Prices Control Order No. 404.

Firewood—Perth Metropolitan Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 404.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 105, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 243, is hereby revoked.

## PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950.

Prices Control Order No. 403.

Motor Spirit.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.

## Maximum Wholesale Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which firewood of the descriptions specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price specified therein.

## Maximum Retail Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which firewood of the descriptions specified in the Second Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be—

- (a) in respect of sales for delivery at the purchaser's premises—the price specified in that Schedule according to the quantity of firewood comprised in the sale;
- (b) in respect of other sales—the price so specified less 3d. per cwt. in each case.

## Delivery of Invoices or Dockets.

6. Every person who sells firewood by wholesale or by retail in the Perth Metropolitan Area shall deliver with that firewood an invoice or docket containing the following particulars—

- (a) his name and place of business;
- (b) the name and address of the purchaser of that firewood;
- (c) the date of the sale of that firewood;
- (d) a description of the firewood sold;
- (e) the weight of the firewood sold;
- (f) the price per ton or per cwt. at which that firewood is sold.

## Exhibition of Price List.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any firewood, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, in the form of a price list and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of that firewood.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which firewood specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in the Perth Metropolitan Area by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## Prices Control Order, No. 405.

## Leather.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order, No. 405.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order, No. 49, as amended by Prices Control Orders, Nos. 239 and 262, is hereby revoked.

## Definition.

3. In this Order “prevailing price” means, in relation to any person, the price whether wholesale or retail at which that person sold leather of the classes or kinds specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order on the 31st day of August, 1939, or, if no sale was made on that date, on the last preceding date on which such sale was made, at the same place and on the same terms and conditions.

## Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the classes or kinds of leather specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the prevailing price plus the percentage of that price set forth in the second column of that Schedule opposite each such class or kind of leather.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any class or kind of leather specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950.

Prices Control Order No. 407.

Sheets, Tea Towels, Nursery Squares, Table Cloths, Pillowslips—Hemmed in Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Act, 1948-1950, and the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantine Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 407.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 22, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 216 is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. This Order shall apply only to specified goods hemmed or overlocked in Australia.

Definitions and Interpretations.

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“maker-up” means, in relation to the supply of any services of hemming, overlocking, or otherwise making up of any specified goods, a person who hems or overlocks or otherwise makes up those goods from material furnished to him by some other person for such purpose;

“manufacturer” means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods, a person who manufactures those specified goods from his own material;

“semi-manufacturer” means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods, a person who owns the material from which those specified goods are manufactured and who furnishes that material to a maker-up for hemming, overlocking, or otherwise making up of such specified goods, and includes a person who sells the material to a maker-up or manufacturer and buys the goods hemmed, overlocked, or otherwise made up from the material back from the maker-up or manufacturer;

“specified goods” means the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order;

“wholesale merchant” means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods, a person who purchases such goods from a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer and resells those goods by wholesale.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Manufacturers and Semi-Manufacturers.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which specified goods may be sold by the manufacturer or semi-manufacturer to be the sum of—

(a) the maximum making allowance specified in the Schedule to this Order, plus—

(b) (i) in respect of sales by wholesale—the maximum price fixed by or under the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, for the sale by wholesale by that manufacturer or semi-manufacturer, as the case may be, of the material contained in such goods;

(ii) in respect of sales by retail—the maximum price fixed by or under the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, for the sale by retail by that manufacturer or semi-manufacturer, as the case may be, of the material contained in such goods.

Maximum Rates—Makers-up.

6. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the service of making-up any specified goods may be supplied by the maker-up to be the amount specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale Merchants.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which specified goods may be sold by a wholesale merchant to be the purchase price paid or payable for those goods by that wholesale merchant, before deduction of any discount or allowance thereon.

Discounts.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a manufacturer, wholesale merchant or a semi-manufacturer has customarily allowed in relation to sales other than by retail, any difference in price—

(a) to any person, or to any person included in any class of persons;

(b) in respect of sales of certain quantities;

(c) in respect of sales under certain conditions of sale,

the maximum prices fixed by or under this Order shall, in the case of sales other than by retail to any such person or persons, or of such quantities or under such conditions, be reduced by the allowance of that difference. Provided that in any case, whether any difference in price has been customarily allowed or not, where payment is made within 30 days from the date of invoice, such reduction shall not be less than 2½ per centum of such price.

**Delivery of Invoices Specifying Maximum Prices. etc.**

9. Every manufacturer or semi-manufacturer who sells to a wholesale merchant any specified goods, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall deliver with those goods an invoice or docket setting forth—

- (a) a full description of the goods sold;
- (b) the price charged for those goods; and
- (c) the maximum price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale of those goods by that manufacturer, or semi-manufacturer, to that wholesale merchant.

**Variation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice.**

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where in pursuance of this paragraph a maximum price is fixed in relation to any specified goods or a maximum rate is fixed in relation to the supply of the service of hemming, over-

locking or making-up any specified goods by notice in writing to any person, I declare the maximum price at which such specified goods may be sold or the maximum rate at which the service of hemming, overlocking or making-up specified goods may be supplied, to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
