### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA TO WIT. JAMES MITCHELL, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Transfer of Land Act Amendment Act, 1950, that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Transfer of Land Act Amendment Act, 1950, shall come into operation on the 16th day of March, 1951.

GOD SAVE THE KING !!!

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 27th day of February, 1951, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 45/49.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, except as therein stated; and whereas it is in the said section provided inter alia that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch) of 168 St. George's Terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act and as such subject to the provisions of the said section 13, and having duly made application under and in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made and in force thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act to pay compensation to workers employed by it and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit,  $3\frac{1}{4}$  per cent. Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock of the value of five thousand pounds (£5,000) which said securities are duly charged with all payments to become due under such liability as aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the

Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said section 13 of the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch) from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, for the period of two years commencing on the 25th day of January, 1951.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 2 of 1951.

Australia—West Coast.

Wreckage—Beagle Rocks.

Position—South Mole Light—Lat.  $32^{\circ}$  03' 20'' S., long.  $115^{\circ}$  43' 40'' E. (approx.).

Details—Wreckage has been deposited in the locality of the remains of the wreck "Lygnern" at the Beagle Rocks, the wreckage lying partially

awash. The following area should therefore be regarded as foul ground and given a wide berth:—Commencing from a point bearing 226 deg. distant 1,600 feet from the above position; thence on a bearing of 260 deg. for a distance of 850 feet; thence on a bearing of 180 deg. for a distance of 500 feet; thence on a bearing of 90 deg. for a distance of 600 feet; and thence on a bearing of 20 deg. for a distance of 690 feet to the starting point.

Note—The wreck-marking buoys will continue to remain established in this locality for the time being.

- The Board may appoint an equipment officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.
- 5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the Chairman and Secretary of the Board conjointly.

### Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the

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The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

### Membership of Brigade.
