(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Administrator of the State of Western Australia, do hereby

prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedules A, B, C and D hereto, for the term of 12 months from 29/7/51.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of the section aforesaid, I prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters described in Schedule E hereto, during the periods commencing at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of Friday in each week and ending at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the Monday next following for the term of 12 months from 29/7/51.

(3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Act aforesaid, I prohibit (a) the taking of all species of fish by means of nets, known as "pilchard nets" and "whiting nets," as defined in paragraphs (c) and (d), respectively, of the Proclamation dated 24th October, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated 1st November, 1940, in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedule F hereto, from 1st October, 1951, to 31st March, 1952, both inclusive.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet (including its tributaries) upwards from the Railway Bridge at Point McLeod to a line drawn due North from a point marked by a post in Point Mornington, to a point marked by a post on the Western shore of Leschenault Inlet.

The whole of the waters of that part of Koom-bana Bay lying within a radius of $\frac{1}{4}$ mile of the Groyne adjacent to the channel connecting Leschenault Inlet with the Indian Ocean.

Schedule E.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from a point marked by a post in Point Mornington to a point marked by a post on the Western shore of Leschenault Inlet.

Schedule F.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from a point marked by a post in Point Mornington to a point marked by a post on the Western shore of Leschenault Inlet.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949 (as reprinted in February, 1949), that it shall be obligatory for every employer or group of employers to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him or them, but that if an employer or group of employers proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer or group of employers has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer or group of employers from the operation of this section; and whereas Bunning Bros. Pty. Ltd., Perth Jarrah Mills Pty. Ltd., Nyamup Sawmills Pty. Ltd., and Donnelly Sawmills Pty. (2) Time Limits for Parking of Vehicles.—No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand or remain, (a) on the Eastern side of York Street for a longer period than 30 minutes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.; (b) on the Northern side of Stirling Terrace between York Street and Spencer Street for a longer period than 30 minutes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.; (c) in front of the Post Office in Stirling Terrace for a period longer than 15 minutes.

(3) Standing Places for Taxi-Cars and Motor Omnibuses.—Standing places for the purposes of hire or for picking up passengers at which taxi-cars or motor omnibuses may stand shall be as follows:—Six taxi-cars on the Northern side of Peel's Place at its Eastern junction with York Street; 4 taxi-cars on the Northern side of Grey Street at its Western junction with York Street; 2 motor omnibuses on the Northern side of Peel's Place at its Western junction with York Street; 1 omnibus on the Northern side of Grey Street at its Western junction with York Street; 2 motor omnibuses on the Northern side of Middleton Road at the Eastern end of the Esplanade Hotel Building.

(4) Standing Place for Taxi-cars at which Passengers may not be picked up.—For the purpose of a feeder rank at which passengers may not be picked up or taxi-cars hired, a standing place shall be as follows:—4 taxi-cars on the Northern side of Peel's Place at its Eastern junction with York Street.

(5) Gardens and Lawns.—No person shall ride, drive or park any cycle, vehicle or animal, or cause such cycle, vehicle or animal to be ridden, driven or parked on or over any garden or lawn planted and maintained by or with the permission of the Council.

(6) One-way Traffic Streets.—No person shall cause or permit any cycle vehicle or animal to be ridden or driven along any of the following streets or portions thereof save in the direction indicated hereunder:—(a) Cuthbert Street—from Vancouver Street to Duke Street in a Southerly direction; (b) Wylie Crescent—from its junction with Middleton Road to its junction with Cheyne Walk in a South-westerly direction; (c) Cheyne Walk—from Wylie Crescent to Middleton Road in a Northerly direction; (d) Peel's Place—between existing gardens and the Northern footpath in an Easterly direction.

(7) Horden Monument.—All vehicles entering Albany Highway from Middleton Road must keep to the left of the Horden Monument.

(8) Cross-Walks.—In all street intersections where cross-walks are delineated by painted lines drivers of vehicles shall yield the right-of-way to any person crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk but no person shall loiter or cause any undue delay at any crosswalk.

(9) Penalties.—If any person shall contravene any of the provisions of this by-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

Residential Flat Buildings.

By-law No. 4.

P.W. 286/38.

A by-law of the Municipality of Subiaco made under Section 338 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, and numbered 4 for Regulating the Construction of Residential Flat Buildings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Subiaco order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of Subiaco.

“Fire-resisting material” means—

- (1) brickwork constructed of good bricks, well burnt hard and sound, properly bonded and solidly put together with—
 - (a) good mortar composed of fresh burnt lime with sharp clean sand; or
 - (b) good neat cement; or
 - (c) good cement mixed with sharp clean sand.
- (2) Granite and other stone suitable for building purposes by means of its solidity and durability.
- (3) Iron, steel, and copper.
- (4) (a) In the case of doors—jarrah or other hard timber not less than 2 inches thick.
(b) In the case of internal stairs—jarrah, or other hard timber with treads, stringers, and risers not less than 2 inches thick.
- (5) Slate, tiles, brick, and terra cotta when used for covering corbels.
- (6) Flagstones when used for floors over arches but not exposed on the underside and not supported at the ends only.
- (7) Concrete comprised of broken stone, chip-pings, or ballast, and lime, cement, or calcined gypsum when used for filling in between joists or floors.
- (8) Any material from time to time approved by the Council as fire-resisting.

“Floor area” applied to a flat means the aggregate superficial areas of so many horizontal sections thereof as there are floors in the flat, the horizontal section of each floor being made at the point of its greatest surface dimensions exclusive of external walls, but including bathrooms, water-closets, pantries and storerooms.

“Habitable room” includes bedroom, dining room, sitting room and kitchen, but does not include bathroom, water-closet, pantry or store-room.

“Residential flat building” means a building containing 2 or more residential flats.

2. The by-law made by the Council on the 11th June, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th July, 1941, and all other by-laws made by the Council relating to the construction of residential flat buildings are hereby repealed,

3. No residential flat building shall be erected unless the land on which it is erected—

- (a) is of a minimum area of 6,000 square feet, and
- (b) has a minimum frontage to a street of 50 feet, and
- (c) has a minimum depth, measured at right angles from the street on to which it fronts, of 120 feet, and
- (d) is the whole of a subdivisinal lot shown on a plan or diagram registered in the Land Titles Office.

4. A residential flat building shall not exceed 2 floors in height.

5. The floor area of a residential flat building shall not exceed one $\frac{1}{2}$ of the area of the parcel of land on which it is built.

6. In every residential flat building each flat—

- (a) shall have all its rooms on the same floor;
- (b) shall have a floor area of at least 500 square feet and in addition shall have attached open verandah space of at least 100 square feet for the exclusive use of such flat;
- (c) shall have habitable rooms with an average area of 120 square feet, no habitable room having an area of less than 100 square feet;
- (d) shall contain a separate kitchen, a separate bathroom and a separate water-closet, provided that the water-closet may be included in the bathroom;
- (e) shall have a separate entrance.

7. (1) Every external stairway leading to a flat above the ground floor shall be of brick, stone, or concrete, and of fire-resisting material and shall be not less than 4 feet in width.

(2) Every internal stairway leading to a flat above the ground floor shall be of fire-resisting material and shall be not less than 4 feet in width.

8. The principal entrance to every flat shall lead off a main hallway, driveway or court of access.

9. All kitchens, bathrooms, water-closets and and laundries in a residential flat building shall be constructed and equipped in accordance with the Health Act, 1911-1950, and its amendments and all by-laws and regulations made thereunder.

10. No part of a residential flat building shall be erected within 15 feet of the street on which it fronts.

11. No garage or other outbuilding appurtenant to a residential flat building shall be erected closer to the street on which the residential flat building fronts than such residential flat building.

12. No dividing fence shall be erected in front of a residential flat building so as to subdivide the frontage of the parcel of land on which such building is erected.

13. If a residential flat building consists of 2 floors the dividing floor shall be of fire-resisting material throughout.

14. Dividing walls between separate flats in a residential flat building shall be not less than 9 inches in thickness and of fire-resisting material and shall extend from the footings thereof to top plate level.

15. No basement shall be designed or adapted for occupation as a flat.

16. In a flat containing more than 1 bedroom each bedroom shall be separately accessible, and a bathroom and a water-closet shall be accessible without passing through a bedroom.

17. A common hall or passage serving 2 or more flats shall be not less than 4 feet in width.

18. No building shall be converted into a residential flat building unless when so converted it will comply with all the provisions of this by-law.

19. Except as in this by-law otherwise expressly provided every residential flat building shall comply with the building by-laws of the Council.

1. In this by-law:—

“Caravan” includes any vehicle designed or fitted as a habitation for any person or capable of being used for dwelling or sleeping purposes.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of Cottesloe.

“District” means the Municipal District of Cottesloe.

“License” means a written license issued under the authority of the Council by the Town Clerk or Acting Town Clerk of the Council.

“To park” includes to allow to remain stationary.

2. No person shall park any caravan in any street within the district for a period exceeding 1 hour.

3. No person shall, without a license, park any caravan on any public reserve or other land vested in or under the control of the Council for a period exceeding 1 hour.

4. No occupier of land within the district shall, without a license, permit or suffer a caravan to be parked on such land between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

5. No person shall, without a license, park a caravan and no person in charge of a caravan shall, without a license, permit or suffer such caravan to be parked on private land within the district between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

6. A license under this by-law may be issued for such period and subject to such conditions as the Council shall in each case decide.

7. (1) An application for a license shall be in the form No. 1 in the schedule hereto.

(2) A license shall be in form No. 2 in the schedule hereto.

8. Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 and in the event of a successive similar offence to a minimum penalty of £5.

THE Wagin Road Board under and by virtue of

 powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish
 the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the
 following words shall have the meanings assigned
 them hereunder.

(a) "Board" means the Wagin Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the
 employment of this Board during which the em-
 ployee has not been absent from the service of
 the Board for a continuous period of more than
 2 days or an aggregate period of more than 10
 days without leave of absence being granted by
 the Board.

2. Absence on account of sickness shall not be
 deemed to be a break in continuity of service, pro-
 vided the period of absence shall not exceed 3
 months in any year, unless otherwise decided by
 the Board.

3. Employees of the Board shall upon comple-
 tion of 10 years' continuous service as regular
 full-time employees thereof, commencing from the
 1st day of January, 1941, be entitled to 3 months'
 (13 weeks) long service leave. Long service leave
 shall be taken at the convenience of the Board,
 who shall as far as possible, meet with the wishes
 of the employee, upon such employee advising the

Board at least 3 months in advance of a date upon which he desires that leave be granted, but the Board may require any employee to take leave as from any definite date by giving not less than three months' notice to the employee.

4. Each employee granted long service leave shall be paid:—

(a) His wages or salary for the period of long service leave at the rate equivalent to his average weekly rate of pay over the preceding 12 months.

(b) The Board may at its discretion either—

(1) pay the employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave or;

(2) pay the employee in advance the sum representing the amount of wages or salary for the period of long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service as above. After completion of the first 10 years' service as from 1st January, 1941, any employees leaving the services of the Board before the completion of a further 10 years' period of service will then be entitled to a *pro rata* leave payment at the rate of one and three tenths ($1\frac{3}{10}$) weeks wages or salary for each year of service over and above the 10 years' qualifying period.

6. In the event of resignation, retirement, or death of an employee after the completion of the long service qualifying period of service, the full amount of long service leave payments accrued to the date of termination of service shall be payable to the employee, or in the case of death to dependants of the deceased employee.

7. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of these by-laws.

8. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled, or shall become entitled to before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave.

9. Long service leave granted by this Board shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with the view to fitting the employee for a further term of service, and during long service leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for wages, hire or reward, unless by special permission granted in writing by this Board.

Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, cease long service leave payments, and take action for the recovery of amount paid in advance on account of long service leave.

THE York Road Board under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the York Road Board.

(b) "Continuous Service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than 2 days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.

2. All employees of the Board shall after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full time employees thereof commencing from 30th day of June, 1946, be entitled to 3 months' long service leave. Long service leave is to be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take his leave by giving not less than 3 months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in the continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not be longer than 3 months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Board may at its discretion either—

(i) pay to an employee his salary or wages periodically during long service leave, or

(ii) pay to the employee in advance the sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service. After the completion of the first 10 years, employees will be entitled to a *pro rata* payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. In the event of resignation, retirement or death of an employee the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative, or if there be none to his dependant) a sum of money equal to his salary or wages for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement or death, or if the Board after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of salary or wages which would under this by-law have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

7. An employee dismissed by the Board except in the matter of retrenchment shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

8. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.
