WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a period of three years as from date of gazettal of this Proclamation.

#### Schedule.

- (a) Wellstead Estuary.—The whole of the rivers, tributaries, creeks and other streams flowing into the waters of the Wellstead Estuary, more especially the S.W. Bay River and Lizzie Creek.
- (b) Beaufort Estuary.—The whole of the rivers, tributaries, and other streams flowing into the waters of the Beaufort Estuary, more especially the Pallinup and Salt Rivers.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 6 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1949, that the Governor may revoke or vary any proclamation made under the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation—

1. Revoke the Proclamation dated the 3rd day of August, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1927, relating—

  (i) to the bringing in of all kinds of fruit from any portion of the State to a part of the State as specified in the said Proclamation; and

By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by sections 5 and 6 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1949, that the Governor may revoke or vary any proclamation made under the said Act and may by proclamation prohibit either absolutely or except in accordance with resulation the bringing into any specified portion of the State of Western Australia from the rest of the State generally or from any specified portion thereof any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would, in his opinion, be likely to introduce any disease into the State or into the specified portion thereof, as the case may be; and appoint any specified ports to be the only ports of entry for plants or fruit or for any specified kind of plants or fruit; and whereas I the Governor and the Executive Council of the State are of opinion that the bringing (contrary to any prohibition hereinafter contained) of potatoes into any portion of the State wherein their introduction is hereinafter prohibited would be likely to introduce the diseases set out in Part I of the schedule hereto: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do revoke the proclamation dated the 29th day of October, 1924, and published in the Government Gazette on the 7th day of November, 1924, relating to the bringing in from any portion of the said State to a part of the said State as specified in the said proclamation of any plant, fruit or thing which would be likely to introduce disease, and do by this proclamation appoint the ports of Eucla, Esperance, Fremantle, Geraldton, Carnarvon, Onslow, Cossack, Port Hedland, Broome, Derby and Wyndham to be the only ports of entry for the bringing of potatoes into Western Australia; And I do, by this proclamation, prohibit the bringing of potatoes into that portion of the state described in the schedule hereto, from the rest of the State generally.

Bacillus Solanacearum (Brown Rot or Potato Bacteriosis).

*Chrysophlyetis endobiotica* (known as Potato Canker).

*Synchytrium endobioticum*—Black Scab (Warty Disease and Cauliflower Disease of Potato).

Fusarium spp. (Collar Rot, Foot Rot, Leaf Spot, Dry Rot of Potato).

Actinomyces scabies—causing Common Scab and Spongospora subterranea causing Powdery Scab of Potatoes.

Phytophthora Infestans (Potato Disease, otherwise known as Irish Blight).

Heterodera Marioni and Heterodera schactii causing Eelworm of potatoes.

Pthorimaea Operculella (Potato Moth).

*Leptinotarsa decem-lineata* (Colorado potato Beetle).

Road Districts Act, 1919-1948. Northam Road District. Re-Division into Wards and Determination of Number of Members. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, doth hereby: (i) Re-divide the Northam Road District into wards by excising from the South Ward the whole of the Wundowie townsite (Avon Location 27073 as shown on Lands and Surveys Diagram 60457, Plan 2A/40 and A1, as specified in the *Government* Gazette of the 14th February, 1947) and constitute the area excised a separate ward to be known as the Wundowie Ward.

South Ward. All that portion of the Municipality of Fremantle bounded by lines starting at a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean situate at the intersection of that Municipal boundary and the prolongation Westerly of the centre line of South Street and extending generally Easterly to and along that line to the Easternmost boundary of that Municipality and thence Southerly, generally Westerly and generally Northerly along that boundary to the starting point.

#### Central Ward.

All that portion of the Municipality of Fre-mantle bounded by lines starting at a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, situate at the intersection of that Municipal boundary and the prolongation South-Westerly of the centre line of Howard Street and extending generally North-Eeastrly to and along that line to the centre North-Eeastrly to and along that line to the centre line of South Terrace; thence North-Westerly along that line to its intersection with the pro-longation South-Westerly of the centre line of Alma Street; thence North-Easterly to the South-Westernmost corner of Fothergill Street; thence Northerly along its Westernmost side to a point in prolongation Westerly of the centre line of that street; thence Easterly to and along that centre line and onwards along the centre line of Broome Street and again onwards through reserve Broome Street and again onwards through reserve 6638 to the centre line of Carrington Street; thence Northerly along that line to a point in prolonga-tion Westerly of the Northern side of Sainsbury Road; thence Easterly along that prolongation to the Municipal boundary; thence generally Easterly and Southerly along that boundary to the North-Easternmost corner of the South Ward; thence Westerly along the Northernmost boundaries of that Ward to the Westernmost boundary of the Municipality and thence generally Northerly along that boundary to the starting point.

#### North Ward.

All that portion of the Municipality of Fremantle bounded by lines starting at a point on that Municipal boundary situate at its intersection with the prolongation North-Westerly of the centre line of Edward Street and extending generally North-Easterly, Southerly, Easterly again Southerly along boundaries of that Municipality to the Northern boundary of the Central Ward; thence generally Westerly along boundaries of that Ward to the Western side of Fothergill Street; thence Northerly along that side to its intersection with the Southern side of Fairburn Street; thence Northerly to the intersection of the prolongation Southerly of the centre line of Parry Street and the Southern side of Holdsworth Street; thence North-Westerly to and along the lastnamed centre line and onwards along the centre line of Edward Street and again onwards to the starting point.

#### City Ward.

All that portion of the Municipality of Fremantle bounded by lines starting at a point on that Municipal boundary situate at its intersection with the prolongation South-Westerly of the centre line of Howard Street, a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and extending generally North-Westerly and North-Easterly along that boundary to the Westernmost corner of the North Ward; thence generally South-Easterly along the South-Western boundaries of that Ward to a North-Western corner of the Central Ward and thence South-Westerly along the North-Western boundaries of that Ward to the starting point.

#### UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT, 1911-1947.

Amendments to Statutes.

Premier's Department, Perth, 6th June, 1951.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased under section 33 of the University of Western Australia Act, 1911-1947, to approve of Amending Statute No. 1 of 1951 (Amending Statute No. 11) and Amending Statute No. 2 of 1951 (Amending Statute No. 8) as passed by the Senate and the Convocation of the University, copies of which are shown hereunder.

#### Amending Statute No. 2 of 1951. 9th April, 1951.

Amendment to Statute No. 8-The Faculties.

Section 1 is amended to read:----

1. In this Statute unless the context otherwise requires:—

- "Faculty" shall mean any one or more of the Faculties mentioned in section 2.
- "Lecturer" shall include reader and senior lecturer and any person temporarily holding an appointment as reader, senior lecturer or lecturer, but shall not include a part-time or visiting lecturer.

Section 2, subsection (1) is amended to read as follows:—

2. (1) There shall be Faculties of and degrees shall be granted after examination in Arts, Law, Education, Science, Engineering, Agriculture and Dental Science and such other Faculties as the Senate may from time to time establish.

Section 4, subsection (1) is amended to read as follows:—

4. (1) Each Faculty shall each year nominate one of its members being a professor, or if no professor is available, a lecturer for appointment by the Senate as its Dean. Section 6 is amended to read as follows:----

- 6. (1) Meetings of each Faculty shall be held—
  (a) as often and at such times and places as the Dean may think fit;
  - (b) within seven days of the service on the Dean, Registrar, or Assistant Registrar of a requisition signed by at least three members of the Faculty and containing a statement of the matters to be discussed.

(2) The Registrar or Assistant Registrar shall act as Secretary to each Faculty and shall give to all members at least three days' written notice of all meetings thereof.

New section 10 is inserted to read as follows:----

10. The Faculty of Education shall consist of the Professors and Lecturers in Education, the Dean of the Faculty of Arts, the Dean of the Faculty of Science, the Professor of English and one Lecturer in English nominated annually by the Professor of English, the Head of the Department of Psychology and one Lecturer in Psychology, nominated annually by the Head of the Department of Psychology, the Principal of the Teachers' College and a member of the Teachers' College staff nominated annually by the Principal of the Teachers' College, and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the foregoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

Section 15, subsection (1) is amended to read as follows:—

15. (1) There shall be Advisory Boards in Law, Education, Engineering, Agriculture and Dental Science constituted as follows:—

- (a) The Advisory Board in Law shall consist . . . . (unaltered).
- (b) The Advisory Board in Education shall consist of the Dean and members of the Faculty of Education, the Director of Education, the Director of the Roman Catholic Education and a nominee of the Roman Catholic Colleges, the Superintendents of Primary, Secondary and Technical Education, a member of the Teachers' College Advisory Board nominated by the Advisory Board, two members of the Teachers' Union nominated by the Union, one member of the Headmasters' Association nominated by that Association, and the Principal of the Headmistresses' Association nominated by that Association, and the Principal of the Kindergarten Training College and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Senate on the nomination of the Froegoing and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.
- (c) The Advisory Board in Engineering shall consist of ......(present paragraph (b)).
- (d) The Advisory Board in Agriculture shall consist of ..... (present paragraph (c)).
- (e) The Advisory Board in Dental Science shall consist of .....(present paragraph (d)).

Renumbering of present sections 10 to 16.

Sections 10 to 16 are renumbered 11 to 17 respectively.

#### Amending Statute No. 1 of 1951.

Amendment to Statute No. 11—Academic Dress.

Section 2 is amended to read as follows:----

2. The academic dress shall be for—

Undergraduates—A plain black stuff gown of a pattern approved by the Professorial Board, with a band of watered silk half an inch wide of the colour appropriate to their Faculty placed horizontally on the breast of the gown at each side. Black cloth trencher cap.

Scholars—Same as for other undergraduates, with the addition of a black velvet bar on the right shoulder of the gown. Bachelors—Black stuff or silk gown similar in shape to the gown worn by Bachelors of Arts of the University of Oxford. Black silk hood similar in shape to the hood worn by Bachelors of Arts of the University of Oxford, lined with watered silk of the colour appropriate to the Faculty and edged with white fur. Black cloth trencher cap.

Masters—Same as for Bachelors, but the hood without the white fur edging.

Doctors of Philosophy—Gown of black stuff or silk as for Bachelors with facings 5in. wide of watered scarlet silk. Hood of black silk lined with watered scarlet silk. Black velvet trencher cap.

Doctors (other than of Philosophy)—Scarlet stuff or silk gown with facings of watered silk of the colour appropriate to the Faculty. Hood of scarlet cloth lined with watered silk of the colour appropriate to the Faculty. Black velvet trencher cap.

Hoods—The following are the colours of the watered silk linings of the hoods for Degrees in the several Faculties:—

Arts—Royal Blue. Law—Royal Purple. Education—Light Blue. Science—Emerald Green. Engineering—Gold. Agriculture—Bronze. Dental Science—Silver Grey. Medicine—Ruby Red. Surgery—Ruby Red. Music—Peacock Blue.

The patterns shall be in accordance with specimens approved by the Professorial Board, and the colours shall accord with specimens attached to a document preserved with the University records, and bearing the seal of the University.

The Common Seal of the University of Western Australia has been affixed in pursuance of an order of the Senate by the undersigned being legally entitled to the custody thereof as the Chancellor of the said body Corporate.

First Assignment.—Know ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in our said State and its Dependencies, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people, in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of the call be appointed and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said State and its Dependencies, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves, as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and dis-charge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply your-selves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises. In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Common-wealth of Australia, at Perth, this 1st day of June, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

First Assignment.-Know ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our First Assignment.—Know ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia in the Magisterial Districts herein-before indicated, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in the said Districts, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people, in the said Districts according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said Districts, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within the said Districts who use threats to any of Our people, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our people: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in the said Districts: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the person charged until they are taken or surrender themselves, as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and dis-charge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply your-selves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, at Perth, this 1st day of June, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

# Licensing Officers.

1A. Every license required under and for the purposes of the provi-sions of this Act may be issued only by a licensing officer. The following persons are, for the purposes of the Act, appointed licensing officers-

- (a) the Chief Inspector of Fisheries
- (b) any Inspector of Fisheries, other than one whose appointment designates him an honorary inspector.

(a) 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.
(b) 7 o'clock p.m. to 2 o'clock a.m.

6. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building or furniture and refund any fees paid.

9. The Board may, at its discretion, on applica-tion, remit the charges for the hire of any build-ing or furniture, either partially or wholly, as it thinks fit, or grant the free use of any building or furniture.

10. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or furni-ture for the same date and hour the Board may, without considering priority of application, deter-mine to which applicant the hire of such building

or furniture shall be granted. 11. The hirer of any building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being, applicable to such hirings and use of any buildings. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under the last pre-ceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such buildings as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

No spirituous or fermented liquors shall be 13 brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement except when permitted by the Board in writing.

14 No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor light or otherwise ignite any light in any building during any ball, or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons, in the said building, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social.

- (e) large bulbs and roots, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (f)<sup>s</sup> small bulbs—
  - (a) for each thousand or part of a thousand up to two thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
  - (b) for every thousand or part of a thousand in excess of two thousand, in one consignment—3d.;
- (g) strawberries and small plants, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (h) apple seedlings and stocks, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (i) pear seedlings and stocks, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (j) peach seedlings and stocks, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (k) plum seedlings and stocks, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (1) orange seedlings and stocks, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (m) vine cuttings, for every thousand or part of a thousand in one consignment—1s.;
- (n) cuttings of any plants other than those enumerated above, for every thousand or part of a thousand, in one consignment—1s.;
- (o) other plants, other than those enumerated above, for every hundred or part of a hundred, in one consignment—1s. 6d.;
- (p) tobacco—for every ounce or part of an ounce of the seeds of the tobacco plant—1s.;
- (q) peach, apricot and similar stones for propagation—6d. per bag;
- (r) banana and pineapple suckers—6d. per bag;
- (s) grass roots—6d. per bag.

Provided that a minimum inspection fee of one shilling shall be payable for each and every inspection under each and every paragraph above, except paragraph (o), and that a minimum inspection fee of one shilling and sixpence shall be payable under paragraph (o).

2. A new regulation numbered 9A is inserted as follows:----

9A. Except where otherwise provided the following fees shall be charged for—

 fumigation—where H.C.N. gas and carbon bisulphide is used 10s. for each fumigation;

(2) steaming-10s. for each and every steaming.

3. The regulation contained in a notice dated the 20th day of March, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of March, 1935 (page 716), relating to a fee payable by the owner or person in charge of any fruit, is cancelled.

4. Delete the words "Under Secretary for Agriculture" wherever they appear in the regulations and substitute in lieu thereof the words "Director of Agriculture."
