered.

Dangerous cargo shall include matches, carbide, compressed gases, corrosives, poisons, cartridges and films.

Infiammable liquids shall include petroleum, kerosene, and any oil, liquid, or spirit derived wholly or in part from any petroleum, shale, schist, coal, peat, bitumen, or any similar substance, and which has a true flashing point of less than 150° Fahrenheit; and any other liquid which the Governor by proclamation in the *Gazette* declares to be an infiammable liquid.

Ship's Stores—Stores for consumption of vessel by which shipped are free of wharfage dues, but handling and haulage charges shall be payable at ordinary cargo rates, according to services rendered.

Berthage Dues—For vessels over 300 tons gross register, shall be 2d. per ton on all cargo landed and/or shipped, with a minimum of £2 10s. per day of 24 hours or part thereof. Vessels under 300 tons gross register shall pay 2d. per ton on all cargo landed and/or shipped, with a minimum of £1 10s. per day of 24 hours or part thereof. Pearling store ships, mission vessels, and luggers shall pay 2d. per ton on all cargo landed and/or shipped, with a minimum of 5s. per trip.

Vessel's Lines—The minimum charge for handling a vessel's lines shall be £1. Lighting Jetty and/or Shed—£2 per night or part thereof.

Travellers' Samples—Exempt from outwards wharfage, provided full inwards wharfage has been paid.

M.O.P. Shell shall be treated as cargo for transhipment and pay wharfage one way only.

Storage on M.O.P. Shell—6d. per ton per week. Department not to be responsible for safe custody or loss of or damage to such shell.

Cylindrical cargo manifested on square measurement shall, for the computation of wharfage dues and handling and haulage charges, be reduced by one-fifth.

Heavy Lifts—Additional charges for heavy lifts on hand winches or crane shall be levied as follows:—

- (a) By-law 17, Part I—After the word "street" in the second line, insert the words "or way or upon any land."
- (b) By-law 29(b), Part I—Delete the whole of the same and substitute in lieu and instead thereof a new by-law, by-law 29 (b) as follows:—

The occupier of any premises shall not keep any ducks, geese or turkeys within 40 feet, or any other poultry including pigeons within 20 feet of any dwelling house, and where pigeons are kept they shall be continually confined.

(c) After By-law 29(d), Part I, insert a new by-law, by-law 29(e) as follows:—

The owner or occupier of any premises wherein or whereon pigeons are in the habit of nesting or perching, shall when ordered by an inspector, take such steps as directed to prevent same.

- (d) By-law 7, Part VII—After the word "dust" in the third line, insert the words "or any other source."
- (e) By-law 19, Part VII—After the word "vessels" in the fourth line, insert the words "and shall not permit the use of any drinking vessel, unless such vessel is sound and free from cracks or chips."

# Part X. Private Morgues.

- 1. Any person who intends to open or conduct any premises as a private morgue for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination or any other lawful purpose before burial or cremation shall, before opening such premises, make application to the local authority for registration thereof as a private morgue, and shall pay a fee of £1 per annum, and application for renewal of such registration shall be made annually. Every license and registration effected under this by-law shall operate only during the current calendar year.
- 2. No license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless—
  - (a) the walls thereof are constructed of stone or brickwork or other approved material; and
  - (b) the interior surfaces of the walls are covered with glazed tiles or are rendered with some impervious material to be approved by the local authority so as to be non-absorbent and washable; and
  - (c) all floors are constructed of some impervious material to be approved by the local authority such as granolithic or glazed tiles, laid on a bed of 4 inch concrete, having a fall to an outlet discharging over a trapped gully; and
  - (d) the premises are adequately ventilated by direct communication with the outer air.
- 3. No such license shall be granted in respect of any room the dimensions of which are less than 10 feet by 9 feet by 12 feet in height.
- 4. No such license shall be granted unless the site thereof is approved by the local authority, or if the same is within 20 feet of any dwelling house.

# Penalties for Breaches of By-law.

5. Where anything by this Part of the By-laws is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Part of the said By-laws. And every person guilty of a breach of this Part of the said By-laws shall be liable, for every such offence, besides any cost or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every breach of any such by-law, or to a penalty not exceeding £2 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be liable to pay to the local authority any expense incurred by such authority in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any by-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be executed and not so executed.

  - (b) The same fees and allowances as are provided for the Chairman under subparagraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e) of paragraph (1) of this regulation.
- (3) Whenever by the direction of the Board the Chairman (except when he is a Public Service Officer) or any member of the Board makes any inspection or performs any other service on behalf of the Board under and for the purposes of the Act or regulations, the Chairman or such member may, by resolution of the Board be granted and paid out of the funds of the Board a fee by way of remuneration for his said services for and in respect of each day or part of a day during which the services are performed:

Provided that the fee so granted and paid to the Chairman or any member hereunder shall not exceed £1 1s. per

day.

(4) This regulation shall have effect and shall be deemed to have had effect and to have been in operation as from and including the first day of July, 1950.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.

# 5.—Copy of Award.

A copy of this Award shall be kept by the employer in each change room in some position accessible to all workers.

# 6.-Weekly Hands.

Subject to clause 7 hereof, the employment shall be weekly and a week's notice shall be given on either side to terminate the engagement, or a week's wages paid in lieu of same; such notice may be given before 12 o'clock noon on any day: Provided that nothing in this clause shall prevent an employer summarily dismissing a worker for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

### 7.—Casual Workers.

(a) "Casual worker" shall mean a worker engaged for less than one (1) week.
(b) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in clause 21.

## 8.-Holidays.

- (a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to clause 12 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) The secretary of the Union shall give to the employer one calendar month's written notice of the date upon which it is intended to celebrate Butchers' Picnic Day, failing such notice the em-ployer shall be entitled to assume that the date fixed for such celebration is the third Monday in February, and to make his business arrangements accordingly.

# 9.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service. service.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (f) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

# 10.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall provide a time record, to be kept where the worker or workers usually commence work, in which each worker shall enter his starting and finishing times each day.

The employer shall keep a record showing-

- (a) the name of each worker;
  (b) the occupation of each worker;
  (c) the time worked by each worker;
  (d) The wages and overtime paid therefor;
  (e) in the case of a junior worker, the age on his last birthday.

Such records shall be open for inspection by the secretary of the Union, or such other person authorised in writing by the president of the Union during ordinary office hours in any day.

#### 11.—First Aid.

Each employer shall keep at his shop, or factory, or at each if more than one, a first aid equipment, containing the following:-

- 3 sterilised dressings for fingers.
- 3 sterilised dressings (assorted sizes, one for hand, one for feet, and one large size).

  1 tube or pot ung vitamin ata (V.P. 48).

  6 assorted roller bandages.

- 2 ozs. iodine.
- 2 ozs. sal volatile. 1 triangular bandage.
- 1 roll adhesive tape, 2 in. Eye drops and brush.
- enamel kidney dish, 8 in. Medicine glass.
- A.P.C. tablets (24).
- 2 ozs. callodium.

#### 12.—Overtime.

- (a) All work performed beyond the daily hours prescribed in clause 14 or on a Saturday, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) All work performed on Sunday or on any of the holidays prescribed in clause 8 hereof, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) The minimum of overtime to be paid for, if the worker is called to work on Saturday before noon, shall be four (4) hours at the rate of time and a half, and if employed after dinner, eight (8) hours, at the rate of time and three-quarters.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-
  - (i) an employer may require a worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
  - (ii) no organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, he a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with working of overtime in accordance the requirements of this subclause;
  - (iii) this subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

## 13.—Meal Hours.

- (a) One hour or such lesser period of time as may be mutually arranged between the management and the employees at the factory, shall be allowed all workers for the midday meal and one and a half (1½) hours shall be allowed off duty for the tea break when workers are required to work overtime for more than one (1) hour.
- (b) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual finishing time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with a suitable meal or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof.

# 14.—Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work Monday to Friday inclusive. No working day shall consist of more than eight (8) hours, and the working hours each day shall be consecutive with the exception of the meal hour.
- (b) Starting time each day shall be 8 a.m. or may be altered by mutual arrangement between the employer and the Union.

# 15.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act

- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

#### 16.-Clothing Allowance.

An allowance for necessary clothing, including aprons and rubber boots, shall be made at the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week to all employees; such allowance to be payable weekly or at such longer period as may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the workers.

#### 17.—Smoke-oh.

All workers under this Award shall be allowed in the forenoon a smoke-oh of ten (10) minutes only from the time of ceasing to the time of resumtion of work, to be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay, at a time to be mutually arranged between the management and the Union to suit the requirements of each work place. to suit the requirements of each work place.

### 18.—Oilskins.

Workers employed as barrowmen shall be supplied with oilskin coats when necessary.

## 19.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-

- (1) Name in full.
- (2) Age and date of birth.
- (3) Name of each previous employer.
- (4) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate, and the worker alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

## 20.—No reduction.

No worker who at the time of making this Award is in receipt of a higher wage than that prescribed by this Award for his class of work shall suffer any reduction in wages by reason of this Award.

#### 22.—Junior Workers.

(a) The work performed by junior workers shall (a) The work performed by junior workers shall be confined to dry guts, turning middle and bungs, me.surilg, sizing, salting, work on beef and bung machines and behind scraping machine.

(b) No junior shall do more than one (1) hour's scraping per day during the first year.

(c) No junior shall do more than two (2) hours' scraping per day during the second year.

(a) No junior shall do more than three (3) nours' scraping per day during the third year.

(b) No junior shall do more than four (4) hours' scraping per day during the fourth year.

### 23.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court may appoint, for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regula-tions. There are assigned to each such board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of
  - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
  - (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
  - (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

# 24.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 25.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.
