Prices Control Order No. 617.

Boot and Shoe Repairs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 617.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 427 is hereby revoked.

Maximum Rates.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the kinds of service of boot or shoe repairing set out in the Schedule to this Order, including all the materials therefor, may be supplied by any

person by retail to be the rate set out in that Schedule opposite each such kind of boot or shoe repairing.

Exhibition of Price List.

4. Every person who supplies or offers to supply any kind of service of boot or shoe repairing, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the maximum rate fixed by the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of that kind of service of boot or shoe repairing. I hereby declare that any form of notice shall be deemed to be an approved form if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 49 of the regulations.

Variation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any kind of service of boot and shoe repairing specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 618.

Tea.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 618.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 362 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Tea Control Board” means Tea Control Board constituted under the National Security (Tea Control) Regulations of the Commonwealth of Australia;

“primary wholesaler” means primary wholesaler as defined in regulation 3 of the National Security (Tea Control) Regulations;

“licensed primary wholesaler” means a wholesaler who is licensed by the Tea Control Board to sell tea by wholesale;

"eliminated primary wholesaler" means a primary wholesaler who is not licensed as aforesaid by the Tea Control Board to sell tea by wholesale;

"secondary wholesaler" means any person who is registered with the Tea Control Board as a secondary wholesaler;

"first grade tea" means any tea the quality, brand, or description of which is set out or referred to in the first column of the Schedule to the Tea and Coffee Control Order No. 5, published in the *Commonwealth Government Gazette* of the 17th October, 1942, at page 2487;

"second grade tea" means any tea the quality, brand or description of which is not set out or referred to in the first column of the Schedule to the said Tea and Coffee Control Order No. 5;

"Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, any person who is both a primary wholesaler and a secondary wholesaler as defined in paragraph 3 hereof shall be deemed to be—

- (a) a primary wholesaler in respect of sales of tea received by him in its original package direct from the Tea Control Board or from a licensed primary wholesaler and blended and packed for sale by him; and
- (b) a secondary wholesaler in respect of all other sales of tea made by him.

Maximum Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which tea may be sold to a retailer to be—

- (a) where such tea is sold in packages not exceeding 14 lb. net weight—
 - (i) first grade tea—3s. 7d. per lb.;
 - (ii) second grade tea—3s. 3d. per lb.
- (b) where such tea is sold in packages exceeding 14 lb. net weight, such packages being unopened original packages—
 - (i) first grade tea—3s. 4½d. per lb.
 - (ii) second grade tea—3s. 0½d. per lb.
- (c) where such tea is sold in packages exceeding 14 lb. net weight, such packages not being unopened original packages—
 - (i) first grade tea—3s. 5½d. per lb.;
 - (ii) second grade tea—3s. 1½d. per lb.

Provided that where payment of the purchase price of such tea is made within 10 days from date of delivery, such maximum prices shall be reduced by 1d. per lb.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which tea may be sold by a primary wholesaler to a secondary wholesaler to be—

- (a) where such tea is sold in packages not exceeding 14 lb. net weight—
 - (i) first grade tea—3s. 5d. per lb.;
 - (ii) second grade tea—3s. 1d. per lb.;
- (b) where such tea is sold in packages exceeding 14 lb. net weight, such packages being unopened original packages—
 - (i) first grade tea—3s. 2½d. per lb.;
 - (ii) second grade tea—2s. 10½d. per lb.;
- (c) where such tea is sold in packages exceeding 14 lb. net weight, such packages not being unopened original packages—
 - (i) first grade tea—3s. 3½d. per lb.;
 - (ii) second grade tea—2s. 11½d. per lb.

7. Where any tea, the maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by paragraphs 5 and 6 of this Order, is sold to any person for delivery to a purchaser in the Metropolitan Area, the maximum price fixed in relation thereto shall be deemed to include the costs of delivery to such purchaser.

8. In respect of tea, the maximum price of which is fixed by paragraphs 5 and 6 of this Order, sold to any person for delivery to a purchaser at any place other than in the Metropolitan Area, I fix and declare the maximum price at which such tea may be sold and delivered to the place of delivery to be that specified in paragraphs 5 and 6 of this Order, plus the costs properly incurred in and attributable to the transporting of each pound of such tea (calculated in relation to each such pound to the nearest upward farthing).

Provided that no amount may be added for costs of transport under the provisions of this paragraph unless such amount is properly recorded and vouched for in the books of the seller.

9. I fix and declare the maximum price at which tea may be sold by a licensed primary wholesaler to an eliminated primary wholesaler to be—

- (i) first grade tea—3s. 1d. per lb.;
- (ii) second grade tea—2s. 9d. per lb.

Provided that where payment of the purchase price of any such tea is delayed beyond the period of 30 days from the date of delivery thereof, the vendor may charge a further ½d. per lb. for such tea, which aggregate price I hereby fix and declare to be the maximum price thereof.

10. I fix and declare the maximum price at which tea may be sold by retail to be—

- (i) first grade tea—3s. 11d. per lb.;
- (ii) second grade tea—3s. 7d. per lb.

Provided that where such tea is sold by retail in a place outside the Metropolitan Area, the costs properly incurred in and attributable to the delivery of such tea into the store of the retailer and clearly recorded and vouched for in the retailer's books (calculated to the nearest upward ¼d. per lb.) shall be added to the prices fixed and declared by this paragraph, which aggregate prices I hereby fix and declare to be the maximum prices for such tea.

11. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which tea, packed by a primary wholesaler in packages supplied by the purchaser of such tea may be sold to be the maximum price fixed in accordance with the provisions of this Order, less the cost to the purchaser of such packages.

12. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which tea may be sold to the Commonwealth or the State of Western Australia to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by wholesalers—
 - (i) bulk unblended tea—3s. 2½d. per lb.;
 - (ii) bulk blended tea—3s. 3½d. per lb.;
 - (iii) tea in 1-lb. packets—3s. 3½d. per lb.;
- (b) in respect of sales by retailers—
 - (i) bulk unblended tea—3s. 3½d. per lb.;
 - (ii) bulk blended tea—3s. 4½d. per lb.;
 - (iii) tea in 1-lb. packets—3s. 4½d. per lb.;

plus, in each case, cost of transport in to the seller's store. Provided that no amount may be added for cost of transport under the provisions of this paragraph unless such amount has been properly recorded in the seller's books of account.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which tea specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which new cornsacks may be sold by any person for cash, to be—

- in respect of sales of cornsacks for use as containers of wheat or barley, 69s. 6d. per dozen, plus a margin at the rate specified in the First Schedule to this Order;
- in respect of sales of cornsacks for use other than as containers of wheat or barley, 69s. 6d. per dozen, plus a margin at the rate specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Provided that where such cornsacks are sold for other than cash to wheat and barley growers, the maximum price shall be the maximum price fixed by the provision of this paragraph plus 6d. per dozen.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 621.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 193, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 326, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

"Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

"ton" means 2,240 lb. weight;

"salt" means salt produced in the State of Western Australia.

Sales by Processors to Wholesale Sellers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which salt of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold in the Perth Metropolitan Area to wholesale sellers by any person who processes such salt, to be the price set out in the second column of such Schedule opposite each such variety of salt.

Sales by Wholesale—Perth Metropolitan Area.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which salt of any of the varieties and quantities specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order may be sold in the Perth Metropolitan Area by any person by wholesale to be the price set out in the second, third or fourth columns of such Schedule, opposite each such variety of salt, according to the point of delivery by the seller by wholesale and the quantity sold.

Sales by Wholesale—Outside the Perth Metropolitan Area.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which salt may be sold by any person by wholesale at any place outside the Perth Metropolitan Area to be—

- (a) where such salt is transported from or through the Perth Metropolitan Area—the maximum price fixed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order, plus the cost of transport actually incurred in transporting the salt from the Perth Metropolitan Area to the wholesale seller's store;
- (b) where such salt is not transported from or through the Perth Metropolitan Area—the maximum price fixed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order, less the usual cost of transport from the point of production to the Perth Metropolitan Area, plus the actual cost of transport from the point of production to the wholesale seller's store.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any salt specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

Meat and Offal Meat.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 624.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 487 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

“South-West Land Division” means the South-West Land Division as defined in the Land Act, 1933-1938, but not including the Perth Metropolitan Area, as defined in this paragraph;

“Kalgoorlie-Boulder—Coolgardie Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the principal post office at Kalgoorlie;

“seven days' credit,” in relation to any sale of meat by retail, means any sale within any period of seven days where payment for all meat sold within that period is not made within that period.

General.

4. In this Order, reference to the weight of any meat shall be construed as a reference to the dressed weight of that meat.

5. For the purposes of this Order, if a person operates more than one place of business, he shall, in respect of each place of business, be deemed a separate seller.

6. Every person who sells by wholesale any meat or offal meat for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall deliver with that meat or offal meat an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and place of business.
- (b) The name and address of the purchaser of that meat, or offal meat.
- (c) The date of the sale of that meat, or offal meat.
- (d) The class of that meat or offal meat described according to the classes of meat or offal meat specified in the Schedules to this Order.
- (e) The number in each lot of those classes of meat or offal meat sold.
- (f) In the case of any class of meat or offal meat for which a maximum price is expressed in this Order or the Schedules thereto to be fixed by reference to weight—the total weight of each lot of those classes of meat or offal meat sold.
- (g) The price per lb., per dozen, or per unit, as the case may be, at which each lot of those classes of meat or offal meat is sold.

7. Every person who sells by retail any meat for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order and in relation to the sale of which meat, in pursuance of subparagraph (i) or (ii) of the proviso to paragraph 11 of this Order—

- (i) the purchaser is given credit; or
- (ii) where a delivery charge is made by the seller by retail, shall deliver with that meat an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—
 - (a) His name and place of business.
 - (b) The name of the purchaser of that meat.
 - (c) The date of the sale of that meat.
 - (d) The cut or class of meat described according to the cuts or classes of meat specified in the Schedules to this Order.
 - (e) In the case of any cut or class of meat for which a maximum price is expressed in this Order or the Schedules thereto to be fixed by reference to weight—the total weight of each cut or class of meat sold.
 - (f) The price per lb. or per unit, as the case may be, at which each lot of those cuts or classes of meat is sold.
 - (g) The total price of each cut or class of meat sold.

Sales by Wholesale.

8. (1) Subject to subparagraph (2) of this paragraph, I fix and declare the maximum price at which the classes of meat or offal meat specified in the First and Second Schedules to this Order may be sold by wholesale to be the prices specified in those Schedules.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat for which a delivered price is fixed for sales by wholesale may be sold by wholesale other than at a delivered price, to be such delivered price less an amount calculated at the rate of $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per lb. for every 25 miles or part thereof by which the purchaser's premises are distant from the seller's premises.

Portions of a Carcass or Side.

9. Where any class of meat, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by paragraph 8 of this Order, is sold by wholesale in the form of portions or cuts of a carcass or side, the maximum price at which any portion or cut of that carcass or side may be sold shall be such amount that the maximum

price of that portion together with the portion of the carcass or side previously sold, shall equal the maximum price fixed for the sale of the whole carcass or side, as the case may be.

Other Sales by Wholesale.

10. I declare that where a person (in this paragraph referred to as "the agent") purchases livestock as agent, or purported agent, for another person (in this paragraph referred to as "the principal") and processes or treats the livestock and delivers meat resulting from the processing or treatment to the principal, the carrying out of the agency (or purported agency) and the performance of the other services by the agent shall, for the purpose of the Regulations and this Order, be deemed to be a sale by wholesale of the meat so delivered by the agent to the principal at a price equal to the sum of the amounts paid or payable by the principal to the agent in respect of the agency and services (including the price paid by the agent for the livestock purchased by him).

Sales by Retail.

11. I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat of the classes or cuts specified in the first column of the Third Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales in the Perth Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the second column of such Schedule;
- (b) in respect of sales in the South-West Land Division, the prices specified in the third column of such Schedule;
- (c) in respect of sales in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder-Coolgardie Area, the prices specified in the fourth column of such Schedule.

Provided that the prices so specified shall—

- (i) in relation to any sale other than in the Perth Metropolitan Area, where delivery is made to a purchaser's premises which are at a distance greater than one mile from the seller's premises, and are outside the boundary of any town or city; or
- (ii) in relation to any sale in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder-Coolgardie Area, and the South-West Land Division, including the Perth Metropolitan Area, where more than seven days' credit is given to the purchaser by the seller by retail—

be subject in each case to a charge of one half-penny per pound: Provided also that any such charge, in relation to delivery to a purchaser's premises is separately recorded on a docket delivered in relation to that meat.

Offal Meats—Sales by Retail.

12. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any class of offal meat specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be the price specified for such class of meat in that Schedule.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order—

- (i) I declare the maximum price at which meat or offal meat of any class specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person;
- (ii) where any notice in writing fixing a maximum price for any of the goods covered by this Order was given in pursuance of any Order which was by virtue of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1950, in force immediately prior to the commencement of this Order, that notice in writing shall be deemed to have been given under this Order and shall continue in full force and effect.

Exhibition of Price List.

14. (1) Every trader who sells or has for sale by retail any meat or offal meat, shall exhibit in a prominent place in his shop, or if he has more than one shop, in each of his shops, a notice setting forth the maximum price fixed from time to time by or under the provisions of this or any subsequent Order for sale by him of any class or cut of meat or offal meat in the form approved by the Commissioner. I hereby approve the following form of such notice, that is to say—a notice not less than 18in. long and not less than 12in. wide, having printed thereon in clear printer's type all the classes or cuts of meat or offal meat which that trader sells or has for sale, and the maximum prices fixed by or under this Order in relation thereto.

(2) For the purpose of the last preceding subparagraph, the amount added for delivery in pursuance of the foregoing provisions of this Order shall not be deemed to be part of the maximum price, but where any charge in relation to delivery or credit is permitted in respect of the sale of meat by any person under those provisions, the following shall be endorsed in clear printer's type at the foot of the notice referred to in the last preceding subparagraph:—

Where delivery is made to a purchaser's premises outside this town (or city), which are distant more than one mile from these premises . . . and where applicable—

Where credit is given for more than seven days, the prices referred to in this list are subject to an addition of one half-penny per lb. in respect of each service.
