WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1950, the Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned; and whereas it is desirable to amend the rules of the Board as published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 45) of the 5th August, 1949: Now, therefore, the Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby, at a meeting held on the 21st day of May, 1954, make and publish the following amendments to the said rules, to take effect one month after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Company Law.  
Equity.  
Legislation and Administrative Law.  
Private International Law.

29. Subject to rule 30 every articled clerk shall while articled attend at the University of Western Australia the lectures provided in the

following subjects, and pass an examination therein as follows, viz.:—

##### Final Examination.

Practice and Procedure (including pleading) of the High Court, Bankruptcy Court and Supreme Court in all their jurisdictions and of the inferior Courts of Western Australia.

##### Conveyancing.

##### Elementary Accounts.

Taxation (including death and other duties).

30. (i) The Board may for good cause shown excuse an articled clerk from attendance at any lecture or lectures, but subject thereto an articled clerk shall not be deemed to have attended the lectures provided in any subject unless he shall have attended at least 80 per cent. of the number of lectures provided in that subject in any year.

(ii) An articled clerk shall be deemed to have complied with Rule 28 if he shall (either before or during his articles) have taken a degree in Law at a University recognised by the Board for the purposes of section 15 (d) of the Act.

(iii) An articled clerk who has (either before or during his articles) taken a degree in law at a University recognised by the Board for the purposes of section 15 (d) of the Act and whose articles were registered prior to the 1st day of July, 1953, shall not be required to comply with Rule 29 if he shall while articled pass or have passed a Graduates Examination in the following subjects, viz.:—

Practice and Procedure (including pleading) of the High Court, Bankruptcy Court and Supreme Court in all their jurisdictions and of the inferior Courts of Western Australia.

##### Conveyancing.

(iv) An articled clerk whose articles were registered prior to the 1st day of July, 1954, shall not be required to comply with either Rule 28 or Rule 29 if he shall while articled pass or have passed examinations as follow, viz.:—

(a) Alternative Intermediate Examination, comprising:—

##### Legal History and Constitutional Law.

- (1) Sources and development of the Law (Common Law Equity Legislation, etc.), history and jurisdiction of the several Courts.
- (2) Federal and State Constitutions and English Constitutional Law and Conventions.

Real Property—The principles of the law of Real Property and the nature, creation, disposition and devolution of estates and interests in land.

Personal Property—The principles of the law of Personal Property and rights and obligations relating thereto.

(b) Alternative Final Examination, Part I, comprising:—

##### Real and Personal Property:

- (1) Nature creation, disposition and devolution of estates and interests in land, and conveyancing in respect of general law and Torrens System titles.
- (2) Principles of the law of Personal Property, including a more detailed knowledge of Bills of Sale, Hire Purchase Agreements, Partnerships and Bankruptcy than is required

for the Intermediate Examination on Personal Property.

Contracts and Company Law—General principles of law of contract, including agency, carriage by land and sea, insurance, negotiable instruments, sale of goods, suretyship. Company law in Western Australia.

Torts—Torts and obligations arising from civil wrongs at common law.

Criminal Law—Crimes and offences punishable summarily.

(c) Alternative Final Examination, Part II, comprising:—

Equity—General principles and maxims of equity.

Private International Law—General principles of private International Law as a branch of English law, and including the application of such principles with statutory modifications between the other States of the Commonwealth.

Practice—Practice and procedure in all jurisdictions of the various Courts having jurisdiction in Western Australia (including the High Court).

Evidence and Legal Interpretation—Principles of the law of evidence and the rules relating to legal interpretation.

31. (i) Subject as hereinafter provided, all subjects prescribed for any examination must be passed at the one examination before an articulated clerk will be permitted to attend lectures or to sit for examination in any subject prescribed for any other examination, provided that in any particular case and for good cause shown the Board may dispense with the requirements of this subrule on such terms and conditions as the Board thinks fit.

(ii) Subject to Rule 30, no articulated clerk may sit for examination in any subject until he shall have attended the lectures provided in that subject.

(iii) Subject to Rule 30, no articulated clerk may sit for the Final Examination referred to in Rule 29 until he shall have passed the Intermediate Examinations referred to in Rule 28. The Intermediate Examinations shall be passed in the order in which they appear in the last-mentioned rule.

(iv) No articulated clerk may sit for the Alternative Final Examination Part I until he has completed three years' service under articles, nor may an articulated clerk sit for the Alternative Final Examination Part II until he has completed four years' service under articles.

(v) Examinations shall be conducted by such persons in such manner and at such times and places as the Board may from time to time determine. The time and place of every examination shall be advertised by the Board by notice displayed in the Supreme Court Library.

(vi) Before attending lectures at the University of Western Australia in any year, articulated clerks will be required to enrol as students not preceeding to a degree and to pay to the University the fees payable by such students.

(vii) Articled clerks while attending lectures at the University of Western Australia will be required to comply with all the statutes and regulations of the University as if they were enrolled as students proceeding to a degree.

32. (i) An articulated clerk wishing to sit for an examination shall not more than six nor less than four weeks before the date appointed for the examination lodge with the Secretary an application in Form G in the Schedule.

(ii) An articulated clerk who has not previously so applied shall lodge with his application a separate certificate in Form H from every practitioner with whom he has served articles certifying as to his conduct during the relevant period of service. On every subsequent occasion he shall lodge a separate certificate in Form N from every practitioner with whom he served articles since the date of his last previous application.

## Long Service Leave By-laws.

L.G. 257/52.

THE Ashburton Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

(1) In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Ashburton Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the armed forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and 3rd March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided that the requisite proof is produced.

(2) All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof,

commencing as from 1st day of January, 1936, be entitled to thirteen (13) weeks' long service leave, and the employee shall be entitled to full pay for the said 13 weeks.

(3) Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employees, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

(4) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

(5) Where any employee resigns, retires, or in the event of the death of an employee, the Board may pay to the employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative, or if there be none, to his dependants), a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

(6) An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

(7) (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wages for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Board may, at its discretion, either—

- (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave; or
- (ii) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

(8) All annual leave to which an employee is entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

(9) Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Provided that where any employee leaves the service of the Board, who has served continuously for one period of 10 years next before his retirement, he shall be paid long service leave *pro rata* for any additional period of service.
