### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency The Honourable Sir John  
TO WIT, } Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of the Most  
[L.S.] } Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and  
Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS by a Commission dated the 8th day of April, 1952, I, Sir John Patrick Dwyer, was duly appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia and by the said Commission I was authorised and required in the event of the office of Governor becoming vacant, or of the Governor being incapable, or of his departure from the said State, to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal, being dated at Westminster the 29th day of October, 1900, constituting the office of Governor in and over the said State of Western Australia, and according to such instructions as the said Governor for the time being had already received or might thereafter receive from Her Majesty or through one of the Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such laws as were then or might hereafter be in force in the said State; and whereas Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of

the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, has obtained leave from Her Majesty the Queen, through one of the Principal Secretaries of State, to temporarily depart from the State, which he has accordingly done: Now this is to give notice that I, the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer, have duly taken the Oaths required by the Letters Patent and have, in pursuance of the said Commission, this day assumed the office of Administrator of the Government, during the absence of the said Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner and by the terms of the said recited Commission Her Majesty doth command all and singular her officers, Ministers, and loyal subjects in her said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take notice thereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 5th day of July, 1954.
