HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendments to the by-laws made by the Commission under and for the purposes of the Government Railways Act, 1904-1948, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of May, 1940, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

By-law No. 54, Appendix III, paragraph 4 (*Government Gazette*, 14/5/40), is amended by—

- (i) deleting subparagraph (e) and inserting in lieu thereof a new subparagraph (e) as follows:—

(e) When two or more engines are attached to the head of a train, the driver of the leading engine, unless there are local rules to the contrary, shall be responsible for the observance of signals and the working of the continuous brake. The driver of the second (or assisting engines) must watch for, and take his signals from, the driver of the leading engine, but the driver of the second (or assisting engines) is not relieved from the due observance of all signals regulating the safe working of the line. The driver of the second (or assisting engines) shall, in case of emergency only, assist in stopping or reducing the speed of the train by applying the vacuum or hand brake as may be required, but he shall not maintain or recreate vacuum, *i.e.*, the steam valves to his ejector shall be closed; and

(ii) inserting a new subparagraph (f) as follows:—

When an additional engine or engines are employed to bank a train, the drivers of these engines shall not interfere with the working of the vacuum brake, nor shall they maintain or recreate vacuum. The leading driver shall control the vacuum brake as in paragraph 4 (e), except in cases of emergency

which may not be apparent to the leading driver or drivers, or of a run back, when the rearmost assisting engine driver automatically becomes the leading driver.
