IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto, from 1st to 30th April, 1951, from 1st September, 1951, to 30th April, 1952, from 1st September, 1952, to 30th April, 1953, and from 1st September, 1953, to 30th April, 1954, all dates inclusive.

### Schedule.

All the waters of that portion of Esperance Bay bounded by lines starting at a point on the High Water Mark of that Bay situate at its intersection with the prolongation South-Easterly of the North-Eastern side of Andrew Street, Esperance, and extending South-Easterly to the Easternmost extremity of the old jetty; thence North-Easterly to the Easternmost extremity of the centre line of the new jetty; thence generally Westerly along that centre line to the High Water Mark of Esperance Bay aforesaid, and thence generally South-Westerly along that mark to the starting point.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the

powers aforesaid and of every other power in naming me in this behalf, prohibit the taking by any means whatsoever of the fish known as or called "Crayfish" in all Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of three years from the 1st April, 1951.

#### Schedule.

1. All that portion of the Indian Ocean bounded by lines starting at a point on the Southernmost extremity of Wreck Point on Pelsart Island in the Pelsart Group, situate at approximate Latitude 28° 59' 15" South, Longitude 113° 58' 20" East and extending South to the outermost extremity of the Western Australian waters of that Group situate at approximate Latitude 29° 2' 45" South; thence generally North-Westerly along the outermost extremities of those waters to Latitude 28° 50' 30" South, Longitude 113° 46' 45" East; thence East to Longitude 113° 50' 15" East; thence South to the Northernmost extremity of the reefs surrounding the Group and thence generally South-Easterly along the outer extremities of those reefs to the starting point.

2. All that portion of the Indian Ocean bounded by lines starting at a point on the Southernmost extremity of the outer reefs surrounding Rat Island in the Easter Group situate at approximate Latitude 28° 47' 45" South, Longitude 113° 45' 00" East and extending South to the outermost extremity of the Western Australian waters of that Group situate at approximate Latitude 28° 50' 30" South; thence generally North-Westerly and North-Easterly along the outermost extremities of those waters to approximate Latitude 28° 36' 15" South, Longitude 113° 43' 45" East; thence South to the Northernmost extremity of the outer reefs and thence generally South-Westerly and South-Easterly along the outer extremities of those reefs to the starting point.

3. All that portion of the Indian Ocean bounded by lines starting at a point on the Southernmost extremity of Evening Reef, situate South of West Wallabi Island in the Wallabi Group at approximate Latitude 28° 32' 55" South, Longitude 113° 41' 45" East and extending South to the outermost extremity of the Western Australian waters of that Group, situate at approximate Latitude 28° 35' 29" South; thence generally North-Westerly and North-Easterly along the outermost extremities of those waters to approximate Latitude 28° 15' 34" South, Longitude 113° 31' 30" East; thence East to the Northernmost extremity of the reef on the Northward of North Island at approximate Longitude 113° 35' 20" East and thence generally Southerly and South-Easterly along the outermost extremities of those reefs to the starting point.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power in naming me in this behalf, prohibit the taking by any means whatsoever of the fish known as or called "Crayfish" in all Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of three years as from the date of gazettal of this Proclamation.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of Western Australian waters lying between Knobby Head on the Western Australian coastline at approximate Latitude 29° 40' 00" South and the mouth of Hill River at approximate Latitude 30° 23' 28" South, including the Western Australian waters of the adjacent islands of that area.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 26th day of April, 1951, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

#### Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection (3) of section 14 of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921, as amended by Acts No. 29 of 1923 and No. 7 of 1936 the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the legislature of any part of the King's Dominions or other competent authority, for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State, by Order in Council, extend the said Act to that part of the King's Dominions; and whereas the Governor is satisfied that such reciprocity has been accorded by the Dominion of Pakistan including the Provinces and the Capital of the Federation of Pakistan: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to the said Dominion of Pakistan including the Provinces and the Capital of the Federation of Pakistan.

#### Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1949.

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 97/51.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1949, that the municipal and road districts mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act are, for the purpose of the Act, constituted fire districts, by the names as in the said schedule stated, and that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute the district of any other local authority a fire district, assign a name to any such fire district and include the same in Part II or Part III or Part IV of the Second Schedule to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, constitute that portion of the Boyup Brook Fire District as referred to in the schedule hereunder a fire district, assign the name of "Boyup Brook Fire District" to the said fire district and order and direct that the said fire district be and the same is hereby included in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the said Act.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the North-Western corner of Nelson Location 308 and extending Southerly, South-Easterly, South-Westerly and generally South-Easterly along boundaries of that location to the centre of Boyup Brook; thence generally South-Easterly downwards along that centre line to the right bank of the Blackwood River; thence generally Southerly downwards along that bank to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of location 710;

thence Westerly to and along that boundary to the Eastern side of road number 1062; thence Northerly along that side to a point situate one chain South of the North-Western corner of Boyup Brook Lot 184; thence West through Nelson Location 7362 (reserve 16199) to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western side of Williams Street; thence Northerly to and along that side and onwards to the North-Eastern corner of location 12001; thence Easterly to and along the Southern boundary of location 850 to its South-Easternmost corner; thence Northerly and North-Westerly along boundaries of that location to the Southern boundary of location 303; thence Easterly along the Southern boundaries of locations 303 and 6128 to the latter's South-Eastern corner; thence Northerly along that location's Eastern boundary to the Southernmost boundary of location 1872; thence Easterly along that boundary and onwards to the Westernmost boundary of location 441; thence Southerly, South-Easterly and again Southerly along boundaries of that location and locations 4174 and 233 and onwards to the South-Eastern side of road number 3235 (Ritson Street) and thence South-Westerly along that side to the starting point.

The Land Act, 1933-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 10150/98.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 23240 for Drainage (Kojonup Location 8896) should be placed under the control of the Katanning Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Katanning Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other

use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

The Land Act, 1933-1950.

Collie Recreation and Park Lands Act  
(No. 1 of 1931).

Road Districts Act, 1919-1948.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 43/28.

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section 3 of the Collie Recreation and Park Lands Act, No. 1 of 1931, there shall be a Board consisting of five members, one person to be nominated by the Governor and who shall be Chairman, two of whom shall be the Mayor and a Councillor of the Municipality of Collie to be nominated by the Council of such municipality and two of whom shall be the Chairman and one member of the Collie Road Board to be nominated by such road board; and whereas by Order in Council dated 27th February, 1951, the Collie Municipal Council was constituted as the Collie Town Road District and by the same Order in Council the Collie Road District and the Collie Town Road District were united into one authority under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, thereby making compliance with the Act impossible: Now, therefore, acting under the provisions of subparagraph (vii) of subsection (1) of section 10 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that until Parliament otherwise provides, the Board of the Collie Recreation and Park Lands shall consist of five members, namely, one person to be nominated by the Governor and who shall be Chairman, and the Chairman and three members of the Collie Coalfields Road Board to be nominated by such Board.

## Regulations.

## Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Industry Act Regulations.

## Interpretation.

2. (1) In these regulations unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means the Dairy Industry Act, 1922-1939 (Act No. 37 of 1922 reprinted as amended by Act No. 27 of 1936 in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of Statutes of Western Australia, 1936, and further amended by Acts Nos. 27 of 1939 and 36 of 1940). (See also Act No. 34 of 1934, s.5 and Act No. 30 of 1918, s.39.)

“approved” means approved by an Inspector;

“creamery butter” means butter, other than pastry butter or milled butter, made from centrifugally separated cream;

“form” means the appropriate form in the Appendix to these regulations;

“milled butter” means butter which is a mixture or blend of two or more butters originally packed under separate names or brands, and which have been mixed or blended at a place other than where manufactured or made and packed;

expressions used have the same respective meanings as in the Act;

sections referred to are sections of the Act;

regulations referred to are these regulations.

- (2) Without prejudice to the provisions of subsection (2) of section three of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1948, the provisions of section 15 of that Act shall apply as if these regulations were an Act and the regulations revoked by the next succeeding regulation were a former Act.

## Consent of Governor to Erection of New Dairy,

## Produce Factory, Store, or Depot.

4. (1) Every application for the consent of the Governor under section 2A to the erection or utilisation of a building as a dairy produce factory, store, or depot, shall be made in writing, signed by the applicant, in Form 25.

- (2) The application shall be lodged with the Director of Agriculture and shall be accompanied by a consent fee of £1.

- (3) If the application be refused, the consent fee paid therewith shall be refunded to the applicant.

- (4) When the application is granted, a certificate of consent, in Form 26 shall be issued to the applicant.

5. (1) Every person requiring the approval of the Minister to the utilisation of a dairy for the manufacture of dairy produce pursuant to paragraph (ii) of the proviso to subsection (1) of section 2A, as evidence that the consent of the Governor to the utilisation of the dairy is not necessary, shall make application for the approval, in writing, signed by him, in Form 24.

(2) The application shall be lodged with the Director of Agriculture and shall be accompanied by an approval fee of £1.

(3) If the application be refused the approval fee paid therewith shall be refunded to the applicant.

(4) When the application is granted a certificate of approval, in Form 27, shall be issued to the applicant.

Register of Factories, Stores, and Depots.

6. The Minister shall cause to be kept a register of dairy produce factories, stores, and depots.

Registration of Factory, Store, or Depot.

7. Application for registration of a factory, store, or depot shall be made by the 20th day of January in each year, in either Form 1 or 2 as the case requires, and shall contain the particulars indicated in the form, which shall be accompanied by a fee of one pound.

8. Subject to the provisions of regulation 84, where pursuant to section 5 application is made for registration of premises intended to be used as a dairy produce factory, store, or depot, an inspector shall not approve of the premises as being fit for the use intended where the premises are intended to be used—

- (a) as a butter factory but are not equipped with all the necessary appliances for the manufacture of butter and for completely controlling the temperature of dairy produce at each stage of the process of manufacture of butter, and which are not provided with impervious water-tight floors, efficient drainage, and a good water supply; or
- (b) as a cheese factory but are not equipped with all the necessary appliances for the manufacture of cheese, and are not provided with maturing room accommodation, suitable shelving for at least fourteen days' make of cheese, and with impervious water-tight floors, efficient drainage and a good water supply.

Certificate of Registration.

9. Every certificate of registration of a factory, store or depot shall be in Form 3 or 4 at the case requires.

Cancellation of Registration.

10. (1) The registration of premises registered in accordance with section 5 shall not be cancelled, as provided for in the proviso to subsection (2) of that section until after a report in writing has been made to the Minister by the Director of Agriculture that the registration of the premises is liable to cancellation.

(2) Upon receipt of the report by the Minister the provisions of regulation 84, subregulation (19) shall apply.

Sale or Lease of Factory, Store, or Depot.

11. When any registered factory, store, or depot is transferred or leased, the person holding the certificate of registration shall, within fourteen days after the transfer or lease, notify in writing the Director of Agriculture at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, of the transfer or lease, and the name of the transferee or lessee, as the case may be.

Any transferee or lessee intending to use the premises as a factory, store, or depot, shall make application for registration.

Temporary Cessation of Work in Factories.

12. If a factory ceases to manufacture dairy produce during any period of the year, a notification shall be sent to the Director of Agriculture at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, within fourteen days of cessation, stating the period for which it is contemplated the dairy produce factory will be closed.

Register of Brands and Marks.

13. The Minister shall cause to be kept a register of registered brands. The register shall contain the following particulars:—Number of registered brand, date of application, date of registration, name and address of the owner of the brand, copy or exact representation of the brand, grade of dairy produce represented by brand.

Application for Registration of Brand.

14. Application for the registration of a brand shall be in Form 5 and shall be accompanied by a fee of five shillings.

Certificate of Registration of Brands.

15. A certificate of the registration of a brand shall be in Form 12.

Temporary Registration of Brands.

16. Brands may be temporarily registered pending their registration under the Trade Marks Act (Commonwealth), but the period of temporary registration shall not exceed six months. The particulars of brands temporarily registered shall be kept in a temporary register.

Brands which may be Registered.

17. No brand shall be registered except—

- (a) a brand which has been registered under the Trade Marks Act (Commonwealth) and which is used to indicate the dairy produce factory and the grade of dairy produce manufactured thereat; or
- (b) a brand consisting of the name and address of the factory at which the dairy produce is manufactured and the grade of the dairy produce as designated in accordance with the provisions of regulations 52, 53 and 54.

No brand used to represent choice or first grade of butter shall be registered unless the brand includes the word "pasteurised."

No brand shall be registered which closely resembles or is identical with a brand already registered.

#### Branding Packages.

18. Every package of butter of 28lbs. or over shall be indelibly marked on the outside with a registered brand.

#### Alteration or Removal of Brands.

19. Any person who, without the written consent of an Inspector, removes or alters or defaces any brand, or removes, alters, or defaces any mark or brand placed on boxes or other packages by or at the request of an Inspector, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

#### Brand to be Used in Connection with One Factory Only.

20. The registered brand of one butter factory shall not be used in connection with butter manufactured at a factory belonging to any other owner.

#### Butter Packed at Different Factories Belonging to the Same Owner.

21. When butter is packed under the same brand at more than one factory belonging to the same owner, there shall be marked on each package containing butter so packed, in addition to the brand, a letter or letters indicating the factory at which such butter was made.

#### Dimensions of Letters to be Used in Branding Butter Boxes.

22. When packages of butter are branded with a brand containing the word or words "choice," "first grade," "second grade," or "pastry grade," as the case may be, the word or words shall be in letters not less than three-quarters of an inch in length and half an inch in width, and shall be placed in the most prominent position in the brand, which shall itself be marked in a prominent position on the box.

#### Cancellation of Registered Brands.

23. A registered brand shall be cancelled on the written request of the owner of the brand and may be cancelled if the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that the brand is intentionally being used in connection with butter of a lower grade than that represented by it or to mislead the public.

#### Butter Brands where the Manufacturer and Owner of the Registered Brand are Different.

24. Where butter is placed in packages of 28lbs. or over, bearing a registered brand other than that owned by the manufacturer, the package which contains the butter also must bear the name and address of the manufacturer, or his registered serial number.

#### Transfer of Brand.

25. Where the right to use a registered brand has been transferred, the transfer shall be noted in the register of brands, and, for this purpose, a joint application for transfer shall be made by the owner and the transferee.

#### Butter Bearing an Incorrect Registered Brand.

26. If, after butter has been despatched from a factory, the manager thereof has reason to believe that circumstances have arisen which will cause the quality of the butter to deteriorate, so that it will be of lower quality than that indicated by the registered brand on the package containing it, the manager of the factory shall immediately notify the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, of the circumstances.

#### Cream Grader's Certificate.

27. (1) The certificate of competency for a cream grader shall be in Form 7.  
(2) Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as a cream grader shall give satisfactory evidence of practical experience and shall satisfy the examiner by means of a theoretical and practical examination as to their knowledge respectively of the following:—

- (a) Elementary knowledge of dairy bacteria, their development and their influence on milk and cream.
- (b) Neutralisation and pasteurisation of milk and cream.
- (c) Temperatures—their influence in the treatment, manufacture and storage of any dairy produce.
- (d) Causes affecting the quality of milk, cream, butter, cheese or other dairy products.
- (e) Grading cream.
- (f) Estimating solids in milk.
- (g) Over-run and factors which influence it.
- (h) The provisions of the Act.

#### Milk Grader's Certificate.

28. (1) The certificate of competency for a milk grader shall be in Form 10.  
(2) Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as a milk grader shall give satisfactory evidence of practical experience, and shall satisfy the examiner by means of a theoretical and practical examination as to their knowledge respectively of the following:—

- (a) Elementary knowledge of dairy bacteria, their development and their influence on milk and cream.
- (b) Neutralisation and pasteurisation of milk and cream.
- (c) Temperatures—their influence in the treatment, manufacture and storage of any dairy produce.

- (d) Causes affecting the quality of milk, cream, butter, cheese or other dairy products.
- (e) Milk grading.
- (f) Estimating solids in milk.
- (g) Methylene Blue Reductase test, Resazurin test and Wisconsin Curd test.
- (h) The provisions of the Act.

Milk Tester's Certificate, Cream Tester's Certificate,  
Milk and Cream Tester's Certificate.

29. (1) The certificate of competency for a milk tester or a cream tester, or a milk and cream tester shall be in Form 8.

(2) Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as a milk tester, or a cream tester or a milk and cream tester shall give satisfactory evidence of practical experience, and shall satisfy the examiner by means of a theoretical and practical examination as to their knowledge respectively of the following:—

- (a) Elementary knowledge of the secretion of milk and factors which might influence the quantity and quality of the same.
- (b) Composition of milk and cream and factors which induce variation therein.
- (c) Collection of samples and means of preserving the same.
- (d) Methods of testing for acidity, moisture, and preservatives.
- (e) Estimating by the Babcock method from weight and volume of samples the quantity of butterfat in milk and cream.
- (f) Errors which may occur in testing and how to correct or avoid same.
- (g) Recording and computing results of testing; and
- (h) The provisions of the Act.

Butter Maker's Certificate.

30. (1) The certificate of competency for a butter-maker shall be in Form 9.

(2) Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as a butter-maker shall give satisfactory evidence of practical experience and shall satisfy the examiner by means of a theoretical and practical examination as to their knowledge respectively of the following:—

- (a) Cream grading as outlined in regulation 27.
- (b) Determination of acidity, moisture, preservatives, and solids other than butterfat in milk and its products.
- (c) Neutralisation and pasteurisation of sour cream.
- (d) Churning, washing, salting, working and packing of butter.
- (e) Over-run and condition affecting actual over-run.
- (f) Composition of butter and factors that influence its control.
- (g) Causes of defects found in butter and their prevention.
- (h) Scoring and grading of butter.
- (i) Cooling facilities for factories.
- (j) The provisions of the Act.

Cheese-maker's Certificate.

31. (1) The certificate of competency for a cheese-maker shall be in Form 11.

(2) Candidates for examination for a certificate of competency as a cheese-maker shall give satisfactory evidence of practical experience, and shall satisfy the Examiner by means of a theoretical and practical examination as to their knowledge respectively of the following:—

- (a) Milk grading as outlined in regulation 28.
- (b) Determination of acidity, moisture, preservatives, and solids in milk and its products.
- (c) Coagulating materials and their nature.
- (d) Aeration and cooling of milk.
- (e) Starters and the control of ripening.
- (f) Pasteurisation of milk for cheese-making.
- (g) Technique of Cheddar and Stilton cheese-making or of two other classified varieties of cheese.
- (h) Composition and yield of Cheddar cheese.
- (i) Curing of cheese.
- (j) Causes and prevention of defects found in cheese.
- (k) Varieties of cheeses.
- (l) Judging and grading of cheese; and
- (m) The provisions of the Act.

Persons Holding Certificates from Other States.

32. The Director of Agriculture may either without or upon further examination in the manner provided by the Act and these regulations, grant a certificate to test or grade milk or cream to any person holding a certificate obtained after examination conducted under the authority of the Government of any other State of the Commonwealth, but a certificate may be limited to the period stated therein.

Applications for Certificates.

33. An application for a cream grader's, milk grader's, milk tester's, cream tester's, milk and cream tester's, butter-maker's, or cheese-maker's certificate shall be in Form 6.

Cancellation of Certificates.

34. A certificate referred to in the last preceding regulation may be cancelled by the Director of Agriculture in the following cases:—

- (a) If the testing or grading performed by the certificate-holder is found by an Inspector to be so inaccurate that in his opinion the holder should not be further permitted to test or grade.
- (b) If the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that the certificate-holder has become incapable of testing or grading.
- (c) If the Director of Agriculture is satisfied that any tests are intentionally falsified by the certificate-holder.

- (d) If, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, the certificate holder has committed any offence against the Act or these regulations, or has advised or assisted any other person so to do.
- (e) If there are other grounds which, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, justify such cancellation.

#### Classification of Cream.

35. Cream supplied to a dairy produce factory for the manufacture of butter shall be classified as follows:—No. 1—Choice grade; No. 2—First grade; No. 3—Second grade or under.

Choice cream shall be free from all taints, from whatever source arising, and have a smooth and even texture, and shall be capable of being manufactured into choice butter.

First grade cream shall be cream affected by food flavour, or by slight physical, biological, or chemical flavour, or by an odour absorbed from any substance which is not of an unclean or putrescent nature, or by a combination of any of these, and shall be capable of being manufactured into first grade butter.

Second grade cream or under shall be cream—(a) affected by an advanced physical, chemical, or absorbed taint, or by an advanced biological taint, which has not reached the putrescent stage; or (b) cream in which are any flies or vermin of any other nature whatsoever.

#### Classification of Milk for Manufacturing Purposes.

36. Milk supplied to a dairy produce factory for use in the manufacture of dairy produce shall be pure milk without addition or subtraction, and shall be classified as follows:—

No. 1—First Grade.

No. 2—Second Grade.

First Grade Milk is milk which does not completely decolourise Methylene Blue in less than three hours.

Second Grade Milk is milk which completely decolourises Methylene Blue in less than three hours.

Milk shall be rejected for use in the manufacture of cheese if it is affected by an advanced physical, chemical or absorbed taint, or by an advanced biological taint, or if it contains more than 0.25 per cent. acidity calculated as lactic acid.

#### Grading of Cream.

37. Cream of the classes mentioned in regulation 35 shall score the following points out of a maximum of 50 points for flavour and aroma:—

#### Grading of Milk Intended for Manufacture.

38. (1) Each can of milk from each supplier at each delivery shall be subjected to examination by a milk grader's senses of sight, taste and smell.

(2) Subject to subregulation (4) of this regulation a sample of the milk from each supplier at each delivery shall be subjected to the Methylene Blue Reductase test daily, but when two deliveries of milk, one in the morning and one in the evening, are made, the samples shall be tested as follows:—

- (a) Night and morning delivery separately if each delivery is manufactured separately and without delay.
- (b) Each morning if the evening delivery of milk is held over till the following morning and in such case the sample of the evening delivery shall be held at a temperature of not more than 60 deg. F.
- (c) If the milk delivered in the evening is mixed with the milk delivered in the morning for manufacture, samples of each delivery shall be mixed.
- (d) Where the milk delivered in the evening is held overnight and used for manufacture separately from the milk delivered in the morning, the samples shall be tested separately.

(3) The Methylene Blue Reductase test shall be carried out in the following manner:—

(a) Sampling of Milk to be Tested.

The milk to be tested shall be well mixed and the sample collected by means of sterile equipment into a sterile stoppered bottle, or directly into sterile covered test tubes permanently marked so as to show a content of 10 millilitres.

(b) Reagent.

#### Methylene Blue.

A solution shall be used which is prepared from 0.019 grammes of standard Methylene Blue which contains 80.4 per cent. Methylene Blue dye dissolved in 800 millilitres of sterile water. Alternatively, tablets containing 0.019 grammes of standard Methylene Blue shall be used to prepare the solution by dissolving one tablet in 200 millilitres of sterile water, shaking until the tablet is completely dissolved and making up the solution with cold sterile water to 800 millilitres.

The resultant solution shall be stored in a stoppered sterile flask in a cool dark place and shall not be used if—

- it has been exposed to sunlight except in course of preparation or use in testing milk; or
- a period of two months has elapsed since the date of preparation.

The amount of Methylene Blue required for a days work should be poured off from the stock bottle into a suitable glass container stoppered with a rubber stopper. The pipette used for transferring the Methylene Blue Solution to the tubes of milk shall not be introduced into the stock bottle.

(c) Apparatus.

Test tubes shall conform to the British Standard Specification No. 625 (1935) 152/16, nominal 6 inches by  $\frac{5}{8}$  inch, having an internal diameter of 13.5 plus or minus 0.5 millimetre, and being correctly marked at 10 millilitres. They shall be plugged with cotton wool covered with loosely fitting aluminium caps or stored in such other way as may prevent contamination.

Pipettes should be 1 millilitre straight sided blow out delivery type and shall be plugged with cotton wool at the upper end.

All rubber stoppers and glassware shall be sterile.

(d) Method of carrying out the test.

(i) Thoroughly mix the sample of milk to be tested by inverting and shaking the sample bottle and pour the milk into the test tube up to the 10 millilitre mark leaving one side of the interior unwetted with milk. Add 1 millilitre of Methylene Blue Solution without letting the pipette come into contact with the milk in the tube or with the wetted side of the tube. After a lapse of three seconds blow out the solution remaining in the tip of the pipette. Close the tube with a sterile rubber stopper with aseptic precautions invert the tube slowly twice so that the whole column of contained air will rise above the level of the milk and place within five minutes in a water bath. The water in the bath should be kept above the level of the milk in the test tubes and its temperature shall be 37° C. with a tolerance of plus or minus 0.5° C. and shall be maintained as nearly uniform as possible by means of a reliable automatic thermo regulator. The interior of the bath shall be kept completely dark.

(ii) After one half hour after placing the tube in the water bath it should be inspected for decolourisation and any tube which is decolourised to within 5 millimetres of the surface of the milk shall be regarded as completely decolourised. A trace of colour at the bottom of the tube may be ignored provided that it does not extend upwards for more than 5 millimetres.

After that inspection a tube which is not completely decolourised should be inverted once slowly and replaced in the water bath. Inspections should be then made at half hourly intervals until decolourisation is complete or until the tube has remained in the bath for a period of three hours without complete decolourisation. Following each inspection at which decolourisation has not commenced, the test tube should be inverted slowly once. Any tube in which decolourisation has commenced should not be inverted.

(4) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this regulation, milk supplied to a dairy produce factory for manufacturing purposes may be graded solely by the milk grader's senses of sight, taste and smell where, by the application of that test, milk is in the opinion of the milk grader below the standard prescribed for second grade.

#### Time of Arrival.

39. All milk delivered to a dairy produce factory by the morning delivery for manufacturing purposes shall be delivered or shall arrive on the premises of the dairy produce factory at or before 10 o'clock a.m. on the day of delivery; and no manager of any dairy produce factory shall accept delivery of any milk for manufacturing purposes which does not arrive on the premises of his factory at or before that time.

#### Basis of Payment for Milk and Cream.

40. (1) The butterfat content of milk and cream shall be estimated by the Babcock method.

(2) Samples of cream for testing for butterfat content shall be weighed with an approved scale.

(3) The basis of payment for cream graded either as choice grade cream or first grade cream shall be as follows:—

(a) For all cream graded as choice grade cream, the owner of a factory shall pay not less than one halfpenny per lb. for butterfat contained therein over and above the price paid by him for cream graded as first grade cream; and for all cream graded as first grade cream he shall pay not less than one penny-halfpenny per lb. for butterfat contained therein over and above the price paid by him for cream graded as second grade cream.

(b) The rates of pay on any one day shall be common to the grade and all other factors on which the rates of pay have been computed and made.

#### Differential Payment for Milk.

41. For all milk graded as first grade, the owner of a factory shall pay not less than one penny per lb. for butterfat contained therein over and above the price paid by him for the butterfat contained in milk graded as second grade.

The rates of payment on any one day shall be common to the grade and to all other factors on which such rates of payment have been computed and made.

## Check-testing of Milk and Cream Samples.

42. The manager of every factory is required to have available for check-testing by an Inspector samples equal in number to at least the number of samples of milk or cream represented by the full Babcock testing machine used at the factory, and the tests of which samples have been entered in the records. The samples as required to be made available shall be those representing the last series which passed through the testing machine.

## Weighing and Sampling Cream.

43. Each can of cream received from a supplier shall be stirred so as to be a homogeneous mixture weighed, sampled and tested separately.

Provided that, where more than one can of cream is received from the same supplier in the same consignment the samples may be mixed together and the composite sample so obtained may be taken for testing purposes.

## Sampling of Milk.

44. (1) The manager of a dairy produce factory shall sample, weigh and test every individual supply of milk received at the factory. The samples from such supplies may be mixed so to form a composite sample, and the testing of the composite sample shall be carried out at intervals of not more than seven days.

## Fat Standard of Cream.

45. Cream delivered at factories during the months of September, October, November, December, January, February and March for the manufacture of butter shall contain not less than 37 per cent. of butterfat, and, during the other months of the year, shall contain not less than 30 per cent. of butterfat.

## Supplies of Putrescent Cream.

46. The manager of every factory—(a) shall report to an Inspector the name and address of every person who supplies putrescent cream, and shall state the date on which such cream was supplied; (b) shall then add to it either kerosene, tannate of iron, or cochineal essence in sufficient quantity to colour distinctly the whole of such cream.

All cream in which rats, mice, or maggots are found, or which is otherwise unfit for human food, shall be treated as putrescent cream.

## Cream Below Standard and Milk Rejected for Manufacture to be Reported.

47. The manager of a dairy produce factory shall furnish weekly to the Inspector in whose district the factory is situated, a statement in duplicate, either in Form 19 or 23 as the case requires, signed by a person holding a certificate of competency under the Act as a milk or cream grader, showing the name and address of every person who, during the week next preceding that in respect of which the statement is furnished, supplied to the factory cream containing less than the prescribed amount of butterfat, and whose cream was below first grade quality, or milk rejected for manufacture, and the statement shall contain all the particulars required to be supplied in the appropriate form.

## Grading of Butter.

48. (1) One box of butter from each churn of butter manufactured in premises owned or occupied by licensed manufacturers (other than licensed manufacturers who manufacture butter only from the milk produced from their own cows) shall, for the purposes of grading by an inspector, be submitted within a reasonable time, and not later than seven days after the manufacture thereof, by the manufacturer to such premises at such place as shall be specified by the Superintendent of Dairying in relation to such manufacturer.

(2) Such box submitted for grading shall be marked and branded in accordance with the provisions of regulations 50, 51 and 55.

(3) Notice of the date when the butter will be submitted for grading shall be given by the manufacturer of it to the Dairy Products Marketing Board, the Superintendent of Dairying, and the owner or occupier of the premises at which the grading is to take place, not later than the time of arrival of the butter at the premises, and the notice shall be in writing and may be in accordance with Form No. 33 in the First Schedule to the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act Regulations.

(4) The grading shall be performed not earlier than four (4) days after the date of manufacture.

(5) All butter submitted for grading under the provisions of this regulation shall be graded for quality in accordance with the provisions of regulation 52 by an inspector appointed under the Act.

Provided that, whenever practicable, any grading performed by an inspector under this regulation shall be performed in the presence of an inspector appointed by the Dairy Products Marketing Board under the provisions of the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1937.

(6) The grading officer shall, in respect of butter submitted for grading to him, forward to the Dairy Products Marketing Board and the manufacturer, respectively, a copy of the grade certificate forthwith after the grading has been performed.

(7) (a) The Minister shall pay to the manufacturer of the butter by way of reimbursement for expenses incurred in the submission of butter for grading pursuant to the provisions of this regulation, an amount assessed in accordance with a scale or rate to be fixed by the Minister from time to time.

(b) If, in accordance with regulations made under the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1937, the Dairy Products Marketing Board by an arrangement with the Minister agrees to reimburse the Minister moneys paid or payable by the Minister pursuant to the provisions of this regulation, the Board may, on behalf of the Minister, pay direct to the manufacturer the amount payable to him by the Minister.

(8) Any person failing to observe or comply with the requirements of this regulation shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

(9) When the grading of any box of butter by the inspector under this regulation differs in any respect from the grading by the manufacturer of the box of butter, the grading by the inspector shall, subject to an appeal as provided for by the Act, be deemed to be the correct grading of the box of butter, and the manufacturer shall be bound thereby.

#### Packing of Cheese for Grading and Grading of Cheese.

49. (1) For the purpose of grading by an inspector, one 80 lb. cheese or one 40 lb. cheese from each vat, manufactured in registered premises owned or occupied by each manufacturer, shall be submitted by the manufacturer not earlier than 21 days nor later than 35 days after the manufacture thereof to such premises at such place as shall be specified by the Superintendent of Dairying in relation to such manufacturer.

(2) Cheese submitted for grading shall be marked, branded and crated as follows:—

- (a) The factory brand and identification letter or symbol allotted to the factory or either shall be clearly stamped on the side of each cheese.
- (b) The vat number and day and month of manufacture in figures and letters not less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch high shall also be clearly stamped on the side of each cheese.
- (c) Two 80 lb. or three 40 lb. cheeses, each from different vats, shall be packed in one crate.
- (d) Both ends of the crate shall contain the word "coloured" or "white" in violet ink letters  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch high and  $\frac{3}{32}$  inch thick, and a true description of the variety of cheese.
- (e) The vat number, day and month of manufacture and total weight in lb. of green cheese from each vat shall be stamped on the side of that portion of the crate containing the cheese from the vat in figures and letters not less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch high.

(3) Notice of the date when the cheese will be submitted for grading shall be given by the manufacturer of the cheese to the Superintendent of Dairying, the Dairy Products Marketing Board, and the owner or occupier of the premises at which the grading is to take place, not later than the time of arrival of the cheese at the premises, and the notice shall be in writing and shall be in Form 32, and shall contain all the particulars required to be supplied in the form.

(4) The grading shall be performed not earlier than 21 days after the date of manufacture.

(5) All cheese submitted for grading under the provisions of this regulation shall be graded for quality in accordance with the provisions of regulation 54 by an inspector.

(6) The grading officer shall forthwith after the grading has been completed in respect of cheese submitted to him for grading, forward to the Dairy Products Marketing Board, the manufacturer and his agent, a statement in Form 33, and the statement shall contain all the particulars required to be supplied in the form.

(7) (a) The Minister shall pay to the manufacturer of the cheese by way of reimbursement for expense incurred in the submission of cheese for grading pursuant to the provisions of this regulation, an amount assessed in accordance with a scale or rate to be fixed by the Minister from time to time.

(b) If, in accordance with the regulations made under the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1937, the Dairy Products Marketing Board by an arrangement with the Minister agrees to reimburse the Minister any moneys paid or payable by the Minister pursuant to the provisions of this regulation, the Board may, on behalf of the Minister, pay direct to the manufacturer the amount payable to him by the Minister.

(8) When the grading of any cheese by an inspector under this regulation differs in any respect from the grading by the manufacturer of the cheese, the grading by the inspector shall, subject to an appeal as provided for by the Act, be deemed to be the correct grading of the cheese, and the manufacturer shall be bound thereby.

#### Marking of Dairy Produce.

50. (a) If, upon the examination mentioned in regulations 48 and 49, the Inspector finds the dairy produce concerned to be of the grade indicated by the brand on the package containing it, he shall mark the package containing it as follows:—



The grade indicated being that of the dairy produce as found upon the examination.

(b) If the dairy produce is found to be not of the grade indicated by the brand on the package, he shall mark the package as follows:—



The grade indicated on such mark being that of the dairy produce as found upon the examination.

#### Branding of Butter Packages.

51. Packages containing 28lb. or more of butter shall be legibly and indelibly branded with the words "Pure creamery butter," "Pure dairy butter," "Milled butter," or "Pastry butter," as the case may be, according to the contents, the net weight of the contents, the words "Western Australia," in block letters of not less than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch in length, the grade of the butter, and the name of the manufacturer, or, in lieu of such name, a trade mark registered as a brand under the Act.

#### Determination of Grades of Butter.

52. The following scale of points shall be the maximum used as a basis for determining the grade of butter:—

Flavour and aroma—50 points.

Texture, including body, grain and moisture—30 points.

Condition, including colour, finish, salting, packing, and package—20 points.

There shall be four grades of butter. The designation of each respective grade shall be—

"Choiceest," which means that it is pure creamery butter made from pasteurised cream and scores not less than 93 points out of 100;

"First grade," which means that it is pure creamery butter made from pasteurised cream and scores not less than 90 points and not more than 92 points out of 100;

"Second grade," which means that it is pure creamery butter and scores not less than 86 points and not more than 89 points out of 100;

"Pastry," which means that it is pure butter which is not rancid and scores not less than 83 points and not more than 85 points out of 100.

#### Percentage of Butter from Various Grades of Cream.

53. (1) Every factory manager shall so handle and process cream which is received and graded as "choice" quality at his factory that the minimum weight of "choice" butter manufactured therefrom determined by grading not earlier than four days after manufacture, in accordance with regulation 48 shall be 50 per cent. of the weight of butterfat contained in the cream.

(2) Every factory manager shall so handle and process the cream which is received and graded as "first grade" at his factory that the minimum weight of "first grade" butter manufactured therefrom determined by grading not earlier than four days after manufacture, in accordance with regulation 48, shall be 90 per cent. of the weight of the butterfat contained in the cream.

#### Determination of Grades of Cheese.

54. (1) The following scale of points shall be the maximum used as a basis for determining the grade of cheese:—

Flavour and aroma .. .. . 50 points.

Texture, including body .. .. . 30 "

Condition, including colour, finish, salting, packing and package 20 "

(2) There shall be four grades of cheese. The designation of each respective grade shall be:—

"Choiceest," which means cheese scoring not less than 93 out of 100 points.

"First grade," which means cheese scoring not less than 90 nor more than 92 points out of 100.

"Second grade," which means cheese scoring not less than 86 points nor more than 89 points out of 100.

"Third grade," which means cheese scoring not less than 83 points nor more than 85 points out of 100.

#### Marking of Packages where Butter is Below Standard of 36 Points for Flavour.

55. All packages containing butter which is below the standard of 36 points for flavour shall be indelibly marked with the words "Pastry butter," in addition to any other brands on the packages, before being submitted for sale.

## Re-examination of Dairy Produce.

56. If an Inspector has reasonable cause to think that the grade of any dairy produce examined pursuant to the provisions of these regulations has changed since the examination, he may re-examine it and, if necessary, cancel the certificates already given and the stamp applied to the package, and may deal with the certification and stamping of the dairy produce as if it had not been previously examined.

## Approved Stamp.

57. No person other than an Inspector shall use any stamp identical with or resembling a stamp mentioned in regulation 50. Any package bearing a stamp or impression resembling it shall have that stamp or impression removed by the owner of the dairy produce or his agent before it is sold.

## Standard for Butter.

58. Butter shall contain butterfat to the extent of not less than 82 parts per centum, and shall contain the following:—

Water to the extent of not more than 16 parts per centum.

Casein to the extent of not more than 2 parts per centum.

Salt to the extent of not more than 4 parts per centum.

And such colouring matter as may be deemed by the Minister to be harmless.

## Standards for Cheese.

59. The standards for cheese shall be as follows:—

(1) Cream Cheese.—Cream cheese shall contain not more than 50 parts per centum of water, and the water-free substance shall contain not less than 65 parts per centum of milk fat.

(2) Whole Milk Cheese.—Whole milk cheese shall contain not more than 40 parts per centum of water and the water-free substance shall contain not less than 50 parts per centum of milk fat.

(3) Partially Skim Milk Cheese.—Partially skim milk cheese shall contain not more than 45 parts per centum of water, and the water-free substance shall contain not less than 36 parts per centum of milk fat.

(4) Skim Milk Cheese.—Skim milk cheese shall be cheese which contains less than 36 parts per centum of milk fat in the water-free substance. It shall contain not more than 45 parts per centum of water.

(5) Processed Cheese.—Processed cheese shall be cheese which has been submitted to a process of comminution, emulsification and pasteurisation. It shall contain not more than 42 parts per centum of water, and the water-free substance shall contain not less than 48 parts per centum of milk fat.

## Labelling Skim Milk Cheese.

60. All packages, including the bandage, containing partially skim milk cheese or skim milk cheese, shall be marked in bold face sans-serif capital letters of not less than 48 points face measurement "Part Skim Milk Cheese" or "Skim Milk Cheese," in accordance with the contents as the circumstances of the case require.

## Manufacture and Storage of Dairy Produce for Sale.

61. No person shall manufacture for sale, or have in any factory, store, depot, or other place for sale, dairy produce which does not conform to the standard prescribed by these regulations.

## Monthly Return of Butter Manufactured and Fat Paid For.

62. The monthly return required by section 15 shall be made in accordance with Form 18, and shall be sent or delivered to the Department of Agriculture so as to be received by the Superintendent of Dairying not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month in respect of which the return is made.

Monthly Return from Factories Manufacturing Cheese,  
Condensed Milk or Dried Milk.

63. The manager of every dairy produce factory for the manufacture of cheese, or condensed milk or dried milk, shall forward to the Department of Agriculture every month so as to be received by the Superintendent of Dairying not later than the 20th day of such month a statement either in Form 21 or 22, as the case requires, showing the quantity of milk received and treated during the next preceding month and supplying in the statement the particulars required to be supplied in the appropriate form.

## Annual Returns to Suppliers.

64. (1) The annual return to suppliers required by subsection (2) of section 15 shall be made either in form 17 or 20, as the case requires, and shall contain all the particulars required to be supplied in the appropriate form.

(2) A copy of every such annual return shall be forwarded also to the superintendent of Dairying not later than the 31st day of March in each and every year, or within three months from any balancing date, other than the 31st day of December, of which the Minister has approved in writing.

## Register of Milk or Cream Suppliers.

65. A register shall be kept at every factory showing the name and address of each person who supplies milk or cream to the factory, and shall be available at all times for examination by an Inspector.

## Appeals.

66. Any appeal against the decision of an Inspector shall be made to the Director of Agriculture in writing within fourteen days after the decision has been given, and the appeal shall then be considered by the Appeal Board as constituted under and in accordance with section 24.

## Milk or Cream-Testing and Grading Advice Dockets.

67. The secretary or manager of each dairy produce factory shall forward to each milk or cream supplier, at least four times a month, a statement in Form 13 or 14, as the case requires, showing the particulars of milk or cream received, the test, and the quantity of fat calculated; and at the end of each month, when payment is being made, shall furnish a statement to each supplier in Form 15 or 16 as the case requires.

When on the final advice docket on Form 13 or 14, supplied to farmers each month, the total fat calculated is shown, this information need not again appear on the monthly statement on Form 15 or 16, the total only of each grade of butterfat being then sufficient.

## Books to be kept at Butter Factories.

68. (1) The owner of every butter factory shall cause to be kept at the factory, or at a place or premises approved by the Minister, the following records, which shall at all times be available for examination by an Inspector:—

- (a) A cream-grading book in which shall be recorded the weights and grades of cream received from each supplier daily and which shall be signed daily by a grader holding a certificate issued under these regulations;
- (b) a cream test book, which shall show the test of each supplier's cream and which shall be signed each day by the cream tester holding a certificate under these regulations;
- (c) a cream and butter record book, showing on each day the names of suppliers, weight of cream, grades or quality of cream, test of cream, and quantity of butterfat, calculated in the prescribed manner, of each supplier;
- (d) a churn book, showing the weight in pounds of each grade of butter manufactured daily. The book shall be signed daily by the butter-maker or packer;
- (e) a butter stock and sales book, showing on each day the opening stock on hand, the butter manufactured, butterfat purchased, consignments, sales, donations, and closing stock on hand. Each grade of butter shall be shown separately, and the quantities shall be stated in pounds;
- (f) a pay-sheet book, showing the total quantity of each grade of butterfat each supplier is paid for and showing all debits;
- (g) a supplier's individual ledger, containing all the particulars shown in Form 15, with the exception of the total quantity of butter manufactured and the total quantity of butterfat paid for. In cases where carbon copies are kept of the statements to suppliers, showing the cream supplied, test, and butterfat calculated, this book may be dispensed with;
- (h) a computed and manufactured butter book, showing the total butterfat calculated in each day's churning side by side with the quantity actually churned. Each grade shall be shown separately, and explanations shall be given of any discrepancies in the grades.

(2) The records prescribed by the provisions of the last preceding subregulation may be made in books of the above character to any number being not less than three; and the records referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of that subregulation, where convenient, may be incorporated in one book, provided that the entries of grades, tests, and weights are made by the persons who carry out the work of grading, testing and weighing.

## Books to be kept at Cheese Factories.

69. (1) The owner of every cheese factory shall cause to be kept at the factory, or at a place or premises approved by the Minister, the following records which shall at all times be available for examination by an Inspector:—

- (a) A milk grading book in which shall be recorded the weights and grades of milk received from each supplier daily. This book shall be signed daily by a milk grader holding a certificate issued under these regulations;
- (b) a milk test book, which shall show the test of each supplier's milk. This book shall be signed each day on which testing is carried out by the milk tester holding a certificate under these regulations;
- (c) a milk and cheese record book, showing on each day the name of each supplier, and the weight, grade and test of milk received from each supplier, and the quantity of butterfat contained therein;
- (d) a manufacture book, showing the weight in pounds of each grade of cheese manufactured daily. The book shall be signed daily by the cheese maker holding a certificate under these regulations;
- (e) a cheese stock and sales book, showing on each day the opening stock on hand, the cheese manufactured, butterfat purchased, consignments, sales, donations, and closing stock on hand. Each grade of cheese shall be shown separately, and the quantities shall be stated in pounds;
- (f) a pay sheet book, showing the total quantity of each grade of butterfat each supplier is paid for and showing all debits;
- (g) a supplier's individual ledger, containing all the particulars shown in Form 16, with the exception of the total quantity of butterfat paid for. In cases where carbon copies are kept of the statements to suppliers, showing the milk supplied, test and butterfat calculated, this book may be dispensed with.

(2) The records prescribed by the provisions of the last preceding subregulations may be books of the above character to any number not being less than three; and the records referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of that subregulation, where convenient, may be incorporated in one book, provided that the entries of grades, tests and weights are certified by the persons who carry out the work of grading, testing and weighing.

## Milk or Cream Cans.

70. No person shall receive milk or cream at a dairy produce factory unless the name and address of the supplier are indelibly stamped on or permanently attached to the can, and unless the cans contain not more than 10 gallons of milk or cream.

## Condemned Milk and Cream Cans.

71. Milk and cream cans which have been condemned shall not be used to contain milk and cream for human consumption or for manufacture into dairy produce unless again made fit for that use to the approval of an Inspector.

## Standard for Milk Pipettes.

72. Pipettes used in connection with tests for butterfat content in milk shall have a capacity of 17.6 cubic centimetres at 60 degrees Fahrenheit, so as to deliver 18 grammes of milk of an average specific gravity of 1.030. The inlet shall have an internal diameter of 1.3 to 1.5 millimetres, and the glass shall not be less than 1 millimetre in thickness.

## Glass Measures to be Examined.

73. All glass measures used for testing milk or cream for butterfat and acidity content or temperature in a factory shall be submitted for examination to, and shall bear the mark of the Department of Agriculture, showing that the measures have been passed as accurate. Those found on examination to be inaccurate shall be so marked and returned to the owner or owners, but shall not be used for testing milk or cream as aforesaid.

## Carriage of Dairy Produce.

74. Any person who owns or controls any vehicle used for the transport of dairy produce shall not use or permit it to be used for the carriage of dairy produce to or from any store, dairy produce factory, depot, boat, railway depot, or wharf between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., unless the dairy produce is protected from heat by a method approved by an Inspector.

## Notice of Intention to Transfer Supply of Cream from one Factory to another.

75. (1) Notice of intention to transfer the supply of cream from one dairy produce factory to another as provided for in section 11A shall be given by the supplier to the manager of the dairy produce factory from which the supply of cream is about to be transferred, in accordance with Form 30.

(2) Upon receipt of the notice referred to in the last preceding subregulation the manager receiving it shall complete and sign the detachable form at the foot of it, detach and send or deliver it to the Superintendent of Dairying, or to such other person as the Superintendent of Dairying by writing appoints for the purpose.

76. Not later than the fourteenth day in each and every month, the manager of every dairy produce factory shall furnish to the Superintendent of Dairying, in writing, in Form 31, a return setting forth the names and addresses of suppliers of cream to his factory who have ceased to supply or who have commenced to supply milk or cream to his factory during the immediately preceding month.

## Methods for Protection of Dairy Produce from Contamination.

77. (a) Vehicles, including railway vans, used in the carriage or delivery of any dairy produce shall be kept at all times clean to the satisfaction of an Inspector; no such vehicle and no receptacle shall at any time be used for the carriage of any matter whereby the wholesomeness or quality of any dairy produce carried, or usually carried therein, would or might be endangered.

(b) Any person having in his possession or in transit any dairy produce for sale or for delivery shall, when required by an Inspector, state his name and place of abode to such Inspector, and any person who refuses to do so, or states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

(c) No person shall smoke or chew tobacco while engaged in the manufacture, packing, or storing of dairy produce intended for sale, and no person shall smoke in any place used for the manufacture, storage, or preparation of such dairy produce.

(d) Every person who is engaged in the manufacture or preparation of dairy produce for sale shall, when so engaged, maintain his clothing and his body clean.

## Protection of Cream from Contamination by Flies and Vermin.

78. All vessels in which cream is being held in storage, unless in a cream ripening room or factory specially designed to shut out flies and other vermin, shall be covered by a wire or metal gauze of a mesh so fine as to prevent the ingress of ordinary house flies.

## Transit of Milk or Cream.

79. Vehicles used for hire for the transit of milk or cream must be so protected by a raised hood as to prevent the direct rays of the sun from shining on the milk or cream cans.

## Storage of Milk or Cream while Awaiting Transit.

80. No person shall store milk or cream, while awaiting transit to a dairy produce factory, in any place where any can containing milk or cream is exposed to the direct rays of the sun, nor shall any carrier or dairy produce factory manager retain cream overnight in the cans in which it was despatched by the producer: Provided that, where it is shown that cream cannot be brought to the factory in one day, owing to distance or unfavourable weather, no penalty will be imposed as the result of cream being held overnight in the same cans.

## Strainers.

81. The manager of every dairy produce factory shall cause to be inserted on the cream line between the pasteuriser and the holding vat, and between the holding vat and the churn, an approved strainer having a mesh or openings of not more than one-eighth of an inch.

## Temperature of Butter-storing Rooms.

82. The temperature of the room in which butter is stored in a dairy produce factory shall not exceed 50 degrees Fahrenheit.

## Storage of Foreign Materials in Dairy Produce Factories, Stores or Depots.

83. No material other than that required for use in connection with the working of a dairy produce factory shall be stored in rooms used for the manufacture or storage of dairy produce.

## Registration and Cancellation of Registration of Premises.

84. (1) Premises shall not be regarded as fit for use or registration as a dairy produce factory, store or depot unless complying with the provisions of this regulation.

## (2) Sanitation:

- (a) Every dairy produce factory, store or depot shall be so situated that good sanitation as regards disposal of sewage and freedom from the ill-effects of noxious trades is permanently and economically possible.
- (b) The premises shall be protected from flies in manner approved by an Inspector.

## (3) Atmosphere:

- (a) The premises shall be so situated that the atmosphere surrounding them is, in the opinion of an Inspector, free from taint which arises from the proximity of a noxious trade centre or any other cause, and which taint is capable of detection by sense of smell.
- (b) Where it is sought to use premises for the storage of butter, the atmosphere in them shall be free of taint, which is capable of detection by sense of smell and which would be detrimental to the flavour of butter if the taint be absorbed by the butter.

(4) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subregulation, the premises shall be situated—

- (a) more than 300 yards from a piggery or pig sties in which pigs are enclosed;
- (b) more than 100 yards from the nearest boundary fence of a paddock in which pigs are grazed;
- (c) more than 200 yards from a slaughter house where animals are kept for slaughter for more than six hours before being slaughtered.

(5) Where the premises were registered under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920 or were otherwise lawfully established to the satisfaction of the Minister prior to the 23rd day of June, 1933, but do not comply with the provisions of the last preceding subregulation, the Minister may permit registration on the recommendation of an Inspector, and on being satisfied as to the good sanitary condition generally of the pig sties or slaughter house referred to in the last preceding subregulation, but animals shall not be yarded in the slaughter houses more than three hours before slaughter.

(6) Construction: The construction of the premises shall be as follows:—

- (a) Floors.—The floors of rooms in which dairy produce is received, processed, manufactured or stored shall be of material impervious to water such as concrete and be smooth on the surface and graded so that the washings will readily run away into a suitably made drain.
- (b) Walls.—All walls of rooms in which dairy produce is received, processed or manufactured shall be at least 12 feet in height at the lowest point and shall be of material impervious to water and capable of being washed down to a height of at least six feet.
- (c) Ceilings.—Every room in which dairy produce is received, processed or manufactured shall be provided with a ceiling so constructed as to follow the contour of the roof and to prevent the avoidable deposit of dust.
- (d) Size.—The minimum floor space in the butter churn rooms, cheese manufacturing rooms, condensing and milk drying rooms of dairy produce factories shall be 336 square feet.
- (e) Ventilation.—The premises shall be ventilated to maintain pure atmosphere.
- (f) Cream Receiving Platform.—The platform on which milk or cream is received in cans shall be constructed of—
  - (i) material impervious to water; or
  - (ii) of wood thoroughly caulked and supported on concrete pillars to a height of at least 4ft. constructed on a concrete floor which is graded and drained in a manner approved by an Inspector.
- (g) Sumps.—Sumps for draining butter milk from churns or whey from cheese vats may be constructed outside the building on the premises and the butter milk or whey conveyed to them by channels or fluming approved by an Inspector, but such sumps shall not be placed inside the building.

(7) Water: Water used for the washing of butter on the premises shall be obtained from a pure source, shall be free from avoidable organic matter and from deleterious mineral matter.

(8) Lighting: The milk testing room, the cream testing room, and the manufacturing room in every dairy produce factory shall be sufficiently well lighted to enable accuracy to be assured in all operations.

(9) Cool-storage Rooms: The cool-storage rooms in butter factories, stores or depots shall be kept free from unnecessary moisture; and any drip from thawing ice shall be carried away in open guttering approved by an Inspector.

(10) Storage of Butter for Sale: Where butter is exposed for sale the temperature of the store in which it is so exposed shall not exceed 70 degrees Fahrenheit.

(11) Curing Rooms: Curing rooms in cheese factories shall be so constructed as to enable an atmosphere not exceeding 60 degrees Fahrenheit to be maintained.

(12) Storage of Cheese for Sale: Where cheese is stored for sale it must be kept on shelves and at a temperature below 80 degrees Fahrenheit.

(13) Can Washing Accommodation: Suitable can washing accommodation shall be provided in every factory, store or depot, and shall include a supply of both hot and cold water and shall be situated outside the manufacturing and packing rooms.

(14) Can Storage Accommodation: The premises shall be provided with suitable storage accommodation for such cream cans as are not sent out daily to suppliers. The accommodation shall be of a character which will enable the cans to drain, and which will also admit of pure air, as approved by an Inspector, and may take the form of a special can house, or the cans may be stored in racks over a verandah with a floor made of material impervious to water and protected by a lean-to roof or other similar arrangement approved by an Inspector.

(15) Buttermilk Tanks: Tanks used for the purpose of holding buttermilk at dairy produce factories shall be so constructed that they can be easily cleaned. Buttermilk shall be removed from the tanks daily and they shall be kept in a clean and sweet condition. Where the tanks are elevated the space underneath them shall be concreted and graded so that the drip may be washed away without causing offence.

(16) Whey Tanks: All tanks used for holding whey in connection with cheese-making shall be situated at a distance of not less than 25 yards from the factory: Provided that, when a farmer manufactures cheese from milk obtained only from his own dairy herd, the distance of the whey tank from the factory need not be more than 10 yards.

(17) Disposal of Sewage: Provision shall be made for disposal of factory sewage in a manner which will preclude the possibility of such sewage contaminating the atmosphere surrounding the factory. Open concrete drains shall, wherever possible, be used for carrying away factory washings.

(18) Thermometers:

(a) Every room or chamber for the storage or holding of dairy produce shall be equipped with a thermometer which accurately registers the temperature of the room or chamber.

(b) Where thermometers are necessary for use in milk or cream in the manufacture of any dairy produce, such thermometers shall be enclosed in an unbreakable material approved by the Director of Agriculture.

(19) Cancellation: The manner in which registration of premises may be cancelled pursuant to the proviso to subsection (2) of section five of the Act is as follows:—

(a) The Minister shall cause written notice to be served upon the manager of the premises.

(b) The notice shall—

(i) notify the manager of intention to cancel the registration upon grounds specified in the notice, unless the manager shows cause to the satisfaction of the Minister that the registration should not be cancelled;

(ii) appoint a time and place at which the manager may show cause by representations made orally or in writing.

(c) The Minister may extend the time and change the place so appointed on giving notice to the manager.

(d) The Minister shall consider any representations made by the manager and decide whether or not the registration shall be cancelled.

(e) If no representations are made by the manager the Minister may decide to cancel the registration.

(f) Where the Minister decides to cancel the registration, notice of his decision shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and upon that publication the registration shall be cancelled and a memorandum of the cancellation shall be entered in the register and notice of the cancellation in Form 29 shall be served on the manager.

#### Stores used as Cold Stores.

85 (a) No cold store will be registered as a dairy-produce store for the purpose of freezing butter, unless the atmosphere during the time that the store is in use is maintained below 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

(b) No store will be registered as a dairy-produce store unless rooms are provided for dairy produce only; and cheese and butter shall not be stored in the same cold chamber at the same time, unless by special permission of an Inspector.

(c) If the refrigerating machine in any registered store which is used as a cold store be wholly or partly inoperative, and the temperature of the store rises above 40 degrees Fahrenheit, notice of the facts must be given forthwith on their occurrence to the Director of Agriculture, Department of Agriculture, or to an Inspector.

(d) The owner of every cold store, being dairy produce premises as defined by the Act, shall provide at the cold store an ante-chamber free from noises and smells, and with natural light and controlled temperatures suitable for the purpose of handling, examining, grading, weighing, and marking of dairy produce, scales for weighing dairy

produce placed in position as required by an inspector, suitable accommodation, including furniture and sanitary conveniences for the use of inspectors, a telephone placed in an approved place, thermometers in each cool chamber and ante-chamber, and adequate labour for the handling and stacking of dairy produce, having due regard to the placing of brands, grades, and consignments in manner approved by an inspector.

(c) Where a dry air service method of refrigeration is utilised at a cold store, the owner of the cold store shall provide an independent air service for each kind of dairy produce stored therein.

#### Marking of Butter Packages.

86. The manufacturer shall, upon every box of butter packed by him, in the top left-hand corner of the ends bearing the trade description, mark in figures half an inch in length and one-sixteenth of an inch in width, the vat number, the churn number; the number of boxes in the churning and, immediately beneath those figures, the day and the month of manufacture; for example, the figures—

1—2—25  
23—11

indicate vat No. 1, churn No. 2, 25, boxes in the churning, and that the contents of the box were manufactured on the 23rd November.

The figures shall be applied in violet-coloured ink by means of a rubber stamp.

#### Marking of Cheese.

87. (1) The manufacturer of cheese shall mark in plain and legible figures on the side of every cheese manufactured by him as soon as it has been removed from the hoop the date of manufacture and the sequence number of the batch of that date on which it was made.

(2) Before despatch to market the manufacturer of every cheese shall cause the original marking thereon to be reproduced by stencil or stamp on the side thereof in plain figures not less than  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch in length, and shall place thereon the factory brand or the identification letter of symbol allotted to the factory or both.

#### Marking of Cheese Crates.

88. All crates containing cheese shall be marked by the manufacturer of such cheese on both ends of the crate, in prominent and legible characters, with the following information and in the manner indicated by the illustration hereunder:—

- (1) The word "coloured" stamped in red ink or the word "white" stamped in violet ink, as the case may be, applied by means of a rubber stamp in letters three-quarters of an inch high and three-thirty-seconds of an inch thick.
- (2) A true description of the variety of the cheese.
- (3) Figures seven-eighths of an inch high and one-eighth of an inch thick stamped in violet ink above the trade description by means of a rubber stamp, indicating in one line the number of the vat and the date of manufacture, and immediately below that line the number of crates from the vat.
- (4) Figures indicating the number of the crate applied to the ends of the crate below the word "coloured" or "white" as the case may be.

#### Packing of Cheese for Distribution and Sale.

89. (1) Only cheeses of the same quality and manufactured on the same date and from the same batch shall be packed together in the same crate by the manufacturer packing the same:

Provided that, where it is unavoidable, odd cheeses may be packed together in the same crate, but in such instances markings shall be placed on the side of the crate clearly indicating the contents of the crate and the position in the crate of each different make of cheese.

(2) Every crate used by a manufacturer for containing cheese shall be provided with scale boards of pine or other material approved by an inspector, to prevent the cheese from adhering to the ends or centre boards of the crate.

(3) (a) Cheeses intended for interstate markets shall be graded and packed at the factory before being despatched.

(b) Cheeses intended for local sale may be despatched from the factory without being packed, provided they are placed on shelves or placed singly on the floor of the conveyance in which they are carried from the factory.

#### Control of Whey.

90. (a) No person shall remove whey from a cheese factory unless the whey shall first have been subjected to a temperature of 180 degrees Fahrenheit in a manner approved by the Inspector.

(b) Where a person removes whey from a cheese factory in any receptacle used or capable of being used for the purpose of containing milk or cream, he shall immediately on arriving at his destination remove the whey from the receptacle and wash the receptacle with warm water and finally thoroughly cleanse the receptacle with steam or boiling water.

- (c) The manager of a cheese factory shall—
- (i) keep at the cheese factory a book in which he shall enter or cause to be entered a record of the treatment to which whey produced in the factory has been subjected, including details of the temperature to which it has been heated and details of the names and addresses of the persons to whom it has been distributed;
  - (ii) when requested to do so by an Inspector, produce the book for his inspection.

Containers and Markings.

91. (1) No person shall use any package as a container of any dairy produce unless the package is clean and suitable for the purpose.
- (2) All markings used or placed upon any package so used shall be neat and plain and of a reasonably permanent nature.

Dairy Produce Improvement Fund.

92. (1) The contributions payable to the Dairy Produce Improvement Fund by the manager of each and every dairy produce factory, in accordance with section 24B shall be paid monthly to the Director of Agriculture not later than the 14th day of the month next following the month in respect of which the contributions are payable.
- (2) As and when, in accordance with the provisions of the last preceding sub-regulation, contributions are paid to the Director of Agriculture, the manager paying the contributions shall furnish to the Director of Agriculture, in writing signed by him, a return in the Form 28, setting out the quantity and value of the milk or cream paid for during the month in respect of which the contributions are paid.
- (3) Where deferred payments or bonuses in respect of milk or cream supplied to a dairy produce factory are paid at the end of any trading period, the contributions payable by the manager of such dairy produce factory shall be deducted by the manager from the amount of the deferred payments or bonuses before the deferred payments or bonuses are made available to the suppliers.
- (4) When payment of contributions to the Dairy Produce Improvement Fund are paid by cheque, the cheque shall be made payable to the "Dairy Produce Improvement Fund" and shall be crossed.
- (5) The rate of contributions payable by managers of dairy produce factories to the Dairy Produce Improvement Fund shall be at the rate from time to time declared by the Governor in accordance with the provisions of section 24B and notified in the *Government Gazette*.

Duties and Powers of Special Dairy Instructors.

93. Special Dairy Instructors appointed as such under section 24C shall have and may exercise the same powers and carry out and perform the same duties as are conferred or imposed upon the Inspectors appointed under and generally for the purposes of this Act.

Penalty for Breach of Regulations.

94. Any person who commits a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, or, when the breach is a continuing one, not exceeding two pounds for every day during which such breach continues.
