Reserve for Natives.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRDNER, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted) that the Governor may by Proclamation declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives and abolish any reserve so declared; and whereas by Proclamation issued under the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, and published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd day of July, 1937, the Lieutenant-Governor declared an area at Collie more particularly described as Reserve No. 7136 and defined in the Schedule to such Proclamation to be a reserve for natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said reserve: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd day of July, 1937, as aforesaid.

Jetties Act, 1926.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 296/51.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Jetties Act, 1926, that the Governor may make regulations for the management, use, maintenance and preservation of all jetties, and, *inter alia*, for the imposition, fixing, levying, collection and payment of dues and charges as set out in subsection (9) of section 4 of the said Act; and whereas for some time past the public jetty at Port Hedland has been managed and controlled by the Commissioner of Railways and has been so managed and controlled Railways and has been so managed and controlled in accordance with by-laws or regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1904-1948; and whereas the management and control of the said public jetty at Port Hedland has from the 1st day of November, 1951, been transferred from the said Commissioner of Railways to the Harbour and Said Commissioner of Rahways to the Harbour and Light Department as administered by the Chief Secretary; and whereas it is deemed necessary to make regulations under the said Jetties Act, 1926, for the imposition, fixing, levying, collection and payment of wharfage dues, handling charges and haulage charges and other charges for the use of the said public jetty at Port Hedland and in respect of goods leaded carried or stored on or from the of goods loaded, carried, or stored, on or from the said jetty or on, in or from premises appurtenant thereto, or in respect of any incidental services rendered by the Harbour and Light Department, and any officers thereof, in the course of managing

and controlling the said public jetty: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Jetties Act, 1926, doth hereby declare that regulations made under the said Jetties Act, 1926, shall apply to the Port Hedland Jetty.

Dog Act, 1903-1948.

Municipality of Geraldton.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1365/35.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order under the authority of section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, namely, that the Municipality of Geraldton is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of section 35 of the said Act, to have effect within the Geraldton Municipal District.

- (1) Empowering it, subject to the provisions of the Act under which it is constituted, to establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Act.
- (2) For the care, detention, release, disposal and destruction of dogs so seized.
- (3) Prescribing fees to be payable in respect of the seizing, care, detention, release, disposal and destruction of dogs so seized.
- (4) Prescribing the liability of any person in respect of payment of the fees referred to in the last preceding paragraph.
- (5) Prohibiting the release from any pound of any dog except in accordance with the regulations.
- (6) Prohibiting the obstruction or hindrance of any employee of the Municipality of Geraldton or any member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Act or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.
- (7) Imposing as an absolute prohibition an obligation on the owner of any dog that the dog shall not enter or be in (i) such places as may be prescribed in any circumstances whatever, or (ii) such places as may be prescribed, unless on a leash held by a person.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 47/49.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 13; and whereas Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, being an employer within the meaning of the said section has duly, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the said section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Certificate of Title, Volume 478, Folio 98, in which is comprised an estate in fee simple in all that piece of land being portion of Perth Town Lot G1, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, for a period expiring on the 17th day of November, 1953.

Companies Act, 1943-1949. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 28 (1) of the Companies Act, 1943-1949, that no company shall be registered by a name which is identical with that by which a firm in existence is already registered under the Business Names Act, 1942-1946; and whereas by paragraph (7) proviso (a) of the said section where in the opinion of the Governor (on being satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require any company formed or incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of this Act applies to change its name, style, title or designation before complying with the requirements of the said Part) it is in the circumstances of the particular case expedient, the Governor may, notwithstanding anything in the said section or section 30 of the said Companies Act, 1943-1949, authorise the Registrar to accept for filing the documents and particulars specified in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of subsection (1) of section 329 of the said Companies Act, 1943-1949; and whereas a company, incorporated in the State of South Australia as J. N. Taylor & Co. Limited, desires to register as a foreign company under the said Companies Act, 1943-1949: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (7) proviso (a) of section 28 of the said Companies Act, 1943-1949, doth hereby authorise the Registrar to register J. N. Taylor & Co. Limited as a foreign company.

Limited, desires to register as a foreign company under the said Companies Act, 1943-1949: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (7) proviso (a) of section 28 of the said Companies Act, 1943-1949 doth hereby authorise the Registrar to register S. Smith & Sons (Australia) Pty. Limited as a foreign company.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1946, has been pleased to approve of the repeal of all by-laws heretofore made under the said Act for the management of the Boulder General Cemetery and to approve of the substitution in lieu thereof of the by-laws made by the Trustees of the Boulder General Cemetery as set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Boulder Cemetery (Reserve 9037). By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Boulder, the said Trustees make the following by-laws:—

1. That all fees and charges payable to the Trustees, in accordance with Schedule "A", shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

- 2. That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, railing, wall, or for any other purpose shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial, in the form specified in Schedule "B".
- 3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall, before obtaining permission to do so, submit a plan of description of such monument, tombstone, or enclosure, and specify the materials of which it is to be composed to the Trustees, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work, in the form of Schedule "D".
- 4. And every person who shall place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure upon any grave the exclusive right of which has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair; and if, after receiving one month's notice in writing from the Trustees, such repairs are not executed, then the Trustees may order such monument, etc., to be removed.
- 5. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave shall keep such grave, and any erection or construction thereon in proper repair; and if after receiving notice in writing from the Trustees requiring such repairs to be executed, shall fail so to do, then, after the expiration of 28 days, the Trustees may cause such repairs to be executed and may recover the cost thereof from such person in a summary way before two Justices in Petty Sessions.
- 6. (1) The time appointed for any funeral to arrive at the Cemetery shall be notified to the Secretary at least eight working hours before the time appointed for such arrival, and such time shall be punctually observed.
- (2) The name of the deceased, age, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule "C" shall be furnished when giving the order.
- 7. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug but any person desiring to construct a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under the direction of the Secretary or his deputy, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and made and kept air-tight.
- 8. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a metal plate with the name of deceased and date of death stamped or inscribed thereon.
- 9. That every grave shall be at least 6 ft. deep, except those used for the burial of infants, which the Trustees may allow to be of lesser depth; but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.
- 10. That, in case of application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.
- 11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the Secretary in the form of Schedule "C" and delivered to the sexton at the Cemetery.
 - 12. That hours for burial shall be as follows:—
 Monday to Friday—9 a.m. 4.30 p.m.
 Saturday—9 a.m. 11.30 a.m.

On Sundays: No interment shall be allowed except when it is certified in writing by a Medical Officer of Health that for hygienic reasons or by the Chairman of Trustees that for religious reasons, it is necessary or advisable that the burial shall take place on that day.

- 13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours above-mentioned, except by special permission, and upon payment of the fee for burials "not in the usual hours".
- 14. That the time stated in Schedule "C" for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same time shall be punctually observed.

- 15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and thence follow the sexton to the grave. No bicycle, velocipede, carriage, or vehicle, except hearses and mourning-coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Horses shall not be driven faster than a walking pace, and no horses, or other animals shall be ridden in the Cemetery.
- 16. No erection of an estimated value of ten pounds—£10, or more will be permitted until a certificate of right of burial shall have first been bed and obtained. had and obtained.
- 17. That every erection shall be placed upon proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse, rubbish, or material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once, by and at the expense of the person causing the same.
- All material required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery.
 - That no catacomb shall be allowed.
- 20. When, in the opinion of the Trustees, any tomb, monument, tablet, gravestone or other erection is, or is likely to become dangerous, the Trustees shall, where practicable, give notice in writing to the owner or person responsible to repair, if his place of abode can be ascertained. within reasonable time such repair is not effected, the Trustees may take down and remove such monument, tablet, gravestone or other erection, and sell or otherwise dispose of the materials of which same was composed. The Trustees shall not be required to account for the proceeds of such sale or for such disposition of the materials. A notice sent by prepaid post to the address of such owner or person last known to the Secretary shall be sufficient notice under this by-law.
- The sexton shall have power to remove from any burial allotment, any unsightly ornaments such as broken glass bottles, jars, tins, decayed and broken wreaths and dead flowers, and to prune, cut down, or dig up and remove any shrubs or plants on any burial allotment, when such, in his opinion, shall have become unsightly or overgrown.
- 22. Where a re-open might be required within three years, provision must be made in the first instance by sinking the grave 12in. deeper than above prescribed, for every contemplated interment.
- That the Trustees shall not (except in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other cemetery, and before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the trustees a written applicaremoval of such corpse, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Governor, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.
- That any workman or other employee, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the Cemetery be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the Secretary or his deputy, and shall obey all such directions, and shall be removed from the Cemetery upon any breach of the by-laws or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.
- Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, namely:—
 - (1) That no rubbish or any other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, or pathway, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work.

 (2) That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave

dressing any grave.

- (3) That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather except by special permission of the Secretary, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise. Work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulated hours.
- 26. That no child under the age of 10 years shall be admitted into the Cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.
- 27. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any explosives be discharged therein except by special permission.
- 28. That every driver of a hearse, mourning-coach, or other vehicle, and every pedestrian shall keep strictly to the roads and pathways as laid out for vehicles and pedestrians respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for so doing is made.
- 29. That no animals other than horses drawing hearses or mourning-coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery except by permission.
- 30. That no person in the Cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, plate, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border or railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave, or burying place; and any person or persons so offending may be proceeded against in accordance with the Act.
- 31. That no person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatever.
- The "Secretary" or his "Deputy" as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the Secretary or his Deputy of the Cemetery, and such person or persons shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters portaining to the Cemetary and to the convince out pertaining to the Cemetery and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws; and the direc-tion of such person or persons shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.
- 33. That all fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these by-laws taken before two Justices of Petty Sessions except where otherwise provided for.
- That any person committing any breach of these by-laws shall thereupon be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, or Secretary or his deputy, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such persons may be subject.
- That licenses to grave dressers or grave decorators and licenses for various purposes not otherwise provided for may be issued by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule "E".
- 36. That a plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, sections, blocks, and graves numbered, a Register of Burials, and a Register of Certificates of Right of Burial shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.
- 37. That the officiating minister at any burial shall be given at least six hours' notice prior to the time stated for such burial.

STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895.

Department of Agriculture, Perth, 4th December, 1951.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 6 of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, has been pleased to amend the Stock Diseases Act Regulations, 1939, made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 17th day of March, 1939, and amended from time to time thereafter, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

- The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—
 1. Regulation 77A. (Government Gazette 11/2/49) is revoked and a new regulation 77A substituted in lieu thereof as follows:-
 - (1) No owner of swine shall utilise any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash unless and until it is sterilised by treatment in a vessel of approved design at a temperature of not less than 212°F for a minimum period of two hours per charge. The capacity of such vessel shall be not less than one hundred gallons.
 - (2) No owner of swine shall collect or utilise any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash except under the authority of a license issued by the Chief Inspector of Stock. Such license shall be known as a treatment license and shall be to the effect of Form No. 16 in the Third Schedule hereto.
 - (3) Every person who desires to obtain a treatment license under this regulation shall make application in writing to the effect of Form No. 15 of the Third Schedule to the Chief Inspector of Stock. Licenses shall be in force till the 31st day of December, next following the date of issue.
 - (4) A treatment license shall entitle the licensee to collect, treat and utilise any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash in the manner prescribed in paragraph (1) of this regulation, in a specified premises within a specified district, for the feeding of swine.
 - (5) Every license granted under this regulation shall be non-transferrable except with the written approval of the Chief Inspector of Stock.

- (6) No licensee under this regulation shall store or place, or have in his possession, or under his control, any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash in any place accessible to any swine, dog, or other animal or in any premises, district, place, locality or store which has not been specified in a treatment license issued to such licensee under this regulation.
- (7) The Chief Inspector of Stock may issue a treatment license provided that on inspection he is satisfied that-
 - (a) the plant is of a sufficient capacity and type to effectively sterilise any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash within the specified time;
 - (b) the plant is entirely enclosed within a swine-proof fence no portion of which shall be within a distance of 10 feet of any part of the plant;
 - (c) the plant is situated 50 feet clear from any pig pen, race, sty or yard;
 - (d) the floor of such plant is constructed of sound impervious material extending to a distance of at least 10 feet from the extremities of the plant and on all such sides of it;
 - (e) drains are provided to carry any wash water or fluid to a dry well situated in a position entirely protected from swine.
- (8) (a) Upon conviction of a person holding a treatment license under this regulation for any offence against this regulation, the Chief Inspector of Stock may revoke the license held by such person;
- (b) A treatment license may be revoked under this regulation by notice in writing signed by the Chief Inspector of Stock and served upon the person so convicted.
- (9) Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation the Minister may, if he deems it necessary for the prevention of the spread of disease, by a notice in the Government Gazette, prohibit the use of any kitchen or other refuse or pigwash for the feeding of swine in any portion of the State.
- (10) In this regulation "kitchen or other refuse or pigwash" includes any material which contains or is likely to contain meat, bones, meat products and animal offal of any description no matter from what source it is derived.
- (11) Any contravention of this regulation shall be an offence punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding £100 and not less than £20.
- Form 15 (Government Gazette 11/2/49) is amended—

 (a) by deleting the words "food refuse" appearing in line 9 and inserting in lieu thereof the words "kitchen or other refuse or pigwash";

 (b) by deleting the second item, "Capacity, make and type of treatment plant and other facilities existent for sterilisation" under the heading "Particulars" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Capacity and the second time of treatment plant" and type of treatment plant"
- 3. Form 16 (Government Gazette 11/2/49) is amended by-
 - (a) deleting the words "food refuse" in line 7 and inserting in lieu thereof the words "kitchen or other refuse or pigwash"; and
 - (b) deleting the words "steam sterilising plant which must be operated at a constant steam pressure of not less than 40 lb. per square inch for a minimum period of two hours per charge" in lines 8 to 10 and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "sterilising plant which must be operated at a temperature of not less than 212°F for a minimum period of 2 hours per charge,"
- 4. The Fourth Schedule (Government Gazette 17/3/39) to the abovementioned regulations is amended by deleting the figure "6" opposite item 4 and the figure "3" opposite item 5 in the second paragraph dealing with scale of charges for dipping stock and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "9" and "6" respectively.

RAILWAY CLASSIFICATION BOARD 1920-1950.

No. 6 of 1951.

WHEREAS application having been made under section 21 of the above Act by the Western Australian Government Railways Commission and the West Australian Railway Officers' Union for variation of Award No. 2 of 1951 and having the consent and agreement of both the above parties, the Railways Classification Board doth order and prescribe that the Award made in this matter be varied in the manner following, that is to say:—

Award No. 2 of 1951.

Clause 30—Rates of Pay.

Insert new subclause (q):

(q) In the event of the Court of Arbitration increasing the ratio of the female basic wage to the male basic wage, the margins herein prescribed for females shall be adjusted as follows:—

- (i) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult female is equal to, or greater than, the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically reduced by the same amount as the basic wage is so increased.
- (ii) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is less than the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically deleted.
- (iii) In the case of junior female workers the percentage of the female basic wage and the margins prescribed herein shall be automatically reduced by a sum and/or percentage sufficient to enable the rates to remain constant.

In the event of the Court of Arbitration increasing the ratio of the female basic wage to the male basic wage, the margins herein prescribed for females shall be adjusted as follows:—

- (a) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is equal to, or greater than, the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically reduced by the same amount as the basic wage is so increased.
- (b) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is less than the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically deleted.
- (e) In the case of junior female workers the percentage of the female basic wage and the margins prescribed herein shall be automatically reduced by a sum and/or percentage sufficient to enable the rates to remain constant.
