Port Hedland Water Area.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 274/51.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1949, and the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the district of a local authority, or 2 or more local authorities, or any part or parts of such district or districts, a Water Area, under such name as may be directed; and whereas,

under the provisions of the said Acts, the Administrator may authorise the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to exercise within a water area all the functions of a water board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute an area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereunder, a Water Area for the purpose of the said Acts, under the name of the Port Hedland Water Area, and doth hereby appoint the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to exercise all the functions of a water board under the Acts in such area.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the prolongation South-Westerly of the South-Eastern boundary of reserve 15232 and the high water mark of Port Hedland and extending generally Northerly (including the jetties) and generally Easterly along the high water mark of Port Hedland and the Indian Ocean to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Eastern boundary of the Northern portion of reserve 21504; thence Southerly to and along that side and onwards to the Northern boundary of Port Hedland Town Lot 262; thence Easterly, Southerly, Westerly, again Southerly and again Westerly along boundaries of town lots 262, 263, 253, 252 and the Southern portion of reserve 21504 to the latter's South-Western corner; thence Westerly to the South-Eastern corner of reserve 15232, and thence South-Westerly along the South-Eastern boundary of that reserve and onwards to the starting point.

2. Also, all that portion of land, being a strip of land one chain wide, the centre of which is a pipe line, starting at a point on an Eastern boundary of the above described area and 51 links Southerly of the South-Eastern corner of the Northern portion of reserve 21504 and extending 102 deg. 2 min. 28 chains 70 links; thence 103 deg. 32 min. 75 chains; thence 107 deg. 27 min. 6 chains; thence 110 deg. 23 min. 57 chains; thence 126 deg. 42 min. 54 chains; thence 138 deg. 40 min. 30 chains; thence 147 deg. 36 min. 3 chains; thence 167 deg. 44 min. 38 chains; thence 208 deg. 52 min. 16 chains; thence 204 deg. 1 min. 52 chains; thence 172 deg. 42 min. 8 chains; thence 178 deg. 40 min. 1 mile 5 chains; thence 230 deg. 0 min. 8 miles 47 chains; thence 220 deg. 30 min. 2 miles 33 chains; thence 230 deg. 56 min. 68 chains 50 links; thence by a strip of land 2 chains wide, 230 deg. 56 min. 2 chains 50 links to the centre of a 150,000 gallon reinforced concrete summit tank; thence, by a strip of land 2 chains wide, 264 deg. 22 min. 2 chains 50 links; thence, by a strip of land one chain wide, 264 deg. 22 min. 1 mile 68 chains 86 links; thence 236 deg. 53 min. 4 chains 1 link, and thence, by a strip of land 5 chains wide, 276 deg. 53 min. 40 chains across the river bed, as shown in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 32877.

## CEMETERIES ACT, 1897-1946.

## Coolgardie Cemetery Board By-laws.

Department of Lands and Surveys,  
Perth, 20th August, 1951.

HIS Excellency the Administrator, the officer for the time being administering the government of the State, in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1946, has been pleased to approve of the repeal of the by-laws

for the control and management of the Coolgardie Public Cemetery and of the substitution therefor of the following by-laws.

#### Schedule.

##### Coolgardie Cemetery Board—By-laws.

By virtue of all the powers in that behalf vested in the trustees of the Coolgardie Cemetery Board, which shall be appointed by the Coolgardie Road Board, annually, the said trustees hereby repeal all by-laws heretofore made in respect of the said cemetery and make the following by-laws in lieu thereof:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees as set forth in Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. The "Secretary," as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed as Secretary of the Coolgardie Road Board, who shall act also as Secretary of the Coolgardie Cemetery Board, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

3. A plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a register of burials, shall be kept at the office of the Road Board.

4. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B.

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Board in such time as to allow at least 8 working hours' notice being given to the Secretary at the office prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

6. The trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. Any coffin not complying with this by-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the cemetery.

8. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground, but in the case of the Australian and American War Cemeteries, every grave shall be at least 5ft. deep, and one interment shall take place in each grave.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Death that the death has been registered, or a coroner's order for burial is handed to the Secretary, at the latest upon the day of the burial. Should the undertaker or his representatives be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within 3 days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within 3 days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. Such certificate will be retained by the Secretary, but any coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday, except when it is certified in writing by a medical officer of health that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4.15 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. And no burials shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin enter the cemetery at any other hour, except by permission of the trustees. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates.

13. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Vehicles shall not be allowed to proceed faster than 10 miles per hour within the cemetery. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the cemetery.

14. If applications be made to the trustees to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or his family, an order from the Governor or the warrant of a coroner, or of a Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Board to permit of the exhumation must be attached to the application form.

15. Children under the age of 10 years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

16. Smoking shall not be allowed within the cemetery, nor may any fireworks be discharged therein.

17. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

18. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws, shall be expelled from the cemetery.

19. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the trustees or their representatives.

20. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery, any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertising whatsoever, without the written consent of the trustees, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the cemetery.

21. No person employed by or under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

22. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave. If it is proposed to inter therein the remains of any already deceased person, the name of such person must be shown in the application. If the application is approved by the trustees, a Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial shall be issued.

23. Every such Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the grant aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the consent of the trustees.

24. If application be made for an "interment" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the Grant of Right of Burial.

25. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial on making application for a grave to be re-opened, for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial before the interment takes place.

26. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the trustees.

27. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

28. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the trustees, and any materials rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

30. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the trustees the sum of 10s. which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the 2 preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

31. All material required in the erection and completion of any such work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at the main entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

32. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the cemetery during other than the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, Saturday and Sunday excepted, when no work is to be done from noon Saturday to the opening of gates on the Monday morning, without the written permission of the trustees.

33. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

34. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee.

35. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Secretary.

36. All workmen, whether employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removeable from the cemetery.

37. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Secretary.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due dispatch, and only during regulation hours.

38. Prior to conducting any interment within the cemetery or making use of the cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the trustees an annual fee as prescribed in Schedule A, and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a permit, to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the pos-

session of such a permit, no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the cemetery.

39. The trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the trustees for that purpose.

40. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the trustees, or those licensed by the trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

41. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the trustees find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from off the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the trustees the charges laid down in Schedule A.

42. Notwithstanding anything contained in the by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

43. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the trustees—

(a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received on active service;

(b) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances:

Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the conditions that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

44. Any persons committing any breach of any by-laws or regulation, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

45. Any person committing a breach of any by-law shall in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-law, be liable to be forthwith removed from the cemetery by the trustees or the Secretary or other employees of the trustees or by any police constable. If such person resists removal from the cemetery, or if and as often as such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the Secretary, again enter the cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Coolgardie Cemetery Board Trustees held at the Coolgardie Road Board Office on the 12th day of February, 1951, and adopted.

Municipality of Guildford.

By-law No. 21.

P.W. 128/29.

A By-law of the Municipality of Guildford made under section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, and numbered twenty-one for regulating Long Service Leave.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Guildford order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this by-law the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

“Council” means the Guildford Municipal Council.

“Continuous service” means service in the employment of this Council during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Council for a continuous period of more than 2 days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Council, provided that an employee who was employed by the Council on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Council, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All present and future employees of the Council, shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of July, 1941, be entitled to 3 months' long service leave. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Council, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Council may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than 3 months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed 3 months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Council.

3. (a) The Council may grant long service leave to an employee of the Council who has been granted long service leave for 10 years' continuous service if, before a further 10 years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the Council's service owing to having reached the retiring age, or because of permanent inability to carry on his employment, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted *pro rata*.

(b) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding  $1\frac{3}{10}$ ths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

4. In the event of the resignation, retirement, or death of an employee, the Council may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none to his dependants), a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Council was empowered under this by-law to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Council, after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Council may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Council.

5. An employee dismissed by the Council, except in the matter of retrenchment shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding paragraph.

6. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Council may, at its discretion, either (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (ii) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

7. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

8. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Council. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Council to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

By-laws—Long Service Leave.

P.W. 1272/37.

THE Manjimup Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Manjimup Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than 2 days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.

2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing 30th June, 1941, be entitled to 3 months' long service leave. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, which shall, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than 3 months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break of continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed 3 months in any one year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average weekly rate of pay over the preceding 12 months; (b) the Board at its discretion, either (1) pay an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service. After completion of the first 10 years' service, employees shall be entitled to a *pro rata* payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

6. In the event of the resignation, retirement or death of an employee the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement or death or if the Board after consideration of all circumstances direct that the death of an employee be presumed the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which under this by-law would have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

7. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention to this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Between the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearoom and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, S. Ramage and other Employers as per Schedule attached, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

## Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

## 1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Restaurant and Tearoom Employees (South-West Land Division) Award" and replaces Industrial Agreement No. 17 of 1935 (as amended).

## 3.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the areas comprised within a five (5) mile radius of the post offices situated at Geraldton, Northam, Collie, Katanning, Albany, Manjimup and York in the State of Western Australia.

## 4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## 5.—Definitions.

(a) "Junior worker" for the purpose of this Award means a worker under eighteen (18) years of age who is in receipt of less than the adult rate of pay.

(b) "Adult worker" for the purpose of this Award means a worker who is eighteen (18) years of age or more, or who is in receipt of the adult rate of pay.

(c) "Restaurant" means an establishment where no restriction is placed on the nature of the food cooked or served.

(d) "Tea room" means any eating house where the only foods served for consumption on the premises are tea, coffee, and similar beverages, sandwiches, pies, pasties and such prepared foods as are usually supplied by wholesale pastrycooks, toast, cakes, biscuits, pastries, cold salad, cold meat, and prepared beef tea and other extract or soups which are supplied by the manufacturer in tins or bottles ready for consumption but where no food is cooked on the premises.

(e) "Night shift" shall mean a shift where the worker finishes for the day after eight (8) p.m.

## 6.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) per week.

(b) If any worker is at liberty to leave the premises of the employer for any time not less than half an hour but elects to remain thereon, such time shall not be included in the working time.

## 7.—Spread of Shifts.

(a) "Daily spread of shift" shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's actual starting time to the worker's actual finishing time for the day or shift.

(b) "Weekly spread of shifts" shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.

(c) Subject to clause 11, the daily spread of shift shall not exceed eleven (11) hours.

(d) Subject to clause 11, the weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty (60) hours.

## 8.—Breaks in Shift.

In addition to two breaks for meals of not less than half hour each nor more than one hour each, which shall be taken between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. and between 5 p.m. and 8 p.m., one other break may be allowed in each shift.

(d) "Head cooks," appointed as such by the employer, shall be entitled to receive 5s. per week extra.

(e) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to the Court for a review of the female rates of wages herein prescribed.

## 10.—Junior Workers.

(a) Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one (1) junior to every one (1) adult worker employed.

(b) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply for a variation of this clause.

## 11.—Overtime.

(a) All work done outside the daily spread provided in clause 5 or beyond forty (40) hours per week, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half: Provided that any overtime in excess of six (6) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

(i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;

(ii) no organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

## 12.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) In establishments which are open on seven (7) days a week, workers shall be entitled to receive one full day and one half day off duty in each week.

(b) In establishments which are open six (6) days a week, workers shall be entitled to receive one half day off duty in each week.

(c) The half day off shall, if taken in the morning, terminate not earlier than 2 p.m. and, if taken in the afternoon, shall commence not later than 2 p.m.

(d) A worker shall not be required to work more than four (4) hours on the day on which his half day off is taken.

(e) All work done on any day observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day or Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under this clause for each day or part of a day so worked: Provided that, if, by agreement between the employer and the worker or as a result of the worker's own default, only part of a day is worked by the worker on any such day,

an addition shall be made to such annual leave equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day.

(f) On any public holiday not referred to herein, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(g) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(h) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(i) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(j) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(k) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (i) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(l) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(m) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual or part-time workers.

#### 13.—Meals.

(a) In restaurants, meals shall be provided for workers in accordance with the menu in the particular establishment.

(b) In tea rooms, one meal shall be of reasonable variety, and shall include soup, joint or entree, two vegetables and sweets. If this meal be not provided there shall be a proportionate reduction in the allowance for board provided in clause 19.

(c) If any dispute arises as to the value or variety of the meals provided, or the proportionate reduction in the allowance for board, if not provided, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

#### 14.—Casual Workers.

(a) "Casual worker" means a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service who works less than fifteen (15) hours in any one week.

(b) Casual worker shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(c) The wages payable to a casual worker on an outside job shall be handed to the worker immediately on completion of the engagement.

#### 15.—Roster.

(a) A roster of the working hours of all workers other than casuals or part-time workers shall be exhibited in the office of each establishment and in such other place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned.

(b) Such roster shall show the name of each worker and denote the hours to be worked by each worker, and shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Union in the office, at such time and place as the Record Book is so open for inspection.

(c) Such roster shall be drawn up in such manner as to show the hours of each worker for one week in advance of the date of the roster, and may only be altered on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.

#### 16.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept on his business premises, or at each of them, if more than one, a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the name, occupation, and in the case of junior workers, the age on his or her last birthday, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, the total hours worked each week, and the wages paid to each worker.

(b) The record shall be entered up from day to day.

(c) The word "book" for the purpose of this clause, shall include loose leaves if bound together and numbered consecutively.

(d) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily entering of the record. The hours shown as worked in the record book shall be *prima facie* evidence of the correctness thereof in any proceedings for the enforcement of this Award.

(e) The book shall be open for inspection, at a convenient place, on the premises of the employer on days other than Saturday and Sunday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (except from 12 noon to 2 p.m.), except in the case of establishments which are open only after 5 p.m., when the book shall be open for inspection during all working hours.

#### 17.—Women Climbing Ladders.

No female worker shall be permitted or compelled to climb ladders for the purpose of cleaning electric fans, fanlights, walls or windows.

#### 18.—Payment of Wages and Contract of Service.

Wages shall be paid at least weekly. The contract of service shall be on a weekly basis: Provided that one day's notice of termination of service may be given on either side.

#### 19.—Board and Lodging.

(a) (i) No employer shall be compelled to board and/or lodge any worker, but where full board is provided the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of male workers each week a sum equal to twenty per cent. (20%) of the male basic wage.

If full board is provided the employer shall be entitled to deduct a sum equal to thirty-six per cent. (36%) of the female basic wage each week from the wages of female workers.

(ii) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply for a variation of this subclause.

(b) If full board is not provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker a sum proportionate to the amount of board provided.

(c) Full board shall mean three ordinary meals a day.

(d) If any dispute arises as to the value or amount of the board provided, it shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

#### 20.—Uniforms.

(a) Where employers require stiff white cuffs and collars or white aprons or coats or white uniforms to be worn by workers, they shall cause the laundering to be done free of charge to the workers.

(b) Only a plain uniform of black and white, or black, or white, colours shall be required of the worker.

(c) If the employer requires an alteration of the above colours in the uniform, he shall pay for the cost of the alteration.

(d) The employer may require plain white head bands to be worn.

## 21.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

## 22.—Higher Duties.

Any worker performing work for more than two (2) hours in any day in work carrying a higher prescribed rate of wages than that in which he is engaged shall receive such higher wage for the time so employed.

## 23.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker, other than a casual or part-time worker, shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

## 24.—Part-time Workers.

(a) "Part-time worker" means a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service who works fifteen (15) hours or more, but less than forty (40) hours, in any one week.

(b) A part-time worker shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.

(c) Part-time workers shall not be engaged for less than three (3) consecutive hours.

## 25.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (1) Name in full.
- (2) Age and date of birth.
- (3) Name of each previous employer.
- (4) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate, and, in such case, the employer shall not be guilty of a breach of this Award.

## 26.—Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference.

The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court, and two other representatives, one to be appointed by each of the parties.

The Board is hereby assigned the following functions, in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by the Award:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them.

(ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

The provisions of regulation 92 of the regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

## 27.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed in any of the occupations mentioned in clause 9 in Restaurants, Cafeterias and Tea Rooms.

I certify, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

## (a) Second Engineers—

(i) The rate for these workers shall be 26s. 6d. per week over and above the total rate prescribed in the appropriate award or industrial agreement for fitters employed by Government departments in the same locality as the employees referred to

in this Award are working, provided that the aforesaid rate shall be deemed to include shift work and dirty work allowance.

(ii) An allowance of one shilling (1s.) per shift shall be paid to the watchkeeping second engineers at Nos. 1 and 2 Pumping Stations when three engines are working.

(b) Engineers in Charge Pumping Stations—

(i) A margin of £340 per annum over and above the basic wage prescribed in this clause, plus an allowance of £120 per annum to cover all overtime and call-outs and other disabilities associated with the position.

(ii) At Station No. 1 the engineer in charge shall be paid £15 per annum extra. At Station No. 2 the engineer in charge shall be paid £5 per annum extra.

(c) Engineer in Charge of the Goldfields Water Supply Workshop at Cunderdin.

A margin of £320, plus an allowance of £50 per annum to cover all overtime worked: Provided he shall receive the same long service leave and annual leave conditions as those applying in the Second Engineers. Liberty is reserved to either party in regard to rates of pay to Engineers in Charge referred to in subclauses (b) and (c) of clause 1.

(d) Relieving Engineers in Charge—Senior Second Engineer.

(i) The Second Engineer appointed to carry out the work of relieving Engineers in Charge Pumping Stations when on holidays or sick leave or on other occasions, when instructed to do so by the Superintendent of Machinery or other officer acting in his stead shall be classed as Senior Second Engineer.

(ii) When relieving an Engineer in Charge, the Senior Second Engineer shall be paid the rate of the Engineer in Charge he is relieving. Overtime rates shall not apply.

(iii) The Senior Second Engineer shall be paid an additional margin of ten shillings (10s.) per week after he has completed an initial period of 13 weeks actual time as Acting Engineer in Charge. Provided that this additional margin shall not be paid when he is in receipt of the rate of pay of an Engineer in Charge.

(iv) The Senior Second Engineer for the time being shall not necessarily hold the right to automatic promotion when a position of Engineer in Charge Pumping Station becomes vacant. Appointments of Engineers in Charge shall, subject to the provisions of the Promotion Appeal Board Act, be at the discretion of the Superintendent of Machinery.

(v) Second Engineers (other than the Senior Second Engineer), when relieving an Engineer in Charge, shall receive two hours' pay extra at ordinary rates for each day on which they relieve the Engineer in Charge on his holiday or sick leave, or on other occasions when instructed to do so by the Superintendent of Machinery or other officer acting in his stead, up to a period of one month. After one month, they shall be paid the same rate of pay as the Engineer in Charge they are relieving. Overtime rates shall not apply.

(vi) Fitters and turners at Cunderdin Workshops shall be classed as second engineers. Such workers shall be prepared to relieve at any station.

Clause 10—Travelling on Duty and Away from Home Allowance.

Delete subclauses (b) and (c) and insert in lieu thereof—

(b) in addition, the scale of travelling allowance shall be three shillings (3s.) per item; "item" shall mean the expense of breakfast, dinner, tea and bed necessarily incurred whilst travelling from headquarters on duty: Provided that if the charge for any item exceed three shillings (3s.) the actual cost of the item shall be paid by the Minister upon proof by the worker of the amount expended;

(c) away from home allowance.

Engineers when relieving away from home station shall be paid ten shillings (10s.) per day at Stations 1, 2, 3 and 4, and eleven shillings (11s.) per day at other stations.

Clause 16—Contract of Service.

Subclause (d) (a) (ii)—Delete the word and figure "nine (9)" in line two and insert in lieu thereof the word and figure "ten (10)."
