WHEREAS by section 17, subsection (1) of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1947, it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation vest in the Minister the moneys, securities for money, and articles held for any charitable purpose or on behalf of any person, society, body or association on being satisfied—(a) that a majority of at least three-fourths in number of the persons who are trustees or who have the control of the moneys or securities for money or articles in such fund has consented thereto; and whereas such a majority of the trustees of the Three Springs Branch Silver Chain District and Bush Nursing Association has so consented; and whereas by subsection (2) of section 17 of the Act the Governor may by proclamation vary such trusts and authorise the Minister to apply the said moneys and securities and articles or any part thereof to such charitable purposes as he may direct: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1947, hereby proclaim that the said trusts are hereby varied and that the Minister is authorised to apply the said moneys as set out in the Schedule attached hereto, to the support of activities of a social welfare character, and for that purpose to deliver the said moneys to the Mingenew Branch Silver Chain District and Bush Nursing Association and the North Midlands Centre of the St. John Ambulance Association, Three Springs.

Health Act, 1911-1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 1162/53.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1952, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1952, doth hereby constitute all that portion of the State comprised in the Kwinana Road District (as created by the Kwinana Road District Act, 1953) to be a health district and for the purpose of the Health Act, 1911-1952, to be known as the Kwinana Health District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 11275/00.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1953, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 7530 (near Cuballing) should vest in and be held by the Cuballing Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Cuballing Road Board in trust for Recreation, with power to the said Cuballing Road Board subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.

Any dog found on the foreshore or reserve in contravention of this by-law may be destroyed or sold in accordance with the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-48.

DOG ACT, 1903-1948.

By-laws.

Ashburton Road Board.

L.G. 257/52.

PURSUANT to an Order in Council promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of August, 1953, under section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, and in exercise of all other powers thereto enabling it, the Ashburton Road Board doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws for the establishment of a dog pound and the control of dogs within the area of the Ashburton Road Board.

1. In these by-laws the term "Board" shall mean the Ashburton Road Board.

2. The Board may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948.

3. A dog seized by the police or by an officer authorised by the Board may be placed in a pound.

4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Board shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the Schedule hereto, the dog shall be released to such person.

6. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Board.

7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Board, the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Board in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.

8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized, or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Board may sell such dog.

9. Upon the sale of a dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Board and may be disposed of in such manner as the Board thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Board in respect of the proceeds thereof.

10. If within the time mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid, and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase, the dog may be destroyed.

11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the secretary of the Board if, in the opinion of the secretary, the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

12. If the Board shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Board the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.

13. No person shall—

- (a) unless a pound keeper or other officer of the Board duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
- (b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
- (c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding, or conveying dogs which have been seized.

14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.

15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture garden.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A shop or other public business premises.

16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sports ground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A car park.
- (d) A school.
- (e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Board other than a road.

17. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Board or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

18. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.

19. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 4 of 1954.

Registered 10th February, 1954.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act 1912-1952, this 5th day of February, 1954, between the Minister for Works (hereinafter referred to as “the Minister”) of the one part and the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia, West Aus-

tralian Branch Association of Workers (hereinafter referred to as “the Union”) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Engine Drivers and Firemen's (Country Pumping Stations) Agreement and supersedes Industrial Agreement, No. 15 of 1947 as amended.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to those pumping stations controlled by the Minister for Works and Water Supply as specifically referred to in clause 7 (a) hereof.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for one year from the date hereof.

5.—Definitions.

(a) Wherever the term “Pumper in Charge” is referred to herein, it shall mean a worker who is employed as a Pumper in Charge-engine driver.

(b) Wherever the term “Second Pumper” is referred to herein, it shall mean a worker who is employed as a Second Pumper-engine driver.

(c) “Engineer” means the officer occupying for the time being the position of Engineer, Goldfields Water Supply, Hydraulic Engineer, or any executive officer of the aforesaid engineers, as the case may be.

6.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) Such ordinary hours shall be worked by day workers in five shifts of eight hours each, Monday to Friday, and by shift workers in eight hour shifts.

(c) The hours of labour shall include all time occupied in raising steam, banking fires, starting up or closing down engines.

(d) Where circumstances permit, regular starting and finishing times may be fixed by agreement in writing between the Union and the department concerned or its representatives.

(b) (i) Where a Pumper in Charge or Second Pumper is required to attend an electric generator exceeding 10 kilowatt capacity, he shall be paid an extra margin of 9s. per week.

(ii) Pumper in charge of plant shall be paid an extra margin of 9s. per week: Provided that these rates shall not be cumulative to the extent of increasing the margin of an employee above 50s.

(c) In addition to the margins prescribed in sub-clause (a) of this clause:—

- (i) The Pumpers in Charge at Barbalin, Waddouring, Knungagin, Narembeen and Kondinin shall be paid an extra margin of 20s. per week to cover all overtime worked in addition to such special duties as defined in clause 8 (a) hereof.
- (ii) The Pumpers in Charge at Meckering, Station Creek, Meekatharra, Nallan, Ora Banda and Menzies shall be paid an amount of 22s. 6d. per week to cover all overtime worked in any case where such a worker is required to work 92 hours or more in any one fortnight.

8.—Special Duties.

(a) All Pumpers in Charge and the Second Pumpers at Barbalin and Waddouring shall be required to undertake maintenance and repair work on the water mains and reticulations, fix and cut off services, read, remove and replace meters when necessary in addition to the duties in and around the pumping station.

(b) When not engaged on pumping at the Kellerberrin, Coolgardie, Widgiemooltha, Higginsville and Norseman Booster Stations or on other duties, to be employed on any general duties as directed by the Engineer Goldfields Water Supply or his deputy.

9.—No Reduction.

This Agreement shall not of itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who is at the date of the Agreement receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

10.—Quarters.

(a) Pumpers in Charge—

(i) Except as hereinafter provided, where free quarters or fuel, light and water are not provided for a Pumper in Charge, an allowance as agreed upon between the department and the worker concerned, or in default of agreement as fixed by a Board of Reference, shall be paid to such worker.

(ii) The Pumper in Charge at Pingelly shall be paid an amount of 12s. per week, and the Pumper in Charge at Menzies an amount of 10s. per week in lieu of free quarters, fuel, light, and water.

(b) Second Pumpers—

(i) Where quarters are provided for a Second Pumper, an amount as agreed upon between the department and the worker concerned, or in default of agreement as fixed by a Board of Reference, shall be deducted for rent from the wages of the said worker by the Department.

(ii) Where free fuel, light and water are not provided for a Second Pumper, an allowance as agreed upon between the department and the worker concerned, or in default of agreement as fixed by a Board of Reference, shall be paid to such worker.

11.—District Allowances.

12.—Shift Work.

(a) Pumpers in Charge—Pumpers in Charge shall take day shift or portion of day shift as necessary to meet the requirements of pumping.

(b) Second Pumpers—

(i) Where only one Second Pumper is employed, the Pumper in Charge may rotate with the Second Pumper and the shifts shall be as mutually arranged between themselves, or in default of agreement as fixed by the engineer.

(ii) Where two Second Pumpers are employed, they shall work a weekly rotation of afternoon and night shifts between themselves.

(iii) Where three Second Pumpers are employed they shall rotate day, afternoon, and night shifts amongst themselves.

(c) Where pumping is necessary outside of the hours of 8 a.m. to noon on a Saturday, or on a Sunday, each Second Pumper shall take up to an eight (8) hours shift, provided that, if the circumstances in the opinion of the Pumper in Charge require his special attention, he may take a shift.

(d) Second Pumpers when employed on afternoon shift shall be paid five per cent. (5%), and on night shift seven and one-half per cent. (7½%) in addition to their ordinary rates for such shifts in accordance with subclause (e) hereof.

(e) For the purpose of assessing the payment of loading for shift work the following shall be the recognised hours of the various shifts:—

Day shift—8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Afternoon shift—4 p.m. to 12 midnight.

Night shift—12 midnight to 8 a.m.

13.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the normal hours of eight per shift, or any additional shift, or part thereof shall, except as provided herein, be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter: Provided that a worker called back to perform another shift on Sunday,

after having completed his five shifts of eight hours shall be paid at the rate of double time for the time so worked.

(b) Saturday Time—

(i) Rostered shift work performed on Saturday up to a maximum of eight hours in each shift shall be included in the week's work and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(ii) The extra quarter rate shall stand alone and be paid for as an addition to the workers' weekly earnings.

(c) Sunday Time—Rostered shift work performed on Sundays up to a maximum of eight hours in each shift shall be included in the week's work and be paid for at the rate of time and a half. The extra half rate prescribed shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the workers' weekly earnings, provided that time worked in excess of eight hours on such Sundays shall be paid at the rate of double time, i.e. twice the ordinary rate, which rate shall be the maximum payable under this Agreement.

(d) Overtime and shift work rates shall not be cumulative on Saturday and Sunday penalty rates.

(e) The Department may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at such overtime rates, if any, as may be prescribed herein, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(f) The Union or any worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

14.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(ii) Seven day shift workers, i.e., shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed, in addition to clause (a) (i) hereof, seven consecutive days' leave including non-working days.

Where an employee with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve-monthly period as a seven day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the part of two weeks' consecutive days annual leave described in subclause (a) (i) hereof increased by half a day for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided

always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) Workers regularly working for the Government North of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two years, subject to the convenience of the department. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

15.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(c) In the case of workers working a five day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

16.—Casual Workers.

Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the usual rate in this Agreement for the employee's occupation. A casual worker is one for whom work, over a period of six (6) consecutive days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer.

17.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day.

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of clause 18 hereof, as to payment for absence on account of illness.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery or from any other cause for which the employer is not responsible.

18.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer hereunder shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

19.—Payment of Wages.

When an employee is discharged before the usual pay day he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post, at the employer's risk, unless the employee desires to collect it at the office.

20.—Travelling Time, Fares, etc.

(a) When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares (including sleeper, where travelling is by rail and if considered necessary by the engineer) and a proper allowance at current rates for all necessary meals or board and lodging.

(b) The time necessarily occupied by all workers in travelling on duty (including waiting time) shall be paid, subject as hereinafter provided, as from the time of departure of the train or other means of transport to the arrival at destination at the ordinary rate of wages attached to the place of departure, but not to exceed eight (8) hours per day. Overtime rates shall not apply. Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days. When a worker is obliged to travel by road, a reasonable time for the road journey, as determined by the engineer, shall be allowed. No worker shall lose any time by transfer.

(c) When a worker is engaged by the Department at a place other than at the place of employment and the employer does not provide for transport for the worker, the worker shall be entitled on the completion of the job or after the completion of twelve (12) months' service on the job whichever should first occur, to a refund of the fare actually paid by him in travelling from the place of engagement, (or from such other place as may be agreed upon between the Department and the worker) to the place of employment. The worker shall also be entitled in accordance with the provisions of subclause (e) hereof to a return fare free of cost. Provided that where a worker can travel by rail and elects to travel by other conveyance, the employer shall not be liable for payment of any expenses incurred by the worker unless the means of conveyance is approved by the engineer prior to the journey and in no case shall the worker be entitled to expenses exceeding the cost of the fare that would have been involved if the worker had travelled by rail.

(d) Where the Department has paid the fare of a worker to enable him to proceed to a job, and such worker leaves the job of his own accord or is dismissed on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory work within six (6) weeks of time of engagement, the amount of the fare to the job may be deducted from any amounts due to such worker

at the time of dismissal or the termination of his service and he shall forfeit privileges of fare returns to place of engagement or such other place as provided in subclause (c) hereof.

(e) Rail fares shall be first class in the case of Pumpers in Charge and second class in the case of Second Pumpers. Return fares by rail or other means of conveyance shall also be paid on completion of job or after twelve (12) months on job.

21.—Firing and Repairs.

(a) Pumpers in Charge shall do their own firing where necessary and shall carry out such maintenance and repairs to the plant as are necessary to maintain it in efficient running order.

(b) Second Pumpers shall do their own firing where necessary and shall also do such minor repairs to the plant as in the opinion of the Pumper in Charge can be done during their shift.

22.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement, to members of the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia, West Australian Branch Association of Workers.

23.—Interviewing Workers.

Provided he has previously notified the engineer, any officer of the Union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of the Union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such Union covered by this Agreement are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The engineer shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work.

24.—Inspection of Wages Sheets.

The wages sheets of the Department shall be open for inspection at the local or head office by the secretary or other authorised member of the Union, upon reasonable notice given of his desire to inspect same.

25.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement, Boards of Reference are hereby appointed, which shall each consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. Each Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the function of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;
- (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of a Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

26.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full-time Government wages workers generally shall apply to workers covered by this Agreement.

27.—Camp Allowance.

Workers required to live in tents at or in the neighbourhood of the job shall be paid an additional allowance of 15s. per week. The above allowance covers a week, whether of five, six or seven days. For broken periods this particular allowance shall be calculated at one-sixth (1/6th) viz., 2s. 6d. per day.
