The abovementioned regulations are amended by adding new regulations $29,\,30$ and 31 as follows:—

- 29. For the purposes of section 18M (1) (c) of the Act the following areas are hereby prescribed as areas outside the Commonwealth namely the area comprising the countries known as South and North Korea and Japan and the waters within one hundred miles thereof.
- 30. Operations within the areas prescribed by regulation 29 of these regulations are for the purposes of the definition of "war service" in section 18M (1) of the Act hereby prescribed as operations of the nature of war in which operations His Majesty became engaged after the 3rd day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine
- 31. For the purposes of section 18M (1) (c) of the Act the following period is hereby prescribed as a further or other period namely the period commencing at the termination of the war service within any prescribed area and six months thereafter subject to the continuance in force of the Act.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902.

Amendment of Regulations

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, acting pursuant to section 65 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902 (as reprinted with amendments in the 1934 Sessional Volume of Statutes), hereby amend the regulations made by them and in force under the said Act, as published in the Government Gazette of the 5th day of September, 1934, and amended from time to time thereafter (reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments to the 24th day of November, 1950), and since further amended by notices published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of March, 1951, and on the 1st day of June, 1951, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:— By inserting the following new Regulation—

No. 239A.—Prohibited Explosives Area.

(a) With the exception of craft duly authorised, vessels or boats of any description whatsoever are prohibited from entering an area of water in the Fremantle Outer Harbour bounded by the following lines:—

Commencing at a point at high water mark alongside the southern side of the Quarantine Station jetty at Woodman Point; thence on a line extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of one-quarter mile; thence on a line generally north-easterly and parallel to the coastline for a distance of about one mile to a point in

prolongation west-north-westerly of the northern boundary of Explosives Reserve 8909, Lot 135 (Clarence); thence on a line east-south-easterly to a point at high water mark at the north-west corner of the said Explosives Reserve; thence on a line along high water mark generally in a south-westerly direction to the commencing point.

(b) Any person committing a breach of the foregoing Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds) in respect of each breach.

11.—Fees and Expenses.

Delete Clause 11 and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

11.—Fees and Expenses.

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, the remuneration payable to a member of the Board other than the Chairman for his services shall be at the rate of 3 pounds per day for each day of sitting and where a sitting occupies only portion of a day the fee payable shall be the proportion of the daily fee to 3 pounds, not being less than 1 guinea in respect of the portion of the day his services are required.

Provided that no member of the Board shall be paid more than £450 in any financial year in return for his services as a member.

- 2. Any member of the Board being a salaried officer of the Railway Department and who is elected by the West Australian Railway Officers' Union, shall be paid, in addition to his classified salary, a fee of 1 pound 10 shillings for each day of sitting as a member of the Board provided that no such member shall be paid more than £75 in any financial year for sitting as a member of the Board.
- 3. A member of the Board nominated by the Western Australian Government Railways Commission who receives from the Commission any remuneration in return for personal services rendered as an officer thereof shall be paid an allowance on the same basis as a member of the Board elected by the West Australian Railway Officers' Union.

- 4. A deputy member, whether a nominated or elected member, when sitting in the place of the member for whom he is a deputy, shall be entitled to the fee or allowance to which he would be entitled under this regulation if he were a nominated or elected member of the Board.
- 5. Any assessor, nominated by the Western Australian Government Railways Commission or elected by the West Australian Railway Officers' Union who receives from the Commission any remuneration in return for personal services rendered as an officer thereof, shall be paid, in addition to his classified salary a fee of 1 guinea for each day of sitting as an assessor with the Board.
- 6. Expenses shall be in accordance with the Department scale and subject to Departmental conditions.
